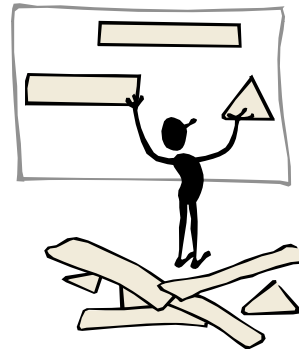

# **NEWLY ADOPTED LEGISLATION**

# PROPOSAL 2010-9

## NCAA MEMBERSHIP – CONTRACTS AND COMMERCIAL AGREEMENTS– WRITTEN POLICIES

•**Intent:** To specify that institutions and conferences shall include language in all licensing, marketing, sponsorship, advertising, broadcast and other commercial agreements that outlines a commercial entity's obligation to comply with NCAA legislation, interpretations and policies on the use of a student-athlete's name or likeness; further, that each institution and conference shall maintain written policies for its licensing, marketing, sponsorship, advertising, broadcast and other commercial agreements.

•**Effective date:** August 1, 2011

# PROPOSAL 2010-15-B

## PERSONNEL– COMPESATION AND RENUMBERATION—INCOME IN ADDITIONA TO INSTITUTIONAL SALARY

•**Intent:** To specify that an athletics department staff member may not serve as a consultant for a noninstitutional athletics event that primarily involves prospective student-athletes and may not endorse or promote such an event; further, to specify that an athletics department staff member shall not promote or endorse a prospective student-athlete's team or coach, or an athletics facility that is primarily used by prospective student-athletes.

•**Effective date: IMMEDIATE**

# PROPOSAL 2010-21

## PERSONNEL- LIMITATIONS ON NUMBER OF OFF-CAMPUS RECRUITERS AT ANY ONE TIME—SPORTS OTHER THAN BASKETBALL

•**Intent:** To specify that during June, July and August, a coach replaced for the purpose of off-campus recruiting activities is not required to return to the institution's campus before engaging in additional recruiting activities, provided no more than the permissible number of off-campus recruiters in the particular sport engage in recruiting activities each day.

•**Effective date: IMMEDIATE**

# PROPOSAL 2010-21

## Example:

- Sport is allowed two permissible coaches off-campus recruiting at one time.
- Coach A is recruiting in Los Angeles on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.
- Coach B is recruiting in Texas on Monday and Wednesday.
- Coach C wants to recruit in Oregon on Tuesday.
- It is permissible for Coach B to stay in Texas on Tuesday and not return to campus before beginning recruiting again on Wednesday, provided no more than two coaches recruit on a specific day.

# PROPOSAL 2010-31

## PERSONNEL AND RECRUITING– RECRUITING COORDINATION FUNCTIONS-CONTACTS, TELEPHONE CALLS AND RECRUITING MATERIALS- COMMUNICTATION AFTER COMMITMENT

•**Intent:** To specify that the restrictions on the forms and frequency of communication between institutional administrators or coaching staff members and a prospective student-athlete (or prospective student athlete's relatives or legal guardians) shall no longer apply beginning the calendar day after: (1) the prospective student-athlete signs a National Letter of Intent (NLI) or a signed acceptance of a written offer of admission and/or financial aid agreement; or (2) the institution receives a financial deposit in response to the institution's offer of admission.

•**Effective date:** August 1, 2011

# PROPOSAL 2010-33

## RECRUITING- CONTACT AND EVALUATIONS- RECRUITING OPPORTUNITIES-WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

- Intent:** In women's basketball, to increase, from five to seven, the number of recruiting opportunities (contacts and evaluations).
- Effective date:** August 1, 2011

# PROPOSAL 2010-38-B

## RECRUITING– RECRUITING MATERIALS-MEDIA GUIDES TO PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES VIA EMAIL

- Intent:** To specify that an institution may only provide a media guide to a prospective student-athlete via an electronic mail attachment or hyperlink.
- Effective date:** August 1, 2011; for media guides produced for the 2011-2012 academic year and thereafter.

# PROPOSAL 2010-41-A

## RECRUITING -- UNOFFICIAL (NONPAID) VISIT -- ENTERTAINMENT/TICKETS -- GENERAL RESTRICTIONS -- NONTRADITIONAL FAMILY

•**Intent:** To specify that if a prospective student-athlete is a member of a nontraditional family (e.g., divorce, separation), an institution may provide up to two additional complimentary admissions to the prospective student-athlete in order to accommodate the parents accompanying the prospective student-athlete (e.g., stepparents) to attend a home athletics event during an unofficial visit.

•**Effective date:** August 1, 2011.

