BOISE STATE, TCU RANKED IN NATIONAL POLLS

Two Mountain West teams are currently ranked in both the *USA Today/Coaches'* and *Associated Press* polls. Boise State is the MW's highest-ranked squad, climbing to No. 4 in the Coaches' poll and staying at No. 4 in the *AP* rankings. TCU rose two spots in both sets of rankings to enter Week 3 at No. 23. San Diego State received three votes in the Coaches' Top-25.

At least two Mountain West teams have been ranked in the *USA Today/Coaches'* Top 25 poll for 51 consecutive weeks, dating back to Sept. 2, 2008. The MW joins the Big 12, Big Ten and SEC as the only four conferences that have had at least two teams ranked for 51 consecutive weeks.

The Mountain West has had at least one team in the Top-10 of the *USA Today/Coaches'* rankings for 31 consecutive weeks, dating to Sept. 27, 2009. The MW is one of four leagues (Big 12, Big Ten, SEC) with at least one team ranked in the Top-10 of the Coaches' poll during that span.

Boise State has been ranked in the top-10 of both polls for 33 consecutive weeks, dating back to Sept. 13, 2009 for the nation's current longest streak.

Boise State and TCU are ranked third and fourth, respectively, for the nation's current longest ranking streak. The MW is the only league in the country with two of the top four teams ranked in 44 consecutive polls:

37 OR MORE WINS SINCE 2008

Boise State (39-2) and TCU (37-4) are two of three teams (Alabama 38-5) to achieve 37 or more wins since the beginning of the 2008 season. The Mountain West is the only conference to have two teams with 37-plus wins during that span.

TWO-LOSS TEAMS

TCU and Boise State have had two or fewer losses in each of the previous three seasons. The Horned Frogs finished the 2008 campaign with an 11-2 record before going 12-1 in 2009 and 13-0 in 2010. The Broncos posted identical 12-1 marks in 2008 and 2010, and went undefeated (14-0) in 2009.

FROGS TIE MW RECORD WITH 18 STRAIGHT CONFERENCE WINS

With last week's 35-19 victory at Air Force, TCU extended its win streak against league foes to 18, dating back to the 2008 season, to tie for the Mountain West all-time record. The Horned Frogs' last loss to a MW opponent came at Utah (13-10) on Nov. 6, 2008. Former MW member BYU originally set the league record for most consecutive Mountain West wins with 18 from Sept. 28, 2006 to Oct. 11, 2008.

TCU has also won nine consecutive road games in Mountain West play, dating back to Oct. 8, 2009. The Horned Frogs' last loss on an MW opponent's home field was Nov. 6, 2008 (13-10, at Utah).

TCU HOME WIN STREAKS

TCU has won 20 straight home games, one shy of the Mountain West record set by former member Utah from Sept. 15, 2007 to Oct. 23, 2010. The Horned Frogs' home win streak is the fourth-longest active home win streak in the nation behind Oklahoma (37), fellow Mountain West member Boise State (32) and Alabama (21). Below is a look at how TCU's current streak ranks in the league record book.

TCU SETS RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE MW HOME WINS

TCU has won 14 consecutive home contests against opponents from the Mountain West. The Frogs' 14 straight league victories in Amon G. Carter Stadium have eclipsed the previous Conference record, shared by BYU (Oct. 17, 2006-Sept. 26, 2009) and Utah (Oct. 13, 2007-Oct. 23, 2010).

SDSU ON A ROLL

San Diego State's 23-20 victory at Army was its fourth consecutive win dating back to last season. The Aztecs have not trailed in any of those four games, marking the first time the Aztecs have posted a four-game win streak without trailing since Oct. 29 to Nov. 19, 1977, with wins over Tulsa (41-7), Pacific (29-7), Long Beach State (33-22) and 13th-ranked Florida State (41-16).

