SETTING THE STAGE

The first win of Bobby Bowden's FSU career came against a Big 12 team. After starting his Florida State coaching tenure 0-3, Bowden got his first victory versus Kansas State 20-10 on October 2,

- ▶ Bowden has a winning record versus every team in the Big 12 except for Oklahoma who the Hall of Fame Coach has never beaten (0-4).
- The Seminoles and Bowden have fared well versus Big 12 members. FSU is 29-13 all-time versus the conference and Bowden is 20-6.
- ▶ Only two schools in the Big 12 have ever defeated a Bobby Bowden coached Seminole team. One is Oklahoma and the other is Nebraska. Bowden is undefeated versus Colorado (1-0), Iowa State (1-0), Kansas (3-0), Oklahoma State (3-0), Texas A&M (2-0) and Texas Tech (2-0).
- ▶ This will be the Seminoles' second appearance on ESPN this season. Overall Florida State has played on ESPN 53 times and posted a 41-12 record in those games.
- From 1996 to 2002, FSU won 16 straight games broadcast by ESPN. The streak began Sept. 19, 1996 with a 51-17 win over NC State and was broken in Louisville September 26, 2002 in an OT loss.

- ▶ Quarterback Drew Weatherford is coming off the seventh 300-yard game of his career, which moves him into the top 5 in that category. After the UAB game, Weatherford moved into the top 10 at FSU for career TD's, fourth in career completions and sixth in career yards besting Charlie Ward. ▶ Weatherford will attempt to throw for 300 yards in back-to-back games for just the second time

in his career versus Colorado. The only time the junior has put up 300+ yards in consecutive games was in 2005 versus Wake Forest (351) and Virginia (377).

- Florida State does not have a single player on its roster from the state of Colorado. Only six players on the Seminole roster grew up west of the Mississippi river.
- ▶ Since joining the ACC, Florida State is 22-16 in non-conference games away from home. In true away games, Florida State is just 7-10 with the majority of those losses coming to Florida and Miami.

BOWDEN IN AMERICA

Saturday's game against Colorado will be the first time Bobby Bowden has coached in the state of Colorado. During his Florida State tenure, Bowden has coached in half of the states in the Union and when you add in his years at West Virginia the total improves to 27 states with Colorado becoming the 28th. There are 41 states in the US that have Division I programs and here are the states where Bowden has not coached. Arkansas Connecticut Hawaii Idaho coached: Arkansas, Connecticut, Hawaii, Idaho, Iowa, Minnesota, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wisconsin and Wyoming.

THOUGHT YOU KNEW IT ALL?

Charlie Barnes, Executive Director of Seminole Boosters, wrote a fascinating article about Seminole head coach Bobby Bowden last year. He called it "Nine Things You Don't Know About Bobby Bowden". For a man that has been the subject of numerous books, thousands of articles and an uncoming major motion picture. Barnes and an upcoming major motion picture, Barnes was able to unearth some hidden gems about Bowden's life. Here are the top seven:

He Plays Piano: Bowden took lessons as a child but "hated it". He did not like the lessons but he did like the piano.

He learned to play by ear. He Made A Record in 1984: Bowden and then-University President Bernie Sliger recorded the song "The Seminoles of The song was written by Marvin Goldstein, who received his advanced degrees in music from FSU. The song was released on a 45 and is still available today on CD.

He Ate Lunch With The Mayor Of

Stuttgart: Anyone who knows Bowden knows he is a an avid history buff. On one of his trips to Germany he enjoyed a private lunch with the mayor of Stuttgart, Manfred Rommel. Rommel is the son of Field Marshall Erwin Rommel.

the "Desert Fox". Bowden always had a special admiration for the elder Rommel's renowned tactical brilliance. His Favorite Song: "Three Coins In A 4)

Fountain' Two-Time Fraternity President: Bowden was a born leader from way back. In college he was not only a two-time president of his fraternity at Howard College (now Samford) but he was already a married man and father while playing football, baseball and running track for the Howard College Bulldoos

track for the Howard College Bulldogs. He Will Leave Tallahassee: Upon retirement, Bowden will leave Tallahassee but not the state of Florida. The main reason is he does not want to cast a shadow over the man who succeeds him as the next Seminole

football coach. Favorite Quote: "One equal temper of heroic hearts, made weak by time and fate, but strong in will to strive, to seek, to find, and not to yield." These lines from Tennyson attributed to Ulysses and appeared in Bowden's yearbook at Woodlawn High School. The same quote appeared in that yearbook by a young sophomore named Ann Estock. Within a year she would become Ann Bowden.

THE FAMILY TREE

Bobby Bowden gets a lot of credit and all of it is deserved but there is one area where the legendary coach probably doesn't receive his due and that is when it comes to producing other great coaches. His sons Jeff, Terry and Tommy have all served on his staffs at FSU. Tommy and Terry each led a major college team to an undefeated season. George Henshaw is another undefeated season. George Henshaw is another Bowden assistant that became a head coach leading the Tulsa program beginning in 1987. Skip Holtz is the current head coach at East Carolina after sponding a course of seasons in Tallahasson after spending a couple of seasons in Tallahassee in the late 80's. Long-time assistant Gene McDowell led the UCF football program for 13 years and Mark Richt is in the midst of a successful tenure as the head coach at Georgia. Brad Scott moved from Bowden's staff to take over another SEC program as he led South Carolina for five seasons. Many of Bowden's former assistants are coaching at major college football programs as assistant coaches. John Eason is the Associate Head Coach at Georgia, Joe Kines served as the defensive coordinator and interim head coach at Alabama while Kevin Steele and Kirby Smart are both on Nick Saban's current Crimson Tide staff.