# PROPOSAL 2010-47

## RECRUITING -- USE OF RECRUITING FUNDS -- RECRUITING OR SCOUTING SERVICES -- VIDEO-ONLY SERVICES

•**Intent:** To specify that an institution is permitted to use or subscribe to a video service that only provides video of prospective student-athletes and does not provide information about or analysis of prospective student-athletes, subject to the criteria that permits an institution to subscribe to a recruiting or scouting service, except that the video-only service is not required to disseminate information about prospective student-athletes at least four times a year and is not required to provide individual analysis for each prospective student-athlete in the information it disseminates.

•**Effective date: IMMEDIATE.**

# PROPOSAL 2010-53

**ELIGIBILITY – SEASONS OF COMPETITION: FIVE YEAR RULE –  
DELAYED ENROLLMENT – SEASONS OF COMPETITION –  
SPORTS OTHER THAN MEN'S ICE HOCKEY AND SKIING –  
EXCEPTION – NATIONAL/INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION**

•**Intent:** In sports other than men's ice hockey and skiing, to exempt a prospective student-athlete's participation in organized national/international competition from the application of the delayed enrollment, seasons of competition legislation for a maximum of one year after his or her first opportunity to enroll following the one-year time period after his or her high school graduation date or the graduation date of his or her class, whichever occurs earlier, as specified.

•**Effective date:** August 1, 2011; applicable to student-athletes who initially enroll full time in a collegiate institution on or after August 1, 2011.

# **PROPOSAL 2010-57**

## **ELIGIBILITY -- FRESHMAN AND TRANSFER ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS -- PARTICIPATION PRIOR TO CERTIFICATION -- RECRUITED STUDENT-ATHLETE -- 21-DAY PERIOD**

- Intent:** To increase the temporary certification period for a recruited student-athlete from 14 days to 21 days.
- Effective date:** August 1, 2011.

# PROPOSAL 2010-62

## FINANCIAL AID -- DEFINITIONS AND APPLICATIONS -- EXEMPTED INSTITUTIONAL FINANCIAL AID -- FEDERAL NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID

- Intent:** To specify that federal government grants awarded based on a student's demonstrated financial need are considered exempted institutional financial aid and are not counted in determining the institution's financial aid limitations, regardless of whether the institution is responsible for selecting the recipient or determining the amount of aid, or providing matching or supplementary funds for a previously determined recipient.
- Effective date:** August 1, 2011.

# PROPOSAL 2010-63

## FINANCIAL AID – DEFINITIONS AND APPLICATIONS – EXEMPTED INSTITUTIONAL FINANCIAL AID – STATE NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID

- Intent:** To specify that state government grants awarded based on a student's demonstrated financial need, regardless of whether the institution is responsible for selecting the recipient or determining the amount of aid, or providing matching or supplementary funds for a previously determined recipient is not included in determining the institution's financial aid limitations, provided the aid is administered in accordance with the federal methodology for determining a student's financial need and has no relationship to athletics ability; however, such aid is not exempt in determining a student-athlete's counter status for purposes of applying the football or basketball, varsity competition legislation.

- Effective date:** August 1, 2011.

# PROPOSAL 2010-64

## FINANCIAL AID – DEFINITIONS AND APPLICATIONS – EXEMPTED INSTITUTIONAL FINANCIAL AID – STATE MERIT-BASED FINANCIAL AID

- Intent:** To specify that state government merit-based grants are considered exempted institutional financial aid and are not counted in determining the institution's financial aid limitations, regardless of whether the institution is responsible for selecting the recipient or determining the amount of aid, or providing matching or supplementary funds for a previously determined recipient, provided the aid is awarded consistent with the criteria of the legislative requirements of an academic honor award or institutional academic scholarship and has no relationship to athletics ability; however, such aid is not exempt in determining a student-athlete's counter status for purposes of applying the football or basketball, varsity competition legislation.

- Effective date:** August 1, 2011.

# PROPOSAL 2010-65

## FINANCIAL AID – DEFINITIONS AND APPLICATIONS – RECRUITED STUDENT-ATHLETE

- Intent:** To establish a definition of "recruited student-athlete" for purposes of Bylaw 15, as specified.
- Effective date:** August 1, 2011.

# PROPOSAL 2010-70

## FINANCIAL AID – SUMMER FINANCIAL AID – ENROLLED STUDENT-ATHLETES – EXCEPTION FOR FIRST-TIME RECIPIENT IN THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR

- Intent:** To specify that a student-athlete who has not received athletically related aid from the certifying institution during a previous academic year may receive athletically related financial aid to attend the institution's summer term or summer school, provided the student-athlete has been awarded athletically related financial aid for the following academic year and the aid is awarded only in proportion to the amount of athletically related financial aid the student will receive for the following academic year.
- Effective date:** August 1, 2011.

