THE GAME: The University of Colorado begins its final Big 12 Conference season by traveling to face No. 7 (AP)/5 (WBCA) Texas A&M University on Saturday, Jan. 8, at 6 p.m. MST at Reed Arena in College Station, Texas.

BROADCAST: Saturday's game can be heard live on KKZN AM 760. Mike Rice will handle play-by-play duties while Carol Callan of USA Basketball provides the color commentary. Live internet audio is available on CUBuffs.com, through the BufsRadio free subscription.

OPENING TIPS: CU head coach **Linda Lappe** will guide the Buffaloes Saturday in her 100th career game as a collegiate head coach. The first-year CU coach is 59-40 overall in her fourth year on the bench. Senior guard/forward **Brittany Spears** needs just 17 points -- or right at her season average -- to catch former CU All-American Shelley Sheetz for fourth place on CU's all-time scoring list. Spears currently is at 1,758 points while Sheetz scored 1,775 from 1991-95.

THE BUFFALOES: Colorado rounded out the nonconference portion of its schedule with a 67-56 win over the University of North Dakota on Jan. 4. The Buffaloes, 9-4 overall, have won their last two and three of five. CU will be looking for its first road win of the season and its first since defeating Missouri on Feb. 23, 2010.

Colorado has played well defensively throughout the nonconference schedule, giving up just 55 points a game while opponents are only shooting 35 percent from the field. The Buffaloes have been even more stringent from the 3-point line, allowing just 24.3 percent from beyond the arc, ranking second in the Big 12 and among the nation's leaders all season (CU's 23.8 percent ranked ninth through games of Jan. 2). Colorado has also been winning the battle of the boards, outrebounding its opponent in 11 of 13 games and by an average of nearly seven boards an outing.

Senior guard/forward **Brittany Spears** leads CU and ranks fifth in the Big 12 in scoring at 17.3 points per game. She is also fourth in defensive rebounds (5.5 drpg), seventh in 3-point field goals made (2.2 3mpg), ninth in overall rebounding (7.8 rpg) 12th in steals (1.8 spg) and 15th in free-throw percentage (.750) on the league charts. She is coming off back-to-back 21-point efforts in the wins over Colgate and North Dakota, giving her 36th career games of 20 or more points. Spears, who is averaging 21.3 points over the last three contests, has registered double digits in 12 of 13 games this season and in 91 of 106 career outings. She is also second on the team in steals (24) and assists (24).

Sophomore guard **Chucky Jeffery** is CU's top rebounder (9.2 rpg) while ranking second on the team in scoring at 15.2 an outing. Jeffery six double-doubles this season, ranking second in the Big 12 behind Oklahoma State's Toni Young who has seven, including the second triple-double in team history by recording 10 points, 13 rebounds and 10 assists against Loyola Chicago. Jeffery tops the Big 12 in steals at 3.2 per game (42) and ranked seventh in the nation through games of Jan. 2 (3.5). Jeffery also ranks third in defensive rebounding (6.5 drpg) and overall boards (9.2 rpg), seventh in minutes (32.2 mpg), eighth in assists (4.8 apg), 12th in offensive rebounds (2.6 orpg) and 15th in scoring on the Big 12 charts.

Junior forward **Julie Seabrook** is averaging 7.2 points and 5.5 rebounds per game while shooting a team-best 54 percent from the field (37-of-68). She has shot 60 percent or better in seven of 13 games, and 50 percent or better in nine of 13 outings. Seabrook has three games of double-digit rebounds including 10 against the Rams.

Sophomore guard/forward **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** is averaging 7.8 points and 5.2 rebounds and leads the Buffaloes with 10 blocked shots. Malcolm-Peck is heating up from the outside, making 10 of her last 21 3-pointers (.476) spanning the last six games. Senior guard **Britney Blythe** is averaging four points over the first 13 games, mostly from long range. Thirteen of her 15 field goals this season have come from 3-point range.

FIRST LINEUP SHAKE-UP NETS GREAT RESULTS: After sporting the same starting lineup for the season's first 12 games, the Buffaloes made a switch against North Dakota by giving freshman guard **Brittany Wilson** her first career start and bringing forward **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** off the bench, and both players responded in outstanding fashion. Wilson, averaging 7.2 points on the season, scored 15 points including a career-best four 3-pointers. Malcolm-Peck responded with her second career double-double, finishing with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

BENCH PRODUCING: With nine active players available, the Buffaloes have been making good use of their bench. Colorado's bench is averaging 20 points and 17 rebounds over the last four games, marking the time senior guard **Chelsea Dale** returned to the lineup to make the Buffaloes' bench four-players strong. Meagan Malcolm-Peck scored 11 in her first game off the bench while Dale and **Brittany Wilson** are combining for 15 points per game. Freshman post **Rachel Hargis** is pulling down 4.5 rebounds a game during that span, bolstered by a career-best seven in the win over Colgate.

Brittany's twin sister **Ashley Wilson** is averaging three points and three rebounds. The quartet has also accounted for 18 assists and 15 steals over the last four contests.

ABOUT THE AGGIES: No. 7 (AP)/5 (WBCA) Texas A&M is 12-1 overall and has won six straight since its lone loss of the season, a 61-58 setback at then No. 5 ranked Duke. The Aggies are averaging 83 points per game while shooting 48 percent from the field. The Aggies have hit the century mark twice this season and have been held below 74 points in just two games. Texas A&M's defense is allowing just 54 points an outing and leads the Big 12 in both steals (12.8 spg) and turnover margin (+11.1 topg).

Senior forward Danielle Adams, the 2010 Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and an honorable mention All-American, is the league's leading scorer so far this season at 22.6 points per game. She also tops the Aggies at 8.2 rebounds per game and his hitting 57 percent from the floor. Junior guard Tyra White averages 13.8 points while hitting 52 percent from the field. Junior forward Adaora Elonu averages 10.2 points and 6.3 rebounds per game.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be the 19th meeting between Colorado and Texas A&M with the Buffaloes holding a 10-8 series lead. Texas A&M has won the last seven meetings, including a 95-61 decision last season in Boulder. The series is tied 4-4 in College Station, with the Aggies winning the last three. CU's last win in College Station was a 55-49 decision on Feb. 8, 2003.

