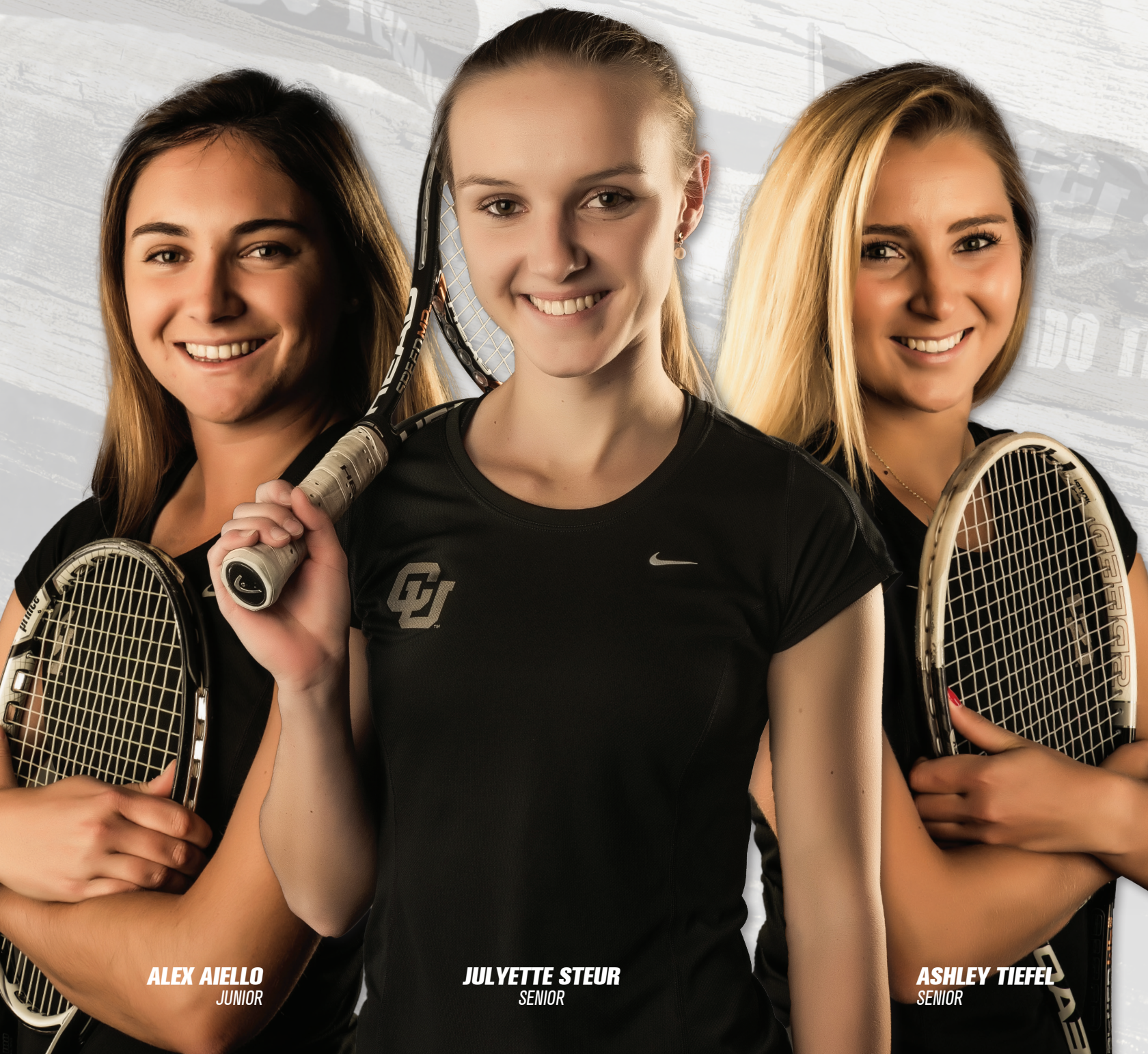

From Boulder - head toward Denver on Route 36 and exit Table Mesa Drive. Go straight through the exit ramp light. Travel down that road and turn right at the fork in the road, turning right again soon after at the green gate. The courts will be on your left and parking to the south.

From Denver - North on I-25 and west on Hwy 36, exit Table Mesa Drive/ South Boulder Road. Take a left at the light. Go under Foothills Parkway and over Hwy 36. After passing over Hwy 36 take a left at the first light. Travel down that road and turn right at the fork in the road, turning right again soon after at the green gate. The courts will be on your left and parking to the south.

