SCOUTING THE COWBOYS - Oklahoma State enters today's matinee 4-2 in conference play with both losses coming on the road. However, OSU possesses a starting lineup comprised of five seniors led by All-America candidate Joey Graham and Big 12 media preseason selection John Lucas. Toss in senior Ivan McFarlin at forward and experience of five other letterwinners from last year's Final Four team, in addition to a head coach with 769 career victories in Eddie Sutton, the Cowboys are certainly one of the best teams in the nation ranked number nine in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today/ESPN* polls.

CU vs. OKLAHOMA STATE - The Cowboys hold a 55-45 advantage since 1948 and depending where the game is being played, the home team has been victorious every year since 1997. OSU has lost its last four in a row in Boulder and has not won at the Events Center since Feb. 24, 1996 (68-66). Coach Patton teams are 4-6 against OSU with all four wins coming at today's site. Will the fans be rushing the court???

LAST TIME OUT - Richard Roby sank a 3-pointer with 21 seconds left to lift Colorado to a 64-62 win over Missouri Wednesday night. Seconds later, Jason Horton of Missouri (had a good look at a 3-pointer that would have given the Tigers the lead, but he missed and Mizzou remained winless (0-6) away from home this season. Roby led the Buffaloes with 15 points while Chris Copeland recorded his fifth double-double of the season with 12 points and 11 rebounds (game story and box, page 30).

Chris Copeland came off the bench to record his fifth double-double (12 pts., 11 rbs.) in the win over Mizzou ... **Richard Roby** continues to lead CU in scoring (14.5) and scoring 10 or more points 15 of 17 games ... **Marcus Hall** has led CU 11 times in assists, including the last five straight (5.0 apg.) ... **Glean Eddy** (279) and **Copeland** (221) are the lone players with over 200 career rebounds ... Roby ranks fourth all-time among CU freshmen with 14.5 ppg. ... Copeland and Hall are a combined 68-of-85 (.800) from the charity stripe, the rest of the team is .580 ... Roby's 30 steals is eight from cracking the CU single-season top-30 list ... Copeland's 25 blocks are 26th on the single-season list ... **Julius Ashby** is averaging 30 minutes, 5.0 ppg., 7.3 rpg. in his last three games since returning from a tendon tear in his left foot ... **Glean Eddy** is averaging 8.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in last four games in a starting role. Eddy was named CU's Athlete of the Week recipient for his team-high 12 points with 11 rebounds in the overtime win at Iowa State ... Roby and Copeland are averaging 14.2 and 13.7 ppg., respectively in six conference games; Copeland is the team leader on the boards (8.3) ... Hall is the team's best FT shooter with under 2 minutes to play (14-of-16, .875) ... The bench is averaging 17 points in conference play and the starting line up has changed eight times ... **TEAM LEADERS:** Roby (14.5 ppg.), steals (1.8); Ashby (7.3 rpg.); Copeland 3-pointers made (30), FG percentage (.479), blocked shots (1.5); Hall in assists (3.8).

CU IN 8th PLACE - In the final fall NACDA/United States Sports Academy Directors' Cup Standings, the Colorado is in eighth place as the gears switch into the winter sports competitions. Notre Dame leads a tight race with 337 points, followed by Michigan (333), Stanford (332) and Duke (327) as just 10 points separate the top four schools. The fifth through eighth schools are bunched together by just 22 points: UCLA (5th, 297), Maryland (6th, 280), Ohio State (7th, 286) and **Colorado (8th, 275)**.

LIFE WITHOUT ASHBY - In the seven games and 33 minutes that Julius Ashby was sidelined with a tendon tear, CU went 4-4 and 1-4 in its last five. Chris Copeland was the leading scorer (16.4), rebounder (6.4), shot blocker (15), and FGs made (46-of-96, .479).

FROSH PHENOM - Freshman Richard Roby is making huge strides during his initial season leading the Buffaloes in scoring at 14.5 ppg. He has scored in double figures in 15 of 17 games with 17 starts. Not since the 1995-96 season has a freshman led CU in scoring (Chauncey Billups, 17.9 ppg.). Roby also leads CU in steals (30), minutes played (30.1), field goals made (90), and ranks third in rebounds (4.8). Roby has also led the team in rebounding three times.

NOW THERE WERE 14 - CU redshirt-freshman Keith Smith was released from the team last week after violating team rules according to Coach Patton. Smith played a mere 19 seconds at Cali-

fornia for his only action this season.

