



## CHIZIK IN SECOND SEASON

Iowa State ends a two-game road trip against Colorado ... ISU WR R.J. Sumrall leads the team with five touchdown receptions, including two against Kent State and UNLV ... quarterback Austen Arnaud set a career-high with 371 passing yards against Texas A&M ... Arnaud accounted for 438 total yards against the Aggies, the third best total in ISU history ... true freshmen are making major contributions for the Cyclones ... wide receiver Darius Darks is second on the team with 29 receptions ... freshman Grant Mahoney has made all 25 extra point tries and has made 13-of-20 field goals, with a long of 48 ... Leonard Johnson is 12th in the nation, averaging 28.7 yards per kick-off return ... Johnson set an NCAA record with 319 return yards against Oklahoma State ... Alexander Robinson had a 67-yard scoring run, the longest play of his career against Nebraska ... ISU has not punted in two games (SDSU and Texas A&M) ... the Cyclone defense has forced 23 turnovers that have resulted in 49 ISU points ... Kurtis Taylor leads ISU with nine tackles for loss and also has four sacks.

## BUFFS STINGY AGAINST PASS

Colorado (4-5 overall, 1-4 Big 12) is ranked first in the Big 12 against the pass, allowing opponents just 213 yards through the air ... Colorado owns non-conference wins over Colorado State, Eastern Washington and then-No. 21 West Virginia ... its lone conference win was a 14-13 victory over Kansas State ... fifth in the Big 12 in total defense ... the Buffs are the second least penalized team in the Big 12, giving up just 45 yards a game on penalties ... freshman running back Rodney Stewart is sixth in the conference in rushing, averaging 69 yards a game.

## Head Coach Gene Chizik



Improvement in the Cyclone football program under Chizik was immediate. Chizik's first ISU team beat rival Iowa and made steady progress throughout the season.

Iowa State closed out the 2007 home season with wins over Kansas State and bowl-bound Colorado, affirming the major advances the Cyclones made on both sides of the ball. Iowa State fans embraced Chizik. Cyclone backers bought a school-record 36,000 season tickets in 2007 and posted the school's best home game attendance average (49,462) since 1982.

Chizik came to Iowa State after two years as the assistant head coach, co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Texas. Working for former Iowa State assistant coach Mack Brown, Chizik was on the coaching staff of the Longhorns as UT went undefeated at 13-0 en route to the collegiate national championship.

Chizik had been defensive coordinator at Auburn, where his unforgiving defenses set a standard for the rest of the country. In 2004, the Tigers gave up an average of just 277.62 yards of total offense per game. During one amazing stretch, Chizik fashioned a personal 29-game winning streak between Auburn and Texas' national championship seasons in 2004 and 2005, respectively.

Chizik is a 1985 graduate of Florida. A former third-grade teacher, Chizik stepped into coaching at Clemson (1988-89), Middle Tennessee State (1990-91), Stephen F. Austin (1992-97) and Central Florida (1998-2001) before heading to Auburn in 2002.

## STORY LINES

### 1. CHIZIK IN SECOND SEASON

Gene Chizik, 2-7 this season, is still the man. One season after being tabbed as Iowa State's head coach, Chizik is continuing to build the ISU football program in his image. Chizik's Cyclones won two of their last three games of 2007, including erasing a 21-0 half-time deficit to defeat bowl-bound Colorado. Iowa State's 2007 wins came over in-state rival Iowa, and back-to-back Big 12 victories over Kansas State and Colorado, the first time a Cyclone team had won consecutive conference games since 2005. Iowa State's 2008 season-opening wins over South Dakota State and Kent State gave the Cyclones four straight home wins. A defensive wizard who was defensive coordinator at Auburn and Texas, Chizik oversaw a dramatic improvement in the Cyclones' performance. A defense that had been ranked 102nd nationally in 2006, improved to 65th.

### 2. DEFENSE SETTING UP OFFENSE

A defense that has forced 23 turnovers has given the offense a short field to work with over and over again. The Cyclones have 15 scoring drives that took less than two minutes off the clock. ISU is fifth in the Big 12 and 29th nationally in turnover margin. Its 23 forced turnovers is tied for sixth in the nation.

