FOR STARTERS: Tonight's game will be the first of two in the next three days for the Buffaloes. Northern Colorado visits Boulder for the first time since Jan. 10, 2004 when CU defeated the Bears, 78-48. Believe it or not, UNC leads the all-time series with CU, 18-17 dating back to 1918. From 1918 thru 1937, the Bears won 18 of 30 games, while the Buffs have won the last two in recent memory dating back to 1978 and 2004. The Buffs are 10-8 at home vs. the Bears.

HOLIDAY STAY: No more frequent flyer miles for the CU MBB team for the next seven games and/or five weeks. CU will not leave the state of Colorado until Jan. 9's travel day to Norman, Okla. (Jan. 10 at Oklahoma, FSN RM). Prior to visiting OU, the Buffaloes open the Big 12 Conference season against Texas on Jan. 6.

LAST TIME OUT: Junior guard Daniel Fountain poured in a career-high 21 points and UNC Wilmington held Colorado to 18 points in the second half for a 67-55 come-from-behind victory over the Buffaloes in the home opener for the Seahawks. Fountain paced three players in double digits for the Seahawks, who shot 44.8 percent to just 37.3 percent for the Buffaloes. With guard Richard Roby sidelined most of the second half with cramps, CU managed just 26.1 percent from the floor after the break. Roby paced the Buffaloes with 16 points, all in the first half. Jeremy Williams was the only other CU player in double figures with 14 markers.

DA BEARS: Northern Colorado (Big Sky Conference) enters tonight's game with a 1-6 record hav-

HOOK SHOTS: Not counting his 3-point shooting, **Richard Roby** is 24-for-63 (.381) in two-point attempts; last year at this time, he was 20-for-46 (.435) for two-pointers ...

Jermyl Jackson-Wilson is fifth in conference rebounding (8.5 rpg.), remains first in offensive boards (4.0) and is tied for eighth in defensive (4.5) ... Roby is tied for seventh in steals (2.0 spg.) and 11th in scoring (15.3 ppg.) ... Roby needs three points to move into 21st place on CU's all-time scoring list (1082 pts., 16.4 ppg.) ...

Jeremy Williams started his second game of the season at UNCW scoring 14 points (4-for-4 FG) and 6-for-7 from the free throw line; he started at Utah ... **TEAM:** CU slipped to 2-4 for the first time since the 1988-89 season ... In second half scoring, CU is averaging 33.3 ppg.; Individually, Roby leads the team in scoring in the second half (8.2 ppg.) ... Of the 19 team categories administrated by the Big 12 Conference, CU is last in 11 categories and 10th or 11th in four ... CU's .395 FG percentage, .232 3-PT% and .569 FT% are the lowest in coach Patton's 11-years ... CU has been out-rebounded in their last five games (5.4).

ing defeated Colorado Christian, 89-68 back on Nov. 21. The Bears have lost on the road to Ball State (81-42), Purdue (90-58), Denver (74-68) and Arizona State (66-51). Home game losses are to UC-Colorado Springs (96-91) and a two-point loss to Oregon State (69-67). Head Coach Tad Boyle enters his first year with UNC.

CU vs. PEPPERDINE: On Monday, CU hosts the Pepperdine Waves (1-5) at the Events Center at 7 p.m. CU and Pepperdine (West Coast Conference) are tied at three in the head-to-head series dating back 1944. The Buffs hold a 3-1 advantage in Boulder and have played twice in recent memory (1999: NIT: CU, 65-61) and 2003: at Pepperdine, L, 94-77).

CU vs. the COLONIAL: After falling on the road to UNC Wilmington, the Buffaloes are now 3-4 against the Colonial Athletic Association, while coach Patton teams are 2-4 overall and 0-3 on the road.

CU vs. THE MOUNTAIN WEST: Since CU is playing six of the nine Mountain West Conference schools this year (1-3 so far), overall, CU has enjoyed much success against them in its history (109-53, .672). The Buffs are only 11-10 (.524) since 1996-97 and since the 2002-03 season, the Buffs are 6-5 (.546) against the conference.

MWC WRAP: For the last two weeks it seemed CU joined another conference, the Mountain West. After four straight games with the MWC, CU produced a 1-3 record. The Buffaloes still have Colorado State (Dec. 9) and TCU (Dec. 30) to play.

