THE GAME: No. 12 (AP)/14 (USAT) University of Colorado closes out the nonconference portion of its schedule by hosting Southern Utah University on Sunday, Dec. 29, at 2 p.m. at the Coors Events Center.

BROADCAST: Sunday's game will air live on KKZN AM 760. Mark Johnson will handle play-by-play duties and will be joined by Carol Callan of USA Basketball with the color commentary. A free live video stream will be available through Colorado's Pac-12.com video player. All CU women's basketball home games that are not televised will be available through Pac-12.com at this link:

Non-televised Pac-12 road games are scheduled to be available on the opponents' video player, free of charge.

OPENING TIP: Colorado has averaged 84 points on 48 percent shooting in six home wins this season.

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 9-1 overall coming off its first loss of the season, a 69-62 setback at No. 7/7 ranked Louisville on Dec. 21. The loss snapped Colorado's 33-game nonconference regular season win streak which dated back to the 2010-11 season. The Buffaloes' nine-game win streak to begin the season is the fifth best start in program history.

Colorado is averaging 77.7 points per game while hitting 45 percent from the field and 73 percent from the free-throw line. Colorado has four players averaging double-digits, six players scoring between 7.3 and 13.6 points per game and nine pitching in at least five a contest.

The Buffaloes lead the Pac-12 in scoring margin (+18.1) and rebounding margin (+10.7) while ranking second in scoring defense (59.6 ppg) and defensive rebounding (31.6 drpg) and third in scoring (77.7 ppg), free-throw percentage (.726), field-goal percentage (.452), field-goal percentage defense (.352), rebounds (44.8 rpg) and rebounding defense (34.1 rpg).

Junior forward **Jen Reese** is the leader among four Buffaloes averaging double-digits at 13.6 per game while hitting 54.2 percent from the floor, ranking fifth in the Pac-12. She also ranks second on the team in rebounding (6.7 rpg) and free-throw percentage (.818). Reese recorded the second double-double of her career with 14 points and a team season-best 14 rebounds at Louisville. Her 14 rebounds also matched her career high which she also achieved against UCLA in 2011. Over her last six games she is averaging 15.8 points and 7.7 rebounds an outing.

She has hit her season high of 18 points twice this season, first at New Mexico and most recently in the win over Denver. At New Mexico she was 7-of-10 from the field, tying a career-high for field goals made and recording the second-highest scoring output of her career (22 at Arizona State on Feb. 17, 2013). Against Denver she was 6-of-10 from the field and was a team season-best 6-of-6 from the foul line. Reese was named to the Omni Classic All-Tournament team after averaging 14.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and hitting 11-of-16 field goals (.688) over the two games. She also ranks ninth in the Pac-12 in free-throw percentage, 16th in rebounding and 19th in scoring.

Reigning Pac-12 Freshman of the Year **Arielle Roberson** leads Colorado in rebounding at 8.3 per game while pitching in 13.4 points per contest. Roberson has three of Colorado's four double-doubles, which occurred in the three straight contests (Wyoming-Illinois-Denver). She is the first Buff with double-doubles in three straight games since Chucky Jeffery had three in a row from Feb. 3-Feb. 10, 2013 (at USC, vs. Oregon State, vs. Oregon). She had a season-high 22 points and 10 rebounds in the win over Denver. In that game she established team-season and career-highs in free throws made

(13) and attempted (17).

Roberson was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for Dec. 2-8 averaging 15 points and 11 rebounds while hitting 48 percent from the field in the wins over Wyoming and Illinois. She ranks fifth in offensive rebounds (3.5 orpg), eighth in overall rebounds, 15th in defensive boards (4.8 drpg) and 20th in scoring on the Pac-12 charts.

Junior guard **Lexy Kresl** has been running a solid point for the Buffaloes averaging 11.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.9 assists per game. She led Colorado in scoring at Louisville with 17 points while grabbing eight rebounds. Kresl already has six games with at least five rebounds and is averaging 7.3 boards over the last three contests

Kresl leads the Pac-12 in free-throw accuracy at 91.2 percent (31-of-34), including a perfect 6-of-6 against Louisville, tying Reese for the team best this season. She also ranks seventh in assists and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.8) and 25th in scoring. Her team-leading 39 assists in the first 10 games have already surpassed her 2012-13 29-game season total of 30.

Kresl was the MVP of the 2013 Omni Hotels Classic averaging 15.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists. She dished out a career-high six assists, with no turnovers, and added 12 points in the first round win over South Alabama. Kresl scored 19 points in the championship game, just one point off her career high, hitting 7-of-14 from the field and adding four assists, five rebounds and three steals.

Senior guard **Brittany Wilson** leads the team in steals (17), ranks second in assists (3.0 apg) and is fourth in scoring (10.8 ppg). She had a monster night against Illinois, recording career and team-season highs with 13 rebounds and eight assists. She has Colorado's top scoring output this year with a career-best 26 points in the win over Iowa marking the fifth 20-point game in her career as she also set personal bests from the line hitting on 10-of-14 from the charity stripe.

Junior guard **Jasmine Sborov** has sprinted out to a great start averaging 8.2 points and 3.6 rebounds per game. Sborov has hit 77.8 percent from the foul line, delivering a pair of clutch performances on the road. She hit two foul shots at Colorado State with under a minute left to give Colorado a three point lead. In the win over Wyoming,

she iced the game for the Buffaloes with another two free throws that provided the final margin, 63-59, with five seconds remaining. She has scored in double-digits in five games, including a career-high 13 points in the season opening win over Colorado State. She came into this season with just three double-figure scoring games over the first 62 games of her career.

Freshman guard **Lauren Huggins** has provided a nice scoring punch off the bench. Huggins leads Colorado from 3-point range, already with 22 on the season as she has multiple 3-pointers in six of her first 10 games. Huggins ranks sixth in the Pac-12 in 3-pointers (2.2 3mpg) and 11th in percentage (.407). She is second on the team in steals with 12 and recorded a career- and team-season high four against Rice.

