THE GAME: No. 20 (AP)/25 (USAT) ranked University of Colorado opens the 2013 Pac-12 Conference season by hosting defending league champion and No. 4 (AP)/3 (USAT) ranked Stanford University on Friday, Jan. 4, at 8 p.m. at the Coors Events Center.

BROADCAST: Friday will mark the Pac-12 Network debut for the Buffaloes, their first of nine regular season games scheduled for the network. Anne Marie Anderson will handle play-by-play duties with Rosalyn Gold-Owunde providing the color commentary. Friday's game will be broadcast live on KKZN AM 760. Mike Rice will have the play-by-play with Carol Callan of USA Basketball providing the color commentary.

OPENING TIP: Of Colorado's 14 all-time wins over top 10 teams, three, and the most, have come against Stanford (1993, 2002 NCAA Tournaments, 1990-91 preseason).

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 11-0 for the fourth time in team history and the second-straight year after finishing the nonconference regular season with an 84-39 win over New Mexico on Dec. 29. The win clinched the Buffaloes' second consecutive perfect nonconference season, and third in school history (1992-93). Colorado is one of only three remaining unbeaten teams in

NCAA Division I joining No. 1 UConn and No. 3/4 Duke. Colorado will continue a string of 24 nonconference regular season wins into next season. The Buffaloes are 31-4 in the nonconference season under head coach **Linda Lappe**.

Colorado's offense has played well, averaging 74.3 points per game, ranking second in the Pac-12. The Buffaloes have improved that number to 79.5 points over the last four games, hitting the 80-point barrier in three of those four contests. CU is shooting 45 percent from the field, and 48 percent inside the 3-point arc. Colorado has shared the ball well averaging 15.3 assists per game, and it has come from a multitude of players. Seven Buffaloes are already in double-figures for assists through 11 games. Colorado also has held a sizeable advantage in rebounds (+14.4 rpg), and ranked sixth in NCAA Division I through games of Dec. 30.

Defensively, the Buffaloes are holding teams to 54.6 points per game on 34.2 percent from the field. Colorado ranks in the top five of the Pac-12 in 17 of 21 statistical categories, including second in scoring, rebounding defense (30.7 rpg), assists and turnover margin (+3.2).

Redshirt freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** leads Colorado and ranks seventh in the Pac-12 in scoring at 15.7 points per game. A three-time Pac-12 Freshman of the Week, Roberson also ranks second on the team in rebounding (6.1 rpg) and field-goal percentage (.521). She scored 18 points in the win over New Mexico, giving her a school record 11th consecutive game scoring in double-figures to begin her CU career. Along with her scoring success, Roberson ranks ninth in field-goal percentage, 11th in offensive rebounds (3.0 orpg), and 19th in overall rebounds on the Pac-12 leaderboard.

All-Pac-12 guard **Chucky Jeffery** leads the team in assists (4.7 apg), rebounds (8.2 rpg) and steals (2.6 spg), while ranking second in scoring (12.3 ppg). She has dished out 15 assists over the last two games (7.5 apg), recording a team-season high eight against New Mexico. Jeffery leads the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.7), and ranks fourth in assists, sixth in steals, seventh in overall rebounding, eighth in defensive rebounds (5.7 drpg) and free-throw percentage (.815), 14th in offensive rebounds (2.5 orpg) and 17th in scoring.

Junior guard **Brittany Wilson** has started all 11 games and ranks second on the team in steals (1.8 spg) and assists (2.6 apg) while coming in at fourth in scoring at 9.5 points per contest. She has

upped her scoring to 12 points over the last five games, including a season-high 19 points at Denver. Over that same span she has shot 48 percent from the floor (21-of-44), including 10-of-24 from 3-point range (.417). Wilson ranks 10th in 3-point field-goals made (1.4 3mpg) and percentage (.357) and 15th in assists and steals on the Pac-12 leaderboard.

Sophomore forward **Jen Reese** has made a successful return from an eye injury that kept her out of the final nine games of 2011-12. She is third on the team in scoring (10.5 ppg) and rebounding (5.9 rpg) while hitting 50.5 percent from the field and 76.9 percent from the free-throw line. She set a career-high with 16 points in the win over Utah Valley. Reese has scored in double-figures in seven of the last eight contests, averaging 11.8 points during that span. On the Pac-12 charts Reese is 12th in field-goal percentage and 25th in scoring.

Junior center **Rachel Hargis** joins Wilson as the only Buffs to start all 10 games. A career 33 percent shooter entering the season, Hargis has made the most of her opportunity hitting 52 percent (28-of-54) through 11 games. Hargis netted season-best totals with nine points and seven rebounds against Utah Valley. She also has 14 assists on the year, after registering just 17 in 35 games as a sophomore, and a team-best 14 blocked shots, ranking 11th in the Pac-12 (1.2 bpg). Hargis had a career- and team-season high seven blocked shots against Louisville, just one off the school single-game record.

Sophomore guard **Lexy Kresl** tied a career-high with 20 points in the win over New Mexico. She hit a perfect 5-of-5 from the 3-point arc which tied a school record for 3's made without a miss, matching Jenny Roulier who also hit 5-of-5 against Missouri on Feb. 13, 2002. She made her only attempt in the Utah Valley game, giving her a 6-of-6 streak over the last two games. Prior to Utah Valley she had made just 9-of-42 on the season (.214).

Colorado has seven players averaging between four and 12 points per game. Five different Buffaloes have led the team in scoring through the first 11 games.

ABOUT THE CARDINAL: Stanford is 11-1 overall and ranked No. 4 (AP) and 3 (USAT) in the latest top 25 polls. The Cardinal had a six-week run as the nation's top ranked team come to an end after dropping a 61-35 decision to Connecticut at home on Dec. 29.

Stanford leads the Pac-12 and ranks ninth in the country in field-goal accuracy at 48.1 percent. Stanford averages 72.3 points per game and leads the Pac-12 in scoring defense at 52.5 points per outing.

Junior All-America candidate Chiney Ogwumike leads the Pac-12 in scoring at 21.5 points per game and ranks second in rebounding at 12.8 boards per contest. She has a league-leading 10 double-doubles and also shoots 57.7 percent from the field. Senior forward Joslyn Tinkle is averaging 13 points per game and shooting 52.3 percent from the floor. Junior forward Mikaela Ruef tops the Cardinal in rebounding at 6.7 per game. Sophomore guard Amber Orrange paces Stanford at 4.9 assists per game while scoring 10 points per contest.

Hall of Fame head coach Tara VanDerveer is in her 27th year at Stanford with a record of 720-150. She is 872-201 overall in her 34th season as a collegiate head coach.

THE SERIES: This will be 12th meeting between Colorado and Stanford with the Cardinal holding a 7-4 edge. The Cardinal took the first two Pac-12 Conference meetings last season, an 80-54 win in Boulder on Jan. 14, and a 68-46 win at Stanford on Feb. 23. The series holds historical significance for the Buffaloes. Three of the first nine meetings came in the NCAA Tournament, with the Buffaloes winning two of those contests. Both of those NCAA wins, coming in 1993 and 2002, sent Colorado to the Elite Eight. Stanford's NCAA win came in the 1994 Sweet 16.

Linda Lappe is 0-2 against Stanford as a head coach. Tara VanDeveer is 7-4 against Colorado as a head coach.

NATIONALLY RANKED: Colorado debuted at No. 25 in the *USA Today Sports* Top 25 women's basketball coaches poll released on Tuesday.

Colorado is ranked in the coaches' poll for the first time since coming in at No. 24 in the final poll of the 2003-04 season (April 2004). That was also the last time the Buffaloes were ranked in both major women's basketball polls, finishing 17th in the final Associated Press poll that year.

