OPENING TIP: Colorado will play its third-straight against a ranked opponent for the first time since the 2012 Big 12 season when the Buffs faced four in a row. This will be the first time CU has ever faced three consecutive ranked opponents in true road contests.

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 15-4 overall, its best record after 19 games since the 2003-04 NCAA Tournament team began 17-2. The Buffaloes are 4-4 in Pac-12 play, currently in the sixth spot, one game behind Sunday's opponent, USC.

CU dropped a pair of competitive road games to No. 7 California on Jan. 25 (59-56) and No. 6 Stanford on Jan. 27 (69-56). All four of Colorado's losses this season have been to those Bay Area teams, ranked No. 7 or better in each game, and sporting a combined record 35-4 with two of those losses coming to each other.

Colorado averages just under 68 points per game on 42 percent shooting from the field. The Buffaloes scored in bunches during the nonconference schedule hitting 80 points three times. Defensively, CU allows just over 53 points and has held opponents to 34 percent shooting for the year.

Colorado ranks second in the Pac-12 and 10th in the nation in rebounding margin at +10.4 per game. The Buffaloes rank among the top five in the Pac-12 in 16 of 21 statistical categories including second in scoring defense (53.6 ppg), rebounding defense (32.5 rpg) and assists (13.7 apg).

All-Pac-12 guard **Chucky Jeffery** leads the team in scoring (13.3 ppg), assists (4.2 apg), rebounds (8.2 rpg) and steals (2.6 spg). She averaged 11.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.0 steals on the Bay Area trip last weekend, including a team season-high five steals at Stanford. She has all four of the team's double-doubles this year, including a 19-point, 16-rebound effort against Arizona State on Jan. 18. Jeffery ranks third in the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.4), and is also fourth in assists, fifth in overall rebounding, steals and defensive rebounds (6.2), 11th in free-throw percentage (.737) and 13th in scoring.

Redshirt freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** is second on the team and ranks 17th in the Pac-12 in scoring at 12.6 points per game. A three-time Pac-12 Freshman of the Week, Roberson tops the Buffaloes in free-throws made and attempted (64-of-100) and also ranks

second on the team in rebounding (5.7 rpg) and third in steals (1.1 spg). Roberson ranks 10th in offensive rebounds (2.8 orpg) on the Pac-12 leaderboard.

Junior guard **Brittany Wilson** ranks second on the team in steals (1.3 spg) and assists (2.4 apg) while coming in at fourth in scoring at 8.2 points per contest. She averaged 10 points over the Bay Area trip, leading the Buffaloes at California with 11 points, including matching a season-best with three 3-pointers. Wilson is also second on the team in 3-pointers made (21) and has hit 81 percent from the free-throw line, ranking third in the Pac-12. She also ranks 13th in 3-point percentage (.323) on the league leaderboard.

Sophomore forward **Jen Reese** has made a successful return from an eye injury that kept her out of the final nine games of 2011-12. She is third on the team in scoring (8.5 ppg) and rebounding (4.9 rpg) while hitting 45.2 percent from the field. She is one of the team's better free-throw shooters at 77.8 percent.

Junior center **Rachel Hargis** is the only Buffalo to start all 19 games. A career 33 percent shooter entering the season, Hargis has made the most of her opportunity hitting 50 percent this season. She leads CU in blocked shots with 23, ranking 13th in the Pac-12 at 1.3 per outing.

Sophomore **Lexy Kresl** tops Colorado in 3-pointers with 22 and is averaging 5.8 points and 2.8 rebounds per game. Kresl was second on the team in rebounding over the Cal-Stanford trip averaging 5.0 per game.

Colorado's balance has served them well through the first half of the season. Aside from Roberson and Jeffery averaging in double figures, six others average between three and nine points per game. In the win over Arizona, nine different Buffaloes scored between six and 12 points. At California, nine different Buffs also scored, with seven netting between five and 11 points. With freshman **Jamee Swan** leading the team at Stanford with 14 points, she became the sixth different player to lead CU in scoring in a game this year.

ABOUT THE BRUINS: No. 18 (AP)/19 (USAT) UCLA is 15-4 overall and tied with Washington for third in the Pac-12 at 6-2. The Bruins have won eight of their last 10, with the only losses coming on the road at No. 6 Stanford and No. 7 California. UCLA ranks second in

the Pac-12 in scoring at 70.6 points per game while hitting 42 percent from the field. The Bruins top the Pac-12 in both assists (16.3 apg) and steals (12.0 spg). UCLA allows 62.4 points per game and 37.5 percent from the field.

Senior guard/forward Markel Walker paces the Bruins in scoring at 11.7 points per game and leads the Pac-12 in both assists (5.5 apg) and steals (3.2 spg). UCLA sports three of the top 10 rebounders in the Pac-12 with Walker and Tennessee transfer Alyssia Brewer tied for seventh at 7.9 per game and junior forward Atonye Nyingifa right behind in ninth at 7.5. Nyingifa is UCLA's second leading scorer at 11.2 points, Brewer is third at 10.8 an outing. Junior guard Thea Lemberger is second on the team in assists (2.9 apg) and ranks third in the Pac-12 in 3-point percentage (.365).

Cori Close is in her second year as head coach at UCLA with a career record of 29-20.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be the sixth meeting between Colorado and UCLA. The Bruins hold a 3-2 series edge, claiming the first ever Pac-12 meeting between the two teams, 62-54 in overtime on Jan. 29, 2012 in Boulder. The Buffaloes visit Pauley Pavilion for the first time since Dec. 8, 2001, a 79-48 CU win. UCLA won the only other meeting in L.A., 91-66, on Dec. 22, 1983. Current CU head coach **Linda Lappe** was on the team that played in L.A. in 2001, but missed that contest due to injury.

Lappe is 0-1 against UCLA as a head coach. Bruins' head coach Cori Close is 1-0 against Colorado as a head coach.

CONNECTIONS: Colorado sports three players from California on its roster and all three from the greater Los Angeles area. The Wilson twins, **Ashley** and **Brittany**, hail from Long Beach while freshman guard **Alexus Atchley** is from Yorba Linda. The Wilson's were high school teammates with UCLA senior forward Jasmine Dixon at Long Beach Poly. UCLA has one Colorado player on its roster, Mariah Williams, a Colorado Springs native who graduated from Regis Jesuit in Aurora. UCLA assistant coach Jenny (Roulier) Huth was a three-time All-Big 12 performer for Colorado (1998-02) and teammate of current CU head coach **Linda Lappe**. Roulier scored 1,399 points in her CU career, helping the Buffaloes to two NCAA Tournaments, including the 2002 Elite Eight.

