Scene Setter

After a string of heart-breaking losses, the University of Kansas (3-5, 0-4 Big 12) looks for its first Big 12 win of the season when it hosts Colorado (1-7, 1-3 Big 12) on Oct. 28. Kickoff from KU's Memorial Stadium is scheduled for 1 p.m.

The Jayhawks enter the game against the Buffaloes looking to snap a four-game losing skid after falling to Baylor, 36-35, Saturday in Waco, Texas. Kansas took an 18-point lead into the fourth quarter, but BU scored 19 unanswered points in the final 9:22 of the game to rally for the win. Senior running back Jon Cornish ran for a career-best 196 yards and scored a pair of touchdowns in the contest.

After dropping its first six games of the season, Colorado defeated Texas Tech on Oct. 14 to claim its first win of the year. The Buffs enter the game against Kansas on the heels of a 24-3 setback last weekend at Oklahoma.

KU / Colorado Notes

This year's game marks the 59th consecutive meeting (starting in 1948) and 66th overall between the two schools ... KU and CU also played seven other times prior to World War II ... Colorado holds an all-time 41-21-3 advantage ... The team with the most rushing yards in the game has won each KU-CU contest since 1993, a steak of 13 games ... In seven of the last nine games, the home team has walked away with the win ... The last Kansas victory in Lawrence occurred in 2000 when the Jayhawks defeated the Buffs 53-29 ... KU is 13-17-3 all-time against the Buffs in Lawrence.

A Kansas WIN Would ...

Make the all-time series 41-22-3 in favor of Colorado ... Snap CU's five-game win streak in the series ... Hand Mark Mangino his 23rd career win as head coach, making his overall record 23-34 ... Make Kansas 540-536-58 all-time on the gridiron.

The Coaches



KU head coach Mark Mangino (22-34, .393), who was a driving force in the successful turnaround of two Big 12 Conference football programs prior to his arrival in Lawrence, is in his fifth season as head football coach at the University of Kansas.

During the 2005 season, Mangino led the Jayhawks to their first bowl victory since 1995 as the team defeated Houston 42-13 in the Fort Worth Bowl. By appearing in the 2005 bowl game, Mangino became the only coach in KU history to direct his team to a pair of bowl contests during a three-year span. Mangino's 2005 squad also posted a perfect 6-0 record at KU's Memorial Stadium - the team's first undefeated/untied season at home since 1951. In fact, KU fans backed Mangino and his team like never before. An average of 43,675 fans showed up per game -- an all-time Memorial Stadium record. He also guided the team to its first win over Nebraska since 1968, snapping a 36-game Cornhusker win streak. In addition, Mangino's club won its third consecutive game against Border Showdown rival Missouri. Under Mangino's guidance, senior linebacker Nick Reid became KU's first-ever Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year.

In 2004, Mangino guided a relatively inexperienced club to a 4-7 record, with a schedule that included six games against opponents ranked among the Top 25 during the 2004 season -- only two NCAA Division I teams played more regular-season games against opponents ranked in the Top 25. In addition, for the first time since the 1989 season, Kansas was victorious against both of its biggest rivals -- Missouri and Kansas State. The Jayhawks snapped K-State's 11-game win-streak in the series by defeating the Wildcats 31-28 on Oct. 9 in Lawrence, and later tamed the Tigers 31-14 on Nov. 9 in Columbia, Mo.

In 2003, Mangino led the Jayhawks to their first bowl appearance since 1995 when the team faced North Carolina State in the Mazda Tangerine Bowl.

The Buffaloes are coached by Dan Hawkins (1-7, .143 at Colorado), who is in his first season as the team's head coach after compiling an overall record of 53-11 in five years as the head coach at Boise State. Prior to his stint at BSU, Hawkins spent five years as the head coach of Willamette University (NAIA) in Salem, Ore.

A Quick Look at Colorado

Colorado enters the game against Kansas on the heels of a 24-3 setback in its game at Oklahoma on Oct. 21. The Buffs are averaging 14.1 points per game and allowing 20.0 points per contest. CU collects 156.0 rushing yards per game and averages 107.9 yards per game through the air. Junior quarterback Bernard Jackson averages 93.9 passing yards per game and has thrown three touchdowns. Junior running Hugh Charles collects 63.3 rushing yards per game, averages 5.5 yards per carry and has one touchdown. Jackson will also run with the football and averages better than 50 yards per contest. Colorado ranks seventh among all Big 12 teams in total defense, allowing 316.5 yards per game. Junior linebacker Jordon Dizon leads the team with 87 total tackles while junior cornerback Terrance Wheatley is tied for the Big 12 lead with four interceptions.