Colorado moved up three spots to No. 20 in the latest AP poll released Monday.

The Buffaloes had received votes in the previous two coaches polls, finally cracking the top 25 Tuesday with 60 votes. This week's ranking marks the 152nd time Colorado has appeared in the coaches' poll dating back to the 1988-89 campaign.

In the AP poll, Colorado received 224 votes – up from 156 last week - to make its third-straight appearance and highest ranking since that No. 17 showing in the final AP poll of the 2003-04 season (March 15, 2004).

The Buffaloes have a long history of rankings in the AP poll, dating back to the 1980-81 season. This week's ranking marks the 161st time Colorado has appeared in the AP poll, trailing only Stanford, USC and UCLA among Pac-12 Conference schools. The current three-week run in the poll is the Buffaloes longest since a four-week stretch from Dec. 24, 2007-Jan. 14, 2008.

LAPPE AND COLORADO IN THE POLLS: Head coach **Linda Lappe** joined some elite company when the Buffaloes received their first AP ranking in five years. She is only one of eight NCAA Division I women's head coaches to have played for an AP ranked team, and then return to lead that same program into the AP poll. Overall she is the 31st person to play for and coach an AP ranked program.

STANFORD, Calif. – The Stanford sister tandem of Chiney and Nnemkadi Ogwumike accounted for 41 points as the No. 2 ranked Cardinal improved their home court winning streak to 77 games with a 68-46 Pac-12 Conference win over Colorado Thursday evening at Maples Pavilion on the Stanford campus.

Stanford, which clinched its 12th straight conference title one week ago, improves to 25-1 overall and 16-0 in league play. Colorado has dropped three straight and falls to 16-10 overall and 5-10 in the

Chucky Jeffery notched her sixth double-double of the season with 13 points and 13 rebounds. Lexy Kresl and Ashley Wilson each had nine points off the bench for the Buffaloes.

Colorado played a strong first half defensively, limiting Stanford to 32 percent from the field and forced 15 turnovers.

"We wanted to make sure we didn't back down," Colorado coach **Linda Lappe** said. "We weren't intimidated."

Despite their shooting woes, the Cardinal were able to get to the foul line and capitalized. The Buffaloes were called for 13 fouls in the first 20 minutes which resulted in 13 Stanford free throws. Nine of them alone came from Nnemkadi Oguwmike.

A Wilson layup with 11:12 remaining in the first half gave the Buffaloes a 12-11 lead. Chiney Ogwumike scored on a layup and older sister Nnemkadi hit three free throws to put the Cardinal up by four at 16-12. Jeffery cut Stanford's lead to two with a bucket, but Lindy La Rocque hit a 3-pointer and the Cardinal were able to widen their lead to 26-18 at the half.

Stanford hit their first five shots of the second half to spur a decisive 33-6 run, pushing its lead to 59-24 on pair of Joslyn Tinkle free throws.

Colorado stayed competitive though, getting 29 points from its bench with that crew closing the gap late. Kresl had seven of her nine points in that late run. **Jasmine Sborov** had six points and **Rachel Hargis** chipped in five.

Stanford had a sizeable advantage at the line, making 27-of-33 attempts. In contrast, Colorado was 8-of-12 on free-throw attempts.

Nnemkadi Ogwumike finished with 28 points and 11 rebounds. Chiney Ogwumike had 18 points seven rebounds and three steals.

The Buffaloes were ranked for 29 weeks during Lappe's playing career (1998-03) including 27 straight from Jan. 22, 2001 through the end of her junior year (March 11, 2002). CU's highest AP ranking during that span was No. 10, on March 4, 2002.

JEFFERY'S HEADLINER WEEK: Senior guard Chucky Jeffery led the Buffaloes to their first Associated Press ranking in five seasons and their first top-10 win in over 10 years, and as a result picked up some well-deserved conference and national recognition.

On Dec. 17, Jeffery was named the espnW National Player of the Week and Pac-12 Conference Player of the Week for the week of Dec 10-16. She also received national and Pac-12 Player of the Week honors from collegesportsmadness.com.

On Dec. 18, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) named Jeffery its Ann Meyers Drysdale Women's National Player of the Week.

Jeffery averaged 18 points, 9.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists while shooting 46 percent from the field and 80 percent from the free-throw line in wins over Denver and No. 8 ranked Louisville.

Against Louisville she had a game-high and personal season-best 22 points along with seven rebounds, four assists and one steal as the Buffaloes claimed their first win over a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 5 Stanford in the 2002 NCAA Sweet 16. Jeffery recorded season highs from the 3-point line (2-of-5) and the foul line (8-10) as she became the 16th player in team history to reach 1,300 career points.

Jeffery had 14 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and two steals in the road win over Denver on Dec. 11. She notched her second doubledouble of the season, and 22nd of her career, tying Sandy Bean (1978-82) for fifth on CU's all-time list.

Jeffery's Pac-12 Player of the Week honor is her second, as she received the same award on Dec. 5, 2011.

FAST OUT OF THE GATE: Colorado is 11-0 for the second straight year; its fourth start of 11-0. The Buffaloes began last season 12-0, tying the second-best mark in team history. CU's best start was a 15-0 mark to begin the 1992-93 season. Here is a break down of CU's 6-0 or better starts:

MORE ON THE BOARDS: Colorado ranked sixth in NCAA Division I in rebounding margin at +14.3 through games of Dec. 30, the second best mark in the Pac-12. The Buffaloes have either tied or led the rebounding battle in each game this season and have enjoyed double-digit margins in seven games. Over the last five games, Colorado has held a +19 rebounding margin.

The Buffaloes grabbed a season-high 59 rebounds in the win over Colorado State, their most since also recording 59 against Bowling Green on Nov. 23, 2001. CU had 24 offensive rebounds, nearly matching Colorado State's overall total (26). Colorado's 24 offensive rebounds were its most since it had 24 at Iowa State on Feb. 18, 1996.

Colorado's +33 advantage against the Rams tied for the ninth largest single-game margin in team history, most recently achieved against San Francisco on Nov. 30, 2011 (53-20).

Colorado had 50 rebounds against Denver, hitting the 50 mark for the second straight game for the first time since grabbing 50 against UC Irvine and 52 against Illinois-Chicago in the first two games of the 2009-10 season.

CU's 109 rebounds over a two-game span are its most since hitting the same number during the 2001 Coors Classic (59 vs. Bowling Green, 50 vs. Houston). The Buffaloes 46 offensive rebounds during that stretch are their most since grabbing 48 in back-to-back games in December 1994 (25 vs. Montana State, 23 vs. Notre Dame).

STRONG FINISHES: Colorado has benefitted from strong second half finishes, averaging 40 points per game while shooting 46 percent from the field. In first half action during that same stretch Colorado is averaging 34 points on 43 percent shooting. The Buffaloes are outscoring their opponent by 10 points per game in the second 20 minutes.

Colorado has scored at least 34 points in all 11 second periods this season and have hit 40 five times with a high of 46 at UMKC. The Buffaloes have scored 30 or more second half points in their last 16 games dating back to the 2012 Pac-12 Tournament.

SUCCESS ON THE ROAD: Colorado is 3-0 away from Boulder this season and is 12-7 in its last 19 true road contests since the tail end of the 2010-11 campaign. Prior to the start of this run, The Buffaloes had just five wins in their previous 37 road games dating back to the 2008 Big 12 Conference schedule.

The Buffaloes are averaging 76.7 points on 45 percent shooting in those three road contests. CU has also held its opponent to 60 points per game and enjoys a plus-14 rebound margin.