MORE ON THE DEFENSE: Colorado leads the Pac-12 in scoring defense through eight conference games at 52.1 points per outing, and is second overall at 53.6. Colorado has allowed just four teams in the 60's all season and set a school-record by holding nine straight opponents under the 60-point mark:

Colorado has yet to allow 70 points in a game this year. This is the longest the Buffaloes have gone into any one season without allowing 70. The previous best was the 2011-12 team, that didn't allow 70 until game No. 13, a 75-67 loss at Washington.

CU held three straight conference opponents (Utah, Arizona State & Arizona) to 43 points or less, the first time the Buffaloes have held three straight opponents at 43 or under in conference play since 1980-81. It is also the eighth time in school history the Buffs have held their opponents under 50 in three consecutive outings.

BOULDER - Colorado went cold early, late and played sloppily in between, eventually paying with a 62-54 overtime loss to UCLA on Sunday afternoon at the Coors Events Center.

The Buffaloes slipped to 15-5 overall and 4-5 in the Pac-12 Conference. The Bruins evened their overall record at 10-10 and at 5-4 in the league.

Freshman **Lexy Kresl** led the Buffs with 15 points, while junior **Chuckie Jeffery** added 14. UCLA's Markel Walker led all scorers with 26 points.

CU opened the game by missing its first 13 shots and finished by making only two field goals in the last 10:25, including overtime. The Buffs also committed 25 turnovers.

The Buffs led only once in the first half, and that one-point advantage (24-23) came courtesy of Jeffery's buzzer beater before intermission. Otherwise, the home team's largest crowd of the season - 5,885 on a State Farm Insurance day - mostly stayed in a holding pattern for 19:59.

That CU enjoyed even that slight advantage at the break was surprising. The Buffs missed their first 13 shots and fell behind 9-2 - their only points coming on a pair of free throws by **Meagan Malcolm-Peck**. CU didn't get its first basket until Jeffery hit a short jumper in the lane at the 13:26 mark.

Jeffery's "J" brought the Buffs to 9-4 and was followed by a Kresl three-pointer that narrowed the gap to 9-7. But just as quickly, CU fell behind by six (13-7) and didn't pull even until **Brittany Wilson's** layup made it 19-19 with 2:06 before halftime.

UCLA took a four-point lead (23-19) before **Rachel Hargis** hit one of two free throws and Jeffery converted a steal into a layup, then hit her jump shot at the buzzer to give CU its one-point lead at intermission.

CU committed 10 first-half turnovers, but UCLA managed only six points from those. Meanwhile, the Buffs scored 12 points off of UCLA's eight errors. The Buffs outrebounded the Bruins 27-20 and had an 8-0 advantage over a UCLA bench that held only three players.

But clearly, a better second-half start was needed by the Buffs - and they got it by opening with a 6-1 surge to take their largest lead of the afternoon to that point. Jeffery accounted for four of that total, scoring on a pair of layups to send CU ahead 30-24 with 16:13 to play.

A layup in transition by Rebekah Gardner brought UCLA to within one (35-34) and her 12-foot jump shot on the next possession gave the Bruins their first lead (36-35) since the first half's last 30 seconds.

CU had just under 10 minutes to figure out UCLA's changing defenses. The Buffs regained the lead (37-36) on a **Julie Seabrook** layup with 7:46 to play. But Gardner hit one of two free throws and followed with a layup to put UCLA up 39-37, giving her seven consecutive points during a 7-2 Bruins run.

The Buffs forged a 39-39 tie on a **Jen Reese** jumper, went ahead 41-39 on Jeffery's layup and didn't surrender the lead for the final 5:25. Fouled while attempting a three-pointer from the left wing with 2:07 left, Kresl hit all three free throws to put CU up 46-42.

But UCLA crept back to 46-44 on Thea Lemberger's runner from the right side. With a chance to tie, the Bruins lost the ball on a traveling call with 57 seconds to play. CU called a timeout, but promptly turned it over, allowing Gardner to work the baseline for a layup that tied the score at 46-46 with 7.5 seconds left.

After another timeout, the Buffs committed yet another turnover - their 23rd in regulation - and CU's sloppy afternoon was headed for overtime.

The Bruins outscored the Buffs 9-2 to start the extra period, but CU crept to within 55-51 on a Kresl three-pointer with just over a minute remaining. UCLA put the game away by making seven of eight free throws in the final 50 seconds.

Colorado had held its opponents to 24.6 percent shooting (49-of-199) over a 140 minute span (3 1/2 games) from the Utah game in Salt Lake City on Jan. 13 through the first half the game at California.

Colorado allowed just 36 points to Arizona, the fewest in a conference game since a 70-35 win at Kansas on Jan. 16, 2002. Arizona State was held to 17 points on 4-of-30 from the field in the second half of the Jan. 18 game. The four field goals were one shy of a school record (3 vs. Texas State 12/1/10 and Kansas State 3/7/92). The 13.3 percent allowed was just a fraction off the all-time opponent low for a half, 13.0 (3-of-23) vs. Kansas State on 3/7/92). That weekend Arizona State and Arizona combined for 79 points (39.2 ppg) and 24 percent from the field (26-of-107). The Buffaloes scored 79 points in their win over Arizona alone.

NATIONALLY RANKED: Following competitive losses to a pair of top 10 teams, Colorado remained at No. 23 in the USA Today Sports Women's Basketball Coaches poll released on Tuesday.

On Monday, Colorado slid two spots to No. 22 in the Associated Press Women's Basketball Top 25 poll.

Colorado, 15-4 overall and 4-4 in the Pac-12 Conference, received 64 points in the coaches' poll, down from 113 last week. The Buffaloes have been in the coaches' poll for three-straight weeks and four overall this season. The current No. 23 ranking, held for the last two weeks, is Colorado's highest spot in the coaches' rankings since coming in at No. 16 in the March 15, 2004 poll. This week's ranking marks the 155th time Colorado has appeared in the coaches' poll dating back to the 1988-89 campaign.

Colorado received 205 points in the AP poll, down only 75 from last week. The Buffaloes have resided in the AP poll for the last seven weeks, reaching as high as No. 20 twice - Dec. 31 and Jan. 21. CU's seven-week run in the AP poll is its longest since appearing in all 19 polls of the 2003-04 season. The Buffaloes have a long history of rankings in the AP poll, dating back to the 1980-81 season. This week's ranking marks the 165th time Colorado has appeared in the AP poll, trailing only Stanford, USC and UCLA among Pac-12 schools.

