Hargis had 10 as all 10 Buffaloes that saw game action scored at least four points.

Colorado dominated in every facet of the contest, and the game served as a good tune up to Sunday's official season opener.

Colorado shot 55 percent from the field and did it inside and out. The Buffaloes made 7-of-17 from 3-point range, led by Wilson who made her first three before settling on a 4-for-5 night.

"I just took the open shot," Wilson said. "They were open early from the three so I just took it."

The Buffaloes also controlled the paint, outscoring the Mountaineers 48-4 inside the key

"I was really proud of our effort," CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "There are going to be some things that we have to fine-tune both offensively and defensively, but our effort was there all night long on both ends of the floor.

Much like last year, the Buffaloes thrived in transition. CU scored 23 points off of 20 Western State turnovers. The Buffaloes also tallied 20 fast break points.

"I thought we ran the floor particularly well on the offensive side," Lappe said. "We really hit the open player tonight."

Colorado sprinted out to a 9-0 lead before Jazmine Johnson put Western State on the board with a bucket at the 15:38 mark. Desiree Smith, who led Western State with 12 points, hit a 3-pointer to cut the CU lead to 14-9 just over two minutes later.

But soon after the Wilson-Weston back court took over. Wilson answered Smith's 3-pointer with one of her own, and then scored on a fast break layup off a Mountaineer miss to put CU's lead back at double-digits.

Weston then got on the board for the first time with a long jumper, and followed that basket up with a fast break sprint of her own. A **Jen Reese** 3-pointer capped a 12-2 run as CU led 26-11 midway through the first half.

Weston's 14 points on 6-of-8 shooting led a Colorado bench that scored 39 on the evening.

"It was all my teammates," Weston said. "They found me when I was open and they set good screens for me to get me open...and pushing the ball down the floor is what I like to do."

Lappe raved about the overall team performance, but certainly liked what she saw with the Wilson-Weston backcourt tandem.

"I felt like (Kyleesha) and Brittany (Wilson) played well together as the one and the two," Lappe said. "I liked Kyleesha's tempo and what she did with the ball."

Smith converted a conventional 3-point play to bring Western State to 28-15 with 6:57 left in the half, but the Buffaloes shut down the Mountaineers from there. Western State made only one of its last six shots and had seven turnovers in the final 6:57 as Colorado ended the half on a 24-3 run to lead 52-18 at the break.

The Buffaloes shot well for the entire game, but even more so in the first half hitting 66 percent (21-of-32).

Colorado also shared the ball well dishing out 23 assists on the night, led by Kresl and **Jasmine Sborov**, each with five. The Buffaloes also outrebounded the Mountaineers 49-25. Seven different players had at least five boards for CU, Wilson and freshman forward Jamee Swan each had seven.

Colorado continued its defensive dominance in the second half. While the scoring cooled off after a torrid first-half pace, the Buffaloes allowed only three field goals in the second frame. The majority of Western State's points came from the foul line, as the Mountaineers hit 17-of-25 from the charity stripe.

AABOUT THE VANDALS: Idaho officially opened its season Friday night with an 86-53 setback at Wyoming. The Vandals shot just 29 percent from the field, just 19 percent from long range. Freshman forward Christina Salvatore led Idaho with 12 points in her collegiate debut. Fellow classmate Ali Forde had seven points and a team-best 11 rebounds.

The Vandals return three starters and six letterwinners from their

2011-12 squad which finished 12-20 overall and fourth place in the Western Athletic Conference at 6-8.

All-WAC forward Alyssa Charlston averaged 14.5 points and 8.8 rebounds as a sophomore last season. She ranked sixth in the WAC in scoring and fourth in both rebounding and field-goal percentage (.486). Sophomore guard Stacey Barr was second on the team in scoring in 2011-12 at 10.3 points per game, a mark that also ranked second among freshmen in the WAC. Point guard Krissy Karr averaged 6.9 points, 4.0 assists and 3.5 rebounds, earning WAC All-Freshman team honors a year ago.

Idaho played one exhibition game, defeating Western Oregon 93-62. Charlston had a perfect night, hitting all eight field goal attempts, leading the way for the Vandals at 21 points and seven rebounds.

THE SERIES: Colorado has won both meetings against Idaho, with both coming in Boulder. The first a 77-66 decision on Nov. 27, 1998, and the second coming just last season, a 68-59 triumph.

In last season's meeting, **Chucky Jeffery** scored a career high 30 points and grabbed 10 rebounds to lead the Buffaloes. Idaho held a one-point late in the game at 59-58, but Colorado scored the game's final 10 points, seven of which came from Jeffery. **Jen Reese** had 10 points and six rebounds off the bench for the Buffaloes. Alyssa Charlston led Idaho with 12 points and eight rebounds.

BUFFS IN OPENERS: Colorado is 33-5 (.868) all-time in season openers and will start the season with a home game for the 27th time in 39 seasons. Colorado is an outstanding 36-2 (.947) all-time in home openers. Colorado has never lost its overall season opener when played at home (26-0).

BOULDER – The University of Colorado women's basketball team moved to 7-0 for the first time since the 1993-94 season, but Sunday afternoon's seventh win might have been more difficult than the Buffaloes expected.

CU finally disposed of Idaho 68-59 at the Coors Events Center, but it took a late spark by junior point guard **Chucky Jeffery** to keep the Buffs unbeaten.

Jeffery scored seven of her career-best 30 points in the final 2:14 as CU overcame a 59-58 Idaho lead and dropped the Vandals to 2-6. Jeffery, who also collected 10 rebounds Sunday, had registered a then-career-high 26 points Wednesday against San Francisco.

The only other CU player in double figures was freshman post **Jen Reese** with 10. Idaho got 13 points from Keri Arendse and 12 each from Stacey Barr and Alyssa Charlston.

