OPENING TIP: Colorado leads the Pac-12 in scoring defense during conference games at 50.6 points a game.

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 14-2 overall, its best start since the 2003-04 NCAA Tournament team began its season 18-2. The Buffaloes are 3-2 in Pac-12 play, and have won three straight, their best string in conference play since the end of the 2011 Big 12 Conference season. Colorado claimed a 57-43 win over Arizona State on Friday, holding the Sun Devils to a CU opponent season-low 23.6 percent shooting.

Colorado averages just under 68 points per game on 43 percent shooting from the field. The Buffaloes scored in bunches during the nonconference schedule hitting 80 points three times. Defensively, CU allows just over 53 points and has held opponents to 34 percent shooting for the year.

The Buffaloes continue to rank among the best rebounding teams in the nation. CU's +10.9 rebounding margin is second in the Pac-12 and the Buffaloes ranked 11th in NCAA Division I through games of Jan. 17. On the Pac-12 team leaderboard, the Buffaloes rank in the top five in 17 of 21 statistical categories, including second in scoring defense and tied for first in rebounding defense.

Redshirt freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** leads Colorado in total points (219), averaging 13.7 per game. A three-time Pac-12 Freshman of the Week, Roberson also ranks second on the team in rebounding (5.8 rpg) and field-goal percentage (.470). She had a career-best 11 rebounds in the win over Arizona State, including a personal-high six on the offensive end. Roberson ranks 10th in offensive rebounds (2.9 orpg), 12th in scoring and 14th in field-goal percentage on the Pac-12 leaderboard.

All-Pac-12 guard **Chucky Jeffery** leads the team in assists (4.1 apg), rebounds (8.6 rpg) and steals (2.4 spg) and is in a virtual tie with Roberson for the lead in scoring average wise (13.7 ppg). She recorded her fourth double-double of the season, and 24th of her career, with 19 points and a team season-high 16 rebounds against Arizona State. Jeffery ranks second in the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.4), and is also fifth in assists, overall rebounding and defensive rebounds (6.5), eighth in steals, 10th in free-throw percentage (.727) and 13th in scoring.

Junior guard **Brittany Wilson** ranks second on the team in steals (1.5 spg) and assists (2.4 apg) while coming in at fourth in scoring

at 8.0 points per contest. She dished out five assists in the Arizona State game, tying her season-high. Wilson is also second on the team in 3-pointers made (17) and has hit 78 percent from the free-throw line. Wilson ranks 12th in 3-point percentage (.333) and 14th in 3-pointers made (1.1 3mpg) on the Pac-12 leaderboard.

Sophomore forward **Jen Reese** has made a successful return from an eye injury that kept her out of the final nine games of 2011-12. She is third on the team in scoring (9.0 ppg) and rebounding (5.3 rpg) while hitting 46.8 percent from the field. Reese has scored in double-figures in eight of the last 13 contests including a game-high 11 in the road win at Utah.

Junior center **Rachel Hargis** is the only Buffalo to start all 16 games. A career 33 percent shooter entering the season, Hargis has made the most of her opportunity hitting 51 percent this season. She leads CU in blocked shots with 20, knocking away four in the last two games alone. Hargis also has 16 assists on the year, after registering just 17 in 35 games as a sophomore. Hargis had a career- and team-season high seven blocked shots against Louisville, just one off the school single-game record. She ranks 14th in the Pac-12 in blocks at 1.3 per outing.

Colorado's balance has served them well through the first half of the season. Aside from Roberson and Jeffery averaging in double figures, six others average between four and nine points per game. In the road game at Utah, nine different Buffaloes scored at least three points and had two or more rebounds.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS: Arizona is 11-5 overall and tied with Colorado and Washington for fifth in the Pac-12 at 3-2 after a 62-58 win Friday night at Utah. The Wildcats average 67.2 points per game, and have shown the ability to score in bunches. Arizona has hit 80 points four times this season, including a league season best with its 100-68 home win over Oregon on Jan. 13. The Wildcats lead the Pac-12 in free-throw percentage (.736) and rank second in steals (11.2 spg) and 3-pointers made (6.1 3mpg).

Senior guard Davellyn Whyte leads Arizona and ranks fourth in the Pac-12 at 16.7 points and second in assists with 5.1 per outing. Junior guard Kama Griffiths is second on the team in scoring at 11.5 points, and has 34 3-pointers to her credit, but has missed the last three games. Junior forward Alli Gloyd averages 10.4 points and 5.9 rebounds per contest. Junior forward Erica Barnes tops the Wildcats in rebounding at 6.3 an outing.

Niya Butts is in her fifth year has head coach at Arizona with a record of 73-70.

THE SERIES: This will be the 12th meeting between Colorado and Arizona with the Buffaloes holding an 8-3 series lead. The Buffaloes swept the initial Pac-12 season series from the Wildcats in 2011-12, winning 56-54 in Tucson and 69-59 in Boulder. Overall CU has won the last five in the series dating back to 1989. The Buffaloes are 5-1 all-time against Arizona in Boulder, the lone loss coming in 1975, CU's first season.

Linda Lappe is 2-0 against Arizona as a head coach. Niya Butts is 0-2 against Colorado as a head coach.

CONNECTIONS: Colorado has two Arizona natives on its roster. Sophomore guard **Lexy Kresl** is from Paradise Valley, a suburb of Phoenix. Freshman forward **Jamee Swan** is from Tucson.

MORE ON THE DEFENSE: Colorado leads the Pac-12 in scoring defense through five conference games at 50.6 points per outing. CU has held its last two (Utah & Arizona State) to 43 points each, the first time the Buffaloes have held consecutive opponents under 45 in conference play since 1996-97, the Buffs' Big 12 Tournament Championship year. CU won at Texas A&M 69-40 on Feb. 8 and defeated Oklahoma at home 61-42 on Feb. 12.

BOULDER - When **Chucky Jeffery** set her feet, squared up and buried the game's first shot and her first three-point Thursday night, her coach had an inkling good things would follow. **Linda Lappe** was right.

Behind Jeffery's 21 points and career-high five treys, the Colorado women's basketball team cruised past Arizona 69-59 at the Coors Events Center, winning by its largest margin in Pac-12 Conference play.

"Chucky, from the opening shot, showed how she was going to play that game...that set the tempo," Lappe said. "She took it with confidence and even if she missed it, she still had the same confidence...she really controlled the game from start to finish."

The Buffs, breaking a three-game losing streak, improved to 16-7 overall and 5-7 in the conference. Behind 10 first-half points each from Jeffery and **Brittany Wilson**, the Buffs finished the first 20 minutes strong, then opened the final 20 with the same vigor. It was very close to being a performance with no dead spots, which Lappe called "huge. Our players, hopefully, learn from our mistakes. We came out in the second half really strong - and we haven't done that in a while."

The Buffs' 6-0 run to close the first half gave them a 40-37 lead at intermission, and five straight points to open the second half put them up eight (45-37) before the Wildcats could recover.

Arizona did, closing to 47-45 before CU surged with an 11-2 run - it featured Jeffery contributing a pair of treys - and went up 59-47. The Buffs held a double-digit lead for the final 10:22 and sent the Wildcats (13-11, 2-10) to their seventh consecutive loss.

