The Pac-12 posted a 28-15 record (.676) in non-conference play last season, marking the 29th consecutive season of posting a winning record outside the league.

KICK IT OFF: The Pac-12 kicks off its 98th season with an unprecedented eight Thursday games, four Friday contests and one Sunday game, to go along with the traditional slate of Saturday games. Ten Pac-12 games will be played Thursday-Sunday on the opening weekend of the college football season. Of the seven home games played during the first weekend three will appear on the Pac-12 Networks.

THE POLLS: For the second time in league history, and in back-to-back years, two Pac-12 teams appear among the Top 5 in the AP preseason poll - No. 3 OREGON and No. 4 STANFORD. In the Coaches poll, the Ducks and Cardinal hold down the same ranking spots. In both polls, UCLA comes in at No. 21, USC at No. 24 and OREGON STATE at No. 25. ARIZONA, ARIZONA STATE and WASHINGTON received votes in both polls.

NON-LEAGUE SLATE: The Pac-12's non-conference schedule of 37 games includes matchups with 12 opponents who are ranked or received votes in the preseason AP and/or USA Today polls. Keep an eye on week three as the schedule features three games against teams ranked among the Top 25 - No. 23 Wisconsin at ARIZONA STATE; No. 2 Ohio State at CALIFORNIA; No. 21 UCLA at No. 18 Nebraska.

THE PAC-12 SCHEDULE: Each conference team will play a nine-game schedule that includes five games within its own division and four games in the other division. Teams with the best record in their respective divisions will meet in the Pac-12 title game on Saturday, Dec. 7 (ESPN or ABC). The team with the best Conference record will host the Pac-12 Championship game.

RETURNING SIGNAL-CALLERS: Eight returning starters line up behind center led by All-Pac-12 first team selection **Marcus Mariota** (league-best 163.2 passing efficiency/32 TDs). Only two seniors among the returning starters - Washington's **Keith Price** (209.8 ypg/19 TDs) and Colorado's **Jordan Webb** (143.4 ypg). Plenty of young arms to keep the Pac-12 offenses moving with Arizona State's **Taylor Kelly** (159.9 passing efficiency/29 TDs), UCLA's **Brett Hundley** (292.5 ypg total offense/29 TDs), Oregon State's **Sean Mannion** (244.6 ypg/15 TDs), and Stanford's **Kevin Hogan** (only started last five games, but that was an impressive string of five straight wins over No. 13 Oregon State, No. 1 Oregon, No. 17 UCLA, No. 16 UCLA and Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl).

TOP RUSHER/TOP RECEIVER: The Pac-12 features the FBS's top returning rusher in Arizona's **Ka'Deem Carey** (1,929 yards/142.4 ypg) and the top returning receiver in USC's **Marqise Lee** (1,721 yards/132.4 ypg). Lee, the reigning Biletnikoff Award winner, also topped the league in all-purpose yards (206.4 ypg). In addition, a trio of 1,000-yard gainers return in Washington RB **Bishop Sankey** (1,439 rushing)/16 TDs), Arizona WR **Austin Hill** (1,364 receiving/11 TD), although Hill will be sidelined with a knee injury suffered during spring practice, and Oregon State FL **Brandin Cooks** (1,151 receiving/5 TDs). A pair of 900-yard rushers return and are expected to carry a bigger load - Oregon State's **Storm Woods** (941 yards/13 TDs) and USC's **Silas Redd** (905 yards/9 TDs).

DON'T MISS ON THESE GUYS: The Conference has its share of quality tight ends that include Arizona State's **Chris Coyle** (57 rec/12.2 ypc), Oregon's **Colt Lyerla** (25 rec/15.7 ypc/6 TDs), Oregon State's **Connor Hamlett** (32 rec/12.6 ypc/3 TDs), USC duo of **Xavier Grimble** and **Randall Telfer** (combined 41 rec/10.1 ypc/9 TDs), Utah's **Jake Murphy** (33 rec/10.6 ypc/4 TDs), and Washington's **Austin Seferian-Jenkins** (69 rec/12.3 ypc/7 TDs).