Colorado scored an overall season-high 83 points at Denver, the most in a true road contest since scoring 83 in a 3-point loss at Colorado State on Nov. 30, 2005. CU's 10-point halftime lead was its largest on the road since leading Colorado State 38-22 on Nov. 20, 2011

Colorado's win at Illinois was its first road win against a major conference opponent in a nonconference regular season game since defeating No. 20/17 ranked Vanderbilt, 62-51, on Dec. 9, 2007. The Buffaloes trailed by six at halftime against the Illini, allowing Colorado to claim its largest halftime deficit overcome to win on the road since defeating Missouri 80-79 in overtime on Feb. 23, 2010 after trailing by seven at the break (43-36).

Colorado's 23-point win at UMKC, was its biggest on the road since an 82-47 win at Colorado State on Dec. 1, 2007.

BENCH PRODUCTION: Colorado is getting good production from its bench to the tune of 25.2 points (34 percent) and 21.7 rebounds (48 percent) per game. Sophomore forward **Jen Reese** has headed the bench effort averaging 10.5 points and 5.9 rebounds, ranking third overall on the team in both categories.

Colorado scored a season-high 42 bench points in the win over UMKC. The bulk of those came from freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** who scored 23 points in 19 minutes on 9-of-12 from the field in her lone game off the bench this season. Her 23 bench points are tied for the second most in the past 10 years and her nine field goals are the most. Only Bianca Smith, with 25 points off the bench against San Jose State on Dec. 22, 1999, had a bigger bench game in the last 10 years.

ROBERSON DOMINATES PAC-12 HONORS: Forward **Arielle Roberson** has won the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week award three times this season. The Pac-12 has added Freshman of the Week to its weekly honors for the first time this season.

In her most recent award on Dec. 2, Roberson averaged 19.5 points on 72 percent from the field (13-of-18) and 71 percent from the foul line (12-of-17) in wins over Wyoming and Illinois. She scored a career and team season-high 25 points, including a critical, late, 3-point basket, to lead Colorado to a 69-62 road win at Illinois as the Buffaloes claimed their 19th straight regular season nonconference victory.

She hit 7-of-8 from the field against the Illini and sank a team season-high 10 free throws on 14 attempts. Roberson also had five rebounds, three steals and an assist against Illinois. Earlier in the week, Roberson netted 14 points on 6-of-10 from the field in the home win over Wyoming.

Roberson earned the inaugural Pac-12 Freshman of the Week award on Nov. 12 after scoring 16 points on 7-of-13 shooting with six rebounds, five steals, two assists and two blocks in her collegiate debut - a 70-65 win over Idaho on Nov. 11. Her second citation came on Nov. 26 after averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds en route to Omni Hotels Classic MVP honors.

Her three weekly conference awards in one season are the most since Brittany Spears won four Big 12 Conference Rookie of the Week honors in 2007-08.

ARIELLE & ANDRE: The Roberson's are the only brother/sister tandem on the 2012-13 basketball rosters from the same school in the Pac-12 Conference. They're one of five brother/sister tandems on 2012-13 basketball rosters in Division I. The Big Ten has two tandems, followed by one each in the ACC, Mountain West and the Pac-12 Conferences. CU has another brother/sister pair on the ski team with freshmen Maria and Gustav Nordstrom from Sweden.

BUFFS EXPERIENCED FROM DEEP: While Colorado looks to continue an inside-outside balance on its 2012-13 squad, there is no questioning its experience from shooting from the perimeter. The Buffaloes have four players with at least 50 career 3-point field goals, and all four rank among CU's career Top 20. Senior Meagan Malcolm-Peck tops current Buffs with 86 and ranks 11th on CU's all-time list. Junior Brittany Wilson is right behind Malcolm-Peck in 12th with 85. Lexy Kresl, who set CU's single-season freshman record in 2011-12 at 63 is 14th with 78. Senior Chucky Jeffery rounds out the current Buffs at 17th with 56.

JEFFERY MOVING UP CAREER LADDERS: Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** is within 10 assists and seven steals of moving into the career top five in both categories. She is currently sixth in assists at 405 needing 10 to catch Laurie Welch (1978-82) for fifth. Jeffery is tied for sixth with Annan Wilson (1989-93) in career steals at 242 needing seven to catch Amy Mathern (1989-93).

On CU's career charts Jeffery also ranks seventh in rebounds (749), 14th in scoring (1,340) and free-throws made (276), 15th in field-goals made (504), 16th and blocks (60) and 17th in 3-point field goals (56).

In other miscellaneous categories Jeffery is also tied with Sandy Bean (1978-82) for fifth in double-doubles (22), is seventh in double-figure rebounding games (24) and 13th in double-figure scoring games (73).

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado picked up its 14th all-time win over a top-10 ranked opponent with its 70-66 win over No. 8 Louisville on Dec. 14. The win marked the Buffaloes' first over a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 5 Stanford in the 2002 NCAA Sweet 16. It was the first top-10 win as an unranked team since knocking off No. 7 Texas Tech 63-49 on Jan. 11, 1997.

The win snapped a three-game slide against ranked teams as the Buffaloes improved to 3-5 against ranked opponents under Linda Lappe. CU improved to 62-142 all-time against ranked opponents, including a 38-45 mark at home.

The Buffaloes played just two games against ranked teams in 2011-12, both against Stanford. Colorado is on track to at least triple that number this year as Pac-12 rivals California, UCLA and Stanford have solid footing in both polls.

COLORADO BASKETBALL'S SOLID START: Colorado's men's and women's basketball teams each began the 2012-13 season at 6-0, before the men suffered their first loss of the season on Dec. 1 at Wyoming. It is the first time the men's and women's programs have both started with six or more wins since 1982-83 when both teams started 7-0.

OMNI HOTELS CLASSIC CHAMPS: Colorado improved to 42-10 all-time in its home holiday classic and has won four straight and 16 of the 25 tournament titles contested. The Buffaloes won this year's classic by defeating Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and San Diego State. Freshman forward Arielle Roberson was named the MVP after averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds over the two-game tournament. She is the first CU freshman to win that honor in the 26-year history of the tournament. Senior guard Chucky Jeffery was named to the Omni Classic All-Tournament team after averaging 13 points, 7.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals over the two games. She is the first four-time Omni All-Tournament team honoree, earning MVP honors in 2010 and '11.

BUFFS SIGN FOUR TO NLI's: Zoe Beard-Fails, Desiree Harris, Haley Smith and Briana Watts have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2013-14 head coach Linda Lappe announced on Wednesday, the first day of the NCAA's early signing period.

Beard-Fails is a 6-2 forward from Herndon, Va., and attends Georgetown Day School in Washington D.C. She missed all but five games of her junior year with an ACL and meniscus tear, but is nearing full strength as her senior season commences. The 51st rated forward in the nation according to ESPN.com's HoopGurlz, Beard-Fails averaged 27 points and nearly 18 rebounds as a sophomore for Georgetown Day in 2010-11, earning fourth team All-Met honors from the Washington Post.

Harris is a 5-8 guard from Oakland, Calif., who attends St. Joseph Notre Dame High school in Alameda. She averaged 23.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 2.7 assists as a junior, helping the Pilots to the North Coast Section championship. Harris was a CIF All-State Division V second team selection as well as a Bay Shore Athletic League second team pick.

Smith, a 6-0 wing from Sammamish, Wash., is getting ready for her senior season at Skyline High School. A do-it-all player for the Spartans, she averaged around seven points, five rebounds and just under two assists and steals per game as a junior. Smith is in her fourth varsity season with the Spartans and also has had a successful club career playing with the Tree of Hope program. ESPN.com's HoopGurlz has her as the top prospect in the state of Washington and the 20th ranked wing in the nation.