All four losses of Colorado's losses this season have been to league rivals Stanford and California, ranked No. 7 or better in each meeting. After this weekend's games, Stanford moved up two spots in the AP poll to No. 4 and one in the coaches' poll to No. 5. California moved up one spot in both polls to No. 6. The Buffaloes do have one top 10 win on their resume, a 70-66 win over then-No. 8 Louisville on Dec. 14. The Cardinals are currently ranked No. 12 in both polls.

LAPPE AND COLORADO IN THE POLLS: Head coach **Linda Lappe** joined some elite company when the Buffaloes received their first AP ranking in five years. She is only one of eight NCAA Division I women's head coaches to have played for an AP ranked team, and then return to lead that same program into the AP poll. Overall she is the 31st person to play for and coach an AP ranked program.

The Buffaloes were ranked for 29 weeks during Lappe's playing career (1998-03) including 27 straight from Jan. 22, 2001 through the end of her junior year (March 11, 2002). CU's highest AP ranking during that span was No. 10, on March 4, 2002.

SUCCESS ON THE ROAD: Colorado is 4-2 away from Boulder this season and is 13-9 in its last 22 true road contests since the tail end of the 2010-11 campaign. Prior to the start of this run, The Buffaloes had just five wins in their previous 37 road games dating back to the 2008 Big 12 Conference schedule.

Colorado held Utah to 43 points in Salt Lake City on Jan. 13, its fewest allowed in a true road game since a 45-42 win at Pacific on Dec. 18, 2004

Colorado scored an overall season-high 83 points at Denver, the most in a true road contest since scoring 83 in a 3-point loss at Colorado State on Nov. 30, 2005. CU's 10-point halftime lead was its largest on the road since leading Colorado State 38-22 on Nov. 20, 2011

Colorado's win at Illinois was its first road win against a major conference opponent in a nonconference regular season game since defeating No. 20/17 ranked Vanderbilt, 62-51, on Dec. 9, 2007. The Buffaloes trailed by six at halftime against the Illini, allowing Colorado to claim its largest halftime deficit overcome to win on the road since defeating Missouri 80-79 in overtime on Feb. 23, 2010 after trailing by seven at the break (43-36).

Colorado's 23-point win at UMKC, was its biggest on the road since an 82-47 win at Colorado State on Dec. 1, 2007.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado picked up its 14th all-time win over a top-10 ranked opponent with its 70-66 win over No. 8 Louisville on Dec. 14. The win marked the Buffaloes' first over a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 5 Stanford in the 2002 NCAA Sweet 16. It was the first top-10 win as an unranked team since knocking off No. 7 Texas Tech 63-49 on Jan. 11, 1997.

The Buffaloes are 1-4 against ranked teams this season -- all in the top 10 -- and 3-9 under Linda Lappe. CU is 62-146 all-time against ranked opponents. The Buffaloes played just two games against ranked teams in 2011-12, both against Stanford.

Colorado's last eight ranked opponents dating back to 2010-11 have all resided in the top 10, by far the longest streak for in school history. The five regular season games where the opponent is ranked in the top 10 in both polls, is a first for the Buffaloes in one season. CU played five regular season top 10 games in 2001-02, but two of those games included a team being ranked 10 or better in only one poll. Including postseason, the 2001-02 team played eight top 10 teams, five of which were top 10 in both polls.

CU's series with Cal and Stanford this season have marked just the first and second times the Buffaloes have faced top-10 opponents in consecutive games during the regular season. Colorado has faced that twice in postseason play; the 1993 and 2002 NCAA Sweet 16 and Elite Eight.

BENCH PRODUCTION: Colorado is getting good production from its bench to the tune of 22.7 points (34 percent) and 19.9 rebounds (46 percent) per game. Sophomore forward **Jen Reese** has headed the bench effort averaging 8.5 points and 4.9 rebounds, ranking third on the team in both categories.

Colorado scored a season-high 42 bench points in the win over UMKC. The bulk of those came from freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** who scored 23 points in 19 minutes on 9-of-12 from the field in her lone game off the bench this season. Her 23 bench points are tied for the second most in the past 10 years and her nine field goals are the most. Only Bianca Smith, with 25 points off the bench against San Jose State on Dec. 22, 1999, had a bigger bench game in the last 10 years.

MORE ON THE BOARDS: Colorado ranked 10th in NCAA Division I in rebounding margin at +10.4 through games of Jan. 27. The Buffaloes have either tied or led the rebounding battle in 16 of 19 games this season and have enjoyed double-digit margins in 10 games.

The Buffaloes grabbed a season-high 59 rebounds in the win over Colorado State, their most since also recording 59 against Bowling Green on Nov. 23, 2001. CU had 24 offensive rebounds, nearly matching Colorado State's overall total (26). Colorado's 24 offensive rebounds were its most since it had 24 at Iowa State on Feb. 18, 1996.

Colorado's +33 advantage against the Rams tied for the ninth largest single-game margin in team history, most recently achieved against San Francisco on Nov. 30, 2011 (53-20).

Colorado had 50 rebounds against Denver, hitting the 50 mark for the second straight game for the first time since grabbing 50 against UC Irvine and 52 against Illinois-Chicago in the first two games of the 2009-10 season.

CU's 109 rebounds over a two-game span are its most since hitting the same number during the 2001 Coors Classic (59 vs. Bowling Green, 50 vs. Houston). The Buffaloes 46 offensive rebounds during that stretch are their most since grabbing 48 in back-to-back games in December 1994 (25 vs. Montana State, 23 vs. Notre Dame).

BIG WIN: The 43-point win over Arizona was CU's largest in a Pac-12 game, smashing the old mark of 14 set just two days earlier against Arizona State (57-43). It was the eighth largest margin of victory in a conference game in CU history (all conferences) and the largest since an 83-38 win over Iowa State on Feb. 19, 1995.

Colorado's 28-point lead at halftime (43-15) is its largest lead at the break against a Pac-12 opponent and the most in a conference game since Colorado led Kansas 42-14 at halftime on Feb. 5, 2003.

BUFFS EXPERIENCED FROM DEEP: While Colorado looks to continue an inside-outside balance on its 2012-13 squad, there is no questioning its experience from shooting from the perimeter. The Buffaloes have four players with at least 50 career 3-point field goals, and all four rank among CU's career Top 20. Junior Brittany Wilson tops the Buffaloes' effort with 91, 11th on CU's all-time list. Senior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** is 12th 87. **Lexy Kresl**, who set CU's single-season freshman record in 2011-12 at 63 is 13th with 85. Senior **Chucky Jeffery** rounds out the current Buffs at 17th with 61.

Jeffery became the sixth player to reach 800 rebounds in the Arizona win and in the process became the first Buffalo to reach 1,400 points, 800 rebounds and 400 assists.

