have turned the ball over nearly 18 times per game, although they have been able to dip that number to under 16 in Pac-12 games. Washington State is the top turnover causing team in the Pac-12, forcing nearly 20 a game with 10.6 steals per contest.

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 9-9 overall and 2-5 in the Pac-12 after dropping a hard-fought 85-82 contest at Washington on Jan. 23. The Buffaloes have won two of their last three after sweeping their season series with Utah last week. The Buffaloes claimed a 77-72 overtime win at the Coors Events Center on Jan. 14 before cruising to a 73-54 triumph in the rematch in Salt Lake City on Jan. 18. Colorado's 19-point win over Utah marked their largest conference road margin of victory since defeating Kansas 70-51, exactly 12 years earlier on Jan. 18, 2003. Current head coach **Linda Lappe** was a senior on that 2003 squad.

Colorado is averaging 72.8 points per game on 43.4 percent shooting. After putting up just 57.8 points an outing over a four game span dating back to Long Beach State, Colorado's offense has rebounded to the tune of 79.0 points over the last three. Colorado is coming off its sixth 80-point game after putting up 82 at Washington, the most for the Buffaloes in a conference road game since an 84-60 win at Nebraska on Feb. 26, 2002. Colorado's 84 points against UCLA are the most against a conference opponent since putting up a similar number against Oregon on Feb. 10, 2013.

Defensively, Colorado has allowed 70.4 points per game on 38.5 percent from the field. The Buffaloes had their best performance of the Pac-12 season in the road win at Utah, limiting the Utes to just 54 points after giving up 76 per game over the first five. Colorado is second in the Pac-12 in free throw percentage (.732), rebounding (43.8 rpg), defensive rebounds (30.1 drpg) and blocked shots (5.1 bpg), while ranking third in rebounding margin (+6.3), offensive rebounds (13.7 orpg) and 3-point percentage (.391) and fourth in 3-point defense (.287) and assists (16.2 apg).

Senior **Jen Reese** leads Colorado in scoring (13.9 ppg) and field goal percentage (.480) while ranking second in free throw percentage (.848) and rebounding (7.3 rpg). She scored a career and team

season-high 30 points in the loss to UCLA which put her over the 1,000-point mark in her career. She made 14-of-19 from the field and also dished out five assists, all career-highs. The 30 points are the most by a CU player since Chucky Jeffery had 30 against Idaho on Dec. 4, 2011. Reese is hitting 55.9 percent during Pac-12 games (33-of-59).

Reese has scored in double figures in 13 of 18 games and has three double-doubles. She has four games of 20 or more points this season. On the Pac-12 leaderboard, Reese is sixth in free throw percentage, ninth in overall rebounding, 10th in defensive boards (5.3 drpg), 11th in scoring and 14th in field goal percentage.

Junior forward **Jamee Swan** tops Colorado in rebounding (7.7 rpg), blocked shots (1.9 bpg) and free throws made and attempted (61-of-87) while ranking second in scoring (13.4 ppg) and steals (17). Swan registered her team-best fourth double-double of the season with 22 points and 11 rebounds at Washington. In that game she also recorded a career-best six assists and tied a personal best with nine field goals made. It was also her sixth career 20-point effort and fourth this season.

In the Pac-12 Swan ranks second in blocks, seventh in offensive rebounds (2.9 orpg), eighth in overall rebounding, 13th in scoring, 14th in defensive rebounds (4.8 drpg), and 15th in field goal percentage (.478).

Senior guard **Lexy Kresl** is averaging 11.9 points and 5.2 rebounds while leading the Buffaloes at 4.9 assists and 1.2 steals per game. Kresl leads Colorado in Pac-12 play at 13.4 points per game an average that has exploded to 20 per contest over the past four. She has led the Buffaloes in scoring the last three games including 23 points on 5-of-10 from downtown at Washington. Kresl scored a career-high 26 points in the overtime win over Utah hitting 6-of-8 from the field and setting personal bests with 11-of-16 from the foul line. She leads Colorado in 3-pointers with 34 and has made 14 of her last 23 spanning the last four games.

