OPENING TIP: Colorado has clinched back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2003-04.

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 16-12 overall and is tied with Washington State for 10th in the Pac-12 at 5-12. The Buffaloes have lost five straight and eight of their last nine. CU is just 4-12 since beginning the season at 12-0. The Buffaloes will be either the No. 10 or 11 seed at the 2012 Pacific Life Pac-12 Tournament which begins Wednesday, March 7, at the Galen Center in Los Angeles. Colorado owns the tiebreaker with Washington State for seeding purposes, by virtue of its 57-56 win over the Cougars on Jan. 7.

Colorado has shown balance with five players averaging between seven and 15 points per game. Overall the Buffaloes are averaging 61 points per game and shooting 40 percent from the field. The Buffaloes rank third in the Pac-12 in rebounding defense (35.0) and rebounding margin (+4.8) and fifth in field-goal percentage and scoring defense (59.1 ppg).

Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** leads the Buffaloes at 15.3 points, 7.3 rebounds and 3.8 assists per game. She is prominent on the Pac-12 leader board, ranking third in steals (2.5 spg), fourth in assists, sixth in 3-point percentage (.367), seventh in scoring and defensive rebounds (5.6 drpg), eighth in free-throw percentage (.727), 11th in overall rebounding and assist-to-turnover ratio (0.8) and 13th in blocked shots (0.9 bpg) and field-goal percentage (.448).

Jeffery has scored in double-figures in 24 of Colorado's 28 games and has reached the 20-point mark on six occasions. She has led or shared the team lead in scoring in 19 contests this season. Jeffery became the 24th player in team history to reach 1,000 points during her 18-point performance at Oregon. She has a team-best six double-doubles on the season, tied for 10th in the Pac-12. She was the MVP of CU's Omni Hotels Classic and was named Pac-12 Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 4.

Senior forward **Julie Seabrook** leads Colorado in field goal accuracy at 51.6 percent while also ranking 15th in the Pac-12 in offensive rebounds (2.2 orgp). She scored 16 points in the loss to Oregon, matching a career-high with six free throws made. Seabrook has shot 50 percent or better in 18 of 28 games, 10 of 17 in Pac-12 play. She has made 88 percent from the line (22-of-25) during conference play, tops among the Buffaloes.

Sophomore guard **Brittany Wilson** is second on the team in assists (55), steals (34) and 3-point field goals (32) and third in scoring at 8.4 points per contest. During Pac-12 play, she is Colorado's second leading scorer, slightly below her overall season average at 7.9 points per game. On the Pac-12 charts Wilson ranks 15th in 3-pointers made (1.1 3mpg).

Brittany's twin sister **Ashley Wilson** is hitting 47 percent from the floor while averaging 3.3 points and 2.8 rebounds per game. She played a career-most 26 minutes in each of the last three games. She tied a league-personal best with nine points against second-ranked Stanford and tied an overall career high with seven rebounds at California.

Freshman guard **Lexy Kresl** averages 9.1 points per game and leads the Buffaloes in both 3-point field goals (49) and free-throw accuracy at 88.2 percent. Kresl scored a career-high 17 points in the loss at Oregon, matching a personal best and her own team season-high with five 3-point field goals. Her 49 3-pointers are the fourth-most by a CU freshman and the most since Emily Waner had 51 in 2003-04. She ranks sixth in the Pac-12 in 3-pointers made (1.8 3mpg).

Junior forward **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** is averaging 4.3 points and

4.1 rebounds per game. She is second on the team in offensive rebounds (51), third in assists (34) and fourth in 3-point field goals (18). She has scored 15 points in the last two games after scoring only 10 in the previous six combined. Sophomore **Rachel Hargis**, who averages 3.8 points and 3.2 rebounds per contest, is second on the team and ranks 15th in the Pac-12 in blocked shots (0.9 bpg).

