PAC-12 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK - WEEK ONE

OFFENSE: Johnathan Franklin, RB, UCLA

DEFENSE: Jake Fischer, LB, Arizona

SPECIAL TEAMS: Marqise Lee, WR/KR, USC

WALNUT CREEK, Calif.--Running back **Johnathan Franklin** of UCLA, linebacker **Jake Fischer** of ARIZONA and wide receiver/kick returner **Marqise Lee** of USC have been named Pac-12 Players of the Week in football.

Franklin, a senior from Los Angeles, Calif., rushed for 214 yards on 15 carries (14.3 average) and tied a career high with three touchdowns in a 49-24 win at Rice. His three touchdowns came on runs of 74, 78 and 22 yards. He became the first UCLA back to record two runs of 72 yards or longer in a game and the fourth Bruin to log multiple 200-yard rushing performances. With 2,883 rushing yards in his career, Franklin is 32 yards shy of taking over 7th place on UCLA's all-time rushing list.

Fischer, a junior from Oro Valley, Ariz., recorded career highs in tackles (13) and tackles for loss (2.5) and logged the first forced fumble of his career in Arizona's 24-17 overtime win over Toledo. The Arizona defense allowed just three points and 132 yards of offense in the second half, while holding the Rockets to an 0-7 rate on third downs. Nine of Fischer's 13 tackles were solo stops.

Lee, a sophomore from Inglewood, Calif., racked up 297 all-purpose yards, including a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, in USC's 49-10 win over Hawaii. Lee, whose touchdown came on his only return of the day, became just the second Trojan to register a 100-yard scoring return on a kickoff. In addition, he had 10 receptions for 197 yards.

Also nominated for offensive player of the week honors were running backs **Marion Grice** of Arizona State and **John White** of Utah and quarterbacks **Matt Scott** of Arizona, **Marcus Mariota** of Oregon and **Matt Barkley** of USC. Also nominated on defense were linebackers **Brandon Magee** of Arizona State, **Brennan Scarlett** of California, **Derrick Webb** of Colorado and **Hayes Pullard** of USC, defensive ends **Datone Jones** of UCLA and **Joe Kruger** of Utah and nickelback **Usua Amanuel** of Stanford. Also nominated for special teams play were punters **Josh Hubner** of Arizona State, **Jeff Locke** of UCLA and **Sean Sellwood** of Utah and kicker **Jordan Williamson** of Stanford.

AROUND THE PAC-12

THIS WEEK: Seven BCS opponents on the docket this week, with six of those opponents opening the 2012 season victorious last week, and four enter this week's contests ranked among the AP Top 25 (OREGON STATE hosts No. 13 Wisconsin, UCLA hosts No. 16 Nebraska, ARIZONA host No. 18 Oklahoma State, WASHINGTON travels to No. 3 LSU).

CHECK YOUR LOCAL LISTINGS: Each Pac-12 game will be televised this weekend, including six games appearing on the Pac-12 Networks. Check the Pac-12 website (Pac-12.com) and click on the "Channel Finder" link to find the tv provider in your area.

BIG PLAY SCORES: The following players posted touchdowns covering 40 yards or more during the first weekend of the season - ARIZONA sophomore RB **Ka'Deem Carey** (73-yard run), ARIZONA STATE senior LB **Brandon Magee** (45-yard interception return), UCLA freshman QB **Brett Hundley** (72-yard run), UCLA senior RB **Johnathan Franklin** (74-yard run, 78-yard run), UCLA sophomore LB **Damien Holmes** (44-yard fumble return), USC sophomore WR **Marqise Lee** (75-yard reception, 100-yard kickoff return), WASHINGTON junior S **Will Shamburger** (44-yard fumble return).

ARIZONA

- With head coaching stints at Salem College, Glenville State, West Virginia and Michigan, UA head coach Rich Rodriguez won his debut for the first time with the 24-17 win over Toledo.
- Senior QB **Matt Scott** connected on 30-of-46 passes for a career-high 387 yards and two TDs. Only six quarterbacks in UA history have thrown for more yards in a game.
- The Wildcats racked up 624 total yards (387 pass/237 rush) on Toledo, the second most in school history and the most since posting 691 yards against New Mexico in 1969.

ARIZONA STATE

- ASU rolled up 63 points in its 63-6 season-opening victory over Northern Arizona. It was the most points scored by the Sun Devils since their 63-16 win over Temple in the 2005 season-opener.
- The Sun Devils will look to continue a pretty good streak vs. Big Ten teams at Sun Devil Stadium this weekend. ASU is 7-0 vs. Big Ten teams in Tempe, including big wins in its past two games against Northwestern (52-21 on Sept. 17, 2005) and then-No. 16 Iowa (44-7 on Sept. 18, 2004). In the seven games, ASU has outscored its Big Ten opponents 275-97 (39.3 to 13.8 per game).

