**FOR STARTERS:** The last time Colorado started the Big 12 Conference season 1-5 it was 1998-99. The Buffaloes hold a 33-26 home advantage in the head-to-head series with Mizzou.

**CU vs. MISSOURI:** Coach Patton teams are 10-11 since the 1995-96 season, however are 8-3 in Boulder. The Buffs have won the last four games at the Events Center by an average of 13.5 points and have won straight over Mizzou.

**SCOUTING THE TIGERS:** Missouri enters tonight's Big 12 game having lost all four conference match ups by an average of seven points. They are the only team in the Big 12 not to win a conference game. The Tigers boast one of the conference's best players in Marshall Brown. Brown ranks second in the conference-only points average (21.3) and fifth in field goal percentage (.565). Jason Horton and Leo Lyons each have eight steals between them (2.0 spg.), while the Tigers lead the Big 12 in that category (44) with 11 steals a game. Stefhon Hannah is third nationally in steals.

**BROADCAST:** Tonight's game will be televised on Fox Sports Net Rocky Mountain. All Colorado men's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN AM 760, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. Mark Johnson will handle play-by-play duties and is joined by Charles Johnson with the color commentary.

**HOOK SHOTS:** Xavier Silas has led CU in scoring two straight games. He's the first CU player since the 2004-05 season to lead the team in scoring in back-to-back games, other than Richard Roby. Andy Osborn was the last player ... Silas is averaging 14.3 ppg., 6.0 rpg. in his last three games; In his last three games, Dominique Coleman is averaging 12.7 ppg., 9.0 rpg. ... Coleman has led or shared the team-high in rebounds five times ... Richard Roby needs eight points to move into 14th place on CU's all-time scoring list (1,246). If successful today, he'll pass Scott Wedman (1251) and Blair Wilson (1253) ... In his last four games, Dwight Thorne is averaging 22.2 minutes off the bench and 4.5 ppg., 2.0 rpg. **TEAM:** CU has scored under 60 points five times; under 55: four times; under-50: twice, both Big 12 road games ... CU has lost its last seven conference road games dating back to last year and averaging 61.7 ppg. during that span ... CU has allowed two first-year head coaches to win their first Big 12 game (OU, NU); Mizzou coach Mike Anderson is 0-4 in the Big 12 ... CU is 1-9 on the season after trailing at the half and 4-0 when leading at the 10, 5, 2 minutes marks of the game ... CU has allowed seven double-doubles by the opponent, 10 players to score 20+points ... CU has used nine different starting combinations through 15 games; lineup for A&M, ISU, at NU stayed the same.

**LAST TIME OUT** (complete box on page 19):

Aleks Maric scored 28 points and Jamel White added 18 points leading Nebraska to a 71-50 victory over Colorado Saturday. The Huskers held CU to just 13 first-half points, the lowest single-half point total by any conference opponent in the history of the Devaney Center. It was CU's second lowest first half output of the season after scoring 11 points in the first half against Air Force back on Nov. 18. The 50 points scored by CU was the fewest against the Huskers since Jan. 19, 1980 (44).

**COLEMAN ON THE RISE:** Dominique

Coleman sometimes gets lost in Richard Roby's shadow, but this year has contributed on a regular basis. Ranking second in points scored (11.0) and second in rebounding (6.1), the 6'3" sometimes point-guard is averaging 12.7 ppg., 9.0 rpg., 4.3 apg., 2.3 spg. in his last three games. He has led in rebounding five of 15 games and in scoring three times.

**"X" MARKS THE SPOT:** Xavier Silas became

the first CU player since the 2004-05 season to lead CU in scoring in back-to-back games (ISU, NU), a span of 46 games (Andy Osborn). Silas has started the last nine games averaging 12.7 ppg., and 4.6 rpg. Overall, he's averaging 29.5 minutes a game (leads all freshmen). Silas' season bests are 19 points (Iowa State, Jan. 17 and Pepperdine, Dec. 4); seven rebounds (at Nebraska, Jan. 20 and Central Florida, Jan. 3). He also scored 17 points against Texas (Jan. 6) and a team-high 14 at New Mexico (Nov. 14).