BSU'S MOORE, AFA'S JEFFERSON RANK AMONG NCAA TOP THREE WINNIGEST QB'S

Boise State quarterback **Kellen Moore** is 39-2 (.951) in three years as the Broncos' signal-caller to lead all active FBS quarterbacks in wins and win percentage. He is seven wins away from former Texas quarterback Colt McCoy's Football Bowl Subdivision record of 45 career wins. Air Force quarterback **Tim Jefferson** is tied for third nationally with 22 career wins as the Falcons' starter. Jefferson's .688 winning percentage is the sixth-best nationally. **CSU'S CAPI WRITES NAME IN NCAA RECORD BOOK**

Colorado State sophomore defensive lineman **Nordly Capi** forced an NCAA-record four fumbles against New Mexico on Sept. 3. The previous NCAA record was three forced fumbles in a single game, set 10 times. As a team, the Rams forced a total of five fumbles in the contest, tying for the second-most in a single game in MW history.

AZTECS TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

San Diego State did not commit a turnover at Army last Saturday, marking the third game in a row (2010 Poinsettia Bowl vs. Navy, Sept. 3 vs. Cal Poly) and the first time the Aztecs have not turned the ball over in three consecutive contests in the program's 488 all-time outings at the Division I level (since 1969).

SDSU'S HILLMAN RUNNING UP YARDAGE

San Diego State RB **Ronnie Hillman** recorded his eighth 100-yard rushing game (in just his 15th career game at the college level) last week with 117 yards at Army. He is tied for eighth with Lynell Hamilton, Wayne Pittman and Paul Hewitt in school history for most 100-yard rushing days (NFL Hall of Famer Marshall Faulk tops the list with 23). Seven of his eight career 100-yard rushing efforts have been for 150-yards or more.

Hillman's 117-yard performance at Army marked his fourth straight 100-yard rushing game dating back to last season (152 yards vs. UNLV, 228 yards vs. Navy, 189 yards vs. Cal Poly). The last time an Aztec ran for over 100 yards in four consecutive games was in 1998 (Larry Ned).

SDSU'S LINDLEY GUNNING FOR 10,000

San Diego State quarterback **Ryan Lindley** threw for 146 yards and one touchdown at Army to give him sole possession of third place on the Mountain West's all-time list for career passing TDs with 72. Lindley surpassed former TCU quarterback Andy Dalton, who totalled 71 touchdown passes from 2007-10.

Lindley has passed for at least one touchdown in 12 straight games, dating back to Sept. 25, 2010. Lindley also ranks fourth on the league's all-time list for career passing yardage (9,886 yards). He needs just 114 yards to become the fourth player in Mountain West history to pass for 10,000 yards in a career.

COLORADO STATE'S SISSON LEADS NATION IN CAREER TFL

Colorado State's **Mychal Sisson** paces the country with 40 career tackles for loss. Sisson, a redshirt senior, fractured his ankle in the second quarter of Saturday's victory over Northern Colorado, and looks to return to the playing field prior to the end of the season.

THE LATEST ADDITION

Boise State officially joined the Mountain West on July 1, becoming the second institution to join the Mountain West in the past six years after TCU was added in 2005. The Broncos, who have appeared in nine straight bowl games, join the Mountain West having won two BCS bowls (both victories coming in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl) since 2007. BSU has spent 37 straight games ranked among the top 20 teams in the nation.

COMING SOON...

Fresno State and Nevada will become official members of the Mountain West on July 1, 2012. In addition, Hawai'i will become a football-only member of the Mountain West starting in the fall of 2012.

BOISE STATE PICKED TO CAPTURE MW TITLE

Boise State enters its first season in the Mountain West as the favorite to win the 2011 football title. The Broncos garnered 28 first-place votes, and earned a total of 236 points in a poll of media members. Boise State posted a 12-1 overall mark in 2010, en route to Top 10 rankings in the final *USA Today*/Coaches' (7) and *Associated Press* (10) polls. Boise State returns six starters from an offensive unit that ranked second in the nation last year in both total offense (521.3 yards per game) and points per game (45.1). Seven starters return for the Bronco defense, which ranked second nationally in both total defense (254.7 ypg) and points allowed (12.8 ppg). BSU is led by preseason all-MW performers Thomas Byrd (OL), George Iloka (DB), Doug Martin (RB), Shea McClellin (DL), Kellen Moore (QB), Nate Potter (OL) and Billy Winn (DL).