On the Pac-12 charts Kresl ranks fourth in 3-pointers made (2.1

3mpg), fifth in assists, eighth in 3-point percentage (.410), 13th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.3), 14th in free throw percentage (.766) and 22nd in scoring.

Sophomore guard **Haley Smith** leads the team in free throw percentage (.884) while ranking third in rebounding (6.3 rpg) and field goal percentage (.477) and fourth in scoring (10.7 ppg). She has averaged 12.8 points over the last four games and in that span has made 20 straight free throws including a monster 11-for-11 effort in the home win over Utah that ties for the fourth best single-game performance in team history. Smith scored a personal Pac-12 high 19 points on 7-of-10 shooting against UCLA. She recorded her first career double-double with 24 points and 12 rebounds against San Jose State; both numbers marking personal bests. She hit 10-of-14 from the field during her career-best day against the Spartans.

On the Pac-12 leaderboard Smith ranks second in free throw percentage, 19th in rebounding and 30th in scoring.

Senior guard **Jasmine Sborov** is averaging 6.3 points and 5.2 rebounds and ranks second on the team in assists with 48. Sborov had a career and team season-high four steals at Washington to go along with six points, five rebounds and five assists. She scored in double figures for the fourth time this season with 10 points against USC on 5-of-10 from the field. Her 10 points marked just her third Pac-12 game scoring in double-digits and just one off her league best of 11 set at UCLA last season. Her five field goals made were a Pac-12 best. Against Iowa, Sborov led Colorado with career-highs in points (17) and rebounds (12) for her second career double-double. Sborov also dished out a career-high nine assists against San Jose State.

Sophomore wing **Lauren Huggins** is second on the team with 27 3-pointers and has hit 37.5 percent from long range ranking 14th in the Pac-12. She made 3-of-6 in the road win at Utah after making just 3-of-20 over the previous seven contests.

Sophomore forward **Zoe Beard-Fails** earned a starting role for the Buffaloes front court for a recent five-game stretch. Overall on the season she has averaged 4.7 points and 3.7 rebounds. Beard-Fails had nine points, five rebounds and tied a career-best with three assists at Washington. Against Long Beach State she had career highs in points (14), rebounds (8) and field goals made and attempted (7-of-13).

Colorado's freshmen have steadily increased their productivity as the Pac-12 season gets into full swing. Wing **Alina Hartmann** scored a career-best eight points in the win at Utah, hitting a pair of 3-pointers. **Brecca Thomas** is averaging 4.7 points during Pac-12 play, hitting 48 percent from the field including 60 percent (6-of-10) from 3-point range during that span. **Zoe Correal** logged double-digit minutes in both wins over Utah pitching in 2.0 points and 2.5 rebounds. She had a personal best six points on 3-of-6 shooting at Stanford.

ABOUT WASHINGTON STATE: Washington State is 12-6 overall and 3-4 in the Pac-12 after defeating Utah 63-54 on Jan. 23. The Cougars have won their last two after a four game skid. Those four losses have come to the top four teams in the Pac-12 standings, with a combined league mark of 25-3. Washington State averages 73.1 points on 40 percent shooting and 73 percent from the foul line. Defensively, the Cougars allow 65.5 points per game and allow 41 percent from the field which ranks 11th in the Pac-12. WSU gives up the most rebounds in the league at 41.3 per game and has the lowest rebounding margin (-2.4) in the conference. The Cougars counter that by creating the most turnovers among league competitors at nearly 22 per game while ranking second in steals at just under 11 an outing.

BOULDER – Another chance at a close-game breakthrough eluded the Colorado women's basketball team Sunday afternoon. Following what has become a painfully familiar script, CU faltered in the final 5 minutes and lost 80-77 to Washington State at the Coors Events Center.

