THE GAME: No. 23 (AP)/25 (USAT) ranked University of Colorado hosts the University of Utah in a Pac-12 Conference game on Tuesday, Jan. 8, 2013, at 6 p.m. at the Coors Events Center.

BROADCAST: Tuesday's game will be televised nationally on the Pac-12 Network. Ann Schatz will handle play-by-play duties with Rosalyn Gold-Owunde providing the color commentary. Tuesday's game will be broadcast live on KKZN AM 760. Mike Rice will have the play-by-play with Carol Callan of USA Basketball providing the color commentary.

OPENING TIP: Opening the Pac-12 schedule with No. 4 Stanford and No. 7 California marked just the third time Colorado has played back-to-back top 10 teams, and first time ever in the regular season. The Buffaloes saw consecutive top 10 teams in the 1993 and 2002 NCAA Tournaments.

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado had a challenging start to the Pac-12 Conference season, dropping home games to No. 4 (AP)/3 (USAT) Stanford on Jan. 4 (57-40) and No. 7 (AP & USAT) California on Jan. 6 (53-40). It was CU's first two losses of the season, snapping an 11-game winning streak to begin the season. The Buffaloes 11-0 start was the fourth-best in team history and ties for their eighth

Colorado finished the nonconference regular season with an 84-39 win over New Mexico on Dec. 29. The win clinched the Buffaloes' second consecutive perfect nonconference season, and third in school history (1992-93). Colorado will continue a string of 24 non-conference regular season wins into next season. The Buffaloes are 31-4 in the nonconference season under head coach **Linda Lappe**.

Despite being held under 50 in both games last weekend, Colorado's offense has played well overall, averaging 69.7 points per game, ranking fourth in the Pac-12. The Buffaloes hit the 80-point barrier three times during the nonconference schedule. CU is shooting 43 percent from the field, and 47 percent inside the 3-point arc. Colorado has shared the ball well averaging 14.4 assists per game, and it has come from a multitude of players with seven Buffaloes already in double-figures for assists. Colorado also has held a sizeable advantage in rebounds, and ranked 16th in NCAA Division I through games of Jan. 6 (+10.3).

Defensively, the Buffaloes are holding teams to 54.7 points per game on 35.3 percent from the field. Colorado ranks in the top five of the Pac-12 in 15 of 21 statistical categories, including third in scoring defense, rebounding defense (32.5 rpg), steals (10.5 spg) and turnover margin (+2.8).

Redshirt freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** leads Colorado and ranks eighth in the Pac-12 in scoring at 14.9 points per game. A three-time Pac-12 Freshman of the Week, Roberson also ranks second on the team in rebounding (5.8 rpg) and field-goal percentage (.496). She scored 11 points in the loss to California, extending her school record for consecutive games scoring in double-figures to begin her a CU career to 13. Along with her scoring success, Roberson ranks 10th in field-goal percentage, 12th in offensive rebounds (2.8 orpg) and 20th in rebounding on the Pac-12 leaderboard.

All-Pac-12 guard **Chucky Jeffery** leads the team in assists (4.4 apg), rebounds (8.0 rpg) and steals (2.4 spg), while ranking second in scoring (12.7 ppg). She led Colorado through the opening Pac-12 weekend at 15.0 points and 7.0 rebounds per game. Jeffery ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.4), and is also fifth in assists and defensive rebounds (5.8), sixth in steals, seventh in overall rebounding, eighth in free-throw percentage (.750) and 15th

Junior guard **Brittany Wilson**, who came off the bench for this first time this season against Stanford, ranks second on the team in steals (1.6 spg) and assists (2.4 apg) while coming in at fourth in scoring at 8.2 points per contest. She's tied for the team lead with 15 3-pointers and has hit 81 percent from the free-throw line. Wilson ranks 13th in 3-point field-goals made (1.2 3mpg) and 15th in 3-point percentage (.319) and on the Pac-12 leaderboard.

Sophomore forward **Jen Reese** has made a successful return from an eye injury that kept her out of the final nine games of 2011-12. She is third on the team in scoring (9.6 ppg) and rebounding (5.6 rpg) while hitting 48.6 percent from the field. She set a career-high with 16 points in the win over Utah Valley. Reese has scored in double-figures in seven of the last 10 contests. On the Pac-12 charts Reese is 13th in field-goal percentage.

Junior center **Rachel Hargis** is the only Buffalo to start all 13 games. A career 33 percent shooter entering the season, Hargis has made the most of her opportunity hitting 49 percent (31-of-63) through 13 games. Hargis tied a season-high with seven rebounds against California while also contributing six points and three blocks. She also has 14 assists on the year, after registering just 17 in 35 games as a sophomore, and a team-best 16 blocked shots, ranking 11th in the Pac-12 (1.2 bpg). Hargis had a career- and team-season high seven blocked shots against Louisville, just one off the school single-game record.

