### Extra Points

#### RUSH DEFENSE

The Kansas rush defense currently ranks second in the Big 12 and fourth nationally by allowing just 69.8 yards per game. Five times this season, the KU defense has surrendered less than 100 yards to an opponent (70 vs. Florida Atlantic, 38 vs. La. Tech, 47 at Texas Tech, 35 at Kansas State and 96 vs. Oklahoma).

#### KEEP OUT

The KU defense has allowed just one rushing touchdown in its last seven games dating back to the final contest of the 2004 season. In that span, the Jayhawks have allowed just 109 total points -- an average of 15.6 points per game.

#### ON A MISSION

Sophomore punter Kyle Tucker is averaging 44.5 yards per attempt this season -- the third best single-season average in school history. Only Bucky Scribner (45.8 yards per attempt in 1982) and John Hadl (45.6 yards per attempt in 1959) have better single-season averages in KU history. As a team, the Jayhawks lead the Big 12 and are second in the nation with a net punting average of 40.9 yards per attempt.

#### SIMMONS MOVES UP CHART

Senior Mark Simmons caught one pass in the game against Oklahoma and moved past Brandon Rideau for second place on KU's all-time receptions list with 132. Simmons needs two receptions to move past Willie Vaughn as KU's all-time leader.

### Scene Setter

Kansas (3-3, 0-3 Big 12) and Colorado (4-2, 2-1 Big 12) meet for the 65th time in series history as the Jayhawks travel to Boulder, Colo., for a 6 p.m. (CT) contest against the Buffaloes. Saturday's game against CU marks the last of four consecutive contests away from home for the Jayhawks, who will play three of their final four games of the regular-season in Memorial Stadium. The Buffaloes have won the last four meetings between the two teams, dating back to a 23-15 Kansas victory during the 2000 season.

The Jayhawks enter the contest looking to snap a current three-game losing skid after falling 19-3 to Oklahoma on Oct. 15 in Kansas City, Mo. The KU defense was stellar against the Sooners, allowing the fewest points to an OU team since the 1995 season. Senior linebackers Nick Reid and Kevin Kane led the defensive charge, racking up 15 and 13 total tackles, respectively.

The Buffaloes enter the game against the Jayhawks after a 42-17 setback at No. 2 Texas. Colorado reeled off three-straight wins to open the season, but is 1-2 over its last three outings. The last time these two teams squared off in Boulder, CU was victorious in a thrilling 50-47 overtime shootout.

### Kansas - Colorado Series Notes

This year's game marks the 58th consecutive meeting (starting in 1948) and 66th overall between the two schools ... KU and CU also played seven other times prior to World War II ... Colorado holds an all-time 40-21-3 advantage ... The team with the most rushing yards in the game has won each KU-CU contest since 1993, a steak of 12 games ... In six of the last eight games, the home team has walked away with the win ... The last Kansas victory in Boulder occurred in 1995 when the Jayhawks defeated the Buffs 40-24 ... KU is 8-22 all-time against the Buffs in Boulder, Colo.

### A Kansas WIN Would ...

Snap CU's four-game win streak against the Jayhawks, making the all-time series 40-22-3 in CU's favor ... Hand the Jayhawks their first win in the series since 1995 ... Be KU's first win in Boulder, Colo., since 1995 ... Give Mark Mangino his 16th career win as head coach, making his overall record 16-27 ... Make Kansas 533-529-58 all-time.

### The Coaches



KU head coach Mark Mangino (15-27, .358), who was a driving force in the successful turnaround of two Big 12 Conference football programs prior to his arrival in Lawrence, is in his fourth season as head football coach at the University of Kansas.

Last year, Mangino guided a relatively inexperienced club to a 4-7 record, with a schedule that included six games against opponents ranked among the Top 25 during the 2004 season -- only two NCAA Division I teams played more regular-season games against opponents ranked in the Top 25. In addition, for the first time since the 1989 season, Kansas was victorious against both of its biggest rivals -- Missouri and Kansas State. The Jayhawks snapped K-State's 11-game win-streak in the series by defeating the Wildcats 31-28 on Oct. 9 in Lawrence, and later tamed the Tigers 31-14 on Nov. 9 in Columbia, Mo.

Mangino coached his first All-American at Kansas last year, as sophomore cornerback Charles Gordon was named third-team All-America by the *Associated Press* following the 2004 season. After recruiting Gordon to Lawrence as a wide receiver, Mangino made the bold move to switch the Carson, Calif., native, to the defensive side of the ball. In his first full year at the new position, Gordon tied for the NCAA lead with seven interceptions and broke up a Big 12-best 15 passes.

In 2003, Mangino led the Jayhawks to their first bowl appearance since 1995 when the team faced North Carolina State in the Mazda Tangerine Bowl.