"Well, it seems a little bit like déjà vu," said head coach **Linda Lappe**, whose team lost its fourth Pac-12 Conference game this season by three or fewer points.

Lappe credited the Buffs for competing throughout and staying close enough to win but again lamented their inability to "make key stops, free throws, passes and shots down the stretch that would have helped us."

After trailing by as many as nine points midway through the second half, CU (14-11, 4-10) rallied to tie the score at 71-71. But the Buffs clanked four of their next five free throws, not hitting one until **Ashley Wilson** converted a pair with 2:52 to play, then sank one of two to put CU up 75-73 with 2:17 remaining.

From there until the final buzzer, the Buffs got only a field goal by **Jen Reese** in the last 2 seconds that made it a two-point (79-77) game. After one of two foul shots by WSU's Shalie Dheensaw with 1.1 seconds left put WSU (14-12, 8-6) up 80-77, Reese threw a three-quarter court length pass to **Jamee Swan**, who caught the ball then passed to Wilson instead of shooting. Time expired before Wilson could attempt a shot.

Lappe said Reese's long pass went a step or two too deep, forcing Swan inside the 3-point circle – thus Swan's decision to kick it back to Wilson. Reese said the play was designed for Swan to catch-and-shoot, but added, "If there was more time, Ashley could have shot the ball. The pass was there; she had it."

Swan, again coming off the bench, and Reese led the Buffs with 19 points each, while Ashley Wilson added 12. The Buffs had problems with Washington's backcourt of Kelsey Plum (25 points) and Jazmine Davis (24) in an 87-80 loss on Thursday night. This was part of Lappe's déjà vu: On Sunday, CU surrendered 42 combined points to WSU guards Tia Presley (32) and Lia Galdeira (10).

Presley got 22 of her total in the first half, then picked up eight more points in the first 4:55 of the second half. She didn't get her 32nd point until hitting a layup with 1:27 to play, putting the Cougars up 77-75.

The Buffs trailed 44-40 at halftime, surrendering a 25-22 lead taken on a 3-pointer by Roberson with 8:37 left before the break. But CU didn't get another field goal for nearly 4 minutes, and during that time WSU was building its largest lead of the half – 34-25 – with Presley scoring eight of her 22 first-half points.

The Cougars outscored the Buffs 7-2 to open the half, with Presley scoring consecutive baskets to kick off that run. WSU again stretched its lead to nine – 51-42 – on a traditional three-point play by Sage Romberg (14 points, 12 rebounds).

By the 10-minute mark the Buffs still trailed by seven – 64-57 – but they were about to make their move. With Reese getting four points in a 6-0 run and freshman **Zoe Beard-Fails** scoring on a put-back, CU pulled within 64-63 with 9:07 remaining.

The Buffs finally tied the Cougars at 71-71 when Swan hit both ends of a one-and-one with 4:23 left. On the previous possession, with 5:51 to play, Swan scored what would be CU's next-to-last field goal – the last being Reese's jumper with 2 seconds left.

After Ashley Wilson hit one of two free throws to give CU its 75-73 lead with 2:17 left, WSU got four free throws from Galdeira, Presley's layup and one of two foul shots from Dheensaw to account for its 80 points.

The Cougars were up 80-77 and the Buffs needed a nearly full-court pass and full-blown miracle to force overtime. They got the first but not the second.

Washington State is led by the prolific backcourt of junior Lia Galdeira and senior Tia Presley who account for 53 percent of the team's scoring. The duo are separated by a single point on the season, with Presley taking over the team lead after a 17-point outing against Utah. She's second in the Pac-12 at 19.2 points per game just a fraction ahead of Galdeira who is in third. Presley tops the Cougars and ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in 3-pointers made (2.1 3mpg). Galdeira leads the Pac-12 in steals (3.3 spg) and is WSU's top active rebounder at 5.7 per game. Washington State lost its top rebounder (7.2 rpg) and third-leading scorer (8.6 ppg) in senior Shalie Dheensaw who injured a knee in the loss at Oregon State on Jan. 16. Freshman Louise Brown has stepped in for her, averaging 3.9 points and 5.6 rebounds per game. Dawnyelle Awa paces the Cougars in assists (2.8 apg) and field goal percentage (.536)

June Daugherty is in her eighth year at Washington State with a record of 85-152. She is in her 26th year overall as a collegiate head coach with a record of 398-366.

