GAME NOTES: COLORADO BUFFALOES (0-0-1) vs. STANFORD CARDINAL (0-0-0), SEPTEMBER 6, 1990

Special Welcome... to the Stanford contingent headed by Athletic Director Andy Geiger and Sports Information Directors Gary Migdol and Steve Raczynski...we'd also like to welcome ESPN-TV, making their first trip to Boulder this year, as well as Big Eight Commissioner Carl James, Pac-10 Assistant Commissioner Kirk Hendrix, and Harper Davidson from the Orange Bowl Committee...we're glad to have you with us this evening for our home opener, along with all of our regulars joining us again this season...if we can be of any assistance to you, please don't hesitate to ask.

The Game... Colorado (0-0-1, ranked 6th in AP, 7th in UPI and CNN/USA Today) vs. Stanford (0-0) in the Buffs home opener and the Cardinal season opener... ● CU is shooting for its first victory of the year after tying Tennessee, 31-31, in the Disneyland Pigskin Classic on Aug. 26... ● The Buffs are also looking to extend their home winning streak to nine games, carrying over from both the 1988 and 1989 campaigns... ● This evening's game is being televised live by ESPN-TV with the announcing chores being handled by Mike Patrick (play-by-play) and former Oklahoma Sooner quarterback Steve Davis (color commentary)... ● In addition to national TV, the contest will also be on Mutual Radio, with Tony Roberts (play-by-play) and Jack Snow (color) in the broadcast booth... ● KOA-Radio (850 am in Denver) originates the 26-station CU Football Network...Larry Zimmer is the Buffs' play-by-play voice, while Kent Groshong serves as the color analyst.

The Crowd... On Wednesday night, approximately 1,500 tickets still remained...it is expected that the game will be a sellout and a capacity crowd of 51,463 will be on hand...should the game in fact sellout, it will be the first for a Buff home opener since Sept. 9, 1972 when 50,751 were in the stands for the CU-California game (capacity then was 50,000).

The Coaches... Colorado head coach Bill McCartney (Missouri '62) is in his ninth season at Colorado...his overall record at CU stands at 46-45-2 (.505 pct.), while his career coaching slate is the same...McCartney is 39-20-1 (.658 pct.) over the last five seasons, and 32-11-1 (.739 pct.) since the start of the 1986 Big Eight Conference season...currently, he is fifth in longevity (eight-plus seasons) and games coached (93)...Mac owns a 1-0 record vs. Stanford... ● Stanford head coach, Dennis Green (Iowa '71) is in his second season at Stanford, posting a 3-8-0 (.273 pct.) record...he has a 13-53-0 (.197 pct.) mark in seven seasons as a head coach.

Post-Game Press Conference... with Bill McCartney will be held in the southeast meeting room of the CU team house following a 10-minute cooling-off period after the game...the Buff locker room is open to the media...members of the CU Athletic Media Relations office will be available in the locker room to assist in arranging interviews.

The Series... This is only the fourth time these two clubs have met, with Colorado holding a 2-1 edge... ● The Buffs came away with a 31-17 victory the last time these two squared off, a game played in Boulder on Sept. 19, 1987... ● The first meeting between two of the top academic schools in Division I was in 1904, with Stanford winning 33-0 in Palo Alto, Calif.... ● They did not meet again until 1977, when CU won 27-21 in Boulder (the season opener for both teams)...in that game, former Buff linebacker, Brian Cabral, now an assistant coach with the Buffs, intercepted a pass in the end zone late in the game to stop a Stanford drive that might have led to the winning TD... ● The next two meetings in the series will both be at Stanford, Sept. 28, 1991, and Sept. 18, 1993.

Colorado vs. the Pacific Ten Conference...The Buffs are 29-24-1 against teams from the Pac-10 Conference, having posted victories in the last four match-ups...those games included wins over Washington (1989), Oregon State in 1988, and Stanford and Washington State in 1977... ● The Buffs have had the most success against Arizona from the Pac-10, owning a 12-1 mark... Here are the Buffs' marks against other Pac-10 teams: 2-1 vs. Stanford, 2-1 vs. Washington State, 6-6 vs. Oregon, 3-3-1 vs. Washington, 2-2 vs. California, 2-3 vs. Oregon State, 0-3 vs. Southern California, and 0-4 vs. UCLA.