# PROPOSAL 2010-73

## FINANCIAL AID -- COUNTERS AND EQUIVALENCY COMPUTATIONS -- REQUIRED GRADE-POINT AVERAGE TO QUALIFY FOR EXEMPTIONS OF COUNTER STATUS AND COUNTABLE INSTITUTIONAL AID -- REDUCTION FROM 3.300 TO 3.000

- Intent:** To reduce the necessary cumulative transferable grade-point to exempt institutional financial aid awarded to transfer student-athletes (and the grade-point average at the certifying institution for renewals) and institutional academic scholarships based solely on the recipient's academic record at the certifying institution from team limits from 3.300 to 3.000; further, in football and basketball, to reduce the necessary cumulative grade-point average at the certifying institution to meet the "institutional academic aid only" exception to counter status from 3.300 to 3.000.
- Effective date:** August 1, 2011.

# PROPOSAL 2010-79

## AWARDS, BENEFITS AND EXPENSES – PERMISSIBLE EXPENSES FOR STUDENT-ATHLETE'S FRIENDS AND RELATIVES – COMPLIMENTARY ADMISSIONS TO INSTITUTIONAL AWARDS BANQUETS – ONE-TIME EXCEPTION – PARENTS/LEGAL GUARDIANS

- Intent:** To specify that, on one occasion during the final academic year of a student-athlete's athletics eligibility, an institution may provide complimentary admissions for the student-athlete's parents or legal guardians to attend an institutional awards banquet at which the student-athlete is being honored.
- Effective date:** August 1, 2011.

# PROPOSAL 2010-84

## AWARDS, BENEFITS AND EXPENSES – PARTICIPATION AWARDS – MAXIMUM VALUE OF AWARD – INCREASE TO MAXIMUM VALUES

- Intent:** To increase the limitation on the maximum value of the annual participation award for a senior by \$100 and to increase the limitation on the maximum value for all other participation awards by \$50, as specified.
- Effective date:** August 1, 2011.

# PROPOSAL 2010-84

# **USE OF INSTITUTIONAL FACILITIES**

## BYLAW 13.11.3.2

- **Activities Not Involving Institution's Staff.**
- The use of a member institution's facilities for physical activities by a group that includes prospective student-athletes shall not be considered a tryout, provided the institution's athletics department staff members or representatives of its athletics interests are **not involved in the conduct, promotion or administration of the activity** (other than activities incidental to supervising the use of the facilities) and are **subject to all applicable NCAA recruiting legislation.**

## NCAA EDUCATIONAL COLUMN

- **Use of an Institution's Facilities for Physical Activities by a Group that Includes Prospective Student-Athletes (I, II, III)**
- **Date Published:** August 20, 2007
- For example, while it would be permissible for athletics department staff members or representatives of its athletics interests to open and close the facility, prepare the facility for the event, and perform maintenance on the facility, it would not be permissible for athletics department staff members or representatives of its athletics interests to sell apparel, concessions or tickets for the event, advertise the event, or work at the scorer's table.



## BYLAW 13.11.8

- **Tryout Events.**
- A member institution or conference **may not host, sponsor or conduct a tryout camp, clinic, group workout or combine** (e.g., combination of athletics skill tests or activities) devoted to agility, flexibility, speed or strength tests for prospective student-athletes at any location. An institution or conference shall not host, sponsor or conduct any portion (e.g., instructional clinic) of an event that also includes agility, flexibility, speed or strength tests for prospective student-athletes that are conducted at a separate location. In sports other than football, a member institution's staff members may only attend (subject to sport-specific restrictions) such an event sponsored by an outside organization if the event occurs off the institution's campus and is open to all institutions (see Bylaws 13.1.7.9.4 and 13.1.7.9.5).

## REMINDERS

- Skeleton crew must be used to run facilities.
- Must pay the going rate to rent the facilities and coaches cannot be involved in the rental arrangements.
- All recruiting restrictions apply.
- Be sure to check your recruiting calendar!



## VIOLATION EXAMPLE 1

- Coaching staff was directed to not be involved in any way with team of prospects utilizing campus facilities.
- Coaching staff performed duties beyond administrative duties for the use of facilities.
- **IMPERMISSIBLE!**
- Staff was issued a letter of admonishment and rules education on the topic.



## VIOLATION EXAMPLE 2

- Coaching staff allowed the use of institutional facilities at no charge for a team of prospects.
- Coaching staff also gave a tour of facilities, arranged practice times and set up equipment for the PSAs practice.
- **IMPERMISSIBLE!**
- Staff was issued a letter of admonishment, PSAs were declared ineligible until repayment of extra benefits.