Freshman guard **Jasmine Sborov** has seen extended minutes over the last 13 games, scoring 51 of her 61 season points. She filled up the box score nicely against Arizona, scoring a career high 10 points on 4-of-6 shooting with seven rebounds, three assists and one steal. Sborov has hit 61.9 percent from the field over the last seven games (13-of-21). She has also achieved her personal best of seven rebounds in three of the last six outings.

REESE OUT WITH EYE INJURY: Freshman forward **Jen Reese** suffered a broken orbital bone under her left eye while playing defense in the opening minutes of the Stanford game. She is expected to miss the next 4-to-6 weeks. Reese played in the first 25 games, starting the last nine. She ranked second on the team in rebounding at 6.0 per game and is fourth in scoring at 7.8 an outing. She had four total games rebounding in double figures, including a career high 14 against UCLA. Reese led the Buffaloes, or shared the lead, in rebounding nine times, including six of nine games before her injury. On the Pac-12 charts she remains 12th in field-goal accuracy at 44.9 percent. She recorded her first career double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds in the win at Washington State. Reese earned UTSA Holiday Classic All-Tournament honors by averaging 12.5 points and 4.5 rebounds while shooting 66.7 percent over the two games (10-of-15).

HISTORIC START: Colorado started the season 12-0 for just the third time in team history and first since the 1992-93 squad won a school record 15 games to begin the season. The 12-0 start ties for the second best start in school history. Here is a break down of CU's best starts:

ABOUT THE BEAVERS: Oregon State is 18-10 overall and tied with Arizona State and UCLA for fourth place in the Pac-12 at 9-8. The Beavers still have a shot to claim the coveted No. 4 seed and first round bye in the upcoming conference tournament, but need to win Saturday and have UCLA lose. Oregon State has lost three of four, including a 63-56 overtime setback at Utah on March 1. OSU averages 66.3 points per game while allowing only 58.5 to its opponents. One of the better shooting teams in the Pac-12, the Beavers rank second only to Stanford at 42.9 percent. On the defensive side, the Beavers rank second in blocked shots (5.7 bpg) and defensive rebounds (28.6 drpg) on the Pac-12 charts.

Freshman guard Ali Gibson leads Oregon State in scoring at 12.1 points per game and is third in the Pac-12 in 3-point accuracy at 38.2 percent. Senior guard Earlysia Marchbanks is just a fraction behind Gibson in scoring at 12.0 per game and is the team's top rebounder at 7.0 an outing. Marchbanks also ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in assists (3.7 apg). Junior forward Patricia Bright leads the Pac-12 in blocks at 3.5 per game while also averaging 9.0 points on 57.1 percent from the field.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be the fourth meeting between Colorado and Oregon State, with the Buffaloes holding a 2-1 series edge. Oregon State won the first Pac-12 meeting, 65-45, in Corvallis. Entering the season, this and the Washington State series, were the least played of CU's new conference foes, both at two games. Both of Colorado's wins have come in Boulder, the last a 68-60 decision on Dec. 19, 1999. CU head coach Linda Lappe was on that 1999 team, but did not play due to an injury.

Lappe is 0-1 against Oregon State as a head coach. OSU head coach Scott Rueck is 1-0 against Colorado as a head coach.

CHUCKY REACHES 1,000: Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** became the 24th player in team history to reach 1,000 career points during the loss to Oregon. She is the 10th player to achieve 1,000 before her senior year. Surpassing 1,000 in her 81st career game, she tied Tera Bjorklund (2000-04) for the ninth fastest to reach 1,000. Currently with 1,106 points, Jeffery is 20th on CU's all-time scoring list and needs just two to pass Julie Hoehing for 19th.

THANKS BUFF FANS, KEEP COMING OUT!: Colorado had a season-high 5,885 fans witness the nail biting overtime loss to UCLA on Jan. 29. The attendance number is the second highest for a Pac-12 league game this season, trailing only the California at No. 4 ranked Stanford rivalry game played the night before which drew 6,075. Overall the UCLA-Colorado attendance figure is the third best at a Pac-12 venue this season. Stanford had 7,329 for a nonconference game against national power Tennessee on Dec. 20.