BOULDER - It didn't resemble how she would have scripted it, but **Bianca Smith** submitted a record-setting performance on Saturday.

With a pair of first-half treys, Colorado's sharpshooting senior guard topped Shelley Sheetz (252) as CU's top three-point shooter. Smith, of Missouri City, Texas, finished with four three-pointers, giving her 255 for her career.

But Smith's output was as good as it got for the Buffaloes, who were soundly beaten by No. 12/15 Texas A&M, 95-61.

Smith's two second-half treys enabled her match her own school record of 80 in a season. She finished with a game-high 22 points before going to the bench with 1:15 to play.

"Shelley was a great player . . . I'm humbled to break her record; I never thought I'd have a chance at it when I first got here," Smith said. "Now I can focus on trying to get these next two 'W's.'"

With two regular-season games remaining, CU slipped below .500 (13-14) and 3-11 in the Big 12 Conference, while A&M improved to 20-7, 8-6.

Aside from Smith, the only other Buffs player in double figures was **Alyssa Fressle** with 12. Leading scorer **Brittany Spears** was held to seven points after totaling 60 in her past two outings.

CU started efficiently against A&M, going ahead by five points, then just as quickly falling behind by a dozen. And after rallying to within a respectable 25-20, the Buffs hit the skids again.

By halftime, the Aggies' relentless pressure had forced 15 turnovers and the Buffs were facing a 20-point (45-25) deficit.

CU was mauled in the paint, outscored 40-24, in bench production, 35-11, and outrebounded, 37-22.

Three A&M frontcourt players - starters Damitria Buchanan, Adaora Elonu and reserve Danielle Adams - combined to make 18 of 21 field goal attempts. Their inside accuracy was a big reason A&M shot 63.6 percent (35-of-55).

In the second half, the Aggies - more athletic at most positions and relentless with their pressure defense - kept the Buffs at bay.

But with the lead at 59-33, CU's **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** and **Chelsea Dale** hit back-to-back three-pointers to cut the margin to 18 (59-41) with just over 12 minutes remaining.

That was close enough for the Aggies, who put the hammer down again and forged 30-plus point leads in the game's final 5 1/2 minutes.

Overall Colorado committed 26 turnovers and shot just 38 percent for the game (21-of-55).

against teams ranked in both AP and WBCA Coaches polls (Iowa State was ranked only in the WBCA poll in one meeting last season as was Kansas State in two meetings in 2008-09). CU's last win over a ranked opponent was a 73-68 decision over No. 15/15 Kansas State on Feb. 23, 2008.

CU IN BIG 12 OPENERS: Overall, Colorado is 7-7 in Big 12 openers and 4-10 in its first Big 12 road game of the season. This will be CU's first road overall Big 12 opener since a 70-58 win at Missouri on Jan. 9, 2008. The Buffaloes are 21-15 all-time in conference openers, including the Big Eight and Intermountain Conferences.

JEFFERY 'STEALS' THE SHOW: Sophomore **Chucky Jeffery** had a career and team season-high seven steals in the win over Colgate. It's the 21st time a Buff has registered seven or more steals in a game, but the first since Damietta Velicica had seven vs. Tulane on December 6, 1997. Jeffery, who currently leads the Big 12 at 3.2 steals per game, has had six steals in two other games this season (Regis, Evansville) and has at least three steals in eight of 13 games.

DALE RETURNS: In just four games back from missing the fall semester with academic issues, senior guard **Chelsea Dale** has fit nicely into the CU rotation. She is averaging 6.5 points while grabbing three rebounds over three games. Dale had a career-high with 16 points on 5-of-9 shooting in the win over Colgate. Dale's 26 points in four games back is just three less than the 29 she scored over 23 games in 2009-10. She made her season debut at USC, contributing 10 points and a career-best five rebounds off the bench in the loss to the Trojans.

SPEARS' STREAK: Senior **Brittany Spears** started her 101st consecutive game against Illinois, breaking a tie with Lisa Van Goor (1980-85) for the most consecutive starts to begin a CU playing career. Spears, now at 106 straight starting nods, trails only Amy Mathern (1989-93) for overall consecutive starts. Mathern started the final 112 games of her distinguished career. Overall, Spears' 106 career starts are the ninth most in team history.

DEFENSIVE FEAT A FIRST: Colorado allowed 34 points to Loyola Chicago and 35 points to Texas State, the first time in team history that the Buffaloes have held an opponent below 40 points in consecutive games. The 69 combined points also marks the lowest two-game total in team history, eclipsing the 72 allowed in wins over Texas Southern (64-29) and Dartmouth (57-43), Dec. 14 & 21, 2007.

The 34 points allowed to Loyola Chicago tied for the seventh lowest single-game mark in team history (Southwest Missouri State, March 17, 1995), while the 35 points to Texas State ties for the ninth lowest with three other games (most recently against Kansas on Jan. 16, 2002).

Fast starts have certainly helped, especially at home. Colorado has held six of its 10 home opponents to under 20 first half points.

JEFFERY'S TRIPLE-DOUBLE: **Chucky Jeffery** recorded the second triple-double in team history by totaling 10 points, 13 rebounds and 10 assists in the Omni Hotels Classic Championship game against Loyola Chicago. The only other CU triple-double was by Sandy Bean vs. Utah State on Feb. 16, 1979. Bean had 19 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists.

It marked career highs in both rebounds and assists for Jeffery as well as team season highs in both categories. She's the first CU player with 10 assists in a game since Susie Powers dished out 10 against Pepperdine on Jan. 4, 2008. Jeffery was awarded as the Classic's Most Valuable Player.

Jeffery's triple-double was the 18th in Big 12 Conference history (Baylor's Britteny Griner notched No. 19 the next day, Nov. 28) and she becomes the 11th different Big 12 player to record a triple-double.

SCORING, REBOUND DEFENSE SHINES AGAINST LOYOLA: Chucky Jeffery's triple-double against Loyola Chicago stole the headlines in the Omni Classic Championship game, and deservedly so, but the Buffaloes also notched a couple defensive team milestones of note in that game.

