THE GAME: The University of Colorado hosts Western State Colorado University in an exhibition women's basketball game on Friday, Nov. 2, at 7 p.m. at the Coors Events Center.

BROADCAST: Friday's game will not be carried on the radio, however a free live video stream will be available on the Pac-12 Digital platform at Pac-12.com. SEASON PREVIEW: Colorado women's basketball knows where it wants to be at the end of the season, it's the same place 300-plus other NCAA Division I women's teams want to be.

But head coach **Linda Lappe's** third-year Buffaloes aren't concerned about where they want to be five months from now. They are worried about today; what the team is doing on any given day to get better. Then from there the end results should take care of themselves.

"What we have really focused on is doing something that is uncommon," Lappe said. "More so than getting to the NCAA Tournament, which we can't do (today), every day we are working towards that, and that is the ultimate goal, but we have tried to focus on taking it one day at a time and understanding what that takes (to get there)."

As the 2012-13 season begins, Lappe and her staff have the luxury of the most experience they've had in their time on the bench. In her first season, five freshmen and sophomores were part of the regular rotation. Two years later, those five players are now juniors and seniors with a combined 394 games played and 219 starts.

More importantly, beyond the sheer numbers of games, the variety of experience has been wide in range. They've experienced winning tight games; big games at home and on the road. They've beaten ranked teams; they've won win-or-go home contests.

The two with the most experience are Colorado's senior duo of **Chucky Jeffery** and **Meagan Malcolm-Peck**, who bring different types of game and leadership to the floor. Jeffery, a 5-10 guard, is a returning All-Pac-12 Conference performer and one of the most dynamic players in team history. She led Colorado in scoring (15.5 ppg), rebounding (8.0 rpg), assists (3.8 apg) and steals (2.3 spg) and is among CU's career leaders in those categories, and then some.

Malcolm-Peck looks to rebound from a year where her numbers were down but her leadership qualities certainly were not. She enters this season CU's active leader in starts (81) and games played (98). Malcolm-Peck averaged 4.3 points and 4.3 rebounds as a junior, but is the unquestioned vocal leader on the team. So much so that she was named captain for this season, shortly after last year ended.

"I feel like we have had great leadership from Meagan so far this year," Lappe said. "She has really set the tone for the rest of our players and done a great job communicating. Anything that comes up, she is sure she is on top of it."

Meagan's twin sister **Brenna Malcolm-Peck** is Colorado's third senior. Brenna has played just three games over the past two years,

continuing to fight back from chronic knee injuries. Her future playing status remains uncertain, but she continues to be a valuable asset to her teammates.

Colorado's junior twin guards, **Ashley** and **Brittany Wilson**, and fellow classmate **Rachel Hargis** have also benefitted from two solid years of game action. Brittany Wilson was second on the team in scoring, assists and rebounding as a sophomore and really shined during the Buffaloes postseason run averaging 13.7 points and four rebounds over the final six games.

Ashley Wilson provided a spark of energy off the bench and thrived in that role. She did a lot of the grunt work for the Buffaloes and was particularly crafty on the offensive boards. Despite her 5-8 stature, Ashley Wilson compiled 97 rebounds (2.9 rpg), 43 of which came on the offensive end.

Hargis continues to grow as a solid low-post presence for the Buffaloes. She started the first half of last season, but came off the bench in the second half primarily to give CU a better matchup against finesse Pac-12 teams. Either way, Hargis has contributed positive minutes, especially defensively. She has been one of Colorado's better shot blockers the last two seasons, entering her junior year with 50, good enough for 17th on CU's all-time list.

Even with the experience of veteran players, the Buffaloes will still expect their three sophomores and four freshmen to make a huge impact, greatly improving the depth of the team.

Guard **Lexy Kresl** set Colorado's freshman record for 3-pointers made last season with 63. Forward **Jen Reese** led all Pac-12 freshmen in rebounding on a per game basis (6.0) and shot 45 percent from the floor before her season ended nine games early with an injury. Guard/forward **Jasmine Sborov** came on strong at the end of last season, essentially moving into the starting lineup after Reese went down.

"We are still going to be young but our veterans have all played and that is something we have to utilize in the preseason and as we head into the conference season," Lappe said. "In a lot of ways we are ahead of where we were last year, and I think every year builds on the last, so that's not surprising, we should be ahead of where we were last year."