Receivers Catching On

Junior wide receiver Marcus Henry and sophomore wideout Dexton Fields may be short on experience, but both have become favorite targets of KU quarterbacks. Against Oklahoma State on Oct. 14, Henry finished the game with three catches for 37 yards and has caught at least two passes in seven of KU's eight games this season. He ranks second on the club with three TD catches and third on the team with 271 receiving yards. Fields, who had a team-leading four receptions including a TD against Baylor on Oct. 21, has a team-best five touchdowns this season and is second on the team with 29 receptions for 314 yards. Senior Brian Murph leads the team with 32 catches and 375 receiving yards. Sophomore Marcus Herford has eight catches for 137 yards this season and hauled in his first touchdown of the season on Oct. 14 against Oklahoma State. Overall, six different wide receivers have caught passes this season -- Murph (32), Fields (29), Henry (21), Herford (8), Jonathan Lamb (6) and Dominic Roux (1).

Herford and Murph Among Big 12's Best

In his first full year as KU's kickoff return specialist, Marcus Herford has 21 returns for 554 yards -- an average of 26.4 yards per return (4th in the Big 12). Punt returner Brian Murph, who has two career punt returns for touchdowns, leads all Big 12 players with an average of 19.5 yards per punt return attempt. In the season-opener against Northwestern State, the Howardville, Mo., native returned his only attempt 70 yards for a touchdown. In KU's final game of the 2005 season against Houston in the Fort Worth Bowl,

Murph scored on an 85-yard punt return -- his only attempt of that season. The KU record for punt return TDs in a career is three, held by Donnie Shanklin who starred at Kansas from 1966-68.

O-Line Leads KU Offense

KU's offensive line is both deep and talented as the Jayhawks return nine of 10 offensive linemen from last year's depth chart, including David Ochoa, Bob Whitaker, Cesar Rodriguez, Ryan Cantrell, Jake Cox and Travis Dambach who combined for 47 starts a year ago. Only 11 NCAA 1-A teams have more experience the KU's offensive line which has a combined 120 career starts.

In 2005, KU's offensive line helped lead a rushing attack which ended the season averaging 134.0 yards per game and nearly four yards per carry. (In 2004, the Jayhawks averaged just 94.0 yards per game and less than three yards per carry.) ***This season, the Jayhawks collect an average of 172.5 rushing yards per game.***

Ochoa, a senior captain, is on the preseason watch lists for the Lombardi Trophy, Rimington Trophy and the Outland Trophy after earning All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honors by the league's head coaches and the *Associated Press* in 2005. Whitaker, a senior, also was an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention selection by the league's head coaches last year and has started every game of his Jayhawk career (44).

Five Rookies Have Seen Action in 2006

Five true freshman have seen action for the Jayhawks this season, including four who participated in the season-opener -- linebacker Olaitan Oguntodu, linebacker Maxwell Onyegbule, cornerback Anthony Webb and running back Jake Sharp. In addition, defensive end Jason Thompson saw his first career action at Baylor.

Stopping Drives

The Jayhawks lead the Big 12 in stopping fourth-down conversion attempts through eight games this season. Only twice during the season (in nine attempts) has the opposition converted on fourth down. In fact, KU hasn't allowed a fourth-down conversion since the third game of the year (0-1 vs USE, 0-2 vs. TAMU, 0-1 vs. OSU).

About the Run Game

Through eight games this season, senior running back Jon Cornish has posted six 100-plus rushing efforts and averages 120.1 yards per contest (2nd among all Big 12 players, 9th in NCAA I). He is one of just two Big 12 players who averages better than 100 yards per game. On Oct. 21, Cornish led the way with a career-high 196 yards against Nebraska, including a pair of touchdown scampers -- moving his season total to five. Junior Brandon McAnderson has been tough around the goal line, scoring three times in 18 rushing attempts this season, including a career-long 11 yarder against Oklahoma State on Oct. 14. In KU's most recent game of 2006, the Jayhawks rushed the ball 46 times for 284 yards against Baylor -- the sixth time since the start of last season the Jayhawks have topped the 200-yard barrier.