THE SERIES: This will be just the seventh meeting between Colorado and Washington State, the least played series for the Buffaloes in their fourth year in the Pac-12. The series is tied at 3-3 after Washington State swept the two meetings in 2013-14. The Cougars won 70-60 on Jan. 17 in Pullman and took the rematch in Boulder a month later, 80-77. Colorado's lone win in three tries in Pullman came in the team's first year in the Pac-12, a 57-56 squeaker on Jan. 7, 2012.

Linda Lappe is 2-2 against Washington State as a head coach. June Daugherty is 2-4 against Colorado, 2-2 with Washington State and 0-2 while she was head coach at Washington.

CONNECTIONS: Sophomore guard/forward **Haley Smith** is a graduate of Skyline High School in Sammamish, Wash., located east of Seattle.

SMITH PERFECT FROM FREE THROW LINE: Sophomore **Haley Smith** was a perfect 11-for-11 from the free throw line in the home win over Utah. Both numbers represent career highs for Smith with the 11 free throws made tying for the team season high along with **Jen Reese** (11-of-13) and **Lexy Kresl** (11-of-16).

Smith's 11-for-11 outing also ties for Colorado's fourth best single game performance for free throws made with out a miss. She has made 20 straight free throws over the last four games and currently ranks second in the Pac-12 at 88.4 percent. She has made 21-of-22 in Pac-12 play (.955), the league's best mark during that span.

REESE'S TOP FIELD GOAL NIGHT: Senior forward **Jen Reese** had a career night with 30 points against UCLA. She made 14-of-19 from the field and the 14 field goals made tie for the third-best single-game total in team history. Reese joins 10 others who have had 14 field goals in a game, most recently by CU's all-time leading scorer Brittany Spears against California in the first round of the 2011 Postseason WNIT.

BACK TO THE BOARDS: Colorado has outrebounded, or been even, with 15 of its 18 opponents this season by an average of 6.3 per game. The Buffaloes are second the Pac-12 in overall rebounds (43.8 rpg) and defensive rebounds (30.1 drpg) and ranked third in offensive boards (13.7 orgp).

Colorado has five games with 50 or more rebounds, including the Long Beach State contest where the Buffaloes dominated the 49ers 50-26, the largest margin of the season and biggest since holding a plus-25 margin against Arizona (51-26) on Jan. 20, 2013. All five of Colorado's 50-plus rebounding games came over an eight-game span including a season-high 60 against San Jose State the pro-

gram's most since pulling down 60 against Marquette in the first round of the 1994 NCAA Tournament.

Colorado sports two of the top nine rebounders in the Pac-12, and is the only school with two in the top 10. Junior **Jamee Swan** is seventh at 7.7 per game while senior **Jen Reese** is ninth at 7.3 per contest.

KRESL'S DISH: **Lexy Kresl** recorded the fourth triple-double in team history by scoring 12 points, grabbing 11 rebounds and dishing out 11 assists in the double overtime win over Colorado State on Nov. 29.

Her triple-double was the team's first since Chucky Jeffery recorded the second of her two triple-doubles at Oklahoma State on Mar. 25, 2012 during the Postseason WNIT. Sandy Bean achieved the program's first triple-double against Utah State on Feb. 16, 1979.

For Kresl, both the rebounds and assists figures were career-highs. It was actually her second "double" of the week. Kresl put together her first career double-double in the win over Denver with 10 points and 10 assists.