That depth is more pronounced with a solid group of freshmen, with each bringing something different to the table.

One freshman, not so new, is forward **Arielle Roberson**. The younger sister of CU men's basketball standout, Andre, Arielle was a redshirt in the CU program last season after developing a torn labrum in her left hip. She was one of the better players out of the state of Texas in 2011, and is hungry to contribute.

Colorado's incoming freshman class was rated as the 27th best in the nation according to ESPN.com HoopGurlz, and that doesn't count Roberson who came in with the 2011 class.

Jamee Swan, a 6-2 forward from Tucson, Ariz., was an honorable mention WBCA All-American and ranked as the eighth best forward in the nation, and 38th best player overall. **Lauren Huggins**, a 6-1 guard/forward from Littleton, Colo., was also a Top 100 player, ranking as the 11th best wing and 64th best player overall. **Kyleesha Weston**, a 5-7 guard from Kansas City, Mo., is this staff's first true point guard recruit, coming off a year where she was a finalist for the DiRenna Award, given to the top girls player in the K.C. metro area.

Swan averaged 20.8 points and 12.8 rebounds as a senior and will be a big factor down low for the Buffaloes. Huggins can stretch the court with extensive range. She hit 5-of-6 from 3-point range at the 2012 edition of "The Show" Colorado's annual high school all-star game, earning MVP honors.

Weston averaged 18 points and five assists for Park Hill High School, but more importantly her addition will allow Colorado to have both Jeffery and Brittany Wilson spend more time off the ball, giving the Buffaloes more offensive and defensive options.

"I think fans will be happy to see our freshmen, they have really gotten off to a great start," Lappe said. "I know fans always like to see new faces, and I think we have three really good freshmen that will contribute in their own separate ways."

The key for the Buffaloes will be to continue to build on what they've already accomplished, from previous seasons for the veterans and off season workouts for the whole team.

"We challenged our team over the summer to get better as individuals, our guards to become better ball handlers, our shooters to

become more accurate from the outside and the inside, and our post to really work on their low-post game, and I feel like they all did that throughout the summer,” Lappe said. “So we have been able to see the biggest progression just on the court.

“Our players have come in every day with the right attitude and work ethic. It has been fun to coach them on individual skills, and not having to worry about if they are going to come in and be ready to go every single day.”

If the Buffaloes end up where they want to be five months from now, it will be at home. Colorado will serve as one of eight NCAA Tournament first- and-second round hosts, March 23 & 25 at the Coors Events Center. But there is a lot to do between now and then. “Our staff has a lot of experience in the NCAA Tournament and we’re all on the same page in understanding all the tools needed to get there,” Lappe said. “The fact is, it’s not easy to get there and just because we are hosting it doesn’t mean we are in, we’ve got a lot of work to do before that.”

ABOUT THE MOUNTAINEERS: Western State Colorado University is an NCAA Division II school located in Gunnison, Colo., and competes in the prestigious Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference, a league Colorado was once part of during the first half of the 20th century.

The Mountaineers are coming off a 16-15 season, in which they were fourth in the league standings at 13-9 and advanced to the 2012 RMAC Shootout championship game. Western State is in rebuilding mode, with a new coaching staff and just two players returning from last year’s team. Van Girard is in his first season as head coach after 24 years at Cal State Dominguez Hills. Junior guard Cara Walderman and sophomore forward Jade McIntosh are the lone returning players, each playing sparingly on the 2011-12 squad.

The Mountaineers have been picked to finish 12th in the 2012-13 RMAC Preseason Coaches Poll.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado is a perfect 22-0 in exhibition games, outscoring its opponents by just over 30 points per game (85.9 to 55.5). The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU’s exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams. CU’s closest exhibition contest came in 1997, a 77-72 win over Athletes in Action. Colorado’s last exhibition was a 78-40 decision over Regis (Colo.) University prior to the start of the 2011-12 season.

This will be the second time that Colorado and Western State have hooked up in an exhibition game. The Buffaloes downed the Mountaineers 93-62 prior to the beginning of the 2010-11 season.

BUFFS PICKED NINTH: Coming off its first 20-win season in eight years, Colorado was picked to finish ninth in the Pac-12 in 2013, according to the league’s annual Preseason Coaches Poll.