SURPRISE LINEUP ADDITION: Chase Perkowski came off the bench in the early stages of the first half at UNCW. The sophomore from San Juan Capistrano, Calif. took a charge in four minutes at running the point. Aside from on again, off again scholarship and former student-athlete Scott Senger (May 2006 graduate), Perkowski is the first walk on to play quality minutes in the last six years when the game hasn't been decided.

NO OFFENSE (2nd Half): Depending on which four minute span you are looking at, the Buffs are struggling to score points in the second half (Opponent: 43.8, CU: 33.3). On the average, they are being outscored in all four minute breakdowns. During the four-to-eight minute mark, UNC Wilmington used a 12-0 run during this span to finally take the lead; and during the 8-12 minute mark, Wyoming (10-7 run), Utah (13-7) and Air Force (21-0) all have put themselves back in the game with runs of their own. Individually, Richard Roby leads the team in scoring in the second half (8.2 ppg.). For more media timeout breakdowns (10 mini-games), please turn to page 4.

TURNOVERS FROM A YEAR AGO: If you think the Buffaloes are turning the ball over due to their youth, you might be right or is it really making a difference? After six games last year, CU averaged 13.5 a game (81 total). This year the average is 16.3 (98).

SHOOTING FROM THE FIELD: Compared to last year after six games to this year, the numbers are indeed different from an upperclassmen dominated team to this season's youth. Here's a look at the two seasons:

CU ON TOP: The Division I Sports Academy Directors' Cup standings kicked off the 2006-07 season with 20 total points separating the first, second and third place spots. Colorado opens the year on top with 190 total points after capturing the men's cross country national championship and a runner-up finish in women's cross country.

Twelve-time defending champion Stanford is currently in second with 180 points, finishing first in women's cross country and fourth overall in men's cross country.

Just 10 points behind, with 170 points, is Wisconsin, with a runner-up finish in men's cross country and a fourth place stop in women's cross country. The Sports Academy Directors' Cup was developed as a joint effort between the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and USA Today. The United States Sports Academy, based in Daphne, Alabama, is the program's sponsor. Points are awarded based on each institution's finish in up to 20 sports – 10 women's and 10 men's. "YOUNG GUNS" Eight of the team's 13 players are freshmen and are known as another name of the 2006-07 roster, the 'Young Guns.' If you haven't already done so, check out the back cover of the 2006-07 media guide, they're the future of CU Basketball. After six games, Kal Bay and Xavier Silas have made the most of the opportunity in the CU lineup. Bay has started all six games at the point, is tied for the team lead in treys (9), second in assists (20; 3.3 apg.) and is fifth in scoring (6.2 ppg.).

"X" MARKS THE SPOT: Xavier Silas is averaging an impressive 25.8 minutes in a reserve role and averages 8.3 points, fourth overall on the team. He led CU in scoring at New Mexico with 14 points.

20 SHOTS + 20 PTS. = CU WIN: Twice this season when Richard Roby shoots 20 times in a game, he scores 20 points AND CU wins. Over his career, CU is 5-1 in this trend. Last season, he did it three times, all wins and his freshman season, he did it once and lost (at Texas Tech). Here are Roby's 20 shots=20 points and the result:

INJURY LIST: Freshman center Marc Van Burck is out 3-5 weeks with a right foot stress fracture. He will not redshirt the 2006-07 season. Van Burck (6-11, 280) from Star City, Saskatchewan, Canada/Luther HS, played one game (Denver) with two points, two rebounds in six minutes.

THIS DAY IN BUFF MBB HISTORY: CU is 17-6 on this date in history. The last time they played on this date was 1998 defeating Virginia Commonwealth, 78-76. Jaquay Walls led the Buffs with 14 points.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE THIS YEAR? Sophomore-transfer Jermyn Jackson-Wilson is the closest CU player on the roster after five games to average a double-double. Right now JJW is averaging 10.5 ppg. and 8.5 rpg. ANOTHER PRESEASON HONOR: Fifty of the nation's best men's college basketball players were named as preseason candidates for the Naismith Trophy presented by Cingular Wireless, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced. Seven of the athletes recognized were from the Big 12 Conference. The Naismith Trophy is among the most prestigious national awards presented annually to the men's and women's players of the year.

The Big 12 athletes recognized are Richard Roby (Colorado), Brandon Rush (Kansas), Julian Wright (Kansas), JamesOn Curry (Oklahoma State), Joseph Jones (Texas A&M), Acie Law (Texas A&M) and Jarrius Jackson (Texas Tech). The Top 50 list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, comprised of leading basketball journalists, coaches and administrators from around the country. The board based its preseason criteria on player performances from last season and expectations for the 2006-07 season.