SPORTS ILLUSTRATED - Congratulations are in order to former CU student assistant Jody Woodman who recently accepted a job with SI as the associate producer for the men's college basketball web site in NYC. Jody worked with the media relations staff for two years and graduated from CU last May. Not a bad gig after graduating from CU seven months ago!

2008-09 CLASS - CU signed its lone scholarship student-athlete for next season adding Calvin Williams (6'8, 200, Forward) from Hillcrest HS. The Memphis, Tenn. native signed a letter of intent during the early signing period in November. "Calvin is really a big-time athlete, a 6-8 guy who can run the floor and finish around the basket," said Patton.

CU IN POST-SEASON PLAY - Under head coach Ricardo Patton, the Buffaloes are 4-8 in the Big 12 post-season. In 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2001-02, and 2002-03, CU advanced to the second round and finished 1-1. Last season was the highest a CU team is seeded since being No. 3 (11-5) back in 1996-97.

CU IN THE BIG DANCE - Colorado 2003-04 NCAA Tournament team was the first since the 1996-97 season to make the post season tourney. It was also the second appearance for head coach Ricardo Patton at CU. Back in 1968-69, CU garnered the NCAA post-season plateau, but haven't reached back-to-back tournaments since the late-Sox Walseth achieved the two-fer in 1961-62 and 1962-63 (42 years ago).

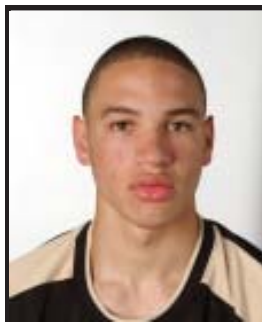

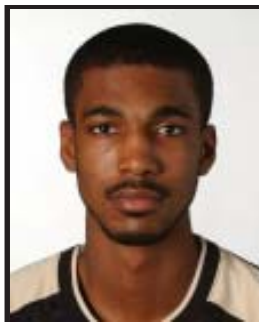

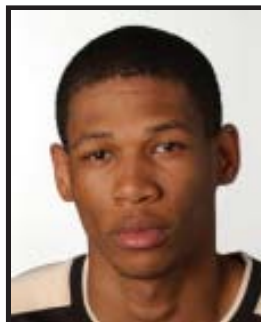

CU OPENS SEASON WITH WIN

BOULDER – Freshman guard Richard Roby scored 12 of his game-high 19 points in the second half to lead three Colorado players in double figures as the Buffaloes defeated the College of Charleston, 72-57, to open the 2004-05 season in the first round of the Preseason NIT Monday night.

“It is a good win against a very quality opponent,” said CU head coach Ricardo Patton. “That team (C of C) is going to win a lot of games, especially in their league. I think they did a good job of running it down our throats, they kept the intensity up the whole game.”

With the win, the Buffs improve to 9-0 in season openers under Patton, who claimed his 100th career win at the Coors Events Center. The Cougars have dropped their second season opener in a row, after winning 12 straight before last year.

Colorado led throughout the first half with their biggest margin reaching nine points with 3:37 to go; however, the Cougars trimmed their deficit to two points to narrow the margin to 35-33. Sophomore guard Marcus Hall then hit a three-pointer to push their lead back to five for a 38-33 halftime lead.

In the second stanza the Buffs upped their lead to 13 points at the 12:11 mark after consecutive baskets (Andy Osborn 3-pointer) and a Lamont Arrington dunk for a 54-41 advantage. C of C again rallied to cut the deficit to seven with 6:20 remaining, however CU outscored the Cougars by a 13-5 margin to end the game.

Colorado had 12 blocks compared to the Cougars two and out-rebounded the College of Charleston 48-46. Julius Ashby scored 13 points and Jayson Obazuaye added 10. Roby finished the night hitting 7-of -11 from the floor and grabbed eight rebounds in his debut. The Cougars’ Josh Jackson had 12 points, while Robert Swain chipped in 10.

“Today we made some great steps as a team to get where we want to be,” said Obazuaye. “It excites me for the season and the games ahead especially the next one nationally televised (ESPN).”

BUFFS FALL AT MICHIGAN, 69-60 IN NIT 2ND ROUND

ANN ARBOR, Mich. - Dion Harris scored a career-high 24 points and Lester Abram added 12 to lead Michigan to a 69-60 win over Colorado Wednesday in the second round of the Preseason NIT.