Watts, a 6-4 center from Fresno, Calif., will make her debut with Clovis West High School this winter after playing her first three years at rival Buchanan. She was the first commit of the 2013 class. Watts averaged nearly six points and just over six rebounds per game for Buchanan as a junior, contributing to the Bears' 18-9 record and a spot in the CIF Central Section Division I semifinals.

BUFFS IN OPENERS: With its win over Idaho, Colorado improved to 34-5 (.872) all-time in season openers and 37-2 (.949) in all-time home openers. The Buffs opened the season with a home game for the 27th time in 39 seasons, and moved to a perfect 27-0 in those instances.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado improved to a perfect 23-0 in exhibition games with its 87-38 win over Western State University Colorado. The Buffaloes have outscored their exhibition opponents by just over 31 points per game (86.0 to 54.7).

Colorado's 38 points allowed against WSCU were its fewest in an exhibition since the Buffaloes beat Colorado Mines 58-31 in 2007. The 49-point margin was the most in an exhibition since the Buffaloes defeated Spartak Moscow 115-55 in 2002.

The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU's exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams.

BUFFS PICKED NINTH: Coming off its first 20-win season in eight years, Colorado was picked to finish ninth in the Pac-12 in 2013, according to the league's annual Preseason Coaches Poll and Media Poll.

In the Coaches Poll, 2012 NCAA Women's Final Four participant Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12, compiling the maximum amount of points (121) and first place votes (11) possible. 2012 Pac-12 runner-up and NCAA participant California claimed the other first place vote and was second in the poll (109). UCLA was third with 100 points followed by USC (91), Arizona State and Oregon State (67), Utah (56), Washington (54), Colorado (49), Washington State (40), Oregon (20) and Arizona (18).

Colorado's ninth place preseason rating is its highest in the last nine years since Buffaloes were picked to finish seventh in the 2004-05 Big 12 Coaches Poll.

The Media Poll was nearly identical in order. Stanford was picked to win with 12 first place votes and 166 total. California was second with 155 points and two fi rst place votes. UCLA was third (136) followed by USC (123), Oregon State (106), Arizona State (100), Washington (80), Utah (72), Colorado (57), Washington State (47), Oregon (25) and Arizona (22).

MEDIA TABS JEFFERY: Along with picking the order of Pac-12 finish, the media selected a preseason All-Pac-12 team. Senior guard Chucky Jeffery was one of six individuals selected, along with California's Layshia Clarendon, Washington's Jazmine Davis, Stanford's Chiney Ogwumike, UCLA's Markel Walker and Arizona's Davellyn Whyte.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 375-126 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.749). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 23 of the previous 34 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed fi ve undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado's regular season schedule will feature at

least 11 regionally or nationally televised games in 2012-13. Colorado will play nine regular season games on the Pac-12 Networks, and a guaranteed one, and potentially more, during the Pac-12 Tournament, March 7-10, in Seattle.

A program-best six regular season games will be televised nationally while three more will be on one of the regional networks. CU's first Pac-12 Tournament game will also be televised nationally, as would any ensuing round through the championship game, which will air Sunday, March 10, on ESPN2.

CU made its first television appearance on Dec. 11 at Denver on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain. The Buffaloes make their Pac-12 Network debut on Friday, Jan. 4 against defending league champion Stanford; their first of four straight televised games on the network. Colorado will have five straight road games televised beginning with Utah on Jan. 13, through a Super Bowl Sunday matchup at USC on Feb. 3. CU's final regular season televised game will be Feb. 8 at home against Oregon State.

Entering the 2012-13 season, CU has appeared on 99 regional or national telecasts over the previous 11 seasons.

BOULDER - Brittany Wilson's clutch free throw shooting and Arielle Roberson's overall play pushed Colorado past Idaho 70-65 on Sunday in the Buffaloes' season-opener at the Coors Events Center.

Wilson, a junior guard, finished with a game-best 18 points, including four free throws in the final 18 seconds, while Roberson added 16 points. Idaho (0-2) had three players in double figures, led by Alvssa Charlston's 16.

Roberson, a 6-1 forward, redshirted her freshman season due to rehabilita tion from hip surgery. CU coaches believed her return would boost the Buffs inside play as well as their overall defense - and they were correct. In addition to her 16 points, Roberson collected six rebounds and added five steals and two blocked shots in her CU debut.

Senior point guard Chucky Jeffery missed the opener, serving a suspension because of a violation of team rules. Had she not been in the lineup last season against Idaho, the Buffs would have been in trouble.

With the Vandals up 59-58 with just over 2 minutes remaining in last season's meeting, Jeffery went on a tear, scoring seven of her career-best 30 points to rescue the Buffs, 68-59.

But CU would have to do without Jeffery this time around - and her teammates coped pretty well.

Idaho's Ali Forde scored the game's first points, but the Vandals' 2-0 lead was erased by a Meagan Malcolm-Peck 3-pointer. Roberson took over from there, scoring CU's next six points. Malcolm-Peck and Brittany Wilson combined for 10 of the next 15 points as the Buffs built an 11-point (25-14) cushion.

The Vandals wouldn't go away; an 11-2 run over the first half's final 6 minutes brought them to within two (27-25) on a layup by Charlston. But the Buffs righted themselves and got field goals by Jasmine Sborov and Rachel Hargis to lead 31-26 at intermission.

CU shot 46 percent from the field (12-of-26) in the first half to Idaho's 34 percent (9-of-26). The Buffs held an 18-16 edge on the boards, but also turned the ball over one more time than the Vandals (11-10).

Behind the three-point shooting of Lexy Kresl and Roberson's inside work, the Buffs built a pair of eight-point leads in the first 6 minutes of the second half. Kresl drained a pair of treys during that span, marking her 19th career game with two or more three-pointers.

The Vandals weren't lacking for long-distance shooters. They got treys from Connie Ballestero, Christina Salvatore and Stacey Barr to creep to within four (43-39) with 14 minutes to play.

Thanks to Roberson, CU was able to pull away before Idaho could fashion its next run. She scored consecutive baskets to restore a double-digit Buffs lead (54-44), but the Vandals weren't folding.

They closed to 56-50 on a conventional three-point play by Charlston and a trey by Krissy Karr, then to 56-52 on another basket by Charlston with just over 5:30 remaining. Another three-pointer by Karr less than 2 minutes later pulled ldaho to three back (58-55), but CU answered with one of two free throws by Roberson and an Ashley Wilson layup to go ahead 61-55.

The Vandals answered on three of four free throws by Charlston to cut their deficit to 61-60 with 3:04 remaining. Ashley Wilson responded to those with another lavup for a 63-60 CU lead. After an Idaho miss and a CU rebound, Jen Reese hit a pair of foul shots to put the Buffs up 65-60 with 51.6 seconds to play, and Roberson followed by hitting one of two free throws 11 seconds later for a 66-60 CU advantage.

Idaho called timeout with 37.2 seconds remaining, then another with 22.5 showing after the Vandals couldn't get off a shot. When they did, they missed, but a pair of flagrant fouls was called. Brittany Wilson and Charlston each their

free throws (68-62), then Barr hit a long trey to draw the Vandals to within 68-65. With 13.8 seconds left, Brittany Wilson's pair of foul shots gave the Buffs their final five-point advantage.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. - One freshman forward started, one finished. No matter the order of appearance the recipe provided a winning combination for Colorado. Arielle Roberson and Jamee Swan combined for 37 points on 71 percent shooting as Colorado defeated Missouri-Kansas City, 78-55, Sunday afternoon at

the Swinney Recreation Center on the UMKC campus. Colorado improved to 2-0, claiming its 15th straight win over nonconference regular season opponents dating back to 2010. UMKC drops to 2-2.