Colorado gave up just 20 rebounds to Loyola, tying for the second fewest in team history. Northern Arizona had just 19 against the Buffaloes on Feb. 7, 1981. On two other occasions the Buffaloes have held an opponent to just 20 rebounds; Dec. 28, 1991 at Washington (a 58-53 loss) and Jan. 21, 1980 vs. Northern Arizona (a 129-47 win). The Buffaloes +22 rebound margin (44-20) was their most since a +23 margin against Arkansas-Pine Bluff (51-28) on Dec. 2, 2008.

On the scoreboard, CU gave up just 34 points to Loyola, tying for the seventh fewest points allowed in team history and the fewest since

NOTABLE FROM THE OPENER: Colorado improved to 32-5 (.865) all-time in overall season openers and 35-2 (.946) in all-time home openers. The Buffs improved to 25-0 when their overall season opener is played at home.

Colorado's win snapped a four-game losing streak dating back to last season. Colorado's 38-point margin of victory was its most in a season opener since a 93-43 win over Albany to open the 2000-01 campaign.

SPEARS CLIMBING CAREER LADDERS: Brittany Spears not only achieved her 26th career double-double against Dayton, with her 22 points and 12 rebounds she became the third player in team history, joining Lisa Van Goor (1980-85) and Jackie McFarland (2004-08) to record 1,700 points and 800 rebounds in a career.

Spears is fifth overall in career scoring with 1,758, 17 behind Shelley Sheetz (1991-95) for fourth place. She also ranks fourth in 3-point field goals attempted (549), fifth in rebounds (821) and field goals made (642), sixth in 3-point field-goals made (184) and blocked shots (124), seventh in minutes (3,502), eighth in steals (200), ninth in games started (106) and 13th in free-throws made (290) on CU's all-time charts.

SPEARS ON NAISMITH WATCH LIST: Brittany Spears has been named to the 2010-11 Naismith Trophy preseason watch list, announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club.

The watch list of the nation's top 50 women's players was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded on April 4, 2011 at the NCAA Women's Final Four in Indianapolis.

The active leading career scorer in the Big 12 Conference (1,758 points), Spears topped the Buffaloes in scoring (17.7 ppg), rebounding (7.8 rpg) and steals (2.1 spg) as a junior, earning honorable mention to the 2010 All-Big 12 team. On the 2010 league charts she ranked third in steals, fourth in scoring, fifth in rebounding, defensive rebounds (5.5 drpg) and free-throw percentage (.837), eighth in 3-point field-goal percentage (.357), 10th in 3-point field-goals made (1.8 3mpg), 12th in blocked shots (1.0 bpg) and 14th in offensive

rebounds (2.3 orgp).

Her preseason recognition by the Naismith Trophy is CU's first since Jackie McFarland was a Naismith Trophy semifinalist in 2008.

PAC-KING UP: The 2010-11 season will be Colorado's final one in the Big 12 Conference as the school will officially join the Pacific-10 Conference on July 1, 2011. Utah will also join at that time as league will then become the Pac-12 Conference.

The Pac-12 basketball schedule will comprise of 18 conference games for each institution. Every season's schedule will feature both a home and road game against each institution's traditional rival. Colorado's new rival in its new conference will be Utah. In addition to these games, each institution will play six other opponents both home and away (for two consecutive years), and four opponents on a single-game basis - two at home and two on the road. The single-play opponents will rotate every two years.

The women's schedule mirrors the men's schedule. For example, when Colorado's men's basketball team plays at USC the women's team will host the Trojans.

BUFFS PICKED 12TH, SPEARS MENTIONED: Colorado was picked to finish 12th in the annual Big 12 Conference Preseason Coaches Poll while Brittany Spears recieved honorable mention to the Preseason All-Big 12 team.

2010 NCAA Women's Final Four participant Baylor was chosen as the preseason favorite for the second consecutive year earning 121 points and 11 of 12 first place votes. Texas A&M was second at 109 and received the other first place vote. Oklahoma was third (97) followed by Texas (88), Iowa State (85), Kansas (64), Nebraska (58), Oklahoma State (50), Kansas State (40), Texas Tech (39), Missouri (26) and Colorado (15).

Spears was an honorable mention All-Big 12 selection in 2008 and 2010 and a second team pick in 2009.

BUFFS SIGN THREE: Lexy Kresl, Jen Reese and Jasmine Sborov have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2011-12, CU head coach Linda Lappe announced on Nov. 12, during the NCAA early signing period.

Kresl is a 5-11 guard from Paradise Valley, Ariz. She led the state of Arizona in scoring as a junior (27.6 ppg) and guided Shadow Mountain High School to the 2010 Arizona 4A state title. Reese is a 6-2 forward from Clackamas (Ore.) High School and the reigning

Sborov is a 6-1 guard from Round Rock (Texas) High School who led the Dragons to a 15-9 mark in 2010 and the playoffs for a third straight season.

BRENNA MALCOLM-PECK RECOVERING: Sophomore forward Brenna Malcolm-Peck suffered a hyper-extended left knee during preseason workouts and has not yet been cleared to practice.

SHAE KELLEY LEAVES TEAM: Freshman forward Shae Kelley has left the women's basketball team citing personal reasons, head coach Linda Lappe announced on Nov. 12. Kelley will remain enrolled at CU through the fall semester. A 2010 graduate of Denver East High School, Kelley led the Angels to their first state title last March. She scored 22 points in CU's 93-62 exhibition win over Western State on Nov. 5 in her only appearance.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Colorado will potentially play 16 games - or 55 percent of the schedule - against teams that advanced to either the 2010 NCAA or WNIT postseason tournaments. Six of CU's 2010-11 opponents are ranked in the latest USA Today/ESPN/WBCA Coaches poll (#1 Baylor, #5 Texas A&M, # 16 Iowa State, #17 Oklahoma, #24 Texas and #25 Oklahoma State) and three others are receiving votes (Kansas, Texas Tech, and Nebraska). Five are ranked in the latest Associated Press poll (#1 Baylor, #7 Texas A&M, #17 Iowa State, #19 Oklahoma and #22 Texas) while four others are receiving votes (USC, Oklahoma State, Kansas and Texas Tech).