Senior center **Rachel Hargis**, averaging 5.1 points and 3.9 rebounds per game, tied a career-high with 12 points in the win over Illinois. Hargis, who needs just seven blocks to become the eighth Buffalo to register 100 in a career, has seven in her last four games and ranks 10th in the Pac-12 in that same category (0.9 bpg).

Sophomore forward **Jamee Swan** scored a career-high 16 points in the win over South Alabama hitting 7-of-10 from the floor. She had a team-best eight rebounds in that contest and ranks fifth on the team at 4.4 per game. Swan is averaging 4.6 points on 57 percent from the field while ranking second on the team, and 13th in the Pac-12 at 0.8 blocks per outing. Senior guard **Ashley Wilson** returned to the lineup at Louisville after missing the previous three games with a shoulder injury. Wilson is averaging 5.0 points and 3.7 rebounds per game, while shooting 50 percent from the floor.

ABOUT THE THUNDERBIRDS: Southern Utah is 7-2 overall and has won three straight, including a 75-63 win at Northern Colorado on Dec. 19 to open its Big Sky Conference season. The Thunderbirds are averaging 75.1 points on 42 percent from the field and 74 percent from the free-throw line. Southern Utah pulls down 42 rebounds per game and enjoys a plus-8 advantage over its opponents. The Thunderbirds give up 67 points an outing while allowing opponents to shoot 38 percent.

Senior forward Carli Moreland paces Southern Utah at 11.9 points and 8.1 rebounds per game. Sophomore forward Lori Parkinson gives the Thunderbirds a solid 1-2 punch in the front court averaging 11.6 points and 7.2 rebounds while shooting 54 percent from the field. Senior guard Andrea Jones tops Southern Utah in assists with 39, averages 9.6 points per game and is a perfect 20-of-20 from the free-throw line.

JR Payne is in her fifth season at Southern Utah with a record of 51-77.

THE SERIES: This will be the third meeting between Colorado and Southern Utah with the Buffaloes winning both previous meetings, both of which were played at the Coors Events Center. Colorado claimed an 88-36 decision in the last meeting on Dec. 19, 2009.

Linda Lappe has never faced Southern Utah as a head coach. JR Payne is 0-1 against Colorado as a head coach.

CONNECTIONS: Southern Utah sports one Colorado native on its roster. Senior forward and leading scorer Carli Moreland is a native of Broomfield and a graduate of Legacy High School.

FAST OUT OF THE GATE: Colorado's 9-0 mark to start the season is the fifth best in team history. Three of the top five all-time best starts in program history have come in the last three seasons. CU's best start was a 15-0 mark to begin the 1992-93 season. Here are Colorado's top-eight all-time season starts:

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado fell in its first opportunity against a ranked team this year, dropping a 69-62 decision at No. 7/7 Louisville. The Buffaloes were 1-6 against ranked teams in 2012-13, with six of seven coming against the top 10. Ten of Colorado's last 11 ranked opponents have been ranked No. 8 or higher.

CU is 62-149 all-time against ranked opponents and 3-12 under Linda Lappe.

FREE THROW HISTORY: Sophomore **Arielle Roberson** had one of the top free-throw performances in team history in the win over Denver. Her 13 free throws made tied for the fifth best single-game performance in team history and most since Jackie McFarland had 13 against TCU in the 2008 WNIT, just days after setting her school record of 15 against Villanova. Roberson's 17 attempts tie for the second most in team history, just one off the school-record 18 attempted by LeaAnn Banks at Colorado State on Dec. 5, 1984.

ROBERSON PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sophomore **Arielle Roberson** was named the Pac-12 Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the week of Dec. 2-8, the league office announced on Dec. 9.

For Roberson it's her first Player of the Week honor and sixth conference weekly award overall. She was a five-time winner of the Pac-12's Freshman of the Week award last season.

Roberson averaged 15 points, 11 rebounds while hitting 48 percent from the field in Colorado's wins over Wyoming (63-59) on Dec. 4, and Illinois (79-56) on Dec. 7.

Roberson scored 13 points and matched a season-high with 12 rebounds in the win at Wyoming. Eight of her rebounds were on the offensive end, one less than she had in her previous four games combined. She hit 6-of-15 from the field and also dished out an assist.

Against Illinois, Roberson led Colorado in scoring, tying a season-high with 17 points, hitting 58 percent from the field (7-of-12). She pulled down 10 rebounds, logging her fifth career double-double.

Roberson's honor is CU's ninth weekly award in the Pac-12 since

the Buffaloes joined the conference in 2011; fourth in the Player of the Week category.

MORE OFFENSE: Colorado has hit 80 points in five games this season, with four coming in succession from the Alcorn State through South Alabama contests. It marked the first time that the Buffaloes had hit 80 points in four consecutive games since late in the 1982-83 season when Colorado achieved the mark in five straight (Feb. 12-Mar. 5, 1983).

Colorado's 94 points against South Alabama were its most since a 96-90 overtime win over TCU in the third round of the 2008 Post-season WNIT, and the most in regulation since the last time the Buffaloes hit the century mark, a 100-71 win over Cal State-Fullerton

on Nov. 18, 2005.

The Buffaloes scored 85 at New Mexico, the most on the road, in regulation time, since a 101-56 win at TCU on Dec. 7, 1993. Colorado scored 90 on the road in a one-point overtime loss at Baylor on Feb. 23, 2000 and that same number in a 9-point overtime win at Kansas on Feb. 24, 1995.

SCORING BALANCE: Colorado has four players averaging double-digits in scoring, six averaging at least seven points and eight pitching in at least five.

Seven different Buffs have led the team, or tied for the team lead, in scoring led by **Arielle Roberson** who has been in the drivers seat three times. **Lexy Kresl**, **Jen Reese** and **Brittany Wilson** have each led Colorado in two games.

Colorado has had five players score in double-digits in three games and four in double-digits in two others another. The Buffaloes didn't register any five-player double-digit games in 2012-13, but were 8-0 in games with four in double figures.

LIGHTS OUT: Colorado is shooting 45 percent from the field (270-of-598), ranking third in the Pac-12.

The Buffaloes had one of their best shooting stretches in recent memory during the three-game span of New Mexico through the Omni Classic. CU hit an impressive 52.8 percent (93-of-176) during that span and finished above 50 percent in all three contests, including a season-best 55.6 percent (30-of-54) at New Mexico.

