Davies was a solid 18-for-20 for 287 yards and three touchdowns as he led the Grizzlies' to a 55-7 win at Wayland Baptist (Texas). Completing 90 percent of his passes without committing a turnover for the second straight game, Davies had a 260.04 pass efficiency rating as he completed touchdown passes of 30, 21 and 11 yards. Davies also averaged 3.7 yards on six carries (22 net yards) as he played for just one drive of the second half in what was already a 49-0 game. In the process, Davies racked up 309 yards of total offense and helped the Grizzlies set a new NCAA Division II single-game record for completion percentage (93.1).

ADAMS STATE UNIVERSITY (2-0, 0-0 RMAC)

Cody Davies (Junior, Quarterback, 6-2, 200, Bozeman, Mont./N.D. State College of Science/Bozeman HS)
National Football Foundation - Colorado Chapter Player of the Week

Team Notes: The Grizzlies set a new NCAA Division II record for pass completion percentage as they completed 27 of 29 passes (93.1 percent) of their throws in Saturday's 55-7 win over Wayland Baptist (Texas). Starter Cody Davies (Bozeman, Mont.) completed 18 of 20 for 287 yards and three scores while Trevor Eggleston (Tucson, Ariz.) saw his first action of the young season completing all nine of his attempts for 78 yards. He also had a rushing touchdown and played for most of the second half after seeing some time in the first half as well. The previous record of 90.9 percent (20-22) was set 46 years ago in 1966 by Northwestern State (La.) against Louisiana-Lafayette. The Grizzlies led the Pioneers 46-0 at halftime. ASU racked up 642 yards of total offense in the contest, rushing for 257 while throwing for 365. The Grizzlies averaged 7.6 yards per play. The Grizzlies' total was their best since Oct. 8, 2005, when they racked up 674 in a win over New Mexico Highlands. They were a perfect 7-for-7 in trips into the red-zone and are 9-for-10 (90.0 percent) this season. However, the Grizzlies have scored just four touchdowns in those trips. Ron Gaudin (Miami, Fla.) caught seven balls for 114 yards in Saturday's win. The Grizzlies have a +8 (11-3) turnover margin thus far into the campaign and rank third in the nation with their +4.0 per game average. The Grizzlies also rank in the nation's top 10 for scoring defense as they are giving up just 8.0 points per game thus far. The Grizzlies went 2-0 in non-conference play for the second straight year. The Grizzlies will look to get to 3-0 for the first time since 1996 when they travel to Gunnison, Colo. to face arch-rival Western State in the annual Colorado Classic game. The Grizzlies have won 10 straight games between the teams, including last year's 49-10 season-ending victory. The winning team will get to keep possession of the Colorado Classic trophy, which was first given in 2006, when the teams played for the first of two straight times in Pueblo. The Grizzlies have never been without possession of that trophy, which lists all of the scores in the series, which dates back to 1934. Western State leads the overall series 37-28, thanks in large part to an 11-year winning streak from 1991-2001. The Grizzlies will be looking to match that series-record for consecutive wins this year.

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (0-2, 0-0 RMAC)

Jake Edmiston (Junior, Linebacker, 6-2, 195, Palisade, Colo./Palisade HS)

Edmiston led all players with nine total tackles (four solo, five assisted) in the Mavs' loss at Division I Northern Colorado. He is second on the team with 14 total tackles.

Team Notes: CMU will host Chadron State College on Saturday in the Mavs' home opener.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (2-0, 0-0 RMAC)

Matt Brown (Sophomore, Quarterback, Limon, Colo.)

Brown once again led the Oredigger offense in its 71-7 win over South Dakota Mines on Saturday to the tune of 349 passing yards on 30-of-48 passing with three touchdowns. He connected with Jimmy Ellis, Jerrod Doucet and Diamond Gillis on scoring tosses. He accounted for 360 of Mines' 492 yards of total offense after also rushing for 11 yards on nine carries.