Colorado is coached by Gary Barnett (46-35, .568 at Colorado), who is in his seventh year as the team's head coach. Barnett arrived in Boulder, Colo., after a seven-year stint as the head coach at Northwestern (1992-98)

where he guided the Wildcats to 35-45-1 overall record. At Colorado, Barnett has captured one Big 12 Conference title (2001) and three Big 12 North Division crowns (2001, 2002, 2004). The Buffs are 31-20 in Big 12 contests during his tenure. He has been named Big 12 Coach of the Year by the *Associated Press* on two occasions (2001 and 2004).

### A Quick Look at Colorado

Colorado (4-2, 2-1 Big 12) enters the contest against Kansas after falling to No. 2 Texas 42-17 last week in Austin, Texas. CU is averaging 27.5 points per game and allowing 18.8 points per contest. The Buffaloes are rushing for an average of 145.3 yards per game and collecting 250.8 yards through the air. CU is led offensively by sophomore tailback Hugh Charles who averages 5.0 yards per carry and 87.5 rushing yards per game through six contests. Senior quarterback Joel Klatt has completed 126-of-202 passes this season for 1,435 yards and eight touchdowns. The Colorado defense is paced by junior linebacker Thaddeus Washington and junior safety Tyrone Henderson who lead the team with 46 and 40 total tackles, respectively. Eight different defensive players have collected an interception for the Buffaloes.

### Among the Best

KU's scoring defense currently ranks 15th among all NCAA I teams by allowing just 17.0 points per game. The Jayhawks have allowed just one rushing touchdown all season long and only two offensive touchdowns in the team's last two contests. In addition, the Jayhawks rank second in the Big 12 allowing the opposition to convert on just 28.1 percent of their third-down opportunities.

### KU Defense Ranks 3rd in NCAA in Tackles for Loss

The Kansas defense is currently third among all NCAA I teams with an average of 10.5 tackles for loss per game.

### Sack Happy

The KU defense ranks second in the Big 12 with 19 quarterback sacks. Only Nebraska (34 sacks) has dropped the quarterback more often than the Jayhawks. Senior linebacker Brandon Perkins leads the way for Kansas with eight QB sacks.

### Tough in the Red Zone

KU's defense leads the Big 12 in red zone defense, allowing the opposition to convert on just 61.1 percent of their chances inside the 20-yard line. KU opponents have been inside the red zone 18 times this season and have walked away with points just 11 times (eight touchdowns, three field goals).

### Picking Off Passes

KU safety Rodney Fowler is currently ranked 16th in the nation and tied for the Big 12 lead with three interceptions. While Fowler leads the club, junior cornerback Charles Gordon placed his name among the conference leaders by picking off a pair of passes last weekend against Oklahoma. Gordon's two interceptions came during OU's first two possessions of the third quarter, and marked the first two INTs of the season for the Carson, Calif., native. Last season, Gordon tied for the national lead with seven interceptions. No other Jayhawk had collected more INTs in a season since 1951. Gordon, who was named third-team All-America for his efforts as a sophomore, also led the Big 12 with 15 passes broken-up.

### Gordon Impressive Against Oklahoma

Junior Charles Gordon lived up to the nickname Slash on Oct. 15 against Oklahoma as he played extensively on both offense and defense while returning two punts for 44 yards. Gordon snagged two interceptions, his first picks of the season, and also led the Jayhawks with four receptions for 18 yards.

### Defensive Improvements

The Kansas defense had one of its best seasons in recent memory during the 2004 season. Consider the following:

►In 2004, KU allowed an average of 345.5 total offensive yards per game -- the lowest average since 1994. **This season, the Jayhawks are allowing just 307.2 yards per contest.**

►In 2004, KU's defense led the Big 12 Conference with 27 takeaways, including eight fumble recoveries and a Big 12-best 19 interceptions. **This season, the Jayhawks have collected five fumbles and intercepted the opposing quarterback eight times.**

►The KU defense did not allow a first quarter offensive touchdown during the entire 2004 season. The only points the opposition scored in first quarters came on two field goals, a safety and a defensive touchdown. KU outscored its opponents 75-15 in first quarters throughout the 2004 season. **This season, the Jayhawks have been solid out of the locker room as well, outscoring the opposition 70-40 in the first and third quarters of games.**

►In 2004, the Jayhawk defense allowed an average of 117.6 rushing yards per game -- the third-best average in school history, and the best since 1962. **This season, the Jayhawks are allowing just 69.8 yards per game on the ground which would shatter the school-record of 109.2 rushing yards allowed per game set in 1948.**

►In 2004, linebacker Nick Reid had 15 tackles behind the line of scrimmage -- tying for the seventh-best single-season total in Jayhawk history. **This season, Reid already has 16 stops behind the line of scrimmage. In addition, senior defensive end Charlton Keith has added 13 TFLs of his own. As a team, KU has 63 tackles for loss in 2005.**