31 AND COUNTING

For the third-straight year and seventh time in the last decade, Bobby Bowden's Seminoles saw one of their own selected in the first round of the NFL Draft. This year it was linebacker Lawrence Timmons. Last season four Seminoles were taken in the first round. During Bowden's 31-year tenure 31 Seminoles have been selected in the first round of the draft. FSU only had three first round draft picks in school history before Bowden came on board. Four times since then Bowden has seen at least three of his players taken in the first round.

6 MORE

The storied career of FSU head coach Bobby Bowden should add another chapter and maybe as early as this season. Bowden enters the Colorado game with 294 wins at Florida State. With six more victories he will join Joe Paterno as the only Division I-A coaches to ever win 300 games at one school. Bowden will become just the sixth coach in NCAA history to join that list as well. Bowden has won at least seven games for 25-straight seasons and only twice in his 31 years at FSU has he failed to record at least seven victories.

BOWDEN AND ANDREWS TOGETHER THROUGH THICK AND THIN Florida State Head Coach Bobby Bowden and

Seminole Associate Head Coach Mickey Andrews have been together in Tallahassee since 1984 when Andrew's became Bowden's defensive coordinator. Andrews has been on Bowden's staff longer than any other head coach in the ACC has been a head coach in the conference. There are only two players on the Seminoles' roster (Jeremy Franklin in 1980 and Roger Williams in 1983) who were born before 1984.

BOWDEN NEARING 500 GAMES COACHED

Florida State's Bobby Bowden will coach his 486th career game at Colorado on Sunday in his first trip to the state. Within the next two seasons, Bowden will become only the second coach in college football history to coach in 500 or more games - joining the legendary Amos Alonzo Stagg (last coached at Pacific in 1946). Penn State's Joe Paterno (currently active) could also join

the short list of coaches who have coached at least 500 games during their careers. After Bowden and Paterno, the closest active coach is Frank Beamer who entered the season having coached 307 games.

PLAYING ON THE MOTHER SHIP

This will be the Seminoles' second appearance on ESPN this season. Overall Florida State has played on ESPN 53 times and posted a 41-12 record in those games. From 1996 to 2002, FSU won 16 straight games broadcast by ESPN. The streak began Sept. 19, 1996 with a 51-17 win over NC State and was broken in Louisville September 26, 2002 in an OT loss. Florida State has struggled a little bit as of late when their game is broadcast by the sports channel's flagship network. FSU has lost its last three regular season games broadcast on ESPN and is just 4-6 in the last 10. That does not include the team's Emerald Bowl victory at the end of the 2006 season which was also shown on ESPN.

FSU AND THE BIG 12...RANDOM NOTES

▶ In Bobby Bowden's first ever FSU win against the Wildcats, the Seminoles set the team mark for the lowest passing percentage by an opponent as KSU was just 2-of-13 (15.4 percent). ▶ Running back Travis Minor set the school

record for rushing attempts against Texas A&M on August 28, 1998.

➤ Speaking of the ground game, the school record for rushing attempts by both teams involves a school from the Big XII. Under the guidance of first-year head coach Bobby Bowden, Florida State combined with Oklahoma - who was coached by third-year boss Barry Switzer-for 120 running plays.

▶ Twenty-six years away from joining the Big 12, Texas A&M wasn't able to block Dale McCullers as he set the school record with 29 tackles versus the Aggies on October 5, 1968.

FSU AWAY FROM HOME OUT OF CONFERENCE

For the first time since 2004 Florida State will play a true road game against a non-conference opponent besides Florida when it travels to Colorado. The last non-Gator game on the road was a 17-13 victory over Syracuse. Since joining the ACC, Florida State is 22-16 in non-conference games away from home. In true away games, Florida State is just 7-10 with the majority of those losses coming to Florida and Miami. When taking out the Gators and Hurricanes, Florida State is 3-2 on the road against non conference opponents with wins over USC (1997), Notre Dame (2003) and Syracuse (2004) and losses to Notre Dame (1993) and Louisville (2002).

FLY THE FRIENDLY SKIES

Florida State's trip to Boulder marks the first in program history and it will be the longest trip of the season for the Seminoles at 1,656 miles. Last season FSU traveled 2,638 miles to the Emerald Bowl but this will be the longest road trip an FSU team has taken for a regular season game since 1997 when the Seminoles traveled 2,259 miles to play USC in Los Angeles. Since Bobby Bowden took over the program in 1976, FSU has only made five regular season road trips to a place further than Boulder, CO. Those trips were to Los Angeles (USC), Tempe twice (Arizona State), San Diego (San Diego State) and Anaheim (BYU)

DOESN'T HAPPEN OFTEN

After opening the season with a loss at Clemson, FSU will head back out on the road to face Colorado this weekend. Florida State will be looking to avoid back-to-back road losses, something that hasn't happened since 2005 when FSU lost at Clemson and then at Florida. In Bobby Bowden's 32-year FSU career he has only lost back-to-back road games nine times and two of those came when he opened his FSU career going 0-3 in 1976. Since 1991, The Seminoles have lost consecutive road games just twice, once in 2005 as mentioned earlier and once in 2002 versus Louisville and Miami.

TAKING OUR SHOW ON THE ROAD

Saturday night's game between Colorado and FSU is a rare one for the Seminoles. Not just because the teams have only met once or because it is the first trip to Boulder for the Seminoles. It will be just the third non-conference game played away from home by FSU in the month of September since joining the ACC is 1992. In 1997 FSU opened the season with a 14-7 win over USC. Then in 2002 the Seminoles traveled to Louisville September 26 and lost 26-20 in overtime.

