QUICKLY...The University of Colorado (7-5, 0-1 Big 12 Conference) will face Iowa State University (11-1, 1-0 Big 12 Conference) on Saturday, Jan. 8, at 7 p.m., at the Coors Events Conference Center in Boulder.

BUFFS ON THE AIR...All Colorado women's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN AM 760, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. **Tim Smile** will handle play by play duties and is joined by USA Basketball's **Carol Callan** with the color commentary.

31ST SEASON...Colorado is in its 31st season of varsity women's basketball sporting an all-time record of 584-318 (.647). The Buffaloes have made 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, all since 1988, including six Sweet 16 appearances and three trips to the Elite Eight (1993, 1995 & 2002).

BUFFS LOOKING UP...Despite the Buffs Big 12 opening loss to Nebraska, Colorado has answered an early December three-game losing streak to win five of its last six games. Sophomore forward **Anna Nedovic** leads a balanced CU scoring attack at 12.0 points per contest. Nedovic, who also posts a team-high 7.2 rebounds per game, is one of six Buffs averaging at least seven points per game. Senior point guard **Veronica Johns-Richardson** is averaging 11.1 points per contest and paces the Buffaloes in 3-point field goals (19), steals (25) and assists (35). The freshman duo of forward **Jackie McFarland** and center Kara Richards have nearly identical outputs, combining for 18.3 points and 11.6 rebounds per game. Richards, who has started all 12 games, has a team-best .552 shooting percentage and is averaging 9.3 points and 5.8 rebounds a contest. McFarland, a two-time Big 12 Rookie of the Week, is averaging nine points and 5.8 rebounds per game. On the outside, sophomore **Jasmina Ilic** averages 8.9 points per game coming off a 15-point, nine-rebound performance against the Cornhuskers. Junior shooting guard **Whitney Law** is sixth on the squad in the scoring column (7.4 ppg) and ranks fourth in the Big 12 in 3-point field-goal percentage at .458 (11-of-24).

TURNOVERS DOOM BUFFS IN CONFERENCE OPENER...**Jasminia Ilic** had a career-high 15 points and nine rebounds but Colorado's 25 turnovers proved costly as Nebraska took a 84-62 decision from the Buffaloes Jan. 5 at the Devaney Center in the Big 12 Conference opener for both teams.

Colorado (7-5, 0-1) trailed by just two (36-34) 20 seconds into the second half, but the Buffs committed seven turnovers over the next 9:37 that turned into a 23-4 run by Nebraska. The Huskers (9-4, 1-0), who totalled 30 points of CU turnovers, were red hot in the second half hitting 59.4 percent from the field (19-of-32).

Senior **Veronica Johns-Richardson** had 13 points including three 3-pointers while freshman **Kara Richards** had 10 points and six rebounds. Richards had CU's first six points of the game and helped spark the Buffs to a 21-13 lead, but three first half fouls limited her minutes late in the period as Nebraska out scored CU 17-7 over the final 6:42 of the period to take a 36-31 lead at halftime.

Nebraska guard Kiera Hardy had a game-high 22 points, 16 of which came in the first half as she single-handedly brought the Huskers back from their eight-point first half deficit.

The Buffaloes out-rebounded Nebraska 45-35, marking the first time in seven games this year they have lost the game while winning the battle of the boards. Ilic's nine led the way for CU, six of which were on the offensive glass. **Anna Nedovic** had eight rebounds to go with nine points. Freshman Yari Escalera had a career-high eight points off the bench.

WHIRLWIND OF SUCCESS SO FAR IN AMES...Iowa State had a strong preseason winning 10 of 11 games and there was no let down with the beginning of the league schedule. The Cyclones dispatched of defending Big 12 champion and No. 20/21 Kansas State 78-59 in their last game on Jan. 5. Iowa State sports four players scoring in double digits and averages 84.2 points per game as a team. Ann O'Neil paces the

Cyclones at 17.8 points and 6.9 rebounds per game. She put up 21 against Kansas State on 8-of-12 from the field. Katie Robinette had 21 points and 11 rebounds against Kansas State and is averaging 14.8 points and 6.8 boards per game. Iowa State's defense is just as tough holding opponents to just under 59 points per game. The Cyclones were just three spots out of the Associated Press Poll and will likely break into the top 25 next week after their win over Kansas State.

COLORADO-IOWA STATE SERIES...This will be the 52nd meeting between Colorado and Iowa State with the Buffaloes holding a commanding 35-16 advantage. The 35 wins over the Cyclones are the second most CU has over any one opponent (37 against Nebraska). Colorado has won the last four and six of the last eight contests. Iowa State's last win came in the quarterfinals of the 2002 Big 12 Tournament, 58-56. Seven of ISU's 16 series were between the 1998-2001 seasons.