#22 Brittany Spears, 6-1, Sr., F, Pasadena, Calif. (Pasadena/Notre Dame Prep)

This Season:

- The third player in team history to reach 1,700 points and 800 rebounds joining Lisa Van Goor (1980-85) and Jackie McFarland (2004-08)

- Has started all 106 games of her career, a school record. The previous best was by Van Goor who started her first 100 games. Trails only Amy Mathern (112 from 1989-1993) for overall consecutive starts.

- Earned honorable mention to the 2010 All-Big 12 Conference team as she ranked third in steals (2.1 spg), fourth in scoring, fifth in rebounding, defensive rebounds (5.5 drpg) and free-throw percentage (.837), eighth in 3-point field-goal percentage (.357), 10th in 3-point field-goals made (1.8 3mpg), 12th in blocked shots (1.0 bpg) and 14th in offensive rebounds (2.3 orgp).

BOULDER - They needed maybe 5 extra minutes to get untracked, but once they did the Colorado Buffaloes produced a tantalizing tip-off to the **Linda Lappe** Era in women's basketball.

CU overran Regis 76-38 Friday night at the Coors Events Center, giving Lappe a victorious debut on the same court where she starred for CU Hall of Fame inductee Ceal Barry before finishing her collegiate eligibility in 2003.

"It's always great to get the first one," Lappe said. "We had some early-game jitters, but that's normal. We picked it up midway through the first half . . . and it started with our defense."

The Buffs' post and transition defense improved as the night went on, and once they settled down, their offense wasn't too shoddy either.

Four Buffs players reached double figures, led by senior **Brittany Spears** with 20 points. Senior guard **Britney Blythe** scored a career-high 15 points, including a career-best five three-pointers. Sophomore **Chucky Jeffery** contributed a double-double - 13 points and 12 rebounds. She also had a game-high six assists and six steals, while sophomore **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** added 10 points.

Jeffery called her diverse role in the opening-night "real fun . . . it's not too much about scoring for me. I'm big on the assist game now . . . it's good to know I can pass to my teammates and they'll knock down the shot."

Spears said the win "felt good. It always feels good with a win . . . we know we're playing for each other."

That thought will have to stay in their minds as the season unfolds. Lappe's team opened the season with a sparsely populated bench. She knew academics would sideline senior guard/forward **Chelsea Dale** for the fall semester and that sophomore guard/forward **Brenna Malcolm-Peck's** hyper-extended left knee would keep her out of the lineup indefinitely.

But on Friday, top recruit **Shae Kelley**, an athletic forward from Denver East, informed Lappe she was leaving the program for personal reasons. In the Buffs' 93-62 exhibition tour of Western State a week prior to the opener, Kelley came off the bench to score 22 points on 11-of-14 shooting from the field.

That turned out to be her lone appearance in a CU uniform in the Events Center. As a result, CU suited up eight players to face Regis in Lappe's debut.

"It leaves us in a tough situation," she said. "But our players are great . . . with eight players, everybody has got to contribute. We just have to be in great shape . . . these guys played a lot of minutes. But we work hard all off-season for that. It leads to some great team chemistry; we'll use it as positive."

Lappe said she "wishes Shae the best of luck, but we're focused on our team and getting better every day."

CU opened slowly and frigidly, hitting just one of its first six field goal attempts in the first 4:15 and falling behind 8-2. But after they caught the Rangers at 8-8, the Buffs began to take off.

They went ahead 17-10, then allowed Regis to climb back as close as 17-16 before Blythe & Co. put the hammer down by hitting three consecutive three-pointers. Malcolm-Peck opened the onslaught with a three with 5:55 remaining before halftime, and Blythe followed with back-to-back treys.

For Blythe, a 5-9 senior from Mateo, Calif., her three-pointer with 5:20 left in the half were her first official points since Feb. 14, 2009 at Texas A&M. (She scored nine in CU's exhibition win against Western State.)

Blythe said she "felt good, but I'm not thinking about shooting - unless things are open."

After their 8-8 tie, the Buffs outscored the Rangers 34-9, including a 25-1 run in the first half's final 5:55. The score at intermission: CU 42, Regis 17.

And the Buffs weren't done. They scored the first 13 points of the second half, taking a 55-17 lead with 15:30 to play. The Rangers got their first points of the second half on a three-point play Salina Kuiper with 15:10 remaining, but by then it was 55-20 and CU was looking at a name-your-number opening night.

The Buffs eventually led by 43 points before the final buzzer.

DENVER - University of Denver's Britney Rice scored nine of her team-high 19 points from the free-throw line, including six in the closing seconds as the Pioneers edged the University of Colorado 70-69 Tuesday night at Magness Arena.

Brittany Spears led Colorado (1-1) with 24 points and 10 rebounds, her 23rd career double-double. **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** had 14 points, five rebounds and three blocks.

DU (1-1) and Colorado went back-and-forth, 10 ties, 15 lead changes and just six points - two possessions - was the largest margin for either team. But a few costly CU mistakes down the stretch and Denver's ability to capitalize was the difference.

Colorado made six of its first eight shots from the field and Spears' third 3-pointer in the first nine minutes gave Colorado a 17-12 lead.

But turnovers hurt the Buffaloes. Denver pressed, giving CU's back court some problems which turned into easy buckets. The Pioneers scored 14 points of 14 first half CU turnovers and led 32-29 at the break.

The Buffaloes continued to keep the Pioneers within reach early in the second half and momentum began to swing when CU amped up the defensive effort and began to return the favor.

"We pressured them," CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "We became the aggressors on defense, which is how we need to play the entire game, but it really spurred our run and we were able to get some easy baskets."

After DU held its largest lead of the game at 52-46, CU's defense sparked a 9-0 run. Spears scored first on a put back and after a stop Malcolm-Peck drilled a 3-pointer to pull CU to within one at 52-51. Spears then recorded steals on back-to-back possessions, the first resulting in a coast-to-coast layup and the second ending in a Malcolm-Peck bucket as CU led 55-52 with 5:31 left.