She is fourth in career steals with 262, needing 22 to catch Bridget Turner (1985-89) for third. Jeffery is currently fifth in career assists with 433, needing 10 to catch Tracy Tripp (1985-89) for the fourth spot.

On CU's career charts Jeffery also ranks sixth in rebounds (814), 12th in field-goals made (550), 14th in free-throws made (296), 16th in blocks (61) and 17th in 3-point field goals (61).

In other miscellaneous categories Jeffery is also fifth in double-doubles (24), is sixth in double-figure rebounding games (26) and 10th in double-figure scoring games (80).

JEFFERY'S HEADLINER WEEK: Senior guard **Chucky Jeffery** led the Buffaloes to their first *Associated Press* ranking in five seasons and their first top-10 win in over 10 years, and as a result picked up some well-deserved conference and national recognition.

On Dec. 17, Jeffery was named the espnW National Player of the Week and Pac-12 Conference Player of the Week for the week of Dec 10-16. She also received national and Pac-12 Player of the Week honors from collegesportsmadness.com.

On Dec. 18, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) named Jeffery its Ann Meyers Drysdale Women's National Player of the Week.

Jeffery averaged 18 points, 9.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists while shooting 46 percent from the field and 80 percent from the free-throw line in wins over Denver and No. 8 ranked Louisville.

Against Louisville she had a game-high and personal season-best 22 points along with seven rebounds, four assists and one steal as the Buffaloes claimed their first win over a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 5 Stanford in the 2002 NCAA Sweet 16. Jeffery recorded season highs from the 3-point line (2-of-5) and the foul line (8-10) as she became the 16th player in team history to reach 1,300 career points.

Jeffery had 14 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and two steals in the road win over Denver on Dec. 11. She notched her second double-double of the season, and 22nd of her career, tying Sandy Bean (1978-82) for fifth on CU's all-time list.

Jeffery's Pac-12 Player of the Week honor is her second, as she received the same award on Dec. 5, 2011.

FAST OUT OF THE GATE: Colorado finished the nonconference regular season at 11-0, the Buffs' second consecutive perfect non-conference season, and third in school history (1992-93). Colorado will continue a string of 24 nonconference regular season wins into next season. The Buffaloes are 31-4 in the nonconference season under head coach **Linda Lappe**.

ROBERSON PAC-12 HONORS: Forward **Arielle Roberson** has won the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week award three times this season. The Pac-12 has added Freshman of the Week to its weekly honors for the first time this season.

In her most recent award on Dec. 2, Roberson averaged 19.5 points on 72 percent from the field (13-of-18) and 71 percent from the foul line (12-of-17) in wins over Wyoming and Illinois. She scored a career and team season-high 25 points, including a critical, late, 3-point basket, to lead Colorado to a 69-62 road win at Illinois as the Buffaloes claimed their 19th straight regular season nonconference victory.

She hit 7-of-8 from the field against the Illini and sank a team season-high 10 free throws on 14 attempts. Roberson also had five rebounds, three steals and an assist against Illinois. Earlier in the week, Roberson netted 14 points on 6-of-10 from the field in the home win over Wyoming.

Roberson earned the inaugural Pac-12 Freshman of the Week award on Nov. 12 after scoring 16 points on 7-of-13 shooting with six rebounds, five steals, two assists and two blocks in her collegiate debut - a 70-65 win over Idaho on Nov. 11. Her second citation came on Nov. 26 after averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds en route to Omni Hotels Classic MVP honors.

Her three weekly conference awards in one season are the most since Brittany Spears won four Big 12 Conference Rookie of the Week honors in 2007-08.

ARIELLE & ANDRE: The Roberson's are the only brother/sister tandem on the 2012-13 basketball rosters from the same school in the Pac-12 Conference. They're one of five brother/sister tandems on 2012-13 basketball rosters in Division I. The Big Ten has two tandems, followed by one each in the ACC, Mountain West and the Pac-12 Conferences. CU has another brother/sister pair on the ski team with freshmen Maria and Gustav Nordstrom from Sweden.

SEEING DOUBLE: Colorado is used to getting double takes from fans and opponents, as the Buffaloes once again sport two pairs of identical twins on its roster.

Brenna and Meagan Malcolm-Peck are senior wing players while **Ashley and Brittany Wilson** are junior guards. Brenna is the older of the two Malcolm-Pecks by 27 minutes. Ashley is the older of the Wilson twins, by only five minutes.

COLORADO BASKETBALL'S SOLID START: Colorado's men's and women's basketball teams each began the 2012-13 season at 6-0, before the men suffered their first loss of the season on Dec. 1 at Wyoming. It is the first time the men's and women's programs have both started with six or more wins since 1982-83 when both teams started 7-0.

OMNI HOTELS CLASSIC CHAMPS: Colorado improved to 42-10 all-time in its home holiday classic and has won four straight and 16 of the 25 tournament titles contested. The Buffaloes won this year's classic by defeating Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and San Diego State. Freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** was named the MVP after averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds over the two-game tournament. She is the first CU freshman to win that honor in the 26-year history of the tournament. Senior guard **Chucky Jeffery** was named to the Omni Classic All-Tournament team after averaging 13 points, 7.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals over the two games. She is the first four-time Omni All-Tournament team honoree, earning MVP honors in 2010 and '11.

BUFFS SIGN FOUR TO NLI's: Zoe Beard-Fails, Desiree Harris, Haley Smith and Briana Watts have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2013-14 head coach Linda Lappe announced on Wednesday, the first day of the NCAA's early signing period.

Beard-Fails is a 6-2 forward from Herndon, Va., and attends Georgetown Day School in Washington D.C. She missed all but five games of her junior year with an ACL and meniscus tear, but is nearing full strength as her senior season commences. The 51st rated forward in the nation according to ESPN.com's HoopGurlz, Beard-Fails averaged 27 points and nearly 18 rebounds as a sophomore for Georgetown Day in 2010-11, earning fourth team All-Met honors from the Washington Post.

Harris is a 5-8 guard from Oakland, Calif., who attends St. Joseph Notre Dame High school in Alameda. She averaged 23.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 2.7 assists as a junior, helping the Pilots to the North Coast Section championship. Harris was a CIF All-State Division V second team selection as well as a Bay Shore Athletic League second team pick.

Smith, a 6-0 wing from Sammamish, Wash., is getting ready for her senior season at Skyline High School. A do-it-all player for the Spartans, she averaged around seven points, five rebounds and just under two assists and steals per game as a junior. Smith is in her fourth varsity season with the Spartans and also has had a successful club career playing with the Tree of Hope program. ESPN.com's HoopGurlz has her as the top prospect in the state of Washington and the 20th ranked wing in the nation.