THE TRENCHES: On the offensive side, keep an eye on Stanford tackle **David Yankey** (team allowed just 20 sacks all season), Oregon center **Hroniss Grasu** (Ducks led Pac-12 in total offense with 537.4 ypg), UCLA guard **Xavier Su'a Filo** (Bruins posted 466.5 ypg total offense), Arizona's 6-8 bookend tackles **Mickey Baucus** and **Fabbians Ebbele** (Wildcats posted 526.2 ypg in total offense). . . On the defensive side, Oregon State end **Scott Crichton** (9.0 sacks), Arizona State nose tackle **Will Sutton** (23.5 tackles for loss), USC end **Morgan Breslin** (13.0 sacks), Utah end **Trevor Reilly** (69 tackles), and Stanford end **Ben Gardner** (7.5 sacks) provide a formidable front for their respective teams.

DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE: With all the deserved attention focused on the Pac-12 offenses in recent years, the league's defenses are stepping up with some big time linebackers and defensive backs. Linebackers to keep an eye on include Stanford's trio of **Shayne Skov** (81 tackles), **A.J. Tarpley** (66 tackles) and **Trent Murphy** (56 tackles/10.0 sacks), UCLA duo of **Eric Kendricks** (149 tackles) and **Anthony Barr** (83 tackles/13.5 sacks), Washington State's **Darryl Monroe** (80 tackles), Washington's **Shaq Thompson** (74 tackles/3 INT), USC's **Hayes Pullard** (107 tackles), Colorado's **Derrick Webb** (88 tackles), and California's **Nick Forbes** (85 tackles). The league's secondary defenders to watch are Oregon State's **Rashaad Reynolds** (75 tackles/3 INT), Oregon's **Ifo Ekpre-Olomu** (63 tackles/4 INT), Stanford's **Ed Reynolds** (47 tackles/6 INT), Washington State's **Deone Bucannon** (106 tackles/4 INT), Arizona's **Jared Tevis** (82 tackles/2 INT), Arizona State's **Alden Darby** (80 tackles/3 INT), and Utah safeties **Eric Rowe** (64 tackles) and **Brian Belchen** (58 tackles).

THREE NEW COACHES: The Pac-12 North Division adds two new coaches with California's **Sonny Dykes** and Oregon's **Mark Helfrich**, while the South Division welcomes **Mike MacIntyre** to head Colorado's football program. That's seven new coaches in the Pac-12 over the last two years.

IF YOU BUILD IT...: Several campus facilities received a makeover the past year. Arizona added the Lowell-Stevens Football Facility to the north end zone of its stadium, while Utah just completed construction on a new football facility as well - the Spence and Cleone Eccles Football Center. After spending a year at CenturyLink Field, the Washington Huskies return to campus to a rebuilt Husky Stadium, and the Rose Bowl completed a facelift of its press box/suites. In addition, Stanford and Washington State added new start-of-the-art video boards in each of their stadiums.

ARIZONA: Junior RB **Ka'Deem Carey**, who led the nation in rushing last season (1,929 yards/148.4 ypg), returns to an offense that averaged 526.2 yards and 38.2 points per game . . . Missing from that offense is QB Matt Scott who engineered the Wildcat attack to over 4,000 yards in total offense. The 'Cats appear to be leaning towards senior QB **B.J. Denker** to lead Arizona's spread offense this season . . . The defense is led by senior LBs **Jake Fischer** (team-leading 119 tackles) and **Marquis Flowers** (100 tackles), as well as a deep secondary comprised of **Shaquille Richardson**, **Jared Tevis** and **Tra'Mayne Boundurant** . . . Head coach **Rich Rodriguez** has won seven of his last eight season-openers.

