C.A.R.A. RULES

In-Season Hour Limitations

- No more than 4 hours per day
- No more than 20 hours per week
- Must give 1 day off per week of your declared calendar week
 - Can be any 7 day period
 - Wednesday-Tuesday
 - Sunday-Saturday
 - Must be the same 7 day period throughout your calendar

New info to be aware of...

- We recently learned on a Big 12 Conference Call that “transition time” must be counted in the daily limits
- Example:

Incorrect Way	Correct Way
Meetings- 1:30-2:30- 1 hour	Meetings- 1:30-2:30 (1 hour)
Dress for Practice- 30 minutes	Practice- 2:30-4:30 (2 hours)
Practice- 3:00-5:00 (2 hours)	Dress for lift- 4:30-5:00
Dress for Lift- 30 minutes	Lift- 5:00-5:30 (1 hour)
Lift- 5:30-6:30 (1 hour)	
TOTAL TIME- 5 hours	TOTAL TIME- 4 hours

Out-of-season Limitations

- 8 hours per week
- 2 days off per week
- No more than 2 hours of skill instruction per week (not applicable to Football)

What's "Countable?"

- Practice (in-season only)
- Competition {no matter how long the contest last, it only counts for three hours}
- Strength and conditioning workouts
- Game tape breakdown with coaches
- Athletics meetings with the coach initiated or required by the coach

What is voluntary?

- Training room time and/or Rehabilitation
- Travel associated with contests
- Compliance meetings
- Academic meetings
- Study hall/tutoring appointments
- Meetings with the coach initiated by the student-athlete
- Training table meals
- Promotional activities
- Recruiting activities
- **ANYTHING ELSE DONE AT THE STUDENT-ATHLETE'S OWN VOLITION!!!!**

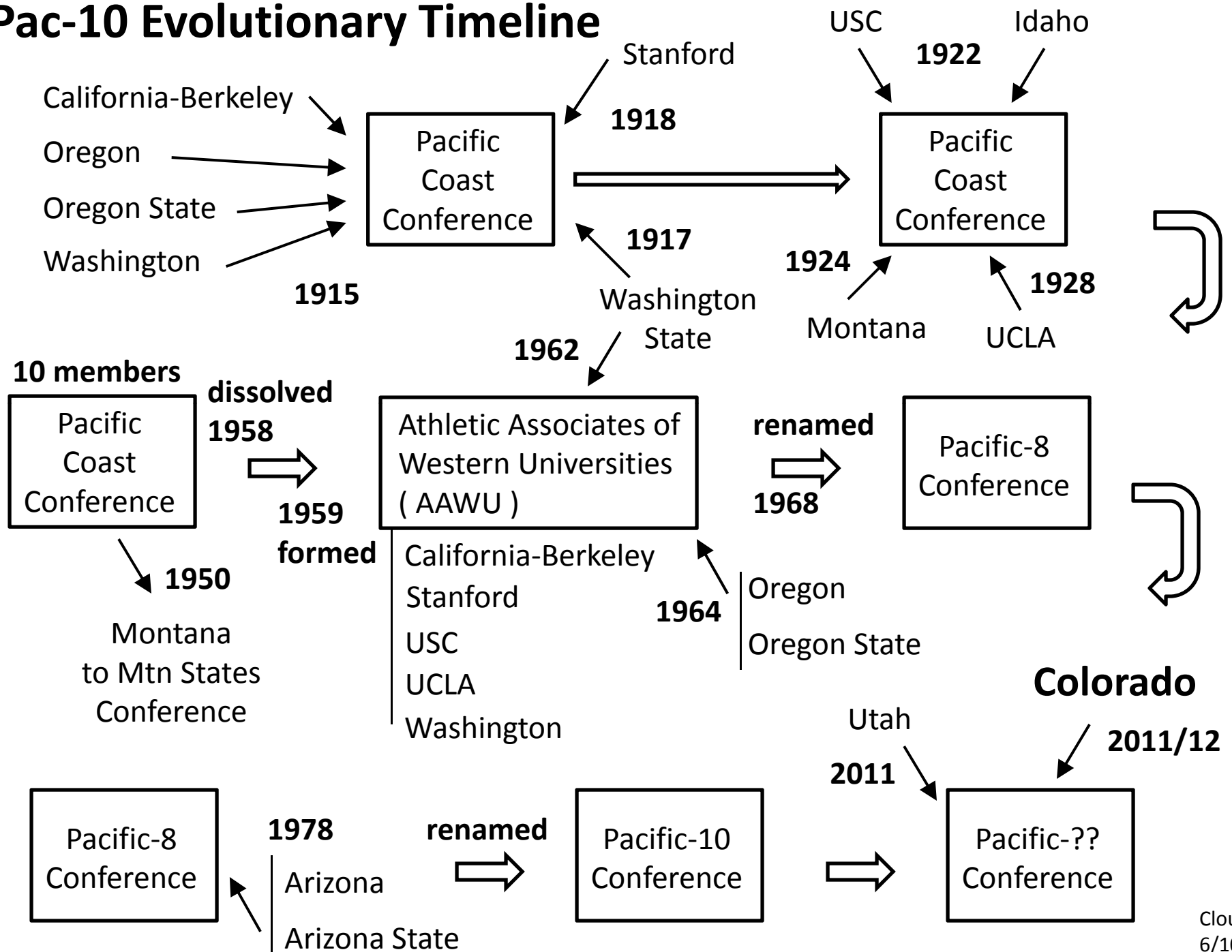
What have we learned?

