**Ocoee, Fla./Ocoee HS**

On Saturday in helping to preserve a 14-10 conference win on the road at New Mexico, Capi established the single-game NCAA record with four forced fumbles. Three came on sacks and the fourth, with only nine seconds remaining in the game and the Lobos threatening to score from the CSU 15, secured a Rams victory. He also recovered that final fumble, to go along with 4.5 tackles for loss. Prior to Saturday, a player had forced three fumbles in a game on nine occasions, but no one has ever forced four. He had seven tackles on the day, including 3.5 sacks, the fourth-highest single-game total in CSU football history.

# 2011-2012 NFFCC News & Notes

## ADAMS STATE COLLEGE (1-0, 0-0 RMAC)

### Terjean Saffold (Senior, Running Back, 5-8, 200, Stockton, Calif./Laney JC/Weston Ranch HS)

Saffold broke an ASC available history (1997-present) record with his 33 carries in Saturday's season-opening win, and his 179 yards gained on the ground was the most by a Grizzly since 1999 and the third most in available history. It was also the second straight season that Saffold has surpassed the 100-yard mark in a season-opening win, and was also just the second time since 2001 that a Grizzly running back has eclipsed the century mark in a season-opener. Saffold broke off a game-lone 32-yard scamper to begin the Grizzlies final possession late in the third quarter. He had four runs that went longer than 10 yards, three of which came in the second half.

**Team Notes:** The Grizzlies tallied their second straight season-opening win on Saturday as they defeated Dixie State for the second straight season. Their two wins in the last two seasons are their only two season-opening wins since 2006 as well as ASC's only two non-conference wins in that span. The win lifts the Grizzlies to a 3-2 advantage in the series, and is the first road win for either team in the series. Adams State ate up clock in the game, as the offense ran 81 plays and controlled the ball for 39:48, while DSC ran just 44 plays while keeping possession for 20:12. Junior quarterback Trevor Eggleston was good on 20-of-35 pass attempts for 225 yards and two touchdowns while throwing no interceptions. It was the fourth straight game that he has eclipsed the 200-yard passing mark dating back to the 2010 season. Eggleston completed passes to six different receivers. Senior Dustin Bolt hauled in a career-best seven passes for 89 yards and two scores, while senior Delton Prescott gained a career-high 97 yards on six catches. For the second straight meeting they allowed just one offensive touchdown, which came following a turnover that gave Dixie the ball on the ASC 4-yard line. Three Grizzly defenders came up with picks in the game, including senior Jake Long who returned his for 35 yards, junior James Ackel and freshman Mike Liebrock. Junior Kirk Gainous recorded two sacks and three tackles for loss in his first game as a Grizzly, which resulted in 13 yards lost for DSC. Adams State will be on the road again next weekend against Black Hills State in Spearfish, S.D. where they will be looking to start the season with back-to-back wins for the first time since 1996. The match-up will be the first between the two squads.

## COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (0-1, 0-0 RMAC)

### Connor Wright (Senior, Defensive Line, 6-1, 250, Wheat Ridge, Colo./Wheat Ridge HS)

Wright led the team with 11 tackles against Humboldt State. He tallied three solo tackles and a game high eight assisted tackles. Wright had 1.5 tackles for a loss of four yards and had one quarterback hurry.

**Team Notes:** The Mavs fell in their home opener to Humboldt State Thursday night. It was the third meeting between the two teams. HSU now holds a 2-1 advantage. CMU (then Mesa State) defeated the Lumberjacks in 2007 in Grand Junction, 23-21. In 2005, the first ever meeting, Humboldt won on their home turf, 28-9. Kick returner Trent deBraga returned three kicks for 97 yards, long of 43. He led the team in all-purpose yards and also finished the game with nine tackles, including five solo tackles and one pass breakup. CMU will travel to Dixie State next Saturday night.

## COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (1-0, 0-0 RMAC)

### Dan Palmer (Junior, Running Back, 6-2, 235, Greeley, Colo./University)

Palmer carried 22 times for 134 yards (6.1 avg.) and three touchdowns as the Orediggers posted a 33-0 shutout victory at William Jewell College on Sept. 3.

**Team Notes:** CSM outgained William Jewell 369 to 121 in total yards. Mines also converted on 9-of-14 third-down opportunities and scored on 4-of-5 visits to the red-zone. The Orediggers, ranked No. 24 in the latest AFCA poll, will host South Dakota Tech at 12 p.m.

## COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (1-0, 1-0 MWC)

### Nordly Capi (Sophomore, Defensive Line, 6-3, 249, Ocoee, Fla./Ocoee HS)

## COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY-PUEBLO (1-0, 0-0 RMAC)

### Kyle Major (Senior, Kicker, 6-3, 230, Littleton, Colo./Heritage HS)

Major tied career highs for longest field goal (52) and most field goals in a game (four), turning in his first career 4-for-4 performance. Major's field goals were the difference in CSU-Pueblo's win, with his final kick with five minutes remaining giving CSUP its first lead (26-24).

