The Pac-12 posted has posted a winning record outside league for 30 consecutive seasons . . . The Pac-12 recorded a 37-9 record in non-conference action last season, posting the most wins ever outside of conference play. Since 1934, only one other season witnessed the Conference capture more than 29 wins in non-league play - 2002 (32-15) when the league played an eight game conference schedule, allowing an additional 10 non-conference games to be played.

AROUND THE PAC-12

KICK IT OFF: All 12 teams will be in action during the opening week of the season as the Pac-12 kicks off its 99th season. The 2014 season features eight Thursday games and eight Friday contests, including the Pac-12 Championship Game, to go along with the traditional slate of Saturday games.

THE POLLS: Six Pac-12 teams grace the preseason Top 25 polls. While the Conference had six teams listed in the final AP poll of the 2013 season, this marks the first time the league has placed six teams in the preseason polls.

NON-LEAGUE SLATE/PAC-12 SCHEDULE: The Pac-12's non-conference schedule of 37 games includes matchups with 10 opponents who are ranked or received votes in the preseason AP and/or USA Today polls. . . Each Conference team will play a nine-game league schedule that includes five games within its own division and four games in the other division. Teams with the best record in their respective divisions will meet in the Pac-12 title game on Friday, Dec. 5 (FOX). This year's game will be played at Levi's Stadium in Santa Clara, Calif.

RETURNING SIGNAL-CALLERS: Ten returning starters line up behind center led by two-time All-Pac-12 first team selection **Marcus Mariotta** (league-best 167.7 passing efficiency/31 TDs). He's tossed 63 TDs over two seasons and will have a chance to become the first Pac-12 QB to earn first-team league honors three times. Only three seniors among the returning starters - Arizona State's **Taylor Kelly** (303.1 ypg total offense/28 TDs), Oregon State's **Sean Mannion** (358.6 passing ypg/37 TDs), and Washington State's **Connor Halliday** (353.6 passing ypg/34 TDs). Mannion and Halliday posted the top two season passing totals in Pac-12 history with 4,662 and 4,597 passing yards respectively; Mariotta and Kelly set school single-season records with 4,380 and 4,243 total yards respectively. Mannion needs just 1,839 passing yards to set the Pac-12 career record. UCLA's versatile **Brett Hundley** (152.9 passing efficiency/293.8 ypg total offense/24 TDs) has steadily climbed the school's charts, moving up to third in total offense with 7,914 yards and 53 TD passes over the past two seasons

TOP RUSHER/TOP RECEIVER: The league loses its top four rushers from last season, including NFL Draft picks Arizona's Ka'Deem Carey (1,885 yards), Washington's Bishop Sankey (1,869 yards), Stanford's Tyler Gaffney (1,709 yards). However, Pac-12 ground attacks will feature the young legs of Oregon junior **Byron Marshall** (1,038 yards), USC juniors **Tre Madden** (703 yards) and **Javorius Allen** (785 yards/14 TDs), Oregon sophomore **Thomas Tyner** (711 yards) and Colorado sophomore **Michael Adkins II** (535 yards). . . Similar to the league's rushing attack, the Pac-12 loses its top three receivers from last season - Oregon State's Brandin Cooks (1,730 yds/16 TDs), Colorado's Paul Richardson (1,343 yds/10 TDs) and Oregon's Josh Huff (1,140 yds/12 TDs) have moved on to the NFL. Looking to establish themselves as the go-to receiver are Utah senior **Dres Anderson** (1,002 yds/7 TDs), Arizona State sophomore **Jaelen Strong** (1,122 yds/7 TDs), Stanford senior **Tyler Montgomery** (958 yds/10 TDs), California's **Chris Harper** (852 yds/5 TDs) and **Bryce Treggs** (751 yds), USC's **Nelson Agholor** (918 yds/6 TDs) and Washington State's **Gabe Marks** (807 yds/7 TDs). Arizona junior **Austin Hill** redshirted last season following a knee injury, but is ready to post similar numbers achieved in 2012 - 81 rec/1,364 yds/11 TDs.

