NCAA Central Regional Notes



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ON THE RANGE...

The **108th Annual NCAA Golf Championships** begin this week with 81 schools competing in three regionals around the country, with the **University of Colorado** one of 27 schools competing in the 18th Annual NCAA Central Region Golf Championships in Chardon, Ohio (about 25 miles east of Cleveland; Cleveland State University is the host school)... It's the sixth trip in the last eight seasons to the NCAA's as a team for Colorado; the Buffs have now been invited in 13 of the 18 years of the regional format... The top 10 teams out of 27 competing in the Central Regional will advance to the NCAA Finals, set for May 31-June 3 in Sunriver, Ore. (the University of Portland will host)... Ten out of 27 teams will also advance to the finals out the East and West regionals, taking place at the same time; the top two individuals from teams that do not qualify also will be invited... CU is the No. 4 seed in this meet out of the NCAA's District 5 (or Central District) but is the No. 19 seed overall... This will go into CU's books under the accomplishments of late head coach **Mark Simpson**, who passed away last December 5 from complications due to lung cancer; he took over in January, 1977, and thus 16 of his 30 teams qualified for the NCAA Championships (advancing to the finals seven times during his era)... CU tees off at 7:00 a.m. (EDT) on Thursday off No. 10 and at 12:12 p.m. Friday on No. 1, as the Buffs will be paired with familiar Big 12 rivals Missouri (No. 20 seed) and Nebraska (No. 21).

THE SITE

This is the first time that **Sand Ridge Golf Club** (Chardon, Ohio) will be hosting the NCAA Central Regional, as the Tom Fazio-designed layout opened in 1998. The course will play to 7,173 yards and par-71 for the regional. It's the third straight year the Central Regional will be in that part of the nation, as the previous two were in Indiana (West Lafayette in 2004, South Bend in 2005). Cleveland State University is the host and additional information can be found at www.csuivikings.com; the website for the golf course is www.sandridgegolf.com.

THE EVENT

This is the 18th year that the NCAA is holding regionals (east, central, west) in order to stock the 30-team field at the NCAA Championship Finals. There are 27 teams at each site, with the top 10 to advance out of each. Out of the regional format, the Buffaloes have advanced to the NCAA Finals on four occasions, all four times with some style. In **1989**, the inaugural year for regional activity, CU finished third at Stonebridge Country Club outside of Dallas. Oklahoma and Oklahoma State tied for team honors with an 880 score, followed by the Buffs at 902. In **1994**, the Buffs placed second with an 853 score, just two strokes back of regional champion Texas, at Oklahoma City Golf & Country Club. In **1999**, at Ohio State University's Scarlet Course, the Buffs rallied from 18th place and eight shots back after 36 holes to force a playoff with Kent State, winning the battle on the first extra hole and thus advancing to the national finals. It remains the second largest comeback in regional history. In **2002** in Little Rock, Colorado was 11th after day one and in 13th after day two, but rallied to post the seventh best score in a final round hampered by tough winds, finishing in the 10th and final spot with an 886 team score. The Buffs edged two teams by one stroke—Big 12 rivals Kansas and Oklahoma.

THE REGIONAL FIELD

The field is comprised of 141 golfers, 27 five-man teams, plus six individuals. There are more top 10 (four) and top 50 (18) teams competing in the Central Regional than in any other regional (listed by overall regional seed by district, with CU's record against team in parenthesis—the Buffs are 6-27-1 against teams competing):

THE COLORADO ROSTER

The quintet representing Colorado in the NCAA's have earned 13 letters between them, the same total the five players had the last time out in 2004, though two players have NCAA experience to just one two years ago. The 2002 team had a combined 17 letters with 12 previous NCAA regional or finals tournaments among them, as that team was the last to advance to the NCAA Finals. The 2006 Buffalo five:

The seniors are the only ones with NCAA Championship experience, as **Edward McGlasson** is competing in his third NCAA Championship and **Kenny Coakley** in his second. McGlasson and Coakley were teammates on the 2004 Buffaloes, which tied for 18th in the Central Regional, and McGlasson was selected as one of six individuals to play in last year's event. McGlasson joins a list of several Buffaloes who will play in three NCAA Championships, as only four players have qualified to play in four: **Rick Cramer** (1979-82), **Bob Kalinowski** (1991-94), **Matt Zions** (1999-2002) and **Kane Webber** (2000-04).

THE COLORADO COACHING SITUATION

Mark Simpson, long-time golf coach and one of the most visible and respected people associated with the University of Colorado for the last third of a century, lost his yearlong battle against lung cancer last December 5.

Simpson, 55, was honored at memorial service that drew 1,300 at the Coors Events Center, with over two-thirds of his former golfers in attendance. A proud Colorado native (Durango) and CU graduate, coached the Buffaloes for 29 years and earned a massive list of honors, topped by his induction into the Golf Coaches Association of America Hall of Fame in 2005. There was also a moment of silence for Simpson prior to the start of this year's Big 12 Championships, the first conference meet without his presence since the early 1970s.

Simpson replaced his own coach, the legendary **Les Fowler**, in January 1977. Fowler, also a CU alum, also coached the Buffs for 29 years.

Simpson first set foot on the Boulder campus in the late 1960s, and lettered three years as a Colorado golfer, playing for Fowler from 1969-72 and often playing as the team's No. 1 man. He went to work for the athletic department as both the assistant golf coach and facilities manager shortly thereafter.

One of the things he was most proud of was that in his reign as coach at Colorado, 119 of the 129 players he brought into the program (92.2 percent) graduated with a degree from CU. He coached seven All-Americans and numerous all-conference performers.

In 2004, the Colorado Golf Hall of Fame recognized Simpson for his contributions to the sport and honored him with its distinguished Lifetime Achievement Award.