Watts, a 6-4 center from Fresno, Calif., will make her debut with Clovis West High School this winter after playing her first three years at rival Buchanan. She was the first commit of the 2013 class. Watts averaged nearly six points and just over six rebounds per game for Buchanan as a junior, contributing to the Bears' 18-9 record and a spot in the CIF Central Section Division I semifinals.

BUFFS IN OPENERS: With its win over Idaho, Colorado improved to 34-5 (.872) all-time in season openers and 37-2 (.949) in all-time home openers. The Buffs opened the season with a home game for the 27th time in 39 seasons, and moved to a perfect 27-0 in those instances.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado improved to a perfect 23-0 in exhibition games with its 87-38 win over Western State University Colorado. The Buffaloes have outscored their exhibition opponents by just over 31 points per game (86.0 to 54.7).

Colorado's 38 points allowed against WSCU were its fewest in an exhibition since the Buffaloes beat Colorado Mines 58-31 in 2007. The 49-point margin was the most in an exhibition since the Buffaloes defeated Spartak Moscow 115-55 in 2002.

The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU's exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams.

BUFFS PICKED NINTH: Coming off its first 20-win season in eight years, Colorado was picked to finish ninth in the Pac-12 in 2013, according to the league's annual Preseason Coaches Poll and Media Poll.

In the Coaches Poll, 2012 NCAA Women's Final Four participant Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12, compiling the maximum amount of points (121) and first place votes (11) possible. 2012 Pac-12 runner-up and NCAA participant California claimed the other first place vote and was second in the poll (109). UCLA was third with 100 points followed by USC (91), Arizona State and Oregon State (67), Utah (56), Washington (54), Colorado (49), Washington State (40), Oregon (20) and Arizona (18).

Colorado's ninth place preseason rating is its highest in the last nine

years since Buffaloes were picked to finish seventh in the 2004-05 Big 12 Coaches Poll.

The Media Poll was nearly identical in order. Stanford was picked to win with 12 first place votes and 166 total. California was second with 155 points and two first place votes. UCLA was third (136) followed by USC (123), Oregon State (106), Arizona State (100), Washington (80), Utah (72), Colorado (57), Washington State (47), Oregon (25) and Arizona (22).

MEDIA TABS JEFFERY: Along with picking the order of Pac-12 finish, the media selected a preseason All-Pac-12 team. Senior guard Chucky Jeffery was one of six individuals selected, along with California's Layshia Clarendon, Washington's Jazmine Davis, Stanford's Chiney Ogumike, UCLA's Markel Walker and Arizona's Davellyn Whyte.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 378-128 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.747). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 24 of 35 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado's regular season schedule will feature at least 11 regionally or nationally televised games in 2012-13. Colorado will play nine regular season games on the Pac-12 Networks, and a guaranteed one, and potentially more, during the Pac-12 Tournament, March 7-10, in Seattle.

A program-best six regular season games will be televised nationally while three more will be on one of the regional networks. CU's first Pac-12 Tournament game will also be televised nationally, as would any ensuing round through the championship game, which will air Sunday, March 10, on ESPN2.

CU made its first television appearance on Dec. 11 at Denver on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain. The Buffaloes made their Pac-12 Network on Jan. 4 against defending league champion Stanford; their first of four straight televised games on the network. Colorado will have five straight road games televised beginning with Utah on Jan. 13, through a Super Bowl Sunday matchup at USC on Feb. 3. CU's final regular season televised game will be Feb. 8 at home against Oregon State.

Entering the 2012-13 season, CU has appeared on 99 regional or national telecasts over the previous 11 seasons.

FALL ACADEMIC UPDATE: The grade point average for the fall 2012 semester for all 321 CU student-athletes was 2.889, while the cumulative grade point was 2.902; it was the best fall GPA on record (surpassing 2.867 in Fall 2011) and the third highest ever recorded. Seven of the 14 programs (indoor and outdoor track are combined) boasted grade points of 3.0 or better for the semester, with seven also sporting a cumulative grade point besting the 3.0 mark. Overall, 221 student-athletes own grade points over 2.5 (72%), 151 over 3.0 (49%, which is also a record) and 61 over 3.5 (23%, yet another best). The men's and women's ski teams, along with women's soccer, women's tennis and women's golf, led the way; a closer look:

- Named espnW and U.S. Basketball Writers Association Ann Meyers Drysdale National Player of the Week (Dec. 10-16).

- Also earned Pac-12 Player of the Week honors after averaging 18 points, 9 rebounds and 4.5 assists in wins over Denver and No. 8 Louisville.

- Named to the Omni Classic All-Tournament team averaging 13 points, 7.5 rebounds, 3 assists and 3 steals.

- First player to be named Omni Classic All-Tournament all four years of her career.

- Ranks third in the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio, and is also fourth in assists, fifth in overall rebounding, steals and defensive rebounds, 11th in free-throw percentage and 13th in scoring.

Career:

- Ranks fourth in steals, fifth in assists, sixth in rebounds, 11th in scoring, 12th in field-goals made, 14th in free-throws made, 16th in blocks and 17th 3-point field goals made. Her 24 double-doubles are fifth, 26 double-figure rebounding games rank sixth and her 80 double-digit scoring games rank 10th on CU's career charts.

- Has at least one assist in 61 straight games and in 110 of 112 career outings.

- Has 43 career games with three or more steals.

- 2012 All-Pac-12 Conference selection by both the coaches and the media. Selected to the Pac-12 All-Defensive team by the coaches.

- Averaged 15.8 points and 11.8 rebounds in the 2012 Postseason WNIT. Had double-doubles in her last three and four of her last six games.

- Holds two of the program's three triple-doubles, recording her second with 12 points, 12 rebounds and a career-high tying 10 assists in the WNIT quarterfinal over Oklahoma State.

BOULDER – More challenging times are ahead for the Colorado women's basketball team, but the Buffaloes appear to be steeling themselves for whatever comes their way.

Unbeaten CU (7-0) rolled past Colorado State 72-46 on Wednesday night in the first game of a women's/men's doubleheader at the Coors Events Center.

All things considered, it was a night for fun and frolic - but next week promises to bring the degree of difficulty to a higher level. The Buffs are off until Tuesday (7 p.m.) when they travel to the University of Denver (3-3), then host No. 8 Louisville (8-1) on Friday (7 p.m.) in their most significant challenge to date.