THE TRENCHES: Oregon center **Hroniss Grasu** looks to guide a veteran Duck offensive line that helped lead the Pac-12 in total offense with 565.0 ypg and rushing offense with 273.5 ypg. . . Arizona, which was second in the league in rushing at 264.9 ypg, returns four of its five offensive linemen, including tackle **Mickey Baucus** who has started all 38 games in his career. . . Washington finished third in the league in rushing at 238.9 ypg behind a line that boasts three seniors who each started all 13 games in 2013 - **Micah Hatchie** (LT), **Mike Criste** (C) and **Ben Riva** (RT). . . Stanford's defensive front stifled the opposition's running attack, limiting them to 89.4 ypg on the ground. Senior DT **David Parry** and senior DE **Henry Anderson** will continue that trend for the Cardinal in 2014. . . USC junior **Leonard Williams**, one of the nation's premier defensive linemen, will continue to guide a Trojan defense that led the league in total defense (335.2 ypg). . . Utah's senior DE **Nate Orchard** anchors a Ute defensive unit that allowed just 130.3 rushing ypg last season. . .

DEFENSES SHOWCASE BOTH YOUNG AND VETERAN TALENT: Colorado sophomore LB **Addison Gillam**, who led the Pac-12 in tackles (107 tackles/8.9 avg) last season, and UCLA sophomore LB **Myles Jack**, both the Offensive and Defensive Freshman of the Year in the Pac-12 last season, will spearhead young and talented defenses this season. . . UCLA's defense will count on the combination of Jack (76 tackles/5.8 avg) and senior **Eric Kendricks** (105 tackles/8.8 avg). USC will rely on the leadership of senior **Hayes Pullard** (94 tackles/6.7 avg). Washington's junior **Shaq Thompson** (78/6.0 avg) and senior **John Timu** (77/6.4 avg) provide new coach **Chris Petersen** with a couple of veteran linebackers. Other linebackers to keep tabs on include Utah junior **Jason Whittingham** (81 tackles/8.1 avg), Washington State junior **Darryl Monroe** (94 tackles/7.2 avg), Oregon's **Derrick Malone** (105 tackles/8.1 avg) and Stanford's **A.J. Tarpley** (93 tackles/6.6 avg). . . The league's secondary defenders to watch include Oregon senior **Ifo Ekpre-Olomu** (84 tackles/6.5 per game), Arizona senior **Jared Tevis** (83 tackles/7.5 avg), Oregon State senior **Tyriquek Zimmerman** (104 tackles/8.0 avg), USC sophomore **Su'a Cravens** and senior **Josh Shaw**, Stanford senior **Jordan Richards**, and UCLA's entire secondary returns and is led by senior **Anthony Jefferson** (89 tackles/6.8 avg).

MORE THAN JUST SPECIAL: Utah sophomore PK **Andy Phillips** was perfect on PAT conversions (41-41) and hit 85 percent of his FG attempts (17-20, long 51), while Ute junior punter **Tom Hackett** led the league with a 43.4 yard average. . . Arizona State sophomore PK **Zane Gonzalez** established a Sun Devil single-season scoring mark with 138 points as he hit 63 of 65 PAT attempts and 25 of 30 FG attempts. . . Stanford's Montgomery gives the Cardinal a boost in their return game as he led the league with a 30.3 yard kick return average and returned two kicks for TDs, while USC receiver **Nelson Agholor** topped the league in punt returns averaging 19.1 yards per return with a pair of touchdowns.