In addition to Jeffery's game-best 21 points, CU got 12 points from Wilson and a career-high 10 from freshman **Jasmine Sborov**, who also contributed seven rebounds, three assists and a steal.

Jeffery, who made five of her nine three-point attempts, snapped out of a behind-the-arc slump that had seen her make only 3-of-25 trey tries in the previous seven games.

"When I feel like my shot is good, I get encouraged to hit another one if I'm open," Jeffery said. "So I wasn't going to be hesitant."

Lappe was as pleased with Jeffery's defense as her offense, citing the clamp down job done on Arizona's Davellyn White, whose 10 points were 7.4 below her average. Also key was the Buffs' offensive board work: they outrebounded the Wildcats 41-27, snaring 20 offensive boards and outscoring the visitors 21-4 on second-chance points.

Lappe called that "the difference in the game." Her team also converted 20 Wildcats turnovers into 13 points.

The Buffs, 56-54 winners against the Wildcats last month in Tucson, opened by hitting their first three shots - all treys - and went ahead 9-5. The Wildcats finally got in a flow and tied the score at 13-13 and took their first lead at 15-13 a minute later on a layup by Candice Warthen.

From there, the lead changed hands five times before Arizona got seven consecutive points from Shanita Arnold and took its largest lead (31-26) of the half. The Wildcats led for the next 8 minutes, surrendering their advantage when Ashley Wilson hit a layup with 1:48 left before intermission to send the Buffs ahead 38-37.

Another layup by Meagan Malcolm-Peck gave CU its 40-37 halftime lead and marked the Buffs' first 40-point half in Pac-12 play. The Wildcats made only one field goal in the final 6:59 of the first half but wound up shooting 63.6 percent overall (14-of-22) and 71.4 percent from behind the arc (5-of-7) - and that kept them close for awhile.

Since the second half of the home game against Utah (Jan. 8), the Buffs have held their opponents to a 26.9 field goal percentage (38-of-141), spanning a total of five halves, or 100 minutes.

Arizona State was held to 17 points on 4-of-30 from the field in the second half of Friday's game. The four field goals were one shy of a school record (3 vs. Texas State 12/1/10 and Kansas State 3/7/92). The 13.3 percent allowed was just a fraction off the all-time opponent low for a half, 13.0 (3-of-23) vs. Kansas State on 3/7/92).

Colorado has allowed just four teams in the 60's all season and has held seven straight opponents under the 60-point mark. That run ties for the second best in team history and is just one off the longest:

NATIONALLY RANKED: After a one week hiatus, Colorado rejoined the *USA Today Sports Women's Basketball Coaches* poll at No. 25 released on Tuesday.

Colorado, 14-2 overall and 3-2 in the Pac-12 Conference, received 67 votes, up from 28 last week when the Buffaloes were the second team listed in the "receiving votes" category. Colorado made its first appearance of the season in the coaches' poll on Jan. 1, also at No. 25.

On Monday the Buffaloes moved up two spots to No. 21 in the Associated Press Women's Basketball Top 25 poll. The Buffaloes have resided in the AP poll for the last five weeks, reaching as high as No. 20 on Dec. 31. CU's five week run in the AP poll is its longest since appearing in all 19 polls of the 2003-04 season. In the AP poll, the Buffaloes received 232 votes, their highest vote total of the season.

The Buffaloes have a long history of rankings in the AP poll, dating back to the 1980-81 season. This week's ranking marks the 163rd time Colorado has appeared in the AP poll, trailing only Stanford, USC and UCLA among Pac-12 schools. This week's ranking marks the 153rd time Colorado has appeared in the coaches' poll dating back to the 1988-89 campaign.

LAPPE AND COLORADO IN THE POLLS: Head coach **Linda Lappe** joined some elite company when the Buffaloes received their first AP ranking in five years. She is only one of eight NCAA Division I women's head coaches to have played for an AP ranked team, and then return to lead that same program into the AP poll. Overall she is the 31st person to play for and coach an AP ranked program.

The Buffaloes were ranked for 29 weeks during Lappe's playing career (1998-03) including 27 straight from Jan. 22, 2001 through the end of her junior year (March 11, 2002). CU's highest AP ranking during that span was No. 10, on March 4, 2002.

the Buffaloes to their first *Associated Press* ranking in five seasons and their first top-10 win in over 10 years, and as a result picked up some well-deserved conference and national recognition.

On Dec. 17, Jeffery was named the espnW National Player of the Week and Pac-12 Conference Player of the Week for the week of Dec 10-16. She also received national and Pac-12 Player of the Week honors from collegesportsmadness.com.

On Dec. 18, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) named Jeffery its Ann Meyers Drysdale Women's National Player of the Week.

Jeffery averaged 18 points, 9.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists while shooting 46 percent from the field and 80 percent from the free-throw line in wins over Denver and No. 8 ranked Louisville.

Against Louisville she had a game-high and personal season-best 22 points along with seven rebounds, four assists and one steal as the Buffaloes claimed their first win over a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 5 Stanford in the 2002 NCAA Sweet 16. Jeffery recorded season highs from the 3-point line (2-of-5) and the foul line (8-10) as she became the 16th player in team history to reach 1,300 career points.

Jeffery had 14 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and two steals in the road win over Denver on Dec. 11. She notched her second double-double of the season, and 22nd of her career, tying Sandy Bean (1978-82) for fifth on CU's all-time list.

Jeffery's Pac-12 Player of the Week honor is her second, as she received the same award on Dec. 5, 2011.

FAST OUT OF THE GATE: Colorado finished the nonconference regular season at 11-0, the Buffs' second consecutive perfect non-conference season, and third in school history (1992-93). Colorado will continue a string of 24 nonconference regular season wins into next season. The Buffaloes are 31-4 in the nonconference season under head coach **Linda Lappe**.

In terms of overall winning streaks, CU's 11-game run tied for the eighth best in team history.

MORE ON THE BOARDS: Colorado ranked 11th in NCAA Division I in rebounding margin at +10.5 through games of Jan. 17, and upped that to +10.9 on Friday. The Buffaloes have either tied or led the rebounding battle in 14 of 16 games this season, coming up on the short end for the first time in the Stanford loss. The Buffaloes have enjoyed double-digit margins in nine games.

The Buffaloes grabbed a season-high 59 rebounds in the win over Colorado State, their most since also recording 59 against Bowling Green on Nov. 23, 2001. CU had 24 offensive rebounds, nearly matching Colorado State's overall total (26). Colorado's 24 offensive rebounds were its most since it had 24 at Iowa State on Feb. 18, 1996.

Colorado's +33 advantage against the Rams tied for the ninth largest single-game margin in team history, most recently achieved against

Colorado had 50 rebounds against Denver, hitting the 50 mark for the second straight game for the first time since grabbing 50 against UC Irvine and 52 against Illinois-Chicago in the first two games of the 2009-10 season.

CU's 109 rebounds over a two-game span are its most since hitting the same number during the 2001 Coors Classic (59 vs. Bowling Green, 50 vs. Houston). The Buffaloes 46 offensive rebounds during that stretch are their most since grabbing 48 in back-to-back games in December 1994 (25 vs. Montana State, 23 vs. Notre Dame).