WEATHERFORD THROWS FOR THREE TOUCHDOWNS AGAINST UAB

Junior quarterback Drew Weatherford threw for three touchdowns (to three different receivers) in three touchdowns (to three different receivers) in the Seminoles' victory over UAB. His three touchdown passes fell only one shy of tying his own personal record of four touchdown passes at Duke on Oct. 14, 2006. Weatherford has now thrown for multiple touchdowns in nine career games with four coming against Duke in 2006, three coming against UAB in 2007, three coming against VAB in 2007, three coming against UAB in 2007, three coming against U Syracuse and Wake Forest in 2005 and two coming against The Citadel, Boston College and Duke in 2005 and Clemson and NC State in 2006.

WEATHERFORD HELPS SEMINOLES ACCU-MULATE 520 TOTAL OFFENSIVE YARDS Junior quarterback Drew Weatherford guided Florida State's offense to a season-high 520 yards of total offense in the Seminoles' victory over UAB. It marked the most yards of total offense by the Seminoles since Oct. 8, 2005 against Wake Forest when the offense totaled 587 yards. For Weatherford it marked the first time he directed the offense to 500 or more yards of total offense in a single game by himself. He teamed with Xavier Lee to total 629 yards against The Citadel, 587 yards against Wake Forest and 529 yards against Duke during the 2005 season Weatherford against Duke during the 2005 season. Weatherford and Lee combined to lead the offense to 500 total yards against Rice during the 2006 season. Weatherford has played in one career game when the Seminoles have posted 600 or more yards of total offense, six career games where the offense has earned 500 or more yards of total offense and 10 career games where it has earned 400 or more yards of total offense in a single game. Weatherford has a record of 9-1 when he helps lead the Seminoles to 400 or more yards of total offense in a single game.

WEATHERFORD LIKES THE MARRIOTT RE-WARDS POINTS

Maybe it was the mints on the pillow or the mini bottles of shampoo, but no player seemed to enjoy going on the road more than Drew Weatherford. The junior was night and day in 2006 when it came to his performance at home versus the road. Away from Doak Campbell, Weatherford threw for 245.0 yards per game and

seven of his 12 touchdowns with a passing efficiency rating of 131,58. However, when it came time to play at home, his numbers dropped to 1468 ypg and just five TDs with a 109.01 rating. Weatherford has reversed that trend so far in 2007. The redhshirt junior threw for almost 200 more yards at home versus UAB (332) than he did on the road at Clemson (142)

WEATHERFORD GOES OVER 300 YARDS PASSING AGAINST UAB

Junior quarterback Drew Weatherford passed for 321 yards to lead the Seminoles over UAB. The 321 yards to lead the Seminoles over UAB. The 321 yards passing marked the seventh 300-yard passing game and seventh highest single-game passing yardage total in his career. Weatherford has now thrown for at least 300 yards in the two of the last three games and is tied for fifth in school history for total career 300 yard passing games. Weatherford will attempt to throw for 300 yards in back-to-back games for just for 300 yards in back-to-back games for just the second time in his career versus Colorado. The only time the junior has put up 300+ yards in consecutive games was in 2005 versus Wake Forest (351) and Virginia (377).

NEW THREATS EMERGING
With the transfer of tight end Brandon Warren and Chris Davis' move to the NFL, there was a question mark about whether the Seminoles would have offensive weapons to replace those losses. So far the answer to that question has been yes thanks to first-time starters Richard Goodman and Charlie Graham. Goodman had never started a game in his life and Graham had made just two starts coming into the season. The two players had combined for 10 receptions and 105 yards in their careers. Through just two games in 2007 Graham and Goodman have eight catches for 103 yards and three TDs. Goodman is already having a career year. His 50 yard TD catch versus UAB represented more yards than he had in either of his first two seasons. Graham tied a career high with two catches versus UAB on top of hauling in his first ever TD.

SMITH CLOSER TO 1,000 CAREER YARDS Junior running back Antone Smith led Florida State with 90 rushing yards against Clemson -the total was his best effort since he gained a career-high 137 yards against Rice on Sept. 23, 2006. His 90 yards rushing against Clemson in the 2007 season opener was the second highest single-game total of his Seminole career and the fourth time he has gained at least 75 yards in a single game. He has now gained 796 career yards and needs only 204 yards to become the 37th player in school history to gain 1,000 or more career rushing yards.

SMITH AS FLORIDA STATE'S LEADING RECEIVER

Junior running back Antone Smith led Florida State with five receptions for a team-leading 57 yards in the Seminoles' season opener against Clemson. It marked the first time during his career that he had led the Seminoles in both receptions and yards in the same game. Smith has as many receptions against Clemson (five) for more yards (57) than he did during his entire freshman season (five for 25 yards in nine games).

DE'CODY FAGG STREAKING

Fagg caught at least one pass in each of the last 16 games in which he has earned playing time. He missed two games last season (against Maryland and Virginia) because of injury. Fagg's streak includes all 11 games he played in during the 2006 season and the final three games of the 2005 season. He extended that streak with three catches versus UAB Saturday.

SEMINOLE RECEIVING DID YOU KNOW I Senior De'Cody Fagg (82 career catches / 927 career yards) and junior Greg Carr (69 career catches / 1,329 career yards) can become only the fifth and sixth players in school history with 30 or more catches in three consecutive seasons. Fagg has caught 34 (2005) and 37 (2006) passes in the last two seasons while Carr has begun his career with 30 (2005) and 34 (2006) catches. Only Ron Sellers (first in school history with 212 career catches), Peter Warrick (second / 207), Kez McCorvey (third / 189) and E.G. Green (fourth / 166) have caught 30 or more passes in three consecutive years.