Swan, making her first career start, scored 10 of her 14 points in the first half to give the Buffaloes a good start. After picking up her third foul early in the second half, Roberson stepped in scoring 19 of her game-high 23 points in the last 20 minutes.

Roberson was 9-of-12 from the field, hit all five free throw attempts and grabbed six rebounds. Swan was 6-of-9 from the floor had three rebounds and an

The freshman front court duo helped the Buffaloes dominate in the paint, outscoring the Kangaroos 42-14 inside.

"I give all the credit to my teammates," Roberson said. "We knew coming out of the locker room we needed to push the ball and run more, really turn it up in the

Roberson and Swan were the beneficiaries of a Colorado offense that picked apart the UMKC zone; putting on a passing clinic from all five positions. The Buffaloes had 17 assists on 32 made shots and overall shot 47 percent for the game.

That offense ran through forward Jen Reese and center Rachel Hargis. Playng in the high post, Reese and Hargis continually made the right pass, either finding Roberson and Swan on the low block or dishing out to continue through the guards

Officially the two combined for six assists, but their initial reads led to plenty of good looks for the Buffaloes all afternoon.

Reese also had 10 points on 5-of-8 shooting with eight rebounds. Hargis made 3-of-4 field goals finishing with eight points.

"Our four post players, Arielle, Rachel, Jamee and Jen really dominated the game," CU head coach Linda Lappe said. "They really understood what we were trying to do in our zone offense. I thought they did a fantastic job of being a presence on the inside.'

After Lauren Dudding put UMKC up with a 3-pointer on its initial possession, Colorado scored nine straight including two buckets from Swan.

UMKC briefly retook the lead with a 7-0 run of its own for a 10-9 advantage six

minutes in. Roberson and Swan had back-to-back scores to put CU up for good.

The Kangaroos kept CU close early. Eilise O'Connor scored eight of her 10 points in the first half as UMKC pulled to within two at 18-16, but then the Buffaloes went to work. Colorado scored on five of its next six possessions during an 11-0 run to take a 29-16 lead. Hargis had a three point play and Roberson and Reese each scored on put-backs off CU misses.

Offensive rebounding was key for the Buffaloes, grabbing 19 which led to

22 second chance points. Overall Colorado enjoyed a 44-29 advantage on the

Colorado led by nine at the half (36-27). UMKC's Kim Nezianya quickly converted conventional 3-point play to cut the CU lead to six, and also gave Swan her third foul. From there Roberson shined.

The San Antonio native scored 14 points in the first six minutes of the half as the Buffaloes began to pull away. She scored six in a row as CU rebuilt a doubledigit lead at 46-35. BOULDER - Colorado had three players in double-digits and used a late run to pull away from Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, 75-48, in the second game of the 2012 Omni Hotels Classic at the Coors Events Center.

Colorado improves to 3-0 and will play San Diego State in Saturday's championship game set for 7:30 p.m. San Diego State defeated Auburn 78-57 in the first game. Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (0-5) will play Auburn in Saturday's consolation game at 5 p.m.

Freshman forward Arielle Roberson scored a game-high 16 points on 6-of-14 shooting. Senior guard **Chucky Jeffery** nearly missed a double-double with 14 points and nine rebounds. Sophomore **Jasmine Sborov** tied a career-best with 10

"I thought for the second straight game we had great contribution from every-body on our team," head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "They all did their job and they played their role. Many of them came in and gave us some great energy, whether it was to start the game, start the half, or when they came in off the bench. But I thought they did a fantastic job of really playing together."

Seven players had at least five points as the Buffaloes hit 70 for the third straight game to open the season. The Buffaloes also had seven players with three or more rebounds and six players with multiple assists.

"It's awesome," Jeffery said on her team's depth. "To have a number of players that can come off the bench and replace players on the floor without disrupting the flow is great. We know the game isn't going to change when we sub because we have confidence in getting the ball to our post players

The layups in the post weren't falling like they did in Kansas City last weekend, but the Buffaloes were able to hit the outside shot.

Sborov, making her first start of the season set the tone early for the Buffaloes. She scored all 10 of her points in the first half on 5-of-7 shooting, most on smooth looking 12-15 foot jumpers.
"Chucky [Jeffery] did a great job at drawing in the defense and I was just hitting

shots off of reversals and kick-outs," Sborov said. "We worked on that religiously in practice so I think that opened up a lot of our inside game in the second half."

The Buffaloes built a 35-24 halftime lead by scoring 11 points off turnovers and

turning in their best half from the line this year, hitting 8-of-10. CU shot below its season average of 44 percent, making just 12 of 30 in the

first 20 minutes, but Lappe lauded the team's ability to shake off the early misses and keep hammering away down low.

"I liked how we stayed composed tonight," Lappe said. "Our inside game wasn't going well at the beginning, but we were getting great shots. The thing I liked about tonight is that we didn't shy away from using our posts, our guards kept feeding the ball down there, they kept offensive rebounding, and they kept at it. When you do that, those easy shots are going to eventually fall."

Jeffery ran a solid point game, contributing four assists and four steals, and notably just one turnover against an aggressive Islanders defense. Colorado led by double-digits most of the game, but still only led by 10 when

Trish Amboree hit three free throws with 9:28 left to make the score 53-43.

Roberson responded with five straight points and Jeffery followed with a transition layup to put CU up 60-43. The Buffaloes ran from there, ending the game on a 22-5 run

Colorado dominated the boards, by a count of 49-23. Roberson had eight, Shorov had six.

Janae Blount led Texas A&M-Corpus Christi with 13 points and six rebounds. Ashley Darley pitched in 12.

BOULDER – What started as a bit of a struggle ended in an impressive stroll Saturday night for the University of Colorado women's basketball team.

The unbeaten Buffaloes (4-0) found their groove midway through the first half and stayed with it the rest of the way, overrunning San Diego State 67-53 to win the Omni Classic at the Coors Events Center.

 $\,$ CU has won 16 of its 26 in-season tournaments, which for 22 years was called the Coors Classic.

Three CU players reached double figures, topped by redshirt freshman Arielle Roberson's 17 points. Sophomore Jen Reese added 14 and senior Chucky Jeffery 12. Reese also grabbed a game-best nine rebounds, while Roberson added seven.

Roberson was named the tournament's MVP, an award Jeffery had claimed the past two years. Joining both on the all-tournament team were Auburn's Tyrese Tanner, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi's Janae Blount and San Diego State's Courney Clements, who led her team Saturday night with 19 points.

Defeating the talented Aztecs, an NCAA Tournament last season, was a

Defeating the talented Aztecs, an NCAA Tournament last season, was a benchmark November win for the Buffs and third-year coach Linda Lappe. She acknowledged that it was her best non-conference win at CU, primarily because her team dealt with and overcame adversity against a physical opponent.

Said Lappe: "It was a great game throughout, two good teams and lot of great players on that court. What we were able to do in the second half...it was not for the faint of heart. I enjoyed seeing our team step up to that level to win."

As Lappe has done after the Buffs' previous three wins, she pointed to her team's balance and depth in the post as keys in overtaking the Aztecs, who led by nine points in the early going. Along with the frontline productivity of Roberson and Reese, CU got eight points and three rebounds from Rachel Hargis and five points and three rebounds from Meacan Malcolm-Peck.

Lappe said she and her staff had challenged her frontline players to match San Diego State's physical play: "We challenged them before the game and they took it on...they were the difference makers."

The Buffs led 28-23 at halftime, but getting that five-point lead was difficult. When the Aztecs raced ahead 6-0, it doubled the largest deficit the Buffs had faced in their three previous games. And San Diego State wasn't content with that.

