QUICKLY...The University of Colorado (2-2, 0-0 Big 12 Conference) will travel the scenic route north to face the University of Wyoming (3-1, 0-0 Mountain West Conference) on Wednesday, Dec. 1, at 7 p.m. at the Wyoming Arena Auditorium in Laramie. The game is scheduled to be aired live on Altitude Sports Network with Mike Helling giving the play-by-play and Julie Browman handling the color commentary.

BUFFS ON THE AIR...All Colorado women's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN AM 760, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. **Tim Smile** will handle play by play duties and is joined by USA Basketball's **Carol Callan** with the color commentary.

31st SEASON...Colorado is in the early stages of its 31st season of varsity women's basketball with an all-time record of 579-316 (.647). The Buffaloes have made 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, all since 1988, including six Sweet 16 appearances and three trips to the Elite Eight (1993, 1995 & 2002).

SECOND AT COORS...Colorado placed second at the 18th annual Coors Classic last weekend at the Coors Events Center. The Buffaloes took care of business with a 69-49 win over Pennsylvania in the first round, but fell to then No 2 ranked, and now top-ranked, LSU 75-44. Freshman Kara Richards was awarded All-Tournament team honors after achieving career-highs with 11 rebounds and six assists against Penn and 10 rebounds, three steals and two blocks against the Tigers. Forward **Leslie Howard** scored a career-high 14 points against Penn while **Anna Nedovic** and Whitney Law each had 10. LSU held Colorado to a school record low 24 percent shooting in the championship game. Preseason Player of the Year candidate Seimone Augustus took home tournament MVP honors.

COWGIRLS BACK IN THE SADDLE...Wyoming is off to a 3-1 start in 2004-05. After a season-opening 85-42 loss at 19th ranked Kansas State, the Cowgirls have reeled off three straight wins, all at home. Wyoming topped Colorado-Colorado Springs, 61-43, in its home opener and then won a nailbiter from Denver, 55-54, and breezed to a 65-45 win over Northern Iowa. Junior guard Erin Hicks leads the Cowgirls averaging 12.5 points, nine rebounds and hitting a solid 51.7 percent from the field. Forward Hanna Zavec is averaging 12 points and 5.5 rebounds per contest while senior guard Ashley Elliott is UW's third double-digit scorer at 1.8 per game.

2-2 STARTS...It's not that common for Colorado to start off the season .500 or lower through the first four games of the season, in fact it's happened just six times (including this season) in the Ceal Barry regime. The Buffaloes started 2-2 four times prior to this season (1986-87, 1989-90, 1998-99 and 1999-2000) and have gone 2-2 in the fifth game. During two of those seasons (1986-87 and 1989-90) at least one of CU's losses was to a team ranked 15th or higher. Of those four seasons only once did CU finish with a record below .500 for the entire year (10-19 in 1999-00). The other sub-.500 start during that stretch came in 1984-85 when the Buffs were just 1-4 out of the gate, Barry's second year as CU's head coach.

CIRCLE THE WAGONS...Colorado and Wyoming will meet for the 39th time on Wednesday, with the Buffs holding a commanding 32-6 edge in the series. The CU-Wyoming series is the most played non-conference match-up for the Buffaloes with Colorado State a close second at 35. Colorado has won 13-straight in the series and 29 of the last 30 dating back to the 1978 season. Wyoming's last win over Colorado came in Laramie, a 67-63 decision on Dec. 13, 1989. Colorado defeated Wyoming in Boulder last season, 71-39.

RICHARDS NAMED BIG 12 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK...True freshman center **Kara Richards** was named the Big 12 Women's Basketball Rookie of the Week in the first awards announced for the 2004-05 season. Players are nominated by each school's sports information office and voted on by a panel of media who cover Big 12 women's basketball. Richards, a 6-4 freshman center, averaged 13.5 points, three rebounds and 1.5 blocks in her first two collegiate games. The Graham, Texas, native scored 13 points and pulled down six

rebounds in her first game, a Colorado win over Loyola Marymount. She was the first Buff freshman to start the season opener since Linda Lappe in 1998. Richards hit 7-of-10 from the floor for 14 points in CU's loss to Nevada.

A BARRY GOOD MILESTONE...By coaching the Buffaloes against Loyola Marymount in the season opener, head coach **Ceal Barry** passed legendary track & field coach Frank Potts for the most events coaches in school history at 642. She already holds the CU record for wins in any sport (420) and has coached in more games (645) than any coach in school history.