►The Jayhawks allowed just 235 total points and 21.4 points per game in 2004 -- the best numbers in each category since 1996. **This season, KU is allowing just 17.0 points per game -- the best average since the 1982 team allowed 16.8 points per contest.**

### KU Punter Solid

Sophomore punter Kyle Tucker had his best day statistically as a Jayhawk in KU's game against Texas Tech on

Oct. 1, when he punted eight times for 404 yards -- an average of 50.5 yards per kick. He nailed a career-long 77 yarder in the third quarter and had four punts longer than 50 yards in the contest. Overall, he is averaging 44.5 yards per punt and has landed 12 kicks inside the opponent 20 yard line while forcing seven fair catches. Last season as a freshman, Tucker averaged 40.1 yards per attempt and landed 15 kicks inside the 20 yard line.

### Simmons Leads KU Receivers

After returning nearly 90 percent of the team's receiving yards and all but three of the team's 25 touchdown catches last season, this year's wide receivers entered 2005 with just one player -- Mark Simmons -- who had more than 10 career catches. Simmons, who finished second on the team with 48 catches for 553 yards in 2004, leads a group of young, but talented wide receivers. The DeSoto, Texas, native caught at least two passes in every game last season and averaged 11.5 yards per catch and 50.3 receiving yards per game. This year, Simmons is once again leading the Jayhawks in catches (21), receiving yards (292), yards per reception (13.9) and receiving yards per game (48.7).

Of all newcomers at wide receiver, Butler County Community College transfer Brian Murph is making the biggest impact after helping the Grizzlies to the NJCAA national championship game last season. He has 16 receptions through six games this season, including a career-best five catches in KU's game against Texas Tech on Oct. 1.

Marcus Henry showed flashes of brilliance as a freshman in 2004, but is expected to post even bigger numbers this year. After hauling in just one pass in the season-opener, he had a career-high five receptions in the game against Appalachian State to lead the team. He is fifth on the team with 11 receptions this year.

Sophomore tight end Derek Fine has 12 receptions for 143 yards this season, including his first career touchdown against La Tech on Sept. 17. He has been tough to bring down in the open field, collecting most of his receiving yards after first contact.

### The End of the Line

Senior defensive ends Jermial Ashley and Charlton Keith give the Kansas defensive line one of the best pass-rushing duos in the Big 12 Conference. Ashley, who was an All-Big 12 honorable mention selection in 2004, has three tackles for loss and one pass deflection this season. Keith currently leads the team with five quarterback hurries and is second on the club with 13 tackles behind the line of scrimmage and five sacks.

### Linebackers Aplenty

The most experienced KU defense in recent memory is led by a capable group of linebackers, highlighted by three seniors -- Nick Reid, Banks Floodman and Kevin Kane -- who all could receive consideration for post-season honors. Last season, the trio combined for 225 tackles -- more than half of the team's 425 total stops. During their careers, the three have seen action in a total of 125 games at KU while making a combined 79 starts. Several talented players see time in a backup role including senior Brandon Perkins, junior Eric Washington and freshmen Mike Rivera and Joe Mortensen.

Reid currently leads the Big 12 with 11.5 tackles per game. The Derby, Kan., native has also recorded a team-best 16 tackles for loss and is one of just two Big 12 players who average more than 10 tackles per game. After recording three tackles for losses against Oklahoma, Reid moved ahead of former Jayhawk Willie Pless as the Jayhawks' career leader in tackles behind the line. Pless recently was named to the Canadian Football League's Hall of Fame.

Kane had his best day in a Jayhawk uniform against Kansas State on Oct. 8, collecting a career-best 14 tackles against the Wildcats. Last week against Oklahoma, Kane followed up his impressive performance with 13 total tackles, including a team-leading seven solo stops against the Sooners.

Floodman tied a career-high with 11 tackles against KSU -- his best total since the 2003 season. His nine solo stops in the contest were the most of his career. He is averaging 10 tackles per game over the last two contests.

### Perkins Sets KU Record

Senior linebacker Brandon Perkins set a KU record with five quarterback sacks in the team's game against Louisiana Tech on Sept. 17 en route to Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors. The Houston, Texas, native, who is used mainly in passing situations, broke the record by collecting a sack on the final play of the game against the Bulldogs. The previous mark was held by Ron Warner who collected four QB sacks against Texas Tech in 1997. Against Texas Tech on Oct. 1, Perkins added two more sacks and currently leads the team with eight this season.

### Other KU Record Holders

Junior Charles Gordon became the career punt return leader at Kansas vs. Florida Atlantic on Sept. 3. His six run-backs for 47 yards against the Owls allowed Gordon to overtake Donnie Shanklin who logged 606 career punt return yards from 1966-68. Currently, Gordon has 871 career yards on 78 punt returns -- an average of 11.2 yards per return.