CU took command Wednesday night with an 18-4 first half run, led 37-17 at halftime and cruised past CSU (2-5) in the final 20 minutes. Buffs coach **Linda Lappe** used 12 players and nine of them scored, topped by **Brittany Wilson's** 13. **Jen Reese** and **Jamee Swan** contributed 11 each and **Arielle Roberson** added 10. CU's bench outscored CSU's 33-5.

"Sometimes these games are a little bit tough to play but I felt like we got better in that game at some different things and that's what I like about our team," Lappe said. "For us, it's all about us right now and us continuing to get better. It's about us continuing to get better at some things or multiple things. I thought our players played hard and rebounded very, very well in this game."

Momentum gained from the Buffs' 69-62 comeback weekend win at Illinois obviously carried into mid-week. CU outrebounded CSU 59-26, outscored the visitors 30-18 in the paint and had 20 second-chance points to CSU's two.

The Buffs, who won 64-55 last season in Fort Collins, trailed once in the first half (2-0), but thereafter took control and led by 20 (37-17) at intermission. Following that two-point deficit, CU surged past CSU the 18-4 over the next 7 minutes to take a 16-point advantage (22-6) and never slowed down.

"We felt like we had to come out early, it's CSU, it's our rivalry game," Wilson said. "If we didn't punch them in the mouth we knew they would try to punch us first. Who doesn't get up for their rivalry game? We knew we had to come out strong in the beginning."

During that spurt, Brittany Wilson scored eight of her 10 first-half points, while Reese added five. At the 11:45 mark, the Buffs were shooting 53.3 percent (8-for-15) from the field while holding the Rams to 21.4 percent (3-for-14).

"Going in we knew we had to have an inside presence," Reese said. "No matter if they were sagging in, double-teaming and stuff like that we had kick-outs, I think everyone in the post did a great job on either making the shot or seeing the open player."

After CU's opening run to go ahead by 16, CSU never got closer than 11 points for the rest of the half. And the Buffs kept pouring it on, leading by 20 twice before the halftime buzzer.

Roberson, a three-time recipient of the Pac-12 Conference freshman of the week award in the season's first four weeks, added eight points to the Buffs' half-time total. She entered the game with an 18.5 average.

CU's second-half goal likely was to not lose interest and allow a CSU run. Mission accomplished. A "B-Wif" three-pointer and a **Rachel Hargis** layup on a nice fast break assist from **Chucky Jeffery** fashioned a 25-point lead (42-17) before the second half was 2 minutes old.

Less than 8 minutes later, after treys on consecutive possessions by freshman Lauren Huggins, senior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** and another by Huggins, the Buffs had pushed ahead by 30 (61-31).

The second half was only half done, but it was time for the Rams to say good-night.

BOULDER - The No. 20 Colorado women's basketball team rallied but couldn't catch California Sunday afternoon at the Coors Events Center, falling 53-49 to the No. 7 Bears.

Coming off a 57-40 loss on Friday night to No. 4 Stanford, CU dropped to 11-2 overall and 0-2 in the Pac-12 Conference. Cal improved to 12-1 and 2-0.

Chucky Jeffery (13) and Arielle Roberson (11) were the only two Buffs players in double figures. The Bears were led by Brittany Boyd's 15 points.

Sunday's first half immediately took on a defensive flavor and didn't change; the score was tied 24-24 at intermission. But for the Buffs, that was an improvement over their first-half production (14) against Stanford on Friday night.

On Sunday afternoon, neither CU nor California could manage more than a four-point advantage in the first 20 minutes. Both teams survived frigid stretches - the Buffs' covering 7:31 and producing just three points, while the Bears' dry spell went for 8:52 and yielded four points.

Not surprisingly, neither team had a player in double figures for the half, with Lexy Kresl's six points pacing the Buffs and Boyd's nine topping the Bears. Three of Cal's four leading scorers - seniors Layshia Clarendon and Talia Caldwell and junior Jennifer Brandon - were held scoreless in the first half. CU shot only 32 percent (8-for-25) while Cal checked in at 42.3 percent (11-for-26).

The Buffs got six consecutive points from Jeffery to start the second half. But as in the first half, creating any separation was a problem for both teams until Cal opened a pair of four-point leads.

The second of those disappeared on a free throw by Rachel Hargis at the 11:26 mark and a conventional three-point play by Roberson just under a minute later that tied the score at 38-38.

Three free throws by Boyd and Clarendon sent the Bears ahead 41-38 with 9:03 to play, and during the previous 9 minutes the Buffs were suffering through another frigid shooting spell (2-for-15).

Cal increased its lead to five (43-38) on a baseline jumper by Eliza Pierre with 7:35 to play. And when Caldwell hit one of two free throws with 6:59 remaining, the Buffs faced a six-point deficit (44-38).

A short jumper in the lane by Clarendon put Cal up 46-38, and with 6 minutes left Lappe called a timeout as her team's offensive malaise (2-for-17 over an 11:46 span) continued.

Jen Reese finally snapped the dry spell with a turnaround jumper from the right baseline (46-40) and Roberson followed with her second trey of the game to cut Cal's lead to 46-43 at the 4:41 mark.

But one of two foul shots by Boyd and a put-back by Reshanda Gray on Boyd's second miss sent the Bears back ahead by six (49-43), and one of two free throws by Clarendon made the Buffs' deficit seven (50-43).

Cal's eight-point lead (51-43) returned when Caldwell hit the first of two foul shots at the 2:53 mark - and time was slipping away for CU. A Jeffery basket with 1:59 left brought the Buffs to 51-45. Layouts by Jeffery and Brittany Wilson pulled them to 51-49 with 16.7 remaining.

Clarendon was fouled by "B-Wil" on the inbounds pass, and with 15.6 seconds showing Clarendon missed both shots. Jeffery and Caldwell battled for the second miss rebound and a tie ball was called. With 13.2 seconds left, the possession arrow favored Cal.

When inbounds pass was made, Clarendon was fouled again - this time by Hargis - and this time she made one of two to give the Bears a 52-49 edge with 10.3 seconds to play.

Lappe called time out, drew up a play - but a shot was never taken. Jeffery turned it over a drive to the basket and Cal got possession. Fouled with 4.5 seconds showing, Boyd missed both free throws but Afure Jemerigbe controlled the rebound.

She hit one of two free throws, giving the Bears a four-point lead and the win.

BOULDER – Linda Lappe's third Colorado women's basketball team is more balanced than her first two, but after a pair of Pac-12 Conference losses she wisely recognized that a stronger dose of **Chucky Jeffery** might be just as beneficial as balance.

After dropping consecutive home games to No. 4 Stanford and No. 7 California, Lappe and Jeffery talked - and on Tuesday night Jeffery responded. The senior point guard scored a season-high 28 points and collected 12 rebounds to lead No. 23 CU to its first Pac-12 win of the season, 67-57 over Utah at the Coors Events Center.

