



2015 PAC-12 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

Post-Game Notes

GAME 10: #4 California (68), #9 Colorado (55)
Saturday, March 7, 2015

California will play for the Tournament championship at 6:00 p.m. PDT Sunday against Stanford. Cal split its two regular season games with the Cardinal; each team won on the other's court. Stanford has won all 6 prior Tournament games with Cal.

Cal has appeared in two Tournament championship games, both times losing to Stanford (2008 and 20012).

Cal's Brittany Boyd had 18 points, 10 rebounds and 7 assists, giving her 38, 20 and 11, respectively for the Tournament. Her double-double was the 12th of the season. For the 3rd time this season, she played all 40 minutes.

Cal had a 16-10 advantage in turnovers caused, leading to an advantage in points off turnovers of 15 (20-5). 10 of the 16 Colorado turnovers came off steals. Cal is now 12-1 when it has at least 10 steals.

Colorado had the better field goal shooting night, .414 to .387. Cal won for the first time in 7 games this season when being outshot.

After falling behind 15-6, California used a 12-0 run to take its first lead. Colorado never led in the regular season CU-Cal contest.

All 7 Bears who played scored and had at least one rebound.

Reshanda Gray, Cal, recorded her 8th double-double of the season (28th career). She is also 14-15 from the free throw line in the Tournament.

Colorado's Lexy Dresl scored in double figures in each of her three Tournament games, (12, 19 and 11). Haley Smith's 4 assists tonight equaled a career high.

Attendance for each of the three semifinal rounds that have been played in Seattle's KeyArena has exceeded 6,000 (2013: 6,152, 2014: 6,073 and 2015: 6,059). These are the three best attended semifinal rounds in Tournament history.