Sophomore guard **Lexy Kresl** tied a career-high with 20 points in the win over New Mexico. She hit a perfect 5-of-5 from the 3-point arc which tied a school record for 3's made without a miss, matching Jenny Roulter who also hit 5-of-5 against Missouri on Feb. 13, 2002. She made her only attempt in the Utah Valley game, giving her a 6-of-6 streak over those two games.

Colorado has seven players averaging between four and 12 points per game. Five different Buffaloes have led the team in scoring through the first 13 games.

ABOUT THE UTES: Utah is 9-4 overall and 0-2 in the Pac-12 Conference. After winning their first seven games of the season the Utes have lost three straight and four of their last six, all of which came at

home. Utah is averaging 64.7 points per game on 42 percent shooting. Defensively, Utah allows just 54 points per game and opponents 35 percent from the field. The Utes average 6.3 3-point field goals per game, hitting on 36 percent beyond the arc.

Utah's junior front line of Taryn Wicijowski and Michelle Plouffe are in a virtual tie for the team scoring and rebounding lead at 15.8 and 7.5 per game. In fact Plouffe's lead in scoring is a single point (206 to 205) while Wicijowski has a similar advantage in total rebounds (98 to 97). Plouffe is Utah's top 3-point shooter with 23 and also has the team lead with 30 steals. Wicijowski is Utah's top field goal shooter at 55 percent. Senior guard Iwalani Rodrigues ranks third on the team at 12.2 points and 4.6 rebounds per game.

Anthony Levrets is in his third season at Utah with a record of 43-37.

THE SERIES: This will be the 21st meeting between Colorado and Utah with the Utes holding an 11-9 series edge. Colorado won two of three meetings last year, the first season in the Pac-12 for both programs. The teams split the regular season, with the road team winning in both games. Colorado took the rubber match as the No. 10 seed Buffaloes knocked off the No. 7 seed Utes, 55-41, in the first round of the Pac-12 Tournament in Los Angeles.

Linda Lappe is 2-1 against Utah as a head coach. Anthony Levrets is 1-2 against the Buffaloes as a head coach.

CONNECTIONS: CU assistant coach **Jonas Chatterton** is a Utah graduate ('01) and native of Salt Lake City. Utah has one Colorado native on its roster, Rachel Messer of Castle Rock who played for ThunderRidge. Messer was a teammate of Colorado's **Brenna** and **Meagan Malcolm-Peck**, who played at ThunderRidge as freshmen and sophomores.

UNUSUAL SCHEDULE: In a new scheduling twist this year, Colorado will turn around and travel to Salt Lake City to play Utah again on Sunday. All Pac-12 teams have similar home-and-home series in the same week with their respective travel partners.

The Buffaloes have played several opponents over the years in back-to-back meetings, but most have involved a final regular season game and opening round conference tournament contest, most recently against Kansas State in 2008-09. Colorado has faced an opponent in back-to-back games twice during the regular season, both times involving Colorado State in the 1974-75 and 1975-76 seasons.

NATIONALLY RANKED: Colorado dropped three spots to No. 23 in the latest Associated Poll released on Monday. Colorado received 121 votes to make its fourth-straight appearance.

The Buffaloes have a long history of rankings in the AP poll, dating back to the 1980-81 season. This week's ranking marks the 162nd time Colorado has appeared in the AP poll, trailing only Stanford, USC and UCLA among Pac-12 Conference schools. The current four-week run in the poll is the Buffaloes longest since a four-week stretch from Dec. 24, 2007-Jan. 14, 2008.

Colorado debuted at No. 25 in the *USA Today Sports* Top 25 women's basketball coaches poll released on Jan. 1.

Colorado is ranked in the coaches' poll for the first time since coming in at No. 24 in the final poll of the 2003-04 season (April 2004). That was also the last time the Buffaloes were ranked in both major women's basketball polls, finishing 17th in the final Associated Press poll that year.

LOS ANGELES - The Colorado Buffaloes cruised to a 19-point first-half lead on Wednesday night and eliminated Utah 55-41 in the first round of the Pac-12 Conference women's basketball tournament.

No. 10 seed CU (18-12) plays No. 2 seed California on Thursday (6 p.m., MST) at USC's Galen Center. Utah (15-15) was the tournament's seventh seed.

During the regular season, the Buffs and Utes couldn't beat each other at home. CU opened Pac-12 play with a 58-52 win on New Year's Eve in Salt Lake City. Utah visited Boulder almost two months later and won 61-56 in overtime. But Wednesday night was all CU, almost all the time.

Brittany Wilson led the Buffs with 21 points - 18 in the first half - and Chucky Jeffery added 20 - 14 in the second half. CU outrebounded Utah 43-35 and held the Utes to 25.5 percent shooting from the field (13-of-51).