Cornish Looking for 1,000

Senior running back Jon Cornish is looking to become the first KU player since June Henley (1996) to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. After posting 196 yards against Baylor last week, the New Westminster, B.C., native sits atop the Big 12 with 961 rushing yards this season.

Tucker Pinning the Opposition

Over the course of the last three games, KU punter Kyle Tucker has landed nine kicks inside the opponent 20-yard line (4 vs. Texas A&M, 3 vs. Oklahoma State, 2 at Baylor). For the season, Tucker is averaging 40.0 yards per attempt (42 punts) and drilled a season-long 60-yarder against Nebraska on Sept. 30.

Webb Steady

After missing his first two field goal attempts of the season, junior Scott Webb was accurate on each of his next eight field goal tries, including a season-long 43-yarder against Oklahoma State on Oct. 14. He currently ranks 7th on KU's all-time scoring list with 153 career points (24 FGs, 81 PATs).

Served five years with the Jayhawk Radio Network as play-by-play announcer for KU women's basketball ... Also serves as the host of the Crimson and Blue Line pre-game radio show.

Linebackers Lead KU Defense

KU linebackers Mike Rivera (59 tackles, 6 TFLs) and Joe Mortensen (51 tackles, 6 TFLs) rank 10th and 15th, respectively, among all Big 12 LBs in total tackles.

Supporting the Jayhawks

After setting a school-record for season tickets sold in late August, the announced attendance of 44,025 against Northwestern State in KU's season-opener represented the largest turnout for a home-opener since 1994 (48,100 vs. Michigan State). The attendance of 41,203 at KU's game against Oklahoma State on Oct. 14 marked the eighth-straight game that Kansas has had 40,000-plus fans for a home contest.

Five Jayhawks Earn Recognition

Senior offensive lineman David Ochoa was named to the preseason watch lists for the Outland Trophy, Rimington Trophy and Lombardi Award. The Houston, Texas, native was also listed as preseason second-team All-Big 12 by Collegefootballnews.com. Senior offensive lineman Bob Whitaker was projected as a second-team All-Big 12 member and senior safety Jerome Kemp earned preseason All-Big 12 first-team honors by *The Sporting News*. Sophomore cornerback Aqib Talib was a preseason All-Big 12 selection by the league's coaches and also was named to the preseason watch list for the Bronco Nagurski Award. Junior punter Kyle Tucker, a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award in 2005, was named to the award's 2006 preseason watch list. He also was named preseason All-Big 12 second-team by *The Sporting News* and Collegefootballnews.com.

Tough Schedule

Six of the Jayhawks' 12 opponents in 2006 appeared in bowl games last season including Toledo (GMAC Bowl), South Florida (Meineke Car Care Bowl), Nebraska (Alamo Bowl), Colorado (Champs Sports Bowl), Iowa State (Houston Bowl) and Missouri (Independence Bowl).

Name Changes at Memorial Stadium

In February, the Kansas Board of Regents granted the University of Kansas permission to name the planned football facility near Memorial Stadium the Anderson Family Football Complex. In addition, the university announced it will name the field inside the stadium Kivisto Field -- which became official at halftime of the Texas A&M game on Oct. 7. The names, approved by Chancellor Robert Hemenway, recognize the primary donors for the \$31 million football complex: the Kivistos (former KU basketball team captain Tom Kivisto and his wife, Julie) and the Andersons (Dana and Sue, and their son, Justin, and his wife, Jean).

New Faces in the Press Box

Former All-Big Eight performer David Lawrence joins veteran play-by-play announcer Bob Davis in the booth this fall. Lawrence serves as color analyst on KU radio broadcasts after serving the last 12 years as the team's sideline reporter. KU graduate Nate Bukaty succeeds Lawrence on the sidelines and will host the "Crimson & Blue Line" pre-game show. The moves follow legendary Max Falkenstien's retirement after 60 years of broadcasting Jayhawk games.

Miscellaneous Jayhawk Notes

Kansas is playing its 117th season of football -- only 11 NCAA Division IA schools have been playing football longer. Through 116 seasons, Kansas has posted a record of 539-536-58 ... Kansas has forced at least one turnover in 38 of its last 42 contests including 15 of its last 18 games... Since 1995, KU is 33-13 when a Jayhawk player rushes for more than 100 yards in a game ... Senior offensive lineman Bob Whitaker has the team's longest starting streak at 44 games and has started every game of his KU career.