The Buffaloes are averaging 2,771 for 15 home dates this season and 3,281 in eight Pac-12 home games, both figures trailing only Stanford (4,250 overall, 4,345 league) in the Pac-12 and ranking 39th in the nation (prior to the Oregon game). CU is on pace for its best home attendance average since the 2003-04 team drew 3,092 over 16 home games.

PERFORMANCE UNDER PRESSURE: Colorado's 67-62 loss to Oregon snapped a seven-game winning streak in games decided by five points or less. The Buffaloes are 4-3 with that narrow margin this season. Five of those seven wins have come away from Boulder. The Buffaloes are 8-5 under Linda Lappe in games decided by five points or less.

...AND IN EVEN TIGHTER CIRCLES: Three of Colorado's five Pac-12 wins have been by one or two points, including back-to-back wins over Arizona (56-54) and USC (69-67). Colorado hadn't been

involved in back-to-back one or two point games since the final two contests of the 2004-05 season when the Buffaloes beat Nebraska in the home finale, 78-76, and then fell to Iowa State, 64-62, in the first round of the Big 12 Championship, which was also Ceal Barry's last game as head coach. Colorado hadn't won back-to-back games with that little margin since the 1983-84 campaign, squeaking out road wins at Northern Arizona, 62-60, and at Wyoming, 57-56.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado is 61-142 all-time against ranked opponents, including a 47-122 mark for those ranked in both AP & Coaches polls. The Buffaloes have won two of their last seven against ranked foes, both wins coming last season. Stanford has been Colorado's only ranked opponent this season, coming at No. 4 in both polls in the first meeting and No. 2 in the second. Unless the Buffaloes meet up with another ranked team in the postseason, the two games against ranked teams this season would match the fewest since 2005-06.

ROAD WARRIORS: Colorado has won seven of its last 13 road games and also seven of its last 13 away from home (both encompassing a slightly different set of games). Prior to the Washington game, the Buffaloes had won six-straight both in true road games and games away from Boulder, each being the program's best such streaks since the 2003-04 squad won six in a row in true road contests.

Additionally, Colorado has won five of its last 11 conference road games after only winning four of the previous 30 dating back to the 2007-08 Big 12 season. CU has three conference road wins this season, its most since the 2003-04 NCAA Tournament squad won five league games away from Boulder.

Colorado began the Pac-12 season with three straight on the road finishing 2-1. It was CU's first three-game conference road stand since 1997, the inaugural season of the Big 12. In that string, the Buffaloes lost at Kansas State on Feb. 19, but bounced back to win games at Missouri on Feb. 23 and No. 12 ranked Texas on Feb. 26, sparking an eight-game win streak that carried Colorado through the first Big 12 Tournament Championship and an appearance in the 1997 NCAA Sweet 16.

Colorado returned home for California and Stanford after nearly a month away from home, spanning five games, which hadn't happened since the end of the 2001 season with a final regular season road game and then four neutral site Big 12 and NCAA Tournament games. The five away from home hadn't been done entirely in the regular season since the 1993-94 team played seven in a row away from Boulder in the late preseason (5) and early Big Eight Conference schedule (2).

FOR OPENERS, CONFERENCE VERSION: Colorado improved to 22-16 in all-time in conference openers with its 58-52 win over Utah. The win snapped a three-game losing streak in road conference openers for the Buffaloes.

DEFENDING THE HOOP: Colorado allowed just 51.7 points in the 11 nonconference games, limiting the opponent to just 33.2 percent shooting overall (34.6 percent on two-point attempts and 29.7 from three-point range). The Buffaloes held five nonconference opponents under 50 points. CU has held its opponent under 50 points 11 times in CU head coach **Linda Lappe's** 62-game tenure.

