Kristen Karlik stepped right into a starting roll for the Buffs in 2006 and will look to continue her stellar performance in 2007. She was a great addition for CU and looks to make a name for herself in the CU record book as a senior.

As a Junior in 2006

Karlik made an immediate impact in the Colorado line-up as the starting libero. She recorded nine matches with 20 or more digs and only picked up

single-digits on four occasions. Karlik picked up a career-high 26 twice. The first time came on Sept. 13 against No. 17 Missouri. The second time was against No. 3 Washington in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Karlik became the first Buff since 2000 to record 20 or more digs in a match and the first Buff since 2001 to pick up more than 25. She collected 442, which ranks third on the single-season chart. Karlik served up 22 aces, which tied for third on the team. She recorded two aces in a match nine times, including in the upset of No. 1 Nebraska. Karlik also recorded four kills on the season. She handed out a career-high five assists in a three-game sweep over Kansas (11/8). Karlik recorded one kills, four assists, one ace and 22 digs in a five-game comeback against Baylor (11/22) on senior night. She ranked fourth in the Big 12 in digs per game with 4.21 and was fourth in conference only matches with 4.13. Karlik was named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament Team after averaging 5.00 digs per game as the Buffs swept all three of their opponents. She made her Colorado debut against Denver (8/25).

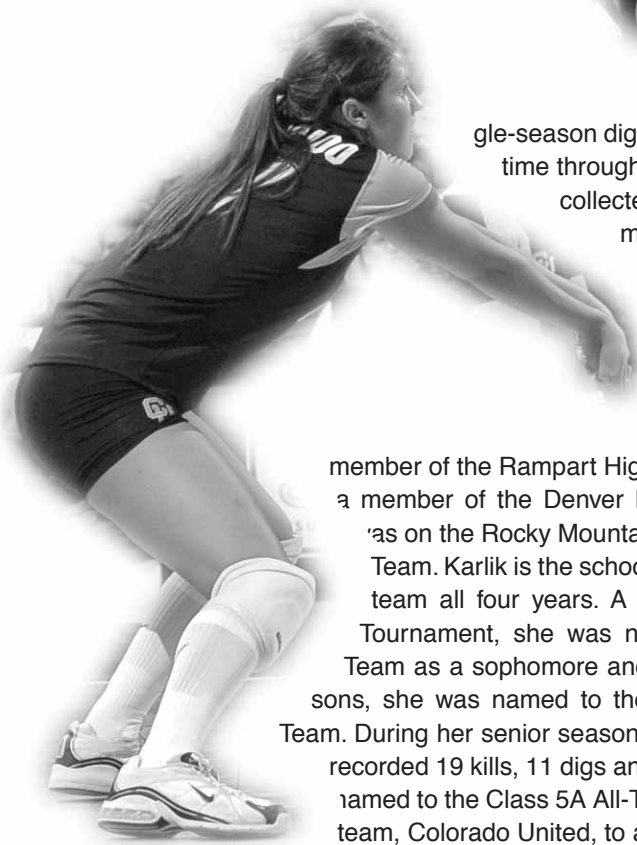
At Colorado State

Karlik recorded 524 digs while at CSU. She picked up her 500th against Idaho (11/24/04) with her second dig of the match. In 2004, Karlik tallied 20 digs in a four-game contest against Utah (10/15), becoming the only Ram to record 20 digs in a match that season. She recorded 352

digs (3.42 dpg) as a sophomore and ranks seventh on the single-season digs chart. As a freshman, Karlik started the final 11 matches, but also saw time throughout the season as a serving specialist, setter and right side hitter. She collected 172 digs in her freshman season and played in 34 of CSU's 35 matches. Karlik was also a member of the Mountain West Conference Championship team in 2003 and 04.

