CAREER NOTES

- 3rd all-time in scoring average at CU (19.0 ppg.) behind Cliff Meely (24.3) and Shaun Vandiver (20.6).
- 7th in free throw percentage (.804) 8th among scoring guards (1,291) 15th in scoring (1,291).
- t-20th in starts (67) t-26th steals (76) 30th in minutes (2,100) 35th assists (165) 40th rebounding (397).
- 397 career rebounds ranks sixth among CU guards 398 made free throws ranks sixth; 495 FT attempts ranks eighth.
- Holds the CU freshman (512) and sophomore (779) scoring records.
- Career-best 36 points (w/ personal-high 12 field goals) in upset win over No. 9/8 Missouri (Jan. 8, 2011) 18th player in school history to score that many in a single game. 36 points was the third highest at the Coors Events Center (since 1979).
- Also scored 33 points in upset victory over No. 5/5 Texas (Feb. 26, 2011).
- 54 games with at least five or more FGs 41 games with 18+ points.
- 39 games shot over 50% from the field 16 games 60+ percent 32 games scoring 20+ points 2, 30+ scoring games.
- 7 double-doubles.
- Led in scoring 38 times (4 shared); rebounding 27 times (9 shared); assists 22 times (9 shared) steals 20 times (11 shared) blocks 20 times (12 shared).
- Three CU Athlete of the Week honors (all in 2010-11).

2010-11 (Sophomore)

- School record points scored in a single-season (779 points) Most free throws single-season (249) and attempts (302).
- First CU player in school history to score over 770 points, 240 rebounds, 100 assists in same season.
- First CU player to average 20 or more points in a season (20.5 ppg.) since 1993-94 (Donnie Boyce, 22.4, 1993-94)
- His 20.5 ppg. ranks ninth all-time in school history for a single season.
- First CU player to make over 200 field goals in a season since 1990-91 251 FGs ranks fifth all-time.
- 535 FG attempts, only the fourth time in school history a player over 500 attempts in a season.
- Second on team in rebounding (247); offensive (91) and defensive (156) rebounding.
- First in scoring (20.5 ppg.) and assists (112, 2.9 apg.) Second in rebounding (6.5 rpg.).
- Led CU in scoring 26 times (1 shared) Led CU in rebounding 13 times (5 shared) Led CU in assists 18 times (7 shared)
- Led CU in steals 14 times (8 shared) Led CU in blocks 13 times (8 shared).
- Recorded 24 games with 20+ or more points Pair of 30+ point games Five double-doubles.
- Tallied 27 games with 18+ points 36 double-digit scoring games.
- Shot over 50 percent from the field in 19 games; six games over 60+ percent.
- 31 games with at least five or more FGs.
- Only the second CU player to average over 20 points, 6 rebounds, and 2.5 assists per game for a season (20.5 ppg, 6.5 rpg, 2.9 apg), joining Donnie Boyce who averaged 22.4 points, 6.7 rebounds, and 4.5 assists in the 1993-94 season.
- 247 rebounds tied for 22nd place on all-time list ranks second all-time among CU guards and sixth of all sophomores.
- 112 assists ranks 24th in season assists and sixth among CU sophomores.
- 41 steals tied for 29th in season steals.
- tied for the most free throws made (11 vs. California) in the NIT.

Only player in the Big 12 to rank in the top-12 in the conference-only games in points (20.0; 2nd), rebounds (7.6; t-3rd), and assists (2.8; 12th) • Second in conference scoring (20.0 ppg.); tied for third in rebounding (7.6); fifth in defensive rebounding (4.9); seventh in free throw percentage (.809); tied for seventh offensive rebounding (2.7); eighth in field goal percentage (.412); 12th in assists (2.8) • Tied two others with the most field goals made in a game (12 vs. Missouri) • Conference high 20 free throw attempts (Texas) • Scored 580 points in 31 games (18.7 ppg.) • His 18.7 ppg. in Big 12-only games ranks fourth overall.

2009-10 (Freshman)

- •Became the first Colorado freshman to surpass 500 points in a single-season (512) and only the second CU freshman to lead his team in rebounding (5.0) since Matt Bullard (6.4, 1985-86).
- Second in team scoring (17.1 ppg.) and field goals made (172); first in rebounding (5.0 rpg.) and FG% (.538); fourth in assists (53); tied for second in steals (35).
- Started all 30 games he played in Missed one game (Kansas, Feb. 3) with a left knee sprain suffered at Iowa St. (Jan. 30).
- 150 rebounds is sixth highest total by a CU freshman Double-figures in 29 games.
- Two double-doubles Season-high 27 points against Missouri (Feb. 6) with a season-high 10 rebounds twice against Miami (OH) (Jan. 5), against Texas Tech (Mar. 10).
- Scored 20+ points eight times.
- Led CU in scoring in 12 games (three shared); Led CU in rebounds in 14 games (four shared); Led CU in assists four times (twice shared) Led CU in steals six times (three shared) Led CU in blocks seven times (four shared).
- 14 games 18+ points, including eight 20+ point efforts.
- 23 games with at least five or more FGs.
- Shot over 50 percent from the field in 20 games, 10 games over 60+ percent.
