2011-2012 NFFCC NEWS & NOTES

ADAMS STATE COLLEGE (5-3, 3-3 RMAC)

Trevor Eggleston (Junior, Quarterback, 6-2, 200, Phoenix, Ariz./Glendale CC/Washington HS)

Eggleston completed 25-of-41 passes (60.9 percent) on Saturday to lead the Grizzlies over the Skyhawks, 46-0. The junior threw for three touchdowns and zero interceptions, while completing passes to seven different receivers for 275 yards. Eggleston also rushed three times for 34 yards, the Grizzlies' third highest total in the game.

Team Notes: Adams State recorded its highest point total of the 2011 season on Saturday, taking a win in its annual Musket Game against Fort Lewis in Durango by a 46-0 score. Senior running back Terjean Saffold recorded two first quarter touchdown runs for the second straight week, while junior safety James Ackel found his way into the end zone for his fifth two-point conversion of the season. Junior quarterback Marc Amos completed his first touchdown pass of the season late in the game. The ASC defense allowed less than 200 total yards for the third time this season, and for the third time held an opponent to less than 25 yards rushing. The Grizzlies reclaimed the Musket after having lost it last season for the first time since 2006. The win was the Grizzlies largest road victory and most points scored away from Rex Stadium since a 55-7 win at Oklahoma Panhandle State on Nov. 4, 2006.

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (2-6, 1-5 RMAC)

Trevor deBraga (Junior, Defensive Back, 5-11, 190, Fallon, Nev./Sioux Falls/Churchill County)

deBraga had a career high 17 tackles at No. 8 CSU-Pueblo. He led all players in tackles and had a game high eight solo tackles. deBraga is third on the team with 65 total tackles and second overall in solo tackles (30). He has one interception on the year, and he has one recovered fumble and 4.0 tackles for loss yardage.

Team Notes: Freshman Jordan Price tied a school record with his 100-yard kickoff return. It was the first kick return this year for Price. CMU registered an interception in the game and has had at least one interception in five of the eight games played. Trevor deBraga's 17 total tackles ties a season high for tackles in a game (tied with his brother; Trent deBraga vs. UNK). The four interceptions' by CSUP's is an opponent high. CMU will travel to Western State this Saturday.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (6-2, 4-2 RMAC)

Clay Garcia (Senior, Quarterback, 6-0, 210, Alamosa, Colo./Alamosa HS)

Garcia threw for 319 yards and three touchdowns completing 27-of-39 passes as he led the Orediggers to a 48-33 victory over Western State. It was the fourth consecutive game in which Garcia has thrown for over 300 yards and the sixth time in eight games this season. He threw three touchdowns to three different receivers. Garcia also scored a rushing touchdown in the win. His longest touchdown pass of the game was a 49-yard strike to Jordan Ward.

Team Notes: Dan Palmer rushed for 71 yards and three touchdowns in the game to bring his season total to 15 touchdowns this season. Diamond Gillis caught a game-high nine passes for 112 yards. Gillis finished the game with 205 all-purpose yards. Jordan Ward finished with five catches and 81 yards. Matt Brown and Eric Shannon both caught touchdown passes. Jarrad McKay led Mines with eight tackles (1.5 for loss). Justin Neal and Henry Kaetzer both had interceptions and seven tackles each.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (3-4, 1-1 MWC)

Team Notes: The Ram lost 31-17 at Texas-El Paso. They will play their second straight game on the road this Saturday against UNLV.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY-PUEBLO (8-0, 6-0 RMAC)

Roger Pfannenschmid (Junior, Tight End, 6-3, 250, Pueblo, Colo./Centennial HS)

Pfannenschmid set a career high with two touchdown receptions in a 27-7 home win over Colorado Mesa Saturday night. His longest catch of the game was for seven yards. Pfannenschmid recorded 11 receiving yards on two passes.

Team Notes: CSU-Pueblo earned its second consecutive win over Colorado Mesa for just the fourth time in school history. The win, combined with a loss by Washburn, made its 12-game winning streak (dating back to last season) the longest in all of Division II. CSU-Pueblo is off to its second 8-0 start in school history, its first coming in 1980 (the only time the ThunderWolves won the RMAC title).

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (2-6, 1-5 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Skyhawks were shutout at home in the annual Musket game with Adams State, 46-0. The Skyhawks will play at Chadron State this weekend for a 12 p.m. kickoff.

2011-2012 NFFCC NEWS & NOTES

UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY (3-4, 0-3 MWC)

Team Notes: Air Force uses game captains. The captains for the Boise State game were Kevin Jablonsky, Joshua Freeman, Kevin Whitt and Josh Hall. Air Force has scored in a school-record 227 consecutive games dating back to the 1992 Liberty Bowl. The streak is the fourth longest active streak in the nation and 13th longest streak in NCAA history. Air Force has scored a rushing touchdown in 28 consecutive games dating back to Navy on Oct. 3, 2009. Air Force was held scoreless in the first quarter for just the second time this season and first time since the TCU game Sept. 10. Air Force's first-quarter touchdown marks the first score off an opponent's turnover since the TCU game Sept 10. Air Force's 17-play, 90-yard touchdown drive in the second quarter is the longest in terms of yards this season. The 17 plays is the second longest and most since an 18-play drive at Notre Dame. Alex Means' blocked PAT in the second quarter is the fifth by Air Force this season. The five blocks are the most in a single-season in the Troy Calhoun era (2007-11) and most since blocking seven in 2006. The block is the 16th under Calhoun and 114th overall for Air Force since 1990. Air Force has not allowed opponents to score on its opening drive of the season half this season. The Falcons have forced six punts and recorded an interception. Air Force is 1-2 this season and 22-6 overall under Troy Calhoun, when having a 100-yard rusher.