FAGG NEXT TO REACH 100 CAREER RECEPTIONS

Senior wide receiver De'Cody Fagg enters the Colorado game with 82 career receptions and needs only 18 catches to become the 21st player in school history with 100 or more career receptions. He caught a single-season career-high 37 passes as a junior in 2006 and has averaged 25.7 catches per season for his three-year career. Florida State's wide receiver coach, Lawrence Dawsey, is tied for ninth in school history with 128 career receptions. The most recent Seminole to reach the century mark in receptions was Chris Davis during the 2006 season. He had 49 receptions as a senior and finished his career ranked fifth in school history with 137 catches.

CARR IS A TOUCHDOWN MACHINE

Junior All-ACC candidate Greg Carr caught his first touchdown pass of the 2007 season (and 22nd of his career) in the Seminoles' 34-24 victory over UAB. He has one touchdown on five catches this season which has slightly driven up his touchdown to catch ratio. Carr entered the season with a ratio of one touchdown for every 3.0 catches during the first two seasons of his career (21 touchdowns on 64 catches / 3.00) and enters Saturday's game against Colorado with a slightly lower career ratio (22 touchdowns on 69 catches / 3.14).

TDS COME IN BUNCHES FOR CARR Greg Carr is more than half way to breaking the ACC's TD reception record. He is just 16 touchdown catches away from tying Clarkston Hines

of Duke with 38. Carr has scored his 22 TD's versus 11 teams: UAB (1), Citadel (2), Boston College (3), Wake Forest (1), Duke (6), Maryland (2), Troy (1), Rice (2), W. Michigan (2), UCLA (1) and Florida (1). Carr has scored multiple touchdowns versus six of those 11 teams. There are four teams Carr has played against on this year's schedule that he has failed to score against (Clemson, Miami, NC State and Virginia Tech).

SEMINOLE RECEIVING DID YOU KNOW II Only five players in school history have caught more touchdown passes than junior All-American candidate Greg Carr. Carr has caught 22 touchdown passes in his first three years and needs just four more TD catches to move into third place. No receiver in school history had more touchdown catches after two seasons than Carr's 21.

CISMESIA CONTINUES TO KICK THEM STRAIGHT

Senior kicker Gary Cismesia, a Lou Groza Award nominee for the second consecutive season, is perfect so far in 2007 making all eight of his kicks (3 FG and 5 PAT). He continued his career-long trend in establishing himself as one of the most accurate kickers in school history as he took over the No. 1 spot on the Seminoles' all-time PAT percentage and moved into second on the field goal percentage leaders lists. He is one of only four kickers in school history who has made more than 70 percent of his field goal attempts. Cismesia's field goal of 36 yards against Clemson was his fourth consecutive successful field goal from between 30 and 39 yards - he has not missed from that distance since missing from 39 yards in Florida State's victory over Troy on Sept. 9, 2006.

CISMESIA TO MOVE ABOVE 200 CAREER POINTS SCORED

Parrish, Fla. native Gary Cismesia became only the 11th player in school history to score 200 or more points during his career when he put up 10 points in the win over UAB. He has led the team in scoring in each of the last two seasons and is looking to become only the fifth player in school history to lead Florida State in scoring in three straight seasons. Cismesia needs only 13 points to move into the Seminoles' all-time top-10 for career scoring.

CISMESIA BY THE NUMBERS ON FIELD GOAL ATTEMPTS

Senior Gary Cismesia is one of the most accurate field goal kickers in school history. He is nearly perfect from inside of 30 yards (13-of-14/929) and is perfect (1-of-1/1.000) from better than 50 yards. He enjoyed the best season of his career from 30-39 yards in 2006 as he missed only once (5-of-6/ .833). Cismesia has made better than 70 percent of his field goal attempts in each of the first three years of his career and is off to a perfect start to 2007 going 3-for-3 so far.

Lou Groza Award candidate Gary Cismesia totaled a season-high 10 points as he was perfect on all of his six kicks (two field goals and four PAT) in the Seminoles' 34-24 victory over UAB. CISMESIA HITS FROM 40 AGAINST UAB

Lou Groza Award candidate Gary Cismesia kicked his second field goal of the season in as many attempts in the Seminoles' victory over UAB. Cismesia was good from 40 yards with 13:03 remaining in the game to give Florida State their final winning margin of 34-24. For Cismesia it broke a streak of four consecutive missed field goals of 40 yards or more and was his first made field goal from that distance since making a 44 yard field goal against Virginia on Nov. 4, 2006 in a 33-0 Seminole victory.

GANO TIES PERSONAL RECORD

Junior kicker Graham Gano, who tied a personal record by punting nine times for a 37.1 yards per punt average in the Seminoles' season opener against Clemson, had another record night versus UAB. The junior had a career-best average of 47 yards per punt including a long of 54 yards. Only one of his punts was returned and that went for just 8 yards as Gano's net average was an outstanding 43.0.

Parker returned six punts for 74 yards including a career-long return of 33 yards. He also was the team's leading receiver with 89 yards and rushed one time for nine yards as well. His first punt return of the game, the 33-yarder, set FSU up at the UAB 31 setting up FSU's first score of the game.

PARKER IS THE DEEP MAN TO RECEIVE PUNTS FOR THE SEMINOLES Sophomore Preston Parker returned a career-high six punts for a career-high 74 yards in the Seminoles' victory over UAB. His career-long 33 yard return in the first guarter gave the Seminoles sensational field position on the UAB 31 yard line. His punt return helped set up Florida State's first score of the game a 28-yard field goal by Gary Cismesia to make the score 10-3. Parker has returned eight of the nine punts kicked at the Seminoles during the first two games of the season (Roosevelt Lawson returned the only one Parker did not) and averages 13.8 yards per return. The last player to average more than 13.8 yards per punt return for an entire season was Willie Reid who averaged 17.5 yards on 31 returns during the 2005 season.