**Team Notes:** The Pack earned their first win over a ranked opponent since defeating Chadron State in 2009. CSU-Pueblo's win over West Texas A&M marks its fourth straight season-opening win (every season since the program was resurrected in 2008). When opening the season on the road, CSU-Pueblo hasn't lost since 1975.

# 2011-2012 NFFCC News & Notes

## FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (1-0, 0-0 RMAC)

### Tim Jenkins (Junior, Quarterback, 6-3, 220, Highlands Ranch, Colo./ThundeRidge HS)

Jenkins completed 22 of 32 passes for 344 yards and three scores (one interception). He also carried the ball five times for two rushing touchdowns in the Skyhawks 48-30 home opening win against South Dakota School of Mines. Of the Skyhawks seven touchdowns scored, Jenkins had a hand in five of them.

**Team Notes:** Freshman running back Van Gramman (5-11, 170, Houston, Texas, Austin Westlake HS) scored two touchdowns in a 10-second span — an unprecedented feat in FLC history. Gramman turned a routine screen pass from Tim Jenkins into a 70-yard touchdown with 7:53 remaining in the game, then returned a fumble 17 yards for a second score on the ensuing kickoff with 7:43 left on clock. His two scores extended FLC's lead from 34-19 to 48-19.

## UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY (1-0, 0-0 MWC)

### Anthony Wright (Senior, Defensive Back, 5-10, 200, Cleveland, Ohio/Maple Heights)

Wright recorded seven total tackles, including four unassisted in a home win over South Dakota. He recorded an interception, the 10th of his career which ties him for fourth place all-time at Air Force. His interception came inside the Air Force five yard line. His seven tackles against the Coyotes were second on the team.

## UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (0-1, 0-0 PAC 12)

### Paul Richardson (Sophomore, Wide Receiver, 6-1, 175, Gardena, Calif./Serra HS)

Richardson caught three passes for 49 yards and two scores in the Buffs season opening game at Hawaii (L, 17-34). It was his third career two-touchdown reception game; that ties him for the third most in school history, trailing only Race Carruth and Derek McCoy, who both had five.

**Team Notes:** The Buffaloes are now 76-41-5 in season openers, 18-18-3 on the road). Since 1967, CU has scored first in a season opener 24 times, going 23-1 in those games; CU is 4-16-1 in the 21 games the opponent scored first to open the season. Longtime assistant coach Brian Cabral wore his trademark black and gold floral print lava lava; he's now 5-3 in the garb, losing for the first time he's worn it for the first time in a season; the other two losses came the second time he donned it in a single year. Quarterback Tyler Hansen had a string of 63 straight passes without an interception come to an end with the fourth quarter pick; he was sacked a career high seven times, the most since Texas A&M recorded eight against the Buffs in 2009. Hansen did become the 11th player to throw for 3,000 yards in a CU career, finishing with 223 against Hawaii to give him 3,045; he passed Gale Weidner 1959-61, 3,033) into 10th all-time on the overall list. Tailback Josh Ford moved into #29 after he and K.T. Tu'umalo both made the first kickoff coverage unit on special teams.

## UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO (0-1, 0-0 BSC)

**Team Notes:** Northern Colorado opened their home season with a 22-20 loss to Lindenwood. This Saturday they will play at Colorado State for a 12 p.m. kickoff.

## WESTERN STATE COLLEGE (0-1, 0-0 RMAC)

### Seth Wilson (Senior, Safety, 5-11, 190, Clovis, Calif./Fresno City College/Buchanan HS)

Wilson led both teams with 13 tackles, including nine solo stops, last Saturday. He also recorded the only sack of the day for Western State with a sack in the first quarter, with an 11-yard loss. Wilson tied for the RMAC-high with 13 tackles in the opening weekend.

**Team Notes:** Western State dropped a 35-12 decision to Angelo State in the season-opening game last Saturday in Mountaineer Bowl. It was the fewest number of points in the season-opener for the Mountaineers since 2006 (nine points vs. Angelo State) and the fewest in a season-opening game at home since 2005 (26 points vs. Angelo State). After the opening weekend of the season, the Mountaineers led the conference in fourth-down conversions and red-zone offense. Both fourth-down conversions came in the fourth quarter on pass completions by Miles Gorham. The Mountaineers had two of the five individual tacklers in the opening weekend with Seth Wilson (13) and Johnny Pieper (12). Western State closes out the non-conference season with Idaho State at 4 p.m. in Holt Arena.