CU, which closed the regular season with a 10-point win against Oregon State, trailed three times in the first half, falling behind 3-0 on a three-pointer by Cheyenne Wilson on the game's first possession. But that basket and the opening six minutes were in no way indicative of what was coming.

After Utah's Wilson hit another to put her team up 10-8, CU took control with its pair of Wilsons - twins Brittany and Ashley. Brittany, who had scored CU's first seven points, hit a short jumper to tie the score at 10-10 - and the Buffs kept on going...and going.

After Cheyenne Wilson's trey with just over 14 minutes left before intermission, Utah didn't get another field goal until the half's final minute. During that span, CU launched a 22-1 run and shot ahead 30-11.

Utah forward Taryn Wicijowski worked inside for a pair of baskets in the last minute, drawing the Utes to 32-15 at halftime. But the first 20 minutes were a nightmare for Utah, which hit only six of its 26 field goal attempts (23.1 percent).

The Utes' 15 points were the lowest by a Buffs opponent since the 1997 team held Iowa State to 12 in that season's Big 12 tournament.

Brittany Wilson paced the Buffs' first-half surge with 18 points, tying Chucky Jeffery for the most productivity in one half this season.

But could CU keep the hammer down and the intensity up?

After the Buffs missed their first two shots of the second half and the Utes hit their first two, CU coach Linda Lappe called a timeout with 18:27 remaining. The Buffs came out of it... and missed another shot.

Utah got one of two free throws from Michelle Plouffe before Julie Seabrook banked in a short jumper from the right side for CU's first points of the half at the 17:30 mark. The Buffs led 34-20, then 36-20 when hit a runner from the right baseline.

Had order (for CU) been restored?

Temporarily.

But the Buffs were being abused inside by the 6-3 Wicijowski, who scored seven of the Utes' first 10 points in the second half and brought her team to within 38-25 with just under 15 minutes to play. Six minutes later, a pair of free throws by Iwalani Rodrigues pulled Utah to within a dozen (42-30).

When Wicijowski followed with two free throws, the Buffs' lead was down to 42-32, then 42-34 on a basket by Plouffe at the 6-minute mark. Utah cut the deficit to seven (43-36) on another pair of Wicijowski foul shots.

But the Buffs answered, getting one of two free throws from Jeffery, a Jeffery layup and a two free throws by Brittany Wilson to restore a 12-point lead (48-36) with 4:26 left.

Utah never got closer than 11 the rest of the way, with Jeffery hitting seven of eight free throws in the final 2:52 to seal it for the Buffs.

The Buffaloes had received votes in the previous two coaches polls, finally cracking the top 25 Tuesday with 60 votes. Last week's ranking marked the 152nd time Colorado has appeared in the coaches' poll dating back to the 1988-89 campaign.

LAPPE AND COLORADO IN THE POLLS: Head coach **Linda Lappe** joined some elite company when the Buffaloes received their first AP ranking in five years. She is only one of eight NCAA Division I women's head coaches to have played for an AP ranked team, and then return to lead that same program into the AP poll. Overall she is the 31st person to play for and coach an AP ranked program.

The Buffaloes were ranked for 29 weeks during Lappe's playing career (1998-03) including 27 straight from Jan. 22, 2001 through the end of her junior year (March 11, 2002). CU's highest AP ranking during that span was No. 10, on March 4, 2002.

JEFFERY'S HEADLINER WEEK: Senior guard **Chucky Jeffery** led the Buffaloes to their first *Associated Press* ranking in five seasons and their first top-10 win in over 10 years, and as a result picked up some well-deserved conference and national recognition.

On Dec. 17, Jeffery was named the espnW National Player of the Week and Pac-12 Conference Player of the Week for the week of Dec 10-16. She also received national and Pac-12 Player of the Week honors from collegesportsmadness.com.

On Dec. 18, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) named Jeffery its Ann Meyers Drysdale Women's National Player of the Week.

Jeffery averaged 18 points, 9.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists while shooting 46 percent from the field and 80 percent from the free-throw line in wins over Denver and No. 8 ranked Louisville.

Against Louisville she had a game-high and personal season-best 22 points along with seven rebounds, four assists and one steal as the Buffaloes claimed their first win over a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 5 Stanford in the 2002 NCAA Sweet 16. Jeffery recorded season highs from the 3-point line (2-of-5) and the foul line (8-10) as she became the 16th player in team history to reach 1,300 career points.

Jeffery had 14 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and two steals in the road win over Denver on Dec. 11. She notched her second double-double of the season, and 22nd of her career, tying Sandy Bean (1978-82) for fifth on CU's all-time list.

Jeffery's Pac-12 Player of the Week honor is her second, as she received the same award on Dec. 5, 2011.