Over the next 5 minutes, the Aztecs built a 14-5 advantage and were limiting the Buffs' looks at the basket. But at the 13:19 mark, CU began to click - mainly because it thumbed up its defensive intensity and matched San Diego State's physicallity.

We were trying to force things," Roberson said. "I don't know if it was nerves or whatever, but we needed to get on the same page." Once that happened and the season's first test of adversity was passed, "It showed us who we really are . . . we're a tough team, they're a tough team."

At about the 6 minute mark, the Aztecs were 5-of-17 from the field - and that made field goal number included San Diego State hitting its first two baskets of the

The Buffs began creeping back into it and fashioned a 13-2 run. They finally caught the Aztecs at 16-16 on a Roberson follow of her own miss, then passed the visitors at 18-16 on a short Reese jumper.

In the half's final 2:15, CU outscored San Diego State 7-1 to take its five-point lead to the locker room. During that span, CU got its only two treys of the first 20 minutes, courtesy of Roberson and Malcolm-Peck.

A 5-0 run to open the second half gave the Buffs their largest lead of the game

A 5-0 run to open the second half gave the Buffs their largest lead of the game (33-23) - and they kept the pedal down. After the Aztecs closed to within six, a 7-2 CU spurt opened an 11-point advantage (42-31) with 13:02 to play. Reese was responsible for four of those points, with Jeffery converting a conventional three-point play for the others.

In the final 7 minutes, the Buffs led by as many as 15 - 67-52 in the final half minute - and the Aztecs never got closer than eight points.

BOULDER - Non-conference basketball schedules are all about preparing for the real thing - conference play. If a team can improve game-by-game, that's good. If it can remain unbeaten while improving, all the better.

The University of Colorado women's basketball team is doing both. The Buffs used a 9-0 run midway through the second half to pull away from Wyoming and win 68-59 on Wednesday night at the Coors Events Center.

"When you're not in your conference schedule, you want as many different scenarios as you can get," said CU coach Linda Lappe, whose team went to 5-0 and 3-0 at home this season. "We're starting to get that with this year's schedule. ... I feel we'll be prepared for whatever we see down the road."

What the Buffs saw from the previously unbeaten Cowgirls (4-1) was an opponent that runs its offense efficiently, was strong on the boards, goes to the rim often and still was shooting just over 40 percent from beyond the arc.

"We've seen a lot of good things from good teams," said CU senior guard Chucky Jeffery. "It's good because in the Pac-12 we'll be seeing a lot of different things...(Wyoming) has some good three-point shooters.

They can a lot of pick-and-page, which we haven't seen a lot but we adjusted."

Jeffery's contributions were major; she recorded her 21st career doubledouble with 21 points and 10 rebounds in what Lappe called "kind of her breakout
game so far...she's eased her way back in. It was good to see her play and get into
her flow. She was more aggressive and we needed her to be."

The Buffs also got double-figure scoring performances from Arielle Roberson (14) and Jen Reese (10), with Lexy Kresl adding eight.

With the exception of a 39-39 draw on the boards, CU held a statistical advantage in every other category. The Buffs outscored the Cowgirls 34-20 in the paint, 27-9 off of turnovers, 13-6 in second-chance points, 8-0 on fast breaks and 22-12 in bench productivity.

Lappe was particularly pleased with her team committing just 12 turnovers and converting the visitors' 18 errors into 27 points. "We made their turnovers count." Lappe said, adding that her team regained its composure in the second half and turned the ball over only five times.

Although far from perfect, the Buffs led most of the first half and were up 31-26 at intermission. They didn't shoot exceptionally well (40.6 percent) from the field, but their defense on the Cowgirls compensated for that.

"We came out a little slow," Jeffery said. "We were just not hitting our shots, not recognizing to get the ball inside. After we figured it out, we got it going."

Wyoming went almost 5 minutes between field goals to open the game and

Wyoming went almost 5 minutes between field goals to open the game and at the 5-minute mark, the Cowgirls had hit only two field goals and trailed 10-4. But the Buffs encountered their own cold spell shortly thereafter and the visitors quickly caught up.

The Cowgirls tied the score at 15-15 on a three-pointer by Kaitlyn Mileto, who

The Cowgirls tied the score at 15-15 on a three-pointer by Kaitlyn Mlieto, who scored a team-high 16 points, then went up 18-15 - their first lead since 2-0 - on another trey by Ashley Sickles. But a 9-4 run to close out the half gave the Buffs their five-point advantage at intermission.

The Cowgirls took a pair of three-point leads early in the second half before the Buffs settled down and took control with their 9-0 run. Trailing 43-42, CU got a three-pointer from Kresl, a conventional three-point play from Roberson and a three-ball from Brittany Wilson to go up 51-43 with 11:55 to play.

When that 9-0 spurt extended to 15-4, the Buffs were in command. Wyoming pulled as close as four points a couple of minutes later, but never threatened again. CU increased its lead to as many as 14 points in the final 7 minutes.

Teams' identities change yearly, and Lappe said this CU team's second-half focus is much better than last: "We've come out with the right focus in the second half and we have some confidence in us. I think that is where your experience comes into play. We have experienced players on the floor that have been in those situations, and they've been able to provide whatever the needs, at whatever point. I think you definitely saw that tonight."

Thanks to a little coaxing by her fellow Buffaloes, freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** capped off a career-high 25-point performance with a clutch 3-pointer as Colorado rallied for a 69-62 win over Illinois Saturday afternoon at Assembly Hall

Clinging to a 3-point lead (63-60) with under 40 seconds left sophomore forward **Jen Reese** had the ball in the paint and kicked it out to the left wing. Roberson held the ball, waiting for the Illinois defense to come to her.

"I was running time off the clock, and I didn't realize how close the shot clock was to running out," Roberson said. "My teammates told me to shoot it,"

And so she did. With the Illini defense leaving her alone on the wing as the shot clock ran down under five ticks, Roberson stepped back and drilled a 3-pointer on the baseline, the lone trey for the Buffaloes in the game, putting the exclamation point on a late 9-0 run and Colorado's 19th straight nonconference regular season win.

Colorado's leading scorer through six games (18.5 ppg), Roberson provided the late heroics, but it was a steady all-involved game for the Buffaloes (6-0) who also received career-best scoring performances from Reese (15) and sophomore Jasmine Sborov (11).

"No one gave up in this game," Reese said. "It's big to go and win on the road. With our team...we have the heart of champions."

Senior guard Chucky Jeffery filled the box score nicely with seven points, three steals and game-high figures with eight rebounds and six assists.

"She's letting the game come to her," said head coach Linda Lappe on Jef-

"She's letting the game come to her," said head coach **Linda Lappe** on Jeffery's performance. "She understands the flow of the game and what our team needs. She's doing a nice job of leading from the point guard position."

The Buffaloes led for most of the first half, but scored just one Roberson free throw in the final 3:50 of the period which allowed the Illini to finish on a 10-1 run and take a 36-30 lead at the break.

But the Buffaloes quickly erased that deficit, as a **Brittany Wilson** conventional 3-point play sparked a 10-2 run that fied the game at 40 with 14:32 left. From there, Colorado played toe-to-toe with the Illini in a contest that saw 14 lead changes in the second half alone.

"We were resilient," Lappe said. "The game could have gone either way at a lot of different times. (Our juniors and seniors) have been in those scenarios. We just stuck with it and didn't let little things affect us. We kept believing we were going to win and I liked how we pulled it out."

Illinois reclaimed a 60-57 advantage with 3:00 remaining after All-Big Ten forward Karisma Penn hit a jumper in the lane. Roberson responded on the other end to cut the lead to one. On the next possession, Illinois turned the ball over and Reese gave CU a one-point lead. Jeffery then picked the pocket of Ivory Crawford and went coast-to-coast to put the Buffs up 63-60 with 1:26 left. Another defensive stoo set up Roberson's 3-cointer.

