QUICKLY: Colorado is looking for its first win in Laramie since Dec. 10, 1996 and are 0-3 since with losses in 1998, 2007, 2012; Margin of defeat is only 5.7 points • CU is receiving votes in the latest AP Top 25 Poll (Nov. 17) with 52 (27th overall) and six votes in the USA Today/Coaches' Poll (36th overall) • CU has allowed their opposition 53.5 ppg. to the lowest opening two-game points total (107 pts.) since 1999-2000 (103 pts., 51.5 ppg.) • Coach Boyle is 1-2 at CU vs. Wyoming.

760 KKZN: Buffs Warm-Up with play-by-play caller Jerry Schemmel (radio voice of the Colorado Rockies) and color analyst Scott Wilke begins at 3:30 p.m. previewing the CU/Wyoming game with a 30-minute pre-game breaking down the match-up, taking a look around the Pac 12, and talking with Head Coach Tad Boyle...followed by the Buffs/Cowboys at 4 p.m. "Voice of the Buffs" Mark Johnson is in Eugene with the CU football team (850 KOA) as the Buffs are taking on the No. 2/3 ranked Ducks.

SCOUTING WYOMING: The Cowboys are 2-0 on the season with a pair victories in three days at home against Northern Colorado (78-70) and Western State (61-46). Larry Nance Jr. is averaging 17 points and eight rebounds a game, while Charlie Hankerson Jr. and Derek Cooke Jr. each average 11.5 a game. Wyoming is shooting 56.8 percent from the field (50-of-88) and averaging seven treys.

WOODEN WATCH LIST: For the fourth time since the 2010-11 men's basketball season, a CU men's basketball player was named to the John R. Wooden Award Top 50 Watch list. Josh Scott, a junior majoring in sociology from Monument, Colo., joins four other CU players who have been nominated. Alec Burks received a nomination during the 2010-11 season and made it as a Top 20 finalist; Spencer Dinwiddie (2013-14), Andre Roberson (2012-13) were also honored with a Top 50 mention, as was, Chauncey Billups, a candidate in 1995-96. Six other athletes from Pac-12 schools were included in the Top 50 nominations for the 2014-15 season.

UP NEXT: The Buffs begin a three-game home stand, in addition to five of the next six games (all 5 on Pac-12 Networks) at the Coors Events Center. The exception is a Dec. 7 match up at Georgia on the SEC Network.

CU-AUBURN RECAP: Xavier Johnson and Josh Scott each scored 17 points, and Wesley Gordon recorded his second career double-double with 16 points and 12 rebounds in CU's 90-59 rout of Auburn in game five of the ESPN Tip-Off Hoops Marathon late Monday night. It was also the 150th head coaching victory for Tad Boyle.

- CU also improved to 62-9 at the Coors Events Center under Boyle, in addition to a 32-1 (.970) home record in non-conference play (Nov./Dec.); and 17-0 during the month of November.
- CU also won its 20-straight non-conference home game dating back to 2011, third longest streak in school history.
- Ironically, CU's lone loss in non-conference home games was to Wyoming, 65-54 (Dec. 9, 2011) ending CU's 27-game home non-conference winning streak (second longest in school history).

GREAT SCOTT!: Josh Scott notched his 16th career double-double against Drexel tying a career-high 21 points with 11 rebounds and three blocks. Against Auburn, he added another 17 points, nine boards, three blocks. He's shooting a 70.6 FG percentage, averaging 19 points and 10 rebounds a game.

CU/Pac-12/NCAA TOURNEY: Since the inception of the Pac-12 Conference in 2011, the Buffaloes are the only team to represent the conference in the last three NCAA Men's Basketball Tournaments.

IN CASE YOU MISSED IT: Against Auburn, CU extended its streak to 401-straight games with a 3-pointer made (dating back to Jan. 19, 2002). The Buffs made a season-best 5 against the Tigers.

- CU shot 65.4 percent from the field in the second half against Auburn (highest of any 2nd half under Boyle). In the last 20 minutes of the game (2nd half), Boyle teams are 10-1 when shooting over 60 percent from the field (lone loss at Arizona, 90-83, ot; Jan. 3, 2013). The previous high was 65.2 against Texas Southern (Mar. 16, 2011).
- CU/Auburn game was the latest ending time at a sporting event in CU history ending (1:11 a.m.). The previous latest finish was at 12:55 a.m. (EDT) in football at Toledo on Sept. 11, 2009. The latest finish in Boulder was at 11:46 p.m. (MDT) in football vs. Florida State on Sept. 15, 2007.
- CU ties for the most consecutive points in a game with 24. It ties with a game vs. Valparaiso on Nov. 27, 1989.

SEASON TICKETS: For the second straight year, the men's basketball program sold out its season tickets allotment. Of the other 11 Pac-12 schools, only Arizona has accomplished this feat.