**ROBY VS. MIZZOU:** In his last four games

against Missouri, Richard Roby has had much success. One of his five career 30-point efforts came last year at the Mizzou Arena scoring a career-best 33 points (Jan. 14). He's averaging 18 points, four rebounds, two steals, .833 at the FT line (15-of-18, .833), 11-of-27 from the 3-point arc (.407), and .397 from the field (23-of-58).

**FTs WHEN IT COUNTS:** After 15 games, we're

**3-POINTERS HARD TO COME BY:** After

setting the 3-point school record last season with 240, CU is shooting a conference low .289 percent (86-for-298) from the 3-point arc in 15 games. At this pace CU is averaging 5.7 treys a game good enough for 142 3-pointers, their lowest since the 1993-94 season when they made 88. CU has made a 3-pointer in 151 straight games (Jan. 16, 2002 vs. Iowa State).

**TOP-10 SHOOTER:** Richard Roby is near-

ing the school's top-10 field goals attempts list. Entering tonight's game, Roby has 1,025 attempts nearing the 10th spot held by Jay Humphries (1980-84) with 1,058. As for field goals made, Roby is a bit behind Scott Wedman's 10th place of 516. Roby has 428 field goals made.

**END IS NEAR:** On Oct. 25, Coach Patton an-

nounced this would be his last season of coaching at CU. Patton said he would not seek nor accept an extension of his contract (expires June 30, 2007). In 11 years, Patton has 182 victories, four NIT appearances, two NCAA Tournaments, and three 20-win seasons.

**ON THE ROAD IN THE BIG 12:** Since the Big 12 formed (1996-97), CU has played 82 regular season games on the road. Heading into 2006-07, the Buffaloes under Coach Patton are 21-61 (.256). That means an average of 2.1 wins a season and 5.9 losses in eight road games. The highest win total was 4-4 in 1996-97; their lowest was one win in each of the 2002-03 (Baylor), 2001-02 (Texas A&M) and 1999-2000 (Kansas State) seasons.

**ON THE ROAD vs. Ranked Opponents:** With CU heading to Lawrence this Saturday to take on No. 8/8 Kansas, the Buffaloes are 0-22 when playing a ranked opponent on the road. Their last win came on Jan. 11, 1997 at Texas Tech, 80-78 (ot).

**MORE FROM THE ROAD...Part II:** Dating back to last season, CU has lost seven straight Big 12 road games ... In those seven games, CU is averaging 61.7 ppg. compared to 78.1 by their opponents; next road games are at Kansas on Saturday and at Baylor next Tuesday. CU hasn't won in Lawrence since Feb. 10, 1983.

**BUFF BITS:** CU has five double-doubles this season: **Jermyl Jackson-Wilson** (2), **Dominique Coleman** (2), **Richard Roby** (1) ... Roby has led the team in scoring eight times, including one shared and has scored double figures in 13 of 15 games ... Coleman recorded his second career double-double scoring a team-high 17 points and career-best 13 rebounds against Texas A&M (Jan. 13). The 13 boards are the most in a game since Roby grabbed 15 against Texas Tech last season ... Despite playing the point, Coleman has led CU in rebounding five times ... **Kal Bay** notched career-bests in vs. Central Florida: 21 pts., five three-pointers, three steals ... Coleman recorded his first of two double-doubles (Pepperdine 12 points, 10 rebounds) ... **Dwight Thorne** handed-out a season-best five assists vs. Pepperdine ... Thorne has made a 3-pointer in four straight conference

games ... Roby's 32 points against the Waves were the most since he scored 33 vs. Nebraska (back on Jan. 14).

**EXPERIENCE NEXT SEASON:** With Marcus Hall redshirting the 2006-07 season, this means the 6'1" guard from Houston, Texas will be returning next year. Hall will join seniors Richard Roby and Marcus King-Stockton and it will seem like old times again, but with a new coach. Hall has played 88 career games played (44 starts) and averages 8.3 points and 3.4 assists per game. He ranks ninth on the school's all-time assist list (295), 10th in 3-pointers made (99) and 19th in steals (82). Hall was also one of the captains on the 2005-06 team.

**CU vs. RANKED TEAMS:** The Buffaloes don't fare well against the nation's elite teams. After dropping an 18-point defeat to No. 8/9 Texas A&M, CU is now 11-49 (.183) in the Coach Patton era. In the last four years, CU has beaten at least one ranked school at home. However, on the road it's a much different story having lost their last 22-straight (last at No. 20 Texas Tech, Jan. 11, 80-78).