It was a good afternoon from Colorado's post players once again. Roberson was 7-of-8 from the field, Reese was 7-of-14 and junior Rachel Hargis hit both her field goal attempts. That effort made up for the Buffaloes making just one of 11 3-point attempts.

"We could have let the fact that we couldn't make an outside shot affect the game," Lappe said. "We took what the defense gave us. Our guards hit our posts in great positions and our posts did a fantastic job of finishing and also getting to the free throw line."

Colorado took advantage of Illinois foul trouble. Penn, who entered the game averaging 20 points and 10 rebounds, picked up her fourth foul early in the second half and was limited to 11 points and four boards. Forward Kersten Magrum sat out a large chuck of the second half as well, eventually fouling out with 7:31 still on the clock.

Alexis Smith led Illinois with 17 points.

BOULDER - More challenging times are ahead for the Colorado women's basketball team, but the Buffaloes appear to be steeling themselves for whatever comes their way

Unbeaten CU (7-0) rolled past Colorado State 72-46 on Wednesday night in the first game of a women's/men's doubleheader at the Coors Events Center.

All things considered, it was a night for fun and frolic - but next week promises

to bring the degree of difficulty to a higher level. The Buffs are off until Tuesday (7 p.m.) when they travel to the University of Denver (3-3), then host No. 8 Louisville (8-1) on Friday (7 p.m.) in their most significant challenge to date.

CU took command Wednesday night with an 18-4 first half run, led 37-17 at halftime and cruised past CSU (2-5) in the final 20 minutes. Buffs coach Linda Lappe used 12 players and nine of them scored, topped by Brittany Wilson's 13. Jen Reese and Jamee Swan contributed 11 each and Arielle Roberson added 10. CU's bench outscored CSU's 33-5.

"Sometimes these games are a little bit tough to play but I felt like we got better in that game at some different things and that's what I like about our team," Lappe said. "For us, it's all about us right now and us continuing to get better. It's about us continuing to get better at some things or multiple things. I thought our players played hard and rebounded very, very well in this game."

Momentum gained from the Buffs' 69-62 comeback weekend win at Illinois

obviously carried into mid-week. CU outrebounded CSU 59-26, outscored the visitors 30-18 in the paint and had 20 second-chance points to CSU's two.

The Buffs, who won 64-55 last season in Fort Collins, trailed once in the first half (2-0), but thereafter took control and led by 20 (37-17) at intermission. Following that two-point deficit, CU surged past CSU the 18-4 over the next 7 minutes to take a 16-point advantage (22-6) and never slowed down.

"We felt like we had to come out early, it's CSU, it's our rivalry game," Wilson said. "If we didn't punch them in the mouth we knew they would try to punch us first. Who doesn't get up for their rivalry game? We knew we had to come out strong in the beginning.

During that spurt, Brittany Wilson scored eight of her 10 first-half points, while Reese added five. At the 11:45 mark, the Buffs were shooting 53.3 percent (8-for-15) from the field while holding the Rams to 21.4 percent (3-for-14).

"Going in we knew we had to have an inside presence." Reese said. "No matter if they were sagging in, double-teaming and stuff like that we had kick-outs, I think everyone in the post did a great job on either making the shot or seeing the open player.

After CU's opening run to go ahead by 16, CSU never got closer than 11 points for the rest of the half. And the Buffs kept pouring it on, leading by 20 twice before the halftime buzzer.

Roberson, a three-time recipient of the Pac-12 Conference freshman of the week award in the season's first four weeks, added eight points to the Buffs' halftime total. She entered the game with an 18.5 average. CU's second-half goal likely was to not lose interest and allow a CSU run. Mis-

sion accomplished. A "B-Wil" three-pointer and a Rachel Hargis layup on a nice fast break assist from Chucky Jeffery fashioned a 25-point lead (42-17) before the second half was 2 minutes old.

Less than 8 minutes later, after trevs on consecutive possessions by freshman Lauren Huggins, senior Meagan Malcom-Peck and another by Huggins, the Buffs had pushed ahead by 30 (61-31).

The second half was only half done, but it was time for the Rams to say goodnight.

In winning for only the second time in Denver against the Pioneers, the Buffs got a season-high 19 points from Brittany Wilson and 14 points and 11 rebounds from Chucky Jeffery. Leading scorer Arielle Roberson, who entered the game with a 17.3-point average, added 11.

Morgan Van Riper-Rose kept the Pioneers close with 13 first-half points. She

finished with a career-high 28

DU defeated CU 70-69 in their most recent Magness Arena matchup on Nov. 16, 2010. The Buffs lead the series 6-2 and won for the third time this season against a Front Range opponent. Before making the trip down I-25 South, CU had

beaten Wyoming (68-59) and Colorado State (72-46) in Boulder.

Tuesday's first half produced 11 lead changes, but they all occurred in the first 10 minutes. DU (4-5) took advantage of CU's sluggish start to go ahead by as many as five points (13-8) before the visitors roused themselves.

BOULDER - The buildup was big, but Colorado's effort was bigger.

The CU women's basketball team eventually took down No. 8 Louisville 70-66 on Friday night at the Coors Events Center. But remaining unbeaten (9-0) almost didn't happen for the Buffaloes.

Sophomore forward Jen Reese scored on a critical put-back after the second of two missed free throws by Brittany Wilson with 11.1 seconds left to secure the Buffs' first win against a Top Ten opponent since the 2002 CU team defeated No. 5 Stanford in the NCAA's Sweet 16.

CU led by as many as 13 (64-51) in the final 3 minutes before Louisville's full-court pressure caused four of the Buffs' 25 turnovers and sparked a 10-0 run in less than half a minute. The Cardinals closed to 68-66 before Wilson went to the line and unwittingly set the stage for Reese.
Head coach Linda Lappe said she was "really proud, really happy for our play-

ers. We've worked hard since end of last season to be able to come in and do what we did tonight...there were times we struggled to score, but we also hung in there

The Buffs had four players in double figures, topped by Chucky Jeffery's 22. Arielle Roberson added 13 and Reese and Wilson had 11 each. CU center Rachel Hargis contributed seven points and a career-high seven blocks in what she agreed was her best overall game at CU.

Louisville (9-2) was led by Antonita Slaughter's 19. The Cardinals' leading scorer Shoni Schimmel, an All-Big East selection last season, was held to four points, primarily by the determined Wilson.

Jeffery scored the game's first basket to give CU a 2-0 lead, but the Buffs trailed for almost the next 10 minutes. The good news: They never let the Cardinals get more than a five-point lead before they made their move to go ahead on a 11-0 run that put them up 23-16.

Roberson scored five points during that spurt, with Jeffery and Lexy Kresl each adding a three-pointer

Louisville closed the gap to three (23-20) before CU surged again, this time riding Jeffery's five points and an inside basket by Hargis on the way to a 7-2 run that gave the Buffs their biggest early lead - 30-22.

Hargis contributed her best half of the season, hitting three of four field goals, blocking three shots, collecting two rebounds and getting one steal. She was on the receiving end of a Jeffery pass in the half's closing seconds, scoring a layup that put the Buffs up 36-30 at intermission.

But the Buffs started the last half in an offensive stupor, not getting their first points until Roberson hit a pair of free throws (38-34) with 15:36 remaining. She followed those with a basket in the lane to push CU ahead again by six (40-34).

Monique Reid answered with a pair of quick inside buckets to cut the Buffs' advantage to two (40-38) and then the Cardinals then pulled to within 41-40 on a bucket by Shawnta Dyer. But the Buffs temporarily held them at bay.