MORE FIVE YEAR NOTES UNDER BOYLE:

- Coach Boyle is 94-50 record (.653), the fastest coach in school history to win that many in the shortest time.
- 94 wins, the most in any five-year span.
- Winning percentage (.653), best of any CU coach in MBB history (min. 2 years).
- The coaching staff is 62-9 at home (.873).
- 19 home sellouts over four years (14-5).
- CU is an impressive 28-4 (.875) when having 15 or more assists in a game.
- 10-0 when having 20 or more assists.
- The Buffs are 15-3 when a road or neutral court loss follows a home game (.833).
- CU is 25-5 at home (.833) in single-digit home games.
- CU is an impressive 29-0 at home and 42-3 overall (.933) when out-rebounding the opponent AND holding opponent under 40 FG% (three losses: at California twice; at Washington).

FIVE YEARS UNDER BOYLE STAFF:

• CU is 73-13 overall (.849) and 50-2 at home (.962) when outrebounding the opponent {Both losses in 2012-03: UCLA, 78-75 (Jan. 12) 34-32 edge on boards; Arizona State, 63-62, ot (Feb. 16) 41-26 advantage on glass}.

• CU is 55-5 overall (.917) and 35-1 at home (.972) when the opponent shoots under 40 FG% {lone loss: UCLA, Jan. 16, 2014, 39.4 FG%, 69-56}.

Pac-12 PRE-SEASON POLL: The CU men were selected to finish third in the standings in a poll of media members who cover the conference. Arizona was first, followed by Utah, then CU, UCLA, and Stanford in fifth place.

VICTORY LAP: Walk-on Kevin Nelson is in his sixth year academically and his third year with the CU men's basketball team. A non-scholarship student-athlete, Nelson transferred to CU after 2011-12 season from Missouri State University-West Plains. He has played nine career games as a Buff.

BUFFS IN THE NBA: CU is tied for 21st in the NBA with four former players on NBA Rosters (Burks, Copeland, Dinwiddie, Roberson). It's the third straight year, CU has had four former student-athletes playing on opening day NBA rosters.

PRE-SEASON STORY LINES: The CU men's basketball team completed the third phase of the Program (Sept. 26) with the Navy SEALs (<http://buffs.me/1qbDHB0>)

• CU is still a young team; only one senior scholarship player: Askia Booker.

• 4 starters return from last year's team.

• CU returns its top three scorers from last year's team that won 23 games; Josh Scott (14.1ppg.), Askia Booker (13.7) and Xavier Johnson (12.0), in addition its three top rebounders with Scott (8.4 rpg.), Gordon (6.0), and Johnson (5.9).

• In each of his first four seasons, head coach Tad Boyle has won over 20-plus games in each season, a school-first. He's the first CU head coach to guide his teams to four-straight post-season tournament berths, in addition to three-consecutive NCAA Tournaments.

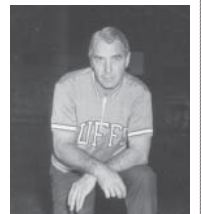

SOX WALSETH COURT: The Coors Events Center basketball floor is named after legendary Colorado basketball coach Sox Walseth in 1996. He is CU's all-time leader in men's basketball victories with 261, then added another 77 victories coaching the CU women from 1980-83, including an impressive 43-0 at home. Walseth is the first at CU and only a few to coach both the men's and women's basketball teams at the same school. With the men, CU won three Big Eight titles and was named conference coach of the year five times (4-Big Eight; 1-Big Seven). He coached 20 different CU teams from 1957-1976. Walseth was inducted into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 1998 and the CU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2002.

HAWAII BOUND: The CU men's team is one of eight teams playing at the 2014 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic this Christmas in Oahu. The CU men's basketball program is not a stranger to the Hawaiian Islands during the first two months of the non-conference season. In Nov. 2009, the Buffaloes competed at the EA Sports Maui Invitational, and in 2008, they participated at the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu. Both tournaments saw the Buffs achieve a 1-2 record.

2013-14 NCAA TOURNAMENT: Seeded eighth in the South Region, it was CU's highest NCAA Tournament seed since the 1997 Tourney when they were ninth in the East Region (defeated Indiana in the first round; then fell to No. 1 seed North Carolina) • CU earned its third straight NCAA Tournament berth, a school record (2011-12 (automatic berth): 3rd Round; 2012-13 (at-large bid): 2nd Round; 2013-14 (at-large bid): 2nd Round.

MORE TOURNAMENT HISTORY: It was CU's 13th NCAA Tournament appearance in its history (10-15, 400) with two Final Fours: 1942 & 1955 • CU last played in the state of Florida for the NCAA Tournament (Tampa) as a No. 10 seed, South Region (2002-03): lost to No. 7 Michigan State • Since 1997 (7 NCAA games since then), CU was the higher seed and wore its lighter color home jersey (instead of home white, they wore their third jersey, silver).

CU IN POSTSEASON: The Buffs are 13-7 in postseason games (9-3 conference, 3-1 NIT, 1-3 NCAA) under Coach Boyle • .650 postseason winning percentage, ranks first in school history • Conference tournament semifinals three of the last four years (Pac-12: 2014

and 2012. Big 12: 2011).

BLOCKS IN A SEASON: Last year was the first time the Buffs had a pair with at least 40 blocks in a season. (Wesley Gordon: 41 and Josh Scott: 40). In 1993-94, Ted Allen had 55, Donnie Boyce, 40.