3-POINT WOES: After setting the 3-point school record last season with 240, CU is shooting a Big 12 Conference low .232 percent (29-for-125) from the 3-point arc in six games. At this pace averaging five treys a game, the Buffs are on course for 140 3-pointers this year, their lowest since the 1993-94 season when they made 88. In case you were wondering, that team had seven freshmen on it.

IN CASE YOU MISSED IT: Jeremy Williams made his first collegiate start, grabbing four rebounds, one steal, no points in 16 minutes at Utah; he also started at UNCW scoring 14 points (4-f-4 FG), four rebounds in 21 minutes ... CU's win at Utah was its first in seven road games (at Okla. State, Jan. 21, 80-78, OT) ... CU has made a three-point shot in 142 consecutive games. The last time the Buffs failed to make a trey was Jan. 16, 2002 (at Iowa State) ... The Buffs are 67-10 (.870) versus non-conference opponents at home since 1996-97; they have won 16 of their last 19 games at home against non-conference opponents (losses, Wyoming, Air Force and Old Dominion in the NIT last season). CU's losses to New Mexico (41 points) and Air Force (38 points) were the worst back-to-back losses since losing consecutive 30+ point games Jan. 29, 1994 (Kansas, 87-53) and Feb. 1 (at Iowa State, 99-69) ... ROOKIES IN THE STARTNG LINE UP: Kal Bay became only the fifth rookie in Coach Patton's 11 years to start the first game of the season. The others were guard Alan Barkdale (1996-97), guard/forward Michel Morandais (2000-01), point-guard Antoine McGee (2002-03) and guard Richard Roby (2004-05). Remember, Chauncey Billups started at CU in 1995-96 when Patton was an assistant under Joe Harrington.

SEASON OPENER - Richard Roby scored 20 points and CU remained unbeaten in 11 season openers under coach Ricardo Patton during the Buffaloes' 78-64 win over Denver. Jermyl Jackson-Wilson grabbed 17 rebounds, including 10 in the first half, and had 14 points, giving him his first career double-double. Jackson-Wilson's 11 offensive boards and his 17 for the game are the most by a Buff in a debut. Dominique Coleman, the lone senior on CU's roster, finished with 19 points and seven assists. CU opened the season with a victory for the 11th straight year (9-0 in Boulder).

LEAVING AT THE END OF SEASON: On Oct. 25, coach Patton announced this would be his last basketball season of coaching at CU. Patton said he would not seek nor accept an extension of his contract, which runs until July 1, 2007. In 10 years as head coach, Patton has 179 victories, four NIT appearances, two NCAA Tournaments, and three 20-win seasons.

HALL INELIGIBLE: Senior guard Marcus Hall was declared academically ineligible for the Fall 2006 semester announced back on Sept. 6. Majoring in sociology, Hall will be re-evaluated at the end of the Fall semester to determine his Spring 2007 status. If he's academically eligible and participates during the second semester, he will use his fourth season of eligibility. Hall is one of two seniors on the 2006-07 roster with 88 career games played (44 starts). He averages 8.3 points and 3.4 assists per game; ranks ninth on the school's all-time assist list (295), 10th in 3-pointers made (99) and 19th in steals (82).

ROBY NAMED TO WOODEN AWARD PRESEASON TOP 50

- Back on October 25, when coach Patton took center stage on CU Basketball Media Day, he took away a preseason honor from Richard Roby. If you have already forgotten, Roby was one of 50 preseason candidates named to the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team. Roby is the first CU player to be named to the Wooden List since David Harrison in 2003-04. The list is composed of 50 student athletes who, based on last year’s individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball’s most coveted trophy. These top 50 candidates will be evaluated and considered for both the Midseason top 30 list and the National Ballot. Roby was one of eight players from the Big 12 selected.

ROBY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 TEAM:

Junior guard Richard Roby was named to the preseason All-Big 12 Team. Roby, a 2005-06 first team conference selection last season enters the 2006-07 season only 10 points shy of scoring 1,000 points in his career. The San Bernardino, Calif. native averaged 17 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.1 steals per games last season. Roby joins sophomores Brandon Rush and Julian Wright (Kansas), junior Joseph Jones (Texas A&M) and seniors Acie Law (Texas A&M) and Jarrius Jackson (Texas Tech).