Nine of her assists in the Denver game came in the first 20 minutes, tying a school record for assists in one half originally set by Whitney Law against Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 18, 2005.

Counting Colorado's prior three triple-doubles, Kresl's points-assists double-double was the 14th in team history and first since Jeffery's triple at OSU (12 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists).

WORKING OVERTIME: Colorado has played in four overtime games, the most in one season in team history. As of January 20, it's tied for the second-most in NCAA Division I for the 2014-15 campaign (DePaul, Norfolk State), trailing only Hofstra which has played in five. The NCAA I record for overtimes in one season is seven set by Wisconsin in 1998-99.

Colorado's 77-72 overtime win over Utah moved the Buffaloes to 3-1 on the season with the extra session and above .500 all-time at 24-23.

The Buffaloes had played three overtime games in one season on four other occasions, most recently in 1995-96. Colorado played in overtime in three of its first seven games marking the first time the Buffaloes had played three during the nonconference schedule. Overall it's the 14 time Colorado has played multiple overtime games in one season.

Colorado played back-to-back overtime games for the first time in team history with the San Jose State and CSU contests. The Buffaloes had two overtimes in a three-game span in February 1988.

The double overtime game with CSU was just the sixth in team history and first since an 84-77 setback to Iowa State on Jan. 13, 2008. **Lexy Kresl** set a school single game record by playing in 49 minutes against Colorado State. The Buffaloes are 3-3 overall in double overtime games.

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS: Colorado has a record of 53-31 since the beginning of the 2012-13 season. Of those 31 losses, 14 have been to ranked teams and 13 of those ranked higher than Colorado at the time the game was played. The Buffaloes have won 50 of their last 67 games against unranked opponents.

The Buffaloes have been dominant in regular season nonconference games under **Linda Lappe**. Colorado is 48-9 in that stretch since the beginning of the 2010-11 season. The Buffaloes have won 41 of their last 46 regular season nonconference contests. The Buffaloes put together 33 straight nonconference wins from Dec. 30, 2010 through Dec. 12, 2013.

REESE'S PIECES: Senior forward **Jen Reese** is the 15th player in team history to reach 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in a career.

She reached the 1,000-point milestone during her career-high 30-point effort against UCLA on Jan. 11 and is the 26th player to reach that mark. She is currently 26th on CU's career scoring list with 1,038 points, seven away from cracking the top 25.

Reese became the 21st player to reach 500 career rebounds during the Missouri State game. She is currently 15th on Colorado's all-time list with 596. Her four field goals against Washington moved her into 20th in all-time field goals made with 415.

KRESL SOLID FROM ARC, LINE: Senior guard **Lexy Kresl** ranks seventh in career 3-pointers made at 158 and is fifth in attempts with 502. She has made 14-of-23 over her last four outings.

She has made a 3-pointer in 81 of 111 career games and has 42 contests with two or more buckets from long range. Kresl hit five at Washington, tying a season high and also marking her seventh career game with five or more 3-pointers.

Kresl has also been one of Colorado's most reliable free throw shooters over the past three seasons. Her career percentage of 82.1 (162-of-197) would rank sixth on the Buffs' all-time list (minimum of 100 attempts).

She hit 84.1 percent from the line in 2013-14 (69-of-82) ranking third in the Pac-12 Conference. Her mark was also good for 19th on Colorado's single-season list.

Kresl is also closing in on the 1,000 point mark, entering Sunday's game with 928.

HUGGINS SHOOTS UP LIST: With 20 3-pointers over the last 14 games, sophomore **Lauren Huggins** has put herself among the Buffaloes' career leaders. She is currently 17th in career 3-pointers made with 67 and 19th in attempts at 182.

SWAN'S SWATS: Junior forward **Jamee Swan** ranks second in the Pac-12 in blocked shots at 1.9 per game. She has 17 blocked shots over the last eight games (2.1 bpg) a number that includes a pair of career and team-season high five block efforts (Long Beach State, USC).