CALIFORNIA

- Junior WR **Keenan Allen** extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 25, every game he's played at Cal. Allen scored his first touchdown of 2012 on a reverse that went for 39 yards. It was his second rushing TD of his career. On the receiving end, he paced the Bears with five catches for 69 yards.
- The Golden Bears will look for their first win in Memorial Stadium since Oct. 23, 2010, a 50-17 win over Arizona State.

COLORADO

- In the loss to Colorado State, junior LB **Derrick Webb** had a career-high 12 tackles (nine solo), with five at our behind the line of scrimmage (three tackles for zero, two tackles for loss including a quarterback sack) and two third down stops in 53 plays.
- The Buffs played 9 true freshmen (13, including redshirt freshmen) in their opener vs. Colorado State. Last season, Colorado played 15 true freshmen last season, the most at Colorado since the NCAA allowed freshmen to play back in 1972.

OREGON

- Freshman QB **Marcus Mariota** completed 18-22 passes for 200 yards and 3 TDs, ran for another 33 yards on 4 carries in his collegiate debut as he guided Oregon to TD drives on its first 7 drives of the game to stake Ducks to a 50-3 lead with 7:06 remaining in the 2nd quarter. Mariota did not play the remainder of the game.
- The Ducks scored touchdowns on their first seven possessions in building a 50-10 halftime lead in its win over Arkansas State. In typical fashion, each of the scoring drives averaged 1:32. Five of those touchdown drives were under 2:00, giving the Ducks 94 such touchdown drives over the last two-plus seasons.

OREGON STATE

- Due to Hurricane Isaac, Nicholls State encountered travel problems that forced the postponement of its game with OREGON STATE. The Beavers are attempting to reschedule the game with Nicholls State
- The Beavers open the season with No. 13 Wisconsin. It's the third time a Mike Riley coached Beaver squad has opened the season against a ranked foe (2004 at No. 3 LSU, 2010 vs. No. 7 TCU).

STANFORD

- Stanford has now prevailed in 24 of its last 27 home games. It has won eight straight non-conference games at home.
- Senior NB **Usua Amanam** had six total tackles, recording a game-high four tackles for loss in his first collegiate start, a 20-17 win over San Jose State. His two solo sacks knocked back the Spartans 17 yards. In the fourth quarter, he recovered a fumble that set up Stanford's game-winning score. He leads the Pac-12 in tackles for loss

and is one of just six FBS players in Week One to record four TFL.

- Junior PK **Jordan Williamson** was perfect on two field goal attempts in Friday's 20-17 win over San Jose State. His first field goal came on the final play of the first half, from a new career-high of 46 yards.

UCLA

- UCLA put 49 points on the scoreboard in its win over Rice. It was the most points scored by UCLA since a 50-38 Sun Bowl victory over Northwestern in 2005 .
- Senior P **Jeff Locke** had six punts for 43.7 yards average and placed three inside the 20-yard line in the 49-24 win at Rice. Entering the season, Locke was the Pac-12's career leader with an average of 44.57 yards per punt.

USC

- Senior QB **Matt Barkley** completed 23-of-38 passes for 372 yards and 4 TDs (including a 75-yarder) against Hawaii, with 304 of those yards and 3 of the scores coming in the first half as USC built up a 35-0 lead. It was his third consecutive game with at least 4 TD passes, and 11th time he's passed for more than 300 yards. Barkley, who had 39 TD passes last year, has now thrown at least one TD in 33 of 37 games, at least 2 TDs in 22 games, at least three in 14 games and four or more in eight games.
- Sophomore WR **Marqise Lee's** finished with 10 receptions for 197 yards. It's his third straight game with 100 or more receiving yards (8 catches, 187 yards vs. UCLA; 13 catches, 224 yards vs. UCLA). That stretch of 608 receiving yards in three games is the most prolific in school history

UTAH

- With the 41-0 win over Northern Colorado, Utah posted its first shutout since blanking Wyoming, 50-0 in 2007. The last time the Utes posted back-to-back shutouts was during the 1981 season when they blanked Portland State (46-0) and Northwestern (42-0).
- Senior RB **John White** rushed 24 times for 119 yards (5.0 ypc) and a TD in the win over Northern Colorado. In the start of his second season at Utah, he now has nine 100-yard games. Utah improved to 9-0 in games when White rushes for 100 yards.
- Utah State is Utah's oldest rival and the series, in its 110th game, is the 12th-longest in NCAA FBS history. Utah's first football game ever was against USU in 1892. The two teams did not play in 2010 and 2011. Utah has won the last 12 games against Utah State (and 20 of 22), including the last six games in Logan.