From Golden - Take CO-93 North to Boulder. Take a right onto Table Mesa Drive. Turn right at the light (third light on Table Mesa) onto South Loop Drive. It's the last light before the HWY 36 junction (Table Mesa will split; straight goes over HWY 36 bridge; veering right is HWY 36 to Denver). Travel down that road and turn right at the fork in the road, turning right again soon after at the green gate. The courts will be on your left and parking to the south.



NICOLE KENNEALLY

Head Coach • 16TH Year

- 151 career victories (second all-time among CU women coaches)

Nicole Kenneally enters her 16th year as the University of Colorado women's tennis head coach and continues to lead the Buffaloes in one of the elite tennis conferences nationally, in addition, instituting a higher learning of success to her student-athletes on and off the court.

With seven winning seasons to her credit, Kenneally is presently the winningest CU head coach among her team sports peers on campus in terms of wins. She ranks second all-time in school history among women's tennis coaches in victories (151) and third all-time among CU's men's and women's tennis coaches.

Perhaps her best seasons at the helm occurred from the spring seasons from 2007-2009. The 2009 spring campaign, Kenneally guided the Buffaloes to their third straight fourth place or better finish in the Big 12 Conference, and fourth top-four tally over the last six years. Her team performed a school-first, becoming the first tennis team in school history to begin the conference season 5-0.

The previous year in 2008, Kenneally coached her Buffalo team to a No. 57 nationally-ranking, an 8-3 conference record, and a fourth place finish in the Big 12. It was the second straight conference season CU tallied at least eight conference wins.

Kenneally enjoyed her finest campaign in 2007 building the Buffaloes into a NCAA Tournament team, winning 16 matches and finishing the conference season with a 9-2 mark (third overall). Both end of the season records were school-bests since 1999. In addition, Kenneally earned the respect

of her coaching colleagues and her highest honor-to-date, being named the 2007 Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year.

Also during the 2007 dual season, CU equaled its highest national ranking ever during the season (No. 20). The top-20 ranking was the highest national placing of any CU women's team since January of 1981. By season's end, the Buffs wrapped up the 2007 spring with the highest end-of-the-season national ranking at No. 37.



The spring season also saw a pair of upsets over the nation's top-15 (No. 12 William & Mary and No. 14 Baylor). With a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances under her watch (the other in 2003), the 2007 spring

saw then-sophomore Monica Milewski become only the fourth woman in school history to earn a berth into the NCAA Singles Tournament and the first in 22 years. She would go on to earn an All-Big 12 singles first team unanimously by the conference coaches.

She has coached 50 All-Pac-12/Big 12 Academic team selections (36 first team), 25 ITA Scholar-Athletes (equivalent to Academic All-Americans), 15 conference first-team, nine conference position champions, five ITA All-Academic Teams, and two nationally ranked doubles teams that finished among the top-50.

In 2008, Kenneally was awarded the Colorado Professional Tennis Registry's (PTR) Member of the Year. The award is based on efforts to help the game of tennis grow and for being an outstanding member of the PTR organization.

In November 2006, Kenneally earned her most prestigious honor off the court being named the Intermountain Region USTA/ITA Community Service Award. Kenneally was one of 15 coaches honored for significant contributions in developing community-based tennis programs throughout the community.

None bigger than spearheading the Tennis Marathon for Breast Cancer event. The 2012 edition was Kenneally's eighth annual event with all the money raised going to the Boulder Community Hospital Foundation. Over the course of this event, over \$100,000 has been raised.

Prior to her stint in Boulder, the Brisbane, Australia native was an assistant coach at the University of Oklahoma from 1996-1999, helping the Sooners' to four straight Top-50 ITA Collegiate team rankings. She also worked with several OU players who were named to the All-Big 12 first team and qualified for the NCAA's.

Oklahoma finished 16-11 in 1999, wrapping up the season as a runner-up to Texas in the 1999 Big 12 Tournament. At the end of the 1996-97 season, Kenneally was named an ITA Regional Assistant of the Year, one of only six Division I assistant coaches in the nation to receive that honor.

In addition to her coaching expertise, Kenneally has served with many off-the-court responsibilities, including the ITA-Regional Committee, National Operating Committee, ITA Board of Directors, and was named the 2003 coach/manager for the Australian team at the World University Games, but could not attend.