But shortly after, momentum took a swift shift back to Denver. The Buffaloes played 29 seconds of solid defense on the other end and had DU needing to get a shot on rim off an inbounds play with just one second left on the shot clock. DU found its leading scorer Kaetlyn Murdoch, but she missed a shot from the elbow. Pioneer Brianna Culberson won a struggle for the rebound with Malcolm-Peck.

The CU sophomore was called for a foul, but the setback was compounded by a technical foul call on Spears who batted the ball away in frustration.

Rice made one of two shots, and on the ensuing possession, Murdoch was fouled and made the subsequent free throws to tie the game up at 55 with 4:56 remaining.

The Buffaloes fought to claim a 62-61 with just 2:13 remaining and had the ball but couldn't extend their lead despite having three chances on the same possession. Spears missed two short range jumpers and Malcolm-Peck couldn't quite stick the put back as Rice finally corralled the rebound and was fouled.

She made both foul shots to give DU a 63-62 lead with 1:09 left. Colorado once again had three chances at regaining the lead, but couldn't connect. Rice, once again corralled the rebound, this time off a Malcolm-Peck 3-point attempt, was fouled and sank another pair of free throws with 39 seconds on the clock to put the Pioneers up 65-62.

The Buffaloes were unable to get a quality shot off on the other end. Murdoch, who survived early foul trouble to score 17 points, followed Rice's lead with a pair of free throws to give DU a two-possession lead at 67-62.

"We fought hard," Lappe said. "We could have folded a few times in this game, down five a couple different times, and really fought back. I thought we had a lot of momentum down the stretch, then a couple possessions where things didn't quite go our way and we weren't quite able to bounce back from that."

CU freshman **Brittany Wilson** made a pair of driving layups to extend the game, but it was not enough. Denver was clutch at the line making 22-of-25 free throws, including 9-of-10 in the final 1:09.

Chucky Jeffery had 10 points and four rebounds. Wilson had nine points and three rebounds.

Colorado returns home to host Santa Clara on Friday, Nov. 19, at 7 p.m. at the Coors Events Center.

BOULDER - Linda Lappe never will complain about a win, but squandering large leads is another matter.

The (Mid) Complaint Dept. is open.
 Her first Colorado women's basketball team subdued the University of Tennessee-Martin 78-67 Sunday afternoon in the Coors Events Center, but as her debut season unfolds Lappe is looking for those cushy leads to stop disappearing.

"We haven't showed we can (hold onto a big lead) yet, but that's typical for this time of year," she said. "We haven't played a full 40 minutes yet, but I like our starts, though. . . I don't want to change how we're starting and how we're finishing. We just have to continue to work to put together a full game."

Following almost the exact script they did in Friday night's 71-57 win against Santa Clara, the Buffs forged a comfortable early advantage (15 points), apparently relaxed a bit and let Sunday's opponent close to within eight points at intermission.

Against Big 12 Conference competition, that kind of momentum swing might lead to an uncomfortable second half. Against UTM, of the Ohio Valley Conference, it wasn't devastating.

The Buffs outscored the Skyhawks 11-5 in the opening minutes of the second half, regained control and improved to 2-1 with their Omni Hotels Classic set for this weekend.

"We just need to stay consistent on defense . . . and not let (teams) go on big runs," CU senior Brittany Spears said.

Added sophomore Chucky Jeffery: "Our offense generates from our defense. We were playing defense hard, but when we get a lead, we seem to slack off a little. When we work on that, we'll be a good defensive team."

A streak of seven consecutive points by Jeffery, who scored a career-best 25 points, helped CU open a 12-point advantage (58-46) midway through the second half.

UTM, which plays at Air Force on Tuesday, pulled within 62-54 with just over 6 minutes remaining, but four consecutive free throws by junior Julie Seabrook restored CU's double-digit lead (66-54).

The Buffs stayed in front by at least 10 points until Heather Butler hit a pair of free throws with 2:29 to play, pulling the Seahawks to 71-63. But a follow by Jeffery, two free throws by Spears, another by freshman Brittany Wilson and a layup by Jeffery helped keep the visitors at bay in the final 1:50.

"We did a good job picking up the win," Lappe said. "We hit our free throws down the stretch; we're getting to the line more . . . offensively, we're clicking at times (but) defensively, we've got a lot of things to work on."

Put on-court communication and focus at the top of Lappe's list. "When we're on it mentally, we can be a really good defensive team," she said.

Spears finished with 20 points and surpassed the 1,600-point plateau (1,611) for her career - a surprise to her: "I didn't even know . . . I guess it's a great accomplishment."

She and Jeffery were the only two Buffs players in double figures. Spears also collected 12 rebounds, giving her 24 double-doubles in her CU career.

CU's 39-31 halftime lead resulted from 46.9 percent shooting from the field (15-of-32) and a string of four consecutive three-pointers by Spears (two), Britney Blythe and Jeffery.

At the time, the Skyhawks were leading 4-2, but the Buffs' treys on four consecutive possessions established a first-half advantage they never lost - although they didn't translate it to Lappe's liking.

After trailing by 15 twice, UTM went on a three-point spurt of its own, getting three straight from Megan White, Alecia Weatherly and Jaclissa Haislip to cut CU's lead to 31-25 with 3:15 left in the half. But that was close as the visitors would draw.

The Buffs were outscored 19-14 in the first half, but finished the game with a 38-34 advantage on the boards. Lappe said being focused in that area was vital for the Buffs. UTM entered the game with a 46-35 rebounding edge in its three previous games.

"That was one of our keys to the game," she said. "We were more aggressive going to the boards in the second half."
 CU outscored UTM 28-24 in the paint and got 18 points off of 19 UTM turnovers. The Buffs committed 17 turnovers but yielded only 10 points off of those.

BOULDER-Colorado needed its defense to step up when nothing else seemed to be going right.

Evansville erased a 19-point first-half CU advantage, had a lead of its own late in the second half, and had the ball in its possession for a potential game-winning shot. But the duo of Brittany Spears and Chucky Jeffery wasn't about to let that happen.

Spears had a double-double and Jeffery had 17 points and six steals, including the game-clinching swipe with five seconds remaining to seal a 55-53 Colorado win over Evansville in the first round of the 2010 Omni Hotels Classic.

