THIS WEEK

Jim McElwain begins his second season at the helm of the Colorado State Rams when they take the field against the University of Colorado at 4 p.m., Sunday, Sept. 1. The game takes place at Sports Authority Field at Mile High, as the 85th renewal of the longstanding rivalry between the two schools.

WHERE TO FIND THE GAME: The Rocky Mountain Showdown will be televised nationally on CBS Sports, with Dave Ryan (play-by-play), Adam Archuleta (analyst), and Evan Washburn (sideline) on the call. CSU fans can listen to the action on the revamped Colorado State Radio Network with new Voice of the Rams Gary Miller alongside Brian Roth (analyst) and Kevin McGlue (sideline). On the airwaves, fans will now be able to listen to the game across the state on: KJAC-FM 105.5 ESPN Denver, KREL-AM 1580 ESPN Colorado Springs, KSIR-AM 1010 The Farm, KRFD-FM 94.5 The Ranch, and KNZZ-AM Newsradio 1100.

ABOUT THE RAMS: Colorado State enters its 116th season of intercollegiate football and second under Head Coach Jim McElwain. In his first season in Fort Collins, McElwain led the Rams to a 4-8 record, the most wins since 2008. CSU rattled off wins in three of their final five games, averaging 28.8 points. The Rams return 17 starters, including OL **Weston Richburg**, who was named to preseason watch lists for the Outland Trophy, Rimington Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award and arguably the best tight end duo in the Mountain West in **Crockett Gillmore** and **Kivon Cartwright**.

TOP NOTES

- The Rams have won their season opener three of the last four seasons. Last season, Colorado State took advantage of a Colorado fumble late in the first half to propel themselves to a 22-17 victory. In 2011, the Rams squeaked out a 14-10 road victory vs. New Mexico. Finally, in 2009, the Rams went into Boulder and defeated CU 23-17. It was CSU's first victory in Boulder since 1986.
- Overall the Rams have posted a 59-55-1 (.513) record in season openers, including streaks of nine consecutive wins between 1940-1950 (CSU didn't field a team in 1943-44) and seven in a row from 1994-2000.
- CSU looks to earn back-to-back victories over in-state rival Colorado for the first time since 1999-2000.
- McElwain looks to win his first two season openers, a feat that hasn't been accomplished by a CSU head football coach since 1947-48 when Bob Davis defeated Colorado Mines 20-12 and Colorado College 25-6.
- McElwain hasn't dropped a season opener at the college level since 2004 as an assistant head coach at Michigan State.
- The Rams may be young but they have experience. In 2012, CSU had 19 players make their first career start, which was the fifth-most in NCAA FBS (Hawaii 29, Air Force 24, Temple 22, TCU 21)
- The Rams return 94 career OL starts, which ranks 12th in the nation according to Phil Steele. (Richburg - 36, Gragert - 24, Sambrailo - 17, Biard - 10, Haynes - 7). This ranks as the third most returning starts in the Mountain West behind Utah State with 110 and New Mexico with 107.

ALL EYES ON RAMS-BUFFS

Kickoff for the 85th meeting between CSU-CU is scheduled for Sunday afternoon. It is one of two games being played on that day, with the other being Ohio at No. 9 Louisville. By the time the Rams kickoff at 4:04 p.m., they will be the only football game on television as the NFL has the weekend off prior to their season-opener.

CSU AND CU TEAM UP TO "TACKLE HUNGER"

Colorado's research universities are teaming up to fight hunger on the same day their football teams square off in the annual Rocky Mountain Showdown. "Tackle Hunger" will collect monetary donations from fans attending the annual game Colorado State and Colorado. Money collected will be divided between Feeding America food banks in Larimer and Boulder counties. During the first quarter fans can donate via text message, typing TACKLE to 501501 to make \$10 donations that will be included in monthly phone bills. Results will be announced later in the game. SUNDAY SHOWDOWN

Sept. 1 will mark the fourth time the Rams and Buffaloes have played on a Sunday. The last time these two teams matched-up on a Sunday was 2009 and the Rams won 23-17. CU holds a 2-1 edge in Sunday contests.

