NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION - COLORADO CHAPTER PLAYER OF THE WEEK



Garrett Grayson
Colorado State
Senior, QB, 6-2, 220
Vancouver, Wash./
Heritage HS

Grayson completed 18-of-21 passes for 390 yards and 5 touchdowns in Colorado State's 45-31 victory over rival Wyoming, securing the Bronze Boot for the second consecutive year. Grayson's 5 passing touchdowns were a career-best. This figure is tied for the 12th most in a single game this season among all FBS quarterbacks, and the most in the Mountain West. His .857 (18-of-21) completion percentage was the second-best performance in school history. Grayson now holds the best single-game passing efficiency (320.3) this season. Grayson began the game completing his first 13 passes for 252 yards and two touchdowns.

2014 NFFCC NEWS & NOTES

ADAMS STATE UNIVERSITY (3-5, 2-4 RMAC)

Ryan Holland (Junior, Defensive Back, 5-10, 185, Corning, Calif./Corning HS)

Ryan Holland returned an interception 57-yards for the game winning touchdown as 2:20 remained in the fourth quarter. The junior's pick-six brought the game to its final score of 41-34 as Adams State University defeated New Mexico Highlands. On NMHU's next possession, Holland secured an ASU victory with another interception. In total, Holland recorded seven solo tackles, one assisted tackle, and two interceptions. His two interceptions came within a span of 90 seconds.

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (5-3, 4-2 RMAC)

Team Notes: Fort Lewis scored 20 points off of turnovers to defeat the Colorado Mesa University football team 28-20 on Homecoming Saturday. The win snapped the Mavericks seven game winning streak against the Skyhawks.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (7-1, 5-1 RMAC)

Kole Kadavy (Senior, 5-11, 205, Greeley, Colo. / Greeley Central)

Kadavy led No. 11 Mines during its 20-12 loss to No. 11 CSU-Pueblo on Saturday with a game-high 18 tackles. Six of his 18 tackles were solo stops and he also recorded 2.0 tackles for loss as well. Saturday's performance pushed Kadavy over 100 tackles on the season, giving him 103 (59 solo) and 12.5 tackles for loss in eight contests. The Greeley native also leads the team with four interceptions on the season as well.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (7-1, 3-1 MWC)

Garrett Grayson (Senior, Quarterback, 6-2, 220, Vancouver, Wash./Heritage HS)

Senior quarterback Garrett Grayson completed 18-of-21 passes for 390 yards and 5 touchdowns in Colorado State's 45-31 victory over rival Wyoming, securing the Bronze Boot for the second consecutive year. Grayson's 5 passing touchdowns were a career-best, and the most by a CSU quarterback since Matt Newton threw five at Air Force on Nov. 11, 2000. This figure is tied for the 12th most in a single game this season among all FBS quarterbacks, and the most in the Mountain West. His .857 (18-of-21) completion percentage last night was the second-best performance in school history, trailing only Caleb Hanie (.870), who completed 20-of-23 passes vs. Colorado on Sept. 9, 2006. Grayson now holds the best single-game passing efficiency (320.3) this season, ahead of second place by over 40 points (Seth Russell – Baylor – 277.17). Grayson began the game completing his first 13 passes for 252 yards and two touchdowns. This was the second-longest consecutive completions streak in school history. The most consecutive completions in CSU history was set by Caleb Hanie (14) vs. Colorado on Sept. 9, 2006. Hanie was 14-for-14 for 179 yards.

Team Notes: The Rams have rattled off six consecutive victories, the longest win streak Colorado State has put together in a single season since 2002, when they also won six straight. At Hughes Stadium the Rams have won six consecutive games and 11 of their last 13, dating back to the 2012 season. This is the best period of success at home for the Rams since winning 15-of-17 stretching across the 1997-2001 seasons. The Rams are 13-3 in their last 16 games as a program, and started 7-1 this year for the first time since 2000. This is the Rams' first 3-1 start in the Mountain West since 2005. That year, CSU opened up with wins against Air Force, Utah and Wyoming but lost at BYU.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (7-1, 5-1 RMAC)

Seth Brown (Sophomore, Linebacker, 5-11, 202, Colorado Springs, Colo./Palmer HS)

Seth Brown totaled a career-high and CSU-Pueblo 2014-high 16 tackles in the 20-12 victory at No. 11 Colorado Mines Saturday. Seven of his 16 tackles were solo efforts. Brown led a defensive unit that held Mines to 12 points (six in the first three quarters) and 349 total yards. Entering the contest, the Colorado Mines offense was averaging 44.6 points per game, while its 563.4 yards per game was No. 1 in the nation.