CU vs. RANKED TEAMS: Entering this season, the Buffaloes and coach Patton are 11-48 against nationally ranked schools. In the last four years, CU has beaten at least one ranked school at home. However, on the road is a much different story having lost their last 22 in a row (last at No. 20 Texas Tech, Jan. 11, 80-78)

Colorado's Jermyn Jackson-Wilson grabbed 17 rebounds, including 10 in the first half, and had 14 points, giving him his first career double-double. Jackson-Wilson's 11 offensive boards and his 17 for the game are the most by a Buff in a debut. Dominique Coleman, the lone senior on Colorado's roster, finished with 19 points and seven assists.

DaShawn Walker led Denver with 16 points. Joseph Jackson and Tyler Bullock each added 15 points.

It's the first time the two teams have played since 2000. Colorado leads the all-time series 56-25 and has won the last five in a row. Patton, who announced he'll step down at the end of his 11th season, is 4-0 against the Pioneers.

The Buffaloes led by as many as 21 points in the second half.

Roby had a play late in the first half that probably won't make his highlight reel. Roby attempted a one-handed dunk on a breakaway but was rejected by the rim and fell to the floor. He smiled as he headed back down the court. The Buffs were up 17 points at the time.

Xavier Silas was assessed a technical with 9:23 left in the first half for hanging on the rim.

The Pioneers trimmed a 17-point deficit in the first half to 37-24 at halftime with a 5-1 run to close out the half.

Denver freshman guard Nate Rohnert rolled his ankle during a shoot-around Friday morning and was held out of the game. The Pioneers were already missing junior guard Mykhael Lattimore (right thumb injury) and junior center Adam Tanner (fractured left arm). They're expected to miss at least three more games.

Colorado guard Kal Bay became just the fifth freshman to start in the opener during Patton's tenure. Roby started for Patton in 2004-05.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) - J.R. Giddens scored a career high 25 points and New Mexico got a huge first half lift from its bench in a 106-65 win over Colorado.

Giddens, the former Kansas guard who sat out last season after transferring to New Mexico, shook off a slow start and dissected the Buffaloes' defense with his quickness, slashing moves to the basket and outside jumper that repeatedly found the hoop.

Guard Xavier Silas led the Buffaloes (1-1) with 14 points. Richard Roby and Kalvin Bay each scored 12.

New Mexico (3-0) took its first lead at 15-14 on a pair of free throws by Jeffrey Henfield with 11:46 left in the first half. New Mexico's reserves, who scored 25 points in the first half, and some solid free throw shooting, carried the Lobos' offense until Giddens found his stroke.

The Lobos hit their first 13 free throws and reserves Daniel Faris, Chad Toppert and Ryan Kersten provided much of the offense in the first 20 minutes.

Toppert hit a trio of 3-pointers in the first half, Faris scored 8 points and Kersten 6. Toppert's back-to-back 3s gave the Lobos a 36-25 lead with 5:02 left in the first half.

Faris, the sophomore backup center, finished with career highs of 14 points and 8 rebounds.

New Mexico led 47-34 at halftime and broke it open from there as the Lobos shot 67 percent in the second half. Giddens was the catalyst. He scored on a jumper in the lane, then came up with a steal and dunk that pushed the lead to 62-39 with 12:55 left.

Giddens, a junior who New Mexico coach Ritchie McKay has tabbed a likely lottery pick in next summer's NBA draft, flexed his muscles to the crowd of more than 12,000 after the dunk.

Giddens hit 11 of 19 shots and along with Faris and Aaron Johnson led the Lobos to a 51-35 edge in rebounding. Giddens had 9 rebounds and Johnson 11.

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) - The Colorado Buffaloes men's basketball team were held to 11 points in the first half and fell to the Air Force Falcons at the Coors Events Center.

Sophomore forward Jermyn Jackson-Wilson led Colorado with nine points. Leading scorer, junior guard Richard Roby was held to six points on 3-for-14 shooting.

Nick Welch added 18 points for Air Force (4-0), which last started out with four straight wins in the 1998-99 season, when it began 5-0. The Falcons hit 13-of-25 3-pointers, four by Tim Anderson.

The first half output of 11 was Colorado's lowest scoring half since being held to four points in the first half of a Jan. 23, 1980 game at Missouri.

It was also the first time CU failed to place a player in double figures since Feb. 15, 1992 at Kansas. Poncho Hodges and Joe Stephens each scored nine points in the 82-45 loss.