ARIZONA: The offensive line returns pretty much intact with seniors **Mickey Baucus** (38 starts) and **Fabbians Ebbele** (37 starts) at tackle, junior G **Cayman Bundage** and senior C **Steven Gurrola**. The Cats averaged 264.9 rushing yards per game and allowed just 1.31 sacks per game behind that group. Could be the deepest set of receivers in school history led by four sophomores in **Samajie Grant** (47 rec/373 yds), **Nate Phillips** (51 rec/696 yds/7 TDs), **Cayleb Jones**, and **DaVonté Neal**. In addition, senior **Austin Hill**, who sat out last season with a torn ACL, is ready to replicate his 2012 performance (81 rec/1,364 yds/11 TDs). It's just a matter of determining a signal-caller to get the ball to the talented wideouts. Look for freshman **Anu Solomon** to emerge as the leader among those battling to be the starting signal caller.

ARIZONA STATE: QB **Taylor Kelly** returns for his senior season after setting the school's single-season total offense mark with 4,243 yards (5th best in Pac-12 history). He threw for 3,635 yards and 28 TDs in 2013, bringing his career total to 6,605 yards and 57 TDs. His primary target will be junior WR **Jaalen Strong** (75 rec/1,112 yds). As a freshman last season, PK **Zane Gonzalez** set an ASU single-season scoring record that stood for more than 60 years with 138 points as he hit on a league-best 25 of 35 field goal attempts and 63 of 65 point after attempts. Dynamic junior RB **D.J. Foster** should be ready to shoulder the load in the backfield. He hauled in 63 receptions, most by a running back in the FBS last year, for 653 yards and added another 501 yards on the ground.

CALIFORNIA: Sophomore QB **Jared Goff**, who broke school single-season records for passing yards (3,508) and total offense (3,446), showed his durability as he was just one of three players to start all 12 games last season. His primary targets will be junior receivers **Chris Harper** (70 rec/852 yds/5 TDs) and **Bryce Treggs** (77 rec/751 yds). The Golden Bears will need to bolster their running attack that ranked ninth in the league (122.2 ypg) to balance out the offense. Junior RB **Daniel Lasco** (317 yds) and sophomore RB **Khalfani Muhammad** (445 yds) could get the bulk of the carries in the backfield. Muhammad led the Bears in rushing and set a school record for kickoff return yards (1,006), while his all-purpose yardage (148.6 ypg) was sixth in the Pac-12.

COLORADO: Sophomore QB **Sefo Liufau** gained considerable experience last season after he ditched his redshirt five games into the 2013 season and proceeded to lead the Buffs with 1,779 passing yards (254.1 ypg) and 12 TDs. Junior RB **Christian Powell** (562 yds) and sophomore **Michael Adkins II** (535 yds) combined for 1,097 yards on the ground with 9 TDs. The Colorado running backs coughed it up just once in 376 touches. The 14 fumbles by CU all season was a school record, besting the previous best of 17 set in 10 games during the 1960 season. With the athleticism of Liufau and three veteran offensive linemen returning (junior **Stephane Nembot** and seniors **Daniel Munyer** and **Kiwi Crabb**), the running game should continue to improve for the Buffs. The receiving corps will be led by junior WR **Nelson Spruce** (55 rec/650 yds/4 TDs) and senior **D.D. Goodson** (22 rec/306 yds/2 TDs).

OREGON: The Ducks' offense should continue to put up its Pac-12 leading numbers of a year ago in scoring (45.5 ppg), rushing offense (273.5 avg) and total offense (565.0 avg, second best in Pac-12 history). Junior QB **Marcus Mariota** led the Pac-12 in passing efficiency (167.7) and in two seasons has thrown for 6,342 yards and 63 TDs. Senior C **Hroniss Grasu**, a two-time All-Pac-12 performer and Rimington Award preseason watch list honoree, anchors a line that allowed just 18 sacks (1.38 avg) in 405 pass attempts. Running behind that line is junior **Byron Marshall** (1,038 yds/86.5 avg) and sophomore **Thomas Tyner** (711 yds/59.2 avg). Two-time All-Pac-12 senior CB **Ifo Ekpre-Okumu** (84 tackles/6.5 avg/3 Int.) returned for his final season and will roam the Oregon secondary that led the Pac-12 in pass defense (204.5 avg) and pass defense efficiency (105.5). Senior LB **Derrick Malone** (team-leading 105 tackles/8.1 avg) looks to keep the opposition off the scoreboard as the Ducks were second in the Pac-12 allowing just 20.5 ppg.