### 3. FROSH MAKE MARK

Iowa State's true freshmen have made big contributions this fall ... WR Darius Darks is second on the team with 29 catches for 328 yards, including seven receptions for 113 yards against Oklahoma State ... WR Sedrick Johnson has 15 catches for 146 yards and two scores ... CB Leonard Johnson has 39 tackles and is 12th in the nation, averaging 28.7 yards per kickoff return.

### 4. ARNAUD GETS THE NOD

The sophomore from Ames has started all nine games this season at quarterback. He has completed 164-of-274 passes for 1,811 yards and 10 scores. Against Kansas, Arnaud set career highs in attempts (27), completions (45) and touchdown passes (3). His 371 passing yards against Texas A&M were a career high, and his 438 yards

of total offense were the third most all-time by a Cyclone. Arnaud led Iowa State on a 9-play, 98-yard TD drive in just 1:03 with no time outs at UNLV to force overtime.

### 5. RUSHING IMPROVEMENTS

From day one, Chizik has made running the football a priority. In 2006, the season before Chizik arrived in Ames, Iowa State averaged 101.8 yards on the ground. That number was improved to 123.7 yards last season. This year the Cyclones are averaging 132.3 yards rushing through the season's first nine games. Iowa State's 229 yards vs. South Dakota State was the team's best effort on the ground since netting 229 yards vs. Kansas State in 2005. ISU's 173 rushing yards are the most against a Big 12 opponent since gaining 196 against Missouri in 2006.

The Cyclones don't have one back who is putting up huge numbers, but are getting production from several different people.

Alexander Robinson leads the team with 470 yards on the ground this season after being ISU's top rusher in 2007 as a freshmen. He rushed for 87 yards, including a 67-yard scoring run, against Nebraska and added 85 yards and a score against Texas A&M.

Quarterback Austen Arnaud had 237 yards on the ground and leads the team with five touchdown runs.

Senior J.J. Bass has played in six of ISU's nine games, and has 130 yards and a score.

Reserve Jason Harris has the team's longest run of the season, a 68-yard scoring jaunt against SDSU.

### 6. MAHONEY MAKES GOOD PK DEBUT

True freshman Grant Mahoney has made all 25 of his extra-point attempts, as well as 13-of-20 field goal attempts. He connected on a career-long 48-yard field goal against Kent State. Mahoney ranks tied for first in the Big 12 and T-24th nationally, making 1.44 field goals a game. He is also 14th in the Big 12 in scoring, averaging 7.11 points per game.

### OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Iowa State and Texas A&M combined for 1,083 yards in the 49-35 Aggie victory and ISU and Oklahoma State gained 1,044 yards in the Cowboy win. That was the 13th and 14th times the Cyclones and their opponent have combined for over 1,000 yards of offense. The yardage against Texas A&M was the most combined yards ever in Jack Trice Stadium.

### 7. JACK TRICE STADIUM FACELIFT

Under the leadership of Athletics Director Jamie Pollard, the home of Iowa State football is getting a face lift. Pollard spearheaded a \$19.5 million first-phase remodeling project that included the renovation/construction of suites and the addition of restroom and concession buildings on the west concourse. The Jack Trice Club section on the stadium's east side was also entirely renovated. A \$5 million gift from Richard Jacobson announced last week will allow the renovation of the stadium's east concourse.

### 8. SUMRALL'S TIME TO SHINE

Senior R.J. Sumrall led Iowa State with four receptions for 104 yards and two scores against Kent State. Those touchdowns were the first of his Cyclone career, coming on career receptions 104 and 105. He added a career-high 10 receptions for 106 yards against Kansas. He has 143 grabs in his career, good for fourth on the all-time ISU receiving charts, and his 1,663 receiving yards are sixth in school history.

### 9. SMITH & SMITH

Iowa State FS James Smith leads the team with 69 tackles ... Smith, a native of Council Bluffs, Iowa, leads the squad with 154 career stops.

Iowa State MLB Jesse Smith is second on the team with 59 tackles this season. He is a former walk-on from Altoona who has 145 career tackles.

## 10. ENDS MAJOR FORCE FOR ISU

Senior defensive end Kurtis Taylor has made his way from special teams player to one of the top linemen in the Big 12. He is joined by Christopher Lyle to form one of the most formidable defensive duos in the Big 12. Taylor, a Fort Dodge native, was second in the Big 12 in sacks a season ago with 6.5. This season he has four sacks and nine tackles for loss. He also returned an interception 48 yards against SDSU, putting a spin move on the quarterback to gain a final couple yards.