High School

Karlik earned four letters as a member of the Rampart High School volleyball team. She was a member of the Denver Post 2002 All-Colorado team and was on the Rocky Mountain New Class 5A All-State Second Team. Karlik is the school record holder in aces and led her team all four years. A three-time MVP of the Arapahoe Tournament, she was named to the Metro League First Team as a sophomore and junior. In Karlik's final three seasons, she was named to the Colorado Springs Gazette First Team. During her senior season, RHS lost in the semifinals. Karlik recorded 19 kills, 11 digs and three aces in the match and was named to the Class 5A All-Tournament Team. She led her club team, Colorado United, to a third-place finish at the Baltimore

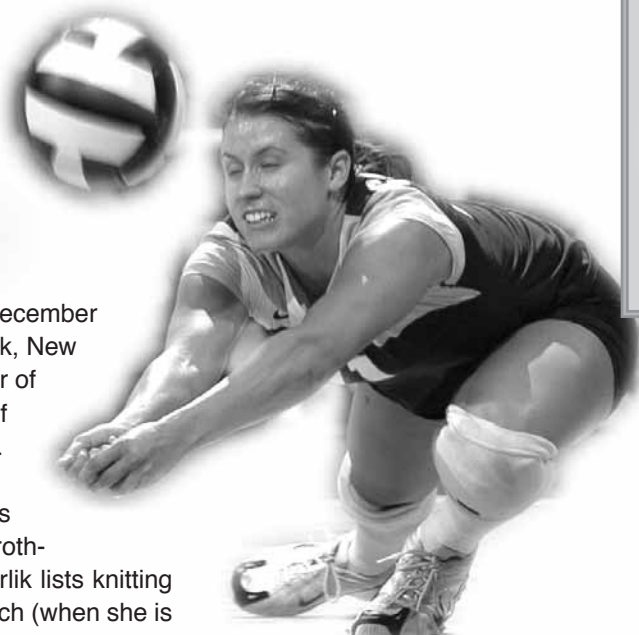

Amber Sutherland in 2007

Amber Sutherland will redshirt the 2007 season. She ranks 15th on the all-time career kills chart and is just 98 kills from the elite 1,000-career kills club. Sutherland will be an important part of CU's offense, but can also step up on defense as she ranks 24th overall on the career digs list.

As a Junior in 2006

Sutherland had a stellar junior season and led CU in kills with 456 kills, which is tied for fifth on the single-season chart with Rachel Wacholder (1996).

Sutherland is also 10th in season attacks (1,182) and 31st in season digs (312). She averaged 4.18 kills per game, which ranked fourth in the Big 12. She also averaged 4.74 points per game, sixth in the league. Sutherland had seven matches with over 20 kills, including a match against No. 17 Missouri where she recorded a career-high with 35 kills. She became the first Buff since 1997 to reach the 30 kill mark and the 35 kills was the third-highest total in CU history. Sutherland was named the Big 12 Player of the Week and the CU Athlete of the Week for the first time in her career on Sept. 18 due to her performance against MU. She added 14 digs and hit .397. Sutherland led CU with 16 double-doubles. She recorded double-figures in kills 23 times and digs 18 times. Sutherland put up a career-high six blocks twice this season, once against Kansas State (one solo and five assists) and once against Iowa State (six assists). She helped CU defeat No. 1 Nebraska (11/1) by notching 18 kills, 11 digs and four block assists. Her 100th career block came in the match. Sutherland was named to the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament team after collecting 35 kills, 35 digs and 11 blocks in nine games. She was named All-Big 12 honorable mention for the first time in her career. Sutherland is 15th on the career kills chart, just 98 from the 1,000 mark. She is also 24th in career digs (618) and 15th in career attacks. She was the only Buff to play and start in every match.

As a Sophomore in 2005

Sutherland started every match and played in all but one game as a sophomore. She ranked second on the team in kills with 3.86, which ranked sixth in the Big 12. Sutherland led the Buffs in digs with 290, ranking 15th in the league. In Big 12 only matches, she was ninth in kills (3.63) and 13th in digs (2.62). Sutherland tallied a team-high 15 double-doubles, reaching double figures in kills 26 times. She recorded a career-best 26 kills (.476) and 28 points at Kansas State (11/16), despite a dislocated finger. Sutherland led the Buffs in kills and digs on 11 occasions, which included a career-high 19 digs at Texas Tech (10/8). The 19 digs were a team-best in 2005. In Sutherland's first match as a sophomore, she hit a career-high .624, registering 12 kills on 16 attempts with two errors against St. Peter's (8/27). Sutherland hit above .300 on 13 occasions and hit .400 or above six times. She was named to the America University Classic, Colorado Invitational and University of Denver All-Tournament Teams.