# **PROPOSAL 2009-14-B**

## **PERSONNEL -- DEFINITIONS AND APPLICATIONS -- MANAGER**

- Intent:** To establish criteria by which an individual may serve as a CU manager for one of our teams, as specified.

- Effective date:** August 1, 2010

# **PROPOSAL 2009-14-B**

## **PERSONNEL -- DEFINITIONS AND APPLICATIONS -- MANAGER**

### **Criteria:**

- Must be enrolled **FULL TIME**.
- Cannot provide instruction.
- Limited on-court/field activities.
- Cannot participate in **CARA**.

# PROPOSAL 2009-22

AMATEURISM AND ELIGIBILITY – INVOLVEMENT WITH PROFESSIONAL TEAMS – EXCEPTION – PRIOR TO INITIAL FULL-TIME COLLEGIATE ENROLLMENT – DELAYED ENROLLMENT – SEASONS OF COMPETITION – SPORTS OTHER THAN MSK

- **Intent:** In sports other than SKIING, to specify that prior to initial full-time collegiate enrollment, an individual may enter into an agreement to compete on a professional team and compete on a professional team, **provided the agreement does not guarantee or promise payment (at any time) in excess of actual and necessary expenses to participate on the team;**
- Further, in sports other than SKIING, TENNIS, and WVB to specify that a SA who does not initially enroll full-time in a collegiate institution within 1 year

# PROPOSAL 2009-22

AMATEURISM AND ELIGIBILITY -- INVOLVEMENT WITH PROFESSIONAL TEAMS -- EXCEPTION -- PRIOR TO INITIAL FULL-TIME COLLEGIATE ENROLLMENT -- DELAYED ENROLLMENT --

(six months for tennis) or the next opportunity to enroll following the HS graduation date of the PSA's class and participates in organized events after the specified time period shall be charged with a season of competition for each year of participation AND

shall have to “sit a year in residence” (one year for each year of competition in tennis) on matriculation at the certifying institution before being eligible to compete.

•Effective date: August 1, 2011

## PROPOSAL 2009-22

- **Rationale:** Prior to initial collegiate enrollment, it is more equitable to determine eligibility based on the circumstances as they relate to the individual PSA, as opposed to his/her teammates.
- This revision would alleviate the situation in which a PSA's eligibility is jeopardized due to a teammate receiving remuneration above actual and necessary expenses, even though the PSA may be unaware of this arrangement and does not receive more than actual and necessary expenses for participation on the team.
- Under this approach, an institution would no longer be required to determine whether a team is considered professional. Instead, the focus would be on the individual's specific circumstances and →

## **PROPOSAL 2009-22**

### **•Rationale:**

eligibility would be assessed using the threshold of receipt of more than actual and necessary expenses.

The competitive equity issues related to participation in organized competition would be addressed by applying the delayed enrollment seasons of competition legislation, which currently apply only to tennis, swimming and diving, and WVB.

For tennis, the decrease in the length of time during which PSA may compete in organized tennis will place emphasis on the importance of academics and level the playing field by ensuring relatively similar competitive opportunities prior to college.

# PROPOSAL 2009-33

## RECRUITING -- TELEPHONE CALLS -- EXCEPTION -- UNLIMITED AFTER RECEIPT OF FINANCIAL DEPOSIT

- Intent:** To specify that on or after **May 1 of a PSA's senior year in high school**, there shall be no limit on the number of telephone calls by an institution to the PSA, provided the institution has received a financial deposit in response to the institution's offer of admission.
- Effective date:** Immediate

# PROPOSAL 2009-43

## RECRUITING -- RECRUITING MATERIALS -- ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSIONS -- EXCEPTION -- AFTER RECEIPT OF FINANCIAL DEPOSIT

- **Intent:** To specify that on or after **May 1 of a PSA's senior year in high school**, there shall be no limit on the **forms of electronically transmitted correspondence** that may be sent by an institution to the PSA, provided the institution has received a **financial deposit** in response to the institution's offer of admission.
- **Effective date:** August 1, 2010

# PROPOSAL 2009-72

## AWARDS, BENEFITS AND EXPENSES -- EXPENSES FOR SA'S RELATIVES -- REASONABLE REFRESHMENTS

•**Intent:** To specify that an institution may provide the family (e.g., parents or legal guardians, relatives (brother/sister/grandma, grandpa, etc.) of a SA with reasonable refreshments (e.g., soft drink, snacks) in conjunction with educational meetings or celebratory events (e.g., senior night) and on an occasional basis for other reasons.

•**Effective date:** Immediate