OREGON STATE: Senior QB **Sean Mannion** returns for his final season after tossing for a Pac-12 single-season record 4,662 yards last year. While the Beavers lost All-American WR Brandin Cooks and his 1,730 receiving yards/16 TDs to the NFL, Mannion will continue to spread the ball around to the likes of junior SE **Richard Mullaney** (52 rec/788 yds/4 TDs) and senior TE **Connor Hamlett** (40 rec/364 yds/5 TDs). The running back tandem of senior **Terron Ward** and junior **Storm Woods** will keep opposing defenses honest with their run capability as the two combined for 998 yards/11 TDs on the ground. The two also have good hands combining for 720 receiving yards/4 TDs. Capable junior C **Issac Seumalo** and sophomore RT **Sean Harlow** return up front, but the line took a hit losing three seniors from last year's unit that combined for 111 career starts and helped pave the way for an offense that scored a school-record 452 points (34.8 ppg).

STANFORD: The Cardinal have posted a record of 46-8 (.852) over the past four seasons under coach **David Shaw** and are one of two FBS teams (the other is Oregon) to win at least 11 games in each of those four seasons. With the departure of four offensive linemen and RB Tyler Gaffney (1,709 yards/122.1 avg/21 TDs), Stanford's offense will have a new look behind junior QB **Kevin Hogan** (2,630 passing yds/20 TDs/151.5 pass eff.). To win a third consecutive Pac-12 title, junior LT **Andrus Peat** will need to lead a revamped offensive line to help Hogan find time in getting the ball to his top receivers - senior WR **Ty Montgomery** (61 rec/958 yds/10 TDs), and junior WR **Devon Cajuste** (28 rec/642 yds/22.0 ypc/5 TDs). Montgomery led the league in kick returns (30.3 avg, 2 TDs).

UCLA: UCLA posted its first 10-win season since 2005, and did so with 18 true freshmen (and 16 redshirt freshmen) seeing action. That experience will help pave the way for junior QB **Brett Hundley** to continue to ascend the charts as one of the most productive UCLA quarterbacks. He's third in school history with 7,914 yards of total offense and 53 TD passes. Senior **Jordon James** (534 yds/5 TDs) and sophomore **Paul Perkins** (573 yds/6 TDs) will pick up the load in the running game. LB/RB **Myles Jack**, the Pac-12 Defensive AND Offensive Freshman of the Year, posted some impressive numbers in his short stint at running back (38 carries/267 yards/7.0 avg/7 TDs), but his prowess is on defense where he posted 75 tackles and broke up a team-best 11 passes. He'll pair up with senior **Eric Kendricks** (team-leading 105 tackles/8.8 avg) to form one the league's top set of linebackers.

USC: In his debut seasons, head coach **Steve Sarkisian** will rely on junior QB **Cody Kessler** who completed 65.4 percent of his pass attempts for 2,968 yards and 20 TDs. The balanced USC running game will showcase junior **Javorius Allen** (785 yds/5.8 avg/14 TDs) and **Tre Madden** (703 yds/5.1 avg/3 TDs). Kessler's go-to through the air will be junior WR **Nelson Agholor** (56 rec/918 yds/6 TDs), who doubles as a dangerous return man (led Pac-12 with 19.1 avg). Junior All-American DL **Leonard Williams** (74 tackles/5.7 avg/13.5 tfl/6 sacks) leads a talented front seven that includes veteran linebackers in seniors **Hayes Pullard** (team-high 94 tackles/6.7 avg), **J.R. Tavai** (56 tackles/8.0 tfl) and **Lamar Dawson** (35 tackles). The defensive backfield returns nearly intact led by senior **Josh Shaw** (67 tackles/5.2 avg) and sophomore **Su'a Cravens** (52 tackles).