Jayhawks in the NFL

Eight former Kansas football players are currently on National Football League rosters as the 2006 NFL season opened in mid-September. **Don Davis**, a linebacker with the New England Patriots, is the dean of former Jayhawks in the NFL. **Moran Norris** was released by the Houston Texans following the 2005 season but was acquired by the San Francisco 49ers as a free agent. **Justin Hartwig** signed with Carolina in March. Other NFL veterans who once played for the Jayhawks include **Adrian Jones**, who started all 16 games for the New York Jets last season at offensive tackle and linebacker **David McMillan** who was a rookie with the Cleveland Browns in '05. Wide receiver/cornerback **Charles Gordon** signed with the Minnesota Vikings and is currently on the practice squad. Former Jayhawk wide receiver **Leo Bookman**, signed with the Oakland Raiders' practice squad in early September and wide receiver **Brandon Rideau** was added to the practice squad of the Chicago Bears later in the month.

LAWRENCE, Kan. -- Behind a career-high 140 rushing yards from senior Jon Cornish, Kansas opened the 2006 season with a 49-18 victory against Northwestern State at Memorial Stadium. A crowd of 44,025 - the largest home-opening crowd at Memorial Stadium since 1994 - saw KU win its third-straight season opener under Head Coach Mark Mangino. The win was also Kansas' fifth-straight against non-conference foes and its seventh-straight at home. KU's 49 points were the most in a season opener since 1992. Kerry Meier's debut as Kansas' quarterback saw the red-shirt-freshman throw for 118 yards and two touchdowns. Meier also rushed for two scores, including 31-yard scamper to end the scoring at 49-18 with 3:46 to play. He also scored on a one-yard plunge earlier in the fourth quarter and finished with 59 yards rushing. Kansas scored 28-straight points behind two touchdown passes, a punt return and a fumble recovery of a blocked punt to lead Northwestern State 28-6 at halftime. Trailing 6-0, Kansas sophomore Marcus Herford returned a kickoff 88 yards to set up KU's first score of the season. Herford's jaunt was the 10th longest in school history as Kansas took a 7-6 lead on a Kerry Meier 10-yard pass to Marcus Henry with 4:32 in the first quarter. After a three-and-out by the Demons, KU senior Brian Murph returned a punt 70 yards to paydirt to make the score 14-6 with 1:42 to play in the first quarter. With 8:20 remaining in the half, KU sophomore Dexton Fields blocked a Demon punt in the endzone and it was recovered by junior Jeff Foster to make the score 21-6 in favor of the Jayhawks. After a fumble recovery by Kansas senior Eric Washington, Meier hit Murph on a 15-yard fade pass to make the score 28-6 with 6:52 remaining before intermission. KU's first drive of the second half saw Cornish score on a 69-yard run. The running back went on to post his fifth career 100-yard rushing game and also set a personal high with 156 all-purpose yards.

LAWRENCE, Kan. -- The University of Kansas defeated Louisiana Monroe, 21-19, behind the efforts of senior running back Jon Cornish and freshman quarterback Kerry Meier. Cornish tallied 165 total yards, a new career-high, while Meier threw for two touchdowns and scored one on the ground. Cornish carried the ball a career-high 23 times for 103 yards. His consecutive 100-yard performances to open the season makes him the first Jayhawk to do so since June Henley in 1996. Meier, making his second career start, was 16-for-27 for 185 yards and two touchdowns. He connected with sophomore Dexton Fields six times for 39 yards. Fields' six receptions - including an 11-yard touchdown grab in the first quarter - set a new career-high for the Dallas native. The Jayhawks struck in the middle of the first quarter after orchestrating an 11-play drive, which was capped off by an 11-yard pass-and-catch from Meier to Fields. The drive spanned over five minutes and the Fields' touchdown was the second of his career. With 2:02 left in the opening period, Louisiana Monroe evened the score at 7-7, after a 59-yard touchdown pass to Zeek Zacharie from quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster. Kansas countered the Warhawks score with a four-yard touchdown pass from Meier to sophomore Marcus Henry putting the Jayhawks ahead, 14-7, at halftime. The touchdown marked Henry's second touchdown in the young season. The drive was ignited by Cornish's 46-yard reception, the longest of his Jayhawk career. After forcing a Warhawks punt on their opening drive of the second half, the Jayhawks marched down the field and scored on a 10-yard touchdown scamper by Meier. The drive included several strong runs by Cornish including a 22-yard jaunt. The Warhawks were able to claw back into the game after Lancaster ran for a nine-yard touchdown, to make the score 21-13. However, the Warhawks missed the resulting extra-point. ULM pulled within two points of the Jayhawks after another Lancaster-to-Zacharie touchdown connection for three yards with 3:31 remaining in the fourth quarter. The ensuing two-point conversion attempt failed after Lancaster's toss to Zacharie sailed out of the end zone. Junior running back Brandon McAnderson retrieved ULM's on-side kick, allowing the Jayhawks to run out the clock and preserve the victory. On defense, KU senior Paul Como registered a career-high eight tackles including three behind the line of scrimmage. Sophomore Mike Rivera also added seven tackles to give him 18 for the season.