Senior wide receiver/kick returner Greg Heaggans holds the Kansas record with 1,777 career kickoff return yards. He has played in a pair of games this season and has 62 return yards -- an average of 15.5 yards per return.

### Webb Becoming a Valuable Weapon

Kansas sophomore place kicker Scott Webb scored KU's only points in the team's last two outings, but was most impressive in KU's contest against Louisiana Tech on Sept. 17. The Tulsa, Okla., native booted the ball out of the end zone four of the seven times that he kicked off. On the other three kickoffs, the KU special teams stopped the La Tech return man at the 14, 16, and 18 yard lines. Webb also was accurate on both of his field goal attempts, including a career-long 47-yarder in the fourth quarter. He is 8-for-10 in field goal tries this season (24, 27, 28, 32, 32, 34, 43, 47).

### Simmons Among Nation's Most Consistent

Senior wide receiver Mark Simmons has caught at least one pass in each of his last 30 games. Only eight NCAA Division I players currently have a longer streak. Those names are listed below.

### In the Press Box

Veteran University of Kansas football and basketball color announcer Max Falkenstien announced Aug. 30 that the 2005-06 athletic season will be his final season of broadcasting Jayhawk athletic events. The 2005 football season also marks Falkenstien's 60th year of working KU games. The Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame and the College Football Hall of Fame have both honored Falkenstien. In 2001, *The Sporting News* named Falkenstien "the best college radio personality in the country." On Sept. 7, Falkenstien underwent emergency surgery but returned to the booth to call the game against Kansas State.

### Kansas Captains

During spring workouts, the 2005 team took a vote to decide the team captains for the upcoming season. Earning the honors for the 2005 campaign were senior linebackers Banks Floodman, Nick Reid, and Kevin Kane, junior cornerback Charles Gordon and junior offensive lineman David Ochoa.

### Miscellaneous Jayhawk Notes

Kansas is playing its 116th season of football ... Senior linebacker Nick Reid has the team's longest starting streak -- 36-straight games dating back to his freshman season ... Senior offensive lineman Matt Thompson has started all 30 games of his KU career, dating back to 2003 ... Senior Mark Simmons has caught at least one pass in every game since the start of the 2003 season -- a string of 30 straight contests ... Kansas has forced at least one turnover in 26 of its last 30 contests ... Since 1995, KU is 27-10 when a Jayhawk player rushes for more than 100 yards in a game.

### Jayhawks in the NFL

The University of Kansas had seven players on 2005 NFL opening day rosters. A pair of the former Jayhawks are rookies with the Cleveland Browns -- linebacker David McMillan and wide receiver Brandon Rideau. Other KU players on opening day rosters included linebacker Don Davis of New England, center Justin Hartwig of Tennessee, offensive tackle Adrian Jones of the New York Jets, fullback Moran Norris of Houston and linebacker Ron Warner of Washington.

### Game-by-Game Post-Game Notes

#### Kansas 30, Florida Atlantic 19 (Sept. 3)

- The attendance of 40,930 was the largest for a Kansas home opener since 1994.
- The last time Kansas won two straight season openers was in 1996 and 1997 - the first two seasons of the Big 12. KU is 59-50-7 all-time in season openers.
- Junior Charles Gordon moved into first place on the Kansas career punt return yards list. Gordon has 648 career punt return yards. He passed Donnie Shanklin who had 606 punt return yards from 1966-68.
- First Kansas career starts included - Jake Cox (RG); Derek Fine (TE); Marcus Henry (WR); Brian Murph (WR); Charlton Keith (DE) and James McClinton (DT).
- Clark Green registered his seventh career 100-yard rushing game. Since 1995 KU is 26-9 when it has a 100-yard rusher.
- Junior RB Jon Cornish's 29-yard TD in the fourth quarter was his first career TD and a career-long rush.
- Sophomore Jeff Foster's first KU career reception went for a touchdown in the third quarter.

#### Kansas 36, Appalachian State 8 (Sept. 10)

- Junior Jon Cornish's three touchdowns marked the most rushing TDs by a Jayhawk since Bill Whittemore ran for three at Tulsa on Sept. 28, 2002. Cornish's 58-yard rush in the fourth quarter was a career-long and marked a KU season-long.
- KU's five rushing touchdowns marked the most by a Jayhawk squad since it totaled five against Toledo on Sept. 11, 2004.
- Freshman tight end Russell Brorsen made his first career start.
- Sophomore Scott Webb's missed extra point in the second quarter was his first career miss. Prior to the kick, Webb was 31-for-31 in extra point attempts.
- Senior Brian Luke's 59-yard pass to junior Brian Murph was the second longest completion of his career (threw a 73-yarder against Texas on Nov. 15, 2004). Luke's one-yard touchdown run in the third quarter was the first rushing TD of his career.
- Senior Clark Green's touchdown in the opening stanza was his first of the season and 14th of his career. Green has 12 career rushing TDs. Green's 15 rushes moved him past John Riggins (518) and into fourth place on the KU all-time rushing attempts list with 523 for his career.