The Rams and Buffaloes have also met four times on a Thursday (1916, '17, '18 and '46), once on a Wednesday (1923) and once on a Monday (1900).

ON SCHOLARSHIP

In 2012, just nine days before the Rocky Mountain Showdown, McElwain presented quarterback M.J. McPeck, running back Mark Woodbury and kicker Jared Roberts with scholarships. Their hard work in fall camp finally paid off.

This year, two more student-athletes were rewarded with scholarships after strong showings in fall camp. Tight End **Joe McKay**, a redshirt senior from Akron, Colo., and linebacker **Ken Hulbert**, a product of Highlands Ranch, Colo., received the honor on Aug. 25.

McKay has played in 23 games for the Rams since 2011 and is a major contributor on special teams. In his career, McKay has registered seven tackles, two forced fumbles and a blocked punt.

Hulbert is another contributor on special teams. The junior linebacker has recorded two tackles in eight career games.

"These are two guys who have really earned it. They have worked their tails off and not only do we appreciate what they do, but our team recognizes these were two very deserving guys, as were other guys. It goes to show we do reward those guys who come here and work hard and earn it. There is a strong tradition here of walk-ons playing a strong role in the team's success and earning scholarships. We really value the hard work and commitment those walk-on players show, and recognize their importance to our team," McElwain said.

RETURNING TALENT

The Rams will return 19 starters in 2013, nine offensively, eight defensively and two from the special teams unit. Colorado State brings back 78 percent of its passing yardage, and 85.7 percent of its net rushing.

Quarterbacks **Garrett Grayson** and **Conner Smith** return after registering a combined nine starts in 2012. Grayson threw for 946 yards and Smith for 1,022. Running backs **Donnell Alexander** and **Chris Nwoke** both return after rushing for 587 and 570, respectively in 2012.

Defensively, the Rams return 100 percent of their interceptions, 92.8 percent of their forced fumbles, 78 percent of their sacks and 77.4 percent of tackles from 2012.

The Rams return the 2012 statistical team leader for every major offensive and defensive category.

NEW PUNTER

For the first time in four years, the Rams will have a new punter. **Hayden Hunt**, a redshirt freshman from Long Beach, Calif., replaces the three-time All-Mountain West choice Pete Kontodiakos.

THE PLAYMAKER

Senior linebacker **Shaquil Barrett** enters 2013 with more tackles in the last two seasons than any returning player in the Mountain West. The 2012 honorable mention All-Mountain West selection made 166 tackles in the 2011 and '12 seasons combined, as has scored three touchdowns in his two seasons as a Ram after transferring from Nebraska-Omaha.

TWO TALENTED TIGHT ENDS

The Rams enter 2013 with a talented and productive pair of tight ends in **Crockett Gillmore** and **Kivon Cartwright**, giving Colorado State multiple options with offensive sets. In 2012 CSU started two tight ends in 11 of the 12 games, with Cartwright logging 11 starts and Gillmore 10. Gillmore, who was named to the John Mackey Award watch list in July, enters his senior season in 2013 with 64 career receptions for 731 yards (11.4) and 6 touchdowns, while Cartwright begins his junior year with 29 career receptions for 373 yards (12.9) and 3 touchdowns. Together, the pair has caught 93 passes for 1,104 yards (11.9) and nine touchdowns as CSU Rams.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

In Jim McElwain's first year as head coach he mixed a veteran nucleus with a host of young talent that helped lead significant improvement over the second half of the season. In all, the 2012 Rams had 18 players make their first collegiate start, tied for 8th-most in NCAA FBS. Included in that group were four players who saw significant game action as true freshmen: LB **Kevin Davis**, WR/PR **Joe Hansley**, DB **Nick Januska** and DB **Jasen Oden**.

HONOR ROLL

After winning four games in 2012, the most since 2008, expectations in 2013 are high. Fortunately, the Rams have players capable of producing a winning season and five of them earned preseason honors.