Team Notes: Colorado School of Mines improved to 2-0 behind a 71-7 victory over South Dakota Mines on Saturday at O'Hara Stadium in Rapid City, S.D. Mines posted 492 yards of total offense in the win, and the 71 points is the second-most points scored by an Oredigger football team under head coach Bob Stitt, and second-most since joining the NCAA Division II ranks in 1992. The Mines caused five turnovers, scored on two safeties and two defensive touchdowns in the game and limited the Hardrockers (0-2) to just 153 yards of total offense. Matt Brown led the offense with 349 passing yards on 30-of-48 passing with three touchdowns. He connected with Jimmy Ellis, Jerrod Doucet and Diamond Gillis on scoring tosses. He accounted for 360 of Mines' 492 yards of total offense after also rushing for 11 yards on nine carries. Senior running back Dan Palmer carried 11 times for 63 yards and scored three touchdowns on three separate one-yard runs. Tyler Denson led the defense in stops with 9, including 1.5 tackles for loss, while Chad McGraw added eight tackles (three solo) and four tackles for loss. Billy Sprague posted seven tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss in the matchup, and Alex Laudenslager returned an interception 35 yards and Billy Sprague picked up a fumble and returned it 73 yards to account for Mines' two defensive touchdowns. Mines will return home to open up the RMAC schedule against Black Hills State on Saturday in Golden.

2012 NFFCC News & Notes

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (1-1, 0-0 MWC)

Team Notes: In Colorado State's home opener of the Bold New Era, the Rams fell short, losing to the Bison, 22-7. On the game's opening drive, and the third play of the game, Garrett Grayson connected with tight end Crockett Gillmore for a 69-yard touchdown. But NDSU responded quickly as Bison cornerback Marcus Williams returned the ensuing kickoff 53 yards to set up NDSU's first touchdown of the day, a 6-yard touchdown run by Sam Ojuri with 12:02 left in the first quarter. The scoring continued early on in the game. With the Bison driving into CSU territory thanks to a 64-yard punt return by Williams, CSU was able to force a turnover on downs on a 4th-and-goal from the one yard line, the second time in as many games that the defense has done so. On the very next play, freshman running back Tommey Morris was stuffed in the end zone for a safety, giving the Bison a 9-7 lead and the ball. With NDSU leading 16-7 late in the first half and the Rams looking to score, Williams again made an impact for the Bison, this time on the defensive side of the ball. Williams intercepted a pass to help set up a Bison field goal as time expired in the first half, giving NDSU a 19-7 lead at intermission. In the second half, CSU's defense was able to hold the Bison offense at bay, but were still not able to get back into the game. NDSU relied on heavy ball control, totaling 81 plays compared to 48 for the Rams. Shaquil Barrett anchored CSU's defense recording 15 tackles, including a six-yard sack. Grayson led the Rams with 171 yards on 13-of-24 passing. He threw one touchdown and one interception, and was never able to get comfortable against the No. 1 FCS defense in the nation.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (2-0, 0-0 RMAC)

Ross Dausin (Senior, Quarterback, 6-5, 230, San Antonio, Texas/Butler County CC/Warren HS)

Dausin completed 16-of-26 attempts for 303 yards and three scores in a 41-24 road win against Northwestern Oklahoma. He did not throw an interception as he completed 61.5 percent of his passes. Dausin also carried the ball twice for 13 yards.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (0-1, 0-1 RMAC)

Stephan Andrews (Freshman, Kicker, 5-8, 180, Mesa, Ariz./Red Mountain HS)

Andrews averaged 46.2 yards per punt on eight punts. He pinned Highlands inside their own 20-yard line on three occasions. His longest punt was a 62-yarder that nailed the coffin corner and pinned the Cowboys on their 3-yard line.

UNITED STATE AIR FORCE ACADEMY (1-1, 0-0 MWC)

Team Notes: Denard Robinson ran for 218 yards, threw for 208 and scored four times to help No. 19 Michigan hold off Air Force for a 31-25 win Saturday. Cody Getz ran for 130 yards, with his third rushing TD and a 2-point conversion pulling Air Force within three early in the fourth. The Falcons had a shot to snap their 19-game losing streak against teams in The Associated Press Top 25, but turned the ball over on downs with 1:28 left at its 35 when Jake Ryan batted down a pass. The Wolverines responded just well enough to prevent a collapse after Getz made it 28-25 and silenced most of the 112,522 fans at the Big House. Michigan kicked a field goal and stopped Getz's fourth-down run on the next two possessions, but Robinson threw short of Gardner on a third down - a play that was ruled a catch before video review overturned it. The Wolverines defense didn't let Air Force drive for the go-ahead TD after having a lot of problems with its option attack, especially on pitches to the outside. Gardner caught five passes for 63 yards and a TD. Funchess, playing for the injured Brandon Moore, had 106 yards receiving and a score on four receptions. Air Force quarterback Connor Dietz was 10 of 19 for 127 yards and ran for 61 of his team's 290 yards rushing.