The Buffs on National TV... This evening's game marks the 28th time that the Buffs have played before a national television audience... ● All told, CU is 11-15-1 on national TV... ● Here's a breakdown of the Buffs' national television appearances (since 1951):

Folsom Field Streak on the Line... In the summer of 1989, the 11-year-old artificial turf at Folsom Field was removed and replaced with a new carpet of AstroTurf-8... ● All three times that the AstroTurf has been replaced at Folsom Field, the Buffs have posted wins in the first game played on the new carpet...in fact, when the turf was replaced in 1971, the Buffs went undefeated at home that year (carried over into 1972 season for nine-straight victories) and in 1978, CU opened with five wins in-a-row at home... ● Last season, the Buffs went 6-0 at home to record another undefeated season at Folsom Field.

Another Streak on the Line... With last year's 6-0 home mark, and two home victories to close out 1988, the Buffs are shooting for their ninth straight home win (the last CU home loss was 17-14 to Oklahoma in 1988, a night game carried by ESPN)... ● The CU record for most consecutive home victories is 12 (1895-1898)... ● The last time CU won nine straight at home was from 1974-76... ● Here's a look at CU's last eight Folsom Field wins:

Folsom Field Capacity Crowds... The Buffs have had 10 50,000-plus crowds at Folsom Field during the 1980s (33 all-time)...the most recent sellouts were last year's Missouri (51,855) and Nebraska (52,877) games... ● Of the 10 50,000-plus crowds in the '80s, six were against Nebraska, two against Oklahoma, one against Missouri... ● The last time CU soldout against a non-conference opponent was vs. Notre Dame in 1983 (52,692)... ● Colorado posts a 17-16 mark all-time in front of 50,000-plus crowds... ● Here's a look at Colorado's 50,000-plus crowds during the 1980s:

Colorado Notes...

- The Buffs are 12-0-1 in their last 13 regular-season games, and still have the longest undefeated streak in the nation...last year, CU was the only undefeated regular-season team in college football, going 11-0 before losing to Notre Dame in the Orange Bowl.
- CU has won it's last 12 games that have been played on artificial turf.
- Colorado is 27-2-1 since 1985 in games when it has rushed for 300 or more yards (12-0 when gaining 400-plus on the ground).
- Also since 1985, the Buffs are 30-2-1 in games when it has held the edge in time of possession.
- CU is 31-0-1 in its last 32 games when leading after three quarters, and has won 29 straight regular-season games when leading at halftime.

Colorado Notes (cont.)...

- In Bill McCartney's tenure at CU, the Buffs are 34-12-1 when scoring first, and 12-32-1 when the opponent has drawn the first blood.
- Colorado has allowed 40 or more points only twice in the last five-plus seasons (spanning 60 games)...Oklahoma State was the culprit both times.
- Only Oklahoma State and Tennessee have been able to score more than 30 points on the CU defense in the Buffs' last 45 games.
- The Buffs are one of 26 teams in NCAA history to record 500 victories...with an overall record of 521-339-33, CU currently stands 25th on the all-time victory list...their .602 winning percentage puts them 28th on that ledger...the only other two teams from the Big Eight Conference to rank ahead of CU are Nebraska and Oklahoma.
- Colorado is in its 55th season at Folsom Field (originally called Colorado Stadium)... ● CU's overall record on the "hilltop" stands at 213-109-8 (.667).
- Head Coach Bill McCartney began this season fifth in coaching longevity at Colorado...his 92 games is topped by only Eddie Crowder (119), Dal Ward (110), Fred Folsom (102) and Myron Witham (96).
- On a sad note, the last time Colorado took on Stanford (Sept. 19, 1987), CU's live mascot Ralphie II past away following the game...she died of a combination of failing health, old age and a bad heart...the new Ralphie III was pressed into action just a few weeks later against Missouri (Nov. 7, 1987).

Buffalo Injuries... Colorado suffered no major injuries in the Tennessee game, and the Buffs are at full strength for this evening's home opener.

Colorado Player Notes...

