# Team Bonding/Entertainment

- Entertainment may be provided to student-athletes in limited situations:
  - Within a 100-mile radius of where a team plays or practices in connection with an AWAY game.
  - Within a 30-mile radius of CU's campus during a vacation period in which student-athletes are required to stay on campus.
- Entertainment costs must be paid for by the institution, we cannot provide cash to the athletes.

# Team Bonding/Entertainment

- Tickets to a professional event are not permissible.
  - Exception: When paid for by an institution or from a booster through CU, they are permissible during an away trip.
  - The tickets cannot come directly from the professional organization.

# Outside Income

- Jo will send out a survey monkey at the end of June/early July.
- It is required per NCAA rules that all professional exempt and coaches complete outside income forms.
- Classified staff do not need to complete the form, unless they are considered a noncoaching staff member.
- Returning volunteer coaches are required to do this as well.

# Outside Income

- Examples of Outside Income:
  - Speaking Engagements
  - Noninstitutional Camps/Clinics
  - Country Club Benefits
  - Training Table Meals
  - Tickets to professional sporting events
  - Ski Passes
  - Free Lodging

# Outside Income

- We recommend keeping a yearly spreadsheet tracking all of the outside income you earn.
- It will save you time in the long run when it comes to completing the survey.

# Social Networking

- Facebook/Twitter
  - You may not comment on or to a PSA via social networking sites.
  - May not comment on the number of commitments you have or where they are from.
  - When out recruiting, you must be very vague regarding the area you are in.
    - PERMISSIBLE- Recruiting in Cali today
    - IMPERMISSIBLE- Recruiting the San Diego Showdown today

- These rules apply to CU specific social networking sites, as well as personal networking sites.
- If you are unsure, please err on the side of caution or call to check first.

# **Pac 12 Rules – Key Points You Need to Know**

## **Nonqualifiers**

- **Cannot initially enroll at Pac-12 institution and ever practice, receive aid or compete at any Pac-12 institution, unless . . .**
- **granted a partially-approved initial eligibility waiver (IEW) by the NCAA (practice and aid for first year) – limit of one (1) in football per year.**

## **Transfers**

- **4-4 who was nonqualifier  
48 credit hours transferable, GPA $\geq$ 2.0, 3 semesters full-time**
- **2-4 and 4-2-4 who was nonqualifier  
meet NCAA rules only**

## **Intraconference Transfers**

- **direct – sits and loses one year, no aid  
does not apply if SA receives no aid at first institution**
- **indirect (4-2-4) – no intraconference consequence**

# Transfers

- Once we have received the permission to contact, they become like a senior PSA.
- After conversations and you know they are strongly considering CU, we can request more information on the PSA – Send the Tracer
- Tracer allows us to determine seasons used, aid received, recruited, aid cancelled, etc.
- Can assess their future eligibility with CU