CONFERENCE PLACING: CU finished tied for third in the final conference standings with a 10-8 mark. However, at the conference tournament, were seeded fifth. CU was the fifth seed in 2012-13; sixth seed in 2011-12 even though they tied for fifth in the overall standings. In the last year in the Big 12, the Buffs were the fifth seed at the conference tournament as well.

UNDER 69.9 POINTS A GAME (when 3-Pt. FG Established): For the first time since the 1978-81 seasons, the Buffs kept the opposition under 69.9 points per game in three-straight seasons (2013-14: 68.2 ppg.; 2012-13: 63.6 ppg.; 2011-12: 63.0 ppg.). The Buffs matched the 1978-79 (66.9), 1979-80 (67.3), 1980-81 (64.5).

CARDIAC BUFFS: Under Tad Boyle (144 games: 94-50), the Buffs have had more than their fair share of close games. In games decided by three points or less in the Boyle Era, CU is 18-8 (5-4 in one-point games, 7-1 in two-point games and 6-3 in three-point games ... and 14-5 against league opponents, 10-4 vs. Pac-12, 4-1 vs. Big 12). And there were 10 overtime games, so that means 36 games ended after regulation with the margin between 0 and 3 points.

FOUR-YEAR BESTS: The Boyle coaching staff over the last four years has won the most games in school history. Here's a breakdown of the top-five classes in school history defined by wins. May 2014 graduate Ben Mills ranks No. 1 among all 4-year CU players. Senior Askia Booker ranks fourth all-time and is steadily moving up the list.

BUFFS TABBED TO FINISH THIRD IN PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL
SAN FRANCISCO – The Colorado men's basketball team was picked to finished third in the 2014-15 Pac-12 Conference men's basketball standings, according to a poll of media members who cover the conference.

Arizona was selected to finish at the top spot for the third year in a row, after garnering all but one first-place vote. Utah narrowly claimed No. 2, with just one more point than third-place finisher Colorado. Both the Utes and the Buffs return four starters from last season.

Last season, CU was also picked third and finished the regular season tying five other teams for third place. The third place conference tally was CU's highest since finishing the 1997 Big 12 Conference season second overall.

Media have correctly picked the Conference winner 13 times in 22 tries. Arizona has correctly been selected in eight of the previous 12 times it has been slated to capture the league crown.

MEN'S BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME: The 10th class of the University of Colorado Athletic Hall of Fame was inducted Thursday, October 30 at the Coors Events Center. Among those inducted for men's basketball was former head coach Frosty Cox and two former greats, Jim Davis and Bob Jeangerard. Of the 68 members and one team (1959 NCAA Ski team) in the CU Hall of Fame, there are nine former men's basketball players and two former head coaches. Players are Ken Charlton (1960-1963), Burdette Haldorson (1952-55), Jack Harvey (1938-40), Billy Lewis (1957-60), Dave Logan (1972-76), Leason "Pete" McCloud (1939-42), Cliff Meely (1968-71); former coach Russell "Sox" Walseth (1946-83).

• **Forrest B. "Frosty" Cox, Basketball Coach (1935-50)**

Cox passed away at the age of 54; his son Forrest "Frosty" Jr., accepted on his behalf. "It's a privilege to be able to represent Dad in accepting this award. This is a tremendous honor for him and our family. We are so proud of his accomplishments here at the University of Colorado. He was a strict on discipline and a perfectionist, and tried to instill those traits into his players both on and off the court. But away from basketball, he was a kind man and a great sense of humor." Cox made mention that several family members went on to attend CU.

• **Jim Davis, Basketball (1961-64)**

"Spider" as he was known by his teammates, opened by congratulating the rest of the class. "I personally feel very, very honored to have this award bestowed upon me. I hope that whatever happens, I will always be a Colorado Buffalo. I am currently living in Canada, but it's a great privilege to be able to travel back here. This was my second home. I want to thank my teammates and all those who helped me earn this honor this evening." He introduced his two roommates, and hoped that they would truly enjoy themselves this weekend, "especially at The Sink." He said he was sold on CU when he woke up the morning of his recruiting trip and saw the sun shining on the Flatirons.

• **Bob Jeangerard, Basketball (1952-55)**

Jeangerard succumbed to complications from Alzheimer's disease this past July at the age of 83; his son, Robert, Jr., represented him. "If my dad was up here accepting this honor tonight, what he would talk about would be his teammates and everything they did for him. The stories that he used to tell us about, everything was about teamwork and dedication. He would tell us about the magic that this university brought him and the opportunity that this university gave him." He spoke about how his father grew up in Chicago during a rough time, but excelled in basketball and baseball and was grateful that CU came along and gave him a chance. He also spoke about his dad's last days, where he still made everybody around him happy despite his nearly decade-long battle with Alzheimer's.

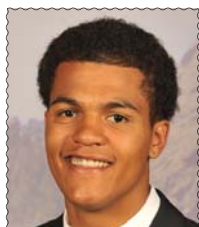

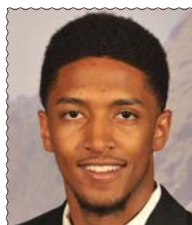