BAG POLICY

This season the NFL has adopted a new policy which restricts types of bags that fans can carry into the stadium. This same policy will be enforced during the Rocky Mountain Showdown. The new policy only allows fans to carry in bags that are 12 inches tall and six inches wide. Additionally, the bags must be clear. In place of a bag issued by the NFL, fans can use a one gallon plastic storage bag or a small clutch purse that is no larger than 4.5 inches by 6.5 inches.

This Week in CSU Football History August 26 to September 1, 2013

August 29, 1998 – The Rams open the 1998 season in Lansing, Mich. against the Michigan State Spartans in the second-earliest start to a CSU football season. With Ryan Eslinger as an untested starting quarterback he is able to find Darran Hall as a qualified receiver. But it was the running combination of Damon Washington and Kevin McDougal that ignited the Rams' offense. However, the Rams defense stepped up to the challenge of the Big Ten Spartan offense and shut down Michigan State running back Sedrick Irvin in the second half. The Rams win 23 to 16 for their first ever defeat of a Big Ten school in CSU football history.

August 30, 1997 – Just one month after a devastating flood ravaged the CSU campus, the Rams open their season at home against the Nevada Wolf Pack. A crowd of 29,672 watched Damon Washington score a career high three touchdowns on 188 yards while fellow running back Kevin McDougal racked up 131 yards and one touchdown in a 45-13 route that vaulted the Rams to the number 24 spot in the AP poll.

August 31, 2002 – The Rams face the defending Big 12 champion Colorado Buffaloes, ranked sixth in the country, at Invesco Field for the Rocky Mountain Showdown. Led by quarterback Bradlee Van Pelt and bruising running back Cecil "The Diesel" Sapp, the Rams out-play the Buffs for their third win in four seasons at the neutral site. Sapp's most memorable touchdown run of his career came early in the game when at the eight-yard-line he seemed to go down, but ended up carrying several Buff players with him into the end zone. However, it was Van Pelt's very memorable touchdown run of 23-yards with 6:20 remaining in the game that locked this contest as one of the most memorable in the long rivalry.

September 1, 1990 – The Rams opened the 1990 season in Colorado Springs against the Air Force Academy Falcons in a contest that would set the stage for the Rams' first season ending in a bowl bid since 1948. In Coach Earle Bruce's second season at the helm, quarterbacks Mike Gimenez and Kevin Verdugo lead the team as a duo. Thanks to a trick play where tailback Brian Copeland passed 44 yards to Mark Holmes for a touchdown and Kevin Verdugo passed 14 yards to receiver Greg Primus, the Rams beat the Falcons in a nail biter of a game 35-33.

Mike MacIntyre, who led San Jose State to its first 10-win season in 25 years, was named the 25th head football coach at the University of Colorado on December 10, 2012, former athletic director Mike Bohn announced. MacIntyre, 47, led San Jose State to a 10-2 record in 2012, with a final regular season ranking of No. 24 in the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches polls as well as in the final BCS Standings. The Spartans earned a berth in the Military Bowl where it defeated Bowling Green, 29-20, and finished No. 21 in the national polls (the win, per NCAA policy, is not credited to him since he did not coach SJSU in the bowl).

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Senior fullback Jake Levin played with CU's tight end Scott Fernandez at Legacy High School...CSU place kicker Jared Roberts and Buffs linebacker Brady Daigh, and running back Josh Ford are both products of Mullen...Former CSU walk-on Jordan Murphy transferred to CU where he is now a fullback...Rams wide receiver Joe Hansley and Colorado offensive lineman Ed Caldwell were teammates at Highlands Ranch High School...Rams linebacker Kevin Davis and Buffaloes defensive back Harrison Hunter both graduated from Fountain-Fort Carson High School...Former crosstown rivals square off as CSU freshman running back Bryce Peters (Cypress Falls) and CU brothers Sean and Jeromy Irwin (Cypress Fairbanks) meet...CU offensive line coach Gary Bernardi has matched-up against CSU on several occasions as he coached for five years at UNLV.