Garvin earned his season-long kickoff return of 35 yards in the third quarter against UAB. Garvin's ability to give the Seminoles outstanding field position with his 35 yard return helped the offense continue to flow. Only three plays after Garvin's return, quarterback Drew Weatherford threw a 50-yard touchdown pass to Richard Goodman to give Florida State a 31-24 lead. SEMINOLES EARNING MORE YARDS ON KICKOFF RETURNS

Whether it's the speed of Florida State's kickoff return specialist Michael Ray Garvin or the fact that the line of scrimmage on a kickoff has been moved back to the 30-yard line, the Seminoles are earning increased return yards in kickoffs this season. Florida State (Garvin) is averaging 22.2 yards per kickoff return this season as compared to the team average of 18.7 yards per return last season. While the Seminoles are averaging 3.5 yards more per kick returns this season while the Seminoles' first two opponents are averaging only 0.2 yards per return this season. Florida State's 22.2 yards per kickoff return is its highest since averaging 22.8 yards on 40 kickoffs during the 2003 season and 23.5 vards on 26 kickoffs during the 1998 season.

AMAZING ACADEMIC SUCCESS STORIES

The academic success stories of redshirt freshman Christian Ponder and sophomore rover Myron Rolle are absolutely amazing. Both players are in their second year as members of the Seminole football team and both are on track to graduate in August of 2008 - meaning they are set-up to graduate more than two years ahead of their class which entered college in August of 2006 and is scheduled to graduate in the spring of 2010. So talented academically, both players graduated high school a semester early and became Florida State students and Seminole football players in January of 2006.

Here are their stories:

Christian Ponder: Graduated from Colleyville Heritage High School and enrolled at Florida State in January of 2006. He arrived at Florida State with 21 hours of college credit because of Advanced Placement (AP) courses and exceedingly high SAT scores in high school. He earned 21 credit hours during the spring and summer of 2006 giving him 42 credit hours entering his first fall semester at Florida State. He earned 39 credit hours as a freshman and enters the fall of 2007 with 81 credit hours and a 3.8 grade point average. He has not earned lower than a B in any course he has taken at Florida State and is set to graduate in a bachelor's degree in finance and will pursue his MBA and begin Ph.D classes while utilizing his final three years of eligibility because he redshirted during his first football playing year at Florida State.

Myron Rolle: Graduated from the Hun School in January of 2006 and enrolled at Florida State in January of 2006. He arrived at Florida State with 11 hours of college credit because of Advanced Placement (AP) courses and exceedingly high SAT scores in high school. He earned 22 credit hours during the spring and summer of 2006 giving him 33 credit hours entering his first fall semester at Florida State. Rolle earned 51 hours of credit as a freshman (fall, spring and summer semesters) and enters the fall of 2007 with 84 credit hours while majoring in exercise sciences. He is on pace to graduate in the Summer of 2008 and will pursue his Master's Degree in public administration. Rolle did not redshirt during his freshman season and will have two years to work on his master's degree and finish out his eligibility. He is also the vicepresident of the Student Athlete Advisory Coun-

OFFENSIVE LINEMEN HAVE EXPERIENCE

Florida State begins the 2007 season with six offensive linemen who have logged extensive playing time during their careers. Leading the push for the offensive linemen is senior All-ACC candidate Jacky Claude who protected quarterback Drew Weatherford's blindside in 2005 and 2006. Claude has started the last 28 games for the Seminoles over the last two seasons. Claude is joined by center turned tight end John Frady (21 career starts). Senior Shannon Boatman started 12 of the Seminoles' 13 games at the right tackle in 2006 while senior David Overmyer has played in 37 games with 20 starts during his career. As a group, the six players have started 80 games during their careers.

THE RICK TRICKETT DIET

One thing to remember as well, this group had combined to drop well over 200 pounds before getting back in the weight room over the summer and adding muscle onto their leaner frames.

FAMILIAR FACES IN NEW PLACES

After spending seven seasons as the head coach at NC State, Chuck Amato is back at Florida State where he coached for 18 years. Amato was the assistant head coach for FSU's National Championship teams in 1993 and 1999 and is one of six new coaches on the Seminole staff when you include strength coach Todd Stroud. While having six new assistants on a staff may seem to pose a problem when it comes to working together, that won't be the case for this group. This is the third time three of these new coaches (Jimbo Fisher, Rick Trickett and Stroud) have all been on the same staff. Fisher, Stroud and Trickett coached together at Samford from 1988-92 and then at Auburn in 1993. In 2003, Lawrence Dawsey was a GA at LSU where Fisher was the offensive coordinator. Stroud is also linked with Amato as the two worked together for seven years at NC State. The man that ties this staff together is Terry Bowden, While serving as the head coach at Samford and Auburn, Terry Bowden had Fisher, Stroud and Trickett on both his staffs. Not only was Fisher on Terry Bowden's staffs he also played for him at Salem College and Samford.

ON THE GROUND

Florida State rushed for 188 yards in its victory over UAB. The Seminoles' rushing total was its highest since gaining 287 yards on the ground against Rice on Sept. 23, 2006. The Seminoles are averaging 151 yards per game rushing this season as compared to 96.5 yards per game rushing during the 2006 season. Florida State is also averaging 4.1 yards per rush on 74 rushes this season as compared to 3.1 yards per rush on 363 rushing attempts during the 2006 season.