As a Freshman in 2004

Sutherland played in just four out of the first 20 matches of the season, but after shoulder injury sidelined Maragda Santillana, she competed in seven of the final eight contests and showed some great promise. Her best match was arguably CU's NCAA Tournament outing against undefeated and No. 2 ranked Hawai'i. She played all four games finishing with a career-high nine digs and a personal-best tying two blocks. Her pair of blocks, which nearly doubled her season output, both came late in game one allowing the Buffs to take the frame from the Rainbow Wahine. She registered a personal-high six kills while playing all three games at No. 14 Texas A&M (11/7). Sutherland made her collegiate debut at Oregon (9/3) recording one dig and tallied her first kill at Iowa State (10/5) on match point as CU wrapped up a three-game win.

High School

Named the 2003 *Rocky Mountain News* and *Denver Post* Colorado Class 4A Player of the Year after leading Glenwood Springs High School to a 29-1 record and a spot in the state semifinals. Earned a spot on the 2003 *Rocky Mountain News* All-Colorado volleyball team, and was the only non-Class 5A selection. Also named to the *Denver Post* All-Colorado volleyball squad. Selected as one of the top 100 high school volleyball players in the country by PrepVolleyball.com. Topped Class 4A in kills (385) and attacks as a senior while hitting .382. A four-time, All-Western Slope League selection. Tabbed the Western Slope Player of the Year in 2003. Second-team all-state selection as a sophomore. Led the Demons to an overall record of 82-17 during her four-year varsity career. Lettered in both track & field and basketball as well. Sutherland was the 2003 Colorado Class 4A state champion in the discus and runner-up in the shot put. In 2004 she was the state runner-up in both the discus and shot put. Holds school record in the discus at 130-7 and freshman records for shot put (35-10), long jump (15-11) and discus (120-11). Leading scorer for the Demons' basketball squad as a senior, earning a spot on the All-Western Slope League team.

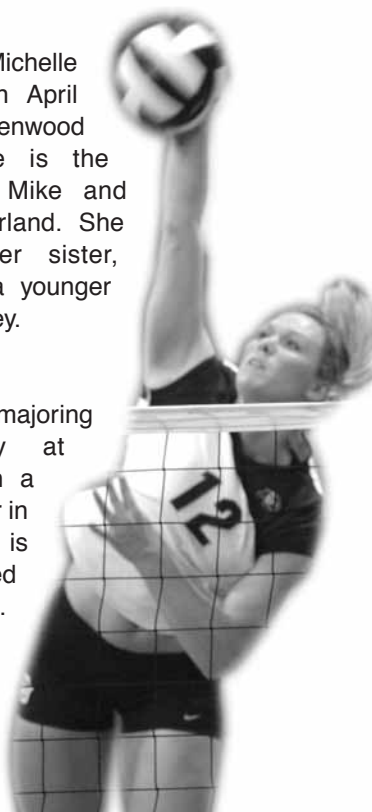

Therese Viñal's knowledge of the Colorado system will help her provide valuable leadership in her senior season. Her work ethic and dedication to the team is second to none.

As a Junior in 2006

Viñal saw action in six games as a junior. She played a season-high three games against Texas Tech (9/16), helping CU to a three game sweep.

Viñal also saw time against Central Connecticut State (9/8), Southern Mississippi (9/9), Texas (9/20) and Baylor (11/22). She recorded seven digs, one assist and one ace. Viñal was named to the inaugural Big 12 Good Works Team in the fall.

As a Sophomore in 2005

Viñal played in 95 games as a sophomore, leading all of CU's defensive specialists in time on the court. She was third on the team in digs with 227 and averaged 2.39 per game. Viñal led the Buffs on five occasions in digs. With 24 aces, she was second on the squad and led the team eight times. Viñal recorded four aces for a career-high against Texas A&M (11/19). She picked up a career-best 19 digs in a three-game victory over Oklahoma (10/22). Viñal also notched 18 digs against Kansas State (11/16) and 17 versus Texas A&M (10/16). She played in 27 of 28 matches, only sitting out against American as CU started its season. For the year, she also tallied 14 assists, tying a career-best of three against Iowa State (10/26).

