Inside the Huddle

• The Cardinal travels to Colorado's Folsom Field on Saturday for the start of a road-heavy finish to the regular season, with three of Stanford's final four games away from home. The Cardinal is 1-2 on the road this season.

• This will be the first time for Stanford to play in Boulder, Colo., since its season opener in 1990, when Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football David Shaw was a freshman wide receiver for the Cardinal.

• Stanford is tied for second-place in the Pac-12 North, where three teams are within one game of each other. Stanford (4-1 Pac-12), Oregon State (4-1) and Oregon (5-0) all play each other in remaining games on the schedule.

• The Cardinal brings the Pac-12's No. 1 turnover margin (+8) to face the Pac-12's last place turnover margin (-8) at Colorado. Stanford ranks t-13th in the nation in turnover margin.

• Stanford won its seventh straight game at home with a 24-17 victory over Washington State at Stanford Stadium. A fourth-quarter pick-six interception by junior FS Ed Reynolds proved to be the winning score last Saturday - the fourth game this season with a Stanford defensive touchdown.

• The Cardinal defense ranks first in the NCAA in tackles for loss (9.50/game), third in sacks (4.00/game) and second in rushing defense (65.1 yards/game). Stanford held Washington State to minus-18 yards rushing last week while recording a school-record 10 sacks.

• Senior RB Stepfan Taylor is 96 yards away from his third consecutive 1,000-yard rushing season, which would be a first in Stanford history. Taylor carried 21 times for 58 yards last week versus Washington State.

• Stanford started three true freshmen in last week's Washington State game: CB Alex Carter, OG Joshua Garnett and LS Reed Miller. SS Zach Hoffpauir and OT Andrus Peat also played expansive roles in the second half, as part of the 11 true freshmen playing this season for the Cardinal.

• Stanford owns active winning streaks against nine of its 12 regular season 2012 opponents: San Jose State (W5), Duke (W3), USC (W4), Arizona (W3), Cal (W3), Washington State (W5), Colorado (W3), Oregon State (W2) and UCLA (W3). The Cardinal has a two-game losing streak to Oregon and lost its most recent games to Washington and Notre Dame.

Head Coach David Shaw

After serving as Stanford's offensive coordinator for four seasons from 2007-10, David Shaw was appointed the Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football on January 13, 2011, becoming the 34th head coach in Stanford history.

A 1995 Stanford graduate, he is the fifth alum to hold the position of head football coach, joining Charles Fickert (1901), Carl Clemans (1902), Chuck Taylor (1951-57) and Paul Wiggan (1980-83).

In Shaw's first season as head coach in 2011, the Cardinal posted an 11-2 record and made its second consecutive BCS appearance, falling in overtime to Oklahoma State in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. Stanford won its first nine games of the season to extend its winning streak to 17 before falling to No. 6 Oregon.

Shaw became just the ninth major college head coach in history to post 11 or more wins in his first season and the first since Chris Peterson (13-0) of Boise State and Bret Bielema (12-1) of Wisconsin accomplished the feat in the 2006 season.

For his efforts, he was named the Pac-12 Conference's Coach of the Year, becoming just the third head coach in Stanford history to earn the award, following Bill Walsh (1977) and Tyrone Willingham (1995 and '99). He was also named Regional Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association of America (AFCA) and the Male Coach of the Year by the Black Coaches & Administrators.

Shaw also represents the Pac-12 on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

The Cardinal was ranked in the top 10 of both major polls for all 16 weeks of the 2011 season, peaking at No. 3 in the AP poll and No. 2 in the USA Today Coaches poll on Nov. 6. Stanford's final ranking of No. 7 concluded a stretch in which the Cardinal held down a spot in the top 10 of the AP poll for a school-record 23 straight weeks dating back to the 2010 season.

Shaw served as the wide receivers and passing game coordinator at the University of San Diego during the 2006 season, where he helped guide the nation's top Division I-AA offense that paced the Toreros to the Pioneer League championship and NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major national title. Shaw's coaching resume also includes nine years of NFL experience with the Philadelphia Eagles (1997), Oakland Raiders (1998-2001) and Baltimore Ravens (2002-05).

A four-year letterwinner at Stanford from 1991-94 as a receiver, Shaw was a member of Stanford's 1991 Aloha Bowl team (8-4) coached by Dennis Green that was the third-highest scoring team in school history. He was also on the Cardinal's 1992 Blockbuster Bowl-winning squad (10-3) coached by Bill Walsh. Shaw finished his Stanford career with 57 catches for 664 yards and five touchdowns. Shaw competed in both a varsity track meet and basketball game before graduating with a degree in sociology.

Born in San Diego, Calif., David and his wife Kori are the parents of three children: Keegan, Carter and Gavin.

• In a series that began in 1904, this marks the eighth meeting between the schools, with the Cardinal holding a slim 4-3 edge. Stanford has won three-straight, including last year's 48-7 victory on the Farm.

Last Matchup Against Colorado - Oct. 8, 2011

- With former Stanford greats John Elway and Tiger Woods looking on from the sideline, quarterback Andrew Luck threw for 370 yards and three touchdowns to lead Stanford to a resounding 48-7 win in front of a sellout crowd of 50,360 at Stanford Stadium. Luck was almost unstoppable, recording his 25th career win, the most of any Cardinal quarterback.
- Linebacker Max Bergen ignited the Stanford scoring by blocking a 29-yard field goal attempt by Will Oliver, returning it 75 yards for a touchdown. Running back Stepfan Taylor's one-yard run gave the Cardinal a 13-0 lead after one quarter of play, and Stanford was never challenged.
- Fullback Ryan Hewitt caught a pair of scoring passes from Luck, covering 1 and 10 yards, and wide receiver Griff Whalen contributed a 30-yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter.
- For the fourth time in five games, the Stanford defense held an opponent to a touchdown or less. The unit limited the Buffaloes to 264 yards in total offense and only 60 yards rushing. Colorado was only 2-of-13 on third down conversions.
- The 13th consecutive win by the Cardinal dating back to 2011 equaled a school record and extended the nation's longest winning streak. It also marked its eighth-straight victory at Stanford Stadium.
- Stanford racked up 28 first downs compared to only 11 by Colorado. The Cardinal also finished with 553 total yards.
- Whalen caught four passes for a career-high 92 yards, while tight end Zach Ertz made four receptions for 78 yards.

It Happened Against Colorado

1977 - In Bill Walsh's first game as Stanford head coach, the Cardinal fell to the 12th-ranked Buffaloes, 27-21, at Folsom Field. Darrin Nelson, playing in his first collegiate game, ran for 99 yards on 15 carries and caught four passes for 77 yards.

1987 - Colorado's wishbone offense rolled up 413 rushing yards as the Buffaloes posted a 31-17 victory at Folsom Field.

1990 - Stanford built a 14-0 lead against the sixth-ranked Buffaloes only to see Colorado rally with two third-quarter touchdowns to tie the game. Stanford regained the lead and was poised to upset the eventual national champions until Eric Bieniemy's controversial game-winning touchdown with 12 seconds remaining on fourth-and-goal from the one-yard line. Glyn Milburn accounted for 158 yards in total offense in his first game as a Cardinal.

1991 - Tommy Vardell (114) and Glyn Milburn (106) combined for 220 yards rushing as Stanford posted a 28-21 victory over the defending co-national champions at Stanford Stadium.

1993 - Before a national television audience on ESPN, No. 20 Stanford and No. 7 Colorado combined for 1,022 yards of total offense as the Cardinal scored 14 points in the final 3:33 - including the game-winner with eight seconds remaining - to upset Colorado, 41-37, at Stanford Stadium. Steve Stenstrom connected with tight end Tony Cline over the middle for the winning touchdown.

2011 - Andrew Luck completed 26 of 33 passes for 370 yards and three touchdowns as the Cardinal cruised to a 48-7 win in front of a sellout crowd of 50,360 at Stanford Stadium. Former Stanford greats John Elway and Tiger Woods were on the sideline as the Cardinal won its 13th straight game dating back to 2010 to extend the nation's longest winning streak.

A Look Back at Washington State

• No. 19 Stanford remained unbeaten (5-0) at Stanford Stadium this year after defeating Washington State, 24-17. The win was the fifth straight for the Cardinal over the Cougars.

• Stanford recorded a school-record 10 sacks, led by senior NB Usua Amanam (2.0) and senior OLB Trent Murphy (2.0). The Cardinal had 15 total tackles for loss from nine defenders.

• In the final minute of the game, Washington State stood first-and-goal at the Stanford nine-yard line threatening to tie the game. Amanam answered with a 10-yard sack, followed on the game's final play by an eight-yard sack (and the school record-breaker) by junior DE Henry Anderson.

• The Cardinal defense held Washington State to minus-18 yards rushing, third-best all-time in Stanford history. The rushing tally at the end of the first quarter stood at minus-36 yards.

• Washington State threw the ball with more success, totaling 403 yards on 43-of-61 passing and two touchdowns. It was the third time this season where an opponent passed at least 60 times for 350-plus yards, and Stanford is 3-0 in those games.

• For the fourth time this season, Stanford scored on defense. Junior FS Ed Reynolds picked off Washington State QB Jeff Tuel in the fourth quarter and ran it back 25 yards for what would ultimately prove the winning score. It was Reynolds' fourth interception this season and second pick-six.

• The Cardinal's talented tight end tandem of seniors Zach Ertz and Levine Toilolo were held to a combined season-low one reception. It was the first game since the season opener versus San Jose State for a tight end to not lead Stanford in receiving.

• Senior QB Josh Nunes and senior WR Jamal-Rashad Patterson connected in the second quarter on a 70-yard touchdown reception - a career-high for both.

• Senior FB Ryan Hewitt dove from one yard out for a score in the third quarter, the first rushing touchdown of his career and sixth overall touchdown as a Cardinal.

• Freshman WR Kodi Whitfield caught his first two career receptions, one on the second offensive play of the first quarter and one for a critical first down in the last offensive series of the fourth quarter.

• Freshman OG Joshua Garnett made his first career start and became the first Stanford true freshman offensive lineman to start since Kirk Chambers in 2000.

• Junior K Jordan Williamson hit a 42-yard field goal in the first quarter, his first conversion since the Notre Dame game. Williamson also excelled on kickoffs with three touchbacks.

The Schedule

• Stanford's next and final home game of the regular season on Nov. 10 against Oregon State remains without a kickoff time, following ESPN's decision to hold the game and four others in the Pac-12 next Saturday for a selection to be made next Sunday or Monday, Nov. 4 or 5. Stay tuned to GoStanford.com and follow on Twitter (@StanfordFball) for the kickoff time and television broadcast announcement at the beginning of next week.

• Stanford's first eight opponents in 2012 are a combined 38-20 in the remainder of their games. Notre Dame (8-0) is undefeated, and USC (6-2) and San Jose State (6-2) have each dropped only one other decision. Duke (6-3), Arizona (5-3), Washington (4-4), Cal (3-6) and Washington State (2-6) round out the slate. In its most recent games, San Jose State defeated Texas State, 31-20; Duke lost to Florida State, 7-48; USC lost to Arizona, 36-39; Washington defeated Oregon State, 20-17; Arizona defeated USC, 39-36; Notre Dame defeated Oklahoma, 30-13; and Cal lost to Utah, 27-49.

• Stanford's schedule is rated one of the toughest in the nation again this year. The computer rankings utilized by the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) measure the Cardinal's schedule strength this week: No. 5 (Massey), 6 (Anderson & Hester), No. 7 (Colley) and No. 14 (Sagarin). [Billingsley and Wolfe schedule strengths are unpublished.]

• In the new era of Pac-12 Conference scheduling, Stanford plays two non-Saturday games in 2012. The Cardinal opened the season Aug. 31 (Friday) at home versus San Jose State; Stanford played at Washington Sept. 27 for the Cardinal's third Thursday night game in the last 15 years ('08 vs. Oregon State, '98 at Arizona State).

• Stanford and rival Cal played the 115th edition of the Big Game in an unprecedented October setting in Berkeley on Oct. 20. The only other one of the previous 114 Big Games not played in November or December took place on March 19, 1892 -- the rivalry's inaugural.

• The Cardinal travel as a conference foe for the first time to Boulder, Colo., to face Colorado on Nov. 3. Stanford last played at Colorado in a 1990 non-conference affair.

• The Nov. 10 home game versus Oregon State is the Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame game, including attendance by and honor of the newest Hall of Fame inductees.

• For the second straight season, Stanford will miss Arizona State and Utah in the Pac-12 Conference's interdivision rotation. The Cardinal will face both opponents for home-and-home matchups in 2013-14.

• A pair of 2012 conference opponents in Arizona and Colorado are off the regular season schedule for Stanford in 2013-14.

• Stanford's road schedule will also take the Cardinal to Oregon (Nov. 17) and UCLA (Nov. 24).

• The second annual Pac-12 Championship game will be played on the campus of the division winner with the best overall conference record.

The Polls

- Stanford is ranked 15th in the USA Today Coaches' poll (Oct. 28).

- The Cardinal is ranked 15th in the Associated Press Top 25 (Oct. 28), marking the 41st straight week Stanford has been ranked among the AP's Top 25. The streak is tied for the fifth longest in the nation, dating back to Sept. 5, 2010. Prior to the 2012 AP preseason poll, the Cardinal had been ranked 23 consecutive weeks among its top 10.

- Stanford has been ranked in the preseason AP poll 16 times, while the Cardinal appeared in a program-best 43 straight weekly polls from 1969-72.

- Stanford finished the 2011 season ranked No. 7 in both the AP and USA Today Coaches' polls, marking the second straight season the Cardinal had finished inside the top 10 after being ranked No. 4 at the conclusion of the 2010 season.

- The Cardinal sits at No. 14 in the newest BCS standings (Oct. 28). Stanford finished each of the past two seasons at No. 4 in the final BCS standings.

Cardinal Rising

- Stanford has compiled a 37-10 (.787) record over the last four seasons, finishing 8-5 in 2009, 12-1 in 2010 and 11-2 last season. The Cardinal's 36 wins rank second only to Oregon's 41 among Pac-12 teams during this stretch, while its .787 winning percentage stands seventh among all FBS teams.

- Stanford is one of just six teams in the nation that has compiled 29 or more wins over the last three seasons along with Oregon (32), Boise State (31), LSU (31), Alabama (30) and TCU (29). The Cardinal's .853 winning percentage since 2010 is tied for fifth-best among FBS teams during that stretch.

- The Cardinal has posted a 26-6 record in Pac-12 Conference play over the last four seasons, which ranks second only to Oregon's 30-2 mark. Prior to its 8-5 finish in 2009, the Cardinal suffered through seven straight losing seasons, compiling a 25-55 record from 2002-08.

Scoring Margins

- Of Stanford's last 20 wins dating back to the 2010 season, 12 have been by 25 points or more, while its average margin of victory in its last 20 wins has been 22.2 points (444 total).

- Stanford's last 37 victories dating back to the 2009 season have come by an average margin of 22.9 points (848 total), while its nine losses have come by a margin of 7.4 points (67 total).

- The Cardinal is 13-11 in its last 24 games decided by a touchdown or less.

The Home Record

- Stanford is 28-3 (.903) in its last 31 home games dating back to the final home contest of the 2007 season, with its only home losses coming against No. 6 USC (2008), California (2009) and No. 6 Oregon (2011) during that stretch.

- The Cardinal had won 11 straight home games at Stanford Stadium prior to its 53-30 loss to Oregon on Nov. 12 of last season. The current home winning streak stands at seven games.

- Stanford is averaging 39.0 points a game (1,169 total) over its last 30 home games while allowing just 21.8 (653 total).

Special Start

- Stanford's special teams are getting started on the right foot, boasting the Pac-12's top punt return average of 16.69 yards led by senior Drew Terrell. The Cardinal's kickoff coverage team has also cast a tight web with a net of 45.5 yards per kickoff (1st in Pac-12).

Taylor's Tale

- One of the top running backs in the Pac-12 Conference and a preseason candidate for the Doak Walker Award, senior Stepfan Taylor figures prominently on many of Stanford's career lists in his senior season.

- Taylor ranks second on Stanford's all-time career rushing list with 3,674 yards, in September against Duke passing Brad Muster (2,940) and two weeks ago against Cal passing Toby Gerhart (3,522). Taylor needs 359 more yards to tie Darrin Nelson for first place.

- With 904 rushing yards this season, Taylor needs 96 more yards for his third consecutive 1,000-yard rushing season – a feat never previously accomplished at Stanford. Taylor heads into his ninth game of the season Saturday, while he crossed the 1,000-yard mark in his 10th and 12th games of the 2011 and 2010 seasons, respectively.

- Taylor's 33 career rushing touchdowns are third all-time on The Farm, needing four more to tie Tommy Vardell for second.

- Taylor's 3,674 yards career rushing currently ranks sixth among active rushers in the NCAA, and his 717 career carries ranks third.

- Taylor's 18 100-yard games rank second on Stanford's all-time career list behind only Toby Gerhart (20). The Cardinal is 15-3 when Taylor reaches the century mark rushing.

- Taylor's 717 career carries rank first all-time at Stanford, last week passing Darrin Nelson (703) for the school record. He passed Toby Gerhart (671) and Brad Muster (686) the week prior at Cal.

- Taylor possesses the second and third best single-season rushing marks in school history. Taylor's sophomore (1,137) and junior (1,330) seasons rank ahead of Gerhart's junior season (1,136) and behind Gerhart's senior season (1,871).

- Taylor finished last season with 1,330 yards on 242 carries (5.5) and averaged 102.3 yards per game, which ranked fourth in the Pac-12 and 21st nationally. Taylor is one of six Stanford backs to rush for over 1,000 yards in a single season and just the third back to accomplish the feat in consecutive seasons, joining Nelson (1977-78) and Gerhart (2008-09).

- Renowned for making defenders miss and for moving his legs forward on contact, Taylor earlier this season orchestrated a string of 58 consecutive rushes without being stopped for a loss.

- Taylor's 189 rushing yards two weeks ago at Cal was a career high, eclipsing his 177 yards against Oklahoma State in the 2012 Fiesta Bowl.

- Taylor's 213 offensive yards (153 rushing, 60 receiving) against No. 2 USC was a career high.

- A 59-yard touchdown run against USC pushed Taylor past the 3,000-yard career mark. It was also the third-longest carry of his Cardinal career. Taylor's two longest rushing plays also came at Stanford Stadium: 70 yards vs. Washington in 2011 and 62 yards vs. Oregon State in 2010.

- Taylor was honored broadly following his game-breaking performances in Stanford's 21-14 win over USC: Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week, Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week, Maxwell Award Player of the Week and CBSsports.com Heisman Player of the Week.

- Also a creative and prolific producer of videos, Taylor's alter ego "Kulabafi" is a YouTube fascination and has been the source of media attention this season.

Giddy Up

- Stanford has recorded four of the school's top five single-season rushing marks over the last four seasons. In 2009, the Cardinal ran for a school-record 2,837 yards behind Heisman Trophy finalist Toby Gerhart. In 2010, the Cardinal finished with 2,779 yards on the ground, which ranks as the second best mark in school history.

- Last season, Stanford finished with 2,738 yards - good for third all-time. The Cardinal rushed for a school-record 446 yards in the Oct. 22 contest versus Washington.

- Of Stanford's 935 plays from scrimmage last season, 55.4 percent (518) were rushing plays while 44.6 (417) were pass attempts. From 2009 through 2011, Stanford rushed the ball on 59.8 percent of its offensive plays (1,589-2,657).

- The Cardinal has rushed the ball on 56.0 percent of its offensive plays (298/532) to date this season.

All Eyes on the O-Line

- The Cardinal's 2012 offensive line carried over just two starters in the same positions as last year: fifth-year senior C Sam Schwartzstein and junior RT Cameron Fleming. Senior RG Kevin Danser and senior LG Khalil Wilkes have debuted this year in the starting lineup, while junior David Yankey has been working at a new position at left tackle after starting 13 games in 2011 at left guard.

- Stanford's offensive line has allowed just nine quarterback sacks through eight games this season (1.13 average), best in the Pac-12 and tied for 23rd in the country. In 2011, the Cardinal allowed 11 sacks in 13 games (0.85) for seventh-best in the nation, and six sacks in 13 games (0.46) which ranked second in 2010.

- The ground game is averaging 161.6 yards per game, including a season-high 257 rushing yards against Arizona and 252 yards two weeks ago at Cal. The well-nicknamed "Tunnel Workers Union" moved earth and defenders to the tune of 210.6 rushing yards per game in 2011 (18th in the nation), 213.8 yards in 2010 (17th) and 218.2 yards in 2009 (11th).

- Three true freshmen have seen action on the offensive line this year for Stanford: OG Joshua Garnett, OT Kyle Murphy and OT Andrus Peat. As all three rated as five-star recruits out of high school and headlined Stanford's 2012 signing class, the talented trio of frosh have played both in the main five offensive line positions and in the Cardinal's six- and seven-linemen offensive sets. Garnett started last week versus Washington State at left guard.

- Twenty-eight percent of Stanford's offensive plays in 2011 contained more than five offensive linemen on the field.

- The myriad positions played by Stanford's offensive linemen can sometimes call personnel into alternate jersey numbers. Junior OG Dillon Bonnell (No. 75) has worn No. 96 in action this season and freshman OT Kyle Murphy (No. 78) has donned No. 94. Murphy even has had one pass attempt thrown his way.

Doing It On Defense

- Stanford's rushing defense is ranked No. 2 in the nation (behind Alabama), allowing 65.1 yards per game and 2.16 yards per carry. Eight out of Stanford's last 11 opponents have been held below 100 yards rushing, including minus-18 yards last week by Washington State and three yards by Cal the week prior.

- The Cardinal defense has scored in four games this season: Ed Reynolds INT return vs. Duke, Trent Murphy INT return at Washington, Chase Thomas fumble recovery at Notre Dame, and Ed Reynolds INT return vs. Washington State

- Opponents have scored a total of 13 points through eight games against Stanford's defense in first quarters of games this season, while only Washington (seven points), Washington State (seven), Arizona (15) and Notre Dame (10) have scored against the Cardinal in a fourth quarter.

- Stanford defenders have snared 10 interceptions this season, led by junior FS Ed Reynolds (four) and sophomore SS Jordan Richards (two). The Cardinal totaled seven interceptions all of 2011.

- Reynolds has returned two of his interceptions for touchdowns, among his 169 total interception return yards – second-best in the NCAA this season.

- Jordan Richards ranks 25th in the nation in passes defended at 1.25 per game (eight passes broken up and two interceptions).

- The Cardinal defense has allowed only nine passing scores this season, including a span of 19:24 of game time on the field without allowing a passing touchdown that ended in the final minutes versus Washington.

- The Stanford defense has been quick to get off the field in 2012, with 32 three-and-out possessions through eight games. The Cardinal ranks 19th in the nation in third-down defensive efficiency, allowing a conversion rate of only 31.8 percent.

- In 2011, Stanford finished third nationally in rushing defense, sixth in third down conversion defense (31.0; 51-164) and 11th in sacks per game (3.00).

Behind Enemy Lines

- Stanford's vaunted 3-4 defense ranks first in the NCAA with an average of 9.50 tackles per loss (76 total) and third with an average of 4.00 sacks (32 total) for the season. The Cardinal recorded a school-record 10 sacks last week versus Washington State.

- Seventeen different Cardinal players have recorded a tackle for loss in 2012. That breaks down to five defensive linemen (22.0 total TFL), seven linebackers (36.0 total TFL) and five defensive backs (18.0 total TFL).

- Four Stanford defenders currently are ranked in the Pac-12's top-15 in tackles for loss: senior OLB Trent Murphy has 1.44 TFL/game (11.5 total), tied for sixth; senior DE Ben Gardner has 1.38 TFL/game (11.0 total), eighth; senior NB Usua Amanam has 1.25 TFL/game (10.0 total), tied for 11th; and fifth-year senior OLB Chase Thomas has 1.19 TFL/game (9.5 total), 13th.

- In the season opener against San Jose State, the Cardinal notched 11 tackles for loss - led by Usua Amanam (4.0) and Chase Thomas (2.0). Seven different Cardinal players recorded tackles for loss in the game.

- Stanford stacked on six more tackles for loss against Duke.

- Nine different Cardinal defenders notched tackles for loss against USC, totaling 12 in the game. Ben Gardner led the way with 3.5 TFL and was honored as the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week.

- Seven Stanford defenders recorded seven solo tackles for loss at Washington, and nine had tackles for loss against Arizona.

- The Cardinal added six TFL at Notre Dame, led by Trent Murphy's 2.5.

- Stanford in the Big Game against Cal recorded 11 tackles for loss by seven defenders, led by Chase Thomas (3.0) and Shayne Skov (2.0).

- A season-high 15 tackles for loss came from nine Stanford defenders against Washington State, with four players recording 2.5 TFL each: Henry Anderson, Usua Amanam, Ben Gardner and Trent Murphy.

- Stanford's defense last season finished 11th in the nation in sacks (3.0) and 28th in tackles for loss (6.85).

- Numerous Stanford players in the defensive front seven employ the hashtag #partyInTheBackfield on Twitter.

The Stanford Trees

- Stanford's tight end tandem of Zach Ertz (27-346-4) and Levine Toilolo (25-343-6) combined to catch 52 passes for 689 yards and 10 touchdowns last season. The duo has combined for 47 receptions, 813 yards and six touchdowns in the opening eight games of 2012. Ertz and Toilolo are the Cardinal's two leading receivers this season and both were named to the John Mackey Award Midseason Watch List (Oct. 15).

- Following his three receptions for 71 yards and the game-winning touchdown against USC, Zach Ertz was named the John Mackey Tight End of the Week. Ertz followed the next game against Washington with career highs of six receptions and 106 yards. Against Arizona, he caught a team-high six passes for 64 yards and a touchdown. Ertz led Stanford's receivers again the next week at Notre Dame with 55 yards on four receptions. At Cal he set a new career high with 134 yards on six receptions, including a career-long 68-yard catch and run.

- Levine Toilolo caught the two longest receptions of his career both in the Arizona game (42, 46). Toilolo hauled in five total passes for a career-best 141 yards, along with a 12-yard touchdown. The 6-foot-8 target not only was tough to defend, but he also picked up yardage impressively after catches.

- Six tight ends currently on NFL rosters were grown on "The Farm" – Jim Dray (Arizona Cardinals), Coby Fleener (Indianapolis Colts), Erik Lorig (Tampa Bay Buccaneers), Evan Moore (Seattle Seahawks), Konrad Reuland (New York Jets) and Alex Smith (Cleveland Browns).

Captains to Lead the Cardinal

- Fifth-year senior C Sam Schwartzstein, senior RB Stepfan Taylor and fifth-year senior OLB Chase Thomas have been named tri-captains for the 2012 season, as voted by their teammates.

- A fourth game captain may represent the special teams: fifth-year senior OLB Alex Debnjak (San Jose State and Notre Dame), junior K Jordan Williamson (Duke), senior ILB Jarek Lancaster (USC), sophomore WR Ty Montgomery (Washington) and senior Drew Terrell (Washington State).

Fresh Faces Time to Shine

- The 2012 Stanford signing class that was ranked fifth nationally by Rivals.com and sixth-best by Scout.com has arrived on The Farm as freshmen.

- The offensive line class was hailed by some as the greatest in the history of college football. As a whole, the talent level of the class has lived up to expectations this fall.

- Eleven true freshmen have made their debuts this season, encompassing all three phases of the game on offense, defense and special teams: Alex Carter, Joshua Garnett, Zach Hoffpauir, Luke Kaumatule, Drew Madhu, Blake Martinez, Reed Miller, Kyle Murphy, Andrus Peat, Aziz Shittu and Kodi Whitfield. The defensive backs (Carter, Hoffpauir, Madhu) and offensive linemen (Garnett, Murphy, Peat) lead the way in this talented freshman class.

- By way of comparison, four true freshman saw the field for the Cardinal in 2011. Six played in each of 2010 and 2009. Eight freshmen played in their first year in 2008.

- Three true freshmen started last week versus Washington State: CB Alex Carter, OG Joshua Garnett and LS Reed Miller. OT Andrus Peat started after halftime and played throughout the second half, while SS Zach Hoffpauir played extensively in the second half. WR Kodi Whitfield made his first two receptions of his career against the Cougars.

- Eight of the 11 true freshmen playing this season are starters on at least one special teams unit. Five of those freshmen are multiple-unit starters, including Alex Carter, Drew Madhu and Blake Martinez as three-unit special teams starters.

- Seventeen additional Stanford players have made their collegiate debut in 2012: sophomores Kevin Anderson, Brendon Austin, Devon Cajuste, Lance Callihan, Ronnie Harris, Anthony Hayes, Kevin Hogan, Charlie Hopkins, Ra'Chard Pippens, Jordan Pratt, Torsten Rotto, J.B. Salem, Patrick Skov, Remound Wright and Kelsey Young, plus juniors Dillon Bonnell and Conor McFadden.



Media Picks Stanford Second in Pac-12 North

• Stanford was picked to finish second in the Pac-12 North Division in a poll of conference media members. The prediction would equal where Stanford finished a year ago when it lost the head-to-head tiebreaker with Oregon.

• Stanford received five first-place votes in the North Division, but was picked behind Oregon which received 117. The Ducks amassed 732 points to 533 for Stanford. Washington was picked third in the division with 503 points, followed by California (382), Washington State (228) and Oregon State (205).

• USC was tabbed to win the Pac-12 South and received 117 of 120 first-place votes. The Trojans were also tabbed to win the Pac-12 Championship Game, receiving 102 of 123 votes.

• The media poll has correctly selected the conference champion in 28 of 51 previous polls, including 11 of the last 12. Historically, the media has not been great at selecting Stanford's outcome, although it did correctly slot Stanford second in 2011.

• On the season of Stanford's most recent Rose Bowl appearance (1999), the Cardinal was picked to finish eighth. In the 51 years of the conference media poll, Stanford has never been picked first, but has played in three Rose Bowls during that span.

Coaching Changes

• Stanford welcomes two new coaches to its staff in 2012, with Pete Alamar taking over the role as special teams coordinator and David Kotulski assuming the duties of inside linebackers coach.

• Alamar served as special teams coordinator for the past two seasons at Fresno State and also spent seven seasons (2003-09) in the same capacity at California.

• Running backs coach Mike Sanford has taken on additional responsibilities as recruiting coordinator.

In the Classroom

• Stanford's football program received an Academic Progress Rating (APR) of 977 last spring, which was the highest rating in the Pac-12 Conference and a figure that ranked 13th nationally among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) institutions.

• Stanford had 65 players card a grade point average of 3.0 or better last spring quarter.

• Stanford University requires its students to declare an undergraduate major before starting their junior year. Among the team's juniors and seniors, 18 different majors are represented. Fifteen Cardinal upperclassmen are engineering majors. Majors with three or more Cardinal scholar-athletes: biomechanical engineering, economics, management science & engineering, political science, psychology, and science, technology & society.

Cardinal Playbooks Go Digital

• Stanford ushered in a new era with iPad playbooks for the 2012 season. With the start of the Cardinal's fall training camp, each Stanford player and coach received an iPad outfitted with a digital playbook powered by Denver-based partner PlayerLync.

• Five professional teams in the NFL are currently equipped through the same partnership, and Stanford is proud to be the first in college football to take this leap forward in operational efficiency, cost reduction and environmental responsibility.

• The voluminous paper playbooks which consumed trees, money and countless man-hours of production are now a thing of the past for Stanford. The training camp playbook, weekly game playbooks and daily notes are now all immediately published from the coaching staff to the players via unattended content synchronization, ensuring that Stanford's players have all the right information as soon as it is available. Documents and video are automatically pushed to each team member's iPad without their involvement.

Stanford Stadium Becomes Wireless Leader

• For the past two seasons, Stanford has taken a bold leadership position with in-venue technology, working with AT&T to build a free public Wi-Fi network in operation at Stanford Stadium since the beginning of the 2011 season. Stanford is working to have the first stadium in college or pro football to aggressively resolve the increasing problem of in-venue mobile connectivity for today's fans.

• To get started, fans simply turn on their Wi-Fi under settings and connect to "attwifi" inside Stanford Stadium. The free public Wi-Fi network is also available at eight additional venues throughout Stanford Athletics.

• Stanford has also developed a web-based application to uniquely enhance the game day experience for fans. Stanford GameDay Live! provides access to video highlights, live statistics and more throughout the game. Fans connected to the "attwifi" network in Stanford Stadium can visit StanfordGDL.com for a rich mobile augmentation to their Cardinal game day experience.

STANFORD, Calif. - Senior running back Stepfan Taylor rushed for 116 yards and the Stanford defense stepped up in the final quarter to help the heavily-favored Cardinal hold off upset-minded San Jose State 20-17 in the first-ever Friday night home game at chilly Stanford Stadium.

Playing in front of an announced crowd of 40,577, Taylor eclipsed 100 yards for the 14th time in his career and scored on a one-yard run in the first quarter.

Senior wide receiver Drew Terrell caught an 11-yard scoring pass from senior quarterback Josh Nunes late in the first quarter to give Stanford a 14-0 advantage. It was the first collegiate start for Nunes, who completed 16-of-26 passes for 125 yards and did not commit a turnover.

Junior place kicker Jordan Williamson converted both of his field goal attempts, including a career-long 46-yarder as time expired in the second quarter to lift the Cardinal to a 17-3 lead. Ultimately, his 20-yarder with 13:15 remaining in the game provided the margin of victory.

San Jose State fought back to tie the game with two third-quarter touchdowns. The first came on a three-yard run by quarterback Blake Jurich to cap a 78-yard drive, and the second on a 21-yard pass from quarterback David Fales to wide receiver Noel Grigsby to finish off an 82-yard march.

The Stanford defense, led by sophomore strong safety Jordan Richards, senior nickel back Usua Amanam, fifth-year senior outside linebacker Chase Thomas and junior free safety Ed Reynolds, blanked the Spartans in the fourth quarter, forcing two punts, held on fourth down, and intercepted a pass. Richards collected a team-high seven tackles; Amanam contributed six tackles, including four for losses, and recovered a fumble; Thomas had five tackles, including two for losses; and Reynolds forced a fumble and preserved the win by intercepting Fales on fourth and 10 from the San Jose State 30 with 1:10 left in the game.

Stanford out-rushed the Spartans 155-72, but struggled on third down, converting only 2 of 13 opportunities. However, the Cardinal did not turn the ball over and finished plus-2 in turnover ratio.

Of the 17 players who received first-ever playing time for Stanford, 10 were true freshmen. The Cardinal improved its record to 51-14-1 in the series and won for the ninth time in the last 10 meetings. Stanford has also won 24 of its last 27 home games.

STANFORD, Calif. - Black uniforms and helmets definitely agree with the Stanford football team. For only the third time in school history, the 25th-ranked Cardinal wore them against Duke and rolled to a 50-13 victory at Stanford Stadium before an announced crowd of 44,016. In 2010, Stanford donned them in 68-24 win against Wake Forest. Last year, the Cardinal wore them in a 45-19 win against UCLA.

Led by quarterback Josh Nunes and a suffocating Stanford defense, the Cardinal improved to 2-0 for the third-straight season. In only his second collegiate start, Nunes completed 16-of-30 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns. The defense had little trouble with Duke's no-huddle offense, forcing seven-consecutive punts to start the game. For the fifth game in a row, it held an opponent to less than 100 yards in net rushing, limiting Duke to 12.

After getting three-and-out with the opening kickoff, Duke (1-1) punted to Cardinal wide receiver Drew Terrell, who returned it 76 yards for a touchdown. Stanford tacked on nine points on three field goals by placekicker Jordan Williamson. The Cardinal increased its lead to 20-0 with 11:47 remaining in the second quarter on a 13-yard burst by running back Stepfan Taylor.

The Blue Devils finally crossed midfield with 5:50 remaining in the half when cornerback Ross Cockrell intercepted a Nunes pass at the Cardinal 38. But once again, the Stanford defense was stout. On fourth and two from the 14-yard-line, inside linebacker Shane Skov, playing in his first game since suffering a season-ending knee injury last year in the third game against Arizona, deflected a pass by quarterback Sean Renfree to thwart the scoring threat.

The Blue Devils attempted an inside kick to start the third quarter, but the Cardinal recovered at the Duke 43. Nunes capped a quick scoring drive by finding Terrell in the back of the end zone for a 19-yard touchdown pass.

Less than a minute later, defensive end Henry Anderson tipped a Cockrell pass at the line of scrimmage and strong safety Jordan Richards intercepted at the Blue Devil 7. Nunes upped the lead to 37-3 with a seven-yard scoring pass to tight end Levine Toilolo with 10:41 left in the third quarter.

Cardinal free safety Ed Reynolds intercepted two passes and returned the first 71 yards for a touchdown. He now has three on the season, equaling last year's team-high set by Michael Thomas.

Taylor finished with 69 yards rushing, to move past Brad Muster into third place on the school's all-time list. Taylor now ranks fifth in career touchdowns with 32.

STANFORD, Calif. - Josh Nunes threw a go-ahead 37-yard touchdown to Zach Ertz. Stepfan Taylor ran for 153 yards and scored two touchdowns and No. 21 Stanford upset second-ranked USC 21-14 for its fourth straight win in this series. Heisman Trophy hopeful Matt Barkley threw for 254 yards and two interceptions while completing only 20 of 41 passes. He was sacked twice on the final drive for the Trojans and threw out of bounds on a final, desperate heave on fourth-and-39 from USC's 25-yard line.

Coming out of a two-year bowl ban, USC had national title hopes this season. Now the Trojans will have to climb out of another hole to get there.

A sold-out crowd at Stanford Stadium rushed the field, tossing streamers and jumping in a wild celebration at midfield with Cardinal coach David Shaw and players caught in the middle of the mess. Stanford was 3-0 for the third straight season for the first time since 1970-72 and had its longest winning streak ever against USC in a rivalry that dates back to 1905.

Taylor took a short screen pass and scurried 23 yards for a tying touchdown late in the third quarter. Nunes scampered 12 yards on a third-and-10 from midfield in the fourth and then delivered the strike to Ertz, who juke a defender and dove into the end zone to give Stanford a 21-14 lead and send the home fans into a flurry.

The last chance for USC never amounted to much.

Marqise Lee caught an 18-yard pass on fourth-and-4 on the sideline that was originally ruled out of bounds. After a video replay, officials ruled Lee's left foot landed in bounds and he controlled the ball. Mistakes finally doomed the Trojans.

Nunes threw for 215 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions on 15-for-32 passing in the redshirt junior's biggest game yet. In the end, all that really mattered to Luck's replacement was the win.

Stanford sacked Barkley four times and had him constantly losing his poise in the pocket. The Cardinal outgained the Trojans 417 to 280 total yards and held USC to only 26 yards rushing.

SEATTLE, Wash. - Kasen Williams took a quick screen pass from Keith Price, broke a tackle and the line of scrimmage and raced 35 yards for the go-ahead score with 4:53 left, and Washington rallied from 10 points down to stun No. 8 Stanford, 17-13.

Trailing 13-3 late in the third quarter, the Huskies got a 61-yard touchdown sprint from running back Bishop Sankey, their first offensive touchdown against an FBS opponent since the first quarter of the opener against San Diego State.

Then Washington put together a nine-play drive that included another fourth-down conversion and was capped by Williams' catch-and-run that gave the Huskies their first lead.

It was Washington's first win over a top 10 ranked opponent since its upset of then-No. 3 USC back in 2009, Steve Sarkisian's first season at Washington.

Stanford was held without an offensive touchdown for the first time since a 23-6 loss at Oregon State on Oct. 27, 2007 - a span of 59 games. It also snapped a streak of 11 straight wins in the month of September.

Josh Nunes completed just 18 of 37 passes for 170 yards with an interception.

Stepfan Taylor ran for 138 yards against Washington last year and had 153 yards rushing in the upset of then-No. 2 USC on Sept. 15. He finished with 75 yards on 21 carries, none of them longer than 7 yards.

Stanford's only touchdown came on Trent Murphy's athletic 40-yard interception return for a touchdown in the third quarter that gave the Cardinal a 13-3 lead. Then came Washington's scoring blitz, with Sankey slipping free on the final play of the third quarter for the longest run of his career. After Stanford went three-and-out for the seventh time in the game, the Huskies went on a 65-yard drive to take the lead.

STANFORD, Calif. - Josh Nunes threw for a career-high 360 yards and two touchdowns and ran for three more scores, rallying No. 18 Stanford from a two-touchdown deficit to stun Arizona 54-48 in overtime. Chase Thomas intercepted a tipped pass by Matt Scott in the extra period and Stepfan Taylor ran for a 21-yard touchdown two plays later.

Nunes completed 21 of 34 passes, scrambled for first downs and -- most importantly -- offset Scott's record-setting performance.

Scott completed 45 of 69 passes -- both school records -- for 491 yards and three touchdowns until Henry Anderson tipped his final pass in overtime that Thomas intercepted. Arizona amassed 617 total yards -- same as Stanford -- but lost for the third straight game and is still winless in conference play.

Nunes ran his second short touchdown to trim Arizona's lead to 48-41 with 6:34 remaining. The Cardinal held the Wildcats to three-and-out on the next possession and Nunes led a drive that will help ease concerns about Luck's successor.

The redshirt junior ran for 16 yards on third-and-7 from midfield, threw 17 yards to tight end Zach Ertz on fourth-and-9 from Arizona's 20 and ran for the tying touchdown with 45 seconds left in regulation.

Taylor, who finished with 142 yards rushing and two touchdowns, ran for 35 yards on seven carries before Nunes lofted an 11-yard touchdown pass to Ertz in the corner of the end zone to give the Cardinal a 7-0 lead on the game's first possession.

Stanford has won after its last seven losses. The last time the Cardinal dropped consecutive games came in 2009, when it lost to Oregon State on Oct. 10 and Arizona on Oct. 17.

NOTRE DAME, Ind. - A wall of Notre Dame defenders stopped Stepfan Taylor inches from the end zone on fourth down in overtime and the seventh-ranked Irish remained unbeaten with a 20-13 victory against No. 17 Stanford on a soggy Saturday in South Bend.

Taylor went up the middle and was knocked back, but kept reaching and turning with bodies underneath him. His knee never did hit the ground before reaching the ball across the goal line. But the officials ruled it was too late. The whistle had blown, and that meant the play was stopped. The celebration had to wait for a replay review.

TJ Jones made a reaching 7-yard touchdown catch from Tommy Rees on the first overtime possession to give the Fighting Irish a lead. Stanford responded by driving to a first-and-goal at the 4.

Taylor ran for 1 on first, 2 on second and about a foot on third down. That left one play from inside the 1 and the Notre Dame defense, led by Carlos Calabrese, held up Taylor and moved him backward.

Rees relieved Everett Golson late in the fourth quarter, but this was different from when he did it against Purdue in September and led the Irish to a winning field goal. Golson took a helmet to the head during Notre Dame's game-tying field goal drive late in the fourth.

In the overtime, Rees floated a 16-yard pass to Theo Riddick to convert a third-and-8 to the 7. On the next play, he threw behind Jones on a slant and the receiver reached back for a sliding two-handed catch and a 20-13 lead.

Jordan Williamson's 27-yard field goal with 6:12 put the Cardinal up 13-10, and the Fighting Irish drove into Cardinal territory when Golson absorbed the helmet hit from Usua Amanam that was flagged for 15 yards.

Rees came in and completed an 11-yard pass to Tyler Eifert, and then on third-and-4 from the 28 Eifert drew a pass interference call on Terrence Brown that gave the Irish a first down at the 13.

The Irish settled for Kyle Brindza's 22-yard field goal with 20 seconds left to tie it at 13-13.

Golson alternated between scary and spectacular, completing 12 of 24 for 141 yards and a touchdown. He also lost two key fumbles -- one that Stanford's Chase Thomas recovered in the end zone in the second quarter for a touchdown and the other in the third that gave the Cardinal the ball back after Golson had made a long run deep into Stanford territory.

Thomas' touchdown put Stanford up 7-3, the first time all season Notre Dame had trailed.

BERKELEY, Calif. - Stepfan Taylor ran for a career-high 189 yards and a touchdown, and Stanford overwhelmed California 21-3 for a third straight victory against its rival.

Taylor (3,616) passed 2009 Heisman Trophy runner-up Toby Gerhart (3,522) for second on Stanford's career rushing list. Now only Darin Nelson (4,033) has more.

The Cardinal outgained the Bears 475 to 217 yards, outrushed them 252 to 3 yards and never lost its grip on the coveted Stanford Axe.

Josh Nunes completed 16 of 31 passes for 214 yards and a touchdown for Stanford.

Cal had not scored so few points in the Big Game since losing 10-3 in 1998. Zach Maynard was sacked four times, the Bears fumbled three times - losing two of them - and had another interception of Nunes wiped out by a penalty.

Taylor shook two defenders at the line of scrimmage, cut outside and sliced back up the middle for a 7-yard touchdown run to give Stanford a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter. Taylor's touchdown marked the Cardinal offense's first on the road this season after losses at Notre Dame and Washington.

Maynard completed 19 of 31 passes for 214 yards -- most with the game already decided. Keenan Allen, one of the nation's best receivers, was held to four catches for 43 yards.

STANFORD, Calif. - Ed Reynolds returned an interception for a touchdown and No. 19 Stanford sacked Jeff Tuel a school-record 10 times to overcome a sloppy offensive effort in a 24-17 victory over Washington State.

Reynolds stepped in front of Tuel's pass for the safety's fourth interception - and second returned for a score - this season early in the fourth quarter to bail out the Cardinal offense again. He ran 25 yards untouched into the end zone to give Stanford a two-touchdown lead, highlighting another swarming defensive effort that held the Cougars to minus-16 yards rushing and forced new coach Mike Leach's aerial offense to throw 60 times.

Josh Nunes completed 7 of 15 passes for 136 yards and a touchdown and Ryan Hewitt ran for a short score. A week after running for a career-high 189 yards against rival California, Stepfan Taylor was held to 58 yards on 21 carries.

Washington State had 25 first downs to only 12 for Stanford, which converted 5-of-12 third downs and only put together one complete drive all game.

Tuel, who completed 43 of 60 passes for 401 yards, led a 12-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 10-yard touchdown pass to Kristoff Williams with 6:29 to play to bring Washington State within a touchdown.

Stanford managed two first downs before punting the ball back and giving the Cougars another chance. Marquess Wilson made a leaping 42-yard catch to put Washington State at the Stanford 23. On fourth-and-21, Bobby Ratliff caught a 25-yard pass from Tuel at the 9.

Usua Amanam pressured Tuel into a 15-yard intentional grounding penalty and an automatic 10-second runoff. With Washington State looking for one final heave to the end zone, Henry Anderson planted Tuel into the ground as time expired.

Stanford's National Championships

• NCAA championships are commonplace at Stanford University, as Cardinal teams have combined to win 103 NCAA team championships, including 61 men's championships and an NCAA-best 42 women's titles. Stanford teams have combined to capture a national-best 86 NCAA titles since 1980 and 63 since 1990. Stanford has won at least one NCAA championship for 35 consecutive years and has won four national titles in a single year nine times.

• Nine different teams have won at least five national titles, including men's tennis (18), women's tennis (17), men's water polo (11), women's swimming and diving (9), men's swimming and diving (8), men's golf (8), women's volleyball (6), synchronized swimming (6) and women's cross country (5). A total of 19 Stanford teams have won at least one national championship after women's rowing captured its inaugural NCAA title 2009.