NOTABLE PERFORMANCES AGAINST COLORADO

- Kicker Jared Roberts made his collegiate debut against the Buffs in 2012 just nine days after being put on scholarship. He wasted no time making an impression as he connected on all three field goals, including a 47-yarder. That week Roberts was named Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Along with several other Rams, Donnell Alexander made his collegiate debut, rushing for a game-high 66 yards on eight carries (8.2 avg.) in 2012.
- In last seasons 22-17 victory, Garrett Grayson completed 14-21 passes for 173 yards and two touchdowns.
- In 2011, Charles Lovett tossed his only collegiate TD pass against CU, a 23-yard strike to tight end Crockett Gillmore. Lovett also hauled in two receptions of his own.

General Policies

- Regarding unique subject matter, such as human-interest angles, members of the media are welcome to approach the media relations office at least 48 hours in advance with requests to interview any member of the program, provided the requested individual is not a true-freshman player. Approved requests will be granted.
- Members of the media are strictly prohibited from approaching any coach, staff member or student-athlete by any means, including text messages, e-mail, phone calls (cell, office or home) or social media, such as Facebook and Twitter, without first approaching the athletic media relations office.

Regular-season game weeks

- On Mondays, Head Coach Jim McElwain will conduct a weekly press conference in the McGraw Athletic Center Team Auditorium, located on the ground floor just inside the lobby. McElwain will begin speaking at 12 p.m. and the session should conclude by 12:30 p.m. Designated players will be made available following Coach McElwain's press conference.
- Following Tuesday's practice, designated student-athletes with at least one season in the program will be made available. Regarding unique subject matter, such as human-interest angles, members of the media are welcome to approach the media relations office at least 48 hours in advance with requests to interview any member of the program, provided the requested individual is not a true-freshman player. Approved requests will be granted, but those interviews need to take place on Tuesday following practice.
- On Wednesday, a designated assistant coach will be made available to the media at 12 p.m. The media relations office will provide in advance the names and dates of that coach availability. Those Wednesdays will represent the only assistant-coach availability of the week.
- On Wednesday, McElwain will be available following practice.
- Following Wednesday availability, there is no further access to members of the program until the end of the game Saturday, except for contractual broadcast obligations.

Gameday

- Every member of the program needs to report to the locker room following the game before conducting interviews of any kind. Other than network obligations, CSU does not allow on-field interviews in the minutes following the final gun.
- Head Coach Jim McElwain will meet the media following a 10-minute cooling-off period in a designated area. The CSU locker room is closed. Designated student-athletes will be brought to the interview area. Assistant coaches or true freshmen are not available.

All other times...

- Head Coach Jim McElwain is available either in-person or by phone, by appointment through director of media relations Paul Kirk (paul.kirk@colostate.edu).
- All assistant coaches are unavailable other than designated sessions on Wednesdays during regular season game weeks.
- Phone calls (cell, office or home) to any coach, staff member, or student-athlete are strictly prohibited, unless previously arranged through the athletic media relations office.
- Media should contact the athletic media relations office, rather than the individual coaches and/or student-athletes, when needing personal contact information, such as phone numbers or e-mail addresses.

Injuries

- At all times throughout the calendar year, including spring practice, Head Coach Jim McElwain will serve as the sole source for injury information. All questions related to injuries should be directed to McElwain, and not to any other member of the program, including athletic trainers, doctors, the injured student-athlete, or

his teammates.

- If McElwain is unavailable, contact Paul Kirk in the media relations office.

Practice guidelines

- All outdoor Colorado State football practices are open for the first few periods, including the stretching and individual sessions, unless otherwise noted. At a designated time early in practice, the remainder of the session will be closed to the media.
- During the spring, most scrimmages are open to the media. Fall scrimmages are not open.
- All media should remain on the sidelines, standing a safe distance from the boundary to prevent collisions. Also for safety reasons, media are asked to stand rather than sit or kneel, and should either hold personal bags or set them behind a barrier, so they are not a potential injury source for players or the media.

