Colorado Opens NCAA Tournament Against Colorado State

NCAA TOURNAMENT: Colorado (15-12) will face in-state rival Colorado State (20-8) on Friday, Dec. 2 at 7 p.m. at Moby Arena on the campus of Colorado State University. The winner of the match will play the winner of the No. 3 Washington/Siena match which will be played at 5 p.m. prior to CU's match. The second round match will be played at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, Dec. 3.

Washington is the No. 3 overall seed in the tournament trailing only No. 1 Nebraska and No. 2 Penn State.

The Buffs were one of seven teams from the Big 12 Conference to advance to the tournament; the most out of any conference in 2005. CU finished in fifth-place in the league standings at 10-10. The Big 12 has had 63 NCAA Championship bids in its 10 years of existence, including a league record eight bids in 2001.

The Buffaloes will be making their 15th overall NCAA Tournament appearance and the 14th in the past 15 seasons. It is the third straight year CU has been invited to the tournament.

ON THE SEASON: Colorado is 15-12 overall and finished fifth in the Big 12 Conference with a 10-10 record. The Buffaloes have clinched a .500 or better record for the 18th consecutive season.

Senior right side hitter **Allie Griffin** is averaging 4.64 kills per game while hitting .289 on the year. She ranks second in the Big 12 in kills and is 14th in hitting percentage. Griffin has hit more than 20 kills in nine matches this season; including a career-high 29 against Kansas State on Oct. 12. She notched her 1,000th-career kill with her first kill in the fifth game against Kansas on Oct. 1. Sophomore **Amber Sutherland** is averaging 3.88 per game. Sutherland ranks sixth in the league in kills.

Colorado's 15.82 kills per game is fourth in the Big 12.

Junior middle blocker **Lara Bossow** has four block solos and 79 block assists while averaging 0.78 blocks per game. Freshman middle blocker **Lauren Schaefer** has 87 total blocks (11 solo and 76 assists) on the season. She is averaging 0.88 blocks per game. The Buffs are averaging 2.25 blocks per game and are 11th in the Big 12.

Junior setter **Ashley Nu'u** has passed out 1,402 assists this season to average 13.23 per game. She currently ranks third in the Big 12 and leads Colorado to a .260

attack percentage that ranks fourth in the league. Bossow is hitting a team-best .368.

The Buffaloes' defense is lead by Sutherland. She has picked up 284 digs this season and averages 2.70 per game. She is 15th in the league. Senior **Nicole Carr** has picked up 271 digs this season and has played five games as the team's libero. Carr notched her 1,000th-career dig on Oct. 1 versus Kansas. Sophomore libero **Therese Vinal** has collected 218 digs. The Buffs are 10th in the Big 12 with 13.35 digs per game.

CU has defeated three ranked teams this season; with two of those wins coming

on the road. CU took two consecutive matches against ranked opponents for the first time since 1996 when the Buffs stunned Kansas State and Texas A&M on Oct. 12 and 16.

The first of the two consecutive wins against ranked teams came against No. 20 Kansas State. It was the first win over a ranked opponent this season for Colorado as the Buffs beat the Wildcats 30-14, 30-25, 25-30, 28-30, 15-5. CU followed it up with a win at 24th-ranked Texas A&M. The Buffs rallied back from a 0-2 deficit and won 20-30, 25-30, 30-26, 30-28, 15-10.

Colorado's most recent victory against a ranked team came on Oct. 29 as the Buffs shocked eighth-ranked Missouri 20-30, 30-28, 23-30, 30-27, 15-12 in Columbia, Mo. CU played in front of 2,571, the fourth largest crowd in MU history.

Seven of Colorado's losses have come to CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 ranked opponents. Five of those losses have come to a team ranked in the top-10 at the time.

ABOUT THE RAMS: Colorado State is 20-8 overall and finished third in the Mountain West Conference with a 12-4 record. Tess Rogers leads the Rams with 3.62 kills per game. Casey Bauer and Dre Downs are also averaging over three kills per game with 3.43 and 3.18 respectively. Downs adds 1.53 blocks per game and Mekana Barnes records 1.24. Katherine Whitney leads CSU with 4.18 kills per game. The Rams are hitting .234 and have held their opponents to a .156 hitting percentage.