Courtney Sims also had 10 points, 10 rebounds and 5 blocked shots for the Wolverines who advance to the semifinals of the tournament to play the winner of the Arizona-Wright State second-round game.

Richard Roby scored 18 points for Colorado with Marcus Hall adding 16. Julius Ashby had a game-high six blocked shots tying the CU school record for blocks in a road game.

Michigan, which is looking to become the first team to win the postseason NIT and preseason NIT the following season, led from start to finish.

“I was excited to see the team continue to get better,” said CU head coach Ricardo Patton. “By the time we realized we could play with Michigan we had dug too deep a hole. The Buffaloes tightened the score to 65-58 on Roby’s 3-pointer with 56 seconds left, but a basket by Sims and two free throws by Harris sealed the win.

COPELAND, ROBY TALLY DOUBLE-DOUBLES

BOULDER – The Colorado Buffaloes overcame a tight first half to best the visiting Northwestern Wildcats 66-57 Sunday afternoon at the Coors Events Center.

Freshman guard Richard Roby led the Buffs with his first career double-double, tallying 16 points and 13 rebounds, and three other Buffs scored in double figures as CU pulled away after a first half which included eight lead changes and eight ties.

Down by one in the first half, Roby and junior forward/center Julius Ashby had back-to-back highlight-reel dunks off steals to ignite the home crowd of 2,167 and put the Buffs on top 28-25 going into the halftime.

After Chris Copeland hit a 5-foot jumper 34 seconds into the second half, the Wildcats went on a 12-3 run in a span of 4:20 to take a 37-33 lead.

The Buffs would stage a comeback with the help of Copeland, who finished with a career-high 15 points and 10 rebounds. His 3-pointer with 8:33 left tied the game, and sixteen seconds later he made a lay up to put the Buffs on top 46-44, a lead that they would never relinquish.

“It’s a good win against a great quality opponent, they execute to perfection,” said CU Head Coach Ricardo Patton. “Late when we were down 44-37 it was a pretty scary time for us. But we managed to get the right guys on the floor and changing into zone defense helped us get the lead.

Jayson Obazuaye scored 14 points for his second best career scoring output, and Ashby added 10 points and 7 rebounds for the Buffs, who improved to 53-6 in non-conference home games under Head Coach Ricardo Patton.

Northwestern (1-3) was led by forward Vedran Vukusic, who finished with 25 points and nine rebounds. Sophomore forward Tim Doyle finished the game with 11 points, as he was the only other Wildcat in double figures.

The game was the second meeting between the two teams in as many years. CU opened the 2003-04 season with a 67-56 road win against the Wildcats. The victory improved the Buffs’ overall record in the series to 6-3, with the first seven meetings taking place from 1949-1968.

OREGON STATE OUTSCORES CU, 98-87

CORVALLIS, Ore. - Chris Stephens had a career-high 27 points and freshman Sasa Cuic added 22 to give Oregon State a 98-87 victory over Colorado on Saturday.

Marcus Hall had 22 of his 29 points in the first half for Colorado (2-2), single-handedly bringing the Buffaloes back from a 16-point deficit. Hall tied a school record for consecutive points made tying Donnie Boyce’s mark of 20 points at Oklahoma State, March 5, 1994. Hall’s offensive explosion also were career-highs in field goals made (12) and attempts (16).

Oregon State’s Jason Fontenet had 20 points, including four 3-pointers, for the Beavers (4-2), while J.S. Nash added 13 points and four steals. Oregon State shot 64 percent from the field in the first half and 59 percent for the game. Only one Beaver, reserve Derek Potter who was 0-for-2, shot worse than 50 percent.

Oregon State led 38-22 after Fontenet made two free throws. That’s when Hall took over, scoring the Buffaloes’ final 18 points of the first half.

The sophomore point guard outscored the Beavers 18-7 during the nearly five minute stretch and cut the score to 45-40 by halftime.

The Buffaloes came close early in the second half, taking a brief 70-68 lead on Jayson Obazuaye’s 3-pointer, but Stephens countered with his own 3-pointer and the Beavers went out on a 10-2 run. CU shot a season-best 58 percent (33-of-57) from the field.

Hall, who made 12 of his 16 shots, couldn’t maintain his first-half production, scoring only seven points in the second half.

All five Colorado starters scored in double-figures, including Obazuaye and Chris Copeland, who each had 15 points.