TOLEDO, Ohio -- The Kansas football team suffered its first loss of the season after it dropped a double-overtime decision, 37-31 to Toledo. The KU defense shined in the defeat, limiting the Rockets to just 237 yards of total offense for the game. Linebacker Mike Rivera registered eight tackles to lead the squad and safety Jerome Kemp collected seven tackles while cornerback Aqib Talib, linebacker Eric Washington and linebacker Joe Mortensen each added six tackles for the unit. Freshman quarterback Kerry Meier threw a pair of touchdown passes and ran for another in the first road game of his collegiate career. Running back Jon Cornish rushed for 89 yards on 20 carries and also caught three passes for 26 yards. Tight end Derek Fine had a team-high five receptions for 49 yards while sophomore Marcus Henry hauled in a three passes for a career-high 67 yards, including a 33-yard touchdown grab. The Jayhawks started quickly, scoring on the team's opening possession when Meier scrambled for a 12-yard touchdown run. After a Toledo safety and rushing score, the Jayhawks responded with a two-yard touchdown plunge by fullback Brandon McAnderson. The touchdown, the second of McAnderson's career, made the score, 14-9, midway through the second quarter. Toledo took a 17-14 lead into halftime after connecting on a fourth-down touchdown reception with under a minute left in the first half. The Jayhawks answered quickly in the second half when defensive end John Larson sacked Rockets quarterback Brandon Summers early in the third quarter for a safety. The Jayhawks regained the lead after the safety when Meier hooked up with Henry on the 36-yard score, making the score 23-17. After the Rockets struck back twice to take a 31-23 lead, Meier drove KU down the field before connecting with wide receiver Dexton Fields on a 20-yard scoring play. Meier successfully converted the two-point attempt, knotting the score at 31. The teams then entered overtime, where the Rockets were unsuccessful on the opening possession. However, Meier fumbled a hand-off to Cornish on the Jayhawks' possession, sending the game into double overtime, only the second time in school history that Kansas has played a contest with more than one overtime period. In the second overtime, Meier was intercepted and Rockets running back Jalen Parmale scored on a 25-yard run to end the game.

LAWRENCE, Kan. -- The University of Kansas used a solid defensive effort to outlast South Florida 13-7 at Memorial Stadium. KU freshman Justin Thornton intercepted USF quarterback Matt Grothe's final pass as time expired. The Bulls, 3-1, drove to the Kansas 27-yard line and had two endzone pass attempts on the game's final drive. Kansas, 3-1, won its ninth-straight home game limiting USF, of the Big East Conference, to a season-low seven points. The Jayhawks forced three turnovers and limited the Bulls to 113 rushing yards en route to the victory. After a scoreless first half, a crowd of 40,933 saw points put on the board in each of the first three drives of the second stanza. Kansas took the second half kickoff and drove 60 yards before junior Scott Webb gave KU a 3-0 lead with a 37-yard field goal. USF answered on the next possession to take a 7-3 lead on a seven-yard touchdown run by Grothe. The Jayhawks then drove 79 yards in seven plays to take a 10-7 advantage on senior Jon Cornish's two-yard run at the start of the fourth quarter. On USF's ensuing drive, KU's defense forced a punt and the Jayhawks responded with a 47-yard drive that concluded with a Webb 42-yard field goal to make the score 13-7 with nine minutes to play. KU senior quarterback Adam Barmann received his first start of the season and 14th of his career. The Weston, Mo., native was 25-of-35 for 273 yards passing and hit seven different receivers in the game. Cornish recorded his third 100-yard rushing game of the season with 105 yards on a career-high 26 carries. Cornish also had six receptions and 119 all-purpose yards for the contest. The first half was a defensive battle that ended 0-0. It marked the first scoreless first half in a Kansas game since 1980. USF made the field long for Kansas as KU's first three possessions started inside its own five-yard line. KU outgained USF 219-166 in the first half.