Lyle, who was previously best known for blocking a field goal in ISU's 15-13 win over Iowa in 2007, leads the Cyclones with five sacks and also boasts seven tackles for loss.

## 11. ISU NETS RECORD RETURNS

Iowa State had interception returns by Devin McDowell (3), Kurtis Taylor (48), Austin Alburtis (61), Michael Bibbs (53) and Derek Schmidgall (37t) against SDSU. The Cyclones' 202 interception return yards crushed the previous team record of 167 set against Northern Iowa in 1945. The five interceptions were the most by an Iowa State defense since the Cyclones had five interceptions at Kansas on Nov. 17, 2001.

## 12. BIG KICK RETURN IMPROVEMENT

There has been more bad than good over the last decade for ISU kickoff returners but it has been a solid area for the Cyclones this year as Iowa State is ranked eighth nationally, averaging 25.16 yards per return this season.

Leonard Johnson is the man behind the return improvement. The true freshman from Clearwater, Fla., is averaging 28.7 yards per kickoff return. That ranks 12th nationally and is third in the Big 12.

Johnson set an NCAA record with 319 yards on nine kickoff returns against Oklahoma State. He broke free for returns of 73 and 72 yards in the first half, setting up ISU scores after both returns. Johnson is already Iowa State's all-time leader in kickoff return average and his 28.7 yards per return are the second best single-season mark in school history (Luther Blue, 1974, 32.75).

Credentials will be granted to the media on assignment from daily newspapers, ISU network radio affiliates (as space permits), originating radio stations and television stations. Misuse of these credentials will result in expulsion from the game and denial of credentials to future ISU athletic activities. Credentials are non-transferrable.

### Photo Credentials

Photo credentials must be requested in the same manner as media credentials. For sideline armbands, photo credentials must be presented prior to the game in the press box in accordance with Big 12 Conference rules. Misuse of photo credentials will result in expulsion from the game. An affiliation photo ID must be shown on gamedays to obtain an armband for field admittance.

### Radio Originations

A radio booth is provided for the visiting team's designated station. Additional originations may be arranged through Tom Kroeschell. Auxiliary booths (outside the press box) are used for additional stations. Telephone arrangements should be made through Iowa State University Telecommunications at (515) 294-8556.

### Telephones & Ethernet

Iowa State provides four courtesy phone lines and one ethernet hub in the main press box area for media use on a first-come, first-served basis, as well as a wireless internet connection. Media requiring their own phone lines or ethernet should contact ISU Telecommunications at (515) 294-8556.

## Gameday Operations

### Parking

Media parking is located in the South Lot (S-3) of Jack Trice Stadium. Parking passes should be requested when requesting credentials.

### Press Tower

The Jack Trice Stadium press tower is located on the west side of the stadium and is accessed through the press tower elevator. Admission is by media credential only. The press tower is a three-level facility with separate donor, media and radio-television decks. As per the instructions of the State Fire Marshal, smoking is not permitted in the press tower. Athletics Communications personnel will staff the press box for three hours following the game.

## Services

Complete play-by-play copy, halftime stats, final team and individual stats, tackle charts and quotes from coaches and players are provided.

## Photo Deck

A photo deck is located directly under the press tower directly below the donor (first) level. Arrangements to secure a spot should be made with the Athletics Communications office.

## Interview Policies

In addition to weekly press conferences, interviews shall be conducted between 6:30-9 p.m. CST on Sunday through Wednesday. **MEDIA WISHING TO INTERVIEW IOWA STATE PLAYERS SHOULD CALL THE IOWA STATE ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS OFFICE BETWEEN 1-4 P.M. ON SUNDAYS WITH THEIR INTERVIEW REQUESTS.** All player interviews must be coordinated through the Communications office.

## Post-game Interviews

ISU's locker room is closed. Following a "cooling off" period after the game, head coach Gene Chizik will conduct a press conference in the Jacobson Athletic Building's Hunziker Auditorium (second floor). Media must enter the Jacobson Athletic Building through the facility's northwest door. Iowa State players requested by media personnel will be escorted from the locker room to the auditorium after Coach Chizik is finished. Opposing media can attend the visitor's press conference in the meeting room directly opposite the visiting locker room in the Olsen Building.