FAST OUT OF THE GATE: Colorado began the season with 11-straight wins for the second straight year; its fourth start of 11-0. The Buffaloes began last season 12-0, tying the second-best mark in team history. CU's best start was a 15-0 mark to begin the 1992-93

MORE ON THE BOARDS: Colorado ranked 16th in NCAA Division I in rebounding margin at +10.3 through games of Jan. 6, the third best mark in the Pac-12. The Buffaloes have either tied or led the rebounding battle in 11 of 13 games this season, coming up on the short end for the first time in the Stanford loss. The Buffaloes have enjoyed double-digit margins in seven games.

The Buffaloes grabbed a season-high 59 rebounds in the win over Colorado State, their most since also recording 59 against Bowling Green on Nov. 23, 2001. CU had 24 offensive rebounds, nearly matching Colorado State's overall total (26). Colorado's 24 offensive rebounds were its most since it had 24 at Iowa State on Feb. 18, 1996.

Colorado's +33 advantage against the Rams tied for the ninth largest single-game margin in team history, most recently achieved against San Francisco on Nov. 30, 2011 (53-20).

Colorado had 50 rebounds against Denver, hitting the 50 mark for the second straight game for the first time since grabbing 50 against UC Irvine and 52 against Illinois-Chicago in the first two games of the 2009-10 season.

CU's 109 rebounds over a two-game span are its most since hitting the same number during the 2001 Coors Classic (59 vs. Bowling Green, 50 vs. Houston). The Buffaloes 46 offensive rebounds during that stretch are their most since grabbing 48 in back-to-back games in December 1994 (25 vs. Montana State, 23 vs. Notre Dame).

SUCCESS ON THE ROAD: Colorado is 3-0 away from Boulder this season and is 12-7 in its last 19 true road contests since the tail end of the 2010-11 campaign. Prior to the start of this run, The Buffaloes had just five wins in their previous 37 road games dating back to the 2008 Big 12 Conference schedule.

The Buffaloes are averaging 76.7 points on 45 percent shooting in those three road contests. CU has also held its opponent to 60 points per game and enjoys a plus-14 rebound margin.

Colorado scored an overall season-high 83 points at Denver, the most in a true road contest since scoring 83 in a 3-point loss at Colorado State on Nov. 30, 2005. CU's 10-point halftime lead was its largest on the road since leading Colorado State 38-22 on Nov. 20, 2011

Colorado's win at Illinois was its first road win against a major conference opponent in a nonconference regular season game since defeating No. 20/17 ranked Vanderbilt, 62-51, on Dec. 9, 2007. The Buffaloes trailed by six at halftime against the Illini, allowing Colorado to claim its largest halftime deficit overcome to win on the road since defeating Missouri 80-79 in overtime on Feb. 23, 2010 after trailing by seven at the break (43-36).

Colorado's 23-point win at UMKC, was its biggest on the road since

BENCH PRODUCTION: Colorado is getting good production from its bench to the tune of 22.9 points (33 percent) and 20.1 rebounds (47 percent) per game. Sophomore forward **Jen Reese** has headed

the bench effort averaging 9.6 points and 5.6 rebounds, ranking third on the team in both categories.

Colorado scored a season-high 42 bench points in the win over UMKC. The bulk of those came from freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** who scored 23 points in 19 minutes on 9-of-12 from the field in her lone game off the bench this season. Her 23 bench points are tied for the second most in the past 10 years and her nine field goals are the most. Only Bianca Smith, with 25 points off the bench against San Jose State on Dec. 22, 1999, had a bigger bench game in the last 10 years.

ROBERSON DOMINATES PAC-12 HONORS: Forward **Arielle Roberson** has won the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week award three times this season. The Pac-12 has added Freshman of the Week to its weekly honors for the first time this season.

In her most recent award on Dec. 2, Roberson averaged 19.5 points on 72 percent from the field (13-of-18) and 71 percent from the foul line (12-of-17) in wins over Wyoming and Illinois. She scored a career and team season-high 25 points, including a critical, late, 3-point basket, to lead Colorado to a 69-62 road win at Illinois as the Buffaloes claimed their 19th straight regular season nonconference victory.

She hit 7-of-8 from the field against the Illini and sank a team season-high 10 free throws on 14 attempts. Roberson also had five rebounds, three steals and an assist against Illinois. Earlier in the week, Roberson netted 14 points on 6-of-10 from the field in the home win over Wyoming.

Roberson earned the inaugural Pac-12 Freshman of the Week award on Nov. 12 after scoring 16 points on 7-of-13 shooting with six rebounds, five steals, two assists and two blocks in her collegiate debut - a 70-65 win over Idaho on Nov. 11. Her second citation came on Nov. 26 after averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds en route to Omni Hotels Classic MVP honors.