2012 NCAA Women’s Final Four participant Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12, compiling the maximum amount of points (121) and first place votes (11) possible. 2012 Pac-12 runner-up and NCAA participant California claimed the other first place vote and was second in the poll (109). UCLA was third with 100 points followed by USC (91), Arizona State and Oregon State (67), Utah (56), Washington (54), Colorado (49), Washington State (40), Oregon (20) and Arizona (18).

Colorado’s ninth place preseason rating is its highest in the last nine years since Buffaloes were picked to finish seventh in the 2004-05 Big 12 Coaches Poll.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 367-126 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.744). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 23 of the previous 34 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado's regular season schedule will feature at least 11 regionally or nationally televised games in 2012-13.

Colorado will play nine regular season games on the Pac-12 Networks, and a guaranteed one, and potentially more, during the Pac-12 Tournament, March 7-10, in Seattle.

A program-best six regular season games will be televised nationally while three more will be on one of the regional networks. CU's first Pac-12 Tournament game will also be televised nationally, as would any ensuing round through the championship game, which will air Sunday, March 10, on ESPN2.

CU will make its first television appearance on Dec. 11 at Denver on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain. The Buffaloes make their Pac-12 Network debut on Friday, Jan. 4 against defending league champion Stanford; their first of four straight televised games on the network. Colorado will have five straight road games televised beginning with Utah on Jan. 13, through a Super Bowl Sunday matchup at USC on Feb. 3. CU's final regular season televised game will be Feb. 8 at home against Oregon State.

Entering the 2012-13 season, CU has appeared on 99 regional or national telecasts over the previous 11 seasons.

2011-12 SEASON REVIEW: A historic start to a new beginning and a memorable finish highlighted the 2011-12 University of Colorado women's basketball season.

The Buffaloes ushered in the Pac-12 Conference era with a 21-14 overall record; the school's first 20-win season in eight years. Colorado experienced some growing pains in the first league schedule, finishing in 10th place at 6-12, but rebounded to make a run to the quarterfinals of the 2012 Postseason WNIT.

Under second-year head coach Linda Lappe, the Buffaloes couldn't have started the season any better. Colorado swept its 11-game nonconference regular season schedule and equaled the second-best start in school history at 12-0 by defeating Utah, 58-52, in its inaugural Pac-12 game.

During the preconference run, the Buffaloes won two tournaments: their own Omni Hotels Classic and the UTSA Holiday Classic in San Antonio. The Buffaloes also enjoyed rivalry wins over Colorado State and Denver.

After winning their first 10 games by an average of nearly 20 points a contest, the Buffaloes developed a flair for the dramatic. In the final game of the nonconference schedule against Creighton, neither team led by more than seven and it took a 3-pointer at the buzzer by freshman Lexy Kresl to preserve a 52-49 win over the eventual Missouri Valley Conference Tournament Champions.

Colorado then erased second half double-digit deficits to win two of its first three Pac-12 games. The Buffaloes trailed Utah 48-38 with 10 minutes left, but ended on a 20-4 run, holding the Utes scoreless for the final 8:33 of the contest. After suffering its first loss of the season at Washington, Colorado responded with a 57-56 win at Washington State in which the Buffaloes trailed by 11 midway through the second half before rallying for the road win.

At 13-1, 2-1 in Pac-12 play, the Buffaloes would face their first sustained adversity of the season. Colorado let a double-digit lead slip away against California in the Pac-12 home opener and followed with losses to No. 4 Stanford and at Arizona State.

Colorado regained some of its mojo with back-to-back tight wins. After edging Arizona 56-54 on national television to break its three-game slide, Colorado played one of its most complete games of the season in defeating USC 69-67, exacting revenge on the Trojans who ended CU's season in 2010-11 in the WNIT quarterfinals. Chucky Jeffery accounted for the final points in both wins hitting the go-ahead bucket at Arizona with 17 seconds left and two free throws against USC with under two seconds left.

Just three days after the big USC win, Colorado received its first of several heartbreaks during its worst stretch of the season. The Buffaloes had a late lead at home against UCLA, but the Bruins rallied to tie the game in the final minute and eventually won, 62-54 in overtime. That setback began a stretch where CU lost eight of nine, twice in overtime at home and another pair by two and five points.