2012 NFFCC News & Notes

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (0-2, 0-0 PAC12)

Christian Powell (Freshman, Fullback, 6-0, 235, Upland, Calif. /Upland)

In his first career start, and second collegiate game, Powell rushed 28 times for 147 yards and three touchdowns in CU's 30-28 loss to Sacramento State. He also caught one pass for 13 yards and earned six first downs total. His three touchdowns tied the record for the most in a game by a freshmen (true or redshirt), matching TB Herchell Troutman at Texas on Oct. 1, 1994. He became the first freshman to rush for 100-plus yards since TB Rodney Stewart versus Kansas State in Boulder on Oct. 18, 2008 (29-141, 1 TD). The last fullback to gain 100 or more yards in a game was Erich Kissick against Missouri in Boulder on Nov. 7, 1987 (16-129, 1 TD). Powell's 64-yard TD scamper in the first quarter was the fourth longest rush by a freshman in CU history.

Team Notes: Colorado's score just 1:12 into the game was the quickest since Nov. 28, 2009 at Nebraska, when Cody Hawkins and Riar Geer hooked up on a 68-yard touchdown pass just 54 seconds into the action; NU rallied from 14-0 down to win, 40-31 that day. Colorado running backs had 47 carries without a loss to open the season until the run ended when Christian Powell was thrown for a 2-yard loss early in the fourth quarter. Four of the eight kickoffs returned were to the 23. CU now has 52 punt return yards in two games after having all of 56 in 13 games last year. The Buffs made it hard on Sac State inside-the-20; though the Hornets scored all five times it cracked the 20 (2 TD/3 FG), they gained just 28 yards on 13 plays in the zone and were 1-of-4 on third downs (opponents are now 22-of-77 on third down inside-the-CU 20 dating back to 2008, or 28.6 percent). CU had three plays longer than 20 yards today after having none last week against Colorado State. The Buffs are 0-2 for just the 20th time in 123 seasons of varsity football. Prior to losing the game on a field goal as time expired, the last time it had happened in regulation was on Nov. 24, 2000, when Josh Brown kicked a 29-yard field goal as time expired in Lincoln to give Nebraska a 34-32 win over the Buffs. (CU lost to Wisconsin on field goal in overtime in the 2002 Alamo Bowl.)

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO (1-1, 0-0 BSC)

Dominic Gunn (Senior, Wide Receiver/Returner, 5-11, 170, Aurora, Colo./Rangeview)

Gunn led the team with 193 all-purpose yards, including 133 on five punt returns in a home win against Colorado Mesa. The longest of his career, a 67-yarder, set up a 22-yard field goal in the third quarter to lift the team to a 26-3 advantage. Gunn's 133 return yards are the fourth-most in a single game in Northern Colorado history and by far the most in his career. He also climbed five spots to fifth on the career punt return yards list, and passed his own position coach, Keith Grable (1996-99) in the process. Gunn also moved into the career top-10 in all-purpose yards with 2,898. In the game, Gunn had returns of 21, 10, 21, 14 and 67 yards.

Gunn's 193 all-purpose yards are also his second-highest total in his career, trailing only the 215 he had at Montana on Oct. 1, 2011.

Team Notes: The Bears defense intercepted three passes against Colorado Mesa, the most in a game since Sept. 10, 2011 at Colorado State. Senior safety Jordan Bible and junior linebacker Clarence Bumpas each had the first picks of their career, while sophomore Courtney Hall had his second in as many games. For the first time in 20 games, Northern Colorado did not allow a quarterback sack. The last team not to get to the quarterback was Michigan State on Sept. 25, 2010.

WESTERN STATE COLLEGE UNIVERSITY (0-2, 0-0 RMAC)

Team Notes: Western State Colorado University fell to West Texas A & M Saturday evening by a score of 57-20. The Buffs of West Texas A & M (1-1) took the lead, 7-0, at the 11:01 mark of the first quarter. They would proceed to rattle off 41 more unanswered points until quarterback Brian Duboski connected with Lukas Adams on a 30 yard pass to score the Mountaineers' first points of the game at the end of the third quarter. Despite the loss, Duboski threw for 218 yards and two touchdowns. All three WSCU touchdowns were scored by Adams who also raked in 59 receiving yards to lead the team. On defense, safety Cole Waliczek led the Mountaineers with 7.5 tackles. Waliczek also had a good game on special teams, blocking a Buffs punt that was returned by Adams for a touchdown. Playing in their home opener, West Texas A & M's high powered offense produced 507 passing yards on 44 attempts. Next up for the Mountaineers is Homecoming and the Colorado Classic. WSCU will face-off against Adams State next Saturday, Sept. 15 in the Mountaineer Bowl at 1 p.m. The Colorado Classic between WSCU and Adams State is the second longest running college rivalry in Colorado history.