LINCOLN, Neb. -- Senior quarterback Adam Barmann threw for 405 yards, while running back Jon Cornish gained 145 on the ground, but it was not enough as a furious Jayhawk rally fell short at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 30. KU erased a 17-point deficit, but fell to No. 21 Nebraska, 39-32 in overtime. The loss dropped KU to 3-2 overall and 0-1 in the conference, while the Huskers improved to 4-1 overall and 1-0 in Big 12 play. KU's 32 points were the most scored at Nebraska by any KU team since the 1899 squad defeated the Huskers 36-20. Barmann connected on 27 of his final 46 throws for 405 yards and two touchdowns. His 405 yards passing was the fourth-most by any KU quarterback in team history. Trailing 24-7 late in the first half, the Jayhawks scored 19 consecutive points to grab a 25-24 lead. The Jayhawks tied the game with 46 seconds remaining in regulation as Barmann hit wide receiver Brian Murph on a rollout from the Nebraska 26. However, Cody Glenn's 1-yard run in the first overtime proved to be the game-winner when Barmann's fourth down pass from the Nebraska nine fell incomplete. KU took its first lead with 6:32 left in the fourth quarter when Barmann found tight end Derek Fine in the back of the endzone from one yard out. The Jayhawks missed the two-point try to hold a 25-24 advantage. Fine finished the contest with a career-high 84 yards on five catches. The Huskers responded two minutes later when Zac Taylor connected with Frantz Hardy for a 75-yard touchdown, Taylor's third of the game. KU responded, forcing overtime on Barmann's second TD pass of the game with 46 seconds left. Kansas got a 145-yard effort from senior running back Jon Cornish. It marked the fourth time this season that the senior has gained over 100 yards in a game. After surrendering 17 points in the first quarter, the Jayhawks got on the board early in the second quarter on a one-yard plunge by junior runningback Brandon McAnderson. Starting from its own five-yard line, Kansas put together its longest scoring drive of the season. Barmann hit wide receiver Dexter Fields for gains of 30 and 15 yards and completed a 40-yard strike to Fine. KU outgained the Huskers 558-306 after the first quarter, including 405-257 through the air.