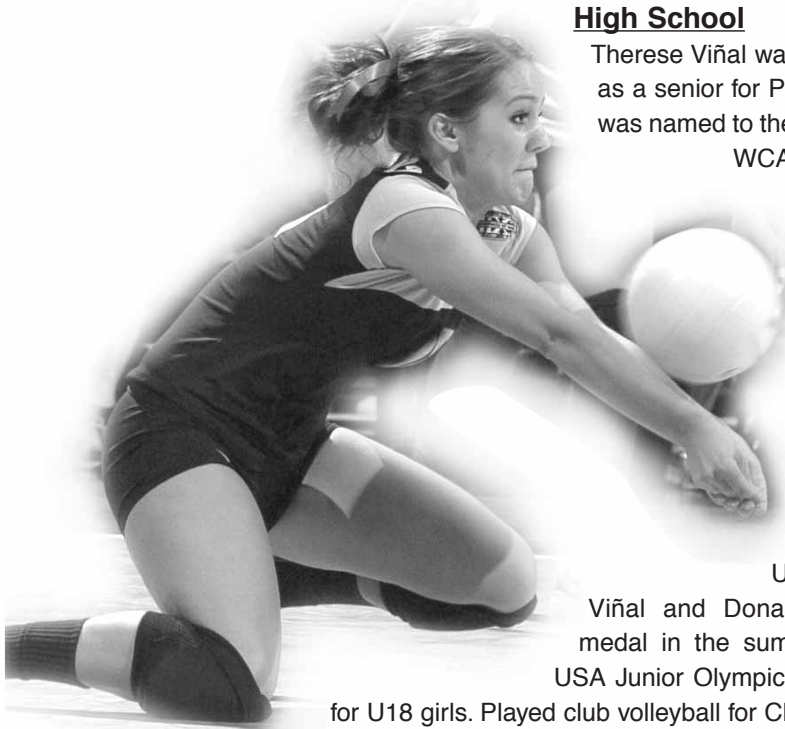
As a Freshman in 2004

Viñal appeared in 26 of 28 matches and served as libero in 18 contests. She played the libero spot for the first time in the final three games of the North Carolina match (9/11) recording 12 digs. It was the first of her seven matches with 10 or more digs with the top performance coming against Texas Tech (10/30) where she had 15. Viñal played the libero position in at least part of all but four Big 12 matches averaging 2.16 digs per game in those contests. She led all CU defensive specialists with 137 digs and was third overall on the team in digs per game (1.96) and ranked fourth in aces per game (0.14). She made her collegiate debut against Denver (9/1), playing in two games with an assist and ace and one dig.

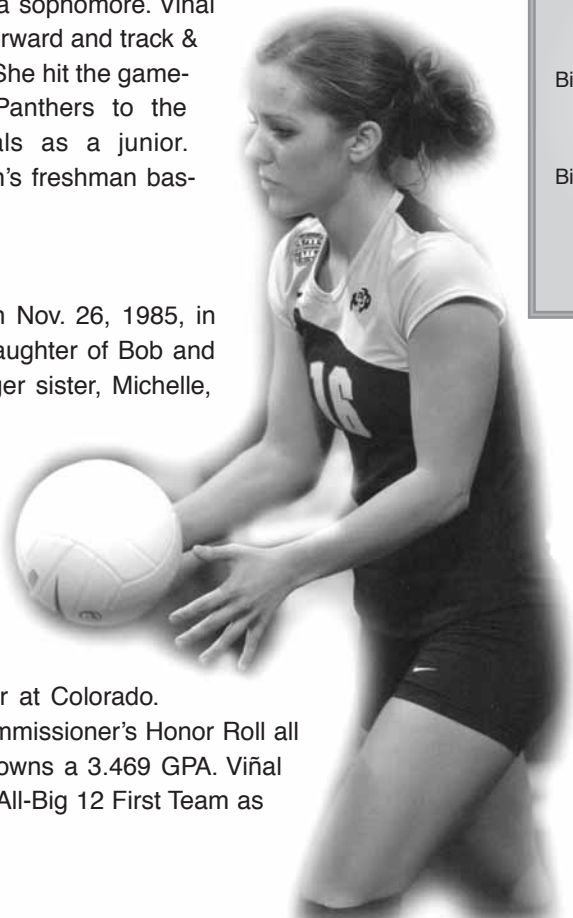

Alex Buth in 2007

Alex Buth returns on the right side for the Buffs and brings valuable experience with her as a starter last season. Her athleticism and competitiveness will help CU remain an NCAA tournament contender