## South Dakota State 17

## Iowa State 44

### Aug. 28 • Jack Trice Stadium • Ames, Iowa

AMES, Iowa -- The turnovers were big. Iowa State's defense forced six turnovers, including five interceptions that led to 20 points as ISU prevailed over South Dakota State 44-17 in its season opener. The five interceptions by ISU was the most since picking off five passes at Kansas in 2001. The Cyclones also shattered the school-record for interception return yards (202), besting the old mark of 167 set against Iowa State Teachers College (Northern Iowa) in 1945. The Cyclone offense was sharp right out of the gates, scoring on their first drive of the season with an eight-play, 69-yard series. An Austen Arnaud 24-yard pass to tight end Collin Franklin was the big play of the scoring drive that was capped off by an Arnaud 1-yard sneak to push ISU out in front 7-0 with 11:30 left in the first quarter. SDSU QB Ryan Berry threw three interceptions inside the Iowa State 25-yard line. Interception returns of 48 yards by DE Kurtis Taylor and 53 yards by LB Michael Bibbs set up field goals by true freshman Grant Mahoney. Mahoney hit on field-goal attempts from 35, 36 and 30 yards in his collegiate debut. DT Austin Alburts' 61-yard interception runback set up a

14-yard TD toss from Phillip Bates to true freshman Sedrick Johnson in the second quarter that gave the Cyclones a 20-0 halftime lead. Arnaud and Bates combined to completed 13-of-19 passes for 159 yards and each had a TD pass. ISU TB Jason Harris had a 68-yard TD dash that made the score 44-9 with 6:29 left in the game. Derec Schmidgall had a 37-yard interception return for a touchdown. Iowa State put up 229 yards rushing on 42 carries. Bibbs added a game-high nine tackles to his interception return. A crowd of 46,617 saw the game on a warm evening in Jack Trice Stadium, which boasted new suites, a remodeled Jack Trice Stadium Club and a much wider west concourse. Iowa State did not punt in the game, the first time that had occurred since Oct. 21, 1989, against Oklahoma.

## Kent State 28

## Iowa State 48

### Sept. 6 • Jack Trice Stadium • Ames, Iowa

AMES, Iowa -- The Iowa State defense and special teams came up with the big plays for the second consecutive game, recovering four fumbles and blocking two punts en route to a 48-28 victory over Kent State in Jack Trice Stadium. ISU recorded 40 points for the second consecutive game, marking the first time a Cyclone team has scored 40 or more points in their first two games since 1976. ISU scored 21 unanswered points going ahead 21-7 at the end of the first quarter. Jason Scales blocked Matt Rinehart's punt at the 33-yard line where it eventually bounced out of bounds at the KSU 1-yard line. Scales then cleaned up his heroic play with a 1-yard touchdown dive to put the Cyclones on the board. Iowa State's 21 points were the most by an ISU team in the initial quarter since 1980. ISU forged its first lead at 14-7 with 1:59 left in the first quarter on a 5-play, 61-yard drive with a Phillip Bates-to-R.J. Sumrall 24-yard touchdown strike. It was Sumrall's first touchdown catch of his career on his 104th reception. QB Austen Arnaud, fired a perfect 49-yard strike to Sumrall make it a 28-14. Arnaud and Bates combined to hit 15-of-21 passes for 214 yards and two TDs. Bates had a 56-yard scamper that set

up the Cyclones' final score. The ISU defense struggled to stop the mad scrambling of Kent State QB Julian Edelman who piled up 236 yards of total offense. Eugene Jarvis, the nation's leading returning rusher had 139 yards on 24 carries with one touchdown for the Golden Flashes. LB Jesse Smith led the Cyclones with eight tackles. Defensive end Kurtis Taylor made six tackles, with a sack, three tackles for 15 yards in losses and caused a fumble.