#### Kansas 34, Louisiana Tech 14 (Sept. 17)

- Kansas donned red uniforms for the first time since the 1947 Orange Bowl team wore them throughout the season.
- Senior linebacker Brandon Perkins recorded five sacks in the game, setting a new KU record. Perkins also surpassed four Jayhawks and moved into a tie for seventh place with David McMillan on the KU all-time sacks list with 15 for his career.
- Senior quarterback Brian Luke threw a career-high three touchdown passes.
- With his three receptions, senior running back Clark Green surpassed Emmett Edwards (105) and moved into sixth-place on the KU all-time pass receptions list with 106 for his career.
- Sophomore tight end Derek Fine scored his first career touchdown to give KU a 14-7 lead in the third quarter.
- Freshman cornerback Aqib Talib notched his first career interception in the fourth quarter, setting up a 29-yard reception by Simmons and one-yard TD rush by

junior running back Jon Cornish. Cornish has scored a touchdown in all three games this season.

- Sophomore place kicker Scott Webb's 47-yard field goal in the fourth quarter marked a career-long.
- KU recorded four interceptions, the most since grabbing four against Texas Tech on Sept. 25, 2004.

#### at Texas Tech 30, Kansas 17 (Oct. 1)

- Junior safety Jerome Kemp recorded his first career sack midway through the first quarter.
- Freshman Tang Bacheyie's fumble recovery in the first quarter on special teams was the first of his career.
- Senior Nick Reid moved into third place on the KU career tackles for loss list when he dropped Danny Amendola for a six-yard loss in the second quarter.
- Senior running back Clark Green hauled in two catches to move into fifth place past Harrison Hill on the all-time pass receptions list. Green's total moved to 109 career receptions.
- Senior safety Rodney Fowler collected his third interception of the season and the fifth of his career.
- Senior wide receiver Mark Simmons extended his streak to 28-straight games with at least one pass reception, which ranks among the top streaks in the nation.
- Senior linebacker Brandon Perkins recorded one sack to increase his career total to 16, moving him past Kyle Moore (15.5 sacks from 1990-92) for sixth place on the KU all-time list.
- Senior defensive end Charlton Keith picked up his second career fumble recovery to set up KU's first touchdown early in the second half.
- Runningback Jon Cornish has scored at least one rushing touchdown in all four of KU's games this season. His third quarter TD moved his season total to six.
- Kyle Tucker booted a career-long 77-yard punt midway through the third quarter. His previous long was a 58-yard kick earlier this season against Florida Atlantic. The 77-yard kick ranks as the ninth longest punt in KU history.
- Tucker finished the game with eight punts for a career-best average of 50.5 yards per kick. His previous high average was 46.8 yards per punt versus Appalachian State.
- Mark Simmons hauled in his 12th career touchdown reception late in the third quarter. The TD catch tied him for fourth on the all-time KU list for touchdown receptions with Isaac Byrd (1994-96).
- Cornish totaled career-highs of 111 rushing yards on 17 carries for his second 100+ yard rushing game of the season. It marked the third game this season KU had a 100-yard rusher.
- KU held Texas Tech to season lows in points (30), first downs (24) and rushing yards (47).

#### at Kansas State 12, Kansas 3 (Oct. 8)

- Mark Simmons' two catches tied him for second all-time on the KU career pass receptions list with 131 career grabs. He is tied with Brandon Rideau (2001-04), and needs two catches to tie Willie Vaughn (1985-88) for first place.
- Senior linebacker Nick Reid recorded his first interception of the year - the third of his career. His return of 28 yards was KU's longest INT return of the season. The Jayhawks have recorded at least one interception in each of the last three games.
- Senior defensive tackle Tim Allen notched his first career forced fumble towards the end of the first quarter.
- Junior Charles Gordon returned a punt 54 yards at the end of the first quarter marking KU's longest punt return of the season. It was Gordon's longest punt return since a 61-yard return against Missouri in the fifth game

of his freshman season in 2003.

- KU's 3-0 lead at the half marked the second time this season the Jayhawks shutout their opponent in the first half (also against Appalachian State).
- Gordon completed his first pass of the season - a 24-yard toss to Marcus Herford - and the second of his career. Gordon's first career completion came last season when he threw a 26-yard touchdown pass to Brandon Rideau against Texas Tech. The catch was the first of Herford's career.
- Sophomore tight end Derek Fine hauled in a career-long 22-yard reception toward the end of the fourth quarter.
- Kansas' defense held K-State to 35 rushing yards -- the fewest by a KU opponent this season (previous 38 by Louisiana Tech).
- The Jayhawk defense also held K-State to 182 yards in total offense, the fewest by the Wildcats this season (previous low for KSU was 248 yards at Oklahoma). The total was also the fewest by a Jayhawk opponent this season (previous was 295 by Louisiana Tech).
- K-State's 12 points were the fewest by the Wildcats against Kansas since 1993 when Kansas State defeated the Jayhawks 10-9 in Manhattan.