ABOUT THE HUSKIES: Washington is currently ranked third in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll. The Huskies sports a 26-1 overall record and won the Pac-10 Conference with a 17-1 record. UW's only loss of the season came against conference foe UCLA. Courtney Thompson leads the country with 14.96 assists per game. She is directing the Huskies to a .347 attack percentage. Sanja Tomasevic, a 2003 AVCA All-American, is averaging 4.52 kills per game while hitting at a .373 clip. Christal Morrison, a 2004 All-American, ranks second on the team with 4.04 kills per game. The Huskies are averaging 15.96 digs and 3.07 blocks per game.

ABOUT THE SAINTS: Siena owns a 20-11 overall record and was 7-2 in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. The Saints are on a nine-match win streak. Nadiege Honore has tallied 3.98 kills and 2.64 digs to lead Siena. Teammate Christie Gustafson has added 3.49 kills per game. April London has recorded 10.47 assists

per game and leads the Saints to a .224 attack percentage. Kathi Kobayashi has picked up 3.48 digs per game.

SERIES RECORDS: Colorado State owns an 18-11 advantage over the Buffaloes. CSU has won eight of the last 10 meetings, with two of those wins in the NCAA Tournament second round. The last time CU defeated the Rams was on Sept. 10, 2002 in four (17-30, 30-23, 30-27, 30-26). The Buffs have never beaten CSU in the NCAA Tournament.

Colorado has only faced Washington twice and is 1-1 in the series. The last time the Buffs faced the Huskies in 1994, CU won 15-13, 7-15, 15-10, 16-14.

Siena and CU have never met.

CU NCAA TOURNEY NOTES VERSUS THE RAMS: Colorado has never defeated Colorado State in the NCAA Tournament. CSU has knocked the Buffs out of the Tournament twice.

CU has never played CSU in the first round of the tournament.

Colorado has traveled to Fort Collins, Colo. for four NCAA Tournaments and its second straight trip.

The last time the Buffs defeated the Rams was on Sept. 10, 2002, when the current seniors were freshman. The only current senior to play in that CU victory was Nicole Carr.

BEEN THERE, DONE THAT: Colorado has a history of playing the NCAA Tournament at Fort Collins, Colo. This is the fourth time the Buffs have traveled to Colorado State for the first and second rounds of the tournament. CU won its first match the first two years and advanced to the second round to play the Rams only to lose in five both times.

ELITE COMPANY: Only 14 NCAA Division I teams can claim they have been to at least 14 (out of a possible 15) NCAA Tournaments since the 1991 season. Colorado is one of those teams and joins an impressive list of college volleyball powerhouses:

WHAT DO WE HAVE IN COMMON?: Colorado has one opponent in common with each of the teams participating in the first and second rounds at Fort Collins this weekend.

CU and Colorado State each played Texas Tech. The Buffs split the season series with the Big 12 rival, falling in five early on, but swept the Red Raiders later in the season. The Rams defeated TTU in four games.

Washington and Colorado both played Stanford this season. The Buffs fell 26-30, 28-30, 24-30 at the Colorado Invitational, while the Huskies defeated Stanford 3-1 and 3-0 in conference play.

Siena and CU have St. Peter's in common. The Buffs started the season with a 30-11, 30-20, 30-23 victory over St. Peter's. The Saints also beat St. Peter's 3-1.

HEAD COACH PI'I AIU: Pi'i Aiu (pronounced P-E I-U) is in his ninth season as Colorado's head coach sporting a career record of 163-103. The 1997 Big 12 and District V Coach of the Year, Aiu has led the Buffs to seven NCAA Tournaments in eight seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1997. Under his guidance, the Buffs have sported three All-Americans, nine All-Region, and 20 All-Big 12 performers. Aiu has been involved in the Colorado volleyball program in some capacity since its inception in 1986.

Aiu, who has led the Buffs to a 108-72 record in Big 12 matches, is joined on the bench this season by sixth-year assistant Jil Thomason and second-year assistant, and USA Olympian, Erik Sullivan.

Aiu is 2-8 against Colorado State. He has never faced Washington or Siena.

BUFFS AT HOME: Colorado will call the Coors Events/Conference Center home for the 18th straight season. The Buffs are 185-63 all-time at the CECC for a winning percentage of .746.