In 2012-13 Colorado had only two games above 50 percent for the entire 32-game season. The last time the Buffaloes had hit 50 percent in three consecutive games was from Nov. 27-Dec. 4, 1998, current head coach Linda Lappe's freshman season.

NUMBERS FROM DEEP: Colorado hit 10-of-18 3-pointers at New Mexico, its best performance percentage wise since the home game against the Lobos last season. The Buffaloes hit 62 percent from long range (8-of-13) in their 84-39 win over New Mexico in Boulder on Dec. 29, 2012. The 10 3-pointers were Colorado's most in a game on the road since hitting 15 at Oklahoma State on March 25, 2012, in the WNIT Quarterfinals. Colorado also had 10 at home against Oregon on Feb. 10, 2013.

Jen Reese and **Jasmine Sborov** both went 2-for-2 from long range against the Lobos, setting new career-highs for 3-pointers made for both players. In fact the duo, 4-for-4 on the day, had been a combined 7-for-48 (.146) in their careers prior to the New Mexico game.

ROAD WARRIORS: Colorado has won 21 of its last 32 true road contests. Prior to the start of this run, The Buffaloes had just five wins in their previous 37 road games dating back to the 2008 Big 12 Conference schedule. Overall the Buffaloes are 25-14 away from Boulder dating back to the tail end of the 2010-11 season.

BIG WIN STREAKS: Colorado saw its 33-game regular season nonconference win streak come to an end at Louisville a string that had began with a 74-52 win over Colgate on Dec. 30, 2010. This run is just one of several enjoyed by the Buffaloes over the last three seasons.

Colorado had claimed perfect 11-0 nonconference marks in each of the last two seasons, comprising of two of the top eight overall winning streaks in team history. The 2011-12 team actually began the season 12-0, including a win in its first ever Pac-12 Conference game, tying for the fifth-best streak in team history and the second longest to begin a season.

The Buffaloes' 11-game streak to start the 2012-13 season ties for the eighth best overall. Throw in a 10-game streak at the end of the 2012-13 campaign, and the Buffaloes have registered three separate double-digit winning streaks in the last two seasons.

Colorado has 10 double-figure win streaks in its history, looking to possibly add an 11th on Saturday. Head coach **Linda Lappe** has presided over three of those streaks, one behind her mentor Ceal Barry who coached the Buffaloes to four different double-figure win streaks over her 22 seasons on the bench.

NATIONALLY RANKED: Following its first loss of the season, Colorado slipped one spot to No. 12 in the seventh regular season *Associated Press Women's Basketball Top 25 Poll* released on Monday.

Colorado received 467 points, down from 517 last week. The Buffaloes have been ranked in 22 consecutive AP polls, their longest run since appearing in 27 straight from Jan. 22, 2001 through the final poll of the 2001-02 season.

Colorado has a long history of rankings in the AP poll, dating back to the 1980-81 season. This ranking marks the 180th time Colorado has appeared in the AP poll, which is the third-most in the Pac-12 Conference, trailing only Stanford and USC.

Colorado remained at No. 14 for the second-straight week in the latest coaches poll released on Tuesday. The Buffaloes received 362 points, down slightly from 374 the previous poll. The No. 14 spot is

the highest Colorado has been in this poll since coming in at No. 13 in the March 8, 2004 poll.

For the first time since 2003, Colorado was ranked in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today Sports Coaches* Top 25 Preseason polls, coming in at No. 19 in each.

Prior to the 2003-04 campaign the Buffaloes were ranked 20th in both polls. The preseason rankings were Colorado's highest since debuting at No. 12 (AP) and No. 13 (Coaches) heading into the 2001-02 campaign.

Colorado was not ranked in the final 2012-13 Coaches poll, coming in as the first team listed in the receiving votes category. The Buffaloes appeared in 11 Coaches polls in 2012-13, reaching as high as No. 18 the week of March 4, 2013.

Colorado currently has five ranked teams on its schedule, three of which were preseason No. 10 picks. Stanford is No. 4 and Louisville is No. 7 in both, Iowa is No. 21 in the AP poll and No. 25 in the coaches, California comes in at No. 22 in the coaches poll while listed at No. 23 in the AP. Arizona State debuted at No. 25 in this week's AP poll and is receiving votes in the coaches poll.

WILSON CLIMBING CAREER CHARTS: Senior guard **Brittany Wilson** has 957 career points, needing 43 to become the 25th player in team history to reach 1,000.

She is in ninth place on CU's all-time list for 3-point field goals with 114. Wilson had a pair of steals at Louisville, taking over sole possession of 17th place with 143 and needing just two more to crack the top 15.

IRON WOMEN: The senior duo of **Brittany Wilson** and **Rachel Hargis** have a good chance to end their careers ranking No. 1 & No. 2 in games played at Colorado.

The two have combined for 221 out of a possible 222 games played during their careers. Wilson has not missed a game in her career, playing in all 111 possible contests. Hargis has played in 110, missing only one contest, the 2013 NCAA Tournament game against Kansas, with a knee injury.

Barring any unforeseen setbacks, and with a modest postseason run, the two will be looking to catch Erin Scholz who set the school record at 132 games played from 1993-97. The duo will reach the top 20 in school history with 121 games played.

OMNI HOTELS CLASSIC CHAMPIONS: Colorado won its 17th Omni Hotels Classic championship, and fifth straight by defeating South Alabama 94-61 in the first round on Nov. 29 and then Rice, 75-58, in the championship game on Nov. 30. Junior guard Lexy Kresl was named Classic MVP while classmate Jen Reese joined her on the all-tournament team. Colorado improved to 44-10 all-time in its home holiday classic and has won 17 of the 26 tournament titles contested (no team champion was crowned in 2006 due to a format change). This was the 27th straight year Colorado has hosted an early season women's basketball tournament. For the first 22 years the tournament was known as the Coors Classic, and is in its fifth year of being called the Omni Hotels Classic.