At the 10-minute mark, CU was up 48-43, but a three-pointer by Slaughter trimmed the lead to 48-46. The Buffs held that two-point advantage until Wilson hit both ends of a one-and-one to send CU's lead to 50-46 with 7:18 to play.

The Cardinals weren't done - and the Buffs weren't even close. A pair of

Slaughter free throws pulled them to 50-48 before Reese banked in a short jumper for a 52-48 CU lead with 5:22 showing. That started a 10-0 Buffs run that produced a 60-49 advantage with 3:33 remaining.

Here's how it happened: Jeffery followed Reese's bank shot with an acrobatic layup to make it 54-48 with just under 5 minutes left, Reese got another basket, and Kresl and Wilson scored on fast-break lay-ins. The Buffs were up by 11 points, the Cardinals were staggering and the CEC was rocking.

But Louisville's 10-0 run and a frantic finish were on the way. And a season high crowd of 3,408 went quiet until Reese's monster offensive rebound and fol-

Utah Valley 14 37 31 44 45 Colorado 81

BOULDER - Competing as a member of the Top 25 is a relatively new experience for the Colorado women's basketball team - and that inexperience might have showed early on Saturday afternoon.

But by the end of the first half, the No. 25 Buffaloes had settled in and were playing the part of a nationally ranked team. Using a 23-3 run to close the first 20 minutes, CU took full control and crushed Utah Valley 81-45 at the Coors Events

The win was the 700th in the women's program's history and kept the Buffs unbeaten (10-0) this season. It was their 23rd straight victory in regular-season non-conference games and gave them a 30-4 non-conference record under thirdyear coach Linda Lappe.

"It's exciting to know where we are at this point," Lappe said. "It's good to go into a break without a loss...there have been a lot of upsets in the last week or so; we wanted to make sure that wasn't us."

The Buffs, she said, finally "got a feel for the game" after their shaky start and eventually "did nice things in spurts" - such as hitting the open player on offense and showing intensity on defense.

The gnarly defense was particularly apparent in the first half; Sammie Jensen, Utah Valley's leading scorer (17.7 average) and the Great West Conference player of the year in 2011-12, was held scoreless in the first 20 minutes and finished the game with nine points.

Benefitting from finding open spots and getting crisp passes from her teammates, CU's Jen Reese led all scorers with a career-high 16 points. She got help from Chucky Jeffery (12), Brittany Wilson (11) and Arielle Roberson (10).

The Buffs never trailed, but despite jumping to a 7-0 lead they didn't open like

a Top 25 team. Jeffery said the Buffs were so intent on not letting their first national ranking since 2008 affect their play that it probably did to start the game.

"We have little distractions here and there and we were able to pull through," she said. "So that was a good thing."

The Wolverines caused some difficulties with their matchup zone defense and switching man-to-man. "Going in, we were ready but we were a little frantic in the beginning," said Reese, who hit six of her 10 field goal attempts and was fourof-five from the free throw line. "We just had to calm down. We knew they would switch (defensively), so it was more of us just hurting ourselves.

But the Buffs' defense also presented big problems for the Wolverines. Lappe said her team's 'D' "kept us in the game...we were very solid. We wanted to hold them to 45 points and we did that. It just took a little time for our offense to catch fire and we did that with transition baskets."

Four consecutive free throws by Reese with 8:03 left before intermission opened a seven-point lead (18-11). And with that, the Buffs were off and running. Finishing the half with its 23-3 run, CU led 37-14 at intermission.

The Buffs didn't ease off in the second half, going up by 31 (59-28) on a threepointer by Wilson with 12:55 remaining, then getting a layup by Rachel Hargis (nine points, seven rebounds) to extend the lead to 33 (61-28) about 40 seconds later. They led by as many as 36 twice in the final 4:30.

Tina Doughty led Utah Valley (4-10) with 13 points and was the only Wolver-

ines player in double figures. Utah Valley shot only 16.7 percent (4-for-24) from the field in the first half and finished the game at 30.6 percent (15-of-49).

Meanwhile, once the Buffs got untracked, they hit 15 of their 34 first-half field goal attempts (44.1 percent) and were at 47.9 percent (34-of-71) for the afternoon. CU outscored Utah Valley 48-20 in the paint and 16-4 on fast breaks. The Buffs converted 16 Wolverines turnovers into 20 points, committed a season-low six turnovers themselves, and outrebounded the visitors 47-30.

BOULDER - Non-conference play is in the rearview mirror, perennial power Stanford is in the headlights. The Colorado women's basketball team contends it is primed and pumped to open work next week in the Pac-12 Conference, and CU sophomore guard Lexy Kresl says the Pac-12 had best be primed and pumped for the Buffaloes

On Saturday, Kresl was that and more - the more being looser, more confident on offense and devilish on defense. She tied a career-high with 20 points, hitting all five of her three-point attempts and tying a school record as No. 23 CU rolled past New Mexico 84-39 at the Coors Events Center.

The victory pushed the Buffs to 11-0 in non-conference play for the second

consecutive season and gave third-year coach Linda Lappe her 100th career win. Lappe is 100-66 overall and 50-30 at CU.

Never mind the possible implications for the Buffs; Lappe says her team is "as prepared as we can be" to begin conference play. "I can't think of many things we're not prepared for...we haven't faced a ton adversity, but we have veteran players who have. We've been tested at home, on the road. We feel confident in any venue. But it's all about us and what we do, executing what we do...if we play with the intensity and composure we did tonight then I feel confident we're ready for the conference season

UNM coach Yvonne Sanchez, who saw her team drop to 8-5, said CU "took everything away from us and I credit them immensely. They're well-coached and they had a great game plan. We didn't execute well, but a lot of that has to do with

And that damage was considerable. With Kresl primarily holding Lobos leading scorer Caroline Dublin (12.9 ppg) to five first-half points (seven total), the Buffs

raced to a 39-21 halftime lead and never looked back.

CU's pace or intensity didn't slow in the second 20 minutes either. The Buffs opened the last half with a 17-2 run - Kresl scored eight in that spurt - and pushed ahead 56-23. Keeping the pedal firmly down, CU led by as many as 47.

Also in double figures were redshirt freshman Arielle Roberson (18), senior Chucky Jeffery (11) and sophomore Jen Reese (10). Jeffery flirted with the third triple-double of her career. In 27 minutes she finished with eight assists and eight rebounds to go with her 11 points.

The Buffs shot 50.8 percent for the game (32-of-63) and held the Lobos to 30.2 percent (16-of-53). CU outrebounded the visitors 42-31, owned a 40-16 advantage in the paint and converted 23 UNM turnovers into 28 points. The Buffs committed 13 turnovers, but the Lobos got only nine points from those errors. And

off-setting CU's miscues were a season-high 18 steals.

Kresl, who had totaled 20 points in her previous three games, had 12 at halftime Saturday for a season high. She followed with eight in the Buffs' early second-half run, missing only one of her eight attempts from the field and hitting her only free throw attempt.

"I don't exactly feel like my role this year is to be the leading scorer." she said "I am more than happy to see my other teammates score and I love passing them the ball. (Saturday) I think I just felt comfortable with my shot. It felt more natural

Roberson called participating in Lappe's 100th win "definitely positive for us. We get to say we helped her get there. It was a great landmark for all of us . . . I was just proud to see her get recognized."

Earning her 100th career "W" was "nice," said Lappe. "It's not something you

focus on as a coach; you don't ever say, 'I can't wait until I get to 100 wins.'

Nonetheless, she added, reaching 100 is a tribute to the players, assistant coaches and staff members who have had hands in the milestone. "I obviously hope there are a lot more hundreds after this one, but it is good and I'm happy that our team can experience success...we're going in the right direction, I think.