SECOND TIME IS A CHARM: The Buffs are got redemption from some of its earlier losses this season. CU lost to Texas, Nebraska, Missouri, Iowa State, Kansas and Texas Tech in the first half of the Big 12 schedule. The second time around, the Buffs defeated Iowa State, Missouri, Kansas and Texas Tech. The Buffs were unable to defeat Texas and Nebraska the second time around.

WHAT A SCHEDULE!: Colorado faces some of the toughest competition in the country in the 2005 season. Four of its Big 12 opponents are currently ranked in the CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll. Nebraska is the number one team in the land, followed by Texas (7-tie), Missouri (10) and Kansas State (24). The Buffs fell to then-third-ranked Stanford on Sept. 8 at the Colorado Invitational. CU faced fourth-ranked Florida in a non-conference match-up on Nov. 25. Colorado, Kansas and Texas A&M have also been ranked this season.

MORE THAN LAST YEAR: The Buffs have recorded more Big 12 wins this year than last with 10. Last season CU went 9-11 in conference play and this year owns a 10-9 record. Colorado has also tallied 15 wins this season, one more than last season.

ONE HUGE WEEK: Colorado recorded two consecutive wins against CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 ranked opponents for the first time since 1996. CU upset then-20th-ranked Kansas State at home in five games. Then the Buffs took to the road and upset then-24th-ranked Texas A&M in front of 1,605. CU rallied from a 0-2 deficit to defeat the Aggies.

GIVE ME FIVE: Five seems to be the Colorado Buffaloes favorite number this season. Colorado has played 11 five-game matches out of 24 matches this season. The Buffs also played five consecutive five-game contests between Oct. 1-16. Both are school records. CU is 6-5 in those matches. Colorado has rallied back from 0-2 deficits against Marquette and Texas A&M.

ONE GRAND FOR ME, ONE GRAND FOR YOU: Seniors Nicole Carr and Allie Griffin recorded career milestones on Oct. 1, as the Buffs battled against Kansas. Carr picked up her 1,000th-career dig with her 14th dig in the match. Griffin hammered her 1,000th-career kill with her 25th kill of the match. Both became the 12th player in CU history to record each milestone.

CHASING HISTORY: Several current Buffs are in the CU record books, but they are looking to move up this season. Seniors Allie Griffin and Nicole Carr are moving up in the career kills list. Griffin owns 1,270 kills for sixth on the list and Carr is 13th with 986. Carr is also ninth on the digs list with 1,147. Ashley Nu'u is fifth on the all-time career assists chart with 2,917.

FINISHING IT OFF: Colorado finished its match against No. 20 Kansas State with a 15-5 victory in the fifth game. The 10-point gap was the largest fifth-game difference recorded among Big 12 Conference teams this season to that point.

ENDURANCE TEST: The CU volleyball team is showing off its off-season conditioning as the Buffs get deeper into the season. The Buffs played a school-record five straight five-game matches against Kansas, Baylor, Texas Tech, Kansas State and Texas A&M. CU won three of the matches, including two consecutive contests against KSU and TAMU. Both were ranked in the top-25 at the time of CU's victories.

BUFF BITS: Seven of CU's losses have been to CSTV/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll ranked teams...Colorado won the American University Classic and took second at Colorado Invitational...Also took second at the DU Thanksgiving Classic...Nicole Carr was named the American University Classic Most Valuable Player. Amber Sutherland and Allie Griffin were also named to the all-tournament team...Sutherland and Griffin were also named the Colorado Invitational All-Tournament Team...Sutherland and Nu'u were named to the Du Thanksgiving Classic All-Tournament Team...The Buffs snapped a three-match losing streak on

Sept. 24 against Oklahoma in five games. The win was the first in the Big 12 for the Buffs this season...Alex Butth served five aces against Oklahoma, which is the most any Buff has served in a single match since the 2000 season. Lara Bossow tallied five in a five-game win over Missouri...The loss to Iowa State snapped an 18-match win-streak against the Cyclones for the Buffs...Seniors Nicole Carr and Allie Griffin each notched career milestones on Oct. 1 against Kansas. Week on Oct. 31...The Buffs' win against eighth-ranked Missouri was its first against at top-10 team since 1997 when CU defeated No. 5 Nebraska... 20TH ANNIVERSARY: The 2005 season marks the 20th campaign for the Colorado volleyball program. Since debuting as a varsity program in the fall of 1986, the Buffs have an overall record of 374-234 (.615) including one conference title (Big Eight in 1993). CU has advanced to 15 NCAA Tournaments in 17 years, 14 of which have come since 1991. The Buffs are one of only 14 NCAA Division I programs with at least 14 NCAA appearances since 1991.