- ANYTHING required must be counted
 - Punishment conditioning
- Something 'voluntary' becomes 'required' when unauthorized sports staff are watching the activity or providing instruction

MAJOR INFRACTIONS UPDATE

USC

- The report from the NCAA's Committee on Infractions was recently released
- What can we learn?
 - Three major areas

Area #1- Agent Interaction

- “Student-Athlete 1,” a.k.a., Reggie Bush, had an agreement in place to start a sports agency at the conclusion of his time at USC
- Nothing in writing, but the agency was “real enough” to be considered tangible.
 - Set up mainly through Bush’s step-father and two upstart marketing agents from San Diego around December of 2004
 - Under the impression that the agency would develop, the would-be agents provided thousands of dollars in travel, housing, lodging, etc.

Agent Interaction Warning Signs

- Bush's parents never attended an away game
 - Attended the 2005 Orange Bowl (occurred after Agency Agreement was developed)
 - Attended 3 more away football games in 2005
 - One of which was paid by another agency
- Driving a different car
 - Went from a beat-up Ford Ranger to a (used) Chevy Impala
 - Rims, a stereo, and security system were added later
 - Wondered how it was paid for

Agent Interaction Warning Signs

- Assistant Coach knowledge of the situation
 - Bush's position coach was contacted by the would-be agents to help in the process of holding Bush to original plan
- Family took free housing for over a year
- Assorted travel and accommodations were given to Reggie and friends
- All these were under the assumption that "we'll make it back later."

Area #2- Recruitment Warning Signs

- Student-Athlete #2, a.k.a. OJ Mayo, was being provided benefits from a sports agent, through a “runner” or “handler” by the name of Rodney Guillory
- With finances from the agency, Guillory provided Mayo (and friends and family) with benefits such as cell phone service, travel, lodging, meals, and clothing.

Recruiting Warning Signs

- Guillory entered the MBB offices at USC, claiming he could “deliver” 2 of the top 3 prep basketball players in the country (Mayo being one of them).
- Guillory inserted himself in the recruiting process, and the staff utilized him in its recruitment of Mayo...which made Guillory a booster of USC, making all of the benefits, services, and contact to Mayo impermissible

Recruiting Warning Signs

- The MBB staff researched Guillory, knew he was once involved in previous impermissible activity.
 - Despite the knowledge, they continued their interaction with Guillory to get Mayo.
- USC's administration was aware that Guillory was back around the program, but did nothing of substance to stop it

Area #3- Extra Benefits from University Resources

- A women's tennis student-athlete used a university-issued long-distance code at her discretion
- Racked up over \$5,000 of long distance charges because she was an international SA placing calls overseas.

Reasons For Punishment

- To accrue \$5,000 worth of long-distance charges, this was not an isolated incident
- Policies/procedures/protocol was purposely circumvented
- The frequency and large phone bill infer an intentional disregard for the rule