**AT HOME vs. RANKED OPPONENTS:** Since the 2002-03 season, CU has defeated at least one ranked opponent at the Coors Events Center. So far, they're 0-1 this season (No. 8/9 Texas A&M) with ranked opponents Kansas (Jan. 27) and Oklahoma State (Feb. 3) looming on the schedule. Last season, it was No. 18/19 Oklahoma, 84-75 (Feb. 15). In 2004-05, the Buffs defeated No. 23/22 Texas, 88-79. In 2003-04 it was No. 22/23 Texas Tech and during the last NCAA Tournament team in 2002-03, it was four opponents, including No. 3 Texas and No. 6 Kansas.

**MOST FRESHMEN EVER:** This year's 2006-07 men's team is comprised of the most freshmen ever on any Colorado roster with eight. Here's a look at the season, final record and the head coach how the numerous newcomers could mean. (\* last year coaching)

**CANCELLED GAMES:** The CU/UC Davis game (Dec. 23) was cancelled due to the inclement weather in the Denver area that caused severe travel difficulties; on Saturday, Dec. 30, both the TCU (men) and Houston (women) schools opted not to board their respective flights to Colorado. Officials from both schools cited the weather conditions in Colorado, despite the fact that their flights were not cancelled. The games will not be rescheduled this season.

**RARE LOSSES AT HOME:** Falling to Colorado State at home was the fourth time this season CU lost in Boulder. It's also marks the first time in the 11 years under coach Patton the Buffaloes have lost four home games in nonconference play.

**TEAM NOTES:** CU fell to 1-6 at home in Big 12 openers ... First time CU opened the Big 12 Conference season with three straight opponents (Texas, OU, A&M) who made NCAA Tournament a year ago ... CU's 0-2 start in conference play third straight season and eighth time in Patton's 11 years ... CU 10-14 at home against ranked opponents since 1996 ... Twice this season CU has allowed 100 points (at New Mexico and Texas). The last time the opponent scored 100+ three times in a season was 2001-02 (KU twice, Texas) ... CU is 1-9 when trailing at the half and 2-56 when trailing by 10 or more half (0-4 this season) ... CU shot a season-best .529 from the field (27-of-51), a school-best since shooting .577 against Savannah State in 2005-06 ... Against UCF, both teams combined for 55 free throws made breaking the Events Center record of 53 ... CU's 36 made free throws against UCF are the most since making 36 back on Feb. 22, 1997 (Missouri) ... Buffs suffered four non-conference home losses this season, a school-first since 1975-76.

**NONCONFERENCE PLAY:** CU finished 4-6, their first losing season in nonconference play since 1988-89 when they finished 5-8. It's also the fewest nonconference games the Buffaloes have played

since the 1997-98 campaign when they finished 6-4.

**SURPRISE LINEUP ADDITION:** Chase Perkowski became the second player in the 11 plus years under Coach Patton to start a game as a non-scholarship player. The first came in Patton's 1995-96 season (where he was named interim then head coach) toward the end of the year. Jamie Miller started Feb. 28, 1996 against Nebraska and played only three minutes and only six games for the season. Perkowski came off the bench in the early stages of the first half at UNCW. The sophomore from San Juan Capistrano, Calif. took a charge in four minutes.

**ROOKIES IN THE STARTING LINE UP:** Kal Bay became only the fifth rookie in Coach Patton's 11 years to start the first game of the season (vs. Denver). The others were guard Alan Barkdale (1996-97), guard/forward Michel Morandais (2000-01), point-guard Antoine McGee (2002-03) and guard Richard Roby (2004-05). Remember, Chauncey Billups started at CU in 1995-96 when Patton was an assistant under Joe Harrington.

**BIG 12 OPENER WRAP:** CU fell for the 10th straight time in a conference opener, this time to Texas. The Buffs have not won a conference opener since Jan. 4, 1997.

**PRESEASON ROBY REVIEW:** Before the season started Richard Roby was named to a trio of preseason honors lists: the top-50 preseason candidates for the Naismith Trophy ... one of 50 preseason candidates named to the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team. Roby is the first CU player to be named to the Wooden List since David Harrison in 2003-04 ... Roby was named to the preseason All-Big 12 Team along with sophomores Brandon Rush and Julian Wright (Kansas), junior Joseph Jones (Texas A&M) and seniors Acie Law (Texas A&M) and Jarrius Jackson (Texas Tech).