Team Notes: The ThunderWolves defeated the 11th ranked team in the nation - Colorado Mines - 20-12.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (3-5, 2-4 RMAC)

PJ Hall (R-Freshman, Running Back, 5-6, 170, Aurora, Colo./Rangeview HS)

PJ Hall rushed for a game high 166 yards Saturday night at Colorado Mesa in a 28-20 upset win. He carried the ball 38 times and added a 24-yard touchdown score. Seven of his rushes went for first downs. He averaged 4.4 yards per carry. In his last three games, Hall has rushed at least 160 yards each game and averaged 167.7 yards per game.

UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY (5-2, 2-2 MWC)

Team Notes: Air Force had a bye this past week. The Falcons will play at Army on Nov. at 9:30 a.m. (MT).

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (2-6, 0-5 PAC-12)

Kenneth Olugbode (Sophomore, Inside Linebacker, 6-0, 210, San Jose, Calif. (Bellarmine Prep))

In Colorado's 40-37 double overtime loss to UCLA in Boulder, Olugbode had 7 tackles (all solo), including one for a loss, a tackle for zero, three third down stops, a fumble recovery and a pass deflection.

Team Notes: UCLA now leads the series by an 8-2 count (4-0 with both as members of the Pac-12). CU drops to 5-7 in overtime games (0-2 this year, 0-3 in multiple); this was the third time CU has played two OT games in the same season (1999—two regular season, 2002—one in a bowl game); all seven losses have been by three points. Game time of 3:53 tied for the fourth longest in CU history (longest was 4:01 at Cal this year, also 2 OT). Colorado has now lost two straight coin tosses after winning the first six (plus the OT one at Cal). Colorado started a new tradition on Saturday: the Buffs will carry out the flags of United States and Colorado when taking the field. The 92-yard run by Paul Perkins was the second longest ever against CU (Robbie Rouse, Fresno State, 94 in 2012). Second Quarter Mastery: Colorado continued its second quarter dominance this season: it out-scored UCLA 14-7 and out-gained the Bruins 194-100; on the year, CU has now out-scored the opponent 90-58 and out-gained the foe, 1,128-680. Colorado was 8-of-8 in the first converting second-and-4 or less situations into first downs (game: 11-of-13). Colorado also has owned the fourth quarter this year, out-scoring the opponent 62-51 and out-gaining them 980-614 (186-65 vs. UCLA); in CU's four home games, CU has advantages of 34-13 in scoring (only Oregon State scored points) and 550-255 in yards.

CU finished with 500 yards of total offense, the seventh straight game over 400 (the first time since the first seven games of the 1994 season); with three 500+ games this year, that is the most since three in 2002.

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO (2-6, 1-4 BSC)

Team Notes: The Northern Colorado football team (2-6, 1-4 Big Sky) couldn't snap its losing skid against Idaho State (5-3, 3-1 Big Sky) on Saturday. The Bengals' offensive presence was too much to handle as the Bears dropped the contest, 46-12.

WESTERN STATE COLORADO UNIVERSITY (3-5, 2-4 RMAC)

Austin Ekeler (Sophomore, Running Back, 5-8, 191, Eaton, Colo./Eaton HS)

Austin Ekeler ran for a career high 254 yards on Saturday against Western New Mexico University. This is the fifth most rushing yards in a game in Western's history. This season, Ekeler has rushed for over 200 yards in three games. Ekeler scored two or more touchdowns on the ground for the fourth time this season. With 1,306 yards rushing through eight games, Ekeler has the second most yards rushing in a season in Western football history. His 12 rushing touchdowns on the season is tied for fifth all-time at Western. He is sixth all-time at Western in career rushing yards with 2,365, and he holds the fifth, sixth and seventh spots in Western's record book for rushing yards in a game. Ekeler is averaging 163.3 rushing yards and 204.6 all-purpose yards per game in 2014.
