SERIES RECORD: The Disneyland Pigskin Classic marks the first meeting between Tennessee and Colorado.

1989 SEASON: Tennessee finished the 1989 season with an 11-1 record, tied for the Southeastern Conference Championship with a 6-1 mark and defeated Arkansas 31-27 in the 1990 Mobil Cotton Bowl Classic. The Vols ended the season ranked fifth in the final wire service polls. Colorado also compiled an 11-1 mark, claimed the Big Eight Conference Championship with a 7-0 record and lost to Notre Dame 21-6 in the 1990 Orange Bowl. The Buffaloes were ranked fourth in the final wire service polls.

VOL/BUFF GAME NOTES

VOLS-BUFFS TO MEET FOR FIRST TIME

Tennessee and Colorado will meet for the first time when they clash in the inaugural Disneyland Pigskin Classic in Anaheim, Calif. The game marks the Vols second appearance in a special preseason classic. UT appeared in the fifth Kickoff Classic on August 30, 1987, in East Rutherford, N.J., and defeated Iowa 23-22. The Vols went on to a 10-2-1 record and defeated Indiana 27-22 in the Peach Bowl.

INITIAL ENCOUNTER

Tennessee Head Coach Johnny Majors and Colorado Head Coach Bill McCartney will face each other on the field for the first time in their coaching careers when their teams square off in the Pigskin Classic. The two coaches carry a combined 196 victories and 30 years of experience into the contest.

VOLS IN SEASON OPENERS

In its 100 years of football, Tennessee has put up some impressive numbers in season openers. Since 1891, the Vols own a 67-21-5 (.747) record in season openers. UT has participated in eight season starters that have taken place at a neutral site and holds a 6-2 (.750) mark in neutral site openers. The Vols are 4-1-1 in their last six openers.

MAJORS IN SEASON OPENERS

In his 22 years as a head coach, Johnny Majors has recorded a 12-8-2 (.591) mark in season openers. While at Tennessee, Majors holds a 5-7-1 (.423) record in season openers, 3-5-1 at home, 1-2 on the road and 1-0 at a neutral site.

MAJORS VS. COLORADO

As the head coach at Iowa State from 1968 to 1972, Johnny Majors faced Big Eight Conference foe Colorado five times and did not fare too well. Under Majors, the Cyclones went 0-5 against the Buffaloes losing by scores of 28-18 ('68), 14-0 ('69), 61-10 ('70), 24-14 ('71) and 34-22 ('72).

VOLS VS. THE BIG EIGHT

Tennessee has squared off against a Big Eight opponent five times in its 100-year history. The Vols hold a 4-1 (.800) edge in games against Big Eight teams. UT shut out Oklahoma in the Orange Bowl 17-0 in the National Championship year of 1938, defeated Kansas 28-27 in 1973 and 17-3 in 1974 and nipped Iowa State 23-21 in 1982. The Vols' only Big Eight loss came in the 1968 Orange Bowl when Oklahoma outscored UT 26-24. Johnny Majors' record versus the Big Eight is 11-26-1 (.303). However, 25 of those losses came in the five years Majors was head coach at Big Eight member Iowa State.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'?

The Vols have played six games in the state of California and have managed a record of 1-5 (.167). Their only success came recently when the Vols outplayed UCLA 24-6 in Pasadena in the second game of last season.

"100 YEARS OF VOLUNTEERS"

The 1990 football season marks the 100th anniversary of Tennessee football. UT has compiled 600 victories, won two national championships, claimed 10 Southeastern Conference titles and made 30 bowl appearances. The Vols' overall record is 600-267-51 (.681) in 918 games.

VOLS LOOK TO CONTINUE WIN STREAK

Tennessee enters the 1990 season with a six-game winning streak. The Vols have won 16 of their last 17 games over the last two seasons. UT's last loss came last season on Oct. 21, in a 47-30 loss to Alabama in Birmingham.

WEBB WATCH

Sophomore tailback Chuck Webb plans to pick up this season where he left off last season. In 1989, Webb was selected as a first team All-Southeastern Conference running back, named SEC Freshman of the Year and compiled 1,236 rushing yards, the second highest single-season total in Tennessee history. Webb set the highest UT single-game rushing total when he romped for 294 yards on 35 carries against Mississippi. Webb's 1989 rushing totals ranked second in the SEC and eighth nationally.

Coaches' Comments

TENNESSEE COACH JOHNNY MAJORS: "I think we should be honored to be selected for the Inaugural Pigskin Classic. I strongly believe having Colorado as our season opener will be one of the biggest challenges I've ever had to face in my entire athletic career. They're a great football team, and we'll have to play extremely well to have a chance to win the ballgame."

COLORADO COACH BILL MCCARTNEY: "Tennessee might be the best team we're going to play. They've won 16 of 17 playing in what is generally thought to be the toughest conference in college football today, and they have 17 starters back. This will be a real tough opener, as tough as they get, but you have to like this kind of challenge to open the season."

OFFENSE: The Vols run a multiple set offense under the direction of quarterback *Andy Kelly*. Kelly has several outstanding backs to work with in *All-SEC running back Chuck Webb, Tony Thompson, Roland Poles and Greg Amster*. The talented receiving corps include *Carl Pickens, Alvin Harper and Anthony Morgan*.

DEFENSE: The Vols line up in a 4-3 defensive formation. *Linebacker Darryl Hardy* returns as the team's leading tackler and tackle *Mark Moore* and end *Kacy Rodgers* patrol the line of scrimmage.

KICKING GAME: Punter--*Redshirt freshman Joey Chapman* takes over the punting chores from *All-SEC punter Kent Elmore*, unless Majors turns to QB *Andy Kelly*. Placekicker--*Greg Burke* (13 of 15). Punt Returns--*Carl Pickens* (4 for 11.5 avg.). Kickoff Returns--*Carl Pickens* (26 for 22.8 avg.).

DEFENSE: Colorado plays in a 3-4 defensive set. Leading tacklers *Alfred Williams* and *Kanavis McGhee* return for their senior years. All-conference nose tackle *Joel Steed* also adds strength to the defense.