- The Rotary Lombardi Award announced its 1990 nominees for the college football lineman of the year on Sept. 5...of the 12 candidates announced, there are three Buffs listed...the CU representatives are OG Joe Garten, OLB Kanavis McGhee, and OLB Alfred Williams.
- For the first time since 1958, Colorado is appointing its captains for each game...this season, Bill McCartney and his staff are selecting four seniors to serve as captains for each of the five non-conference games...once that portion of the schedule is over, the team will vote on the captains for the remainder of the season...OG Joe Garten, OT Mark Vander Poel, OLB Kanavis McGhee and OLB Alfred Williams were selected for the Pigskin Classic...this evening's captains are FB George Hemingway, P Tom Rouen, CB Dave McCloughan and OLB Paul Rose.
- WR Mike Pritchard, who turned running back for the Tennessee game, rushed for 217 yards in that contest...that was good for the sixth-best all-time effort ever by a CU back...it was also the 10th time that a Buff player has rushed for 200-plus yards in a game, and "Pritch" became the eighth different player to do it... ● He also set a school record for most yards gained in a season-opener, breaking the old mark of 174 by Charlie Davis against Louisiana State on Sept. 11, 1971.
- SS Tim James, OT Mark Vander Poel and OLB Alfred Williams have all started 24 straight games, the longest current streaks on the team.

Colorado Player Notes (cont.)...

- OG **Joe Garten** now has 33 career starts, seven shy of breaking the school record of 39 held by Mickey Pruitt (now of the NFL's Chicago Bears)...Garten has started every game of his career, but missed a game as a sophomore due to a sprained ankle.
- Four of Colorado's 25 seniors have already earned their sheepskin and are enrolled in graduate courses this fall...CB **David Gibbs** and CB **Dave McCloughan** (both marketing majors) are enrolled in CU's M.B.A. program, while TE **David Brown** and SS **Tim James** (both sociology majors) will be taking graduate courses in criminology.
- P **Tom Rouen**, the nation's leading punter (net and gross) in 1989, opened his senior year right where he left of his junior campaign...he punted five times at the Pigskin Classic for a 40.6 average (40.0 net), including two boots of 51 and 50 yards...he is bidding to repeat as a consensus All-American and all-Big Eight selection, as CU punters have won all-league accolades each of the last five seasons and All-America honors in four of those five years.
- The average Buff this year (based on the 120 active roster players) stands 6-1 1/2 and weighs 217 pounds...the total height of the team is 8,814 inches, or 734 1/2 feet, while the total weight is 25,995 pounds, or 13 tons.
- A major reason for CU's improvement and success over the past three years (the Buffs are 26-9-1 during that span) has been due to the return of the dominating lines on both sides of the ball... ● The offensive line has averaged 6-5 in height in each of the last three years, while playing to about the same weight... ● The defensive line has had more of a fluctuation, and sums in at 6-2, 280 this season (the 280 pounds is a team record)... ● Here's a comparison of CU's lines the past decade (1990 figured by the the starters in this evening's game:

Last Year... Colorado finished the regular season with an 11-0 mark, the nation's only undefeated team, and won its first Big Eight title since 1976...the Buffs attained their first-ever No.1 national ranking, and had a shot at the national championship, only to come up short in a 21-6 loss to Notre Dame at the Orange Bowl... ● Stanford posted a 3-8-0 record in its first year under head coach Dennis green.

Elsewhere in the Big Eight... Although there are no other games on tap for this evening, the rest of the Big Eight will be in action (non-league) this weekend (most of the teams with their season opener)... ● Here's a look at what to expect: Northern Iowa at Iowa State, Oregon State at Kansas, Texas Christian at Missouri, Northern Illinois at Nebraska, Oklahoma at UCLA, Oklahoma State at Florida, and Western Illinois at Kansas State.

From Here... The Buffs will travel to Champaign, Ill., on Sept. 15, where they'll take on the Illinois Fighting Illini, who will be trying to avenge a 38-7 loss to the Buffs in 1989...kickoff is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. (mountain) and the game will be televised live by ABC-TV... ● Stanford remains on the road, opening the Pac-10 portion of their schedule at UCLA...kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. (pacific).