WASHINGTON

- In the 21-12 victory over San Diego State, the Husky defense allowed the fewest points since the 2010 Holiday Bowl, when Washington held Nebraska in check with a 19-7 win.
- Junior QB **Keith Price** connected on 25 of his 35 passes for 222 yards and 1 TD against San Diego State. His primary targets were a pair of sophomores - TE **Austin Seferian-Jenkins** (9 catches, 82 yards) and WR **Kasen Williams** (6 catches for 75 yards and 1 TD)

WASHINGTON STATE

- This will be the first meeting between Washington State and Eastern Washington in over 100 years. The Cougars won the only two previous matchups 46-0 in 1907 and 73-0 in 1908 with both games played in Pullman. Dating back to a 34-0 victory over Montana in 1903, the Cougars have played 45 games against teams currently in the Big Sky Conference. WSU is 43-2 in those games - including 19 shutouts - and has not lost to a team currently in the Big Sky in more than 60 years.
- Junior PK **Andrew Furney** hit a pair of 40+ yard field goals (47, 41) in the loss at BYU. Furney has now connected on his last eight attempts from 40+ yards. He finished 5-for-5 from 40+ yards in 2011.

Oregon 49, UCLA 31

USC TABBED TO WIN PAC-12 TITLE IN PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

UNIVERSAL CITY, Calif. - USC is the favorite to win the 2012 Pac-12 Conference football title in a preseason poll of media members who cover the league. The Trojans were listed in the top spot in the North Division by 117 of the 123 voters participating in the poll, collecting 729 points. 102 of those pollsters tabbed the Trojans to come out on top in the Pac-12 Championship Game. Utah was picked to finish second in the South Division, collecting one first-place vote in the balloting for the division race. Arizona State claimed three of the other five first-place votes, with each of those members of the media casting a vote for the Sun Devils to capture the Pac-12 title.

Oregon was picked to win the North Division, garnering 732 points and 117 first place votes, while Stanford, which tallied five of the other six first place votes, was pegged to finish second in this year's poll. California, predicted by the voters to finish fourth in the North Division, claimed the remaining first place vote.

The media poll has correctly selected the Conference Champion in 28 of 51 previous polls, including 11 of the last 12. Following are the results of the preseason media poll (points 6-5-4-3-2-1, first-place votes in parentheses):

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PAC-12 CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The Pac-12 Championship Football Game will take place Friday, November 30 at 8 p.m. ET/5 p.m. PT and telecast to a national audience on FOX. The Championship game will match the winner of the North Division vs. the winner of the South Division. The game will be played on the campus of the division winner with the best overall conference record. The winner of the Pac-12 Championship will earn the league's automatic BCS berth.

TIE-BREAK PROCEDURES TO DETERMINE AND CHAMPIONSHIP GAME PARTICIPANTS & HOST

The division winner will be determined by the record in all games played (both divisional and cross-divisional) within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game representatives from each division:

Two-Team Tie.

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
 - a. If no game is played between the two tied teams or that game ends in a tie, the following tie-breaking procedures would be applied:
2. Record in games played within the division
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (Based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest BCS Ranking following the last weekend of regular-season games.
6. Total number of wins in a 12-game season. The following conditions will apply to the calculation of the total number of wins:
 - a. Only one win against a team from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision or lower division will be counted annually.
 - b. Any games that are exempted from counting against the annual maximum number of football contests per NCAA rules (current Bylaw 17.9.5.2) shall not be included.
7. Coin toss.

Multiple-Team Ties.

The following procedures will only be used to eliminate all but two teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure will be applied.

1. Head-to-head (Best record in games among the tied teams).
2. Record in games played within the division.
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest BCS ranking following the last weekend of regular-season games.

Pac-12 Championship Game Host

The Pac-12 Championship Game Host will be determined by the record in all games played within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game host.

Tie-breaking Procedure.

1. Head-to-head, if applicable.
2. Highest BCS Ranking following the last weekend of Pac-12 regular-season games.
3. Record against the next highest-placed common opponent in the conference (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the conference.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Coin toss.

PAC-12 BOWL ARRANGEMENTS - 2012-13

The Pac-12 is in the third year of a four-year bowl cycle. The Pac-12 Conference has agreements with seven bowl partners. The lineup is led by the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, which is the destination for the Pac-12 champion, unless said champion is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final Bowl Championship Series rankings. If that were the case, the Pac-12 champion would play in the BCS National Championship Game hosted by the Discover Orange Bowl. Regardless of the disposition of the Pac-12 champion, a second Pac-12 team may be selected for an at-large berth in the Bowl Championship Series in any given year and other Pac-12 bowl partner arrangements provide for that occurrence. In addition to the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Pac-12 bowl partners include, in order of selection, the Valero Alamo Bowl in San Antonio, Bridgeport Education Holiday Bowl in San Diego, Hyundai Sun Bowl in El Paso, the MAACO Bowl Las Vegas, the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl in San Francisco, and the Gildan New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque.