CU waited until the first half's final 2:43 to begin pulling away, outscoring Idaho 13-4 from that point until intermission to take its biggest lead, 42-33.

The Buffs' run came courtesy of four three-pointers by **Meagan Malcolm-Peck**, **Brittany Wilson** and a pair by Jeffery, who finished the half with 18 of her total. Her field goal shooting (7-of-10) carried CU, which with 11:36 before the break had hit just three of 16 from the field (18.8 percent).

And the Vandals, whose most recent loss before coming to Boulder was at home against Pac-12 member Washington (66-49), took advantage. Down by five (7-2) in the first 4 minutes, Idaho rallied to take its first lead (10-9) on a trey by Barr with 11:07 left in the half.

Less than 2 minutes later, CU reclaimed the advantage on a three-point play by Jeffery and held it until Arendse hit a field goal and one of two free throws on the next Vandals possession to go up 24-22. But that was Idaho's last of the half – but not the game.

The Vandals managed a pair of ties at 27-27 and 29-29 before the Buffs launched their three-point barrage to close out the half and take control.

After its frigid start, CU finished the first 20 minutes shooting 16-of-36 (44.4 percent), while holding Idaho to 13-of-35 (37.1 percent). The Buffs also committed eight first-half turnovers, which the Vandals converted into 13 points.

CU opened the second half with a quick pair of turnovers, allowed Arendse a three-pointer and Charlston a pair of free throws. Suddenly, that nine-point halftime lead was cut to 42-38.

Over the next 6:11, the Buffs got treys from Malcolm-Peck and Jeffery and went ahead 50-42. But the Vandals didn't roll over, closing to 53-50 on a three-pointer by Charlston, who then tied the score at 53-53 with a conventional three-point play with 7:46 remaining.

Arendse canned a pair of free throws to push Idaho ahead 55-53 – only CU's second second-half deficit of the season – but Brittany Wilson's three-pointer 30 seconds later pushed the Buffs back in front, 56-55, with 6:04 remaining.

The lead changed hands four times until Jeffery hit both ends of a one-and-one and followed with a jumper, giving CU a five-point cushion (64-59) with 1:23 to play.

An intentional foul sent Brittany Wilson to the free throw line with 58.8 seconds left, and after she hit one of two (65-59) Jeffery hit two of three in the next 15 seconds to put CU up 68-59 and out of danger with 32.3 seconds showing.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado improved to a perfect 23-0 in exhibition games with its 87-38 win over Western State University Colorado. The Buffaloes have outscored their exhibition opponents by just over 31 points per game (86.0 to 54.7).

Colorado's 38 points allowed against WSCU were its fewest in an exhibition since the Buffaloes beat Colorado Mines 58-31 in 2007. The 49-point margin was the most in an exhibition since the Buffaloes defeated Spartak Moscow 115-55 in 2002.

The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU's exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams.

BUFFS PICKED NINTH: Coming off its first 20-win season in eight years, Colorado was picked to finish ninth in the Pac-12 in 2013, according to the league's annual Preseason Coaches Poll and Media Poll.

In the Coaches Poll, 2012 NCAA Women's Final Four participant Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12, compiling the maximum amount of points (121) and first place votes (11) possible. 2012 Pac-12 runner-up and NCAA participant California claimed the other first place vote and was second in the poll (109). UCLA was third with 100 points followed by USC (91), Arizona State and Oregon State (67), Utah (56), Washington (54), Colorado (49), Washington State (40), Oregon (20) and Arizona (18).

Colorado's ninth place preseason rating is its highest in the last nine years since Buffaloes were picked to finish seventh in the 2004-05 Big 12 Coaches Poll.

The Media Poll was nearly identical in order. Stanford was picked to win with 12 first place votes and 166 total. California was second with 155 points and two first place votes. UCLA was third (136) followed by USC (123), Oregon State (106), Arizona State (100), Washington (80), Utah (72), Colorado (57), Washington State (47), Oregon (25) and Arizona (22).

MEDIA TABS JEFFERY: Along with picking the order of Pac-12 finish, the media selected a preseason All-Pac-12 team. Senior guard Chucky Jeffery was one of six individuals selected, along with California's Layshia Clendon, Washington's Jazmine Davis, Stanford's Chiney Ogumike, UCLA's Markel Walker and Arizona's Davellyn Whyte.

BUFFS EXPERIENCED FROM DEEP: While Colorado looks to achieve balance on its 2012-13 squad, there is no questioning its experience from shooting from the perimeter. The Buffaloes have four players with at least 50 career 3-point field goals, and all four rank among CU's career Top 20. Senior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** tops current Buffs with 80 and ranks 12th on CU's all-time list. Junior **Brittany Wilson** is 14th all-time with 70. **Lexy Kresl**, who set CU's freshman record in 2011-12 is 16th with 63. Senior **Chucky Jeffery** rounds out the current Buffs at 18th with 52.

JEFFERY MOVING UP CAREER LADDERS: Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** ranks among Colorado's all-time leaders in several categories. She is sixth in assists (358), ninth in steals (216), 12th in rebounds (667), 16th in blocks (57), 17th in field-goals made (456), 18th in scoring (1,218), 3-point field goals made (50) and free-throws

CU will make its first television appearance on Dec. 11 at Denver on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain. The Buffaloes make their Pac-12 Network debut on Friday, Jan. 4 against defending league champion Stanford; their first of four straight televised games on the network. Colorado will have five straight road games televised beginning with Utah on Jan. 13, through a Super Bowl Sunday matchup at USC on Feb. 3. CU's final regular season televised game will be Feb. 8 at home against Oregon State.

Entering the 2012-13 season, CU has appeared on 99 regional or national telecasts over the previous 11 seasons.