REBOUNDING WOVES: Colorado has been even or outrebounded its opponent in 20 of 28 games, including 11 in a row prior to the Washington game. CU's margin of plus-4.8 on the season, ranks third in the Pac-12. CU had a big night on the glass against San Francisco, ending with a margin of plus-33 (53-20). That plus-33

margin overall is tied for the ninth best margin in team history and tied for the fourth best since the NCAA/Big Eight Conference era began with the 1982-83 season. It's also the widest margin since the Buffaloes put up a similar plus-33 margin against Bowling Green (59-26) on Nov. 23, 2001. Those two games are the best since CU outrebounded Northern Arizona by 34 (56-22) on Dec. 18, 1993.

Colorado has grabbed 50 or more rebounds five times this season, including a high of 54 against Texas-Pan American. It's the most 50-plus rebound games for the Buffaloes since they had nine such outputs during the 1993-94 season.

On the other end of the spectrum, CU's 20 rebounds allowed to San Francisco tied for the second-lowest in team history. The Buffaloes held a team at 20 on three other occasions, most recently against Loyola Chicago in a 65-34 win on Nov. 27, 2010. The record low is 19, set against Northern Arizona on Feb. 7, 1981.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Chucky Jeffery earned Colorado's first ever Pac-12 Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week honor on Dec. 4. Her award was the fourth overall for the Buffaloes in their inaugural Pac-12 season, joining three football winners from earlier this fall. The league Player of the Week honor is also the first for women's basketball since Brittany Spears was named Big 12 Conference Player of the Week on Nov. 23, 2009. For Jeffery, it's her second similar honor, as she was the Big 12 Freshman of the Week winner on Jan. 11, 2010.

Jeffery averaged 28 points and 11 rebounds while shooting 64.5 percent from the floor, leading the Buffaloes to wins over San Francisco (84-66) and Idaho (68-59).

CHUCKY DOUBLES: Chucky Jeffery has six double-doubles on the season, tied for 10th in the Pac-12, including a string of three-straight (Wisconsin-San Francisco-Idaho). It was the first time a CU player had double-doubles in three-straight games since Jackie McFarland had two separate strings of three during the 2006-07 season. She joins Bridget Turner as the only other guard in team history with three-straight double-doubles. Turner pulled the trifecta during the 1988-89 season, with one of her doubles the points-assists variety.

Overall she is the seventh player to achieve three straight double-doubles. CU Athletic Hall of Famer Lisa Van Goor holds the consecutive mark of six during the 1980-81 season.

LEXY AMONG ELITE COMPANY: Freshman guard **Lexy Kresl** scored in double-digits in the first six games of her career, tying CU Athletic Hall of Fame member and All-American Shelley Sheetz for the second-most in team history. Current CU Director of Basketball Operations **Tracy Tripp** holds the mark of 10, set during the 1985-86 season.

CHUCKY REBOUNDS: Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** became the 20th player in team history to reach 500 rebounds in the win over Washington State and now sits at 592, 14th on CU's all-time list. She has a career average of 6.8 per game which jumps to 7.6 since the beginning of her sophomore year (58 games). She had a career night on the glass at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, grabbing 16 rebounds in the win over the Islanders. Her 16 rebounds were the most by a CU player since Jackie McFarland recorded 18 at Kansas on Feb. 6, 2007.

LEXY'S RECORD NIGHT: Freshman guard **Lexy Kresl** had a memorable collegiate debut making 5-of-6 3-point attempts in the first half of CU's 84-60 win over Northern Arizona. She tied a school record for 3-pointers made in one half, a feat that had happened five previous times by three players. Bianca Smith, who was the last person to hit five in one half (vs. Nebraska on Jan. 31, 2009), did it three times. Kate Fagan and CU Athletic Hall of Famer and All-American Shelly Sheetz are the other two.

What sets Kresl's achievement apart is the others were well into their respective collegiate careers when they reached that one-half mark:

STEALING THE SHOW: **Chucky Jeffery** has been frustrating offenses her entire career, but one of the top defensive players in the Pac-12 is on a tear as of late.