SUCCESS ON THE ROAD: Colorado is 4-0 away from Boulder this season and is 13-7 in its last 20 true road contests since the tail end of the 2010-11 campaign. Prior to the start of this run, The Buffaloes had just five wins in their previous 37 road games dating back to the 2008 Big 12 Conference schedule.

The Buffaloes are averaging 71.5 points on 45 percent shooting in those four road contests. CU has also held its opponent to 55.8 points per game and enjoys a +12.8 rebound margin.

Colorado held Utah to 43 points in Salt Lake City on Jan. 13, its fewest allowed in a true road game since a 45-42 win at Pacific on Dec. 18, 2004

Colorado scored an overall season-high 83 points at Denver, the most in a true road contest since scoring 83 in a 3-point loss at Colorado State on Nov. 30, 2005. CU's 10-point halftime lead was its largest on the road since leading Colorado State 38-22 on Nov. 20, 2011

Colorado's win at Illinois was its first road win against a major conference opponent in a nonconference regular season game since defeating No. 20/17 ranked Vanderbilt, 62-51, on Dec. 9, 2007. The Buffaloes trailed by six at halftime against the Illini, allowing Colorado to claim its largest halftime deficit overcome to win on the road since defeating Missouri 80-79 in overtime on Feb. 23, 2010 after trailing by seven at the break (43-36).

Colorado's 23-point win at UMKC, was its biggest on the road since an 82-47 win at Colorado State on Dec. 1, 2007.

ROBERSON AMONG ELITE COMPANY: Freshman guard **Arielle Roberson** scored in double-digits in the first 13 games of her career setting a new school record. She passed Tracy Tripp's previous mark of 10, set during the 1985-86 season.

BENCH PRODUCTION: Colorado is getting good production from its bench to the tune of 22.0 points (32 percent) and 19.6 rebounds (46 percent) per game. Sophomore forward **Jen Reese** has headed the bench effort averaging 9.0 points and 5.3 rebounds, ranking third on the team in both categories.

Colorado scored a season-high 42 bench points in the win over UMKC. The bulk of those came from freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** who scored 23 points in 19 minutes on 9-of-12 from the field in her lone game off the bench this season. Her 23 bench points

are tied for the second most in the past 10 years and her nine field goals are the most. Only Bianca Smith, with 25 points off the bench against San Jose State on Dec. 22, 1999, had a bigger bench game in the last 10 years.

ROBERSON PAC-12 HONORS: Forward **Arielle Roberson** has won the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week award three times this season. The Pac-12 has added Freshman of the Week to its weekly honors for the first time this season.

In her most recent award on Dec. 2, Roberson averaged 19.5 points on 72 percent from the field (13-of-18) and 71 percent from the foul line (12-of-17) in wins over Wyoming and Illinois. She scored a career and team season-high 25 points, including a critical, late, 3-point basket, to lead Colorado to a 69-62 road win at Illinois as the Buffaloes claimed their 19th straight regular season nonconference victory.

She hit 7-of-8 from the field against the Illini and sank a team season-high 10 free throws on 14 attempts. Roberson also had five rebounds, three steals and an assist against Illinois. Earlier in the week, Roberson netted 14 points on 6-of-10 from the field in the home win over Wyoming.

Roberson earned the inaugural Pac-12 Freshman of the Week award on Nov. 12 after scoring 16 points on 7-of-13 shooting with six rebounds, five steals, two assists and two blocks in her collegiate debut - a 70-65 win over Idaho on Nov. 11. Her second citation came on Nov. 26 after averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds en route to Omni Hotels Classic MVP honors.

Her three weekly conference awards in one season are the most since Brittany Spears won four Big 12 Conference Rookie of the Week honors in 2007-08.

ARIELLE & ANDRE: The Roberson's are the only brother/sister tandem on the 2012-13 basketball rosters from the same school in the Pac-12 Conference. They're one of five brother/sister tandems on 2012-13 basketball rosters in Division I. The Big Ten has two tandems, followed by one each in the ACC, Mountain West and the Pac-12 Conferences. CU has another brother/sister pair on the ski team with freshmen Maria and Gustav Nordstrom from Sweden.

SEEING DOUBLE: Colorado is used to getting double takes from fans and opponents, as the Buffaloes once again sport two pairs of identical twins on its roster.

Brenna and Meagan Malcolm-Peck are senior wing players while **Ashley and Brittany Wilson** are junior guards. Brenna is the older of the two Malcolm-Pecks by 27 minutes. Ashley is the older of the Wilson twins, by only five minutes.

BUFFS EXPERIENCED FROM DEEP: While Colorado looks to continue an inside-outside balance on its 2012-13 squad, there is no questioning its experience from shooting from the perimeter. The Buffaloes have four players with at least 50 career 3-point field goals, and all four rank among CU's career Top 20. Senior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** and junior **Brittany Wilson** top the Buffaloes' effort with 87 each, tying for 11th on CU's all-time list. **Lexy Kresl**, who set CU's single-season freshman record in 2011-12 at 63 is 14th with 81. Senior **Chucky Jeffery** rounds out the current Buffs at 17th with 59.

JEFFERY MOVING UP CAREER LADDERS: Senior guard Chucky Jeffery became the 11th CU player to reach 1,400 points in the road win at Utah. She is just the seventh player to reach 1,400 points and

700 rebounds and joins Bridget Turner (1985-89) as the only players in team history with 1,400 points, 700 rebounds and 400 assists.

She had two steals against Arizona State to break her tie with Sandy Bean (1978-82) for fourth in all-time steals (252). Jeffery is currently fifth in career assists, needing 23 to catch Tracy Tripp (1985-89) for the fourth spot.

On CU's career charts Jeffery also ranks sixth in rebounds (796), 13th in field-goals made (535), 14th in free-throws made (294), 16th and blocks (61) and 17th in 3-point field goals (59).

In other miscellaneous categories Jeffery is also fifth in double-doubles (24), is sixth in double-figure rebounding games (26) and 10th in double-figure scoring games (77).

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado picked up its 14th all-time win over a top-10 ranked opponent with its 70-66 win over No. 8 Louisville on Dec. 14. The win marked the Buffaloes' first over a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 5 Stanford in the 2002 NCAA Sweet 16. It was the first top-10 win as an unranked team since knocking off No. 7 Texas Tech 63-49 on Jan. 11, 1997.

The win snapped a three-game slide against ranked teams and, at 1-2 on the season, the Buffaloes are 3-7 against ranked opponents under Linda Lappe. CU is 62-144 all-time against ranked opponents, including a 38-47 mark at home.

The Buffaloes played just two games against ranked teams in 2011-12, both against Stanford. Colorado is on track to at least triple that number this year as Pac-12 rivals California, UCLA and Stanford have solid footing in both polls.

COLORADO BASKETBALL'S SOLID START: Colorado's men's and women's basketball teams each began the 2012-13 season at

6-0, before the men suffered their first loss of the season on Dec. 1 at Wyoming. It is the first time the men's and women's programs have both started with six or more wins since 1982-83 when both teams started 7-0.

