The Game

Saturday's contest between the New Mexico State Aggies and the Colorado Buffaloes will be the first game between the two schools. Game time is set for 8:00 p.m. (MT) at Folsom Field in Boulder, Colo. The game will be televised on Fox Sports Net and of course you can listen to all the action with the 'Voice of the Aggies' Jack Nixon on KGRT 104 FM.

Aggies vs. Current Big 12 Opponents

Although the Aggies have never faced Colorado, the New Mexico State football program does have its share of experience with other schools that are currently in the Big 12. NMSU is 2-17 all-time versus teams that are currently members of the Big 12. Both of the Aggies' victories over current Big 12 schools have come on the road and both came on the same date.

On Oct. 1, 1983, the Aggies recorded their points and first win ever over a current Big 12 and former Big 8 school when they downed the Cyclones of Iowa State in Ames, 24-17. NMSU set two school records in the victory as the Crimson & White controlled the ball for 40:00 minutes and rushed for a total of 69 times in the win. Kicker Andy Weiler also made his mark on the Aggie record books as he tied Skip Vernon for fourth place on the all-time field-goal list with a 53-yard boot.

On Oct. 1, 1988, the Aggies earned their second win over a Big 12 school as they crushed the Kansas Jayhawks in Lawrence, 49-29. It was NMSU's first meeting ever with Kansas and the Aggies' only win that season. In the game, NMSU racked up a impressive 526 total yards of offense as head coach Mike Knoll celebrated his 37th birthday with the win. The Aggies had two rushers go for over 100 yards on the ground as Anthony Singleton piled up 145 yards rushing and Marvin Johnson led all runners with 179 yards. Aggie kicker Dat Ly also had a great day as he tied an NCAA record and set an Aggie record with five field goals in the first half alone.

Unfortunately, the Aggies' would go on to lose their next 27 games in a row after the win over Kansas.

Checking Up on Colorado

This year's version of Colorado football got its 2005 season off to a great start last Saturday as the Buffs downed in-state rival Colorado State, 31-28 in Boulder. With the score tied at 28, Preseason All-American kicker Mason Crosby booted a 47-yard kick through the uprights with four seconds remaining in the game to give Colorado a come-from-behind win. Down 21-10 headed into the fourth quarter, the Buffalos scored 21 of the game's final 28 points to earn their fourth straight win over the Rams.

Senior quarterback Joel Klatt, a Preseason All-America Honorable Mention pick by Street & Smith's, finished the day 23 of 34 for 283

yards, but it was the Buff's ground game that made the difference as the Colorado rushing attack racked up 127 yards on 28 carries and scored three times. Sophomore running back Hugh Charles led the way in the running game with 108 yards on 15 carries and two scores.

In 2004, Colorado won its third Big 12 North Division title in the last four years and then defeated UTEP in the EVI.net Houston Bowl, 33-28. This season, the Buffs return 50 lettermen and 17 starters from that bowl-championship team. Colorado also had 10 players named to Preseason All-America teams heading into 2005.

Klatt, who is entering his third year as the starting quarterback for the Buffs, is the first three-year starter at quarterback since Kordell Stewart started for Colorado from 1992 to 1994.

On defense, the Buffs return 10 starters from 2004, including sophomore linebacker Jordan Dizon who set a true freshman record last season with 82 tackles.

This Day in Aggie Football History

On Sept. 10, 1960, the Aggie football team scored at will as the Crimson & White rolled past the University of Mexico, 41-0. NMSU quarterback Charlie Johnson completed 14 of 23 passes for 223 yards and two touchdowns. The Aggie ground game also had things going on the day as both Bob Gaiters and Pervis Atkins rushed for over 100 yards in the win. Gaiters finished the day with a game-high 191 yards while Atkins added 144 yards, which included a 86-yard touchdown scamper that still ranks as the fourth longest scoring run from scrimmage in school history.

On Sept. 10, 1966, the Aggies scored in every quarter as they defeated Howard Payne, 35-7. NMSU jumped out to an early 21-7 lead at half as Jim Bohl tossed a first-quarter touchdown and running back Loy Hayes found the end zone from five yards out to put the Aggies ahead by two scores. In the third quarter, with the game still in question, NMSU's Kelly Olive picked off a Yellow Jacket pass and returned it 21 yards for the six points. The Aggies put the final nail in the coffin when running back Tony Field broke free for a 49-yard scoring run.