Her three weekly conference awards in one season are the most since Brittany Spears won four Big 12 Conference Rookie of the Week honors in 2007-08.

ARIELLE & ANDRE: The Roberson's are the only brother/sister tandem on the 2012-13 basketball rosters from the same school in the Pac-12 Conference. They're one of five brother/sister tandems on 2012-13 basketball rosters in Division I. The Big Ten has two tandems, followed by one each in the ACC, Mountain West and the Pac-12 Conferences. CU has another brother/sister pair on the ski team with freshmen Maria and Gustav Nordstrom from Sweden.

BUFFS EXPERIENCED FROM DEEP: While Colorado looks to continue an inside-outside balance on its 2012-13 squad, there is no questioning its experience from shooting from the perimeter.

The Buffaloes have four players with at least 50 career 3-point field goals, and all four rank among CU's career Top 20. Senior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** tops current Buffs with 87 and ranks 11th on CU's all-time list. Junior **Brittany Wilson** is right behind Malcolm-Peck in 12th with 85. **Lexy Kresl**, who set CU's single-season freshman record in 2011-12 at 63 is 14th with 78. Senior **Chucky Jeffery** rounds out the current Buffs at 17th with 58.

JEFFERY MOVING UP CAREER LADDERS: Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** is within four assists and four steals of moving into the career top five in both categories. She is currently sixth in assists at 411 needing four to catch Laurie Welch (1978-82) for fifth. Jeffery is sixth in career steals at 245 needing four to catch Amy Mathern (1989-93).

On CU's career charts Jeffery also ranks seventh in rebounds (763), 14th in scoring (1,370) and free-throws made (278), 15th in field-goals made (517), 16th and blocks (60) and 17th in 3-point field goals (58).

In other miscellaneous categories Jeffery is also tied with Sandy Bean (1978-82) for fifth in double-doubles (22), is seventh in double-figure rebounding games (24) and 11th in double-figure scoring games (75).

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado picked up its 14th all-time win over a top-10 ranked opponent with its 70-66 win over No. 8 Louisville on Dec. 14. The win marked the Buffaloes' first over a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 5 Stanford in the 2002 NCAA Sweet 16. It was the first top-10 win as an unranked team since knocking off No. 7 Texas Tech 63-49 on Jan. 11, 1997.

The win snapped a three-game slide against ranked teams and, at 1-2 on the season, the Buffaloes are 3-7 against ranked opponents under Linda Lappe. CU is 62-144 all-time against ranked opponents, including a 38-47 mark at home.

The Buffaloes played just two games against ranked teams in 2011-12, both against Stanford. Colorado is on track to at least triple that number this year as Pac-12 rivals California, UCLA and Stanford have solid footing in both polls.

COLORADO BASKETBALL'S SOLID START: Colorado's men's and women's basketball teams each began the 2012-13 season at 6-0, before the men suffered their first loss of the season on Dec. 1 at Wyoming. It is the first time the men's and women's programs have both started with six or more wins since 1982-83 when both teams started 7-0.

OMNI HOTELS CLASSIC CHAMPS: Colorado improved to 42-10 all-time in its home holiday classic and has won four straight and 16 of the 25 tournament titles contested. The Buffaloes won this year's classic by defeating Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and San Diego State. Freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** was named the MVP after averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds over the two-game tournament. She is the first CU freshman to win that honor in the 26-year history of the tournament. Senior guard **Chucky Jeffery** was named to the Omni Classic All-Tournament team after averaging 13 points, 7.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals over the two games. She is the first four-time Omni All-Tournament team honoree, earning MVP honors in 2010 and '11.

BUFFS SIGN FOUR TO NLI's: **Zoe Beard-Fails**, **Desiree Harris**, **Haley Smith** and **Briana Watts** have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2013-14 head coach Linda Lappe announced on Wednesday, the first day of the NCAA's early signing period.

Beard-Fails is a 6-2 forward from Herndon, Va., and attends Georgetown Day School in Washington D.C. She missed all but five games of her junior year with an ACL and meniscus tear, but is nearing full strength as her senior season commences. The 51st rated forward in the nation according to ESPN.com's HoopGurlz, Beard-Fails averaged 27 points and nearly 18 rebounds as a sophomore for Georgetown Day in 2010-11, earning fourth team All-Met honors from the Washington Post.

Harris is a 5-8 guard from Oakland, Calif., who attends St. Joseph Notre Dame High school in Alameda. She averaged 23.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 2.7 assists as a junior, helping the Pilots to the North Coast Section championship. Harris was a CIF All-State Division V second team selection as well as a Bay Shore Athletic League second team pick.