Photography guidelines

- Cameras are restricted from shooting/filming any 11-on-11 period, as well as selected other periods (athletic media relations staff will notify).
- Photographers and videographers are not allowed to bring tripods onto the practice field.
- Photographers and videographers should remain on the sidelines, or behind the end lines. They are not permitted in any drill at any time.
- Photographers should stand a safe distance from the boundary to prevent collisions. Also for safety reasons, photographers are asked to stand rather than sit or kneel, and should either hold personal bags and/or camera equipment, or set them behind a barrier, so they are not a potential injury source for players or the media.
- Media are not permitted within listening distance of the post-practice team huddle. Those wishing to shoot/film the huddle should remain on the sidelines. Audio/accounts from the huddle should not be recorded or made public in any way.
- All posed photo shoots must take place at times arranged prior to the beginning of practice, working through the athletic media relations office. Posed photo shoots are not permitted during any practice.

Telephone interviews

- Head Coach Jim McElwain is available for phone interviews as time permits. Media should call to make an appointment through director of media relations Paul Kirk (paul.kirk@colostate.edu).
- Phone calls (cell, office or home) to any coach or student-athlete are strictly prohibited, unless previously arranged through the athletic media relations office.
- Media should contact the athletic media relations office, rather than the individual coaches and/or student-athletes, when needing personal contact information, such as phone numbers or e-mail addresses.

CSURAMS.com/Social Media

- The official Web site of Colorado State athletics is CSURams.com, featuring the latest news, information, statistics, and rosters for all of the Rams' 16 athletic programs. Rams fans worldwide can also listen to the live play-by-play coverage offered by the Colorado State Sports Network through the Internet site. Fans can click on www.CSURams.com, then click on the radio broadcast icon on the site's front page for football and men's and women's basketball live radio coverage. News also will be disseminated via the Colorado State football program's official twitter account, @CSUFootball, as well as the general athletics account, @CSUAthletics, and director of media relations Paul Kirk (@PaulKirk_CSU)

Media credentials

- Credentials must be requested through director of media relations Paul Kirk in writing at least seven days in advance of an event. Approved requests will be mailed or can be picked up in the media relations office, or at the game.

Photographer credentials

- Photo credentials are issued only to accredited photographers.

Passes must be displayed at all times. All photographers must remain outside the 25-yard lines on both sides of the field.

Game-day services

- A pregame luncheon is served 90 minutes prior to kickoff in the press box. In-game services include statistics and play-by-play information following each quarter and notes and statistics following the conclusion of the game.
- Hughes Stadium offers complimentary wireless Internet access. Check the seat-assignment label on press row for access information.
- The south tunnel contains a small photographer room with a table, chairs and several hard-line, high-speed Internet connections.

Parking

- Media parking is available at Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium in selected lots. Please contact the CSU media relations office to request a Hughes Stadium parking pass.
- Access to the parking lot immediately west of the McGraw Center will require an "A" permit from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays. A limited number of single-day passes are available through the media relations office. Annual permits can be purchased through the Office of Parking Management Web site: www.colostate.edu/depts/parking.
- The CSU media relations office will provide complimentary annual passes to this lot for select media organizations and members of the press who demonstrate a consistent willingness to cover the Rams. Those passes are not replaceable and should be treated like cash.

Stadium directions/will call

- Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium is located two miles west of the central campus at the base of the Rocky Mountain foothills, below the "Aggie A." The stadium is just south of Prospect on Overland Trail. From I-25, media should take the Prospect exit west to the mountains, then turn left on Overland Trail. Press box access is on the west side of the stadium via elevator to the fourth level.
- Will call is located at the southwest corner of the south tunnel parking lot. There is no media will call. Provided arrangements are made in advance, passes will be left at this will-call location.

- Please contact the CSU Athletics media relations office to request video highlights.

- The weekly news release will be available by approximately 12 noon each Monday during the season on the school's official Web site, CSURAMS.com. News releases are also e-mailed to media outlets upon request, and available by Twitter link via @CSUFootball.