JUMPIN IN JANUARY...Colorado is 148-106 (.583) all-time in the month of January. The Buffaloes have won 20 of their last 24 January games dating back to the 2001-02 season, including a 7-1 mark last season.

OPENING THE CONFERENCE SEASON AT HOME...Colorado is just 4-4 in Big 12 home openers, but all four losses have come to teams ranked in the Top 25 including a 76-69 setback to No. 11/12 Kansas State last season. Overall the Buffaloes are 20-10 in their first home league contest of the season. Colorado fell to 4-5 in overall Big 12 openers since the league began in 1996-97 with its loss at Nebraska on Jan. 5.

BUFFS CONTINUE SUCCESS IN PRESEASON...With a five-game winning streak in December, Colorado clinched its fifth straight season with a record of .500 or better during the nonconference regular season schedule. The Buffs have only finished below .500 twice during the nonconference schedule in the Ceal Barry era going 5-6 in 1999-2000 and 4-9 in 1984-85.

VJ FROM DOWNTOWN...Senior Veronica Johns-Richardson is nearing the school's top 10 list for career 3-point field goals. She has 19 trey's already this season, helped by a school-record tying seven

COLORADO WELL REPRESENTED WITH BIG 12 ROOKIES OF THE WEEK...Colorado has been a popular choice in the voting for Big 12 Rookie of the Week this season. Of the six weeks the award has been given, Colorado has been represented three times.

Forward Jackie McFarland has received the honor twice -- just this past week and on Dec. 6. Center Kara Richards earned the award in the first week of the regular season, back on Nov. 22.

Most recently, McFarland was cited for her performance over the holiday break where she averaged 10.7 points, 7.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and connected on 68.4 percent of her field goals (13-of-19). McFarland had 16 points on a career-best 8-of-13 shooting against Washington, which included the game-winning layup with under two seconds left in overtime. McFarland made all three of her shots from the field and had five rebounds against Northern Colorado. She then recorded her second career double-double by scoring 10 points and recording a career-high 11 rebounds against Manhattan while adding four assists, two blocks and two steals.

In her first effort, McFarland led Colorado and established career-highs with 23 points and eight rebounds in CU's five-point loss at Wyoming on Dec. 1. She hit 8-of-14 from the field (.571) and 7-of-8 from the line (.875) against the Cowgirls. She then registered her first career double-double with 19 points and a new career-best 10 rebounds against Creighton on Dec. 4. She hit 9-of-10 from the free-throw stripe and added two blocks, one steal and one assist. For the week McFarland averaged 21.0 ppg, 9.0 rpg and 1.0 bpg.

Richards averaged 13.5 points, three rebounds and 1.5 blocks in her first two collegiate games. The Graham, Texas, native scored 13 points and pulled down six rebounds in her first game, a Colorado win over Loyola Marymount. She was the first Buff freshman to start the season opener since Linda Lappe in 1998. Richards hit 7-of-10 from the floor for 14 points in CU's loss to Nevada.

FRESHMAN LEADERS IN THE BIG 12...Colorado's duo of **Kara Richards** and **Jackie McFarland** are featured prominently in the Big 12's freshman statistics. Richards is third in scoring (9.3 ppg) and McFarland is fourth (9.0 ppg) among all league freshman. McFarland is second rebounding (5.8 rpg) while Richards is just behind in third (5.75 rpg). Richards is also second in blocks (1.33 bpg) and fifth in field-goal percentage (.552). McFarland is fourth in assists (1.64 apg) and seventh in blocked shots (0.73). Reserve guard Yari Escalera is fifth in assists (1.58 apg), sixth in 3-point field-goal percentage (.333) and seventh in steals (0.83 spg)

SOME STREAKS ENDING...Prior to the loss against Creighton, Colorado had won 10 straight games at home following a road loss. The three-game losing streak is also the program's first since the 2001-02 season (78-67 at No. 3 Oklahoma on Jan. 2, 70-68 vs. No. 21 Texas on Jan 6. and 75-72 at No. 14 Kansas State on Jan. 9) and the losses to Wyoming and Creighton were CU's first back-to-back setbacks against unranked teams since the 2000-01 season (72-70 vs. CSU on Dec. 6 and 92-66 at Iowa on Dec. 10).

A BARRY GOOD MILESTONE...By coaching the Buffaloes against Loyola Marymount in the season opener, head coach **Ceal Barry** passed legendary track & field coach Frank Potts for the most events coaches in school history at 642. She already holds the CU record for wins in any sport (420) and has coached in more games (645) than any coach in school history.