MORE LONG PLAYS AGAINST UAB

Florida State had five offensive plays of better than 25 yards in its victory against UAB as compared to only two against Clemson in its season opener. The Seminoles utilized the longer strike in the air as quarterback Drew Weatherford completed five passes (50 to Richard Goodman for a touchdown, 41 to Greg Carr that led to a touchdown, 36 and 26 to Preston Parker and 26 to Damon McDaniel) that very quickly moved Florida State downfield. Weatherford completed one pass of better than 25 yards (28 to Antone Smith) against Clemson. Smith also earned a season-long 49-yard rush against the Tigers for the longest rush of the game and of the first two games of the season.

SEMINOLES HIT THE TRIFECTA AGIANST UAB

Florida State scored three touchdowns and totaled 21 points in the third quarter of its victory over UAB. Junior quarterback Drew Weatherford threw touchdown passes to Greg Carr (eight yards) and Richard Goodman (50 yards) and Marcus Sims scored on a one-yard plunge to help Florida State forge a 31-21 lead over the Blazers heading into the fourth quarter of Saturday's game. The Seminoles' 21 points was the most in a quarter since scoring 21 in the fourth quarter of their Emerald Bowl victory over UCLA and the third time in their last 10 games that the Seminoles' offense had scored 21 points in a quarter. The trifecta of 21 points also came during the first quarter of the Seminoles' victory over Duke on Oct. 14, 2006 in a 51-24 win over the Blued Devils.

FOUR DIFFERENT SEMINOLES FIND THE ENDZONE AGAINST UAB

Four different Seminoles - Greg Carr, Richard Goodman, Charlie Graham and Marcus Sims all scored touchdowns in the Seminoles' victory over UAB. It marked the second time in the last three games that four different Seminoles found I a game when rushing for 150 yards or more was

A total of four Seminoles - Lorenzo Booker, Lawrence Timmons, Greg Carr and Tony Carter - all scored touchdowns in the Seminoles' 44-27 victory over UCLA in the Emerald Bowl on Dec. 27, 2006. The Seminoles also had four touchdown scorers last season against Virginia and Rice and five find the endzone against Duke during the 2006 season

SEMINOLES CUT PUNTS BY ONE-THIRD **AGAINST UAB**

Florida State was forced into only three punting situations against UAB as compared to nine punts in its season opener against Clemson. The Seminoles punted fewer times in the first half against UAB (two) than they did in the first guarter against Clemson (five) and punted only once in the second half as compared to four second half punts against Clemson. The three punts by the tandem of Graham Gano (two punts / 47.0 ypp) and Brent Moody (45.0 yards on one punt) were the fewest punts in a game since the Seminoles punted only three times in their 51-24 victory over Duke on Oct. 14, 2006. The combined 46.3 yards per punt average of the Seminoles' punters was the highest since Gano earned a 47.5 yards per punt average against Boston College on Oct. 21, 2006.

SEMINOLES WIN 100TH GAME UNDER **BOWDEN WHEN PASSING FOR 300 YARDS** Saturday's victory over UAB was a milestone of sorts for Florida State. Quarterback Drew Weatheford threw for 332 yards in the 34-24 victory to give the Seminoles their 100th win when they exceed 300 yards passing. Under Bowden, Florida State is 100-20 when exceeding 300 yards through the air. While it was the 120th game that Florida State has exceeded 300 yards through the air as a team, Weatherford's performance was the 66th game under Bowden that a single quarterback has thrown for at least 300 yards.

SESQUICENTENNIAL MARK GROUND MEANS VICTORY FOR FSU

Getting to 150 yards on the ground typically has meant a victory for the Seminoles during the Bowden era. Against UAB, Florida State rumbled for 188 yards on the ground - its most rushing yards since 287 against Rice last season. In Bobby Bowden's 32 years at Florida State, the Seminoles are 200-20 when grinding out at least 150 yards on the ground. The last time FSU lost



last year at Maryland (172 yards) and prior to that the last loss was 28-27 loss at Miami (296 yards) on October 12, 2002.

FSU'S BEST RETURN AS COACHES

Seminole wide receiver coach Lawrence Dawsey and FSU running back coach Dexter Carter bring more than NFL experience in their returns to FSU as coaches. Both were members of FSU's dynasty in the 1990's and still appear all over the Seminole record books. Dawsey is ranked eighth in school history with 2,129 career receiving yards, tied for ninth in school history with 128 career receptions and ninth in school history with 20 touchdown receptions. His single-game career-high of 172 receiving yards led Florida State to a 45-30 victory over Florida on Dec. 1, 1990. Dawsey's 172 receiving yards is the third highest single-game receiving yardage total in 51 all-time Florida State games against the Gators. Carter was a team captain at FSU in 1989 and left Tallahassee as the Seminoles' fifth all-time leading rusher with 1,788 yards on 327 carries. Carter currently ranks 12th all-time on the career rushing list. He scored 22 touchdowns in his career, which is good for 12th place alltime at FSU and he ranked fourth all-time in career TDs when he left FSU. Carter led FSU in rushing as a senior in 1989 with 684 yards and he also scored eight TDs. The running back coach still holds the record for the longest kickoff return in school history set in 1986 with a 100yard return versus Miami.