#### vs. Oklahoma 19, Kansas 3 (Oct. 15)

- Senior linebacker Nick Reid recorded three tackles for loss and in the process became KU's all-time leader with 42 for his career. Reid broke Willie Pless' record of 41 tackles for loss, set in 1985.
- Senior Mark Simmons has caught at least one pass in every game since the start of the 2003 season - a string of 30 straight contests. Simmons' 20 receiving yards moved his career total to 1,822, surpassing Emmett Edwards (1972-74) and moving him into third place on the all-time list.
- The last time a KU opponent returned an interception for a touchdown was on Sept. 22, 2001, when Donald Strickland of Colorado returned a pick-off for 95 yards.
- Junior safety Jerome Kemp recorded his second forced fumble of the season in the first quarter.
- Junior cornerback Charles Gordon grabbed his first two interceptions of the season in the third quarter and moved his career total to nine. Gordon also had two interceptions at Nebraska last year.
- Gordon's four receptions moved him past John Baker (1986-89) and David Verser (1977-80) and into 17th place on the KU all-time list with 79 for his career.
- Sophomore punter Kyle Tucker notched his third 60-plus-yard punt of the season in the fourth quarter.
- The attendance of 54,109 marked KU's largest crowd of the season.

**LAWRENCE, Kan.** - Behind its much-heralded defense and 107 yards rushing by senior running back Clark Green, the Kansas football team defeated Florida Atlantic, 30-19, in its 2005 season opener in front of 40,930 at Memorial Stadium. The Jayhawk defense made its presence felt quickly, as senior linebacker Brandon Perkins pressured Florida Atlantic quarterback Danny Embick into an intentional grounding penalty in the end zone that resulted in an Owls' safety and gave the Jayhawks a 2-0 lead at 10:20 of the first quarter. Following an FAU punt, junior quarterback Adam Barmann marched the Kansas offense down the field on a 12-play, 71-yard drive that culminated in a six-yard rushing touchdown by Barmann to give the Jayhawks a 9-0 lead with 19 seconds remaining in the first quarter. Florida Atlantic responded quickly, needing only nine seconds to get on the scoreboard. Embick connected on a deep strike with Owls' wide receiver Thomas Parker for a 66-yard touchdown pass with ten seconds left in the first quarter to bring the score to 9-7. On the opening drive of the second half, senior Brian Luke - who replaced Barmann at quarterback in the first half - led KU on an eight-play, 44-yard drive that resulted in a 43-yard field goal by Scott Webb to put the Jayhawks ahead 12-7. The kick set a new career-long for Webb. After a series of punts by both teams, the Kansas defense stifled a Florida Atlantic drive by forcing an Embick fumble at the Jayhawks' 14-yard line that was recovered by senior cornerback Ronnie Amadi. The fumble recovery was Amadi's first of his career. Finding themselves behind for the first time in the game, the Jayhawks marched quickly down the field on a five-play, 62-yard drive that was capped off by a 17-yard touchdown strike from Luke to sophomore wide receiver Jeff Foster. The reception was Foster's first career catch and touchdown and put the Jayhawks ahead 19-13 with 32 seconds remaining in the third quarter. In the fourth quarter, the Jayhawks forced the Owls to punt on their first possession and capitalized on the momentum by pounding the ball down to the Owls' 15-yard line, allowing Scott Webb to kick a 32-yard field goal to put the Jayhawks ahead 22-13 at 10:24 of the fourth quarter. The Jayhawks put the game away at 7:07 of the fourth quarter when junior running back Jon Cornish battered his way to the end zone for a 29-yard touchdown, capping off a four-play, 48-yard drive. The two-point conversion was successful, as Luke found senior wide receiver Mark Simmons to put the Jayhawks ahead 30-13. The Owls managed to add another tally on the final play of the game to close the score to 30-19, but failed on their two-point conversion attempt.