UTAH: A healthy **Travis Wilson** (1,827 yds/16 TDs) returns to run the offense. The junior quarterback suffered a season-ending concussion in the ninth game of the season that threatened to end his career. His primary target will be senior WR **Dres Anderson**, who is one of the Pac-12's top returning receivers after hauling in 53 receptions for 1,002 yards (18.9 avg) and 7 TDs. The Utes have a pair of All-America candidates on special teams in sophomore PK **Andy Phillips** and junior P **Tom Hackett**. Phillips hit 17-of-20 field goal attempts, including a career-long 51-yarder, and was a perfect 41-of-41 on PATs. Hackett led the league in punting (43.4 avg), punts inside the 20 (27) and 50+ yard punts (19). Senior S **Brian Blechen** and senior FS **Eric Rowe** (69 tackles/5.8 avg) will provide leadership and experience on defense as each have 35 starts under their belt.

WASHINGTON: First-year coach **Chris Petersen** will need to replace talented quarterback Keith Price (2,966 passing yards/21 TDs) and running back Bishop Sankey (1,870 rushing yards/21 TDs). Best place to start is with the foundation of the offense, so the Huskies are fortunate to have all five starting linemen returning this season. The competition at quarterback has been strong between sophomores **Cyler Miles**, **Jeff Lindquist**, and redshirt freshman **Troy Williams**. Whoever lines up behind center will have their pick of receivers to throw to with the return of junior WR **Jaydon Mickens** (65 rec/688 yds/5 TDs) and senior WR **Kasen Williams** (29 rec/421 yds). Sophomore WR **John Ross** (16 rec/208 yds) also doubled as kick returner (23.2 avg). The Husky defense is solid at the line with four returning starters up front - DE/OLB **Hau'oli Kikaha**, DE/OLB **Cory Littleton**, DT **Danny Shelton** and DT **Evan Hudson** - combining for 221 tackles/33.5 tfl/24.0 sacks.

WASHINGTON STATE: Senior QB **Connor Halliday** returns after posting WSU single-season records for completions (449), attempts (714), passing yards (4,597) and tied the school record with 34 touchdown passes. WSU returns its top eight receivers, including sophomore **River Cracraft** (46 rec/614 yds/3 TDs), junior **Gabe Marks** (74 rec/807 yds/7 TDs), junior **Dominique Williams** (40 rec/647 yds/7 TDs) and senior **Vince Mayle** (42 rec/539 yds/7 TDs). Averaging 368.0 yards through the air, the Cougars ranked fourth in the FBS last season. In helping to protect the backside of Halliday, senior LG **Gunnar Eklund** and junior LT **Joe Dahl** return to the offensive line that gave up just one sack in 23.6 pass attempts. The Cougars return seven starters from a defense that forced 30 turnovers last season, tied for second-most in the Pac-12. The WSU defense will be bolstered by the linebacker tandem of junior **Darryl Monroe** (94 tackles/7.2 avg/8.0 tfl) and senior **Cyrus Coen** (60 tackles/5.5 avg/6.5 tfl).

OREGON TABBED TO WIN PAC-12 TITLE IN PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

HOLLYWOOD, Calif.—OREGON is the favorite to win the 2014 Pac-12 Conference football title in a preseason poll of media members who cover the league. The Ducks were listed in the top spot of the North Division by 37 of 39 voters participating in the poll, collecting 232 points. Twenty-four of the pollsters picked Oregon to come out on top in the Pac-12 Championship game. UCLA received the second most Champion votes with 13 pollsters picking the Bruins to win the Pac-12 Championship game. The Bruins were the top choice for the South Division by 37 of 39 voters participating, collecting 231 points.