FOR OPENERS: Colorado improved to 35-5 (.875) in all-time openers with its win at Colorado State. It marked just the 13th time in 40 seasons that Colorado opened away from Boulder and the 10th time in a true road game. The Buffaloes improved to 6-4 in overall season openers on the road. Colorado is an outstanding 38-2 (.949) all-time in home openers.

BUFFS SIGN PAIR TO NLI's: **Zoe Correal** and **Brecca Thomas** have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2014-15 head coach Linda Lappe announced on Wednesday, the first day of the NCAA's early signing period.

Correal, a 6-4 center from El Cerrito, Calif., is gearing up for her senior season at Salesian High School a program where she has contributed to the last two NorCal Division IV titles. She averaged 9.4 points, 7.6 rebounds and 2.4 blocks as a junior, guiding the Pride to a 29-8 record, the NorCal title and runner-up finish at the 2013 CIF Division IV State Tournament. Correal was named to the 2012-13 Cal-Hi Sports Division IV All-State Second Team.

Thomas, a 5-5 point guard from Houston, is entering her senior season at the Kinkaid School. She has scored nearly 1,700 points and dished out over 400 assists in three years for the Falcons who have won back-to-back Southwest Preparatory Conference Division I titles. A three-time All-SPC Division I selection, Thomas averaged 20.6 points, 5.5 assists and 3.5 steals as a junior, leading the Falcons to a 28-5 record.

BUFFS PICKED THIRD: On the heels of its best season in a decade, Colorado was picked to finish third in the 2013-14 Pac-12 Conference race in separate Preseason Polls conducted by league coaches and media members who cover the league.

In the coaches' poll, Colorado received 91 points trailing only defending co-league champions Stanford and California. The Cardinal and Golden Bears were essentially a unanimous pick to finish 1-2 respectively. Stanford received 121 points including 11 first place votes. California scored 111 points and received the other first place nod. Coaches were not able to vote for their own teams.

The third place preseason ranking is Colorado's highest since a similar third place status in the 1997-98 Big 12 Coaches poll. The Buffaloes have climbed the ladder in three short seasons in the Pac-12 Preseason Poll. Colorado was picked to finish 11th in 2010-11 (eventually tied for 10th) and ninth in 2011-12 (placing fourth).

Washington, which finished one spot behind Colorado last year in the final standings, was picked to do so again coming in fourth with 85 points. UCLA, last year's third place team, was sixth (80) followed by USC (77), Utah (59), Oregon State (51), Washington State (50), Arizona State (29), Arizona (21) and Oregon (17).

In the media poll, Colorado received 129 points trailing only Stanford and California. Stanford was picked to win the 2013-14 league race, receiving 166 points including 12 of 14 first place votes. California had 156 points and received the other two first place nods.

The top eight selected by the media mirrored the order of the coaches' poll. Washington finished just behind the Buffaloes in fourth with 122 points followed by UCLA (112), USC (99), Utah (79) and Oregon State (64).

Arizona State was ninth (62) and Washington State 10th (50) flipping spots from the coaches' poll. Oregon and Arizona did the same, with the Ducks coming in at 11th in the media poll (27) and the Wildcats in 12th (21).

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado will be featured on the Pac-12 Networks 15 times during the 2013-14 regular season, a school record number for television appearances in one campaign.

Colorado's appeared on a program-best 13 national and regional telecasts in 2012-13, a figure that also included three postseason contests. Entering this season, the Buffaloes have tipped off on 112 national or regional contests since the Fall of 2001.

Colorado made its 2013-14 Pac-12 Network debut by hosting Iowa on Nov. 20.

Fourteen of Colorado's 18 conference games will be televised on the Pac-12 Networks, including eight of nine at home. All home games not televised on the Pac-12 Networks, will be available online through Colorado's Pac-12.com video player. Pac-12 road games that are not televised will be available on the opponent's Pac-12.com video player.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado improved to a perfect 24-0 in exhibition games with its 91-42 win over the Colorado School of Mines on Nov. 2. The Buffaloes have outscored their opponents by an average of 32.0 points in those 24 contests (86.2 to 54.2)

The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU's exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams. This was the fourth time Colorado and Colorado Mines played in an exhibition game.

TOUR OF ITALY: Colorado took a 10-day tour of Italy this past summer (Aug. 12-21) as players, coaches and staff took in the opportunity to visit historic destinations including Lake Como, Venice, Florence, and Rome.

Per NCAA rules, the Buffaloes were allowed to have 10 full team practices prior to leaving for Italy. The trip was funded by donors of the basketball program.

Colorado played two full games against a pair of all-star teams made up of professional players from around Italy. The Buffaloes

won handily in both contests, 80-47 against the Toscana All-Stars on Aug. 16 near Florence and then 96-22 against the Lazio All-Stars in Rome on Aug. 18.

A third game against the Lazio/Latina All-Stars provided a unique twist. The Buffaloes and their Italian counterparts played one normal 10-minute quarter that ended in a 20-7 Colorado advantage. For the remaining three periods, the teams started over on the scoreboard and then shuffled rosters to form a Black and Gold squad. Senior guards Ashley & Brittany Wilson, junior guard Lexy Kresl, sophomore forward Jamee Swan and freshman center Bri Watts, joined the Italian coach and players on the Black team, along with Colorado assistants Jonas Chatterton and LaTonya Watson. Several Italian players joined the rest of the Buffaloes and head coach Linda Lappe and assistant Kelly Rae Finley on the Gold.

The contest proved to be highly spirited and competitive with the Black team, led by Brittany Wilson, staging a last-minute comeback for a 48-46 win. Wilson sank two free throws with under 20 seconds left for the deciding margin.

HUGGINS RECEIVES HARDSHIP: Colorado guard/forward Lauren Huggins was granted a medical hardship by the NCAA this summer, allowing her to regain her freshman year of eligibility.

Huggins played in five games as a true freshman before a stress fracture in her right leg sidelined her for the remainder of the season. She had six points and three rebounds in the win over Colorado State on Dec. 5, in her final appearance before the injury. Huggins is a fantastic outside shooter that will help the Buffaloes extend the floor.

CHATTERTON PROMOTED TO ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH: Fourth-year assistant Jonas Chatterton has been promoted to Associate Head Coach.