**CU vs. MOUNTAIN WEST:** With the cancellation of the CU/TCU game (Dec. 30), the Buffs played five games against the Mountain West Conference and finished with a 1-4 record. CU is only 11-11 (.500) since 1996-97 and since 2002-03, 6-6 (.500) against the conference.

**TEAM TIDBITS:** The Nov. 10 match up with Denver was the earliest CU has started the season in its 105-year history...CU's 96 points scored against Central Florida was the most scored since beating up Savannah State, 116-52 on Jan. 3, 2006...CU's 12 blocked shots vs. Northern Colorado was the most since swatting 12 on Dec. 22, 2005 (Mercer) ... Allowing New Mexico to score 100 points on Nov. 14, was the first time CU allowed that many in a game since falling to Oklahoma State, Jan. 30, 2004 (L, 86-104). The 41-point loss at New Mexico is the most since losing by 32 points at Utah (80-48) on Dec. 30, 2004 and by 43 to Texas at the Big 12 Tournament, March 10, 2000 (78-35) ... The win at Utah was its first in seven road games (at Oklahoma State, Jan. 21, 80-78, OT) ... CU losses to New Mexico (41 points) and Air Force (38 points) were the worst back-to-back losses since losing consecutive 30+ point games Jan. 29, 1994 (Kansas, 87-53) and Feb. 1 (at Iowa State, 99-69)...CU's 46 point loss versus USAFA is the lowest point total since scoring 48 points at Utah (Dec. 30, 2004) ... CU remained unbeaten in 11 season openers under coach Ricardo Patton (9-0 in

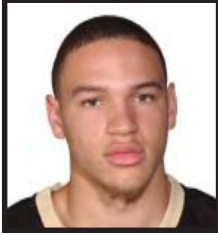

**BOULDER (AP)** - Richard Roby scored 20 points and Colorado remained unbeaten in 11 season openers under coach Ricardo Patton during the Buffaloes' 78-64 win over Denver.

Colorado's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson grabbed 17 rebounds, including 10 in the first half, and had 14 points, giving him his first career double-double. Jackson-Wilson's 11 offensive boards and his 17 for the game are the most by a Buff in a debut. Dominique Coleman, the lone senior on Colorado's roster, finished with 19 points and seven assists.

DaShawn Walker led Denver with 16 points. Joseph Jackson and Tyler Bullock each added 15 points.

It's the first time the two teams have played since 2000. Colorado leads the all-time series 56-25 and has won the last five in a row. Patton, who announced he'll step down at the end of his 11th season, is 4-0 against the Pioneers.

The Buffaloes led by as many as 21 points in the second half.

Roby had a play late in the first half that probably won't make his highlight reel. Roby attempted a one-handed dunk on a breakaway but was rejected by the rim and fell to the floor. He smiled as he headed back down the court. The Buffs were up 17 points at the time.

Xavier Silas was assessed a technical with 9:23 left in the first half for hanging on the rim.

The Pioneers trimmed a 17-point deficit in the first half to 37-24 at halftime with a 5-1 run to close out the half.

Denver freshman guard Nate Rohnert rolled his ankle during a shoot-around Friday morning and was held out of the game. The Pioneers were already missing junior guard Mykhael Lattimore (right thumb injury) and junior center Adam Tanner (fractured left arm). They're expected to miss at least three more games.

Colorado guard Kal Bay became just the fifth freshman to start in the opener during Patton's tenure. Roby started for Patton in 2004-05.

**ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP)** - J.R. Giddens scored a career high 25 points and New Mexico got a huge first half lift from its bench in a 106-65 win over Colorado.

New Mexico (3-0) took its first lead at 15-14 on a pair of free throws by Jeffrey Henfield with 11:46 left in the first half. New Mexico's reserves, who scored 25 points in the first half, and some solid free throw shooting, carried the Lobos' offense until Giddens found his stroke.

The Lobos hit their first 13 free throws and reserves Daniel Faris, Chad Toppert and Ryan Kersten provided much of the offense in the first 20 minutes.

Toppert hit a trio of 3-pointers in the first half, Faris scored 8 points and Kersten 6. Toppert's back-to-back 3s gave the Lobos a 36-25 lead with 5:02 left in the first half.