Colorado (4-1) moves on to play Loyola Chicago (3-1), 74-67 winners over Eastern Washington in the early game, in Saturday's championship set for 7:30 p.m. Evansville (2-2) will face EWU in the consolation game at 5 p.m.

Colorado looked to put this one away early, jetting out to an early 16-2 lead. Spears had 12 of her game-high 19 points in the first half as the Buffaloes shot 52 percent.

Freshman Rachel Hargis put in back-to-back buckets as Colorado held its largest lead at 26-7 with 7:10 left in the first period.

The Purple Aces were able to cut the CU lead to 33-19 at halftime and had an even bigger run prepared for the second half.

Colorado missed its first eight shots of the second half as Evansville responded with a 17-4 run to trim CU's lead to 37-36 with 7:48 remaining. The Buffaloes, who shot only 26 percent in the second half, also had trouble holding onto the ball, committing 27 turnovers.

Colorado pushed its lead back up to 44-38 after a Jeffery 3-point play, but the Purple Aces scored the next nine points. Evansville took its first lead on a Samantha Heck jumper and Megan Collins put the Purple Aces up 47-44 with 5:15 left.

Defense dominated the Buffaloes final push. After a Jeffery basket cut the deficit to one, Spears and Jeffery turned Evansville over on three straight possessions, resulting in an 8-0 CU run. Jeffery had a coast-to-coast steal and layup, a Spears steal led to a pair of Jeffery free throws and another Jeffery steal led to a Spears transition layup as the Buffs led 54-49 with 1:56 left.

Buckets by Heck and Collins allowed Evansville to creep back to within 54-53 with 39 seconds left. Spears took a jumper on the baseline with 26 ticks left. She missed but Meagan Malcolm-Peck corralled the offensive rebound. The Buffaloes were able to move the ball around before Spears was fouled with 11 seconds left.

Spears made the first foul shot, but missed the second giving the Purple Aces one final opportunity. But it never materialized, Jeffery picked the pocket of Staci Gillum in the backcourt with :05 left and ran out the clock for the Buffaloes third straight win.

Spears finished with 10 rebounds, collecting her 25th career double-double in five games this season. She also moved past Erin Scholz (1993-97) into fifth place on CU's all-time scoring list (1,630). Jeffery added eight rebounds and six assists to her numbers.

Heck led Evansville with 16 points and seven rebounds. Collins finished with 13 points off the bench for the Purple Aces.

BOULDER - Five nights after submitting what Coach **Linda Lappe** called "our most complete game of the season," her Colorado women's basketball team found a suitable way to encore.

CU limited Texas State to 16.7 percent shooting from the field in the first half, 24 percent for the game, and cruised past the Southland Conference visitors, 67-35, Wednesday night at the Coors Events Center.

Lappe's calls for the Buffaloes to ratchet up their defense for 40 minutes haven't been ignored; they've allowed 34 and 35 points in their two most recent games. It was the first time in school history CU has kept an opponent under 40 points in consecutive games.

"It all started with our defense; we came out and did some really nice things. Our defense in the last two games has been good in spurts . . . but it was a little better (overall) on Saturday," said Lappe, whose team won its sixth consecutive home game (6-1 overall).

In Saturday night's championship game of the Omni Hotels Classic, CU played hard and smart from buzzer to buzzer and routed Loyola-Chicago, 65-34.

And by Wednesday, there had been no noticeable drop-off in the Buffs' intensity, or in sophomore point guard **Chucky Jeffery's** overall game. Fresh off the second triple-double in school history (10 points, 13 rebounds, 10 assists), Jeffery paced the Buffs Wednesday night with 23 points and 13 rebounds, her fourth double-double of the season and fifth of her career.

"As long as we get a win, I'm happy for everybody on team . . . everybody is contributing and I'm just going with the flow," Jeffery said.

Senior **Brittany Spears** (12) and freshman **Ashley Wilson** (10) were the only other CU players in double figures, but each of Lappe's players scored. Wilson, whose points were a career-high, also had five rebounds and two assists as she works her way back from a serious knee/leg injury suffered in her senior year of high school in Long Beach, Calif.

Wilson took a hard fall on a layup in the final minutes and drew an intentional foul. She tweaked her ankle, not her knee, in the collision, but said she felt fine afterwards.

"It's taken a long time to come back from the (high school) injury, but I'm making progress," she said. "I like playing with these guys."

The Bobcats (2-3) hadn't won a true road game since Dec. 10, 2006 at UT-Pan American, and the Buffs weren't interested in seeing that streak end in Boulder.

CU's defense was suffocating in the first 10 minutes, allowing Texas State only eight field goal attempts and four points (one field goal, two free throws). The visitors didn't score on consecutive possessions until the 8:30 mark of the first half - and by then the Buffs were up 20-8 and still hungry.

Jeffery said Lappe "never wants us to let up on defense. It sparks everything else, and we put a lot of emphasis on that. In the first half, our defense was good. But in the second half, we laid off a little. Overall, though, I think (the intensity) carried over, definitely."

The Bobcats regularly use a 15-player rotation, but coach Suzanne Fox kept it to 12 in the first half. Lappe, meanwhile, used all available personnel - The Crazy Eight? - and saw her team lead by as many as 23 (32-9) before intermission.

Jeffery's short jumper gave her 14 first-half points and CU its 34-12 halftime lead. After snatching nine rebounds in the opening half, Jeffery got No. 10 with just under 17 minutes remaining, then hit a layup and a converted a three-point play on consecutive possessions to give the Buffs a 41-14 lead - their largest of the night to that point - with 16:18 left.

CU led 45-22 at the second half's half-way point and was never threatened in the final 10 minutes. The Buffs outscored the Bobcats 42-18 in the paint, 10-0 on fast breaks, 13-4 on second-chance points and 20-12 in points off turnovers.

BOULDER - **Linda Lappe** wanted to see how her Colorado women's basketball team measured up against an opponent from another power conference in Saturday night's Big Ten/Big 12 Challenge.

In the effort and tenacity categories, Lappe liked what she saw - but on the scoreboard, not so much.