While the NCAA Tournament was falling out of reach, Colorado still

had plenty to play for. At 16-12, the Buffaloes were already eligible for WNIT play, but needed a strong finish to solidify a spot.

Not wanting their season to end in the first days of March, the Buffaloes responded. CU broke a five-game losing streak by defeating Oregon State 67-57 on Senior Day. A fitting final regular season home game for Julie Seabrook, who had a double-double, while exacting pay-back for an ugly 20-point loss in Corvallis in early February.

The Buffaloes, who had earned the No. 10 seed in the Pac-12 Tournament, continued their momentum into the postseason with a 55-41 win over No. 7 Utah for their first conference tournament win since 2007. Colorado dropped a hard-fought battle to No. 2 seed and eventual tournament runner up California, 68-59 in the quarterfinals.

Colorado advanced to the WNIT for the second straight season, its first back-to-back postseason appearance of any kind since playing in four straight NCAA Tournaments from 2001 to '04. The Buffaloes won WNIT games against Northern Colorado, South Dakota and Villanova before falling to an inspired Oklahoma State team on the road in the quarterfinals.

Jeffery had an incredible postseason run averaging 15.8 points and 11.8 rebounds during the WNIT. She had double-doubles in the final three games and recorded her second career triple-double, and just the program's third, with 12 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists at Oklahoma State.

The Buffaloes had the third best rebounding defense (34.4 rpg) and rebounding margin (+5.7 rpg) in the Pac-12 and also ranked fifth in scoring defense (58.4 ppg), field-goal percentage (.396) and offensive rebounds (13.6 orgp).

Overall Jeffery led the Buffaloes at 15.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.8 assists and 2.3 steals per game. She was prominent on the Pac-12 leader board, ranking fourth in assists, fifth in steals, sixth in scoring and defensive rebounds (6.1 drpg), eighth in overall rebounding, 10th in assist-to-turnover ratio (0.8), 12th in field-goal percentage (.445) and 13th free-throw percentage (.680).

Jeffery scored in double-figures in 30 of Colorado's 35 games and reached the 20-point mark on eight occasions. She had a team-best 10 double-doubles on the season, tying for seventh in the Pac-12 and also seventh on CU's single-season list. She led or shared the team lead in scoring in 21 contests this season. Jeffery had the second-most assists in a junior season (133) and 11th overall. Her 541 points were the ninth best in team history while she also ranked fourth in minutes played (1,161), seventh in steals (82), eighth in field-goals made (211) and ninth in rebounds (280). Her point total is the third-best by a junior while her rebounds and steals both rank fourth. Jeffery was the MVP of CU's Omni Hotels Classic and was named Pac-12 Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 4.

Senior forward Julie Seabrook led Colorado in field goal accuracy at 48.8 percent while also averaging 7.3 points and 5.2 rebounds per game. An honorable mention Academic All-Pac-12 pick, Seabrook played in 120 career games and started the final 69 contests of her career. Her 35 starts this year tied De Celle Thomas (1995-96) for the third-most in one season in a CU uniform. Seabrook closed out her playing career ranking 16th in field-goal percentage at .487. She went out with a bang, leading the Buffaloes with 16 points and tying career-highs with four 3-pointers on six attempts in the WNIT quarterfinal game at Oklahoma State. Seabrook, who ranked seventh in the Pac-12 in field-goal percentage during conference games (.474) shot 50 percent or better in 22 of 35 games, 10 of 18 in league play. She made 81 percent from the line (25-of-31) during conference play.

Sophomore guard Brittany Wilson was second on the team in scoring (9.1 ppg), assists (63), steals (47) and 3-point field goals (44). She was Colorado's leading scorer at the Pac-12 Tournament (19.5 ppg) and averaged 13.7 points on 42 percent shooting during the six-game postseason. Wilson ranked 13th in 3-point percentage (.312), 14th in 3-pointers made (1.3 3mpg) and 27th in scoring on the Pac-12 charts. Brittany's twin sister Ashley Wilson hit 47.8 percent from the field on the season while averaging 3.5 points and 2.9 rebounds per game.

Freshman guard Lexy Kresl ranked third on the team in scoring at 9.0 points per game and led Buffaloes in 3-point field goals (63). On the Pac-12 charts she ranked fifth in 3-pointers made (1.8 3mpg), 12th in 3-point percentage (.318) and 28th in scoring.