As a Sophomore in 2006

Buth moved from a serving specialist as a freshman, to a full-time starter at right side. She recorded 231 kills, 213 digs, 67 blocks and 27 aces on the season and notched four double-doubles. Buth was third on the team in kills, fourth in digs and second

in aces. Buth was the only Buff named to the Hawaiian Airlines Wahine Classic All-Tournament Team. At the tourney, she recorded her first double-double against Hawai'i (9/2) with 10 kills and 13 digs and recorded 11 kills against Florida (9/3). Buth had a stellar performance at Baylor (10/18) with 14 kills, 11 digs, five blocks, three aces and hit .464. She hammered a career-high 17 kills in a five-game win against Kansas State (11/1). Buth notched eight kills against Central Connecticut State (9/9) on 15 errorless swings to hit .533. She hit in double-figures 11 times as a sophomore. Buth recorded the last point in CU's first win over a No. 1 opponent (Nebraska, 11/11) in front of a record crowd 4,111 at the Coors Events Center. She played in all but one game and started in every match except one.

As a Freshman in 2005

Buth played in 27 of 28 matches, including 84 games. She led the team in aces with 28. Buth became the first Buff since Monique Gerlach in 2000, to serve five aces in a match against Oklahoma (9/24). She also recorded four against Kansas (11/2), leading CU in aces six times. Buth averaged 0.33 aces per game, which ranked 10th in the league. In conference only matches, she was fifth with 0.35. Buth's first career start came against top-ranked Nebraska (11/23). In the match, she was CU's top attacker, hitting at a .545 percentage. She tallied seven kills on 11 attempts with just one error. Buth also

started the next match against No. 4 ranked Florida (11/25). Both starts were in place of an injured Allie Griffin. Buth made her collegiate debut against American (8/27). In the match, she recorded a career-high eight kills, 14 attacks and 10.5 points.

As a Redshirt Freshman in 2004

Sat out the 2004 as a redshirt in the Colorado volleyball program. She participated in both fall practice and spring drills.

High School

As a senior in 2004, Alex Buth was one of 12 finalists for Michigan's Miss Volleyball Award given annually to the state's top player. She led East Grand Rapids High School to consecutive district titles in 2003 and 2004, advancing to regional finals in both seasons. In her senior year, the Pioneers were ranked as high as third in Class B and finished with a 57-5 record. Buth earned first team all-conference, all-region and all-state honors after the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons. She was named first team all-conference and second team all-region as a sophomore. Buth started as a freshman for the Pioneers, gaining honorable mention to the all-conference team. She played club volleyball for Far Out and helped the 18-under Open squad win the 2004 Michigan Junior Volleyball Association state tournament title. She also participated in the Junior Olympics with Far Out in Atlanta in 2003. An accomplished prep tennis player, Buth led East Grand Rapids to four Michigan Division 3 state championships. She won the No. 3 singles state title as a sophomore and the No. 4 singles crown as a freshman. A two-time all-state selection, Buth was the No. 1 singles runner up as a senior and reached the No. 1

Lauren Schaefer will be a force to be reckoned with in the middle. An All-Big 12 honorable mention, she looks to build on what she has started in the conference last season. Schaefer will be a leader on the court for the Buffs.

As a Sophomore in 2006

Schaefer saw the most action of any of Colorado's middle blockers in 2006. She played in 28 matches, starting in 23. Schaefer led the Buffs in block-

ing with 92 (13 solo and 79 assists). She was third in hitting percentage (.301) and was fourth in kills (226) and points (279.5). Schaefer also ranked 10th in Big 12 only matches with a hitting percentage of .308. She recorded a career-high three block solos against Oklahoma (9/30). Schaefer recorded a career-high 19 kills and five digs against Kansas State (11/1) and added six block assists for a career-best 22.0 points. She hit .750 against No. 5 Florida (9/3) with three kills on four swings and .688 against Cincinnati (9/7) with 11 kills on 16 errorless swings. In a five-game upset of No. 17 Missouri (9/13), Schaefer recorded 12 kills and four blocks. She hit above .333 in 13 matches and recorded 10 or more kills in 11 matches. Schaefer is 22nd on the career blocks list with 180 and is 23rd on the single season chart with 92.