Chatterton has been a member of Lappe's staff since the very beginning of her reign, joining the program on June 9, 2010. He assists with recruiting, opponent scouting, post play development, offensive and defensive schemes and serves as the program's liaison with marketing and promotions.

Chatterton's record on the CU bench is a sterling 71-37, including three-straight postseason appearances. The Buffaloes had one of their best seasons in over a decade in 2012-13, finishing at 25-7, fourth in the Pac-12 Conference, and advancing to the 13th NCAA Tournament in program history, and first since 2004.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 388-129 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.750), and finished the 2012-13 season with a record of 15-3. The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 24 of 35 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

Colorado, a perfect 6-0 at Coors in 2013-14, has won 13 of its last 14 and 24 of its last 28 at home.

FORT COLLINS – In the post-Chucky Jeffery era, even though the Colorado women's basketball team might still be in search of a specific go-to player, the No. 17 Buffs made a significant opening-night discovery.

They had talked about having each other's backs, and when crunch time arrived against their in-state rival Tuesday night, they backed each other up. CU withstood a late Colorado State comeback and escaped with a 63-59 win in its 2013-14 season opener at Moby Arena.

"We stuck together and that's a major accomplishment," said forward **Arielle Roberson**, whose layup with 6:43 left was the Buffs' last field goal of the night. "One of the things we talked about was having each other backs. I think we had that, especially down the stretch."

CU led by as many as 13 twice in the final 10 minutes, including 59-46 on Roberson's final basket. But the Rams outscored the Buffs 13-1 during that span and pulled to within 60-59 on a basket by Ellen Nystrom with 2:15 to play.

CSU had an opportunity to go ahead on a possession in the final minute, but Roberson stole the ball with 51 seconds left. **Jasmine Sborov** hit two free throws with 27 seconds showing, giving her a career-high 13 points and putting the Buffs ahead 62-59.

After Buffs center **Rachel Hargis** blocked Elin Gustavsson at the other end, **Brittany Wilson** hit one of two free throws with 2.4 seconds remaining – and the resilient Rams were done.

The versatile Sborov, who has seen her role undergo alterations in each season of her college career, said hitting the two late free throws "felt good, I'm not going to lie. It was really comforting to know my teammates and coaches trust me with those shots."

The Rams' late 13-1 run included a pair of free throws by Caitlin Duffy following a technical foul called on CU coach **Linda Lappe**. Duffy, who had hit a three-pointer on the previous possession, sank both free throws and pulled the Rams to 60-57 with 2:30 to play. CSU closed to within one on Nystrom's basket but could get no closer.

Lappe called her team's victory "gutsy," adding, "We found a way to win, which is really important. First game of the year, on the road against your rival...CSU is a good team. We got stops when we needed to, got rebounds and made free throws when we needed to."

And there are areas that obviously need improvement. The Rams turned the Buffs' 19 turnovers into 15 points and outscored the visitors 28-24 in the paint. Gustavsson scored a game-high 21 points and got assistance from Duffy with 13 and Sam Martin with 10.

CU benefited from balanced scoring from its five starters, with Roberson and Sborov each scoring 13. Reese added eight points and guard **Lexy Kresl** grabbed a career-high nine rebounds, with four points and four assists.

The Buffs opened the night by hitting four of their first eight field goal attempts and went ahead 10-4 before cooling off. When the clock touches arrived, they lingered; CU went 0-for-7 from the field during a 6:18 stretch and CSU took advantage.

The Rams overtook the Buffs 11-10 at on a Martin three-pointer and increased their lead to as many as four (22-18) just under 5 minutes later.

With about 5 minutes left before halftime, CU appeared to at least temporarily solve its turnover (10 for the half) and shooting problems and launched a 13-0 run that opened a nine-point lead.

Suddenly, the Buffs were up 31-22, although by halftime the Rams had trimmed that lead to 33-27.

The second half started as the Sborov show. The 6-0 junior scored CU's first six points of the half on two field goals and a pair of free throws, jump-starting an 11-5 run that sent the Buffs up by 12 (44-32). They led by as many as 13 points twice in the final half before the Rams launched their comeback and put a large opening-night scare into the visitors.

BOULDER – Four nights after breathing a sigh of relief following a four-point win at Colorado State, the No. 17 Colorado women's basketball team hardly was forced to take a deep breath in its 2013-14 home opener.

CU cruised past overmatched Alcorn State 83-33 Friday night at the Coors Events Center, winning its sixth consecutive home opener and its 38th in 40 tries. Alcorn State became CU's 26th consecutive non-conference regular-season victim. Buffs coach **Linda Lappe** won her 68th game at CU, the third-most wins in program history behind Ceal Barry (427) and Russell "Sox" Walseth (77).

CU led 42-14 at halftime and was up by as many as 50 in the final minute. The Lady Braves led once, 2-0, before being left behind.

Lappe used 11 players, and each of them scored. CU's bench outscored Alcorn State's 45-10.

"We had a lot of players play a lot of minutes and really played together well on the offensive and defensive ends," Lappe said. "Anything you have as many players as we did play significant minutes and share the ball and score and defend, it's a good thing. I think our depth this year will be one of the keys in how we do as we go through the season. I liked what we saw tonight in terms of that."

CU got a game- and career-high 16 points from redshirt freshman reserve guard **Lauren Huggins**, who hit five of her 10 three-point attempts. Junior guard **Jasmine Sborov** added 10 points, with junior forward **Jen Reese** and junior guard **Lexy Kresl** finishing with nine points each.

Included in Kresl's total was a second-half trey that was the 100th of her CU career. She also went above 500 career points (501).

The 6-1 Huggins is shooting precisely the way she does in practices. Lappe said: "She's getting her feet squared to the rim...she's got deep range and she's 6-1, 6-2 with a high release. That makes her hard to guard. That's her role on the team and she knows it."

The Buffs had trouble at CSU finding offensive consistency, which was a point of emphasis in practices leading to Friday night. Said Kresl: "We went over it a lot the past two days (and) kind of figured out some of the areas we struggled in against CSU. I think we put together a more complete offensive game."