MW CLAIMS SECOND STRAIGHT BOWL CHALLENGE CUP

The Mountain West claimed the Bowl Challenge Cup for the second consecutive year in 2010-11 after finishing with a 4-1 (.800) mark. Overall, it was the fourth time in seven years the MW has posted the best win percentage among the 11 FBS conferences. The MW also won the Cup in 2007-08 and 2009-10 with mark of 4-1, and is the only conference to win the trophy four times since the award's inception in 2002-03. The league earned its first Bowl Challenge Cup after registering a 2-1 record in bowl competition during the 2004-05 season.

POSTSEASON PROWESS

Over the past seven seasons (including 2010), the Mountain West owns the best win percentage in bowl games among the 11 conferences with a 22-9 mark (.710). The SEC is second with a 36-19 (.655) record, followed by the Big East at 21-14 (.600) and the Pac-12 at 20-15 (.571).

The Mountain West has secured winning bowl records for five consecutive seasons, and is one of three conferences (Big East and SEC) that have posted a winning bowl record each of the last four years.



- Of the Mountain West's 21 touchdowns in Week 2, 14 were scored in the ground and six through the air. UNLV's **Tim Cornett** became the second MW sophomore in two weeks to return a kickoff for a touchdown, after his 95-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter at Washington State. Cornett's return, which ties for the sixth-longest nationally this season, is the third-longest return by a Rebel and the sixth to go back for a score. It was the longest kick return by a UNLV player since Len Ware went 97 yards vs. Utah on Sept. 25, 1999.
- Three MW squads (Colorado State, San Diego State, TCU) scored on the opening drive of their respective games. The Horned Frogs had a touchdown drive on their opening possession for the fourth straight game and seventh time in the last eight contests. The Aztecs have scored a touchdown on their opening drive in two straight games and five of their last six outings. Colorado State scored a touchdown on its first possession for the first time since hosting New Mexico on Oct. 30, 2010.
- Two MW teams gained at least 500 yards on Saturday, led by Wyoming with 618 total offensive yards vs. Texas State to mark the most by the Cowboys since gaining 659 yards against Hawai'i on Sept. 16, 1995. Colorado State collected 501 total yards in its contest vs. Northern Colorado.
- Four MW teams tallied at least 200 yards on the ground, led by Wyoming with 382 rushing yards against Texas State to mark the most by the Cowboys since a 392-yard performance at New Mexico on Nov. 6, 2010. Air Force posted 249 rushing yards vs. TCU, the Falcons' second straight 200+ yard effort on the ground and sixth in the last seven contests. Colorado State's 242 yards rushing against Northern Colorado were the most since Oct. 30, 2010, when the Rams ran for 328 yards against New Mexico. TCU ran for 204 yards at Air Force for the Frogs' second straight game with at least 200 rushing yards and fourth in the last five contests.
- Four MW players ran for at least 100 yards, led by Wyoming's **Ghaali Muhammad** and San Diego State's **Ronnie Hillman** with 123 and 117 rushing yards, respectively. Muhammad's teammate, **Brandon Miller**, also collected 101 yards on the ground for the Cowboys, while Colorado State's **Raymond Carter** posted the Rams' first 100-yard performance (100 net yards vs. Northern Colorado) since **Leonard Mason** had 124 yards vs. New Mexico on Oct. 30, 2010.
- Both **Muhammad** and **Miller** eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark for the first time in their respective careers. The last time Wyoming had two players rush for more than 100 yards was in the Cowboys' 34-31 loss to New Mexico on Nov. 16, 2010.