ARIZONA STATE: Senior DT **Will Sutton**, consensus All-American and reigning Pat Tillman Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year, leads a vaunted Sun Devil defensive rush that posted 52 sacks last season . . . Senior S **Alden Darby**, a Thorpe Award candidate, and the Sun Devil secondary held its own too as it allowed a league-low 167.9 passing yards per game . . . Junior QB Taylor Kelly is back under center after completing a school record 67.1 percent of his pass attempts for 3,039 yards and 29 TDs. Senior RB **Marion Grice** was on the receiving end for 425 yards (41 receptions/8 TDs), while rushing for 679 yards (6.6 yards per carry/11 TDs) . . . The Sun Devils have won 10 consecutive season openers.

CALIFORNIA: The **Sonny Dykes** era begins in Berkeley and he has tabbed true freshman QB **Jared Goff** to lead the Golden Bear offense. Goff, a local standout from Novato, Calif., earned numerous high school all-America honors and becomes the first true freshman to start at QB for the Bears . . . Goff will have several quality targets with sophomore receivers **Bryce Treggs** and **Chris Harper**, as well as junior **Richard Rogers**. The trio combined for 82 receptions for 1,048 yards and 4 TDs . . . The Bears host a pair of Big Ten teams during the first three weeks of the season with No. 22 Northwestern in the opener and No. 2 Ohio State in week three. Cal's non-conference opponents were a combined 25-11 last year. Since 2004, the Bears are 27-8 in non-conference play.

COLORADO: First-year coach **Mike MacIntyre** looks to turnaround the CU program as he did at San Jose State where he went from 1-12 in his first season (2010) to 11-2 last season . . . Junior **Connor Wood** appears to have the upper hand in the battle for starting QB duties and to run the new pistol offense . . . The Buffaloes led the nation last year in the most games started by true freshmen with 57 (Maryland was a distant second with 39), including the high of 38 on defense . . . One of those rookie starters in 2012 is sophomore RB **Christian Powell**, who rushed for a team-leading 691 yards and 7 TDs . . . Junior WR **Paul Richardson** is back and healthier than ever. He missed last season with a knee injury, but has tallied 73 receptions for 1,069 yards and 11 TDs in two seasons.

OREGON: The Ducks hold down the No. 3 spot in both preseason polls. It's the sixth consecutive season, and 11th overall, that the Ducks have been included in the AP preseason Top-25 . . . First-year head coach Mark Helfrich will continue to lead the fast-paced Oregon attack with sophomore QB **Marcus Mariota**, the 2012 Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, at the help of the Duck offense. The Ducks averaged 537.4 yards per game and 49.5 points per game as Mariota tossed a Pac-12 freshman record 32 TD passes while leading the league with a 163.2 efficiency rating . . . Oregon returns seven defense starters, including the entire secondary led by junior CB **Ifo Ekpre-Olomu** (4 INT/16 BPU). The Ducks snagged a Pac-12 best 26 interceptions last season.

OREGON STATE: Junior **Sean Mannion** and senior **Cody Vaz** are battling for the starting nod at quarterback. The two combined to throw for 3,926 yards and 26 TDs last season . . . Regardless of who takes the snaps, the Beavers will have sophomore RB **Storm Woods** (940 yards/13 TDs) to carry the ball and WR **Brandin Cooks** (1,151 yards/5 TDs) as a primary target in the passing game . . . The OSU defense was one of the best in the league last season as the Beavers ranked third in both rush defense (129.5 ypg) and pass defense (224.5 ypg) . . . Junior DE **Scott Crichton** paced the Beavers with 17.5 tackles for loss, including 9.0 sacks. Senior DB **Rashaad Reynolds** led the secondary with 13 pass breakups . . . Head coach Mike Riley is 11-1 in home openers.

STANFORD: At No. 4, the Cardinal have attained their highest preseason ranking in school history. Stanford has been ranked for 45 consecutive weeks dating back to Sept. 5, 2010. The streak marks the school's longest continuous ranking in the poll . . . Stanford is 35-5 over the past three seasons . . . Currently the longest winning streak in the Pac-12 at 8 games, and the league's longest home field winning streak at 9 games . . . QB **Kevin Hogan** (71.7 completion percentage) will run the Stanford attack behind an impressive offensive line led by All-American **David Yankey** (6-5, 313), **Cameron Fleming** (6-6, 318) and **Andrus Peat** (6-7, 312) . . . Stanford enters the season with one of the top defensive units in the nation. The Cardinal limited opponents to just 97.0 yards rushing and 17.2 ppg last season.