As a Freshman in 2005

Schaefer saw time in every match as a freshman, including 26 starts. She cranked out a career-high 13 kills and 15.5 points in an upset of No. 8 Missouri (10/29). Schaefer hit .700 against Texas Tech (11/5) when she tallied seven kills on 10 attacks with no errors. On three occasions, she recorded seven blocks, which tied for the team-high on the season. Against Iowa State (9/28), Schaefer tallied seven block assists and against Kansas State (10/12) and Texas A&M (10/16), she recorded one block solo and six assists. She notched 12 kills against No. 11 Texas (11/9). In both matches against top-ranked Nebraska, Schaefer tallied five kills. On the season, she hit .242 and in conference only matches, she hit .273, which ranked 13th in the league. Schaefer made her collegiate debut against St. Peter's (8/27).

High School

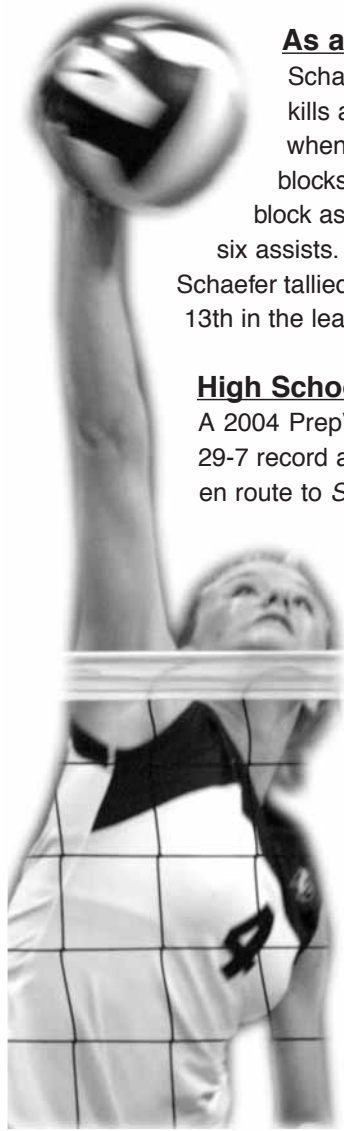

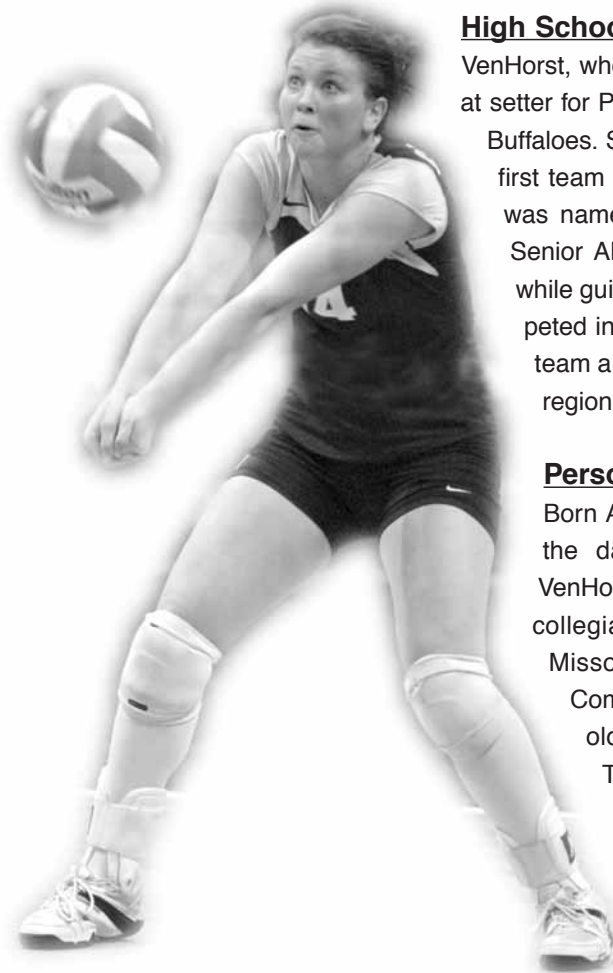
As a Sophomore in 2006

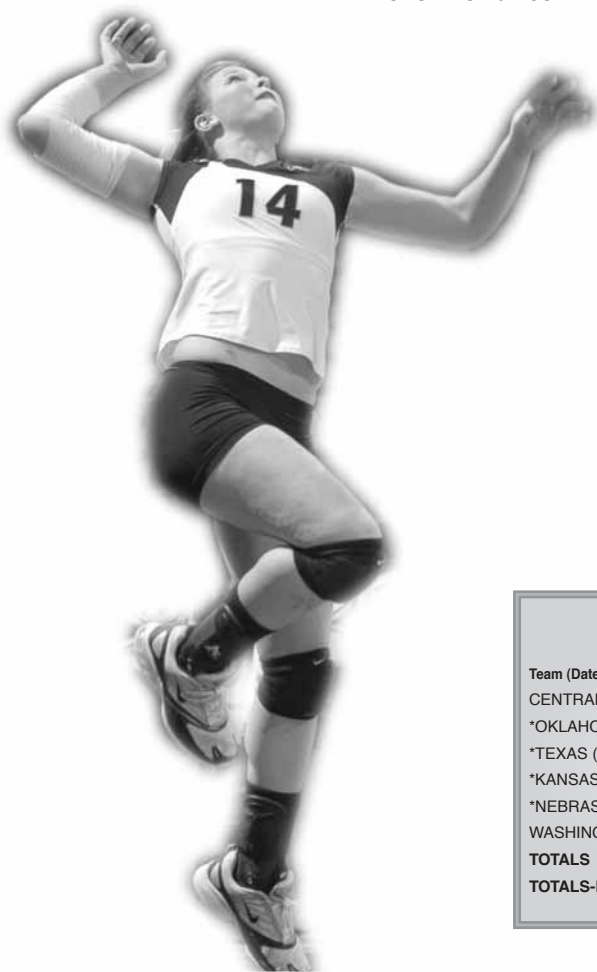

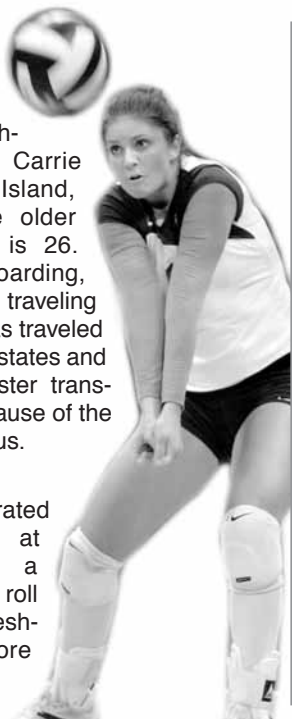

Mallori Gibson earned a medical hardship from the NCAA in 2006 and will be sophomore in 2007. As a returning starter, she will look to show-off her strong arm that propelled CU in 2006. Gibson looks to make even more of an impact this season with a year of experience under her belt.

As a Redshirt Freshman in 2006