SECOND HALF RALLY KEYS CU WIN OVER CAL

BERKELEY, Calif. - Chris Copeland scored all 11 of his points after halftime and Colorado rallied with a big second half to win at California for the first time in eight meetings, 63-60 on Tuesday night.

Richard Roby scored four points in the final 2:47 and also had a late steal for Colorado, sending the Golden Bears to their second narrow defeat at home in a week after a 73-72 loss to UNLV last Tuesday. Marcus Hall (five assists) scored with 12.2 seconds left for the Buffaloes (3-2).

Rod Benson had career highs of 25 points and 10 rebounds for the Bears, who missed several important shots in the final minute. Richard Midgley's 3 at the buzzer wasn't enough for Cal (4-3). Midgley finished with 14 points.

It was the teams' second meeting in two seasons. The Buffaloes won 78-60 last season in Boulder, Colo., but Cal leads the series 9-7. Colorado last played in Haas Pavilion in 2000. Copeland played only three minutes in the first half, had two fouls and didn't score. He was one of several Colorado players to pick up their game in the second half.

The Buffaloes have five players averaging in double figures, and five scored more than 10 - Copeland, Roby (11), Hall (12), Jayson Obazuaye (12) and Julius Ashby (11). It's the second straight game all five CU players scored in double-digits.

Ashby grabbed a game-high 17 rebounds, the most by a CU player since Lamar Harris hauled down 19 against Iowa State last season.

The Buffaloes made three 3-pointers (Copeland - 2, Obazuaye) during an 11-2 spurt early in the second half to get back in the game after getting just nine field goals and shooting 37.5 percent in the first half.

Ashby's two free throws with 8:40 left gave Colorado a 47-44 lead, then DeVon Hardin answered with a three-point play on the other end to tie it. After Obazuaye made one of two free throws - he got another try on his second attempt after a Cal lane violation - freshman Eric Vierneisel made a 3 for a 50-48 Bears' lead. The Bears' poor 3-point shooting has plagued them all season, and they went 3-for-12 from long range Tuesday.

FREE THROWS HELP CU HOLD OFF RIVAL CSU

BOULDER (AP) - Marcus Hall scored 22 points and Colorado hit 11 of 12 free throws in the final minute to hold off Colorado State 89-83 Saturday night.

Richard Roby added 17 points and Chris Copeland had 12 points and 13 rebounds for Colorado (4-2), which won its fifth straight over Colorado State. Copeland's 13 rebounds were a career-high.

Matt Nelson had 26 points and Matt Williams added 16 for the Rams, who had trouble overcoming a shaky first half. Colorado State (5-4) had just three turnovers and shot 58 percent in the second half, but it still wasn't enough for its first win in Boulder since 1957.

Trailing by 11 at halftime, Colorado State tried to get back in it by pounding the ball inside in the second half.

Nelson hit two free throws at the other end, but the Buffaloes broke Colorado State's press and Julius Ashby scored on a dunk to make it 78-71.

CSU kept coming, including a four-point play by Jon Rakiecki, but Hall hit six free throws and Ashby sealed it with two more in the closing seconds to give CU its 13th straight home victory over its in-state rival.

Colorado State had a huge size advantage - four players at least 6-foot-10 to just one for Colorado.

The Buffaloes led by 11 at halftime and it could have been more had they been more patient offensively. Colorado shot just 13-of-34.

SECOND HALF SURGE HELPS CU DEFEAT UMKC

BOULDER (AP) - Richard Roby hit five 3-pointers and scored 17 of his 23 points in the second half, and Colorado rallied from a lackluster first half to beat Missouri-Kansas City 79-68 Tuesday night.

Jayson Obazuaye added 16 points and Colorado (5-2) shot 58 percent in the second half to win its eighth straight game against UMKC.

Quinton Day and Mike English had 17 points each for UMKC (0-6), which looked ragged in the second half after a steady first.

Colorado played it the opposite - the Buffaloes struggled in the first half and started find a rhythm in the second.

Not surprisingly, UMKC spent much of its time forcing shots and didn't make many, ending the half 10-for-30.

Both teams were aggressive defensively in the early going, making it difficult for either one to get into much of a flow.

Colorado was sloppy at times, throwing two balls into the backcourt and another into the stands for turnovers in the first 10 minutes. The Buffaloes were able to work the ball around the perimeter for some open shots and took a few bad ones, with few going in. Colorado shot 8-for-25 and was just 2-for-9 on 3-pointers.