LAWRENCE, Kan. -- Senior Jon Cornish rushed for 123 yards and junior Scott Webb hit three field goals, but it was not enough for the University of Kansas (3-3, 0-2 Big 12) to pull out a Homecoming win against Texas A&M (5-1, 1-1 Big 12), as the Jayhawks lost 21-18. Jorvorskie Lane's second touchdown run of the day with 34 seconds remaining, lifted the Aggies to the come-from-behind victory over the Jayhawks at Memorial Stadium. The Jayhawks took a 7-0 lead on their opening drive when quarterback Adam Barmann hit wide receiver Dexter Fields on a quick out for a six-yard scoring strike. Barmann finished the game 13-of-31 for 127 yards and the score. Cornish, who rushed for over 100 yards in the second half, notched his fifth 100-yard game of the season on 23 carries. The touchdown was set up by a 48-yard reception by junior Brandon McAnderson on a fake punt. McAnderson received a shovel pass from junior Kyle Tucker and raced around the left end to the Texas A&M eight-yard line. McAnderson was KU's top receiver, grabbing three passes for 57 yards. The Jayhawks stretched the lead to 10-0 on Webb's 33-yard field goal in the final minute of the first quarter. Texas A&M responded with a 12-play, 74-yard drive that culminated in a one-yard plunge by Lane midway through the first half to make the game 10-7 at halftime. In the second half, the Jayhawks penetrated the Aggies' 25-yard line twice and came away with a pair of Webb field goals. The junior kicker matched a career-high with his three field goals. Webb hit his third field goal of the day, a 28-yard effort, to extend the Jayhawk lead to 18-7 late in the third quarter. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Texas A&M quarterback Stephen McGee brought the Aggies to within five points, 18-13, on a two-yard scoring plunge. However, KU stuffed the Aggie quarterback on the two-point try to hold the lead at five. In the final three minutes, the Aggies punctuated their final drive of the day with Lane's plunge. Tight end Joey Thomas caught the two-point conversion from McGee for the margin of victory. On defense, senior safety Jerome Kemp led the Jayhawks with a career-high 11 tackles and a sack. LAWRENCE, Kan. -- Oklahoma State scored 42 points in the second half to defeat the University of Kansas, 42-32, at Memorial Stadium in front of a crowd of 41,203. Kansas red-shirt-freshman quarterback Kerry Meier threw two first-half touchdown passes -- the first one going to Marcus Herford on a 33-yard strike and the second to junior tight end Derek Fine on a four-yard hookup -- as the Jayhawks took a 14-0 lead into the break. The Jayhawks added to their halftime lead on their opening drive of the second half when Scott Webb converted on a 44-yard field goal following Cowboys quarterback Bobby Reid's fumble, making the score 17-0. The fumble recovery by freshman Justin Thornton was the first of his Jayhawk career. The Cowboys then scored 28 unanswered points behind three touchdown connections from Reid to wide receiver Adarius Bowman, along with a scoring run by Reid to grab a 28-17 lead. The Jayhawks cut into the Cowboy lead after an 11-yard touchdown scamper by junior Brandon McAnderson midway through the fourth quarter. After converting a two-point conversion attempt from Meier to Fine, the Jayhawks drew to within three points at 28-25 before Oklahoma State added two fourth-quarter touchdowns. KU also added a late touchdown from Meier to sophomore Dexton Fields with 1:22 remaining in the game, giving the sophomore receiver his fourth touchdown grab of the year.

WACO, Texas - Despite leading 35-17 at halftime and getting a career-high 196 rushing yards from senior running back Jon Cornish, the University of Kansas football team fell in the final minutes to Baylor University, 36-35. Kansas' record moved to 3-5 overall and 0-4 in the Big 12, while Baylor improved to 4-4 overall and 3-1 in the league. The first half was full of action as KU and BU traded leads four times. The Jayhawks scored a season-high 35 points in the first stanza and led Baylor 35-17 at halftime at BU's Floyd Casey Stadium. Cornish led the Kansas offense with 134 rushing yards on 13 carries and added touchdown runs of 15 yards and one yard in the final 3:27 of the first half to extend KU's slim 21-17 advantage to 18 points. Freshman quarterback Kerry Meier completed 5-of-9 passes for 55 yards and a score. He also crossed the goal line on a 12-yard scamper in the first quarter. After Baylor scored on its opening possession, the Jayhawks tied the game 7-7 on Meier's endzone-finding TD dash. Sophomore linebacker Arist Wright gave Kansas its first lead of the game when he returned an errant Baylor pass 28 yards for his first career touchdown with 6:45 remaining in the first quarter. Following a Baylor field goal, Bear QB Shawn Bell tossed a four-yard touchdown pass to give the home team a 17-14 advantage. However, the Jayhawks scored three unanswered touchdowns to end the half, including a perfect 13-yard pass-and-catch from Meier to Dexton Fields. After a scoreless third quarter, Baylor struck in the fourth period on a 42-yard pass play from Bell to wide receiver Trent Shelton with 9:22 to play. The five-play, 80-yard drive narrowed the KU lead to 35-24. The Bears drew even closer with 4:42 left in the fourth on a four-play, 81-yard drive that set up a four-yard touchdown by running back Paul Mosley. A failed two-point conversion left the score 35-30 in favor of the Jayhawks. On the ensuing kickoff, Baylor appeared to have Kansas pinned on its own one yardline, but an illegal formation by the Bears forced BU to rekick. The Baylor defense held and took over possession with 2:43 remaining after a KU punt. The Bears then went on a 9-play, 58-yard drive the resulted in a 10 yard TD pass from Bell to Dominique Zeigler with 1:08 on the clock. The BU two-point conversion failed, but Baylor nevertheless took a 36-35 lead which stood as the final score.