Faris, the sophomore backup center, finished with career highs of 14 points and 8 rebounds.

New Mexico led 47-34 at halftime and broke it open from there as the Lobos shot 67 percent in the second half. Giddens was the catalyst. He scored on a jumper in the lane, then came up with a steal and dunk that pushed the lead to 62-39 with 12:55 left.

Giddens, a junior who New Mexico coach Ritchie McKay has tabbed a likely lottery pick in next summer's NBA draft, flexed his muscles to the crowd of more than 12,000 after the dunk.

Giddens hit 11 of 19 shots and along with Faris and Aaron Johnson led the Lobos to a 51-35 edge in rebounding. Giddens had 9 rebounds and Johnson 11.

**BOULDER (AP)** - The Colorado Buffaloes men's basketball team were held to 11 points in the first half and fell to the Air Force Falcons at the Coors Events Center.

Sophomore forward Jermyl Jackson-Wilson led Colorado with nine points. Leading scorer, junior guard Richard Roby was held to six points on 3-for-14 shooting.

Nick Welch added 18 points for Air Force (4-0), which last started out with four straight wins in the 1998-99 season, when it began 5-0. The Falcons hit 13-of-25 3-pointers, four by Tim Anderson.

The first half output of 11 was Colorado's lowest scoring half since being held to four points in the first half of a Jan. 23, 1980 game at Missouri.

It was also the first time CU failed to place a player in double figures since Feb. 15, 1992 at Kansas. Poncho Hodges and Joe Stephens each scored nine points in the 82-45 loss.

Colorado took a 4-0 lead early, but trailed 35-11 at halftime thanks to a scoring drought that lasted nearly 12 minutes and a patient Air Force team that shot 52 percent and had 11 points from Welch.

After a basket by junior forward, Marcus King-Stockton, the Buffaloes missed 11 straight shots and turned the ball over five times while the Falcons' Dan Nwaelele buried three, 3-pointers as part of a 22-0 run that ended with Matt McGraw following his own miss to push Air Force ahead 22-4.

Jackson-Wilson ended the scoreless string with a basket at 6:49 that drew a roar from the crowd. Colorado, which shot 23 percent for the half, managed only seven points the rest of the period, two by Roby, who was 1-for-8 shooting.

Things didn't get much better in the second half for Colorado. The Buffaloes improved their shooting to 42 percent, but fell behind 47-17 after a 3-pointer from Welch and a layup and free throw from Keith Henke.

**SALT LAKE CITY, Utah (AP)** - Richard Roby scored 22 points, and teammate Jermyl Jackson-Wilson made a free throw with 2.1 seconds remaining to lift Colorado to a 60-59 victory over Utah Tuesday night.

Kal Bay added 11 points and three 3 pointers for the Buffaloes who won at Utah for the first time in six tries dating back to 1946. It's also the first road win in seven road games for CU since winning at Oklahoma State back on Jan. 21, 2006 in overtime (80-78).

Jackson-Wilson missed his second of two free throws, and the Utes rebounded and called timeout with 1.8 seconds left. But Lawrence Borhas desperation three-pointer missed badly as time expired.

The victory was the first for the Buffaloes (2-2) after back-to-back blowout losses, while the Utes fell to a 0-3 start for the first time since 1970.

Johnnie Bryant scored 20 points for the Utes, including 11 in a row to start the second half, and Luke Nevill added 14 points and 10 rebounds.

But the Utes committed two crucial turnover in the final minute, with the game tied 59-59.

The first came on a bad pass after Utah's Shaun Green drew a charging foul on Roby, and the second came when the Utes lost the ball on a fast break following a blocked shot by Nevill. Borha fouled Jackson-Wilson in the ensuing scramble to set up the winning free throws.

Jackson-Wilson added 10 for the Buffaloes, who forced 17 turnovers and held the Utes to 43.6 percent shooting.

The teams combined for 17 turnovers in the first half, and the Utes made 6-of-22 shots. Neither team led by more than six points.

**WILMINGTON, N.C.** - Junior guard Daniel Fountain poured in a career-high 21 points and UNC Wilmington held Colorado to 18 points in the second half for a 67-55 come-from-behind victory over the Buffaloes in the home opener for the Seahawks.