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (1-7, 0-4 PAC 12)

Darragh O'Neill (Freshman, Punter, 6-2, 180, Louisville, Colo./Boulder Fairview HS)

In Colorado's 45-2 loss to Oregon, O'Neill punted 12 times for a 43.2 average, with a net of 40.3; the average yardline of his punts was the CU38. He set school records with six inside-the-20 and four inside-the-10 (two of those inside-the-5), as Oregon's average starting field position after his kicks was its own 23. Four of the kicks traveled 50-plus yards.

Team Notes: The Colorado-Oregon series is now tied at 8-8 (CU leads 4-3 in Boulder, where UO has won the last two). Colorado's last three games have all taken under three hours to play (2:53, 2:53, 2:58). Oregon's 293 yards in the first quarter was the second most ever against CU in a single quarter; Oklahoma had 312 in the third quarter On Oct. 4, 1980. Oregon gained 527 total yards; that's three straight games CU has allowed 500 or more, the first time that has occurred since the 1983 season. CU has also allowed over 30 points in five straight games for the first time since doing so six in a row in 2003. Oregon's 371 rushing yards were the most against the Buffs since Iowa State had 377 in Ames on Nov. 20, 1993. Kenyon Barner's 84-yard touchdown run tied for the third longest rushing play ever against Colorado (and the seventh from scrimmage); the longest run ever against CU was by Kansas' Walter Mack (90 yards) in Boulder on Nov. 15, 1980. Terrel Smith's tackle for a safety averted the first home shutout for CU since Nov. 15, 1986 (a 28-0 loss to Oklahoma); the last time the Buffs did not score at least one touchdown at home was on Sept. 16, 2006 (a 21-3 loss to Arizona State); the last time the offense did not score at Folsom was on Oct. 30, 2004 (a 31-7 loss to Texas; CU's touchdown was on an interception return by Terrence Wheatley); the last time CU's only points in a game came on a safety was on Nov. 14, 1914 in a 6-2 loss to Colorado Mines in Denver (the only other game in CU's 1,157-game history its only points came via a safety). Two players made their first career starts against Oregon: safety Kyle Washington and defensive back D.D. Goodson (who started at nickel); that's now 18 players making their first career starts for CU this season. In eight games at the four standard defensive back positions (CB/FS/SS/CB), Colorado has now started nine different players; six started at those four spots in both 2009 and 2010 (eight different players combined). Colorado has now played 15 true freshmen in 2011 with tailback Malcolm Creer and Goodson seeing the field versus Oregon for the first time. That ties the Buffs with Tennessee for the fifth-most true frosh to play in 2011. Goodson "auditioned" for the defense for four snaps in 7-on-7 drills in Tuesday's practice, and then moved there full time Wednesday; so he had all of two full practices after being on offense (TB) the entire fall.

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO (0-8, 0-6 BSC)

Team Notes: Northern Colorado fell at home, 31-21 against Montana State. The Bears will play host to North Dakota this Saturday for a 1:35 p.m. kickoff.

WESTERN STATE COLLEGE (1-7, 1-5 RMAC)

Team Notes: Western State finished with season-highs in rushing yards, total offense and scoring in a 48-33 loss to nationally-recognized Colorado Mines last Saturday. The 172 rushing yards was the best since Oct. 16, 2010, and the 441 total offensive yards and 33 points were the best since Sept. 29, 2009. Jamie Jensen passed for 200 yards for the fourth time in the last five games with 249 yards and four touchdowns on 21 completions. The touchdown passes tied him for sixth in program single-game records in the best performance since 2009. He completed passes to eight different receivers, with two touchdown passes to both Lukas Adams and Curtis Prock. Jensen is on pace to finish No. 10 in program records with 208.6 passing yards per game this season. He ranks sixth in the conference for passing yards per game, eighth in pass efficiency (94.4), seventh in total offense (193.6/game) and fourth in passing yards per completion (11.7/completion). Prock's two touchdown receptions moved him into seventh in program records with six this season. One more touchdown reception will be the best single season performance since 1998 and move him into fifth in season records. McGee caught four passes for a career-high 109 yards in his second 100-yard receiving game of the season. He made a 51-yard reception for a touchdown in the third quarter, and is fourth in the conference with 39.6 yards per catch. He is one of seven RMAC receivers with multiple 100-yard receiving games this season. He also added three kickoffs for 39 yards against the Orediggers. He is fifth in the RMAC for kick return average. The Mountaineers wrap up the home season this weekend with Colorado Mesa at 1 p.m. Western State leads the all-time series 20-17, but will be looking for its first win against the Mavericks since 2004.