Colorado took a 4-0 lead early, but trailed 35-11 at halftime thanks to a scoring drought that lasted nearly 12 minutes and a patient Air Force team that shot 52 percent and had 11 points from Welch.

After a basket by junior forward, Marcus King-Stockton, the Buffaloes missed 11 straight shots and turned the ball over five times while the Falcons' Dan Nwaelele buried three, 3-pointers as part of a 22-0 run that ended with Matt McGraw following his own miss to push Air Force ahead 22-4.

Jackson-Wilson ended the scoreless string with a basket at 6:49 that drew a roar from the crowd. Colorado, which shot 23 percent for the half, managed only seven points the rest of the period, two by Roby, who was 1-for-8 shooting.

Things didn't get much better in the second half for Colorado. The Buffaloes improved their shooting to 42 percent, but fell behind 47-17 after a 3-pointer from Welch and a layup and free throw from Keith Henke.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah (AP) - Richard Roby scored 22 points, and teammate Jermyl Jackson-Wilson made a free throw with 2.1 seconds remaining to lift Colorado to a 60-59 victory over Utah Tuesday night.

Kal Bay added 11 points and three 3 pointers for the Buffaloes who won at Utah for the first time in six tries dating back to 1946. It's also the first road win in seven road games for CU since winning at Oklahoma State back on Jan. 21, 2006 in overtime (80-78).

Jackson-Wilson missed his second of two free throws, and the Utes rebounded and called timeout with 1.8 seconds left. But Lawrence Borhas desperation three-pointer missed badly as time expired.

The victory was the first for the Buffaloes (2-2) after back-to-back blowout losses, while the Utes fell to a 0-3 start for the first time since 1970.

Johnnie Bryant scored 20 points for the Utes, including 11 in a row to start the second half, and Luke Nevill added 14 points and 10 rebounds.

But the Utes committed two crucial turnover in the final minute, with the game tied 59-59.

The first came on a bad pass after Utah's Shaun Green drew a charging foul on Roby, and the second came when the Utes lost the ball on a fast break following a blocked shot by Nevill. Borha fouled Jackson-Wilson in the ensuing scramble to set up the winning free throws.

Jackson-Wilson added 10 for the Buffaloes, who forced 17 turnovers and held the Utes to 43.6 percent shooting.

The teams combined for 17 turnovers in the first half, and the Utes made 6-of-22 shots. Neither team led by more than six points.

WILMINGTON, N.C. - Junior guard Daniel Fountain poured in a career-high 21 points and UNC Wilmington held Colorado to 18 points in the second half for a 67-55 come-from-behind victory over the Buffaloes in the home opener for the Seahawks.

The Seahawks improved to 2-3 on the season and snapped a three-game losing streak as they made new skipper Benny Moss a winner in his first home game. The Buffaloes dropped to 2-4 in the new season.

Fountain paced three players in double digits for the Seahawks, who shot 44.8 percent to just 37.3 percent for the Buffaloes. With guard Richard Roby sidelined most of the second half with cramps, CU managed just 26.1 percent from the floor after the break.

Senior playmaker Temi Soyebo poured in 12 points - all in the first half - on 6-of-8 shooting and added nine rebounds and dished out five assists in an all-around game. He also had eight steals to match the record set by Bob Martin in UNCW's 83-79 loss to Wake Forest when the arena opened on Nov. 26, 1977.

Roby paced the Buffaloes with 16 points, all in the first half. Jeremy Williams was the only other CU player in double figures with 14 markers.

Trailing by five points at halftime, the Seahawks finally caught up with the Buffs with a 7-0 mini-run midway through the second half. A finger roll by CU's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson with 15:48 remaining gave the Buffs a 40-36 lead, but UNCW reeled off seven unanswered points and grabbed a 43-40 edge when Fountain followed up his own shot at 13:09.

After CU sliced the deficit to two points, 49-47, with 6:18 left on a dunk by Jackson-Wilson, the Seahawks went on a 10-2 run. Freshman guard Daryl Felder converted a conventional three-point play on a spin move in the paint to start the rally and a jumper by Dejan Grkovic in the paint at 3:54 pushed the margin to 10 points, 59-49.

The Seahawks, who outrebounded the Buffs by a 37-32 margin, held CU to just six field goals and forced 11 turnovers in the final period.

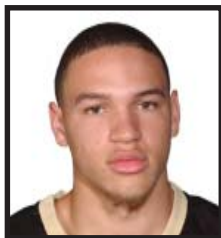