The Seahawks improved to 2-3 on the season and snapped a three-game losing streak as they made new skipper Benny Moss a winner in his first home game. The Buffaloes dropped to 2-4 in the new season.

Fountain paced three players in double digits for the Seahawks, who shot 44.8 percent to just 37.3 percent for the Buffaloes. With guard Richard Roby sidelined most of the second half with cramps, CU managed just 26.1 percent from the floor after the break.

Senior playmaker Temi Soyobo poured in 12 points - all in the first half - on 6-of-8 shooting and added nine rebounds and dished out five assists in an all-around game. He also had eight steals to match the record set by Bob Martin in UNCW's 83-79 loss to Wake Forest when the arena opened on Nov. 26, 1977.

Roby paced the Buffaloes with 16 points, all in the first half. Jeremy Williams was the only other CU player in double figures with 14 markers.

Trailing by five points at halftime, the Seahawks finally caught up with the Buffs with a 7-0 mini-run midway through the second half. A finger roll by CU's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson with 15:48 remaining gave the Buffs a 40-36 lead, but UNCW reeled off seven unanswered points and grabbed a 43-40 edge when Fountain followed up his own shot at 13:09.

After CU sliced the deficit to two points, 49-47, with 6:18 left on a dunk by Jackson-Wilson, the Seahawks went on a 10-2 run. Freshman guard Daryl Felder converted a conventional three-point play on a spin move in the paint to start the rally and a jumper by Dejan Grkovic in the paint at 3:54 pushed the margin to 10 points, 59-49.

The Seahawks, who outrebounded the Buffs by a 37-32 margin, held CU to just six field goals and forced 11 turnovers in the final period.

CU gained the final possession and it would take two missed jumpers before Jackson-Wilson picked up the offensive rebound and hit the game-winning shot to end the game.

Jackson-Wilson also added seven rebounds, six blocked shots, four assists and three steals.

He fouled Denson with 18 seconds left and Denson again hit one of two, giving the Rams a 72-69 lead. Roby was long a 3-pointer that would have tied it with 10 seconds left and the Rams got the ball out of bounds.

This time, they weren't trapped and go the ball upcourt to dribble out their rare win in Boulder.

Cory Lewis added 13 points for the Rams and Stephan Gilling had 12 on 4-of-5 shooting from beyond the arc. Jermyl Jackson-Wilson added 10 points for the Buffs.

**BOULDER (AP)** - Freshman Kevin Durant scored a career-high 37 points to go with 16 rebounds as Texas won its ninth straight Big 12 Conference opener in a 102-78 victory Saturday over Colorado.

Durant was 5-for-7 on 3-pointers as he outgunned Colorado's Richard Roby.

Damion James, D.J. Augustin and A.J. Abrams had 15 points each for Texas (11-3, 1-0 Big 12). Roby led Colorado (4-7, 0-1) with 30 points, three points short of his career high. Xavier Silas added 17 points for the Buffaloes, who lost their 10th consecutive conference opener.

Colorado hasn't won a conference opener since beating Nebraska 79-73 on Jan. 4, 1997.

Roby buried a 3-pointer three minutes into the second half, but 30 seconds later Durant matched it with one of his own, putting Texas up 61-53. Durant connected on another 3-pointer with 15:38 left to begin a 19-7 run that also included two 3-pointers each by Abrams and Augustin that stretched the Longhorns' lead to 80-62.

A 3-pointer by J.D. Lewis and dunk by Durant extended the Texas lead, 88-66 with 7:56 remaining. Roby went scoreless over the last six minutes of the game and CU never got closer than 17 points in the final 5:50 of the game.

Roby and Durant nearly matched shot for shot in the first half. Durant, who had 21 points and three 3-pointers by halftime, had a scoop shot layup and free throw to put Texas up 50-43 with 2:23 before the break.

CU got four free throws from Roby in the last 1:34 as the Buffaloes closed the gap to 51-48 at intermission. Roby was 3-for-5 on 3-pointers and had 22 points in the first half.

**NORMAN, Okla. (AP)** - Nate Carter came off the bench to score 15 points and grab eight rebounds as Oklahoma defeated Colorado, 78-54 on Wednesday in the Sooners' Big 12 Conference home opener, giving rookie coach Jeff Capel his first league win.

