4 Requirements before CU can Provide Official Campus Visit

- PSA must be registered with NCAA Eligibility Center
- Coach must provide academic transcript to Dee
- Test score presented to Dee
- Dee must place the PSA on CU's IRL in the Eligibility Center (EC ID# is requested on PSA Card)

PSA Signs NLI with CU

We Continue to...

- Monitor Admission to CU
- Monitor NCAA Qualifier Status/Amateurism
- Finalize Matriculation
 - Summer
 - Fall/Spring

Summer Bridge

- NCAA Policy – must take 6 credits
- Complete Summer Bridge Form
- Must be admitted by May 15 to attend A Session
- Must be admitted by June 15 to Attend B Session

Arrival on CU Campus

- Per CU policy, a PSA may not be on campus, nor should they be encouraged to come to Boulder, in the summer unless deemed a qualifier by NCAA or given approval (Committee of FAR, Director of Academics, Director of Eligibility).

Required Fees

- Application Fee – ALL PSAs must pay \$50
- Enrollment Deposit - \$200
 - Scholarship – PSA does not pay
 - Walk-on – PSA must pay
- Housing Deposit – All PSAs must pay \$300 deposit (deposit will be returned to student when student departs residence hall, minus fee assessed if damage occurs)

International PSAs

- Same initial process as domestic PSAs
- No core evaluation is completed by Dee (can be done for a Canadian PSA)
- Rather CU International Admissions staff member Tom Naumann uses the *NCAA Guide to International Academic Standards for Athletics Eligibility* to evaluate academic credentials from that country.
- If in a foreign language, CU **must** have a translated copy *in addition* to a copy of the native language

International PSAs (cont.)

- If PSA is admissible, PSA must become a NCAA academic qualifier before I-20 is issued.
- Dee will inform Admissions of qualifier status and the I-20 will be released.
- Sport program will be notified by Dee to pick up the I-20 and then your staff member can Fed-Ex it to the PSA.

International PSAs - Required Fees

- Application Fee – ALL PSAs must pay \$70
- Enrollment Deposit - \$200
 - Scholarship – PSA does not pay
 - Walk-on – PSA must pay but typically it is deferred to student's bill
- Housing Deposit – All PSAs must pay \$300 deposit (deposit will be returned to student when student departs residence hall, minus fee assessed if damage occurs)

Transfer PSAs

- Same initial process
- All college transcripts must be given to Dee
- Instead of core evaluation, transfer credit evaluation is performed by Office of Admissions
- CU does not accept Ds or Fs
- Credits transferring into CU

Transfer Credit vs. Degree Applicable Credit (Admissions vs. Eligibility)

- Admissions will evaluate how many credits will transfer into the university
- The PSA's college will evaluate how many of those credits are degree applicable within the PSA's chosen major (40/60/80%). All high school transcripts are needed to complete this evaluation.

2009-64 ELIGIBILITY -- FRESHMAN ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS -- CORE-CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS -- NONTRADITIONAL COURSES

Intent: To specify that for purposes of using a nontraditional course to satisfy NCAA core-course requirements, the course must be one in which the instructor and the student have ongoing access to one another and regular interaction with one another for purposes of teaching, evaluating and providing assistance to the student throughout the duration of the course; the student's work (e.g., exams, papers, assignments) is available for review and validation; and a defined time period for completion of the course is included.

2009-64 ELIGIBILITY -- FRESHMAN ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS -- CORE-CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS -- NONTRADITIONAL COURSES

Rationale: Current legislation permits the use of nontraditional courses (courses taught via the Internet, distance-learning, independent-study, individualized-instruction, correspondence or similar means) to satisfy NCAA initial-eligibility requirements, provided certain conditions are satisfied. The recent increase in the prevalence of nontraditional courses has created a number of challenges in the determination of initial eligibility for prospective student-athletes, **particularly related to ensuring that courses are academically sound** and meet the NCAA definition of core courses. Additional challenges are presented by the emergence of institutions providing **courses that are not regulated by a regional accrediting agency or state educational authority**. After consultation with the NCAA Student Records Review Committee and NCAA High School Review Committee, this recommendation is intended to help ensure that acceptable nontraditional courses provide opportunities for students to **demonstrate their work was completed in a manner consistent with the intent and design of the core-course curriculum requirements**. This legislation will allow the NCAA Eligibility Center to determine which courses and institutions are acceptable to satisfy initial-eligibility standards with the ultimate goal of ensuring that prospective student-athletes are enrolled in quality courses that satisfy the intent of the core-curriculum requirements and prepare prospective student-athlete for college academic work.

AMATEURISM AND ELIGIBILITY -- INVOLVEMENT WITH PROFESSIONAL TEAMS -- EXCEPTION -- PRIOR TO INITIAL FULL-TIME COLLEGIATE ENROLLMENT -- DELAYED ENROLLMENT -- SEASONS OF COMPETITION -- SPORTS OTHER THAN MSK

•**Intent:** In sports other than SKIING, to specify that prior to initial full-time collegiate enrollment, an individual may enter into an agreement to compete on a professional team and compete on a professional team, **provided the agreement does not guarantee or promise payment (at any time) in excess of actual and necessary expenses to participate on the team**; further, in sports other than SKIING, TENNIS, and WVB to specify that a SA who does not initially enroll full-time in a collegiate

institution within 1 year

What Does This Mean?

- Proposal No. 2009-51-B has received 70 override requests to date. Since the proposal has received at least 30 override requests, the legislation will be reconsidered by the NCAA Legislative Council at its April 12-13 meeting; however, the legislation remains in effect.
- A total of 100 override requests must be submitted by the end of the day on March 17 to suspend the legislation.
- If the Legislative Council agrees to change its position, the proposal will be defeated and will not be sent for further membership comment.
- If the Legislative Council maintains its position, the Division I Board of Directors will review the measure at its April 29 meeting. If the Board does not address the proposal at that time, the membership will vote on the proposal at the 2011 NCAA Convention.

Proposal 2009-22

AMATEURISM AND ELIGIBILITY -- INVOLVEMENT WITH PROFESSIONAL TEAMS -- EXCEPTION -- PRIOR TO INITIAL FULL-TIME COLLEGIATE ENROLLMENT -- DELAYED ENROLLMENT -- SEASONS OF COMPETITION -- SPORTS OTHER THAN MEN'S ICE HOCKEY AND MSK

(six months for tennis) or the next opportunity to enroll following the HS graduation date of the PSA's class and participates in organized events after the specified time period shall be charged with a season of competition **for each year** of participation and shall have to sit a year in residence (one year for each year of competition in tennis) on matriculation at the certifying institution before being eligible to compete.

- Effective date: August 1, 2010

Proposal 2009-51-B

RECRUITING -- CAMPS AND CLINICS -- INSTITUTION'S SPORTS
CAMPS AND CLINICS -- LOCATION RESTRICTION -- SPORTS OTHER
THAN FB

- Intent:** In sports other than FB, to specify that an institution's camp or clinic shall be conducted on the institution's campus or within a 100-mile radius of the institution's campus.

- Effective date:** Immediate; a contract signed before September 17, 2008, for MBB camps may be honored; a contract signed before September 16, 2009, for WBB camps may be honored; a contract signed before October 20, 2009, for all other sports may be honored.