FOR OPENERS...Colorado improved to 26-5 all-time in season openers and has won 17 of its last 18. The Buffs are 19-3 under Ceal Barry in season-opening games and have won the last five. This season marked the first time since the 1999-2000 season the Buffs didn't open the season in Boulder (at Denver) and the first time since 1996-97 (at BYU) the Buffs didn't begin the season in the state of Colorado.

NOVEMBER SUNSHINE...Colorado is 88-22 (.800) overall in regular season games during the month of November including a whopping 73-9 (.890) at home. CU was 5-1 in November last year including its 67-63 overtime win over No. 15/16 Notre Dame in the WBCA Classic championship game. The Buffs' lone loss came to eventual Women's Final Four participant Minnesota, 95-61, in Minneapolis.

PRESEASON TOURNAMENTS...Colorado is 86-31 all-time in preseason tournaments, including a solid 30-6 mark in the Coors Classic. The Buffaloes have won 23 of their last 29 preseason tournament games and went 5-1 last season winning the WBCA Classic and Coors Classic Tournament championships.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, BUFFS...The Colorado Athletic Department and Fox Sports Rocky Mountain have agreed to televise seven Buffs' women's basketball games this season. Add that to the three national Fox Sports Network games scheduled through a combination of Big 12 and Pac 10 Conference pacts, CU women's basketball is scheduled for a school-record 10 regular season television games this winter.

TOUGH SCHEDULE...Colorado's schedule is once again a tough one, with the Buffs facing nine teams that played in the 2004 NCAA tournament. The Big 12 offers one of the toughest schedules in the nation, as seven members played in the NCAA's a season ago, with Texas and Baylor making the Sweet 16. Colorado's Coors Classic alone featured three teams who played in the NCAA Tournament last season, Penn, LSU and Maryland.

HEAD COACH CEAL BARRY...Ceal Barry is in her 22nd season at Colorado, and 26th overall has a collegiate head coach. Barry's overall coaching record is 503-267 with the win total ranking 20th among active NCAA Division I coaches. At Colorado Barry has led the Buffaloes to a 420-225 record, including 13 20-win seasons and 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament.

As a head coach Barry is 19-1 against Wyoming.

BUFFS PICKED SEVENTH, SIXTH IN BIG 12 POLLS...Colorado was picked to finish seventh in the annual Big 12 Coaches Preseason poll while the media said the Buffaloes would finish sixth in their preseason poll. Texas was the overwhelming favorite in both polls. The Longhorns received 11 of 12 first place votes in the coaches poll (coaches aren't allowed to vote for their own teams) and 12 of 14 first place votes in the media poll. Colorado was picked fifth in both the 2003-04 and 2002-03 preseason polls only to achieve a higher standing by the end of the season. CU enjoyed a third-place finish last season and a fourth-place showing in 2002-03. The Buffs have not finished lower than fourth in the Big 12 standings since the 1999-2000 season.

NATIONAL POLLS...Colorado was not ranked in either of the major polls this week. Five of CU's 2004-05 opponents are in the current top 25 including four in the top 15. LSU is ranked first in both polls after its 7-0 start. Texas is seventh in both polls, but owns a win over preseason No. 1 Tennessee. In the coaches poll Baylor is 11th, Texas Tech is 12th and Kansas State is 17th. In the AP poll, Baylor is ninth, Texas Tech is 12th and Kansas State is 19th.

HOME SWEET HOME...The Buffs are 318-91 (.776) at home all-time, with an even more impressive record at the Coors Events/Conference Center, turning in a record of 285-70 (.803). Under head coach Ceal Barry the Buffs are 233-69 (.772) at the CECC. CU has turned in six undefeated seasons at home in 28 seasons, including three consecutive years from 1980-83. Most recently the Buffs were perfect at home in 1993-94 when they went 13-0 at the CECC, 27-5 overall. Colorado owns the seventh-longest home winning streak in NCAA history, going for 53-straight during the early 80s.

THE BUFFALO STAMPEDE...Coach Ceal Barry's television show airs on Fox Sports Rocky Mountain on Friday evenings at 7:30 p.m. Hosted by Sandy Williams, the show incorporates all of CU's athletic department and is filmed on location in and around Boulder and is produced by BuffVision, the partnership that brings us the fantastic video boards at Folsom Field.

UP NEXT...Colorado will return home on Saturday, Dec. 4, for a non-conference game against Creighton at 3 p.m. The game was originally scheduled for 7 p.m., but was moved to allow Buffs fans to attend the game and watch the CU football team take on Oklahoma in the Big 12 Championship game which is slated for a 6 p.m. MST start.