2013 North Division winner STANFORD was picked to finish second in the North Division, collecting 192 points. USC was picked to finish second in the South Division after tallying 181 points, just ahead of reigning South Division winner ARIZONA STATE, who tallied 163 points and was predicted to finish third.

The media poll has correctly selected the Conference Champion in 28 of 53 previous polls, including 11 of the last 14. Following are the results of the preseason media poll (points 6-5-4-3-2-1, first-place votes in parentheses):

PAC-12 CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The Pac-12 Championship Football Game will take place Friday, December 5 at 9 p.m. ET/6 p.m. PT and telecast to a national audience on FOX. The Championship game will match the winner of the North Division vs. the winner of the South Division. The game will be played at Levi's® Stadium in Santa Clara. The winner of the Pac-12 Championship will earn the league's berth into the College Football Playoff.

TIE-BREAK PROCEDURES TO DETERMINE DIVISION CHAMPIONS

The Division Champion will be determined by the record in all Conference games played (both divisional and cross-divisional) within the Conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game representatives

Two-Team Tie.

- A. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
- B. If no game is played between the two tied teams or that game ends in a tie, the following tie-breaking procedures would be applied:
 - 1. Record in inter-divisional games.
 - 2. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the Conference), proceeding through the division.
 - 3. Record in common Conference games.
 - 4. Highest ranking in the CFP poll entering the final weekend of regular-season games.
 - 5. Total number of wins in a 12-game season. The following conditions will apply to the calculation of the total number of wins:
 - i. Only one win against a team from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision or lower division will be counted annually.
 - ii. Any games that are exempted from counting against the annual maximum number of football contests per NCAA rules (current Bylaw 17.9.5.2) shall not be included.
 - 6. Coin toss.

Multiple-Team Ties.

In the event of a tie for a division championship between more than two teams, the following procedure shall be used to eliminate all but two tied teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure shall be used.

- A. Head-to-head (best record in games among the tied teams).
- B. Record in inter-divisional games.
- C. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the Conference), proceeding through the division.
- D. Record in common Conference games.
- E. Highest ranking in the CFP poll entering the final weekend of regular-season games.

Pac-12 Championship Game - Determination of Home Team

The home team in the Pac-12 Championship Game will be determined by the record in all Conference games. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the home team.

Tie-breaking Procedure.

- A. Head-to-head, if applicable.
- B. Record against the next highest-placed common opponent in the Conference (based on record in all games played within the Conference), proceeding through the Conference.
- C. Record in common Conference games.
- D. Highest ranking in the CFP poll following the final weekend of the regular-season games.
- E. Coin toss.

PAC-12 BOWL ARRANGEMENTS - 2014-15

The Pac-12 is in the first year of a six-year agreement with seven bowl partners that should provide the Conference with a competitive post-season bowl experience. The lineup is led by the Rose Bowl Game presented by Northwestern Mutual, which is the destination for the Pac-12 champion. In addition to the Rose Bowl, Pac-12 bowl partners include the Valero Alamo Bowl in San Antonio, the National University Holiday Bowl in San Diego, the San Francisco Bowl, the Hyundai Sun Bowl in El Paso, the Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl, and the Cactus Bowl in Tempe. In 2014-15, the Rose Bowl Game is slotted as one of the College Football Playoff semifinal games. If no Pac-12 team was in the top four of the College Football Playoff poll following the 2014 season it would not have a team in the Rose Bowl. The displaced Pac-12 Champion and any other Pac-12 team ranked high enough would fill a berth in the other four bowls (Orange, Atlanta, Fiesta and Cotton Bowls). When the Rose Bowl does not host a semifinal game, the Pac-12 champion would play in the Rose Bowl unless it was ranked in the top four and would play in one of the semifinal games. The Pac-12 would back-fill the Rose Bowl game if the Pac-12 champion was in the top four and playing in one of the semifinal games.