The role of coach was not the only one Kenneally assumed at Oklahoma, as she is regarded as one of the finest players ever to

come out of the OU program. As a freshman at OU playing No. 3 singles, she won the Big Eight conference title. As a sophomore, she repeated the feat in No. 1 doubles. As a senior in 1994, Kenneally won the Big Eight No. 1 singles title, and qualified for the NCAA Tournament in both singles and doubles.

She finished the year with one of the highest honors by being named Big 8 Conference Player of the Year. In the classroom, she was a three-time member of the Phillips 66 Big 8 Academic team, a three-time Sooner Scholar Award winner, and a member of the dean's list honor roll.

Kenneally was awarded the Regional Senior Player of the Year honor, one of six players selected nationally, and finished her career ranked in the top-50 in singles and top-25 in doubles in NCAA play. After college she attained a world ranking on the WTA tour in singles and doubles. Before returning to OU for graduate work, Kenneally had several top singles wins and a tournament victory in doubles.

As a junior player, she was regularly ranked in the top-10 nationally in her age group and also earned an International Tennis Federation world junior ranking. On the Australian junior tennis circuit, Kenneally garnered several top 10 finishes as well as being named to several Australian national teams for high school tennis. In addition to her junior tennis success, Kenneally was a representative throughout her teen years on the 12, 14, 16, and 18 and under junior cups teams.

Kenneally's philosophy for recruiting in Division I tennis is to bring in student-athletes with a strong character, high moral standards and great-spirit.

Milewski would also earn her second NCAA Tournament honor as a redshirt-senior in 2010 becoming the first-ever CU woman to earn a pair of trips to the national tournament in her collegiate career.

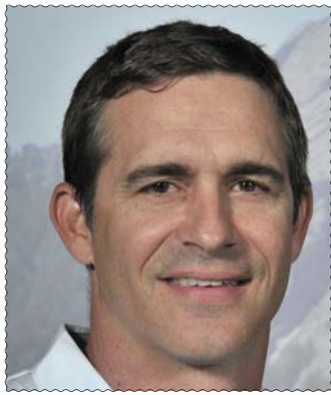

BLAKE MOSLEY

ASSISTANT COACH

Second Year



Blake Mosley enters his second year as an assistant coach with the University of Colorado tennis program bringing 24 years of coaching experience to the Boulder campus.

Mosley spent the 2012-13 school year as an assistant coach at Santa Clara University. The Broncos finished No. 65 nationally with a 12-10 overall record and a program-first, finishing atop of the West Coast Conference standings with an 8-2 mark.

Seven Broncos received WCC Honors for both their athletic and academic achievements, in addition to one of Santa Clara's student-athlete's (Katie Le) becoming the first-ever tennis player in the women's program to qualify for NAAs, and the first player to win a match at the singles championships.

Prior to Santa Clara, Mosley spent five years as the women's head coach at Chaminade University. There he was named 2010 ITA West Region Coach of the Year where the team finished as high as third in the Pac West Conference. In his first year at Chaminade, the team had more wins that season than all previous seasons combined.

Mosley started as a Head Tennis Professional at Padre Isles Country Club in Texas and was an NCAA assistant at Texas A&M Corpus Christi. He also coached and competed in Austria and Switzerland. Mosley has also been certified via the United States Professional Tennis Association at the level of Pro I.

As a player, Mosley was ranked the No. 3 men's player in the Texas Open Division in 1999 before head-

ing to Europe. Starting in 1999, after coaching at Texas A&M Corpus Christi under current Texas A&M head tennis coach Steve Moore, Mosley travelled to Austria to play professionally.

Mosley played No. 1 singles and doubles for TC Goetzens in the Austrian Club League while coaching many rising stars in Austria. In Austria, Mosley was a sparring partner for Sylvia Plischke, who was ranked No. 29 WTA.

Mosley moved on to Switzerland to continue playing and coaching. There he played No. 1 singles and doubles for TC Pfaffikersee. He also served as a travelling coach at the International Tennis Academy in Switzerland and was the sparring partner of Patricia Mayr-Achleitner, who is currently ranked by the WTA.

Mosley played his collegiate tennis at College of Charleston from 1991-95, playing No. 3 singles, No. 1 and 2 doubles.

He completed a Bachelor of Science in Biology in 1996.

A native of Riverside, Calif., Mosley attended Flower Bluff High School in Corpus Christi.

Mosley is married to the former Aline Sartori of Florianopolis, Brazil.