- Five of Colorado State's last six victories over CU have been by six points or fewer, with the exception being the Rams' 41-14 victory over then No. 14-ranked CU to open the 1999 season at Mile High Stadium.
- Sophomore K Jared Roberts, a native of Littleton, Colo., who was awarded a scholarship just nine days ago (Aug. 23), opened up scoring with a 47-yard field goal midway through the first half. Roberts also gave Colorado State its final lead, 19-17, with 6:39 remaining with a 49-yarder at the 6:36 mark of the fourth quarter. He also added a 32-yarder with 2:56 left in the game to cushion the Rams' lead, 22-17.
- Each of Roberts' first two field goals marked the longest for Colorado State since Jason Smith's 52-yarder at Utah on Oct. 18, 2008.
- Roberts became the first Colorado State kicker with three field goals in a game since Ben DeLine went 3-for-4 in the Rams' 43-10 victory over UNLV on Oct. 16, 2010.
- Colorado State's defense recorded five quarterback sacks in today's victory over Colorado, led by redshirt freshman LB Cory James who notched three (including a forced fumble).
- It marks the most sacks by CSU's defense in a single game since the Rams racked up nine in a season-opening victory at New Mexico in 2011.
- Freshman WR Joe Hansley, a native of nearby Highlands Ranch, Colo., recorded his first-career reception and touchdown against Colorado.
- Nwoke, a preseason all-MW selection, carried the ball 11 times for 47 yards, all in the first half on Saturday. He did not see action in the second half because of an injury to a lower extremity.
- With Nwoke limited, three Rams' running backs recorded their first-career carries in today's game.
- Redshirt freshman Donnell Alexander had eight carries for 66 yards.
- Freshman Tommey Morris recorded three carries for just four yards.
- Junior TE/H-Back Joe Brown also carried the ball out of the backfield for the first time in his career, notching 11 carries for 21 yards, including key totes with the Rams backed up against their own goal line late in the third quarter.
- Redshirt freshman LB Cory James recorded three sacks in his first-career game at Colorado State, all in the first half. His third sack of the game also resulted in a forced fumble by CU quarterback Jordan Webb.
- It is the second straight season that a CSU player has recorded three or more sacks in an opener. (Nordly Capi; 3.5 sacks at New Mexico, Sept. 3, 2011)
- Actor John Amos (Roots, The West Wing, The Mary Tyler Moore Show, Coming to America), a Colorado State alumnus and former football player, spoke to the Rams at the team hotel last night.
- Today's captains for Colorado State were : junior RB Chris Nwoke, junior OL Weston Richburg, senior LB Shaquil Barrett, and senior LB James Skelton.
- The temperature at kickoff for today's game was 94 degrees. It marks the warmest starting temperature in the history of the Rocky Mountain Showdown.
- Colorado State debuted a new look with a return to a simpler uniform this year. Additionally, the Rams have added a pumpkin orange "A" on the back of their helmets as a nod to the team's heritage as the Colorado A&M Aggies.

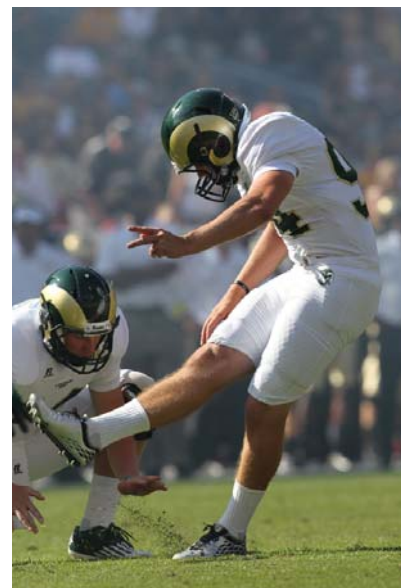


SR • OL • *Weston Richburg*

Porter wants to get into coaching one day and CSU is a great place to get that start. The Super Bowl champion linebacker has a great deal of knowledge that he can pass on to current CSU athletes and he is determined to make them, not only better football players, but better young men.