ROAD WARRIORS

Florida State played four regular season games away from Doak Campbell Stadium in 2006 and traveled just 2,629 miles to get to those four games. That won't be the case in 2007. For just the second time in Bobby Bowden's FSU career. his Seminoles will play seven regular season games away from home. Although the Alabama game is technically a home game, it will be played at a neutral site in Jacksonville. The only other time the Seminoles played away from home seven times was in 2002. That was only five years ago but you have to go back a lot further to find the last time an FSU football team logged this many miles. This year the Florida State football team will travel 4,996 miles to get to its seven games. You have to go back 30 years to find the last FSU team that traveled more cumulative miles to get to its games. In 1977 the Seminoles logged 5,575 miles to get to its six road games. Since 1993 Seminole

SEMINOLES' DEFENSE STIFFENS IN SECOND HALF

Florida State's defense has allowed a total of seven second half points (one touchdown) in its first two games of the 2007 season. The Seminoles' defense shutout Clemson in the second half (the Tigers are averaging 36.5 points per game in their first two games of the 2007 season) and held UAB to seven points in the second half of their 34-24 victory over the Blazers. The only score Florida State has allowed in the second half of its first two games this season was a 16-yard touchdown pass by UAB. Florida State's defense has allowed a total of 61 points in the second halves their last nine games (6.8 points per half) and a total of six second half touchdowns since Oct. 21, 2006 against Boston College. The Seminoles have allowed 105 first half points (11.7 points per half) in their last nine games and have played from behind in eight of those last nine games. But give credit where credit is due as the Seminoles have outscored both of their opponents this season (by a total of 39-7) and have outscored seven of their last nine opponents in the second half by more that double the amount of points (117-57) .

FSU PICKED TO WIN ATLANTIC DIVISION OF ACC

Game Summaries

SEMINOLE FOOTBALL



CLEMSON, S.C. (AP) -- First-time starter Cullen Harper threw two touchdown passes in Clemson's 24-18 victory over the No. 19 Seminoles on Monday night.

Harper and the Tigers came out throwing to take a 21-0 lead before the game was 17 minutes old -- and brought their coach, Tommy, his third straight win over father Bobby's Seminoles.

Florida State rallied from 24-3 down in the second half of the season opener for both teams. When Drew Weatherford hit Richard Goodman for a 15-yard TD pass with 11:40 left, the Seminoles trailed by 6.

Weatherford and the Seminoles got the ball back three more times after that, but could not score.

"It looked like stage fright. We were running a new offense but I thought we grasped it better than that. We were bad," Bobby Bowden said.

Clemson fans rushed the field and the collapsible goal posts came down after Weatherford's final pass fell to the ground. But officials chose to review the play, moving orange-clad fans out of the way.

Finally, they were told the play stood and the game was indeed over.

Florida State had a rough first half, managing only one first down and 62 yards. The Seminoles, however, found their rhythm in the second half.

Antone Smith had a 49-yard run to Clemson's 1, then followed with the score that drew them to 24-11. Goodman's TD catch tightened things up even more.

But Weatherford and the Seminoles couldn't sustain the rally.

They got to Clemson's 31 with 3 minutes left. But Florida State's junior quarterback threw three incompletions and was taken down from behind by defensive lineman Philip Merling.

Harper was 14-of-24 for 160 yards and no interceptions. Davis gained 102 yards on 18 carries.

The victory closed Tommy within a win of his father after the ninth meeting of college football's best known family feud.

Bobby's Seminoles won the first four games in the series by a combined score of 160-79. Tommy won four of the past five, including the last three at Death Valley.

Bobby Bowden said he can't be certain the Seminoles will rebound from their fifth loss in their last eight games. "You never know. The season's too young," he said.

Clemson got things going with a reverse to Jacoby Ford that went for 34 yards to Florida State's 23. Three plays later, Harper found Linthicum for an 11-yard touchdown pass.

The Tigers were at it again moments later when linebacker Nick Watkins recovered Preston Parker's fumble.

Davis, who gained 1,187 yards a year ago, showed off his power on the next play, breaking two tackles and cutting hard left near the goal line for his 29-yard touchdown and a 14-0 lead.

Two series later, Harper hooked up with Kelly for a 41-yard touchdown pass.

GIVE 'EM TWO

The safety in the third quarter was Florida State's first since it picked up one against Virginia Last season. Buster Davis tackled Jameel Sewell for a five-yard loss in the third quarter of FSU's 33-0 victory.

THREE TRUE FRESHMEN MAKE THEIR DEBUT

Florida State had three true freshmen play in tonight's game. Rodney Hudson got the start at left tackle in his first collegiate game. Kendall Smith got into the game on special teams. Also making his debut on special teams was fellow linebacker Maurice Harris.

SMITH ON THE RUN

Antone Smith's 49-yard scamper in the third quarter that set up his oneyard touchdown run was his longest in eight games. The junior set a career high with an 80-yard touchdown run against Duke on October 14. The TD against Clemson was Smith's first since he scored versus Virginia. Smith rushed for 90 yards against Clemson, his best effort since a careerhigh 137 againstt Rice last season (Sept. 23).

GOODMAN MAKES HIS WAY INTO THE ENDZONE FOR THE FIRST TIME

After three seasons as a reserve, Richard Goodman made his first major contribution to the offense in the fourth quarter. The junior caught his first career touchdown pass with 11:40 remaining in the game. The 15-yard reception is the second-longest of his career, coming in just behind a 22-yard reception against Troy last season (Sept. 9). The touchdown

pass was Florida State's first in a season opener since Chris Rix hit Chris Davis for a seven-yard score in the 2003 game at North Carolina (Aug. 30).

WEATHERFORD OPENS 2007 WITH A CAREER-LONG RUN

The 22-yard run by Drew Weatherford on the first play of the game was the longest rush of his career. His previous high was a 17-yarder versus Maryland on October 29, 2005.

MOFFETT AND WATSON COMBINE FOR FSU'S FIRST TURNOVER OF 2007

The fumble recovery by sophomore Dekoda Watson was the first of his career. His recovery was the product of a strip by defensive end Neefy Moffett. It was the second forced fumble of Moffett's career. He also forced one versus Rice in 2006. He recovered that fumble himself.

LARGEST HALFTIME DEFICIT VERSUS CLEMSON

Florida State's 21-point deficit is its largest at the half in the series with Clemson. Prior to this game, the largest Tiger lead heading into the lockerroom was 18 points (28-10) during the 1989 game. The last time Florida State was down more than 21 points at the half was against Florida on November 25, 1995, when the Gators led 28-6. FSU lost that game 35-24.