Smith, a 6-0 wing from Sammamish, Wash., is getting ready for her senior season at Skyline High School. A do-it-all player for the Spartans, she averaged around seven points, five rebounds and just under two assists and steals per game as a junior. Smith is in her fourth varsity season with the Spartans and also has had a successful club career playing with the Tree of Hope program. ESPN.com's HoopGurlz has her as the top prospect in the state of Washington and the 20th ranked wing in the nation.

Watts, a 6-4 center from Fresno, Calif., will make her debut with Clovis West High School this winter after playing her first three years at rival Buchanan. She was the first commit of the 2013 class. Watts averaged nearly six points and just over six rebounds per game for Buchanan as a junior, contributing to the Bears' 18-9 record and a spot in the CIF Central Section Division I semifinals.

BUFFS IN OPENERS: With its win over Idaho, Colorado improved to 34-5 (.872) all-time in season openers and 37-2 (.949) in all-time home openers. The Buffs opened the season with a home game for the 27th time in 39 seasons, and moved to a perfect 27-0 in those instances.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado improved to a perfect 23-0 in exhibition games with its 87-38 win over Western State University Colorado. The Buffaloes have outscored their exhibition opponents by just over 31 points per game (86.0 to 54.7).

Colorado's 38 points allowed against WSCU were its fewest in an exhibition since the Buffaloes beat Colorado Mines 58-31 in 2007. The 49-point margin was the most in an exhibition since the Buffaloes defeated Spartak Moscow 115-55 in 2002.

The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU's exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams.

BUFFS PICKED NINTH: Coming off its first 20-win season in eight years, Colorado was picked to finish ninth in the Pac-12 in 2013, according to the league's annual Preseason Coaches Poll and Media Poll.

In the Coaches Poll, 2012 NCAA Women's Final Four participant Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12, compiling the maximum amount of points (121) and first place votes (11) possible. 2012 Pac-12 runner-up and NCAA participant California claimed the other first place vote and was second in the poll (109). UCLA was third with 100 points followed by USC (91), Arizona State and Oregon State (67), Utah (56), Washington (54), Colorado (49), Washington State (40), Oregon (20) and Arizona (18).

Colorado's ninth place preseason rating is its highest in the last nine years since Buffaloes were picked to finish seventh in the 2004-05 Big 12 Coaches Poll.

The Media Poll was nearly identical in order. Stanford was picked to win with 12 first place votes and 166 total. California was second with 155 points and two first place votes. UCLA was third (136) followed by USC (123), Oregon State (106), Arizona State (100), Washington (80), Utah (72), Colorado (57), Washington State (47), Oregon (25) and Arizona (22).

MEDIA TABS JEFFERY: Along with picking the order of Pac-12 finish, the media selected a preseason All-Pac-12 team. Senior guard Chucky Jeffery was one of six individuals selected, along with California's Layshia Clarendon, Washington's Jazmine Davis, Stanford's Chiney Ogumike, UCLA's Markel Walker and Arizona's Davellyn Whyte.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 375-128 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.746). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 23 of the previous 34 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado's regular season schedule will feature at least 11 regionally or nationally televised games in 2012-13. Colorado will play nine regular season games on the Pac-12 Networks, and a guaranteed one, and potentially more, during the Pac-12 Tournament, March 7-10, in Seattle.

A program-best six regular season games will be televised nationally while three more will be on one of the regional networks. CU's

first Pac-12 Tournament game will also be televised nationally, as would any ensuing round through the championship game, which will air Sunday, March 10, on ESPN2.

CU made its first television appearance on Dec. 11 at Denver on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain. The Buffaloes made their Pac-12 Network on Jan. 4 against defending league champion Stanford; their first of four straight televised games on the network. Colorado will have five straight road games televised beginning with Utah on Jan. 13, through a Super Bowl Sunday matchup at USC on Feb. 3. CU's final regular season televised game will be Feb. 8 at home against Oregon State.

Entering the 2012-13 season, CU has appeared on 99 regional or national telecasts over the previous 11 seasons.

BOULDER – More challenging times are ahead for the Colorado women's basketball team, but the Buffaloes appear to be steeling themselves for whatever comes their way.

Unbeaten CU (7-0) rolled past Colorado State 72-46 on Wednesday night in the first game of a women's/men's doubleheader at the Coors Events Center.

All things considered, it was a night for fun and frolic - but next week promises to bring the degree of difficulty to a higher level. The Buffs are off until Tuesday (7 p.m.) when they travel to the University of Denver (3-3), then host No. 8 Louisville (8-1) on Friday (7 p.m.) in their most significant challenge to date.

CU took command Wednesday night with an 18-4 first half run, led 37-17 at halftime and cruised past CSU (2-5) in the final 20 minutes. Buffs coach **Linda Lappe** used 12 players and nine of them scored, topped by **Brittany Wilson's** 13. **Jen Reese** and **Jamee Swan** contributed 11 each and **Arielle Roberson** added 10. CU's bench outscored CSU's 33-5.