Tale of Two Halves

After being down 31-0 at halftime and giving up 232 yards of total offense against UTEP this past week, the Aggies came out of the locker room firing in the second half. The Aggie defense held the Miners to just three points in the second half (scoreless in the third quarter) and only two first downs. In fact, the Miners could only manage 69 yards in the second half.

On offense, the Aggies snapped a seven-and-a-half quarter scoreless streak against UTEP with 17 fourth-quarter points, including two touchdown passes and a 39-yard field goal. The Aggie offense did outgain the Miners 330 to 301 in the game.

Gill Comes Out of the Gate Firing

Junior quarterback Royal Gill, in his first game as an Aggie, recorded 57 passing attempts for 332 yards and two touchdowns. Gill completed 36 of his passes, breaking a school record for the Aggies, set by Chad Salisbury against Boise State in 1996. Salisbury completed 34 passes that day. On the day, the Aggies completed 38 passes also a school record, breaking the old record of 34 set by the Aggies against Boise State in 1996 and UNLV in 1995.

Dombrowski Has Career Day

Senior wide receiver Paul Dombrowski caught a career-high 15 receptions for 127 yards and one touchdown against UTEP. Dombrowski's previous career-high was six catches, something he did twice last season. Dombrowski also tied a school record for receptions in a game, tying Jeff Evans, who caught 15 passes against Southern Illinois in 1978.

Dombrowski is only the 12th player in school history to catch 10 passes or more in a single game. Paul was also 1-for-1 in passing with an 11-yard completion. Dombrowski now has 34 touchdowns passing, receiving and rushing in his career.

Sophomore Derek Dubois caught his first touchdown pass of his career against UTEP late in the fourth quarter. The pass was a 36-yard bomb from Royal Gill. Dubois caught two passes on the night.

Tolbert Grabs Career-High in Receptions

Junior wide receiver Tim Tolbert also had a career day against UTEP with seven catches for 71 yards. Tolbert's seven catches is two more than his previous career-high of five. Tolbert's 71 yards receiving is his second best day. Tolbert's career-high in yardage in a game is 126 against Florida International last season.

Fourth Downs Not Uncommon For Mumme and Company

Against UTEP, the Aggies went for it on fourth down five times converting on two of those attempts. But this is nothing new for Mumme's teams. Last season at Southeastern Louisiana, the Lions attempted to 'Go For It' on fourth down 49 times during the year converting on 21 of those attempts.

Cottrell Named WAC Defensive Player of the Week

Senior linebacker Jimmy Cottrell was named the WAC Defensive Player of the Week as announced by the conference office Monday morning. Cottrell (castle Rock, Colo.) led the Aggies and the WAC this past week-end in tackles with 18, four solo and 14 assisted. This is the Aggies first ever Player of the Week award in any sport since joining the WAC.

To go along with his 18 tackles, Cottrell also recorded one sack against I-10 rival UTEP. His 18 tackles put Cottrell 302 tackles for his career, placing him ninth all-time on the Aggies' career tackle list. This is Cottrell's first conference Player of the Week award.

10 True Freshmen See Action

In the first football game of the 2005 season, the Aggies played 10 true freshmen, including a starting place kicker in Conor Foley. Six of those freshmen played on the offensive side of the ball. Freshman Chris Williams led the 10 freshman with three carries for nine yards, while A.J. Harris and Jeremiah Williams each caught one pass for nine and six yards respectively.

On the defensive side of the ball, three true freshmen saw action all on the defensive line. David Niumatalolo led that corps of player with two tackles, while Polo Guterrez and Richie Bolin each recorded one tackle.

Griebel Flies Through the Air

Starting free safety Matt Griebel recorded a career-high three pass breakups against UTEP this past week. For his career, Griebel now has 12 pass breakups. He also collected 4.5 tackles on the night.

C - 69 - Mike Martinez, 6-3, 292, So., 1L, Aurora, Colo. - Martinez began the 2004 season as the Aggies' starting center and then moved to left tackle for the final four games. He will move back to center in the fall.

LG - 77 - Justin Shoppell, 6-4, 295, Jr., 1L, Woodbury, Minn. - Shoppell was a permanent fixture at the left guard position a year ago, starting every game.