UMKC had a little more success by working the ball through the post. The Kangaroos did a good job of getting the ball deep even though center Carlton Aaron played just four minutes because of foul trouble, and were even better at kicking out to the perimeter, where they hit 6-of-15 to take a 39-34 lead.

SECOND HALF SURGE HELPS CU DEFEAT UMKC

COPELAND NETS 25 IN CU WIN OVER RICHMOND

RICHMOND, Va. (AP) - Chris Copeland made his homecoming one to remember, having a career night with about 50 family and friends watching.

Copeland scored a career-high 25 points in his return to the city where he played high school ball, including several key shots as Colorado withstood every run in the second half and beat Richmond 75-69.

Copeland, a product of Hermitage High School in the city's suburbs, was nervous beforehand, but didn't show it. He made 10 of 15 shots and four 3-pointers, including a leaning, fall-away heave with 3:53 left, all but cinching the win for Colorado (8-3) after Richmond got within four.

"We just banded together as a team," he said. "Coach drew up some stuff to get us some easy baskets. ... We knew it was crunch time."

The Spiders (5-6), whose rally to within one with 10:33 left was answered immediately by a 7-0 Colorado run, had closed to 60-56 with 4:49 left, but Richard Roby hit a 10-footer and Copeland beat the shot clock with his off-balance shot from the right wing to rebuild the lead.

Coming off an embarrassing 80-48 loss to Utah, Colorado won despite shooting just 14-for-30 from the free throw line. The Buffaloes also avenged a 75-52 loss to the Spiders in Boulder, Colo., last season.

"After Utah, a lot of people looked at us like this team isn't going to be worth anything," said Copeland, a junior whose previous high was 17. "We wanted to show people in this game that we are a good team."

Roby added 18 points and Jayson Obazuaye 16 for the Buffaloes, who shot 56 percent from the field against the normally stingy Spiders.

Copeland's improbable 3-pointer was the "final nail," he said, and the Buffaloes' 7-0 run after Richmond got within 46-45 also hurt a lot.

"We're not real resilient right now," Wainwright said. "It took a long time to blow up that balloon, but it deflated pretty quickly."

The Buffaloes led 38-32 at halftime after shooting 63 percent and going on a Copeland-led 14-4 run midway through the half. Copeland started the burst with a basket and a 3-pointer and added two 12-footers later.

CU NO MATCH AT OU IN CONFERENCE OPENER

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) - Kevin Bookout scored a career-high 27 points and grabbed 11 rebounds to help Oklahoma open Big 12 Conference play with an 85-55 win over Colorado Saturday.

Oklahoma (11-2, 1-0) won its fifth consecutive game with a dominating inside performance against the Buffaloes (8-4, 0-1). The Sooners outrebounded Colorado 48-35 and shot 55 percent from the floor to win their ninth game in the last 10.

CU dropped its eighth straight conference opener in nine games with three of those losses coming against Oklahoma. Oklahoma opened the game on a 15-2 run with all but three points coming off lay ups.

Oklahoma dominated underneath the basket in the first half, scoring 24 of its 44 points from less than three feet away. Thirty of Oklahoma's 44 first half points came from less than five feet from the goal.

The Sooners outrebounded the Buffaloes 19-15 and shot 55 percent from the floor in the first half.

Taj Gray gave the Sooners a 15-point lead going into halftime, hitting one of two free throws with less than a second remaining.

Oklahoma started the second half on an 11-0 run and extended its lead to as much as 31 with more than six minutes remaining.

Richard Roby led Colorado with 12 points. Jayson Obazuaye was next for the Buffaloes with nine.

The Sooners did have a scare late in the second half when senior Johnnie Gilbert went down away from the ball holding his left ankle. After the game it was announced that Gilbert suffered a partially torn tendon in the bottom of his foot. He will be re-examined Sunday and is day-to-day.

Four Oklahoma players scored in double figures, with Gray, Terrell Everett and Lawrence McKenzie chipping in 10 or more. Gray's 11 rebound performance was the sixth time this season he has had at least 11 rebounds in a game for the Sooners.

BUFFS FALL IN BIG 12 HOME OPENER

Boulder (AP) - Freshman Joe McCray scored 21 points, including a clutch 3-pointer late that helped Nebraska hold off a big Colorado comeback for a 68-61 victory Wednesday night.