The Buffs shot 42.3 percent (11-of-26) from the field in the first 20 minutes, but only outscored the Lady Braves 6-2 in the paint. CU built its first-half lead largely on turnovers, getting 16 points off of Alcorn State's 13 first-half errors.

CU wasn't bad on the defensive end, either, holding Alcorn State to 19 percent from the field (10-of-53), forcing the visitors into 20 turnovers that were converted into 28 points and making 12 steals.

"Thus far this season Colorado is the best defense we've seen," Alcorn State coach Tanya Edwards said. "They're definitely on target to be one of the better defensive teams."

The Buffs also outscored the Lady Braves 41-28, but Lappe knows that when Iowa comes calling and later when Pac-12 play begins, the difficulties inside will increase as the bodies become bigger and more athletic.

"The one thing I'm a little displeased about is our rebounding," she said. "That's something that has to get a lot better as we go forward."

The Lady Braves scored the game's first basket, took a 2-0 lead, and watched as the Buffs missed three shots on their first possession. And those were the night's highlights for Alcorn State.

From there, CU hit five of its next seven shots – including a pair of three-pointers – and went up 14-2 before the visitors scored again. The Buffs built their lead to 21 (27-6) on three free throws by Kresl, who was hacked on a three-point try, then to 27 (36-9) on a Huggins trey with 4:14 left in the half.

CU closed out the first half with six consecutive free throws – four by **Rachel Hargis**, two by freshman **Zoe Beard-Fails** – and went to the locker room with a 28-point lead (42-14).

 No. 16 (AP)/20 (USAT) Colorado had five players in double-digits led by **Jen Reese's** 18 points as the Buffaloes ran away with an 85-53 decision over New Mexico Saturday afternoon at The Pit.

Reese, a 6-2 junior forward, hit 7-of-10 from the field and drilled two early 3-pointers for the second best scoring output of her career. She received the starting nod for **Arielle Roberson**, who missed Saturday's game with a concussion.

Lexy Kresl had 13 points, **Lauren Huggins** had 12 connecting on 4-of-7 from 3-point range. **Jasmine Sborov** had 11, all in the first half. **Jamee Swan** came off the bench to add a season-best 10 points.

The Buffaloes, who have hit 80-plus in their last three games, scored their most points in a true road game, in regulation, since a 101-56 at TCU on Dec. 7, 1993. The win was also the 28th straight for Colorado during regular season nonconference play.

Colorado was efficient on offense hitting a season-high 56 percent from the field. The Buffaloes were just as potent from the 3-point line, making 10-of-18 attempts.

"We did play really well," CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "I liked our versatility and the way we played together on the offensive side. We moved the ball, moved ourselves, we had nice action towards, nice action away. When you have that many players that can drive, that can score, that can pass and see the open player, you become a very tough team to guard."

It was outside early and often for the Buffaloes. After spotting New Mexico an early 7-3 lead Sborov scored six straight, including a 3-pointer that tied the game at 9-9. **Ashley Wilson** gave CU its first lead at 12-9 on her first 3-pointer of the year at 14:45 of the first half.

Wilson's bucket ended up being the first of three straight possessions that ended in Colorado 3-pointers. Huggins followed Wilson's with her first of the game and Reese connected on her second the next time down the court.

Minutes later Sborov drilled another 3-pointer to cap of a 20-6 run that gave Colorado a 29-15 lead at 8:17 of the first period. The Buffaloes made 8-of-12 from downtown in the first half alone.

The Buffaloes also distributed the ball well once again, dishing out 19 assists, led by Kresl with five.

"When we move the ball, if we get paint touches, we are pretty hard to stop," Reese said. "Everyone on the floor is so versatile that we can score in so many different ways."

New Mexico was led by Sara Halasz who nearly single-handedly kept the Lobos in the game in the first half. The senior guard scored 12 of her 16 points in the first half as the Buffaloes held onto a 42-28 lead at the break.

New Mexico pulled within 12 early in the second half, at 48-36 three minutes in, but the depth of Colorado began to break through. As much success as Colorado had from long range in the first half, the Buffaloes attacked the basket in the second.

Reese had her two early 3-pointers, but changed gears going 4-of-6 from the field in the second half for 10 points closer to the basket including a couple free throws. Swan had eight of her 10 points in the final frame. Kresl and Wilson both had success driving in the lane as well.

The Buffaloes also clamped down defensively. After allowing the Lobos to shoot 44 percent in the first half, New Mexico made just 35 percent in the second as the Buffaloes closed out the contest with a 26-11 run over the final 12:16.

BOULDER – Colorado's offense continued to click as the No. 14/19 ranked Buffaloes sprinted past South Alabama, 94-61 in the first round of the Omni Hotels Classic Friday evening at the Coors Events Center.

Colorado (5-0) will play Rice (4-4) in Saturday's championship game, set for 7:30 p.m. at the Coors Events Center. Rice squeaked by Samford 57-52 in the opener. South Alabama (0-5) will play Samford (1-4) in Saturday's consolation at 5 p.m.

Colorado had five players score in double-digits for the third straight game and hit at least 80 points for the fourth consecutive contest, and 90 for the second time this year.

Jen Reese and **Jamee Swan** tied for lead scoring honors with 16 points apiece. **Lexy Kresl** had 12 points, seven rebounds and a career-high six assists. **Rachel Hargis** had 11 and **Lauren Huggins** had 10.

"It was another night with really good balance," head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "Offensively, we moved the ball well. We had a lot of different players contribute; we scored on the inside, we scored on the outside. I really like the flow of some of the things we're doing offensively."

Colorado's balanced shined once again as all 10 players that played scored, in fact that was achieved less than 10 minutes into the contest. Kresl scored 11 of her 12 points in the first half and keyed the Buffaloes fast start, drilling a 3-pointer that gave Colorado an early 11-2 lead.

South Alabama stayed close early on the heels of Rachel Cumbo, who hit two early 3-pointers, the second pulling the Jaguars to within six at 22-16 at the 11:10 mark of the first half.