ROBERT STONE

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH

Second Year

Robert Stone enters his second year with the University of Colorado coaching staff serving as the team's volunteer assistant.

He is certified by the United States Tennis Association (USTA) as an Elite Professional, and a certified national coach by the Spanish Tennis Federation.

Prior to CU, Stone was the Director of Competitive Tennis at the Midland Community Tennis Center in Midland, Mich. There he spent four-and-a-half years, training approximately 75 players from ages 8-18. He coached several sectionally and nationally ranked juniors, including four players in the USTA Top 100. Over 80% of the graduates of Stone's competitive tennis program went on to receive college scholarships.

Stone also spent two years at the Nick Bollettieri Tennis Academy in Bradenton, Fla. where he coached four USTA National Champions, and was the head coach of Bollettieri Academy's ITF girls ages 14-18, 10 of which were ranked in the top 50 in the world including Sara Errani and Nicole Pietrangeli.

In addition to his duties at the tennis academy, Stone was the assistant coach for the daily training of the Chinese National Women's Team, and was a hitting partner for professional players including Maria Sharapova, Jelena Jankovic, Daniela Hantuchova, Tommy Haas, Xavier Malisse, Mary Pierce, and others.

Stone also served as the Director of Tennis at Centre Court in Newton, Iowa for two years. There he designed a tennis program for approximately 40 juniors, where he helped mentor several graduates of the program who would later go on to play college tennis, including a pair of Iowa State High School Champions.

He is a 1998 graduate of Iowa State University with a Bachelor of Science degree with conferred honors, and a 2009 graduate at the University of Nebraska College of Law (J.D. conferred with honors).

Stone is currently a 2014 MBA Candidate in the University of Colorado-Leeds School of Business.

this season the CU pair was teamed with one another • Advanced to 2014 USTA/ITA Mountain Regional singles Round of 16 for the second straight fall season • Teamed with freshman Kyra Wojcik to win the Mountain Regional doubles title; it was the first time this season the CU pair was teamed with one another • Will play the No. 1 singles position in the spring for the third consecutive season for the Buffaloes.

Career: Three-Year letterwinner • Ranks on both the career singles and doubles lists in school history • No. 26 in doubles (43) and No. 32 in singles (49) • 10 of her 49 singles wins are in three sets • Five victories rallying from a set down • Ranks 27th in school history with 92 combined singles (49) and doubles (43) victories.

2014 Spring (junior): Named co-Most Valuable Player after winning a team-best 12 dual singles matches at the top singles position • Named the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Mountain Region Player of Watch in May 2014 for next season • Played her second straight spring season at the No. 1 singles position • Won the third most matches (18) for the year • Pick up a pair of Pac-12 Conference singles wins over senior Alice Duranteau (Cal) in the consolation round of the conference tournament; also defeated then-No. 116 junior Elizaveta Luzina (Washington State) in three sets after losing first set (Luzina and Duranteau won 29 and 28 singles matches, respectively during 2013-14) • Played against 11 nationally ranked opponents at the No. 1, five of them among Top 26 • Two-time CU Athlete of the Week Winner (Jan. 27-Feb. 2; Feb. 24-Mar. 2) • Teamed with junior teammate Ashley Tiefel for a team-high 14 doubles wins.

2013 Spring (sophomore): Named the team's overall most improved player and most improved in fitness at the end of the season banquet • Played the No. 1 singles position tying a team-best win total of 16, including 11 in spring play (second highest), easily topping her mark of nine (seven in the spring) the season before • All but three of her victories in spring play were in straight sets • At the top singles spot, defeated three straight Pac-12 opponents • Victories include wins over No. 102 Nicole Long (Oregon); Liudmila Vasilieva (Washington State: all-time singles leader); and Andjela Nemcevic (Washington) • 14 doubles wins during the season, ranked third overall • Clinched the doubles point with Sanders against Santa Barbara (Feb. 15) and Loyola Marymount (Feb. 17) • Upset the ITA's No. 71 ranked team of Douglas-Miron/Shimizu (Washington) on April 7.

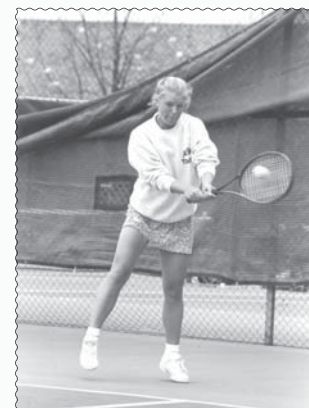