## Iowa State 5 Iowa 17

### Sept. 13 • Kinnick Stadium • Iowa City, Iowa

IOWA CITY, Iowa -- Iowa State's football team had its chances at Iowa. Six times it marched past Iowa's 30-yard line, but came away with just three offensive points to show for it. Iowa drove 65 yards in six plays for a fourth-quarter score and added an 81-yard punt return for a touchdown to seal the Hawkeyes' fourth win over the Cyclones in 11 years, a 17-5 decision in Kinnick Stadium. Iowa State outgained Iowa, 325-244 but simply could not get to the endzone when it had to. Cyclone quarterback Austen Arnaud hit on a career-high 21 completions in 34 attempts for a career-high 224 yards but threw two interceptions, one in the end zone. The score was locked 3-3 early in the fourth quarter. After a 15-yard pass play and a controversial 15-yard penalty against the Cyclones, Iowa's Shon Greene made runs of 20 and five yards, the second carry for a touchdown that gave Iowa a 10-3 advantage with 12:56 left in the game. Iowa State countered as Arnaud marched the Cyclones down the field to the Iowa 29. But his third-down pass intended for Marquis Hamilton was incomplete, forcing ISU to attempt a field goal, which Grant Mahoney missed from 46 yards out. The two teams traded drives before Brodell returned a punt 81 yards for a touchdown to give Iowa a 17-3 lead. Iowa State once again drove down the field to the Hawkeye 4-yard line for the second time in the game, but Arnaud's pass to Houston Jones on 4th-and-4 was incomplete and the Cyclones turned the ball over on downs. The Cyclones got a safety with 28 seconds remaining to conclude the scoring. Jones grabbed six receptions for a career-high 67 yards. Greene rushed for 120 yards and a score for Iowa. Iowa won the rushing yards tally, 122-73. ISU linebacker Michael Bibbs intercepted Ricky Stanzi's throw at the ISU 28 late in the third quarter. Mahoney hit on a 45-yard field goal attempt to knot the score 3-3 after a four-play 2-yard drive with 25 seconds left in the third quarter. Bibbs finished the game with a game-high eight tackles. After Arnaud was intercepted at the Iowa 1-yard line, the Cyclones started the next drive 1st-and-10 at the Iowa 26-yard line. ISU drove to the Iowa 4-yard line and Mahoney's 21-yard field goal attempt hit the upright with 2:56 left in the third quarter.

Iowa State never got on track offensively, recording just 257 yards of total offense, its lowest output of the season ... the Bears took the opening kickoff of the second half back for a touchdown after ISU had already kicked off and stopped the Bears, but an offside penalty forced the Cyclones to kickoff again. ... J.J. Bass totaled 36 yards on six carries to lead the Cyclone rushing attack ... the Cyclone defense recorded three sacks, all in the first half, to tie a season high.

STILLWATER, Okla. -- True freshman Leonard Johnson set an NCAA (FBS) record by netting 319 kickoff return yards, but that effort could not contain the Oklahoma State offense as the Cowboys claimed a 59-17 victory ... Johnson had returns of 73 and 72 yards, both setting up Cyclone scores ... Johnson is already the career leader in kickoff return average for ISU, netting 28.68 yards a return ... for the second consecutive week, Iowa State and its opponent combined for over 1,000 yards of offense ... OSU struck first with a 1-yard touchdown run from fullback Bryant Ward ... after a 72 yard return by Johnson, ISU tied the game with a 1-yard Alexander Robinson run ... ISU's Robinson had 68 yards on 15 carries and a touchdown ... this was the third consecutive game that Robinson found the end zone on the ground ... Oklahoma State's offense took over after that ... quarterback Zac Robinson found Dez Bryant for touchdowns of 11, 26 and 80 yards to jump to a 28-7 lead midway through the second quarter ... a 73-yard return by Johnson set up a 38 yard field goal, making the score 28-10 at half ... OSU's Kendall Hunter scored on a 36-yard run to start the second half ... the Cowboys added two touchdown passes in the third from Robinson, including a 95 yard catch and run by Jeremy Broadway ... Robinson finished the game with 395 passing yards and five touchdowns for the Cowboys ... Bryant had nine receptions for 171 yards and four scores ... Iowa State scored in the fourth quarter, a 1-yard pass from Austen Arnaud to Sedrick Johnson ... the score capped off a 13-play, 83-yard drive ... Arnaud was 20-of-35 passing for 240 yards ... freshman Darius Darks led ISU with career highs of seven catches for 113 yards, including a 54 yard reception ... Darks became just the third freshman in ISU history to have 100 yards receiving in a game, joining Todd Blythe and Jim Knuth.