UCLA: Sophomore QB **Brett Hundley** looks to take the Bruins to a third straight Pac-12 Championship Game. Hundley threw for 3,740 yards and 29 TDs last season while setting a UCLA single-season record with 4,095 yards in total offense (5th best all-time in Pac-12 history) . . . Four of five offensive linemen return to protect Hundley and to provide holes for the rushing game, highlighted by junior **Xavier Su'a-Filo** . . . Seniors **Anthony Barr** and **Jordan Zumalt**, and junior **Eric Kendricks** provide the Bruins with one of their best set of linebackers in years. Kendricks led the Pac-12 in tackles last season with 149 (10.6 pg), while Barr was among the league leaders with 13.5 sacks (0.96 pg) and 21.5 tackles for loss (1.54 pg).

USC: Replacing Matt Barkley at quarterback may be a two-man job with sophomores **Cody Kessler** and **Max Wittek**. While a starter has yet to be named, both are expected to play in the season-opener at Hawai'i. Regardless of who takes the snaps, they'll have plenty of talent on the receiving end of their passes . . . Junior WR **Marqise Lee**, the reigning Biletnikoff Award winner, owns or shares 22 USC records. Five are Pac-12 marks, including most receptions in a season (118) and yards receiving in a season (1,721). A pair of Mackey Award preseason nominees in tight ends in **Xavier Grimble** and **Randall Telfer**, who have combined for 82 receptions and 18 TDs . . . The Trojan defense returns seven starters, including a defensive front that was responsible for 38 of the team's 45 sacks. Senior DE **Morgan Breslin** led the squad with 13.0 sacks and 19.5 tackles for loss.

UTAH: Dennis Erickson, a three-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year (at three different schools - Washington State, Oregon State, Arizona State) has joined Brian Johnson as co-offensive coordinator to help jump start the Ute offense this season . . . Sophomore QB **Travis Wilson**, who became the starter midway through last season, will rely on a pair of senior tight ends in **Jake Murphy** and **Westlee Tonga**. Wilson completed 62.7 percent of his pass attempts for 1,311 yards and seven TDs . . . Freshman PK **Andy Phillips** has never played in a football game. He's a former five-year member of the U.S. Ski Team (2007-11) . . . Utah State is Utah's oldest rival and the series, in its 111th game, is the 12th-longest in NCAA FBS history. The first football game in Utah history was against USU in 1892.

WASHINGTON: One of three schools to return its leading passer, rusher and receiver (also Arizona State and Colorado) . . . The Husky offense returns 10 of 11 starters from a year ago . . . Senior QB **Keith Price** has thrown for 5,953 yards and tossed 54 TD passes in his career . . . Junior RB **Bishop Sankey** is one of two returning Pac-12 running backs to top 1,000 yards rushing last season with 1,439 yards and 16 TDs . . . Senior tight end **Austin Seferian-Jenkins** (69 receptions, 850 yards, 7 TDs) and sophomore WR **Kasen Williams** (77 receptions, 878 yards, 6 TDs) provide a dual receiving threat for the Huskies . . . The defense is led by a pair of talented linebackers in senior **John Timu** (team-leading 91 tackles in 2012) and sophomore **Shaq Thompson** (74 tackles).

WASHINGTON STATE: As with several other Pac-12 teams, the quarterback position is not completely firmed up for the Cougars, but **Connor Halliday** appears to have the upper hand. Halliday started five games last season, throwing for 1,874 yards and 15 TDs . . . All-Pac-12 FS **Deone Bucannon** (team high 105 tackles in 2012) leads a veteran Cougar secondary . . . Junior PK **Andrew Furney** is a preseason Lou Groza Award candidate. He connected on 14 of 20 field goal attempts last season, including all seven attempts within 30 yards. He nailed a 60-yard field goal last season against Eastern Washington, the longest in the Pac-12 since former Cougar Jason Hanson set the Pac-12 record with a 62-yarder vs. UNLV in 1991.