OMNI HOTELS CLASSIC CHAMPS: Colorado improved to 42-10 all-time in its home holiday classic and has won four straight and 16 of the 25 tournament titles contested. The Buffaloes won this year's classic by defeating Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and San Diego State. Freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** was named the MVP after averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds over the two-game tournament. She is the first CU freshman to win that honor in the 26-year history of the tournament. Senior guard **Chucky Jeffery** was named to the Omni Classic All-Tournament team after averaging 13 points, 7.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals over the two games. She is the first four-time Omni All-Tournament team honoree, earning MVP honors in 2010 and '11.

BUFFS SIGN FOUR TO NLI's: Zoe Beard-Fails, Desiree Harris, Haley Smith and Briana Watts have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2013-14 head coach Linda Lappe announced on Wednesday, the first day of the NCAA's early signing period.

Beard-Fails is a 6-2 forward from Herndon, Va., and attends Georgetown Day School in Washington D.C. She missed all but five games of her junior year with an ACL and meniscus tear, but is nearing full strength as her senior season commences. The 51st rated forward in the nation according to ESPN.com's HoopGurlz, Beard-Fails averaged 27 points and nearly 18 rebounds as a sophomore for Georgetown Day in 2010-11, earning fourth team All-Met honors from the Washington Post.

Harris is a 5-8 guard from Oakland, Calif., who attends St. Joseph Notre Dame High school in Alameda. She averaged 23.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 2.7 assists as a junior, helping the Pilots to the North Coast Section championship. Harris was a CIF All-State Division V second team selection as well as a Bay Shore Athletic League second team pick.

Smith, a 6-0 wing from Sammamish, Wash., is getting ready for her senior season at Skyline High School. A do-it-all player for the Spartans, she averaged around seven points, five rebounds and just under two assists and steals per game as a junior. Smith is in her fourth varsity season with the Spartans and also has had a successful club career playing with the Tree of Hope program. ESPN.com's HoopGurlz has her as the top prospect in the state of Washington and the 20th ranked wing in the nation.

Watts, a 6-4 center from Fresno, Calif., will make her debut with Clovis West High School this winter after playing her first three years at rival Buchanan. She was the first commit of the 2013 class. Watts averaged nearly six points and just over six rebounds per game for Buchanan as a junior, contributing to the Bears' 18-9 record and a spot in the CIF Central Section Division I semifinals.

BUFFS IN OPENERS: With its win over Idaho, Colorado improved to 34-5 (.872) all-time in season openers and 37-2 (.949) in all-time home openers. The Buffs opened the season with a home game for the 27th time in 39 seasons, and moved to a perfect 27-0 in those instances.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado improved to a perfect 23-0 in exhibition games with its 87-38 win over Western State University Colorado. The Buffaloes have outscored their exhibition opponents by just over 31 points per game (86.0 to 54.7).

Colorado's 38 points allowed against WSCU were its fewest in an exhibition since the Buffaloes beat Colorado Mines 58-31 in 2007. The 49-point margin was the most in an exhibition since the Buffaloes

defeated Spartak Moscow 115-55 in 2002.

The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU's exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams.

BUFFS PICKED NINTH: Coming off its first 20-win season in eight years, Colorado was picked to finish ninth in the Pac-12 in 2013, according to the league's annual Preseason Coaches Poll and Media Poll.

In the Coaches Poll, 2012 NCAA Women's Final Four participant Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12, compiling the maximum amount of points (121) and first place votes (11) possible. 2012 Pac-12 runner-up and NCAA participant California claimed the other first place vote and was second in the poll (109). UCLA was third with 100 points followed by USC (91), Arizona State and Oregon State (67), Utah (56), Washington (54), Colorado (49), Washington State (40), Oregon (20) and Arizona (18).

Colorado's ninth place preseason rating is its highest in the last nine years since Buffaloes were picked to finish seventh in the 2004-05 Big 12 Coaches Poll.

The Media Poll was nearly identical in order. Stanford was picked to win with 12 first place votes and 166 total. California was second with 155 points and two first place votes. UCLA was third (136) followed by USC (123), Oregon State (106), Arizona State (100), Washington (80), Utah (72), Colorado (57), Washington State (47), Oregon (25) and Arizona (22).

MEDIA TABS JEFFERY: Along with picking the order of Pac-12 finish, the media selected a preseason All-Pac-12 team. Senior guard Chucky Jeffery was one of six individuals selected, along with California's Layshia Clarendon, Washington's Jazmine Davis, Stanford's Chiney Ogwumike, UCLA's Markel Walker and Arizona's Davellyn Whyte.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 377-128 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.747). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 24 of 35 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado's regular season schedule will feature at least 11 regionally or nationally televised games in 2012-13. Colorado will play nine regular season games on the Pac-12 Networks, and a guaranteed one, and potentially more, during the Pac-12 Tournament, March 7-10, in Seattle.

A program-best six regular season games will be televised nationally while three more will be on one of the regional networks. CU's first Pac-12 Tournament game will also be televised nationally, as would any ensuing round through the championship game, which will air Sunday, March 10, on ESPN2.

CU made its first television appearance on Dec. 11 at Denver on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain. The Buffaloes made their Pac-12 Network on Jan. 4 against defending league champion Stanford; their first of four straight televised games on the network. Colorado will have five straight road games televised beginning with Utah on Jan. 13, through a Super Bowl Sunday matchup at USC on Feb. 3. CU's final regular season televised game will be Feb. 8 at home against Oregon State.

Entering the 2012-13 season, CU has appeared on 99 regional or national telecasts over the previous 11 seasons.

BOULDER – Brittany Wilson's clutch free throw shooting and Arielle Roberson's overall play pushed Colorado past Idaho 70-65 on Sunday in the Buffaloes' season-opener at the Coors Events Center.

Wilson, a junior guard, finished with a game-best 18 points, including four free throws in the final 18 seconds, while Roberson added 16 points. Idaho (0-2) had three players in double figures, led by Alyssa Charlson's 16.

Roberson, a 6-1 forward, redshirted her freshman season due to rehabilitation from hip surgery. CU coaches believed her return would boost the Buffs inside play as well as their overall defense - and they were correct. In addition to her 16 points, Roberson collected six rebounds and added five steals and two blocked shots in her CU debut.

Senior point guard **Chucky Jeffery** missed the opener, serving a suspension because of a violation of team rules. Had she not been in the lineup last season against Idaho, the Buffs would have been in trouble.

With the Vandals up 59-58 with just over 2 minutes remaining in last season's meeting, Jeffery went on a tear, scoring seven of her career-best 30 points to rescue the Buffs, 68-59.

But CU would have to do without Jeffery this time around - and her teammates coped pretty well.

Idaho's Ali Forde scored the game's first points, but the Vandals' 2-0 lead was erased by a Meagan Malcolm-Peck 3-pointer. Roberson took over from there, scoring CU's next six points. Malcolm-Peck and Brittany Wilson combined for 10 of the next 15 points as the Buffs built an 11-point (25-14) cushion.

The Vandals wouldn't go away; an 11-2 run over the first half's final 6 minutes brought them to within two (27-25) on a layup by Charlson. But the Buffs righted themselves and got field goals by Jasmine Sborov and Rachel Hargis to lead 31-26 at intermission.