Swan has 98 career blocks ranking ninth CU's all-time list.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado is 0-2 against ranked teams this season after dropping a 62-55 decision at No. 15/15 Stanford on Jan. 3. The Buffaloes have dropped their last 14 against ranked opponents. Colorado is 62-156 all-time against ranked opponents.

STRONG SCHEDULE: Colorado currently holds down the 27th toughest schedule in the nation (through games of Jan. 20) as its opponents have a combined record of 154-98 (.611). The Buffaloes are fifth in the Pac-12 trailing UCLA (2nd, .679), Arizona State (20th, .624), California (23rd, .622) and Washington (26th, .611).

Taking into account the records of future opposition, Colorado jumps to 19th as its cumulative opponent record is 226-129 (.637), trailing

only UCLA in the Pac-12 (1st, .687).

Colorado opened a season with two teams that made the NCAA Tournament the previous year (North Dakota & Western Kentucky) for the first time since 2003-04 when the Buffaloes hosted Old Dominion and Notre Dame in the WBCA Classic. Only twice since then had the Buffaloes even played one team in their first two coming off a trip to the big dance, Loyola-Marymount in 2004-05 (Game 1) and Vanderbilt in 2006-07 (Game 2).

OMNI HOTELS CHAMPS: Colorado won its Omni Hotels Classic championship for the 18th time by defeating Missouri State and Colorado State. The Buffaloes improved to 46-10 all-time in their home holiday classic and won their sixth straight title.

WRAPPING UP THE WNIT: Colorado was 2-1 in the Preseason WNIT advancing to the quarterfinals and picking up a consolation round win. The Buffaloes competed in the season-opening event for the third time and moved to 8-2 all-time in the tournament.

The Buffaloes won the championship in 1995 and also advanced to the semifinals of the 2001 event.

Mississippi State defeated Western Kentucky 88-77 in the championship game. The 2014 Preseason WNIT featured five NCAA Tournament teams from a year ago along with four Postseason WNIT participants, including Colorado.

SBOROV GOOD WORKS: Senior guard **Jasmine Sborov** is one of 93 Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) nominees for the 2015 AllState WBCA Good Works Team.

This prestigious community service award recognizes a distinguished group of student-athletes who have demonstrated a commitment to enriching the lives of others and contributing to the greater good in their communities.

From the 93 WBCA nominees distinguished voting panels will select two 10-member teams comprised of five student-athletes from the NCAA Division I level and five student-athletes from NCAA Divisions II, III and the NAIA. The final roster of 20 award recipients will be unveiled in February.

Sborov, a native of Round Rock, Texas, has been a vital part of Colorado women's basketball's community service efforts during her career and has participated in a wide variety of events. During the Boulder floods of Sept. 2013, Sborov helped with relief efforts around campus, including serving food to displaced members of the community. It was part of a global effort in which

outstanding 39-2 (.951) all-time in home openers and has never lost its overall season opener when played at home (28-0).

RETURN TO 'D': Defense has been a staple to the Colorado program under **Linda Lappe** and for the Buffaloes to be successful in 2014-15, toughness on that side of the court will once again be paramount.

Three of Colorado's top four single-season field goal percentage defense totals have come under Lappe's direction. The 2012-13 NCAA Tournament team set the bar with a school-record effort at .350. Last year's squad came in with the third-best total at .369. Colorado's 2013-14 total ranked third on the Pac-12 leaderboard and 34th in the nation.

Two of Colorado's top 10 scoring defense totals have come under Lappe's reign including a school-best 54.5 ppg in 2012-13. Three of CU's top 10 rebounding margins have also come in that time frame, including last year's mark of plus-5.0, the eighth best in team history.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 401-139 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.743). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 25 of 36 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

Colorado is 7-4 at the Coors Events Center in 2014-15 and has won 25 of its last 36 and 36 of its last 50 at home.