- Three MW quarterbacks passed for over 200 yards in Week 2, led by Colorado State's **Pete Thomas**, who became the first program's first sophomore quarterback to reach 3,000 career passing yards. Thomas threw for 259 yards vs. Northern Colorado on 28-of-42 attempts. Wyoming true freshman **Brett Smith** completed 16-of-31 passes vs. Texas State for 236 yards to mark his second straight 200-yard passing performance. TCU's **Casey Pachall** connected on 20-of-25 passes, including 11 straight, for 206 yards.
- **Pachall's** 11 consecutive completions to start the game tied former TCU QB Andy Dalton (vs. Baylor on Sept. 18, 2010) for second all-time in most consecutive completions by a Horned Frog. The program record is 14, which was set by Jeff Ballard on Nov. 18, 2006 vs. San Diego State.
- **Pachall's** completion percentage of 80.0 is the best by a Frog signal caller since Tye Gunn went 12-of-15 (80.0 percent) at Army on Oct. 12, 2002.
- In his second career game at receiver, San Diego State's **Colin Lockett** recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game at Army after grabbing a career-best five catches for 113 yards.
- Six MW teams made at least one sack last weekend, and two MW squads posted multiple-sack outings. Wyoming recorded four sacks vs. Texas State, including three by junior **Korey Jones**. Colorado State posted its second straight multiple-sack outing with two vs. Northern Colorado, while the defenses of Air Force, New Mexico, San Diego State and UNLV were each credited with one sack in their respective games.
- The offensive lines of Air Force, New Mexico and Wyoming did not allow a sack in their respective contests.
- Two MW defenses held their opponents to 87 passing yards or less. San Diego State limited Army to 43 yards through the air to mark the sixth-fewest passing yards allowed by an Aztec defense in program history. Army's 43 passing yards are the fewest given up by an SDSU defense since holding North Carolina to 33 passing yards on Dec. 19, 1998. Colorado State's defense allowed only 87 passing yards by Northern Colorado, the fewest by the Rams since limiting Air Force to 52 yards in the air on Oct. 13, 2007.
- Wyoming held Texas State to 77 rushing yards, marking the second time in the last three games the Pokes have held a team under 100 yards on the ground. Wyoming held Colorado State to 65 rushing yards in the 2010 season finale on Nov. 20.
- Colorado State and Wyoming each recorded two interceptions in their respective games on Saturday. The Rams' last multiple-interception game was Nov. 6, 2010 at San Diego State, while Wyoming last intercepted two passes in a game on Oct. 30, 2010 vs. the Aztecs.
- Three MW student-athletes were credited with at least 10 total tackles last week, led by Air Force's **Jon Davis** who recorded 11 total tackles vs. TCU. Colorado State's **Mike Orakpo** and San Diego State's **Jerome Long** were each credited with 10 total tackles apiece.
- With its 23-20 victory at Army, San Diego State starts the season 2-0 for the second straight year and second time in the last 17 seasons. Colorado State is 2-0 to open a campaign for the first time since 2009 and for the third time in nine years (2006). Wyoming holds a 2-0 mark for the first time since the 2007 season and for the second season as a member of the Mountain West.
- **James Aho's** 47-yard field goal against Arkansas was his 41st in his career at New Mexico, tying him with former Lobos Colby Cason and Bob Berg for second place on the program's all-time career list. The UNM record is 53 field goals made, set by David Margolis from 1989-1992.
- Colorado State's **Max Morgan** became the first Ram to record a safety since Blake Smith did so at New Mexico on Oct. 28, 2005.

**OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK****CASEY PACHALL, TCU****Sophomore, Quarterback, Brownwood, Texas/Brownwood HS**

Casey Pachall completed 20-of-25 passes for 206 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions to lead No. 25 TCU to a 35-19 win over host Air Force. The Brownwood, Texas, native completed 80.0 percent of his passes, tying former Horned Frog quarterback Tye Gunn for the eighth-best single-game mark in TCU history. Pachall, whose 11 straight completions to open the game tied a mark for second-most in school history, connected on 16-of-18 attempts in the first half. His 3-yard scoring pass to fullback Luke Shivers gave the Horned Frogs a 7-0 lead on their opening possession of the game. Pachall, who earned his first win as a collegiate starting quarterback, also connected with freshman wide receiver David Porter III on a 21-yard touchdown pass with 9:04 to go in the third quarter. He added 32 rushing yards to finish with 238 yards total offense.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**JEROME LONG, SAN DIEGO STATE****Senior, Defensive Tackle, Los Osos, Calif./Morro Bay HS**

Jerome Long recorded the first double-digit tackle game of his career, finishing with 10 stops (seven solo) and a sack to help the Aztecs improve to 2-0 with a 23-20 win at Army. Long's 10 tackles marked a career high and are the most by any SDSU player this season. His sack of quarterback Max Jenkins came on a critical third-down play on the Black Knights' final drive of the game, taking Army out of field goal range. The Black Knights then failed to convert on fourth down, sealing the win for San Diego State. Long's previous career high for solo tackles was four. Of his 10 stops, none came on gains of more than four yards and seven were on gains of two yards or less. He currently ranks first in the Mountain West among defensive linemen with 7.5 tackles per outing this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK**BRIAN STAHOVICH, SAN DIEGO STATE****Senior, Punter, Solana Beach, Calif./Cathedral Catholic HS**

Brian Stahovich dropped four of his five punts inside the 20-yard line and recorded a pair of kicks exceeding 50 yards in the Aztecs' 23-20 win at Army. Stahovich's 59-yard punt in the first half was a season-long and marked the second-longest kick in the Mountain West in 2011. Of Stahovich's four punts inside the 20-yard line, three of them came to rest inside the 12-yard line and three were not returned, helping SDSU limit Army to an average field position of its own 21-yard line. With his effort on Saturday, Stahovich moved from 38th to 15th nationally in punting and from third to first in the Mountain West with a 44.8 average.

A LOOK AT THE 2011 MOUNTAIN WEST SCHEDULE

The 2011 Mountain West football schedule is comprised of 68 games, including 28 Conference match-ups. The 2011 schedule plays out over 14 weeks and concludes Saturday, December 3.

The Mountain West will play three games against the Big Ten and Pac-12 and two contests each against the Big 12 and SEC. There are five games scheduled against Football Bowl Subdivision independents Army, BYU, Navy and Notre Dame, and nine home dates with Football Championship Subdivision programs.

The non-conference schedule features 21 games against teams that earned bowl berths in 2010, including Arkansas, Army (2 games), BYU, Fresno State (2 games), Georgia, Hawai'i, Michigan, Navy, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Texas Tech, Toledo, Tulsa, Nevada (3 games), Wisconsin and UTEP. GAME NOTES

- Colorado State DL **Nordly Capi** ranks tied for third in the NCAA with 5.5 tackles for loss in 2011.
- Ram RB **Raymond Carter** is coming off his second career 100-yard rushing performance (100 yds. vs. Northern Colorado).
- The Rams are 9-1 under **Steve Fairchild** when scoring 30 or more points. The only loss was a 45-42 shootout at home against No. 17 BYU on Nov. 1, 2008.
- Colorado State has won six of the last seven games in which it has scored a TD on its game-opening drive. The only loss in that stretch was at New Mexico on Nov. 21, 2009.
- Last week against Northern Colorado, CSU LB **Max Morgan** recorded the Rams' first safety since DL Blake Smith accomplished that feat in a win at New Mexico on Oct. 28, 2005.
- The Rams have started the season 2-0 for the third time in the last nine years (also 2006 and 2009).
- Colorado State LB **Mychal Sisson**, who leads the nation with 40 career tackles for loss and paced the country in 2010 with seven forced fumbles, fractured his ankle in the second quarter of last Saturday's encounter with UNC.
- Colorado QB **Tyler Hansen** completed 28-of-49 passes for a school-record 474 yards and three TDs in last week's overtime loss to California. He also accounted for a program-record 500 yards in total offense against the Bears. Both numbers are the highest single-game totals in the NCAA through Week 2.
- CU WR **Paul Richardson** tallied 11 receptions for a school-record 284 receiving yards against Cal. That mark is good for the highest single-game total in the NCAA this season. Richardson is also tied for the most receiving yards in the country with 333 total.