Her Buffaloes gamely rallied from an 11-point second-half deficit to take a two-point lead, but the Illini outscored them 8-2 in the final 3:11 and left the Coors Events Center with a 63-59 victory.

Lappe's returning players contended that coming back from a double-digit deficit last season might not have happened.

Although the Illini brought a losing record (3-5) to Boulder, they dealt the Buffs their first home loss of the season. CU (6-2) had three players in double figures, led by **Chucky Jeffery's** 17. Senior **Brittany Spears** and junior **Julie Seabrook** added 15.

The Buffs' already depleted roster shrunk to seven when freshman guard **Ashley Wilson** suffered a concussion late in Wednesday night's game against Texas State.

To add depth, Lappe looked to CU's volleyball team and found Nikki Lindow, a 6-foot-2 freshman from Centaurus High School. Lindow averaged 17.5 points a game for Centaurus, and when Lappe coached at Metro State, she thought enough of Lindow's ability to recruit her for hoops.

Lindow practiced once with the Buffs this week but did not leave the bench Saturday night. Lappe hopes Wilson can return for the next game, but she must be "symptom free" on Sunday.

After falling behind 6-1 in the first 3 minutes Saturday night, the Buffs rallied and took their largest lead (15-8) on a 7-0 run with baskets by Seabrook, a three-pointer by **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** and a pair of free throws by Jeffery.

CU held the lead until Lana Rukavina's layup tied the score at 21-21 with 5:50 left in the half. Thereafter, there were three lead changes, with the Buffs going up by as many as four points (28-24) until Lydia McCully's trey from the right corner cut the Illini's deficit to one.

McCully followed that with another three-pointer and Adrienne GodBold's follow at the buzzer pushed Illinois in front, 32-28.

The Illini's size and aggressiveness gave the Buffs problems early, with the visitors outscoring CU 20-8 in the paint in the first half and 32-24 for the game. The Buffs' lack of depth also took a toll; Illinois' bench outscored CU's 18-5. The Buffs were out rebounded 19-12 in the first half, but came back to hold a 34-33 board advantage at game's end.

McCully opened the second-half scoring with a layup, giving the Illini a six-point lead. They increased went ahead by seven (38-31) on a steal and layup by GodBold before Malcolm-Peck's trey pulled the Buffs to 38-34.

But Rukavina answered with a three-pointer and restored the seven-point Illini advantage. Less than 3 minutes later, it went to 10 (46-36) on a three-point play by Eboni Mitchell, then 11 (55-46).

The Buffs didn't go belly up. An 11-0 run tied the score at 55-55 with 4 minutes remaining, with Spears' basket completing a fast break and knotting the score.

Half a minute later, Seabrook's two free throws gave CU its first lead (57-55) since late in the first half (28-27). Rukavina matched Seabrook's free shots to tie the score, then Penn hit one of two with 1:48 remaining to put the Illini up 58-57, then banked in a running hook for a 60-57 advantage with 50 seconds left.

When Penn hit another pair from the foul line with 16.4 seconds left, Illinois went ahead 62-57. But Seabrook answered with two free throws with 6.8 seconds down, pulling the Buffs to 62-59. A free throw by McCully on the next possession gave Illinois its four-point win.

Penn, a 6-2 sophomore, finished with 17 points and a game-high eight rebounds.

LOS ANGELES-Colorado shot a season-low 32 percent and a late 20-20 Southern California run allowed the Trojans to pull away with a 68-54 decision in the opening game of the Women of Troy Tournament Saturday afternoon at the Galen Center.

USC provided a formidable front court, with 6-foot, 5-inch Kari LaPlante, 6-2 Cassie Harberts and 6-1 Christina Marinacci, that didn't allow the Buffaloes to establish their inside game early. Most of CU's shots came from the outside, and while they fell in the first half, the tank ran dry for a key nine-minute stretch in the second.

The Trojans also held the Buffaloes' leading scorer **Brittany Spears** to a season-low five points. Spears, who entered the game averaging nearly 18 points a contest, scored CU's first four points, but she also picked up two fouls in the first three minutes which sent her to the bench for most of the first half. She was never able to get in rhythm after that, making just 2-of-12 attempts and was held to single digits for the first time this season.

"USC is big and it was tough for us to get into the paint on them," CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "I thought we played great for about 32 minutes of this game." CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "And then we couldn't score...just didn't do the things we needed to do, and that was being done up to that point. It's too bad because we did play a solid 32 minutes, but against good teams you have to play 40."

Despite an off night by Spears, Colorado and USC played a tight first 20 minutes.

USC jumped out to a fast start hitting on four of its first six from the field and led 14-6. Long Beach, Calif., native and CU freshman **Brittany Wilson** scored five consecutive points, including her fourth career 3-pointer to cut the USC lead to 14-11.

Colorado shot 43 percent in the first half and received a spark from senior **Chelsea Dale** who was playing in her first game after missing the first nine with academic issues. Dale hit her first two 3-point attempts, and the Buffaloes made 5-of-10 from downtown in the first half.

USC countered, but from the free-throw line. The Trojans made 11-of-13 attempts in the first half, compared to just 3-of-3 for CU.

Colorado led 34-33 with 2:00 remaining in the opening period after a Dale 3-pointer and a **Chucky Jeffery** layup. But the Trojans responded with two consecutive scores to lead 37-34 at the half.

Neither team was shooting the lights out in the opening minutes of the second half. The teams combined to miss 15 of 17 shots, allowing the game to remain tight. **Meagan Malcolm-Peck's** second 3-pointer of the game closed the gap to 46-44 with 12:34 left in the game.

From there the Trojans started hitting shots, while CU remained cold. USC pulled away with a 20-2 run over the next 9:16. Jacki Gemelos and Ashley Corral hit back-to-back 3-pointers as USC increased its lead to 20 at 66-46 before the Buffaloes cut into the margin in the final minutes.

Colorado made just 7-of-34 in the second 20 minutes (20.6 percent), finishing with a season-low 54 points.

One aspect of CU's game that continued a season-long positive trend was its rebounding. The Buffaloes have outrebounded all 10 opponents this season and held a 44-34 edge over the Trojans. On this night, however the Buffaloes weren't able to use that to their advantage.