DR. GREG MYERS TO BE HONORED

One of the most decorated student-athletes in Colorado State University history, Greg Myers, will be honored at halftime of the Rams' 2013 home opener, Sept. 14 game vs. Cal Poly. Myers' jersey number 3 and his name will be displayed on the press box, alongside Thurman "Fum" McGraw and Eddie Hanna.

Myers, the 1995 recipient of the Jim Thorpe Award, was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in December 2012.

MR. RELIABLE

Senior center **Weston Richburg** is not only one of the most decorated Rams on the roster, he is also the most experienced. The 6-4, 300-pounder from Bushland, Texas, has started all 36 games of his career entering 2013. A preseason candidate for the Rimington Trophy, Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award for the second year in a row, Richburg is one of just three centers in the nation with 36 or more career starts, joining Utah State's Tyler Larsen (38) and Arkansas' Travis Swanson (38). He is tied for 14th in the nation among all players in career starts entering 2013.

FIVE RAMS ARE CSU GRADUATES

Guard **Jordan Gragert**, long-snapper **Tanner Hedstrom**, tight end **Joe McKay**, running back **Chris Nwoke** and center **Weston Richburg** are playing their final season for the Rams in 2013 after having graduated with bachelor's degrees this past spring or summer. Richburg (animal science) graduated after summer classes, while Gragert (sociology), Hedstrom (health & exercise science), McKay (liberal arts) and Nwoke (business administration) received their degrees in May.

NEW RADIO FLAGSHIP FOR RAMS IN 2013

The Colorado State Rams will have a new radio home in 2013 for football and men's and women's basketball, on 105.5 FM ESPN. A new play-by-play voice also joins the team this year, with veteran Denver television sportscaster Gary Miller behind the microphone, joined by long-time radio team member Brian Roth on color commentary. Roth is in his 15th year as part of the CSU football broadcast team, including the last three years in the play-by-play seat. In addition to its 105.5 flagship, the Rams Radio Network includes KREL 1580 AM ESPN in Colorado Springs and Pueblo; KSIR 1100 AM in Fort Morgan; KRFD 94.5 FM in Sterling and KNZZ 1100 AM in Grand Junction.

JIM MCELWAIN

Head Coach | 2nd Year at CSU | 29th Year Coaching



Jim McElwain enters his second season as head coach of the Rams in 2013, looking to build upon the positive momentum established in his debut season. McElwain's team won three of its last five games – including three in a row at home – and posted the program's best record since 2008 (4-8).

In addition to the measurable on-field improvement, McElwain's complete overhaul of the program in this "Bold New Era" has reshaped the players' mind-set and re-energized the fan base.

McElwain, a 28-year coaching veteran, became the 20th head football coach in Colorado State program history on Dec. 13, 2011. He spent the 2008-11 seasons as offensive coordinator at Alabama, where he played a key role in leading the Crimson Tide to two BCS national championship wins (2009 and '11).

In his first game as head coach, McElwain immediately put his stamp on the CSU program, guiding the Rams to a come-from-behind 22-19 victory over in-state rival Colorado, on Sept. 1, 2012. In so doing, McElwain became the first CSU head football coach since 1970 to win his first game and the first to defeat Colorado in his first Rocky Mountain Showdown.

Whether as a head coach or a coordinator, McElwain has not lost a season opener at the college level since 2004 when he was at Michigan State, a span that has produced seven consecutive wins.

The Rams under McElwain in 2012 showed consistent progress over the second half of the season, most notably on offense where the team averaged 163.3 rushing yards per game over the last four contests, after netting 96.2 yards on the ground in the first six. Colorado State, despite seeing three different quarterbacks make at least three starts each because of injury for the first time since 1981, tied for 17th in the nation (2nd Mountain West) in red-zone scoring at 87.5 percent (21-24). In their eight conference games, the Rams' efficiency was 15-of-17 (88.2 percent).

A school-record 18 different Colorado State players scored touchdowns in McElwain's debut season, tied for second-most in the nation, while seeing 19 players make their first career start, eighth-most among NCAA FBS programs.