MOUNTAIN WEST BOWL SYNOPSIS

The Mountain West has agreements to send four teams to bowl games in 2011. Since the league's inception in 1999, the Mountain West has posted a 29-17 bowl record and has captured the Bowl Challenge Cup four times in the last seven years.

Unless an MW team qualifies for a BCS bowl game, the MAACO Bowl Las Vegas has the first selection of MW teams, followed by the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl and the AdvoCare V100 Independence Bowls with the second and third selections, respectively. The Gildan New Mexico Bowl has the fourth choice.

ABOUT THE BCS

The Bowl Championship Series (BCS) is a five-game arrangement for postseason college football that is designed to match the two top-rated teams in a national championship game and to create exciting and competitive matchups between eight other highly-regarded teams in four other games. The bowl games participating in the BCS are the Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game will be played at one of the four bowl sites.

BCS STANDINGS

Since the 2000 regular season, the BCS Standings have been compiled by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. The Standings include three components: *USA Today* Coaches Poll, Harris Interactive College Football Poll and an average of six computer rankings. Each component will count one-third toward a team's overall BCS score. All three components shall be added together and averaged for a team's ranking in the BCS Standings. The team with the highest average shall rank first in the BCS Standings.

MOUNTAIN WEST AND THE BCS

The champion of the Mountain West (along with the champions of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Sun Belt Conference and the Western Athletic Conference) will have an automatic berth in a BCS bowl game if either:

- Such team is ranked in the top 12 of the final BCS Standings, or;
- Such team is ranked in the top 16 of the final BCS Standings and its ranking in the final BCS Standings is higher than that of a champion of a conference that has an annual automatic berth in one of the BCS bowls.

Results from the 2008 to 2011 regular seasons will be evaluated to determine whether a seventh conference earns automatic qualification for the 2012-13 and 2013-14 bowl games. The evaluation process includes the following for each conference:



1. **Average Ranking of Highest-Ranked Team:** the ranking of the highest-ranked team in the final BCS Standings each year (if a conference does not place a team in the final BCS Standings, then its highest-ranked team is determined by the conference member that has the highest average ranking in the computer rankings used in the BCS Standings)
2. **Average Conference Ranking:** The final regular-season rankings of all conference teams in the computer rankings used by the BCS each year
3. **Top 25 Performance Ranking:** The number of teams in the top 25 of the final BCS Standings each year, with adjustments to account for differences in the number of members of each conference.

A conference will become the seventh automatic qualifier if it finishes among the top six conferences in both No. 1 and No. 2 and if its ranking in No. 3 is equal to or greater than 50 percent of the conference with the highest ranking in No. 3.

A conference will be eligible to apply to the Presidential Oversight Committee for an exemption if it finishes among the top six in both No. 1 and No. 2 and if its ranking in No. 3 is equal to or greater than 33.3 percent of the conference with the highest ranking in No. 3, or if it finishes among the top seven in either No. 1 or No. 2 and among the top five in the other and if its ranking in No. 3 is equal to or greater than 33.3 percent of the conference with the highest ranking in No. 3. To determine the "top 25 Performance Rating," points will be awarded to the conferences based on their teams' finishes in the top 25 of the final BCS Standings each year.

The computations will be made according to the conference's membership on December 4, 2011.

If the BCS continues under the same or a similar format, conferences will be evaluated on their performances during the 2010 to 2013 regular seasons to determine which conferences without bowl contracts will have automatic status from 2014 to 2017.