"I thought we crashed the offensive glass really well, and we needed too because we were missing a lot of shots," Lappe said. "The problem with our offensive rebounds tonight is we didn't finish very many of them. The rebounding is all heart, all hustle and I thought we did a good job there."

Jeffery led Colorado with 12 points and eight rebounds. Wilson scored 11 points off the bench while Dale finished with 10. Corral and Briana Gilbreath led the Trojans with 14 points each.

LOS ANGELES-Colorado senior **Brittany Spears** had 22 points and 12 rebounds but cold shooting once again doomed the Buffaloes as the Dayton Flyers captured the Women of Troy Tournament consolation game 70-50 Sunday afternoon at the Galen Center.

The Buffaloes (7-4) shot just 26 percent (18-of-70) and scored a season-low 50 points, falling in consecutive games for the first time this year.

Spears, who notched her fourth double-double of the season, was CU's only player in double digits. She wasn't immune from CU's shooting struggles, hitting only 6-of-23 attempts, and 4-of-14 from 3-point range.

Spears did become the third player in team history to reach 1,700 points and 800 career rebounds, currently standing at 1,716 and 804 respectively.

"We didn't come out ready to go and Dayton took it to us," CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "We have to learn from it. We pretty much started and played for 40 minutes how we ended yesterday. We have to be mentally strong enough to bounce back."

Colorado missed its first six shots, including three from 3-point range. Add in three turnovers and Dayton had an 8-0 early lead. **Chucky Jeffery** got CU on the board with a running jumper at the 15 minute, 26 second mark of the first half.

Dayton extended its lead to 17-2 before the Buffaloes scored again. CU had eight early turnovers and made just 1-of-9 before a **Julie Seabrook** layup at 11:47.

Spears began to find her shot with a 3-pointer with 9:32 left in the half. She added a pair of free throws after getting fouled on an offensive rebound, cutting the Dayton lead to 19-9. Patrice Lalor then scored six straight points for Dayton to push the Flyer lead back up to 25-9.

The Buffaloes shot just 16 percent in the first half as Dayton led 29-16 at the break.

"I thought we had some great shots on the outside and they didn't fall early and we let that affect us for the rest of the game," Lappe said. "As good as our focus was last Wednesday (against Colorado State) I thought it was equally as bad, this whole weekend and particularly tonight."

Colorado was able to close the gap to single digits by scoring the first five points of the second half. Jeffery scored on a layup in transition and Britney Blythe hit a 3-pointer as the Dayton lead was down to 29-21 with 18:40 left.

Dayton then went on a 9-0 run and kept its lead above double-digits the rest of the way. The Flyers were the first team to outrebound CU this year and did it in dominating fashion, 59-45.

"Dayton was ready," Lappe said. "They outlasted us in every facet of the game, rebounds, turnovers, ripping balls out of our hands. Over the break we've got to get a lot better."

BOULDER - Ready or not, Big 12 Conference play begins this weekend for the Colorado women's basketball team. And in a 67-56 win Tuesday night against North Dakota, CU flirted with both ends of a scary spectrum - ready at times, appearing not even close at others.

No matter; the preview is over.

The Buffaloes play Saturday at Texas A&M, taking a 9-4 non-conference record into their final Big 12 season.

"Bottom line, a win's a win," she said. "We're happy to start off 2011 in the right way . . . but we obviously didn't play very well; we didn't play nearly as well as we're going to have to from here on out to compete in the Big 12."

Replacing sophomore Meagan Malcolm-Peck in the lineup, freshman Brittany Wilson contributed 15 points, including a career-best four three-pointers. One was a 30-footer to close the first half. She also made a career-high four steals.

Wilson's practice effort over the past "three or four weeks" earned her the start, Lappe said. But Lappe also was pleased with Malcolm-Peck coming off the bench to record her second career double-double (11 points, 10 rebounds). She scored all of her points and collected seven of her boards in the second half.

CU finally put away North Dakota with a 15-0 run midway through the second half. Senior Brittany Spears and Malcolm-Peck accounted for 13 of those 15 points, with Spears hitting a pair of three-pointers and Malcolm-Peck knocking down one trey and adding another pair of baskets.

Spears (21) and Malcolm-Peck (11) were two of four Buffs in double-figures. The others were Brittany Wilson (15) and sophomore Chucky Jeffery (11). Spears reached 20 points for the seventh time this season and 36th time in her career.

The Buffs led 41-26 at the half, but it took a 30-foot buzzer-beater by Brittany Wilson to account for that 15-point margin. Otherwise, CU's first-half finish wasn't of the variety that would leave Lappe particularly happy.

Her team had its first-half highlights:

It never trailed and went ahead by as many 18 on another Brittany Wilson trey at the 8:10 mark.

It held the Fighting Sioux to six points for almost 7 minutes and allowed baskets on back-to-back possessions only once for almost 9 minutes.

It limited the visitors to 35.7 percent shooting from the field in the first 20 minutes and forced a dozen turnovers. But there was also a bundle of Buffs blunders - not what Lappe wanted in the way of a final Big 12 tune-up:

They committed one more first-half turnover (13) than the Fighting Sioux and finished with 27 - one more than North Dakota.

They allowed their 18-point lead to dwindle to a dozen on the next-to-last possession of the half and were threatening to cut it to 10, maybe 9, before a turnover and Brittany Wilson's long trey.

They had six steals - but the Fighting Sioux had eight. CU finished with 11, North Dakota 18.

Can you say better ball security for the Buffs? Lappe could, and she also could say pass the ball with more authority: "Our passes are very, very soft. We don't have any zip . . . we telegraph, we get tunnel vision . . . Sometimes we get tentative; we just have to be confident in our passing."

The second half opened with a CU turnover and a three-pointer by Mallory Youngblut, cutting the Buffs' advantage to 12 (41-29). Youngblut, a senior co-captain who finished with 19, then scored her team's next five points as North Dakota closed to within 44-34.

Shortly thereafter, CU launched its 15-0 run and North Dakota temporarily was on the ropes. But fight remained in the Fighting Sioux; they pulled to 67-56 on another trey by Youngblut in the final 1:10 - cutting what had been a 25-point deficit to 11.