CU shot 46 percent from the field (12-of-26) in the first half to Idaho's 34 percent (9-of-26). The Buffs held an 18-16 edge on the boards, but also turned the ball over one more time than the Vandals (11-10).

Behind the three-point shooting of Lexy Kresl and Roberson's inside work, the Buffs built a pair of eight-point leads in the first 6 minutes of the second half. Kresl drained a pair of treys during that span, marking her 19th career game with two or more three-pointers.

The Vandals weren't lacking for long-distance shooters. They got treys from Connie Ballestero, Christina Salvatore and Stacey Barr to creep to within four (43-39) with 14 minutes to play.

Thanks to Roberson, CU was able to pull away before Idaho could fashion its next run. She scored consecutive baskets to restore a double-digit Buffs lead (54-44), but the Vandals weren't folding.

They closed to 56-50 on a conventional three-point play by Charlson and a trey by Krissy Karr, then to 56-52 on another basket by Charlson with just over 5:30 remaining. Another three-pointer by Karr less than 2 minutes later pulled Idaho to three back (58-55), but CU answered with one of two free throws by Roberson and an Ashley Wilson layup to go ahead 61-55.

The Vandals answered on three of four free throws by Charlson to cut their deficit to 61-60 with 3:04 remaining. Ashley Wilson responded to those with another layup for a 63-60 CU lead. After an Idaho miss and a CU rebound, Jen Reese hit a pair of foul shots to put the Buffs up 65-60 with 51.6 seconds to play, and Roberson followed by hitting one of two free throws 11 seconds later for a 66-60 CU advantage.

Idaho called timeout with 37.2 seconds remaining, then another with 22.5 showing after the Vandals couldn't get off a shot. When they did, they missed, but a pair of flagrant fouls was called. Brittany Wilson and Charlson each their free throws (68-62), then Barr hit a long trey to draw the Vandals to within 68-65.

With 13.8 seconds left, Brittany Wilson's pair of foul shots gave the Buffs their final five-point advantage.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. - One freshman forward started, one finished. No matter the order of appearance the recipe provided a winning combination for Colorado.

Arielle Roberson and **Jamee Swan** combined for 37 points on 71 percent shooting as Colorado defeated Missouri-Kansas City, 78-55, Sunday afternoon at the Swinney Recreation Center on the UMKC campus.

Colorado improved to 2-0, claiming its 15th straight win over nonconference regular season opponents dating back to 2010. UMKC drops to 2-2.

Swan, making her first career start, scored 10 of her 14 points in the first half to give the Buffaloes a good start. After picking up her third foul early in the second half, Roberson stepped in scoring 19 of her game-high 23 points in the last 20 minutes.

Roberson was 9-of-12 from the field, hit all five free throw attempts and grabbed six rebounds. Swan was 6-of-9 from the floor had three rebounds and an assist.

The freshman front court duo helped the Buffaloes dominate in the paint, outscoring the Kangaroos 42-14 inside.

"I give all the credit to my teammates," Roberson said. "We knew coming out of the locker room we needed to push the ball and run more, really turn it up in the second half."

Roberson and Swan were the beneficiaries of a Colorado offense that picked apart the UMKC zone; putting on a passing clinic from all five positions. The Buffaloes had 17 assists on 32 made shots and overall shot 47 percent for the game.

That offense ran through forward **Jen Reese** and center **Rachel Hargis**. Playing in the high post, Reese and Hargis continually made the right pass, either finding Roberson and Swan on the low block or dishing out to continue through the guards.

Officially the two combined for six assists, but their initial reads led to plenty of good looks for the Buffaloes all afternoon.

Reese also had 10 points on 5-of-8 shooting with eight rebounds. Hargis made 3-of-4 field goals finishing with eight points.

"Our four post players, Arielle, Rachel, Jamee and Jen really dominated the game," CU head coach Linda Lappe said. "They really understood what we were trying to do in our zone offense. I thought they did a fantastic job of being a presence on the inside."

After Lauren Dudding put UMKC up with a 3-pointer on its initial possession, Colorado scored nine straight including two buckets from Swan.

UMKC briefly took the lead with a 7-0 run of its own for a 10-9 advantage six minutes in. Roberson and Swan had back-to-back scores to put CU up for good.

The Kangaroos kept CU close early. Eilise O'Connor scored eight of her 10 points in the first half as UMKC pulled to within two at 18-16, but then the Buffaloes went to work. Colorado scored on five of its next six possessions during an 11-0 run to take a 29-16 lead. Hargis had a three point play and Roberson and Reese each scored on put-backs off CU misses.

Offensive rebounding was key for the Buffaloes, grabbing 19 which led to 22 second chance points. Overall Colorado enjoyed a 44-29 advantage on the boards.

Colorado led by nine at the half (36-27). UMKC's Kim Neziyanya quickly converted conventional 3-point play to cut the CU lead to six, and also gave Swan her third foul. From there Roberson shined.

The San Antonio native scored 14 points in the first six minutes of the half as the Buffaloes began to pull away. She scored six in a row as CU rebuilt a double-digit lead at 46-35. After a pair of Hailey Housee free throws, CU put the game away with a 13-0 run. Following a Reese jumper and a transition layup from **Lexy Kresl**, Roberson scored the next seven as the Buffaloes won their fifth straight nonconference regular season game away from Boulder.

Neziyanya led UMKC with 17 points and eight rebounds.

BOULDER - What started as a bit of a struggle ended in an impressive stroll Saturday night for the University of Colorado women's basketball team.

The unbeaten Buffaloes (4-0) found their groove midway through the first half and stayed with it the rest of the way, overrunning San Diego State 67-53 to win the Omni Classic at the Coors Events Center.

CU has won 16 of its 26 in-season tournaments, which for 22 years was called the Coors Classic.

Three CU players reached double figures, topped by redshirt freshman **Arielle Roberson's** 17 points. Sophomore **Jen Reese** added 14 and senior Chucky Jeffery 12. Reese also grabbed a game-best nine rebounds, while Roberson added seven.

Roberson was named the tournament's MVP, an award Jeffery had claimed the past two years. Joining both of the all-tournament team were Auburn's Tyrese Tanner, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi's Janae Blount and San Diego State's Courtney Clements, who led her team Saturday night with 19 points.

Defeating the talented Aztecs, an NCAA Tournament last season, was a benchmark November win for the Buffs and third-year coach **Linda Lappe**. She acknowledged that it was her best non-conference win at CU, primarily because her team dealt with and overcame adversity against a physical opponent.

Said Lappe: "It was a great game throughout, two good teams and a lot of great players on that court. What we were able to do in the second half...it was not for the faint of heart. I enjoyed seeing our team step up to that level to win."

As Lappe has done after the Buffs' previous three wins, she pointed to her team's balance and depth in the post as keys in overtaking the Aztecs, who led by nine points in the early going. Along with the frontline productivity of Roberson and Reese, CU got eight points and three rebounds from Rachel Hargis and five points and three rebounds from **Meagan Malcolm-Peck**.

Lappe said she and her staff had challenged her frontline players to match San Diego State's physical play. "We challenged them before the game and they took it on...they were the difference makers."

The Buffs led 28-23 at halftime, but getting that five-point lead was difficult. When the Aztecs raced ahead 6-0, it doubled the largest deficit the Buffs had faced in their three previous games. And San Diego State wasn't content with that.