But Kresl countered with a 3-pointer which sparked a 10-0 run. **Ashley Wilson** scored on a put back of a **Brittany Wilson** miss to double-up the Jaguars at 32-16. From there the Buffaloes continued to roll. Colorado hit 57 percent in the first half alone en route to a 53-27 lead at the break, its most halftime points since putting up 53 against Southern Utah in 2009.

The Buffaloes dominated in the paint outscoring the Jaguars 40-14. The trio of Reese, Hargis and Swan were a combined 15-of-24 from the field. They also got it done at the foul line, making 12-of-13 combined, including a career-best 7-of-8 from Hargis.

Swan's 16 points were a career high and came in a variety of ways, she had put back on offensive rebounds, mid-range jumpers and even a steal and coast-to-coast lay-in. She finished 7-of-10 from the field and grabbed eight boards, leading the Buffaloes in rebounding for the second straight contest.

"It was pretty even, it just came down to who wanted it more," Swan said. "They were good on the inside and strong, but again, it came down to who wanted it more."

Colorado as a team was outstanding from the line sinking 83 percent (20-of-24).

"We keep working on that every day," Hargis said. "It was nice to get some fouls and get to the line."

Reese was 6-of-8 from the field and pulled down seven rebounds. Ashley Wilson finished with six points, six rebounds and tied a personal best with four assists.

Colorado ended up at 52 percent for the game (34-of-65) and dished out 19 assists. The Buffaloes also enjoyed a 42-28 edge on the boards.

Cumbo had a game-high 19 points for South Alabama while Jennifer Johnson scored 18 off the bench.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - Outside, negative temperatures and raging winds chilled Laramie, Wyo., but inside the Arena-Auditorium, the No. 11 Colorado women's basketball team burned a fire in the second half to power them to a 63-59 victory over Wyoming.

Colorado, 7-0, wins its 31st straight regular nonconference game and improves its all-time record against Wyoming to 36-9.

Brittany Wilson led the Buffs and finished the game with 19 points. **Arielle Roberson** added 13 points and 12 rebounds, her fourth career double-double and the Buffaloes' first of the season. Kayla Woodward recorded 17 points for the Cowgirls.

Wyoming (4-2) tied the game up at 57 with 57 seconds left on the clock after a dribble-drive through the lane by Chelan Landry. **Lauren Huggins** missed a shot on the Colorado end, but Wilson came up with the rebound in a crowd in the paint and scored on a layup to give the Buffs a two point lead with 35 seconds left.

From there, the Buffs and Cowgirls traded free throws. Tough defense disallowed a shot from by Kaitlyn Mileto and brought **Lexy Kresl** to the charity stripe. She made both free throws to give the Buffs a 61-57 lead.

A foul on the other end put the Cowgirls at the line, and Fallon Lewis capitalized to cut the Buffs lead to two once more. **Jasmine Sborov** was fouled with five seconds left on the clock, and she went to the line and made both free throws to seal the 63-59 victory.

"You got to give our players a lot of credit," Colorado head coach Linda Lappe said. "We figured it out, we bared down, and I think Arielle [Roberson] and Brittany [Wilson] got some key shots. We were resilient again. It's nice to be able to pull out with wins. Lot of things to take away, but I'm proud of the way we stepped up."

Colorado was without leading scorer **Jan Reese**, who suffered a concussion earlier in the week, and backup guard **Ashley Wilson** who injured her shoulder against Rice.

The Buffs got off to a rough start and struggled to drain a bucket. They fell behind and could not match Wyoming's quick four points. **Rachel Hargis** made both of her free throws to narrow the Cowgirls' lead to 4-2. Just before the first media timeout, Huggins gave the Buffs their first lead at 5-4 after draining a big three.

From there, Colorado continued to maintain its lead in the first half with some big plays. Hargis gobble a ball up defensively at half-court, and the Buffs turned it around to add a three from Kresl. A Wilson 3-pointer put the Buffs ahead 13-8 at the 12:10 mark.

Colorado held the lead for a majority of the first half, but the Cowgirls closed on a 10-2 run in the final 4:26, capped off by a Kaylee Hoffman 3-pointer at the buzzer, to take a 27-21 lead at the break.

The Buffs shot a season-low 26.7 percent from the field in the first half. In the second half, Wyoming opened the scoring with a Woodward 3-pointer. Soon afterward, the Buffs went on an 11-0 run, including Huggins' 18th try of the season. The Buffs took a 32-30 lead with 16:44 remaining in the half, but the Cowgirls evened the score once more. Huggins let another three fly to give the Buffs a 35-32 advantage going into the media timeout.

Wilson added another three from the left corner to give the Buffs a 40-32 edge with 14:06, their largest lead to that point.

But Wyoming came back strong. After a Woodward missed free throw, Hoffman grabbed the rebound to keep possession. Mileto then drilled a 3-pointer to cut the lead to 40-36.

Roberson stopped Wyoming's momentum with a jumper that sparked an 11-2 Colorado run ended by five straight points from Wilson.

The Buffaloes kept their lead near double digits until one final run by the Cowgirls in the final five minutes. Wyoming embarked on a 10-0 run, including a pair of tough shots by Landry that tied the score which led to the Buffaloes final clutch shots.

BOULDER - Strange afternoon of hoops in Boulder, but strange was good. The No. 11 Colorado women remained unbeaten with a 79-56 win over Illinois, but it was anything but business as usual in the Coors Events Center.

For starters, the Buffs (8-0) and Illini (5-5) had their pregame warm-up time shortened due to the aftermath of the CU's men's last-second upset of No. 6 Kansas. That game started at 1:20 p.m., with the women's contest scheduled to begin just after 5 p.m. But it took longer than anticipated to clear the CEC court after it was stormed by CU students and fans following the electrifying 75-72 win.

Then, with 8:30 left in the first half of the women's contest and the Buffs up 27-20, alarms sounded in the CEC. Play continued, but after a couple of possessions, the court and stands were cleared. A sprinkler head had burst in the loading dock area of the Events Center, triggering the alarms and stopping play for 20 minutes. Players went to their locker rooms, fans went to the building's upper concourses.

Meanwhile, second-year Illinois coach Matt Bollant might not have known what he was missing. He was ill and remained at his Boulder hotel, which made associate head coach Mike Divilbiss the head man for the afternoon.