"Chucky came out a lot more aggressive," Lappe said. "She was tentative against Cal and Stanford...we needed more from her."

More is what Jeffery delivered, helping key a 20-3 second-half run as the Buffaloes (12-2, 1-2) finally pulled away from the uncooperative Utes (9-5, 0-3).

CU also was lights out from the free throw line, hitting 22 of 26 in the second half and 23 of 28 for the game. The Buffs' final nine points came from the foul line, and they sealed the win by sinking five of six free throws in the final 33 seconds.

Registering her 23rd career double-double (third this season), it was the type of trademark performance expected of Jeffery in her first three CU seasons. "And we still need that from her," Lappe said. "She knew when we needed to score...there are times when we need her to step up; she understands big possessions."

It wasn't as if Jeffery was completely unproductive against Stanford (17 points) and Cal (13). But she agreed with her coach about playing tentative to open Pac-12 play: "After the past two games, I watched film with coach...and I was tentative and wasn't looking to score. She just wanted me to be more aggressive. She told me when I'm more aggressive I make smarter and better decisions to create and help my teammates score as well."

The Buffs only led once in Tuesday's first half, and it took them 19 minutes to finally catch the Utes. They did it by closing the half on a 10-1 run, with eight of the points scored by Jeffery as CU took a 32-31 lead at intermission.

Behind Plouffe's 11 first-half points, Utah led by eight points on two occasions before CU shook itself awake. The Utes' last eight-point advantage (30-22) came on a pair of Wiciowski free throws with 4:42 remaining before the break.

That's when Jeffery went to work, getting eight of her 14 first-half points in the final 41/2 minutes. The Buffs' other basket was scored by freshman Jamee Swan, who finished with a career-high 11 boards and eight points in 22 minutes and was a catalyst in CU catching up in the first half, said Lappe: "She kept us in the game for a lot of the first half."

The Buffs' 32 first-half points gave them a nice start toward finally reaching 50 in their third conference home game. They managed only 40 and 49 in the two previous losses. But that wasn't a second-half focal point for the Buffs; scoring 49 and getting a one-point win would have been fine. They opened the second half with a basket by Swan, taking their largest lead (34-31) of the night to that point.

Plouffe answered for Utah (34-33), then got a trey by Rachel Messer to go up 36-34. Meagan Malcolm-Peck's layup tied the score at 36-36 before a 9-2 Utes run opened a 45-38 advantage for the visitors with just under 13 minutes to play.

It was the Buffs' turn to respond, and they did with an 11-1 run, with seven of the points made at the free throw line. The final pair by Brittany Wilson put CU up 49-46 with 8:49 left.

Jeffery took it from there. After hitting a short jumper, she got a steal at the other end, was fouled and hit two free throws for a 55-48 Buffs lead. And when the Utes misfired on their next possession, Jeffery made them pay with a three-pointer from the top of the key that completed CU's 20-3 surge and opened a 10-point lead (58-48) with 5:58 remaining.

The Utes pulled to within five points (62-57) when Plouffe made one of three free throws with 36.1 seconds to play. But the Buffs pulled away at the free throw line, hitting five of six free throws to pocket their first Pac-12 win.

BOULDER - Thanks to a strong second-half surge, the Colorado women's basketball team secured a 57-43 Pac-12 Conference win over Arizona State Friday night at the Coors Events Center.

Senior guard **Chucky Jeffery** earned her 24th career double-double and her fourth of the season with 19 points and 16 rebounds. Her rebound total was also a team season-high.

Redshirt freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** earned a career-high 11 rebounds and contributed seven points of her own. Overall, Colorado out-rebounded Arizona State 47-31.

"Like any Pac-12 game, it was very physical down there," Roberson said. "It's always a war, it's always a battle ... But we knew we had to box out and then go get the rebounds, not just let them try to come to us."

Forward **Jen Reese** and guard **Lexy Kresl**, both sophomores, added eight points each.

Strong defense from both teams kept the score and shooting percentages low, as Colorado shot just 37.8 percent from the field but held the Sun Devils to 23.6 percent.

One of the goals for Colorado was to keep ASU players from scoring around the rim. The Buffs executed that game plan well, forcing the Sun Devils to shoot 8-for-26 from beyond the arc.

"It was a very solid night defensively for us," said Colorado head coach **Linda Lappe**. "Knowing how Arizona State likes to score, they score a lot of baskets and layups at the rim, so one of our goals was to give up less than 10 layups. I think we gave them only a couple of wide-open layups."

The Buffs and the Sun Devils looked evenly matched in the first half as the lead changed seven lead times, but two three-pointers by Arizona State's Jada Blackwell and Haley Videckis put the Sun Devils up 26-22 at the half. Neither team shot particularly well in the first half, as CU was 32.1 percent from the field and ASU was 36.0.

After intermission, though, the Buffs found the energy they had been lacking. With 14:30 remaining, Colorado went on a 13-0 run capped by a Kresl three-pointer to go up 12 (44-32).

"We have to start fast and finish strong, that's our motto. We say that before every game," Jeffery said. "We just kept going. Once you attack them, you keep them on their heels a little bit."

The Buffs held onto the momentum from that point on, gaining their largest lead of the game, 17, on a Jeffery free throw with less than a minute remaining.

"Even when they started hitting some outside shots, we stayed steady," Lappe said. "We didn't panic, and I thought that allowed us to pull away in the second half."

Jeffery said part of what allowed the Buffs to pull away in the second half was recognizing ASU's key scorers and guarding them with more intensity. Videckis, who was the Sun Devils' leading scorer in the first half with 11 points, was shut out in the second half.

"I thought we did a much better job on (Videckis) in the second half, she hurt us a lot in the first half," Lappe said. "We barred down and knew where she was. Arielle (Roberson) got the assignment on her for a large part, Jen (Reese) guarded her for a little while, and our guards understood where she was in the second half as well."

The Buffs also showed their strength off the bench once again, as three non-starters — Reese, sophomore **Jasmine Sborov** and junior **Ashley Wilson** — scored a combined 14 points on the night.

With the win, Colorado improves to 14-2 overall and 3-2 in the Pac-12. The Sun Devils fall to 10-7 overall and 2-3 in conference play.

BOULDER - The Colorado women's basketball team executed its game plan in every category Sunday afternoon to earn a decisive 79-36 win over Arizona at the Coors Events Center.

It was the Buffs' fourth straight Pac-12 Conference win, with the 43-point margin of victory the eighth-largest in CU history in conference play.