"Sometimes these games are a little bit tough to play but I felt like we got better in that game at some different things and that's what I like about our team," Lappe said. "For us, it's all about us right now and us continuing to get better. It's about us continuing to get better at some things or multiple things. I thought our players played hard and rebounded very, very well in this game."

Momentum gained from the Buffs' 69-62 comeback weekend win at Illinois obviously carried into mid-week. CU outrebounded CSU 59-26, outscored the visitors 30-18 in the paint and had 20 second-chance points to CSU's two.

The Buffs, who won 64-55 last season in Fort Collins, trailed once in the first half (2-0), but thereafter took control and led by 20 (37-17) at intermission. Following that two-point deficit, CU surged past CSU the 18-4 over the next 7 minutes to take a 16-point advantage (22-6) and never slowed down.

"We felt like we had to come out early, it's CSU, it's our rivalry game," Wilson said. "If we didn't punch them in the mouth we knew they would try to punch us first. Who doesn't get up for their rivalry game? We knew we had to come out strong in the beginning."

During that spurt, Brittany Wilson scored eight of her 10 first-half points, while Reese added five. At the 11:45 mark, the Buffs were shooting 53.3 percent (8-for-15) from the field while holding the Rams to 21.4 percent (3-for-14).

"Going in we knew we had to have an inside presence," Reese said. "No matter if they were sagging in, double-teaming and stuff like that we had kick-outs, I think everyone in the post did a great job on either making the shot or seeing the open player."

After CU's opening run to go ahead by 16, CSU never got closer than 11 points for the rest of the half. And the Buffs kept pouring it on, leading by 20 twice before the halftime buzzer.

Roberson, a three-time recipient of the Pac-12 Conference freshman of the week award in the season's first four weeks, added eight points to the Buffs' half-time total. She entered the game with an 18.5 average.

CU's second-half goal likely was to not lose interest and allow a CSU run. Mission accomplished. A "B-Wif" three-pointer and a **Rachel Hargis** layup on a nice fast break assist from **Chucky Jeffery** fashioned a 25-point lead (42-17) before the second half was 2 minutes old.

Less than 8 minutes later, after treys on consecutive possessions by freshman Lauren Huggins, senior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** and another by Huggins, the Buffs had pushed ahead by 30 (61-31).

The second half was only half done, but it was time for the Rams to say good-night.

DENVER – The unbeaten University of Colorado women's basketball team shook off a lethargic start, took control with an 8-0 run and never looked back in dispatching the University of Denver 83-63 here Tuesday night.

Now the Buffaloes can look ahead. Finally, they can focus on their biggest non-conference game - a Friday night game with No. 8 Louisville at the Coors Events Center. The Cardinals are 9-1, with their lone loss by one point (48-47) to archrival Kentucky.

"We feel really good with where we're at," CU coach **Linda Lappe** said of her team's 8-0 start. "We've seen a little of everything. Obviously Louisville will present a few different things we haven't seen and a different level of talent. But we're excited for it; it should be a really fun game. Hopefully we can get a crowd there. Our players have really been looking forward to this for a long time."

In winning for only the second time in Denver against the Pioneers, the Buffs got a season-high 19 points from **Brittany Wilson** and 14 points and 11 rebounds from **Chucky Jeffery**. Leading scorer **Arielle Roberson**, who entered the game with a 17.3-point average, added 11.

Morgan Van Riper-Rose kept the Pioneers close with 13 first-half points. She finished with a career-high 28.

DU defeated CU 70-69 in their most recent Magness Arena matchup on Nov. 16, 2010. The Buffs lead the series 6-2 and won for the third time this season against a Front Range opponent. Before making the trip down I-25 South, CU had beaten Wyoming (68-59) and Colorado State (72-46) in Boulder.

Tuesday's first half produced 11 lead changes, but they all occurred in the first 10 minutes. DU (4-5) took advantage of CU's sluggish start to go ahead by as many as five points (13-8) before the visitors roused themselves.

"It shouldn't have been like that, because it shows that we weren't ready," Jeffery said. "It should be flipped because (Louisville) was on our minds. We have to be prepared."

If it took a little longer for the Buffs to focus, once they got there they took command and made an 18-17 deficit their last of the game. They went on an 8-0 run, getting baskets from **Jamee Swan**, Roberson (her first of the game), Jeffery and Brittany Wilson on a fast-break assist from Jeffery to go up 25-18 at 6:22 before intermission.

From there until the halftime buzzer, CU increased its lead to 10 to two occasions and led 37-27 at the break. CU outscored DU 9-1 to open the second half and surge ahead 46-28. The Buffs didn't allow the Pioneers their first field goal of the last 20 minutes until the 14:07 mark.

