PROMOTIONAL ACTIVITIES

IN THIS ISSUE

All promotional activities must be approved prior to student-athlete participation. If an event is held at a local commercial establishment, that establishment cannot be a cosponsor of the event. Also, student-athletes cannot promote the sale of any commercial products in conjunction with their participation in the event. The commercial establishment cannot advertise the presence of student-athletes at the location nor can the establishment be involved directly or indirectly in promoting the activity.

SCOUTING OF OPPONENTS

FULL-TIME STATUS

- In sports other than football, basketball and volleyball, it is not permissible for coaches to be reimbursed for or CU to pay expenses incurred while scouting opponents. It is permissible for coaches to use personal funds in order to scout.
- In football, basketball and volleyball CU can only pay for expenses related to scouting an opponent in the same tournament as CU's, only at the site where CU is participating.

A student-athlete must be enrolled full-time (12 credits) at all times in order to be eligible for practice, competition and athletic scholarship. There are a few exceptions to this rule:

- SA is enrolled in their final semester and is taking all credits necessary for graduation.
- SA is a graduate student; number of required credits depends on the grad program.
- SA is participating in competition that takes place between terms. SA must have been enrolled full-time in the term preceding the competition.
- SA is participating in competition preceding enrollment. SA must have been accepted for admission and certified as eligible.

Without these exception, if a SA ever drops below 12 credits, they are immediately ineligible!!

DEPARTURE/RETURN EXPENSES

CU may provide travel expenses related to CU competition, provided the SA departs for competition not more than 48 hours prior to the start of the event and remains not more than 36 (24 in men's basketball) hours following the event. The 48/36(24) hour restrictions do not apply in the following circumstances:

- Travel to/from contests in Hawaii or Alaska.
- Travel to/from regular season competition that takes place during an official vacation period (i.e. spring break) or during the summer.
- Travel to NCAA Championships.
- Travel to/from competition that is related to a foreign tour.

**Inclement weather could potentially allow more travel time, if approved.

RECRUITING FUNDS

All necessary expenses incurred by a staff member during a recruiting trip must be paid for by CU. Expense reports must be completed following each recruiting trip. Boosters cannot specifically fund a recruiting trip but with prior approval they could potentially help fund a portion of a recruiting trip.

PHYSICAL CONDITION OF PSA

Institutional financial aid may not be conditioned on the PSA reporting in satisfactory physical condition. If the PSA has been admitted and awarded financial aid, CU is committed to awarding the aid for the term of the award, even if the PSA cannot participate in athletics.

GARA

Countable Athletically Related Activities (C.A.R.A.) include any required activity with an athletics purpose involving student-athletes. These activities are at the direction of, or supervised by, one or more of CU's coaching staff (including strength and conditioning coaches) These must be counted within the weekly and daily limitations. Administrative activities (e.g., academic meetings, compliance meetings, SAAC) shall ***not*** be considered as countable athletically related activities.
