COUNTING CONTACT AND EVALS

During the summer, any contact with a prospect must count towards the permissible number of recruiting opportunities. However, any evaluations that occur during the summer do not need to count towards the annual number of recruiting opportunities. Please remember, summer is determined by the individual prospect's school year, not CU's academic calendar.

Coaches are still required to document all summer contacts in your recruiting database (i.e. Scoutware).

RESPONSIBILITY OF HEAD COACH

Per NCAA Bylaw 11.1.2.1, it is the responsibility of an institution's head coach to promote an atmosphere for compliance within the program supervised by the coach. Further, a head coach is expected to monitor the activities regarding compliance of all assistant coaches and other administrators involved with the program who report directly or indirectly to the coach. This is a very common bylaw cited in major infraction reports.

SUMMER PRIZE MONEY

During the summer vacation period and outside of the declared playing season, an individual sport student-athlete (other than golf) may accept prize money based on his/her place finish in an open athletics event. The prize money may not exceed the student-athlete's actual and necessary expenses for the event and may only be provided by the sponsor of the event. Student-athlete's should complete an outside competition form prior to participation and should track their expenses and prize money.

DELAYED ENROLLMENT

In sports other than skiing, a prospect that does not enroll within one year of his/her high school graduation will have to sit for a year and also lose a year of eligibility if they participate in organized competition outside of the one year 'grace period'.

For example:

2008-2009 High School Senior Year

2009-2010 Not enrolled in school

2010-2011 Not enrolled in school

2011-2012 Enrolls at CU

If the prospect participated in organized competition during the 2010-2011 academic year, they would be penalized one season and have to serve a year in residence at CU. They would then have the 2012-13 through 2015-16 academic years to compete for three seasons.

SICKLE CELL TESTING

As a part of the mandatory medical exam, all incoming student-athletes must undergo a Sickle Cell Solubility Test. Only those students who have a previously documented test and those who choose to opt out of the exam per a written release do not need to undergo the exam. This must occur prior to participation in any athletic activities.

CHANGE IN FAFSA STATUS

If a student-athlete and his/her family experience an extreme financial hardship or change, they could potentially receive more governmental grant money. This hardship and financial change must be documented (typically by a W-2) and the student must notify FAFSA in order to qualify for more aid.

ATHLETICS EQUIPMENT

A student-athlete cannot accept athletics equipment, supplies, or clothing from a manufacturer or commercial enterprise. However, if an item is provided to CU directly from a manufacturer or commercial enterprise, and not the athlete, it could be permissible if it goes through the appropriate issuance and retrieval process with the equipment room. Please be sure to remind student-athletes of the necessary procedures to receive athletics equipment.