McCray, a guard from Fort Lauderdale, Fla., scored his team's first 11 points - a layup and three 3-pointers - but his most important bucket came with 1:34 left after Colorado had trimmed a 17-point deficit to four. McCray spotted up at the top of the 3-point circle, elevated and swished the shot for a 61-54 lead, and the Cornhuskers (8-4, 2-0 Big 12) had more or less secured a win in this, their first conference road game of the season. McCray finished 5-for-8 from 3-point range.

Richard Roby (20 points), the half brother of Nuggets forward Kenyon Martin, scored nine straight points to help Colorado (8-5, 0-2) pull within five with 4 minutes left. But CU never got the game to within one possession, and now the Buffs must prepare for a home game Saturday against No. 2 Kansas.

That one could get ugly if CU plays anything like it did early against the Huskers.

Missing top rebounder Julius Ashby with a foot injury, Colorado's already thin front line got thinner.

Starting in Ashby's place, 6-foot-11 Lamont Arrington was no match for the Huskers. Arrington finished with no points and no rebounds while Nebraska center Aleks Maric, a 6-foot-11 freshman from Sydney, Australia, finished with eight points and 11 rebounds, five of those on the offensive glass.

Jason Dourisseau had 11 points and seven boards for Nebraska.

The Huskers grabbed only five more rebounds than the Buffs, but they ran to their big lead by basically shutting down the middle on defense. CU scored just three baskets in the paint in the first half while running to a 37-22 lead.

The loss spoiled a 22-point, 14-rebound performance by CU's Chris Copeland, who shot 6-for-12 - the only Buff player to make half his shots on a night in which CU shot 34 percent.

BUFFS FALL IN BIG 12 HOME OPENER

BOULDER (AP/Staff) - Wayne Simien had 23 points and 17 rebounds and Keith Langford hit a handful of big shots Saturday to help No. 2 Kansas to a 76-61 victory over surprisingly persistent Colorado.

Playing with a soft cast on his broken left thumb, Simien was a force underneath, and his solid play helped the Jayhawks (13-0, 3-0 Big 12) to a 17-point lead in the first half.

Colorado (8-6, 0-3) rallied in the second, though, and it was Langford who came through big seemingly every time things got tight. He scored 11 points in a key 17-10 Kansas run midway through the second half after being held to just three prior to the span.

Kansas, off to its best start since opening 22-0 in 1996-97, defeated Colorado for the 31st time in the last 32 games of this series but as usual, had its hands full in Boulder.

Led by Glean Eddy's relentless work, the Buffs grabbed 22 offensive rebounds to stay competitive despite missing a variety of open shots, especially in the first half, when they went 8-for-34 from the field.

Kansas shot its second worst percentage from the floor this season, connecting on just 38.6 percent of its shots; the Jayhawks only worse effort came in the season opener against Vermont (38.2). It was the fourth time KU was held to under 40 percent shooting in 13 games this season, as Colorado's defense often outshined that of KU's and the smaller Buffs hung in there on the boards. KU held just a 48-44 edge, and CU hit the glass hard for 22 on the offensive end.

Eddy finished with five points and a career-high 12 boards, six on the offensive glass. Copeland had 22 points and 11 rebounds for his fourth career double-double and Richard Roby scored 14 points for Colorado.

Colorado twice got the game within a possession. Trailing 45-44, Copeland missed on a 15-footer from the baseline. The teams played evenly over the next five minutes, with Kansas owning a 60-56 lead with 6:44 remaining before going on a 9-0 run to establish some distance between the two that the Buffs couldn't make up.

BAYLOR HANDS CU ANOTHER BIG 12 LOSS

WACO, Texas (AP) - Aaron Bruce scored 14 points and Tommy Swanson added 13 points and 10 rebounds to lead Baylor to a 67-59 win over Colorado on Wednesday night.

Baylor (9-4, 1-2 Big 12) opened the second half with an 11-5 run and took a 45-34 lead over Colorado with just under 15 minutes remaining. Colorado (8-7, 0-4) pulled to within seven points twice, but the Bears sank 5-of-8 free throws in the final two minutes to clinch their first Big 12 win this season.

Colorado's Richard Roby led all scorers with 15 points, and Glean Eddy added 12 for the Buffaloes. The loss sends the Buffaloes to their first 0-4 start ever in the Big 12.

Baylor outscored Colorado 18-1 to open the game, holding the Buffaloes scoreless for almost nine minutes.