"Obviously I'm really happy with how that game turned out," said CU head coach **Linda Lappe**. "We had very few mental or physical errors, which was fun to see. It's very rare that you see both of those things happen on the same night."

Senior guard **Chucky Jeffery**'s performance (11 points, five rebounds and six assists) made her the first player in school history to earn 1,400 points, 800 rebounds and 400 assists in her career.

The Buffs started strong over the Wildcats, taking on a 7-0 run to start the game and building that lead for the rest of the half. CU shot 56.7 percent from the field and 66.7 percent from beyond the arc in the first half and held Arizona to 23.3 percent from the field and 14.3 from three-point range.

By intermission, Colorado was up 43-15, its largest halftime lead in conference play since leading Kansas 42-14 in February 2003. Hitting a jumper with nine seconds remaining in the half, freshman guard **Kylesha Weston** became the ninth player to score for CU in the first 20 minutes.

CU held onto that momentum for the rest of the game, going up by 46, the largest lead of the game, on a Weston basket with four minutes to go.

But even with such a decisive lead, the Buffs never lost energy or focus.

"When you're on a roll, you just continue staying on a roll," said redshirt freshman forward **Arielle Roberson**, who scored a game-high 12 points on her 20th birthday. "You've got to continue to stay focused. In the timeouts, coach would say, 'Stay focused, stay solid,' and I think that helped."

By the final buzzer, CU had a 43-point lead over the Wildcats and had played nearly its entire bench, including walk-on guard **Alexus Atchley** in the final minutes. Weston, who was recruited to the team as a true point guard, gained a valuable 17 minutes of playing time at that position.

Four CU players - Roberson, Jeffery, sophomore guard **Lexy Kresl** and freshman forward **Jamee Swan** - scored in double figures, while five other CU players added at least six points.

"We have a lot of players that can score, and you could see that (Sunday)," Lappe said. "I thought our bench played great. From the very first second when the first one came in, we didn't slow down at all. In fact, we pushed the tempo. . . . I think everybody that came off the bench was ready, brought a lot of energy, and there was no disruption of flow, so you have to credit our players for that."

All-conference guard Davellyn Whyte led the Wildcats in scoring with 11, nine of which were in the first half. Lappe said junior guard **Brittany Wilson** stepped up her defense on Whyte to shut her down in the second half.

"I thought Brittany did a really good job on her, staying down on her face," Lappe said. "Davellyn Whyte is a very talented player, has some great offensive skills, and I thought Brittany stepped up to the challenge."

Overall, CU shot 50 percent from the field and held Arizona to just 25 percent. The Buffs also out-rebounded the visitors 51-26, with Swan and junior guard **Ashley** recoding eight boards each.

And while the Buffs' combined 51 rebounds, 21 assists and 79 points are something to be proud of, Kresl said Sunday afternoon wasn't about the stats.

"We all played together," Kresl said. "It was definitely a team effort and not one person was trying to get their points or steals or anything. It wasn't about statistics, it was all about the win and trying to play together."

Colorado improves to 15-2 overall and 4-2 in Pac-12 play, its best start since the 2003-04 NCAA Tournament team began its season 18-2. With the loss, Ariz

STANFORD, Calif. - The Colorado women's basketball team encountered another in-game lapse on Sunday against Stanford, rallied from it, but couldn't finish its comeback and fell 69-56 to the No. 6 Cardinal at Maples Pavilion.

The No. 20 Buffaloes held their own for most of the first half, staying within single digits of the Cardinal by halftime (35-26). That gap could've been smaller, however, had the Buffs not given up 10 first-half turnovers and allowed the Cardinal to go on a 9-3 run to cap the first half.

Colorado didn't regain its momentum until midway through the second half, and with 14:25 remaining, Stanford had already built a 21-point lead from which CU could not recover. That slow second-half start, CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said, was reminiscent of another scoring drought the Buffs had the last time they played Stanford - a 57-40 loss on Jan. 4.

"In both games that we've played these guys, we've had a stretch where we have not played very well, and we've just given them way too many opportunities," Lappe said. "We weren't making them work to get that 21-point lead, and that's probably the most disappointing thing, in both games. Last time it was at the beginning of the game, this time it was right before half into the second half."

With the loss, the Buffaloes drop to 15-4 overall and 4-4 in Pac-12 Conference play, while Stanford improves to 18-2 and 7-1 in the Pac-12.

The two teams were ranked No. 1 and 2 in the conference in scoring defense entering the game, with the Buffs holding opponents to 52.7 points per game and the Cardinal 52.9. On Sunday, though, Stanford's defense prevailed, forcing 18 Colorado turnovers.

Despite its ineffective opening to the second half, CU had nearly 15 minutes to play and wasn't about to give up. The Buffs brought themselves back into contention with a 12-0 run, trimming the score to 51-42 with 10:45 remaining. The Cardinal's lead eventually shrunk to just seven (53-46) as **Brittany Wilson** hit a three with eight minutes on the clock.

But every time Colorado brought the energy, Stanford responded. With 6:10 remaining, Stanford made what turned out to be a five-point play: forward Joslyn Tinkle hit a three-pointer, and missed her "and-1" shot, which forward Chiney Ogwumike rebounded for a layup.

It was the spark the Cardinal needed to bring the game home.

"We didn't close out with our high hands, we run into the shooter and then we don't box out on the free throw, and that was a huge deal at that point in the game," Lappe said. "It gave them a lot of momentum."

Though the Buffs kept fighting, they would never get closer than 10 points.

Lappe said that while Stanford brought a high level of play to the game, many of the Buffs' mistakes were of their own creation.

"We didn't do nearly enough that it was going to take to win tonight," Lappe said, "and I felt like we controlled a lot of that."

But junior guard **Ashley Wilson**, who scored five of her seven points during CU's second-half comeback attempt, said her team had to feel that a win was still possible until the final buzzer.

"It's just never giving up. No matter what position we're in, we have to fight, fight 'till when the horn goes off," Wilson said. "We've just got to be ready to bounce back. That's all we can do every single time is bounce back and not let it defeat us."

Freshman forward **Jamee Swan** led Colorado in scoring with 14 points off the bench, while senior guard **Chuckey Jeffery** added 13. Jeffery and redshirt freshman forward Arielle Roberson grabbed a team-high seven boards each, helping CU to out-rebound the Cardinal 39-33.

Stanford's Ogwumike led all scorers with 20, adding 12 rebounds to earn her 15th double-double of the season. Three other Stanford players - Tinkle, guard Toni Kokenis and guard Amber Orrange - also scored in double figures, as the Cardinal hit 49.1 percent from the field compared to CU's 36.1 percent.