**LAWRENCE, Kan.** - The KU football team defeated Appalachian State, 36-8, in front of 37,070 on Heroes Night at Memorial Stadium. Sparked by a rushing attack that registered 207 yards on the ground and five touchdowns, including three by junior running back Jon Cornish, the Jayhawks (2-0) proved too much for the Mountaineers (1-1). The Jayhawk defense didn't wait long to make an impact. On the Mountaineers' opening possession, junior defensive end Rodney Allen forced a fumble by Mountaineers' running back Kevin Richardson on the Jayhawk five-yard line, which senior linebacker Banks Floodman recovered in the end zone. Following a Mountaineers' punt that pinned the Jayhawks on their 10-yard line, senior quarterback Brian Luke connected with junior wide receiver Brian Murph on a 59-yard completion to the Mountaineers' 31-yard line. Later, a Mountaineers' personal foul penalty kept the Jayhawk drive alive and enabled senior running back Clark Green to rumble in for a four-yard touchdown run and give the Jayhawks a 7-0 lead with 32 seconds left in the first quarter. In the second quarter, the offensive continued as Luke marched the Jayhawks down the field on the quarter's opening possession. The Jayhawks found the end zone again when Cornish rushed for a nine-yard touchdown to give the Jayhawks a 13-0 lead at 10:14 of the second quarter. On the first possession of the second half, the Jayhawks used a large chunk of the clock as Luke capped off a 14-play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run to give the Jayhawks a 20-0 lead with 7:49 left in the third. Cornish continued to pester the Mountaineer defense, finishing off the drive by tallying his second score of the evening, a one-yard plunge to put the Jayhawks up 26-0 with 2:40 left in the third. On the ensuing possession, the Jayhawks found themselves being led down the field on the shoulders of Cornish. The junior tailback accounted for all 75 yards on the Jayhawks' drive, including a 58-yard run. That scamper set up his third rushing touchdown of the contest, a five-yard score that put the Jayhawks ahead 33-8 with 14:07 left in the fourth quarter. In addition to the three scores, Cornish finished the game with a career-high 103 yards rushing on 10 carries. Sophomore placekicker Scott Webb added a 34-yard field goal with 9:15 remaining in the fourth quarter to increase KU's lead to 36-8.

**Game 3 - September 17, 2005**  
**at Kansas 34, Louisiana Tech 14**  
 Lawrence, Kan. - Attendance 41,237

**LAWRENCE, Kan.** - Donning red uniforms for the first time since the 1947 season, Kansas (3-0) defeated Louisiana Tech (0-2), 34-14, in front of 41,237 fans at Memorial Stadium. With the victory, the Jayhawks moved to 3-0 for the first time since 1997. The Jayhawks rode their stout defense, which registered seven sacks and recorded four interceptions, and rallied behind senior Brian Luke, who tossed a career-high three touchdowns in the win. A battle of field position and stingy defense defined the early action. Senior Rodney Fowler, who had two interceptions in the game, picked off Bulldog quarterback Donald Allen at the Jayhawks' four-yard line to quell a threatening Louisiana Tech drive. Sophomore punter Kyle Tucker helped the Jayhawks win the field position battle, continually pinning Louisiana Tech deep inside their own territory, including a punt that was downed inside the Bulldogs' one-yard line. The Jayhawks got on the board with 48 seconds remaining in the first quarter. Junior Charles Gordon struck pay dirt on a 14-yard touchdown reception from Luke to put the Jayhawks on top, 7-0. The catch was Gordon's first of the season and marked his eighth career touchdown. In the second half, Kansas continued to dominate defensively. Senior Nick Reid moved into sixth place on the KU all-time tackles list, as he recorded 14 in the game. Senior Brandon Perkins tallied five sacks in the game, setting a new school record. Seniors Charlton Keith, Theo Baines, and Reid also added a sack to the Jayhawks' total. Luke found tight end Derek Fine for a four-yard touchdown reception to give the Jayhawks a 14-7 lead with 6:33 remaining in the third quarter. On the drive, Simmons moved into fifth place all-time in receiving yards following a 23-yard reception and also contributed a 28-yard reception. The Jayhawk defense continued to shine as Baines intercepted an Allen pass early in the fourth quarter. The turnover set up Luke's third touchdown pass of the game, a six-yard strike to junior Brian Murph with 14:03 remaining in the fourth quarter. To go along with his three touchdown passes, Luke finished 19-of-31 for 236 yards with one interception. Junior Jon Cornish added a one-yard touchdown run to put the Jayhawks ahead 28-7 with 12:57 left in the game. An interception by freshmen Aqib Talib, the first pick of his career, and a 29-yard reception by Simmons, who finished with six catches for 106 yards, set up Cornish's run. Later in the fourth quarter, sophomore Scott Webb connected on two field goals, including a career-long 47-yard conversion, to increase KU's lead to 34-14.