GRIFFIN, NU'U SELECTED TO ALL-BIG 12 TEAMS

Colorado senior **Allie Griffin** was named to the All-Big 12 First Team, announced today by league officials. This is her second All-Big 12 First Team honor as she was selected last season to the squad. Teammate junior setter **Ashley Nu'u** was named to the honorable mention team.

Griffin, a 6-0 right side hitter, leads the Buffs with 4.64 kills per game. She adds 2.06 digs, 0.75 blocks and 0.59 assists per game while hitting .289. The Baton Rouge, La., native was named the Collegiate Volleyball Update (CVU.com) National Player of the Week on Oct. 18. Griffin ranks sixth on CU's career kills list (1,270), is 10th in career attacks (2,834) and ranks eighth in career blocks (266). She is currently third on the single season kills chart with 473 kills. Griffin became the 12th Buff to record 1,000 career kills and just the seventh Buff to record 1,000 career kills and 200 career blocks. She currently ranks 23rd in the NCAA in kills per game.

Griffin's honor keeps Colorado's streak alive of at least one first team pick on every All-Big 12 volleyball team since the conference began in 1996. The Buffs also had at least one first team pick on the last eight All-Big 8 teams from 1988-95.

Nu'u, a 5-10 setter from Aurora, Colo., ranks third in the Big 12 in assists. She is fifth on Colorado's all-time assist chart with 2,917 and has 1,402 assists on the season, which is seventh on Colorado's single-season chart. Nu'u is hitting .306; the second highest percentage on the team, and is averaging 1.78 digs and 0.61 blocks per game. She was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 7. This is the second consecutive season Nu'u has been named an honorable mention selection.

CAMPBELL NAMED TO ALL-BIG 12 10TH ANNIVERSARY TEAM

Former Colorado setter Kelly Campbell has been named to the Big 12 Volleyball 10th Anniversary Team, the league announced today. The team was selected by a combined media panel and an on-line fan poll. To be eligible for the team, a candidate had to be an All-Big 12 First Team selection.

Campbell, a native of Corona Del Mar, Calif., was a member of the All-Big 12 First Team all four years (1996-99) she played at Colorado. She was also a four-time member of the Academic All-Big 12 Team. Campbell is the Buffaloes' career assists leader with 6,228 and owns four of the top six positions for single-season assists.

Campbell was an All-American on and off the court. She was a Volleyball Magazine selection three years (1996, 1998, 99) and was a CoSIDA Academic All-American in 1999. She was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on four occasions and was named the Sports Imports/AVCA National Player of the Week on Nov. 8, 1999.

Four Buffs Named Academic All-Big 12

The University of Colorado had four student-athletes named to the Academic All-Big 12 Volleyball First Team for the 2005 season as announced by the Big 12 league office.

Redshirt freshman Alex Buth, sophomore Therese Vinal, and seniors Nicole Carr and Lynsey Mann all have maintained a GPA of over 3.2.

Buth, a 5-10 right side, business administration major from East Grand Rapids, Mich. was named to the team for the first time after sitting out last season using her redshirt. This year she has seen action in 61 of the teams 87 games usually to use her dangerous jump-serve which has earned her a team-high 24 aces.

Vinal, a 5-8 defensive specialist and broadcast news major from Santa Clara, Calif., is being honored for the first time. Vinal has recorded 181 digs this season and recorded 17 service aces as the team's libero in most of the 74 games she has appeared in.

Carr, a 6-0 outside hitter, accounting major from Wauwatosa, Wis. has earned her third Academic All-Big 12 first team honor. Carr is CU's active career leader in digs with 1,112 and is one kill away from her 200th of the season. Carr is one of three spikers to play in every game this season.

Mann, a 6-3 middle blocker, psychology major from Highland Ranch, Colo., is the third member earning this honor for the first time. After transferring from Western State, Mann was forced to miss half of the 2004 season with an injury but has returned this year to currently be ranked fourth on the team with a .245 hitting percentage.