Game Summaries



TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) -- Drew Weatherford threw for 332 yards and three touchdowns as Florida State rallied from an early two-touchdown deficit and held off UAB 34-24 on Saturday.

The Seminoles fell out of the Top 25 after losing Monday at Clemson and found themselves in a hole to UAB, which has lost nine straight but was up 17-3 lead in the first half.

Weatherford hit a streaking Richard Goodman in stride for a 50-yard touchdown on the final play of the third period that gave the Seminoles a 31-24 lead and Gary Cismesia's 40-yard field goal two minutes later finally gave Florida State some breathing room at 34-24.

Florida State didn't get its first lead, 24-17, until late in the third quarter on Marcus Sim's 1-yard TD run, but UAB countered on Joseph Webb's one-handed catch on a 16-yard pass from Sam Hunt to tie the game at 24.

Tight end Charlie Graham and wideout Greg Carr also caught TD passes for Florida State (I-1, O-1 Atlantic Coast Conference), which totaled 520 yards offense.

Although the offensive statistics were virtually even at the half, UAB held a 17-10 lead on the strength of Will Dunbar's 21-

yard interception return touchdown just five minutes into the game that made it 10-0.

After a 28-yard field goal by Cismesia, Hunt's 4-yard scoring scramble early in the second quarter boosted UAB into its 17-3 lead. UAB (0-2) has not won since a 35-29 win over Memphis last Oct. 7.

Florida State lost starting tailback Antone Smith with a concussion midway through the third period and his status for next Saturday's game at Colorado was not immediately known.

GAME NOTES

SEMINOLES GRINDING IT OUT ON THE GROUND

Florida State's running game has seen a resurgence. For the third game in a row, the Seminoles have produced at least 100 yard rushing as they went for 188 against UAB. The total is Florida State's highest since it went for 287 against Rice last season (September 23). Through the first two games, Florida State is averaging 151 rushing yards per game, compared to just 96.5 in 2006. Florida State had three running backs go for more than 30 yards against UAB - Antone Smith (62), Jamaal Edwards (45) and Marcus Sims (34) - which it hasn't had since last year's Maryland game.

GOODMAN CROSS THE GOAL LINE AGAIN

After scoring his first career touchdown Monday at Clemson, junior Richard Goodman scored six points again versus UAB. He is the second FSU receiver to catch a touchdown catch in consecutive games in the last four contests. Greg Carr rounded out the 2006 season by hauling in scores against Western Michigan, at Florida and against UCLA in the Emerald Bowl.

WEATHERFORD MOVES INTO TOP TEN LIST ON FSU TD CHARTS

With his 50-yard scoring strike to Richard Goodman to start the fourth quarter, signal caller Drew Weatherford has tied Chip Ferguson for 10th in FSU history with 34 touchdown passes. His third touchdown of the night - which was one of his career-high of four set at Duke in 2006 - moved him past Peter Tom Willis, who occupied the No. 11 spot with 33 TDs.

PARKER HAS THE ALL-AROUND GAME

Wide receiver Preston Parker accounted for 172 yards through three different mediums. He caught a career-high 89 yards on four catches. In the special teams department he returned six punts for 74 yards, averaging 12.3 yards per return. He even got in on the ground game as he had one rush for nine yards.

WHY WALK WHEN YOU CAN TAKE THE CARR

Wide receiver Greg Carr hauled in 82 yards against UAB to give him two games with at least 80 yards receiving in his last three outings (88 vs. UCLA). His touchdown catch in the third quarter was the 22nd of his career, which tied him with Duke's Corey Thomas for 12th in ACC history. Within the Florida State ranks, he needs one more to pull into a tie for fifth place with FSU Hall of Famer Ron Sellers.

WEATHERFORD SPREADING THE WEALTH

Quarterback Drew Weatherford completed passes to eight different receivers against UAB. He has completed passes to at least seven different receivers in each of his last three games. Last season he twice completed passes to nine different receivers (Duke & Tory).

WEATHERFORD CROSSES 300-YARD PLATEAU FOR SECOND TIME IN THREE GAMES

With 213 passing yards in the second half, quarterback Drew Weatherford crossed the 300-yard plateau for the second time in the last three games with 332 yards. It was the seventh time of his career that he's thrown for 300 yards, which ties him for fifth on the FSU charts with current FSU executive athletics director Gary Huff

EDWARDS MAKING THE MOST OF HIS OPPORTUNITY

Given the chance to carry the ball, running back Jamaal Edwards made the most of his playing time. The Greensboro, N.C., native produced 45 yards on 12 carries with 43 of those yards coming in the second half. Edwards entered tonight's contest with a total of 28 yards rushing. His longest run of the night was 12 yards, which exceeds his career-high by one that he set against UAB as a freshman in the 2004 season on the very first carry of his FSU career.

SIMS HITS PAY DIRT

While he is the third member of his family to play for Florida State, Marcus Sims is the first to score a touchdown. His one-yard plunge in the third quarter was the first of his career. Sims finished the night with 34 yards rushing, which exceeds his career total of 16 coming into the game. He also added 33 yards receiving. Ernie Sims, Sr, rushed for 273 yards on 58 carries during his career, while Ernie Sims, Jr., a linebacker, rushed one time for negative one yard.

FIRST TIMERS

Marcus Sims is the third Florida State player to score his first career touchdown in the last two games. In the first quarter of tonight's contest, tight end Charlie Graham hauled in a two-yard touchdown reception. Last week against Clemson, wide receiver Richard Goodman pulled in his first touchdown pass.