But by halftime, Colorado reduced Baylor's lead to 34-29 as Roby scored 13 first half points.

With the victory, Baylor surpassed last season's record of eight wins and gave Baylor its first conference triumph since February 25, 2004.

CU EDGE CYCLONES FOR FIST WIN IN BIG 12

AMES, Iowa (AP/Staff) - Andy Osborn hit a 3-pointer with 15.9 seconds left in overtime to give Colorado the lead and the Buffaloes held on through a frantic finish to beat Iowa State 54-52 Saturday night for their first Big 12 victory. The win was CU's first victory in Ames since Feb. 19, 1991, ending a streak of 13 consecutive losses.

Colorado (9-7, 1-4 Big 12) pulled it out despite going scoreless the final 4:46 of regulation, committing 20 turnovers and shooting just 33 percent. The Buffaloes offset those sordid numbers with a 54-35 rebounding advantage, including 22 offensive rebounds that led to a 21-11 edge in second-chance points.

Iowa State (8-7, 0-4) failed on chances to win it both at the end of regulation and overtime and lost for the fifth straight time. It was the Cyclones' 10th straight overtime loss in conference play since a victory over Nebraska in 1995 and its third loss at the Hilton Coliseum in 28 games over the last two seasons.

Glean Eddy led Colorado with 12 points and 11 rebounds for his first career double-double, while Chris Copeland scored 10 for the Buffaloes, who avoided their first 0-5 start in conference play since 1995-96 when they competed in the Big 8. Curtis Stinson led Iowa State with 15 points and Will Blalock scored 14.

Iowa State led 52-50 after Stinson made one of two free throws with 24.2 seconds remaining. Osborn, distinctive in his headband, goatee and knee-length black socks, then got free to the right of key and swished the 3-pointer to put the Buffs up 53-52.

Osborn got the rebound after Iowa State's Damion Staple missed inside and was fouled. He made the first free throw with 8.4 seconds remaining, missed the second and Eddy got the rebound. But he was called for traveling, giving the ball to Iowa State with 5.5 seconds to play.

Both teams then swatted the ball around after Iowa State inbounded and the buzzer sounded as it rolled out of bounds. The officials checked the TV monitor and put one-tenth of a second back on the clock, giving Iowa State one last chance. Blalock lobbed to Jared Homan, who could only bat at the ball. It fell well short and Colorado had the victory.

ROBY’S 3-POINTER LIFTS CU OVER MIZZOU

BOULDER (AP) - Freshman Richard Roby made the biggest shot of his young career Wednesday night, sinking a 3-pointer with 21 seconds left to lift Colorado to a 64-62 win over Missouri at the Coors Events Center Wednesday night.

Roby, the half-brother of Denver Nuggets forward Kenyon Martin, dribbled a couple times, took a step inside the 3-point line to create room between himself and the defender, then stepped back behind the line and swished the game-winner.

Seconds later, Jason Horton of Missouri (10-9, 2-4 Big 12) had a good look at a 3-pointer that would have given the Tigers the lead, but he missed and Mizzou remained winless (0-6) away from home this season. Marcus Hall of Colorado (10-7, 2-4) rebounded Horton’s miss and fed to Jayson Obazuaye, who was fouled and missed two free throws with 1.3 seconds left. But the Buffs rebounded the miss to seal their second straight conference win after four losses to begin the Big 12 season.

Roby led the Buffaloes with 15 points while Chris Copeland recorded his fifth double-double of the season with 12 points and 11 rebounds. Jason Conley led Mizzou with 16 points. Teammate Linas Kleiza had 14 points on 4-for-17 shooting from the floor, a far cry from his 8-for-12, 31-point effort last weekend in a win over Nebraska.

This game had all the trappings of a meeting between two struggling teams desperate to stay out of the cellar in the Big 12. Neither shot particularly well or got into any kind of rhythm and nobody took a lead of more than seven points.

But while the first 39 minutes were lackluster, the last 60 seconds made for good drama.

Leading 62-61 with about a minute left, Missouri’s Thomas Gardner missed a shot but hustled back on defense and made a steal to get the ball back for the Tigers. He fed to Jimmy McKinney, but McKinney shot an airball.

Colorado got the rebound to set the stage for Roby, a 6-foot-6 guard out of San Bernardino, Calif., who chose Colorado over UCLA and a number of other high-profile programs. He has shown flashes of how good he can be throughout this season, averaging 14 points and five rebounds a game.