Oklahoma (9-5, 1-1 Big 12) snapped a two-game losing streak. The Sooners have beaten Colorado (4-8, 0-2) 22 straight times at the Lloyd Noble Center, a streak that dates to February 1980.

Carter has 28 points and 17 rebounds in the Sooners' two league games. Freshman Tony Crocker, who entered the game with a 10.9-point scoring average, had 16 points and eight rebounds, and point guard Austin Johnson added 10 points for Oklahoma.

The Sooners controlled the basketball game on the defensive end, holding the Buffaloes to five points in the first 8:18. Colorado's final point total was about 17 below its previous season average.

Oklahoma also harassed the Buffaloes into a season-high 25 turnovers - stepping into passing lanes for 14 steals - and blocked three shots.

The loss was Colorado's fourth in five games. It's the eighth time in Big 12 history that the Buffaloes have started league play 0-2.

After scoring 30 points in CU's last game, against Texas, Richard Roby scored 20 points. Freshman forward Jeremy Williams had eight points to go with a season-best 12 rebounds for the Buffaloes.

The Sooners never trailed, jumping out to a 16-5 lead early behind five early points from Carter.

A layup by Dwight Thorne and a 3-pointer by Roby pulled the Buffaloes to within two points with just over four minutes left in the first half. Carter responded with a short jumper and Crocker took a charge on Colorado's next possession, then hit two free throws to extend the Sooners' lead.

Oklahoma ended the half on a 13-4 run and led 37-26 at halftime.

**BOULDER (AP)** - Joseph Jones scored 18 points and grabbed a career-high 15 rebounds as No. 8 Texas A&M beat Colorado 87-69 on Saturday night for its eighth straight victory.

"I thought our guys grew up in a lot of ways this afternoon," said head coach Ricardo Patton. "I thought our guys played extremely hard for about 30 minutes, and then we just have to learn how to play like that for 40 minutes. You have to learn how to win ball games and sometimes when you have not experienced much success, you don't know how to succeed."

The Aggies (15-2, 3-0 Big 12) are off to their best start since opening 16-2 in 1959-60. The last time Texas A&M started 3-0 in league play was 1993-94 when it was a member of the Southwest Conference. Acie Law, in foul trouble most of the game, had 21 points for the Aggies. Josh Carter scored 19 before fouling out late, and Antanas Kavaliauskas finished with 15.

Colorado was led by Dominique Coleman with 17 points. He also had a career-best 13 rebounds.

Colorado (4-9, 0-3) has beaten a ranked opponent at home in each of the last four years, but it couldn't upset the Aggies. The Buffaloes were as close as 57-56 with less than 10 minutes remaining — and had several chances to take the lead — but couldn't capitalize.

The Aggies put Colorado away with a 19-3 run as the Buffaloes went more than three minutes without a basket. Richard Roby scored 11 points, his 10th straight game in double figures. He came in averaging 25 points in Big 12 play.

Iowa State chipped away and took a 33-31 lead into the locker room on Rahshon Clark's pull-up 3-pointer just before the halftime buzzer. The Cyclones were just 1-for-11 from beyond the arc before Clark's swish, which capped a 14-3 run.

Silas scored 11 straight points, on a trio of 3-pointers and a layup down the baseline, to help the Buffaloes regain their lead at 47-41 in the opening minutes of the second half, and Colorado never trailed again.

Silas' 3-pointer with 6:47 left gave the Buffs a 58-52 lead that they extended to 63-52 on Jermyl Jackson-Wilson's three points and a bucket by Dominique Coleman (nine points, seven rebounds, four assists, four steals).

**LINCOLN, Neb. (AP)** - Aleks Maric scored 28 points and Jamel White added 18 points, but it was a stellar effort on the defensive end that led the Nebraska men's basketball team to a 71-50 victory over Colorado Saturday at the Bob Devaney Sports Center.

The Huskers held Colorado to just 13 first-half points, the lowest single-half point total by any conference opponent in the history of the Devaney Center. The Buffaloes' 13 points were also just one more than the Devaney Center record for few points scored in a half set by Arkansas in 1987, Bethune-Cookman in 2003 and Morgan State in 2004.

It was CU's second lowest first half output of the season after scoring 11 points in the first half against Air Force back on Nov. 18.

Xavier Silas led two Buffaloes in doubles figures with 13 points, although he hit only five of his 12 shots from the field. Coleman added 12 points and five assists.