Jeffery ranks third overall in the Pac-12 at 2.5 steals per game, but her production has risen to 3.0 over the last 12 games (36). She has six or more steals three times this season including conference matches against UCLA and Oregon. Jeffery leads the Pac-12 in steals at 31 during league only games. She has 33 career games with three or more steals, including 12 this season. Jeffery's 70 steals this season rank 14th on CU's single-season list and she is just six away from her sophomore season total of 76, which ranks seventh.

As a team, Colorado recorded 16 steals against Northern Arizona in the season opener, its most in a single game since swiping 18 against Texas Southern on Dec. 14, 2007. It's just the third time since the 2003-04 season that the Buffaloes have had 16 or more steals in one contest (16 vs. Pacific on Dec. 8, 2005).

Seven different Buffaloes registered steals against Northern Arizona, led by sophomore **Brittany Wilson** who had a career high with five. Freshmen **Jasmine Sborov** and **Jen Reese** each had three in their collegiate debuts.

Picking it up in Pac-12 play, Colorado followed up a 12-steal performance at Oregon with 15 against Arizona. The 27 steals are the most for the Buffaloes over a two game span since the 2007-08 team had 28 over a pair of battles (18-Texas Southern, 10-Dartmouth).

MALCOLM-PECK CLIMBING IN 3-POINTERS, BLOCKS: Junior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** drilled her 78th career 3-pointer in the Oregon game, ranking 12th on CU's all-time list. She is also 12th in blocked shots with 64.

JEFFERY MOVING UP CAREER LADDERS: Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** ranks among Colorado's all-time leaders in several categories. She is ninth in steals (204), 12th in assists (332), 14th in rebounds (592), 16th in blocks (56), 19th in 3-point field goals (49) and 20th in scoring (1,106) and field-goals made (413)

OMNI HOTELS CLASSIC CHAMPIONS: Colorado claimed its 15th holiday tournament title and has won all three since the old Coors Classic was changed to the Omni Hotels Classic in 2009. Colorado improved to 40-10 all-time in its home holiday classic.

YOUNG BUFFS: Colorado sports its youngest team in recent memory with just three upperclassmen. Forward **Julie Seabrook** is the lone senior with **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** and **Chucky Jeffery** the two juniors. **Brenna Malcolm-Peck** is part of the junior class, but redshirted in 2010-11 with an injury and is a sophomore in eligibility.

Current CU head coach **Linda Lappe** was part of the last Colorado teams to feature a roster this young. Colorado's 1999-2000 squad had only one upperclassman - junior Kami Carmann - on an 11-player roster which featured seven sophomores (including Lappe) and three freshmen. That next season, 2000-01, Carmann was the lone senior on the team, marking the last single-senior instance prior to this year.

INTERMOUNTAIN REUNION: CU played several games this season against old Intermountain Conference rivals.

The Buffaloes played in the Intermountain Conference from 1975-82, prior to the Big 8 Conference holding a championship for women's basketball (the Big 8 began regular league play in 1982-83). Colorado won outright or shared three straight Intermountain titles from 1980-82.

With Colorado's move to the Pac-12 Conference for this season, the Buffaloes renew rivalries with old Intermountain mates Utah, Arizona and Arizona State. In addition, CU had nonconference games with Weber State along with Colorado State and Northern Arizona.

RULES CHANGES: Three notable NCAA women's basketball rules changes were made in the offseason and are effective immediately.

The women's 3-point line has been moved from 19-feet, 9-inches back to 20' 9", equal to the NCAA men's line. The Coors Events Center will keep the old 19' 9" line on the floor, because it remains the 3-point distance for the high school level. Coors hosts numerous prep games throughout the season, including the Colorado Class 5A and 4A State Championships.