2012 PAC-12 CHAMPIONSHIP GAME: Stanford 27, UCLA 24

OREGON TABBED TO WIN PAC-12 TITLE IN PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

CULVER CITY, Calif. - OREGON is the favorite to win the 2013 Pac-12 Conference football title in a preseason poll of media members who cover the league. The Ducks were listed in the top spot in the North Division by 15 of the 26 voters participating in the poll, collecting 145 points. Fourteen of those pollsters tabbed the Ducks to come out on top in the Pac-12 Championship Game. STANFORD was picked to finish second in the North Division, collecting 11 first-place votes in the balloting for the division race.

UCLA was picked to win the South Division, garnering 135 points and 12 first-place votes, while ARIZONA STATE, which tallied 10 first-place votes, and collected 130 points, was pegged a close second in this year's poll. USC was predicted by the voters to finish third in the South Division, claiming the remaining four first place votes.

The media poll has correctly selected the Conference Champion in 28 of 52 previous polls, including 11 of the last 13. Following are the results of the preseason media poll (points 6-5-4-3-2-1, first-place votes in parentheses):

PAC-12 CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The Pac-12 Championship Football Game will take place Saturday, December 7 at 8 p.m. ET/5 p.m. PT and telecast to a national audience on ABC/ESPN. The Championship game will match the winner of the North Division vs. the winner of the South Division. The game will be played on the campus of the division winner with the best overall conference record. The winner of the Pac-12 Championship will earn the league's automatic BCS berth.

TIE-BREAK PROCEDURES TO DETERMINE DIVISION CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP GAME HOST

The Division Champion will be determined by the record in all games played (both divisional and cross-divisional) within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game representatives

Two-Team Tie.

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
 - a. If no game is played between the two tied teams or that game ends in a tie, the following tie-breaking procedures would be applied:
2. Record in games played within the division
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (Based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest BCS Ranking following the last weekend of regular-season games.
6. Total number of wins in a 12-game season. The following conditions will apply to the calculation of the total number of wins:
 - a. Only one win against a team from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision or lower division will be counted annually.
 - b. Any games that are exempted from counting against the annual maximum number of football contests per NCAA rules (current Bylaw 17.9.5.2) shall not be included.
7. Coin toss.

Multiple-Team Ties.

The following procedures will only be used to eliminate all but two teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure will be applied.

1. Head-to-head (Best record in games among the tied teams).
2. Record in games played within the division.
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest BCS ranking following the last weekend of regular-season games.

Pac-12 Championship Game Host

The Pac-12 Championship Game Host will be determined by the record in all games played within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game host.

Tie-breaking Procedure.

1. Head-to-head, if applicable.
2. Highest BCS Ranking following the last weekend of Pac-12 regular-season games.
3. Record against the next highest-placed common opponent in the conference (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the conference.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Coin toss.

PAC-12 BOWL ARRANGEMENTS - 2013-14

The Pac-12 is in the final year of a four-year bowl cycle. The Pac-12 Conference has agreements with seven bowl partners. The lineup is led by the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, which is the destination for the Pac-12 champion, unless said champion is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final Bowl Championship Series rankings. If that were the case, the Pac-12 champion would play in the BCS National Championship Game hosted by the Discover Orange Bowl. Regardless of the disposition of the Pac-12 champion, a second Pac-12 team may be selected for an at-large berth in the Bowl Championship Series in any given year and other Pac-12 bowl partner arrangements provide for that occurrence. In addition to the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Pac-12 bowl partners include, in order of selection, the Valero Alamo Bowl in San Antonio, Bridgeport Education Holiday Bowl in San Diego, Hyundai Sun Bowl in El Paso, the Las Vegas Bowl, the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl in San Francisco, and the Gildan New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque.