Defensively, the 2012 Rams ranked fourth in the Mountain West in passing yards allowed (203.2; 27th FBS). Six Rams earned All-Mountain West honors under McElwain's tutelage, including one first-team selection (P Pete Kontodiakos) and two second-teamers (DE Lanston Tanyi and K Jared Roberts).

McElwain, 51, came to Fort Collins from Alabama, where he had served as Nick Saban's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach from 2008-11. His hire was officially announced on Dec. 13, 2011, in a press conference on the Colorado State campus. McElwain returned to campus early the morning of Jan. 10, 2012, just hours after his Crimson Tide defeated previous No. 1 LSU in New Orleans to claim its second national championship in three seasons. He hit the ground running as the Rams' new leader and has rapidly reshaped the entire program in large part defining what Colorado State's "Bold New Era" is all about.

NOTABLE GAME ON THE SCHEDULE

On Sept. 21 the Rams will travel 1,300 miles south to Tuscaloosa, Ala., as McElwain and his Rams take on his former team, Alabama. McElwain was the offensive coordinator of the Crimson Tide from 2008-2011. In 2012, CSU played host to Fresno State, a school where McElwain was the offensive coordinator in 2007.

OTHER SCHEDULE NOTES

- Tulsa will have nine days to prepare for Colorado State.
- For the first time since 1996, the Rams will travel to Honolulu, Hawai'i to take on the Warriors. The Rams escaped Honolulu with a 28-16 victory. 2013 will mark the 12th visit to Hawai'i.
- Colorado State and Wyoming have met every year since 1946 and only twice since have the Rams played back-to-back years in Laramie. In 2013, CSU travels north to Laramie, just like last season. The last time the Rams made consecutive trips to Laramie was in 1963 and '64.
- The Rams look to snap a streak of seven consecutive losses to Air Force, when the Falcons come to Fort Collins on Nov. 30.

MEETING NO. 1

Both preseason AP and USA Today Top 25 polls have the Alabama Crimson Tide ranked as the top team in the country. Alabama open the season with a tough neutral site game vs. Virginia Tech before traveling to College Station, Texas to take on Texas A&M. Should Alabama win both games and keep its No. 1 ranking, it will be the second time the Rams have faced the nation's top-ranked team. The first matchup against No. 1 came in 2004 when the Rams traveled to USC and went up against Matt Leinart, LenDale White and Reggie Bush.

MENTAL CONDITIONING

Colorado State football is among a handful of programs to adopt a mental conditioning program. It is a program that McElwain became familiar with at Alabama and one that he thought would be critical in bringing success to Fort Collins. Immediately, McElwain hired Dr. Lowell Wightman after meeting during a player academic meeting where the two discovered they shared a belief that shaping and changing a team culture requires the brain and body working together.

During the summer players go through a mental conditioning program and meet with top experts in this field. For the second consecutive year, McElwain invited Trevor Moawad, Vice President of Mindset Programs from Athlete's Performance, to come speak to his team. McElwain and Moawad met at Alabama and have since become friends.

FREE TUITION

On Saturday, Aug. 24, the Colorado State athletic department hosted its first annual RAMbunctious Pep Rally. This event was designed to get incoming freshmen at CSU excited about athletic events as part of Ram Welcome activities. During the event Andrew Schneeweis made a half court shot for a year's worth of tuition, paid for by head coaches Jim McElwain, Larry Eustachy (men's basketball), Tom Hilbert (volleyball), and Ryun Williams (women's basketball). The four had come up with the plan just days before the event.

"We're really excited we could be a part of something like that. Our students are such a big part of what we do, and we appreciate their support of our programs. To have all those new students come out and show their excitement last night was outstanding, and we as coaches wanted to do something to show our appreciation," McElwain said. "Andrew Showed he has what it takes to operate under pressure. We talk to our student-athletes all the time about rising to the occasion and responding in pressure situations, and what Andrew did last night speaks volumes about that very thing. It was incredible to see that shot go in."

YOUTH MOVEMENT

In Colorado State's first depth chart of the 2013 campaign, the Rams have 32 underclassmen (15 frosh. & 17 soph.) on their two-deep.