Underneath the basket there is a new restricted arc area that spans out 3-feet. The arc, familiar to those who follow the NBA, marks the area under the basket where a secondary defender is not permitted to establish a legal guarding position. Specifically, a defender must be outside this arc in order to have the ability to draw an offensive charging foul.

Lastly, after the second horn of a timeout, if a team is not ready to play, officials will warn that team on the first offense. On the second and subsequent offenses, the official will make the ball ready for play, regardless if both teams have returned to the floor.

BUFFS IN OPENERS: With the win over Northern Arizona, Colorado improved to 33-5 (.868) all-time in season openers as the Buffaloes started the season with a home game for the 26th time in 38 seasons. Colorado moved to an outstanding 36-2 (.947) all-time in home openers. Colorado has never lost its overall season opener when played at home (26-0).

BUFFS SIGN THREE TO NLI's FOR 2012-13: **Lauren Huggins**, **Jamee Swan** and **Kyleesha Weston** have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2012-13, head coach **Linda Lappe** announced on Wednesday.

This highly touted class features two Top 100 players in Swan and Huggins and an up-and-coming point guard of the future in Weston. Lappe's second full recruiting class is ranked the 20th best in the nation by ESPN.com's *HoopGurlz*.

Huggins, a 6-foot-1 wing from Littleton, Colo., averaged 12 points and nearly eight rebounds per game as a junior, guiding the Heritage High School to the Colorado Class 5A Sweet 16. *HoopGurlz* lists Huggins as the 63rd best player in the nation and the 11th at the small forward position

Swan is a 6-2 forward from Tucson, Ariz., and is a four-star *HoopGurlz* prospect from Marana High School. She is rated as the eighth best forward in the nation and the 38th best player overall. Swan averaged 19.6 points, 13.4 rebounds, 4.1 blocked shots and 4.1 steals for the Tigers as a junior, earning Southern Class 4A All-State first team honors.

Weston is a 5-7 point guard from Park Hill High School in Kansas City, Mo. As a junior last winter, she averaged 15.4 points, 4.5 rebounds, 4.5 steals and 2.5 assists per game. Weston earned first team All-Kansas City Suburban Big 6 Conference and all-district honors as a junior.

EXHIBITION WIN: Four Colorado players scored in double-digits as the Buffaloes ran to a 78-40 women's basketball exhibition win over Regis on Nov. 6 at the Coors Events Center.

Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** and freshman **Lexy Kresl** each had 14 points. Sophomore **Brittany Wilson** had 12 off the bench and her twin sister **Ashley Wilson** had 10.

BUFFS PICKED 11TH/12TH: Despite coming off an eighth place finish and 18-16 record in its final year in the Big 12 Conference, Colorado was picked to finish 11th in its first season in Pac-12, according to the league's annual Preseason Coaches Poll.

2011 NCAA Women's Final Four participant Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12, compiling the maximum amount of points (121) and first place votes (11) possible. 2011 Postseason WNIT runnerup USC claimed the other first place vote and was second in the poll (111). California was third with 98 points followed by UCLA (83), Arizona State (68), Utah (61), Washington State (59), Oregon (51), Arizona (48), Washington (38), Colorado (36) and Oregon State (18).

Colorado was picked to finish 12th in the Preseason Pac-12 Media Poll. Stanford was picked to repeat its title, and the top six mirror that of the coaches poll released earlier. Oregon jumped to seventh in the media poll followed by Arizona, Washington State, Washington, Oregon State and Colorado.

HOME AT COORS: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 364-126 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.743). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 22 of the previous 33 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado's regular season schedule featured nine regionally or nationally televised games. CU made its first appearance on The Mtn in the win over Colorado State on Nov. 20. Colorado will have eight games air on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain. The first was the San Francisco game on Nov. 30, followed by Idaho (Dec. 4), Denver (Dec. 8), Stanford (Jan. 14), at Arizona (Jan. 22) and UCLA (Jan. 29), Utah (Feb. 18) and Oregon (Mar. 1). All ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain games were available nationally on DIRECTV and DISH Network.