Gibson was second in the squad in kills with 351, which also ranks 31st on the single-season kills

chart. She led the Buffs with 34 aces and ranked seventh in the Big 12 with 0.33 per game. Gibson served up a career-high four aces against No. 10 UCLA (9/1) at the Hawaiian Airlines Volleyball Classic. The following night, she recorded 14 kills and seven digs against No. 7 Hawai'i. Gibson recorded a career-best hitting percentage against Central Connecticut State (9/8) of .643 with 10 kills on 14 swings with one error. She tied a career-high three blocks against Texas Tech (9/16) and Nebraska (11/11). Gibson led CU with 11 kills against No. 8 Texas (9/20). She was named the CU Athlete of the Week on Sept. 25 after recording 29 kills against Texas and Kansas. Gibson barely missed her first career double-double with 18 kills and nine digs against Kansas State (11/1). She recorded 10 or more kills in 21 matches and has recorded 15 or more on eight occasions. Gibson hammered 16 kills in the five-game upset of No. 1 Nebraska (11/11). She recorded over 20 kills twice. She had 24 kills against Oklahoma (11/18) and a career-best 28 against Baylor (11/22).

As a Freshman in 2005

Gibson participated in eight games and three matches for the Buffs. She collected six kills on 28 swings and also added two block assists and three digs. Gibson recorded a career-best four points against Oklahoma (9/24) with three kills and two block assists.