Over the next 5 minutes, the Aztecs built a 14-5 advantage and were limiting the Buffs' looks at the basket. But at the 13:19 mark, CU began to click - mainly because it thumbed up its defensive intensity and matched San Diego State's physicality.

"We were trying to force things," Roberson said. "I don't know if it was nerves or whatever, but we needed to get on the same page." Once that happened and the season's first test of adversity was passed, "It showed us who we really are. . . we're a tough team, they're a tough team."

At about the 6 minute mark, the Aztecs were 5-of-17 from the field - and that made field goal number included San Diego State hitting its first two baskets of the game.

The Buffs began creeping back into it and fashioned a 13-2 run. They finally caught the Aztecs at 16-16 on a Roberson follow of her own miss, then passed the visitors at 18-16 on a short Reese jumper.

In the half's final 2:15, CU outscored San Diego State 7-1 to take its five-point lead to the locker room. During that span, CU got its only two treys of the first 20 minutes, courtesy of Roberson and Malcolm-Peck.

A 5-0 run to open the second half gave the Buffs their largest lead of the game (33-23) - and they kept the pedal down. After the Aztecs closed to within six, a 7-2 CU spurt opened an 11-point advantage (42-31) with 13:02 to play. Reese was responsible for four of those points, with Jeffery converting a conventional three-point play for the others.

In the final 7 minutes, the Buffs led by as many as 15 - 67-52 in the final half minute - and the Aztecs never got closer than eight points.

BOULDER - Non-conference basketball schedules are all about preparing for the real thing - conference play. If a team can improve game-by-game, that's good. If it can remain unbeaten while improving, all the better.

The University of Colorado women's basketball team is doing both. The Buffs used a 9-0 run midway through the second half to pull away from Wyoming and win 68-59 on Wednesday night at the Coors Events Center.

"When you're not in your conference schedule, you want as many different scenarios as you can get," said CU coach **Linda Lappe**, whose team went to 5-0 and 3-0 at home this season. "We're starting to get that with this year's schedule. . . I feel we'll be prepared for whatever we see down the road."

What the Buffs saw from the previously unbeaten Cowgirls (4-1) was an opponent that runs its offense efficiently, was strong on the boards, goes to the rim often and still was shooting just over 40 percent from beyond the arc.

"We've seen a lot of good things from good teams," said CU senior guard **Chucky Jeffery**. "It's good because in the Pac-12 we'll be seeing a lot of different things from different things... (Wyoming) has some good three-point shooters. They ran a lot of pick-and-pops, which we haven't seen a lot, but we adjusted."

Jeffery's contributions were major; she recorded her 21st career double-double with 21 points and 10 rebounds in what Lappe called "kind of her breakout game so far...she's eased her way back in. It was good to see her play and get into her flow. She was more aggressive and we needed her to be."

The Buffs also got double-figure scoring performances from **Arielle Roberson** (14) and **Jen Reese** (10), with **Lexy Kresl** adding eight.

With the exception of a 39-39 draw on the boards, CU held a statistical advantage in every other category. The Buffs outscored the Cowgirls 34-20 in the paint, 27-9 off of turnovers, 13-6 in second-chance points, 8-0 on fast breaks and 22-12 in bench productivity.

Lappe was particularly pleased with her team committing just 12 turnovers and converting the visitors' 18 errors into 27 points. "We made their turnovers count," Lappe said, adding that her team regained its composure in the second half and turned the ball over only five times.

Although far from perfect, the Buffs led most of the first half and were up 31-26 at intermission. They didn't shoot exceptionally well (40.6 percent) from the field, but their defense on the Cowgirls compensated for that.

"We came out a little slow," Jeffery said. "We were just not hitting our shots, not recognizing to get the ball inside. After we figured it out, we got it going."

Wyoming went almost 5 minutes between field goals to open the game and at the 5-minute mark, the Cowgirls had hit only two field goals and trailed 10-4. But the Buffs encountered their own cold spell shortly thereafter and the visitors quickly caught up.

The Cowgirls tied the score at 15-15 on a three-pointer by Kaitlyn Mileto, who scored a team-high 16 points, then went up 18-15 - their first lead since 2-0 - on another trey by Ashley Sickles. But a 9-4 run to close out the half gave the Buffs their five-point advantage at intermission.

The Cowgirls took a pair of three-point leads early in the second half before the Buffs settled down and took control with their 9-0 run. Trailing 43-42, CU got a three-pointer from Kresl, a conventional three-point play from Roberson and a three-ball from Brittany Wilson to go up 51-43 with 11:55 to play.

When that 9-0 spurt extended to 15-4, the Buffs were in command. Wyoming pulled as close as four points a couple of minutes later, but never threatened again. CU increased its lead to as many as 14 points in the final 7 minutes.

Teams' identities change yearly, and Lappe said this CU team's second-half focus is much better than last. "We've come out with the right focus in the second half and we have some confidence in us. I think that is where your experience comes into play. We have experienced players on the floor that have been in those situations, and they've been able to provide whatever the needs, at whatever point. I think you definitely saw that tonight."

BOULDER - More challenging times are ahead for the Colorado women's basketball team, but the Buffaloes appear to be steeling themselves for whatever comes their way.

Unbeaten CU (7-0) rolled past Colorado State 72-46 on Wednesday night in the first game of a women's/men's doubleheader at the Coors Events Center.

All things considered, it was a night for fun and frolic - but next week promises to bring the degree of difficulty to a higher level. The Buffs are off until Tuesday (7 p.m.) when they travel to the University of Denver (3-3), then host No. 8 Louisville (8-1) on Friday (7 p.m.) in their most significant challenge to date.

CU took command Wednesday night with an 18-4 first half run, led 37-17 at halftime and cruised past CSU (2-5) in the final 20 minutes. Buffs coach **Linda Lappe** used 12 players and nine of them scored, topped by **Brittany Wilson's** 13. **Jen Reese** and **Jamee Swan** contributed 11 each and **Arielle Roberson** added 10. CU's bench outscored CSU's 33-5.

"Sometimes these games are a little bit tough to play but I felt like we got better in that game at some different things and that's what I like about our team," Lappe said. "For us, it's all about us right now and us continuing to get better. It's about us continuing to get better at some things or multiple things. I thought our players played hard and rebounded very, very well in this game."

Momentum gained from the Buffs' 69-62 comeback weekend win at Illinois obviously carried into mid-week. CU outscored CSU 59-26, outscored the visitors 30-18 in the paint and had 20 second-chance points to CSU's two.

The Buffs, who won 64-55 last season in Fort Collins, trailed once in the first half (2-0), but thereafter took control and led by 20 (37-17) at intermission. Following that two-point deficit, CU surged past CSU the 18-4 over the next 7 minutes to take a 16-point advantage (22-6) and never slowed down.

"We felt like we had to come out early, it's CSU, it's our rivalry game," Wilson said. "If we didn't punch them in the mouth we knew they would try to punch us first. Who doesn't get up for their rivalry game? We knew we had to come out strong in the beginning."

During that spurt, Brittany Wilson scored eight of her 10 first-half points, while Reese added five. At the 11:45 mark, the Buffs were shooting 53.3 percent (8-for-15) from the field while holding the Rams to 21.4 percent (3-for-14).