Despite a spirited second-half comeback, the University of Kansas football team dropped its Big 12 Conference opener, falling 30-17 to Texas Tech in Lubbock, Texas. In the second half, the Jayhawks (3-1) nearly clawed back into the game behind their defense and rushing attack, but ultimately fell short to the Red Raiders (4-0). In the first half, the Jayhawks found themselves down early. The Red Raiders marched down the field on a 12-play, 80-yard drive to start the game. A four-yard touchdown pass from Cody Hodges to Jared Hicks with 11:12 remaining in the first quarter capped off the drive. The Red Raiders also recovered a Brian Luke fumble for a touchdown in the second quarter and later added two field goals to take a 20-0 lead at halftime. On offense, the Jayhawks got a boost from the ground game. Junior Jon Cornish ran for 111 yards on 17 carries and scored the first Jayhawk touchdown on an 11-yard run early in the third quarter. Senior Clark Green added 42 yards on eight carries. The Jayhawks were only down 10 points late in the second half but were unable to complete the comeback. Kansas used three different quarterbacks during the contest. Senior Brian Luke finished 13-of-27 for 109 yards and a touchdown. He connected with senior Mark Simmons on an 17-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter. Simmons finished with five catches for 44 yards. Junior Adam Barmann, who finished 8-of-10 for 45 yards, spelled Luke for a series in the second quarter and came on in relief in the fourth quarter. Freshman Marcus Herford also saw time at quarterback in the third quarter. The Jayhawk defense proved to be a formidable opponent for the Red Raider offense. Texas Tech was limited to a season-low 380 total yards, including only 47 yards rushing on 26 carries. Senior Charlton Keith recorded two sacks and had a fumble recovery. Senior Rodney Fowler snagged his third interception of the season. The Jayhawks forced three Red Raider turnovers.

**MANHATTAN, Kan.** - Despite a solid performance by the Kansas defense, the Jayhawks fell to Kansas State, 12-3, in front of a crowd of 49,798 at KSU Stadium. With the loss, KU moved to 3-2 overall and 0-2 in Big 12 Conference play, while K-State improved to 4-1 and 1-1 in league action. Scott Webb's 28-yard field goal with 3:48 remaining in the second quarter gave KU a 3-0 halftime lead over the Wildcats. Brian Luke took over for starter Adam Barmann at quarterback with 9:06 left in the half. Mark Simmons' 50-yard grab from Luke late in the second stanza moved the Jayhawks to the KSU 18-yard line, setting up Webb's 28-yarder. For the second time this season, a stifling KU defense held its opponent scoreless in the opening half and limited the Wildcats to 65 total yards of offense (six rushing, 59 passing). On the Jayhawks' opening drive in the second half, KSU picked up a Jon Cornish fumble to take over the ball on KU's 14-yard line. The KU defense pushed the Wildcats back 14 yards, but Jeff Snodgrass' 38-yard field goal attempt was good to tie the game with 10:54 left in the third quarter. KSU quarterback Allan Evridge's 28-yard completion late in the third quarter placed the Wildcats in the red zone to open the fourth. Jordy Nelson caught an eight-yard toss from Evridge five seconds into the final quarter to give KSU its first lead of the day, 10-3. The Wildcats sealed the victory when Tearius George sacked Luke in the KU endzone for a safety with 3:39 remaining. Cornish led the KU rushers with 66 yards while Simmons finished with 64 receiving yards. Luke, one of three quarterbacks to take snaps, paced the offense with 86 passing yards. The KU defense held K-State to a season-low 182 yards of total offense, including just 35 rushing yards. The Wildcats' 12 points were the fewest against KU since 1993 when K-State defeated the Jayhawks 10-9 in Manhattan.

Game 6 - Oct. 15, 2005  
**Oklahoma 19, vs. Kansas 3**

**KANSAS CITY, Mo. --** In a game that featured a pair of stellar defensive units, the University of Kansas (3-3, 0-3 Big 12) football team fell to Oklahoma (3-3, 2-1 Big 12), 19-3, at Arrowhead Stadium. Oklahoma parlayed two Kansas turnovers into an early 10-0 lead. Following an OU punt, the Jayhawks marched down the field behind a balanced attack. After long runs by sophomore fullback Brandon McAnderson and junior running back Jon Cornish, senior wide receiver Mark Simmons made a leaping catch on a pivotal third down to keep the drive alive. The 20-yard reception helped set up a 32-yard field goal by sophomore kicker Scott Webb to make it 10-3 with 1:06 remaining in the first quarter. Much like the first, the second half opened with a string of strong defensive plays. Gordon intercepted a pass by OU quarterback Rhett Bomar and returned it to the Sooners' 25 yard-line. On the ensuing play, an interception by OU safety Rufus Alexander gave the ball back to the Sooners on their two-yard line. However, OU's drive was thwarted by another Gordon interception, this one giving KU the ball back at its 28-yard line with 8:05 remaining in the third quarter. OU finally broke the scoring drought when Bomar found Malcolm Kelly for a 25-yard touchdown with 10:17 remaining in the fourth quarter. Hartley missed the extra point attempt (wide right) and the Sooners took a 16-3 lead. The Sooners later added a 40-yard field goal by Hartley to increase their lead to 19-3 with 4:01 remaining in the game. Senior linebackers Nick Reid and Kevin Kane each recorded two sacks in the game, and Reid also registered a team-high 15 tackles. Reid also became KU's all-time leader with 42 career tackles for loss, breaking Willie Pless' record of 41. The game marked the first time Kansas played at Arrowhead Stadium.