HOWARD LEAVES THE BUFFALOES...Leslie Howard, a 5-10 sophomore forward from Salem, Mo., has left the CU basketball program for personal reasons. Howard played in the first four games of the season averaging 6.3 points and 3.5 rebounds per game including a career-high 14 points against Pennsylvania on Nov. 26. She played 24 games in a Colorado uniform averaging three points and just over one rebound per contest.

FOR OPENERS...Colorado improved to 26-5 all-time in season openers and has won 17 of its last 18. The Buffs are 19-3 under Ceal Barry in season-opening games and have won the last five. This season marked the first time since the 1999-2000 season the Buffs didn't open the season in Boulder (at Denver) and the first time since 1996-97 (at BYU) the Buffs didn't begin the season in the state of Colorado.

SECOND AT COORS...Colorado placed second at the 18th annual Coors Classic, Nov. 26-27, at the Coors Events Center. The Buffaloes took care of business with a 69-49 win over Pennsylvania in the first round, but fell to then No 2 ranked, and now top-ranked, LSU 75-44. Freshman **Kara Richards** was awarded All-Tournament team honors after achieving career-highs with 11 rebounds and six assists against Penn and 10 rebounds, three steals and two blocks against the Tigers. Leslie Howard scored a career-high 14 points against Penn while **Anna Nedovic** and **Whitney Law** each had 10. LSU held Colorado to a school record

low 24 percent shooting in the championship game. Preseason Player of the Year candidate Seimone Augustus took home tournament MVP honors.

PRESEASON TOURNAMENTS...Colorado is 86-31 all-time in preseason tournaments, including a solid 30-6 mark in the Coors Classic. The Buffaloes have won 23 of their last 29 preseason tournament games and went 5-1 last season winning the WBCA Classic and Coors Classic Tournament championships.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, BUFFS...The Colorado Athletic Department and Fox Sports Rocky Mountain have agreed to televise seven Buffs' women's basketball games this season. Add that to the three national Fox Sports Network games scheduled through a combination of Big 12 and Pac 10 Conference pacts, CU women's basketball is scheduled for a school-record 10 regular season television games this winter.

TOUGH SCHEDULE...Colorado's schedule is once again a tough one, with the Buffs facing nine teams that played in the 2004 NCAA tournament. The Big 12 offers one of the toughest schedules in the nation, as seven members played in the NCAA's a season ago, with Texas and Baylor making the Sweet 16. Colorado's Coors Classic alone featured three teams who played in the NCAA Tournament last season, Penn, LSU and Maryland.

HEAD COACH CEAL BARRY...Ceal Barry is in her 22nd season at Colorado, and 26th overall has a collegiate head coach. Barry's overall coaching record is 507-270 with the win total ranking 20th among active NCAA Division I coaches. At Colorado Barry has led the Buffaloes to a 424-228 record, including 13 20-win seasons and 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament.

As a head coach Barry is 31-16 against Iowa State, 26-16 with Colorado.

BUFFS PICKED SEVENTH, SIXTH IN BIG 12

POLLS...Colorado was picked to finish seventh in the annual Big 12 Coaches Preseason poll while the media said the Buffaloes would finish sixth in their preseason poll. Texas was the overwhelming favorite in both polls. The Longhorns received 11 of 12 first place votes in the coaches poll (coaches aren't allowed to vote for their own teams) and 12 of 14 first place votes in the media poll. Colorado was picked fifth in both the 2003-04 and 2002-03 preseason polls only to achieve a higher standing by the end of the season. CU enjoyed a third-place finish last season and a fourth-place showing in 2002-03. The Buffs have not finished lower than fourth in the Big 12 standings since the 1999-2000 season.

NATIONAL POLLS...Colorado was not ranked in either of the major polls this week. Five of CU's 2004-05 opponents are in the current top 25 including four in the top 15. LSU is ranked first in both polls after its 13-0 start. In the coaches poll Baylor is fifth, Texas is seventh, Texas Tech is 13th and Kansas State is 20th. In the AP poll, Baylor is third, Texas is seventh, Texas Tech is 12th and Kansas State is 20th.

HOME SWEET HOME...The Buffs are 321-92 (.777) at home all-time, with an even more impressive record at the Coors Events/Conference Center, turning in a record of 288-71 (.802). Under head coach Ceal Barry the Buffs are 236-70 (.771) at the CECC. CU has turned in six undefeated seasons at home in 28 seasons, including three consecutive years from 1980-83. Most recently the Buffs were perfect at home in 1993-94 when they went 13-0 at the CECC, 27-5 overall. Colorado owns the seventh-longest home winning streak in NCAA history, going for 53-straight during the early 80s.