"Going in we knew we had to have an inside presence," Reese said. "No matter if they were sagging in, double-teaming and stuff like that we had kick-outs, I think everyone in the post did a great job on either making the shot or seeing the open player."

After CU's opening run to go ahead by 16, CSU never got closer than 11 points for the rest of the half. And the Buffs kept pouring it on, leading by 20 twice before the halftime buzzer.

Roberson, a three-time recipient of the Pac-12 Conference freshman of the week award in the season's first four weeks, added eight points to the Buffs' half-time total. She entered the game with an 18.5 average.

CU's second-half goal likely was to not lose interest and allow a CSU run. Mission accomplished. A "B-Wif" three-pointer and a **Rachel Hargis** layup on a nice fast break assist from **Chucky Jeffery** fashioned a 25-point lead (42-17) before the second half was 2 minutes old.

Less than 8 minutes later, after treys on consecutive possessions by freshman Lauren Huggins, senior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** and another by Huggins, the Buffs had pushed ahead by 30 (61-31).

The second half was only half done, but it was time for the Rams to say goodnight.

DENVER - The unbeaten University of Colorado women's basketball team shook off a lethargic start, took control with an 8-0 run and never looked back in dispatching the University of Denver 83-63 here Tuesday night.

Now the Buffaloes can look ahead. Finally, they can focus on their biggest non-conference game - a Friday night date with No. 8 Louisville at the Coors Events Center. The Cardinals are 9-1, with their lone loss by one point (48-47) to archrival Kentucky.

"We feel really good with where we're at," CU coach **Linda Lappe** said of her team's 8-0 start. "We've seen a little of everything. Obviously Louisville will present a few different things we haven't seen and a different level of talent. But we're excited for it; it should be a really fun game. Hopefully we can get a crowd there. Our players have really been looking forward to this for a long time."

In winning for the only second time in Denver against the Pioneers, the Buffs got a season-high 19 points from **Brittany Wilson** and 14 points and 11 rebounds from **Chucky Jeffery**. Leading scorer **Arielle Roberson**, who entered the game with a 17.3-point average, added 11.

Morgan Van Riper-Rose kept the Pioneers close with 13 first-half points. She finished with a career-high 28.

DU defeated CU 70-69 in their most recent Magness Arena matchup on Nov. 16, 2010. The Buffs lead the series 6-2 and won for the third time this season against a Front Range opponent. Before making the trip down I-25 South, CU had beaten Wyoming (68-59) and Colorado State (72-46) in Boulder.

Tuesday's first half produced 11 lead changes, but they all occurred in the first 10 minutes. DU (4-5) took advantage of CU's sluggish start to go ahead by as many as five points (13-8) before the visitors roused themselves.

"It shouldn't have been like that, because it shows that we weren't ready," Jeffery said. "It should be flipped because (Louisville) was on our minds. We have to be prepared."

If it took a little longer for the Buffs to focus, once they got there they took command and made an 18-17 deficit their last of the game. They went on an 8-0 run, getting baskets from **Jamee Swan**, Roberson (her first of the game), Jeffery and Brittany Wilson on a fast-break assist from Jeffery to go up 25-18 at 6:22 before intermission.

From there until the halftime buzzer, CU increased its lead to 10 on two occasions and led 37-27 at the break. CU outscored DU 9-1 to open the second half and surge ahead 46-28. The Buffs didn't allow the Pioneers their first field goal of the last 20 minutes until the 14:07 mark.

A minute later, CU went up by 23 and wouldn't allow DU within 15 points the rest of the night. The Buffs led by as many as 26 points in the final 4 minutes.

Lappe said the surge to open the final 20 minutes was "the key to the game... we got kick started toward the end of the first half and I really enjoyed how we came out of halftime."

She also enjoyed her team getting 50 rebounds for a second consecutive game. The Buffs out-boarded the Pioneers 50-28.

"That's probably the best thing I can say about our team tonight," Lappe noted. "We don't take that lightly. Rebounding takes a lot of heart, character and effort. I really liked how our posts crashed the offensive glass and we were constantly trying to get second- and third-chance points. And we were doing a great job keeping them off the glass. We're extremely happy with our rebounding."

CU outscored DU 32-12 in the paint and got 13 second-chance points to the Pioneers' three. The Buffs committed 13 turnovers and scored 19 points off of the home team's 19 errors. And CU's bench outscored DU's 30-12.

When the Buffs finally got engaged, the night turned easy. But Lappe and her players know a slow start on Friday night doom them. The ante goes up against Louisville.

BOULDER – Competing as a member of the Top 25 is a relatively new experience for the Colorado women's basketball team – and that inexperience might have showed early on Saturday afternoon.

But by the end of the first half, the No. 25 Buffaloes had settled in and were playing the part of a nationally ranked team. Using a 23-3 run to close the first 20 minutes, CU took full control and crushed Utah Valley 81-45 at the Coors Events Center.

The win was the 700th in the women's program's history and kept the Buffs unbeaten (10-0) this season. It was their 23rd straight victory in regular-season non-conference games and gave them a 30-3 non-conference record under third-year coach **Linda Lappe**.

"It's exciting to know where we are at this point," Lappe said. "It's good to go into a break without a loss...there haven't been a lot of upsets in the last week or so; we wanted to make sure that wasn't us."

The Buffs, she said, finally "got a feel for the game" after their shaky start and eventually "did nice things in spurts" – such as hitting the open player on offense and showing intensity on defense.

The gnarly defense was particularly apparent in the first half; Sammie Jensen, Utah Valley's leading scorer (17.7 average) and the Great West Conference player of the year in 2011-12, was held scoreless in the first 20 minutes and finished the game with nine points.

Benefiting from finding open spots and getting crisp passes from her teammates, CU's **Jen Reese** led all scorers with a career-high 16 points. She got help from **Chucky Jeffery** (12), **Brittany Wilson** (11) and **Arielle Roberson** (10).

The Buffs never trailed, but despite jumping to a 7-0 lead they didn't open like a Top 25 team. Jeffery said the Buffs were so intent on not letting their first national ranking since 2008 affect their play that it probably did to start the game.

"We have little distractions here and there and we were able to pull through," she said. "So that was a good thing."

The Wolverines caused some difficulties with their matchup zone defense and switching man-to-man. "Going in, we were ready but we were a little frantic in the beginning," said Reese, who hit six of her 10 field goal attempts and was four-of-five from the free throw line. "We just had to calm down. We knew they would switch (defensively), so it was more of us just hurting ourselves."

But the Buffs' defense also presented big problems for the Wolverines. Lappe said her team's "D" kept us in the game...we were very solid. We wanted to hold them to 45 points and we did that. It just took a little time for our offense to catch fire and we did that with transition baskets."

Four consecutive free throws by Reese with 8:03 left before intermission opened a seven-point lead (18-11). And with that, the Buffs were off and running. Finishing the half with its 23-3 run, CU led 37-14 at intermission.

The Buffs didn't ease off in the second half, going up by 31 (59-28) on a three-pointer by Wilson with 12:55 remaining, then getting a layup by **Rachel Hargis** (nine points, seven rebounds) to extend the lead to 33 (61-28) about 40 seconds later. They led by as many as 36 twice in the final 4:30.