The games with Arizona and UCLA were part of the Pac-12's FSN national package. CU has appeared on 91 regional or national telecasts over the last 10 seasons.

BOULDER - Squandered opportunities in the final minutes were difficult to overlook, but University of Colorado women's coach **Linda Lappe** contended her team's 64-62 loss Thursday night to Oregon came earlier.

"No one play, no one shot lost the game," Lappe said. "I can think of several times in second half when we lost the game."

But CU's play in the final 2:14 at the Coors Events Center is hard to ignore. Including two free throws, the Buffaloes missed six shots in that stretch and committed two of their 16 turnovers in the last minute.

With the score tied at 62-62, **Brittany Wilson** misfired on two free throws with 1:47 to play, then missed a floating jumper in front of the basket at the buzzer that would have sent the game into overtime. The Ducks got a free throw each from Laura Stanulis and Ariel Thomas in the last 1:32 for the winning margin.

CU dropped its fifth consecutive game and lost for the eighth time in nine games. The Buffs fell to 16-12 overall and 5-12 in the Pac-12 Conference, while Oregon improved to 15-14 and 6-11. The Ducks swept the Buffs, winning 67-62 last month in Eugene.

Aside from three ties, CU led the entire first half, leading by as many as six points on two occasions. But the Buffs led by only two (30-28) at halftime. Once the Ducks passed them (40-38) with just under 14 minutes to play, the Buffs never regained the lead.

Chucky Jeffery inished with a game-best 19 points in 26 minutes. **Julie Seabrook** added 16 points - two below her career high - and **Lexy Kresl** had 10 for the Buffs.

Oregon had two players in double figures - Amanda Johnson and Deanna Weaver with 11 each - but nine of the Ducks who played scored.

CU limited Oregon, the Pac-12's second-best scoring team (72.6 point average), to nine field goals in 33 first-half attempts (27.3 percent). But the Buffs' early defense was counterbalanced (in a bad way) by their turnovers. Averaging 18 a game in conference play, CU was halfway there by intermission.

With the Buffs up 35-30, Oregon's Danielle Love promptly hit back-to-back treys, giving the Ducks their first lead of the night - 36-35 - with 16:17 remaining.

The Ducks took their largest lead of the game - 48-41 - on a three-pointer by Jordan Loera with 9:27 left. Just under a minute later, Seabrook hit a short jumper and was fouled. Her free throw pulled the Buffs to within four (48-44), and Jeffery followed with a trey from the left wing to close the gap to one (48-47).

Oregon opened a six-point lead (53-47) on a short jumper by Weaver and a three-pointer by Johnson with 6:30 to play. But CU wouldn't go away, closing to within one (53-52) on a Kresl three-pointer, then pulling to within a point again (56-55) on a Kresl layup at the 4:46 mark.

The Buffs twice crept to a point back in the next 2 minutes, then tied the game at 62-62 on a Kresl trey from the right wing with 2:14 left. But at that point, CU's scoring was done.

Lappe liked, for the most part, the way her team attacked Oregon's zone: "I think we executed well at times . . . I liked that we didn't just take all threes; we got some easy shots inside. Meagan (Malcolm-Peck) and Julie had some nice easy looks. I thought we were more versatile in how we were getting shots."

But, noted Lappe, the Buffs also encountered a second-half cold spell, and "when Lexy got the three to go down (tying the score at 62) it gave us a boost."

CU's chance to take the lead fizzled when Brittany Wilson missed a pair of free throws less than a half minute later. With 3.2 seconds left, CU called a timeout, setting up a final shot, but Brittany Wilson's short runner at the buzzer missed.

Lappe's plan was for someone to drive to the rim, but the Ducks denied Jeffery and Kresl the ball. Lappe said she believed Brittany Wilson "had a decent look; it was a little bit of a floater, we just couldn't get it to go down."