"There's not much you can say in that situation," Divilbiss said of the delay. "We're a young team and it's just one of those things - you just have to learn to get past the environment."

Once back on the court, Illinois guard Amber Moore got a quick score but the Buffaloes quickly went up by double-digits for the first time on a three-pointer by **Jan Reese** (16 points) and a jumper by **Rachel Hargis** (12) for a 32-22 lead.

Forward Jacqui Grant (game-high 20) helped keep Illinois close. When the Illini cooled off from the outside, they started going in and the 6-3 freshman scored four of her 15-first half points on a run that cut Colorado's lead to 40-35.

But **Lauren Huggins** hit another 3-pointer and Hargis matched an Illinois score with a layup of her own to give the Buffaloes a 45-37 halftime advantage.

Reese hit her first three field goals of the second half as the Buffs built their lead to 20. A **Jasmine Sborov** trey and a soft Hargis layup pushed CU in front 62-42. But Illinois increased its press, contributing to the Buffs' 20 turnovers, and crept to within 14 (62-48).

CU finally settled down as Sborov (10) hit a three-pointer at the 7:56 mark to push the lead back to 17 and the Illini were done.

"I thought it was a great win for our team," CU coach **Linda Lappe** said, acknowledging Illinois' athleticism, quickness and different defensive looks. "There were a lot of different obstacles and adversities through the game - not having the normal warm up time, having a fire alarm... I liked how we came out of being in the locker room for 15 minutes and got back into it. So, there were a lot of positives to take out of it."

Once again, the Buffs' balance was apparent. Four players, topped by **Arielle Roberson's** 17, reached double figures and 10 players scored. The Buffs out-rebounded the Illini 51-30 and held the visitors to 30.8 percent shooting.

In addition to her seven points, senior guard **Brittany Wilson** set career highs in assists (eight) and rebounds (13) and tied a career-best with three blocked shots.

CU committed 21 turnovers to Illinois' 14, but Wilson said given the Illini's average of forcing 26, the Buffs will take their 21 and move on. "You don't want to have 21 turnovers a game," she said, "but we won, so hey."

Reese, who sat out the Wyoming game on Wednesday night with concussion symptoms and a broken nose, said her last start "was good to get the confidence up. Even if I did miss it, it's short memory. But it was good to come back and it felt good."

LOUISVILLE, Ky. -- Lexy Kresl had 17 points and Jen Reese corralled her second career double-double, but Louisville had a little bit more Saturday afternoon at the KFC Yum! Center as the No. 7 ranked Cardinals outlasted No. 11 Colorado 69-62.

Louisville' Shoni Schimmel had a game-high 30 points, including 13-of-16 from the line as Cardinals improved to 12-1.

Reese had 14 points and pulled down a team-season-high 14 rebounds for the Buffs (9-1) who saw their 33-game nonconference regular season win streak end.

It was a tough, physical battle, the kind one would expect from a game between two of the nation's top teams. But that aggressiveness cost both teams at times; and Colorado a little more in the end. A total of 56 fouls were called, 32 on Colorado. The teams combined for 70 free throw attempts, Louisville hitting 24-of-40 while the Buffaloes were 17-of-30.

Colorado held a potent Louisville offense well below its average. The Cardinals entered the game averaging over 90 points per game, and over 100 in their last four. The Buffaloes were able to slow Louisville down and force the 2013 NCAA runner-ups to score in the half court.

But Colorado gave the Cardinals more opportunities than they hoped. The Buffs were outrebounded for the first time this year, 52-47. Louisville crashed the offensive glass, pulling down 21 offensive boards. Even though second-chance points were even (11-11), it was missed opportunities for stops that hurt the Buffs.

Despite the rebounding struggles, Colorado was in the game the whole way as neither team led by more than seven points and featured nine lead changes.

Kresl gave Colorado an early 8-5 lead with a 3-pointer, but Bria Smith hit back-to-back jumpers to even the game at 10-10. The Cardinals pushed their lead to 24-18 on a Sara Hammond layup with 8:01 left in the first half, but Colorado answered with its biggest run.

Kresl, who scored 15 of her 17 points in the first half, answered Hammond with a jumper that set off a 13-0 run. Arielle Roberson put back a Reese miss and a pair of Kresl free throws tied the game at 24-24.

Lauren Huggins broke the tie with a long 3-pointer to give the Buffs a 27-24 lead, forcing a Louisville timeout. At the beginning of the timeout Louisville's bench received a technical foul giving the Buffs an opportunity to extend the lead.

Kresl hit the two technical free throws coming out of the timeout to give the Buffaloes their largest lead at 29-24. Unfortunately that was it for Colorado in the first half and the Cardinals came storming back.

Schimmel finally ended Colorado's run with a runner in the lane, drew a foul and completed the 3-point play. Younger sister Jude Schimmel then connected on a pair of fast break layups in the closing minutes as a 9-0 run gave the Cardinals a 33-29 lead at the half.

Colorado quickly erased the Louisville halftime lead as a Sborov 3-pointer ended a 7-2 CU run out of the break for a 36-35 Buffs lead. However, shortly after that the fouls started to catch up with Colorado. Sborov picked up her third moments after her 3-pointer. Brittany Wilson then picked up No. 4 with nearly 13 minutes left with Ashley Wilson and Roberson matching that total moments later.

Still the Buffaloes continued to stay close. Sborov hit a bucket to tie the game at 46-46 with 9:44 remaining, but the Cardinals reeled off seven straight behind the Schimmel sisters.

In the end, the game was put away at the line. Louisville hit 18-of-24 from the line in the second half compared to just 10-of-18 for Colorado.

The Buffs did get a few stops, a pair of free throws by Kresl and one each from Roberson and Reese cut the Louisville lead to 63-59 with 1:10 left. The defense came up big when Jude Schimmel missed a jumper with under a minute left, and Roberson grabbed the rebound. Rachel Hargis eventually ended up at the line, hitting 1-of-2 to make it a one possession game at 63-60. But that was it as Shoni Schimmel clamped down hitting four free throws down the stretch, and scored the final points on a breakaway basket in the closing seconds.