Tina Doughty led Utah Valley (4-10) with 13 points and was the only Wolverines player in double figures. Utah Valley shot only 16.7 percent (4-for-24) from the field in the first half and finished the game at 30.6 percent (15-of-49).

Meanwhile, once the Buffs got untracked, they hit 15 of their 34 first-half field goal attempts (44.1 percent) and were at 47.9 percent (34-of-71) for the afternoon. CU outscored Utah Valley 48-20 in the paint and 16-4 on fast breaks. The Buffs converted 16 Wolverines turnovers into 20 points, committed a season-low six turnovers themselves, and outbounded the visitors 47-30.

BOULDER – Non-conference play is in the rearview mirror, perennial power Stanford is in the headlines. The Colorado women's basketball team contends it is primed and pumped to open work next week in the Pac-12 Conference, and CU sophomore guard **Lexy Kresl** says the Pac-12 had best be primed and pumped for the Buffaloes.

On Saturday, Kresl was that and more - and the more being looser, more confident on offense and devilish on defense. She tied a career-high with 20 points, hitting all five of her three-point attempts and tying a school record as No. 23 CU rolled past New Mexico 84-39 at the Coors Events Center.

The victory pushed the Buffs to 11-0 in non-conference play for the second consecutive season and gave third-year coach **Linda Lappe** her 100th career win. Lappe is 100-66 overall and 50-30 at CU.

Never mind the possible implications for the Buffs; Lappe says her team is "as prepared as we can be" to begin conference play. "I can't think of many things we're not prepared for...we haven't faced a ton adversity, but we have veteran players who have. We've been tested at home, on the road. We feel confident in any venue. But it's all about us and what we do, executing what we do...if we play with the intensity and composure we did tonight then I feel confident we're ready for the conference season."

UNM coach Yvonne Sanchez, who saw her team drop to 8-5, said CU "took everything away from us and I credit them immensely. They're well-coached and they had a great game plan. We didn't execute well, but a lot of that has to do with what (CU) did to us."

And that damage was considerable. With Kresl primarily holding Lobos leading scorer Caroline Dublin (12.9 ppg) to five first-half points (seven total), the Buffs raced to a 39-21 halftime lead and never looked back.

CU's pace or intensity didn't slow in the second 20 minutes either. The Buffs opened the last half with a 17-2 run - Kresl scored eight in that spurt - and pushed ahead 56-23. Keeping the pedal firmly down, CU led by as many as 47.

Also in double figures were redshirt freshman **Arielle Roberson** (18), senior **Chucky Jeffery** (11) and sophomore **Jen Reese** (10). Jeffery flirted with the third triple-double of her career. In 27 minutes she finished with eight assists and eight rebounds to go with her 11 points.

The Buffs shot 50.8 percent for the game (32-of-63) and held the Lobos to 30.2 percent (16-of-53). CU outbounded the visitors 42-31, owned a 40-16 advantage in the paint and converted 23 UNM turnovers into 28 points. The Buffs committed 13 turnovers, but the Lobos got only nine points from those errors. And off-setting CU's miscues were a season-high 18 steals.

Kresl, who had totaled 20 points in her previous three games, had 12 at half-time Saturday for a season high. She followed with eight in the Buffs' early second-half run, missing only one of her eight attempts from the field and hitting her only free throw attempt.

"I don't exactly feel like my role this year is to be the leading scorer," she said. "I am more than happy to see my other teammates score and I love passing them the ball. (Saturday) I think I just felt comfortable with my shot. It felt more natural and in rhythm."

Roberson called participating in Lappe's 100th win "definitely positive for us. We got to see we helped her get there. It was a great landmark for all of us... I was just proud to see her get recognized."

Earning her 100th career "W" was "nice," said Lappe. "It's not something you focus on as a coach; you don't ever say, 'I can't wait until I get to 100 wins.'"

Nonetheless, she added, reaching 100 is a tribute to the players, assistant coaches and staff members who have had hands in the milestone. "I obviously hope there are a lot more hundreds after this one, but it is good and I'm happy that our team can experience success...we're going in the right direction, I think."

BOULDER - Thanks to a strong second-half surge, the Colorado women's basketball team secured a 57-43 Pac-12 Conference win over Arizona State Friday night at the Coors Events Center.

Senior guard **Chucky Jeffery** earned her 24th career double-double and her fourth of the season with 19 points and 16 rebounds. Her rebound total was also a team season-high.

Redshirt freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** earned a career-high 11 rebounds and contributed seven points of her own. Overall, Colorado out-rebounded Arizona State 47-31.

"Like any Pac-12 game, it was very physical down there," Roberson said. "It's always a war, it's always a battle ... But we knew we had to box out and then go get the rebounds, not just let them try to come to us."

Forward **Jen Reese** and guard **Lexy Kresl**, both sophomores, added eight points each.

Strong defense from both teams kept the score and shooting percentages low, as Colorado shot just 37.8 percent from the field but held the Sun Devils to 23.6 percent.

One of the goals for Colorado was to keep ASU players from scoring around the rim. The Buffs executed that game plan well, forcing the Sun Devils to shoot 8-for-26 from beyond the arc.

"It was a very solid night defensively for us," said Colorado head coach **Linda Lappe**. "Knowing how Arizona State likes to score, they score a lot of baskets and layups at the rim, so one of our goals was to give up less than 10 layups. I think we gave them only a couple of wide-open layups."

The Buffs and the Sun Devils looked evenly matched in the first half as the lead changed seven lead times, but two three-pointers by Arizona State's Jada Blackwell and Haley Videckis put the Sun Devils up 26-22 at the half. Neither team shot particularly well in the first half, as CU was 32.1 percent from the field and ASU was 36.0.

After intermission, though, the Buffs found the energy they had been lacking. With 14:30 remaining, Colorado went on a 13-0 run capped by a Kresl three-pointer to go up 12 (44-32).

"We have to start fast and finish strong, that's our motto. We say that before every game," Jeffery said. "We just kept going. Once you attack them, you keep them on their heels a little bit."

The Buffs held onto the momentum from that point on, gaining their largest lead of the game, 17, on a Jeffery free throw with less than a minute remaining.

"Even when they started hitting some outside shots, we stayed steady," Lappe said. "We didn't panic, and I thought that allowed us to pull away in the second half."

Jeffery said part of what allowed the Buffs to pull away in the second half was recognizing ASU's key scorers and guarding them with more intensity. Videckis, who was the Sun Devils' leading scorer in the first half with 11 points, was shut out in the second half.

"I thought we did a much better job on (Videckis) in the second half, she hurt us a lot in the first half," Lappe said. "We barred down and knew where she was. Arielle (Roberson) got the assignment on her for a large part, Jen (Reese) guarded her for a little while, and our guards understood where she was in the second half as well."

The Buffs also showed their strength off the bench once again, as three non-starters — Reese, sophomore **Jasmine Sborov** and junior **Ashley Wilson** — scored a combined 14 points on the night.

With the win, Colorado improves to 14-2 overall and 3-2 in the Pac-12. The Sun Devils fall to 10-7 overall and 2-3 in conference play.