Simpson was inducted into the Golf Coaches Association Hall of Fame in January 2005, just two months after he was first diagnosed with lung cancer. He had initially defeated the disease, going into remission after chemotherapy and radiation a year ago this past April, but it returned in September and he was unable to travel with the team as he engaged in a second battle until his early December death.

Simpson stood for integrity, and there was no greater example than in 1996, when one of his players, Knut Ekjord, was selected to participate in the NCAA Central Regional as an individual. However, Simpson noticed a player from Missouri had a 3-1 record in head-to-head competition with his player; he thus called the NCAA and withdrew his player in favor of MU's. "Any coach with integrity had to do it, but it was not an easy thing to do," Simpson said at the time.

Brad Neher, who had been serving as interim golf coach at the University of Colorado since Simpson's death, stepped down from the position April 21 due to personal reasons and what he termed, "for the good of program." Neher, 34, a CU graduate and golf letterman, was Simpson's assistant for six years before being promoted to interim coach this past January. Neher cited a number of reasons, some of which were fueled by wild speculation around the program since he and seven players were suspended for one tournament earlier this month after violating team and athletic department policies.

An administrative "team" has been seeing the program through the remainder of the season, as the search for Simpson's replacement is now in full gear with the posting of the position this week; CU athletic director **Mike Bohn** hopes to have a new head coach of the program in place by July 3. Associate athletic director **David Plati** and assistant athletic directors **Julie Manning** and **Charles Johnson** are handling the administrative aspects of the program, coordinating team travel, academics, schedules, practice and other details. Plati has handled the golf team's media relations since 1979 and knows the team well; Manning, in charge of CU's compliance department, is the former head women's golf coach at Iowa State; and Johnson, the former Buff quarterback and most valuable player in the 1991 Orange Bowl win over Notre Dame that enabled CU to win the national championship, has added a competitive spirit to the mix the remainder of the year.

Both Plati and Johnson have accompanied senior **Edward McGlasson** to tournaments in the past, Plati last spring at the NCAA Central Regional while Simpson was ill and Johnson earlier this month during the suspension of the others. Both were in attendance at the Big 12 Championships, as CU was the host school, while Johnson accompanied the team to The Maxwell Intercollegiate last weekend and Plati is staffing the regional with the squad.

THE SCHEDULE

The NCAA Central Regional figures to be one of the toughest tournaments that Colorado will play in to date in 2005-06; the Buffs have played in 11 tournaments so far, including nine ranked in the top 50 as of the May 8 *Golfweek* ratings (the organization ranks all tournaments played during the course of the season and updates the list as meets are completed). The Texas A&M Aggie Invitational currently ranks No. 12 on the list of 263 competitions through April 17, with the Big 12 Championships at No. 21, the Hawai'i-Hilo Intercollegiate in at No. 28 and the New Mexico Tucker Invitational at No. 37. CU's schedule strength works to No. 43 on the average; using this formula, CU played the fifth toughest schedule in the Big 12.

SEASON CAPSULE

The 2005-06 **University of Colorado** men's golf team has endured more than its fair share of trials and tribulations, but the Buffaloes are focused on trying to meet their standard annual goal, to reach the NCAA Championship Finals, which will be in Sun River, Ore., later this month.

More importantly, it's been an emotional year, a solemn one at that, as the team's coach since January 1977, **Mark Simpson**, passed away after a yearlong battle with lung cancer last December 5. Easily one of the most popular figures in the athletic department if not the entire university, his absence has been felt since his death, as there is simply a void around the program and the entire athletic department.

The team has kept Simpson in their thoughts, as they created a head cover with the phrase "Simps 05" as well as a bag tag with his picture. Senior **Edward McGlasson**, who was very close to Simpson, dedicated his first collegiate win to him when he won the Tunica National Intercollegiate last November. He also credited playing for Mark as one of the reasons he finished fourth in the Big 12 Conference Championships in April.

While the team hasn't performed overall to its liking just yet, they have emphasized there is still time to honor Simpson with an outstanding finish; to date, CU won its own Stevinson Ranch Invitational, but it was shortened due to the weather, so the Buffs still crave that 54-hole victory. However, the team has not been without noted accomplishments.

McGlasson was named CU's Male Athlete of the Year for all sports at the school's annual CUSPY Awards on May 2, and **Derek Tolan** was named the school's Male Freshman of the Year. McGlasson leads the team in stroke average (72.34) and in every major statistical category, and set a school record with six straight top 10 finishes. Tolan, with five top 10 finishes, or two more than any freshman ever before him, currently owns the sixth best stroke average by a frosh (74.66) but has likely played tougher courses than any of the six ahead of him.

The team has received steady play from its other senior, **Kenny Coakley**, and has also seen the emergence of junior **Ryan Anderson**. Sophomore brothers **Jim** and **Patrick Grady** and freshmen **Diego Munoz** and **Justin Bardgett** round out the eight players who have competed this season, as CU's other senior, **Derek O'Neill**, is redshirting and will return in 2006-07.

THE RECORD WATCH

Edward McGlasson is assaulting the record book in several categories, and freshman **Derek Tolan** is making a mark as well. A closer look:

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A STROKE MAKES

History has shown time and time again that a single stroke can mean the difference between advancing to the NCAA Finals and having a season end early. The last five regionals have all come down to one or fewer strokes separating the 10 teams that qualified and the 11th that was left on the outside looking in. Overall, on five occasions, there was a tie for the last qualifying spot, with one stroke the difference seven times and two strokes three times. Only three years has the margin between qualifying and going home been more than two shots, in 1992 (seven), in 1998 (three) and in 2000 (four). A closer look:
