# 2014 NFFCC NEWS & NOTES

## ADAMS STATE UNIVERSITY (1-5, 0-4 RMAC)

**Team Notes:** An outbreak of offense from the onset kept the Chadron State College Eagles in the driver's seat for the duration of their game against the Adams State University Grizzlies on Saturday afternoon. The Eagles came into Alamosa and posted a 45-31 victory over ASU during homecoming week.

## COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (4-2, 3-1 RMAC)

**Team Notes:** The Colorado Mesa University defense intercepted five passes and held New Mexico Highlands to 407 yards of total offense in a 31-19 win over the Cowboys in RMAC football action Saturday (Oct. 11). NMHU entered the game averaging over 550 yards of offense per game.

## COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (6-0, 4-0 RMAC)

### Kole Kadavy (Senior, Linebacker, 6-0, 205, Greeley, Colo./Greeley)

Kadavy led No. 16 Mines to a 44-37 victory over Western New Mexico on Saturday behind a game-high 18 tackles. The senior notched 10 solo stops and added 1.0 tackle for loss for five yards. He added his third interception of the season in the win as well, and currently sits second in the RMAC with 73 tackles through six games.

**Team Notes:** The No. 16 Colorado school of Mines football team used a 19-yard touchdown pass from Justin Dvorak to Cole Spurgeon with 3:02 remaining to remain unbeaten with a 44-37 victory over Western New Mexico at the North Area Athletic Complex on Saturday. Mines (6-0, 4-0 RMAC) churned out 96 plays for 531 yards in the win and benefitted from nine WNMU (2-4, 1-3 RMAC) penalties in the contest that helped overcome a season-high four turnovers. The Oredigger defense forced five turnovers, including a pair of interceptions by sophomore Jalen Champagne. Tied 37-37 with 5:28 remaining, Mines marched 75 yards on eight plays over the next 2:26 for the deciding touchdown from Dvorak to Spurgeon on a back-shoulder deep fade route in the front corner of the end zone. The second of two interceptions by Champagne on the ensuing drive gave Mines the ball back with 2:14 remaining and, after a 3-and-out by the offense, Western New Mexico took over again with 1:44 to play on its own 26-yard line. Despite getting in to Mines' territory, WNMU quarterback Mitch Glasmann was sacked for an 11-yard loss in the waning seconds by junior Billy Sprague to end the game. Dvorak finished 32-of-60 for 413 yards and four touchdowns through the air to lead the offense. He also carried 11 times but was held to minus-three yards on the ground and was picked off twice. The Tomball, Texas, product has claimed each of the last two RMAC Offensive Player of the Week awards. Senior Tevin Champagne, the elder Champagne brother, carried 22 times for 103 yards and a 1-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. He also caught three passes for 11 yards and a 10-yard touchdown in the final minutes of the third quarter. Spurgeon led the receiving corps with 10 receptions for 171 yards and the go-ahead touchdown. The junior has caught eight or more passes and gone for 90 or more yards receiving in each of the last three games. His 171 yards on Saturday set a new career high for the Gretna, Neb., product. Fellow junior Jimmy Ellis caught eight balls for 115 yards, including a 36-yarder in the second quarter. He totaled 109 return yards as well for a total of 224 all-purpose yards in the contest – his second-straight game with 180-plus total yards. Nate Wiemers made another big impact for the squad with six receptions for 90 yards, including a 43-yard touchdown on a screen pass in the first quarter. Senior Diamond Gillis finished with four catches for 29 yards and a 7-yard score in the third quarter. Defensively, Champagne added six stops (five solo) along with his pair of interceptions, while senior Kole Kadavy notched a game-high 18 tackles (10 solo) during the afternoon. The reigning RMAC Defensive Player of the Week added an interception and a tackle for loss in the win and has now notched 12 or more tackles in each of the last four contests. Sprague finished second on the team with 11 stops (two solo) in addition to a team-high 2.0 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and two quarterback hurries. Ryan Griffith and Chris Pinson added seven stops and a pass breakup apiece, while Dallas Fields and Andrew Renfrew each notched six and 0.5 tackle for loss. Avery Llewellyn finished 3-for-5 on field goals and made all five of his extra points on the way to 14 points on Saturday. He was true on attempts from 44, 43 and 33 while missing on attempts from 32 and 57. His 57-yard attempt had the distance but bounced off the left upright at the end of the third quarter. He also punted four times with a 42.8 average and notched two touchbacks on eight kickoffs. Mines will have a short week to prepare for Fort Lewis (2-4, 1-3 RMAC) – the Orediggers' opponent on Thursday on national television (INFORMATION). The Skyhawks upset No. 2 CSU-Pueblo (5-1, 3-1 RMAC) on Saturday in Durango by a score of 23-22.

## COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (5-1, 1-1 MWC)

### Rashard Higgins (Sophomore, Wide Receiver, 6-2, 188, Mesquite, Texas/Mesquite)

Higgins has quickly become Grayson's favorite target. On Saturday night, Higgins caught 10 receptions for a career-high 194 yards and two touchdowns. Higgins' 194 receiving yards are the most by a Mountain West pass-catcher this season and the 16th-most nationally. The 194 receiving yards mark the eighth-most in a single game by a CSU pass-catcher and the most since Rashaun Greer's 211 vs. UNLV on Oct. 4, 2008. In just six games in 2014, Higgins has 10 receiving touchdowns, which ties the single-season CSU record. He currently shares the record with Dion Morton (2008) and Jeff Champine (1981). Higgins now has 16 career receiving touchdowns (6 as a freshman in 2013, 10 in 2014), which ranks as the eighth-most among CSU pass-catchers. Jeff Champine (1980-83) holds the all-time receiving touchdown record at CSU. Saturday was his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season. This ranks as the seventh-most in a single season by a CSU pass-catcher. David Anderson had six 100-yard receiving games in 2003 and 2005, and Willie Miller had six games of at least 100 receiving yards in 1974.

**Team Notes:** The Rams are 5-1 for the first time since 2000. That year, CSU went 10-2 and were Mountain West champions. Saturday also marked CSU's fourth consecutive victory, the longest win streak the Rams have put together in a single season since 2002. That year CSU won six consecutive games. CSU has won five of its last seven true road games dating back to last season, the most successful road stretch since winning five of six during the 2002-03 season. Including neutral site games, CSU has won seven of its last nine games outside Fort Collins. The Rams return to Hughes Stadium to take on Utah State next Saturday. At home, CSU has won four consecutive games and nine of their last 11, dating back to the 2012 season.



# 2014 NFFCC NEWS & NOTES

## COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (5-1, 3-1 RMAC)

**Team Notes:** The No. 2 Colorado State University-Pueblo football team's 42-game regular season winning streak, which started Oct. 23, 2010, came to an end Saturday in a 23-22 upset loss at Fort Lewis College. The streak goes down as the second-longest regular season winning streak in NCAA Division II history, behind at 48-game win streak by Grand Valley State University from 2004-09. The Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference contest at Ray Dennison Memorial Field had six lead changes, with the last coming on a touchdown by Fort Lewis (2-4, 1-3 RMAC) to take the 23-22 lead with 3:46 remaining in the fourth quarter.

## FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (2-4, 1-3 RMAC)

### PJ Hall (R-Freshman, Running Back, 5-6, 170, Aurora, Colo./Rangeview HS)

Hall rushed for 174 carries on 28 carries against the No. 2 team in the nation and the second best rushing defense in the RMAC. Seven of his rushes went for first downs. He averaged 6.2 yards per carry in the Skyhawks upset win over the ThunderWolves at Ray Dennison Memorial Field. His longest run of the day was 41 yards. The Skyhawks win snapped the Pack's 42 straight regular season game winning streak.

## UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY (3-3, 1-2 MWC)

**Team Notes:** Air Force extended its school-record consecutive games scoring streak to 264 games dating back to a 13-0 loss to Mississippi in the 1992 Liberty Bowl. The streak is the third longest active streak in the nation and the ninth longest in NCAA history. Air Force blocked its third kick of the season (1 PAT, 1 FG, 1 Punt). It is the first blocked punt since 2010. The Air Force defense forced a turnover for the third straight game. The Falcons have forced 11 turnovers in that span. Air Force had its first game holding an opponent below 100 yards rushing, holding Utah State to 77 yards on the ground.

## UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (2-4, 0-3 PAC-12)

**Team Notes:** Colorado had a bye this past week. They will play at USC on Saturday at 4 p.m.

## UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO (2-4, 1-2 BSC)

**Team Notes:** Northern Colorado dropped its first game at Nottingham Field in a high scoring affair to Sacramento State, 43-38 on Saturday. A late fourth quarter touchdown reception by sophomore wide out, Stephen Miller cut the Hornets' lead to six, but the Bears special team unit couldn't capitalize on the onside kick to give themselves one final attempt to win the game.

## WESTERN STATE COLORADO UNIVERSITY (3-3, 2-2 RMAC)

**Team Notes:** Totaling nearly 500 yards of offense, the Western State Colorado University football team improved to .500 on the season with a win over Black Hills State University. The Mountaineers broke through for 34 points, defeating the Yellow Jackets 34-13 at home on Saturday.