A minute later, CU went up by 23 and wouldn't allow DU within 15 points the rest of the night. The Buffs led by as many as 26 points in the final 4 minutes.

Lappe said the surge to open the final 20 minutes was "the key to the game... we got kick started toward the end of the first half and I really enjoyed how we came out of halftime."

She also enjoyed her team getting 50 rebounds for a second consecutive game. The Buffs out-boarded the Pioneers 50-28.

"That's probably the best thing I can say about our team tonight," Lappe noted. "We don't take that lightly. Rebounding takes a lot of heart, character and effort. I really liked how our posts crashed the offensive glass and we were constantly trying to get second- and third-chance points. And we were doing a great job keeping them off the glass. We're extremely happy with our rebounding."

CU outscored DU 32-12 in the paint and got 13 second-chance points to the Pioneers' three. The Buffs committed 13 turnovers and scored 19 points off of the home team's 19 errors. And CU's bench outscored DU's 30-12.

When the Buffs finally got engaged, the night turned easy. But Lappe and her players know a slow start on Friday night doom them. The ante goes up against Louisville.

BOULDER - The No. 20 Colorado women's basketball team rallied but couldn't catch California Sunday afternoon at the Coors Events Center, falling 53-49 to the No. 7 Bears.

Coming off a 57-40 loss on Friday night to No. 4 Stanford, CU dropped to 11-2 overall and 0-2 in the Pac-12 Conference. Cal improved to 12-1 and 2-0.

Chucky Jeffery (13) and **Arielle Roberson** (11) were the only two Buffs players in double figures. The Bears were led by Brittany Boyd's 15 points.

Sunday's first half immediately took on a defensive flavor and didn't change; the score was tied 24-24 at intermission. But for the Buffs, that was an improvement over their first-half production (14) against Stanford on Friday night.

On Sunday afternoon, neither CU nor California could manage more than a four-point advantage in the first 20 minutes. Both teams survived frigid stretches – the Buffs' covering 7:31 and producing just three points, while the Bears' dry spell went for 8:52 and yielded four points.

Not surprisingly, neither team had a player in double figures for the half, with **Lexy Kresl**'s six points pacing the Buffs and Boyd's nine topping the Bears. Three of Cal's four leading scorers – seniors Layshia Clarendon and Talia Caldwell and junior Gennifer Brandon – were held scoreless in the first half. CU shot only 32 percent (8-for-25) while Cal checked in at 42.3 percent (11-for-26).

The Buffs got six consecutive points from Jeffery to start the second half. But as in the first half, creating any separation was a problem for both teams until Cal opened a pair of four-point leads.

The second of those disappeared on a free throw by Rachel Hargis at the 11:26 mark and a conventional three-point play by Roberson just under a minute later that tied the score at 38-38.

Three free throws by Boyd and Clarendon sent the Bears ahead 41-38 with 9:03 to play, and during the previous 9 minutes the Buffs were suffering through another frigid shooting spell (2-for-15).

Cal increased its lead to five (43-38) on a baseline jumper by Eliza Pierre with 7:35 to play. And when Caldwell hit one of two free throws with 6:59 remaining, the Buffs faced a six-point deficit (44-38).

A short jumper in the lane by Clarendon put Cal up 46-38, and with 6 minutes left Lappe called a timeout as her team's offensive malaise (2-for-17 over an 11:46 span) continued.

Jen Reese finally snapped the dry spell with a turnaround jumper from the right baseline (46-40) and Roberson followed with her second trey of the game to cut Cal's lead to 46-43 at the 4:41 mark.

But one of two foul shots by Boyd and a put-back by Reshanda Gray on Boyd's second miss sent the Bears back ahead by six (49-43), and one of two free throws by Clarendon made the Buffs' deficit seven (50-43).

Cal's eight-point lead (51-43) returned when Caldwell hit the first of two foul shots at the 2:53 mark – and time was slipping away for CU. A Jeffery basket with 1:59 left brought the Buffs to 51-45. Layups by Jeffery and **Brittany Wilson** pulled them to 51-49 with 16.7 remaining.

Clarendon was fouled by "B-Wil" on the inbounds pass, and with 15.6 seconds showing Clarendon missed both shots. Jeffery and Caldwell battled for the second miss rebound and a tie ball was called. With 13.2 seconds left, the possession arrow favored Cal.

When inbounds pass was made, Clarendon was fouled again – this time by Hargis – and this time she made one of two to give the Bears a 52-49 edge with 10.3 seconds to play.

Lappe called time out, drew up a play – but a shot was never taken. Jeffery turned it over a drive to the basket and Cal got possession. Fouled with 4.5 seconds showing, Boyd missed both free throws but Afure Jemerigbe controlled the rebound.

She hit one of two free throws, giving the Bears a four-point lead and the win.