BUFFS SIGN QUARTET TO NLI's: Monica Burich, Makenzie El-

lis, Kennedy Leonard and Alexis Robinson have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2015-16 head coach Linda Lappe announced on Wednesday, the first day of the NCAA's early signing period.

Burich, a 6-2 forward, is a strong three-sport athlete for Roseville (Minn.) High School in the Twin Cities area. She averaged 15.5 points, 9 rebounds, 5 assists, 3 steals and 2 blocks as a junior, helping Roseville to a 21-7 record. Burich was first team Class AAAA All-State selection by the Minnesota Girls Basketball Coaches Association. A two-time all-conference selection, Burich has led the Raiders in blocks and steals the last three years, and added rebounds and assists to that resume as a junior.

Leonard, a 5-8 guard from Southlake, Texas, has led Carroll High School to three straight district and regional championships. Leonard averaged 8.4 assists per game in 2013-14, leading Texas and ranking ninth in the country. She was the 2014 District MVP, 2013 District Offensive MVP and the 2012 Newcomer of the Year. Leonard has averaged 12 points, 7 assists, 6 rebounds and 3.5 steals over her first three years.

Ellis, a 6-2 forward from Tulsa, Okla., averaged 12.2 points and 6.6 rebounds as a junior, guiding Booker T. Washington High School to a 22-5 record. She earned honorable mention to the Tulsa World's All-State team – which spans all classifications – as the Hornets fell just one game short of the 2014 state tournament. Ellis was the lone sophomore starter on Booker T. Washington's 2013 Class 6A State Championship team and earned All-State Tournament honors.

Robinson, a 5-10 guard from Ashland, Ky., has led Ashland Blazer High School to the last three Kentucky state tournaments, highlighted by a semifinals appearance in 2014. She is the only player in the state to be named MVP of her district tournament the past three years. Robinson is a two-time Area Player of the Year and a member of the Lexington Herald Leader All-State team. She enters her senior campaign already the Kittens' all-time leader in steals with 242 and on pace to challenge team marks for points, rebounds, assists and blocks.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado women's basketball will be televised to a regional or national audience at least 13 times during the regular season, including 12 games on the Pac-12 Networks during league play. This marks the third consecutive year the Buffaloes will have double-digit regional or national television appearances.

Colorado made its television debut on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain on Nov. 25, defeating Denver 77-49. Colorado's first eight Pac-12 games will be televised on the Pac-12 Networks as will five of the Buffaloes' nine home conference games. All remaining home games, and conference road games, that aren't televised will be scheduled to be streamed live through Colorado's Pac-12.com video portal. In addition, CU's game at Missouri on Friday, Dec. 12, aired on SEC Network +, the SEC's online video streaming option.

Entering this season, Colorado has tipped off on 127 national or regional telecasts since the fall of 2001, and 28 since the advent of the Pac-12 Networks in 2012.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado improved to a perfect 25-0 in exhibition games with its 90-57 win over CSU-Pueblo on Nov. 8. The Buffaloes have outscored their opponents by 32 points per game (86.3 to 54.3) in those contests. The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU's exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams. CU's closest exhibition contest

came in 1997, a 77-72 win over Athletes in Action.

BUFFS PICKED 10TH: In what is expected to be one of the most competitive league races in recent memory, Colorado was tabbed to finish 10th in the 2014-15 Pac-12 Conference standings according to the annual coaches preseason poll, announced at Pac-12 Media Day on Oct. 21.

Stanford was voted the preseason favorite for the 15th straight season, claiming 116 points and seven first place votes. California was second with 111 overall and three first place votes. The other two first place nods went to Oregon State, selected to finish third overall with 105.

UCLA was fourth with 84 points followed by Washington (72), USC (65), Arizona State (64), Washington State (56), Oregon (48), Colorado (31), Utah (28) and Arizona (12).

In the media's preseason poll, Colorado was picked 11th, swapping positions in that poll with Utah.

BUFFS TIP OFF SEASON WITH ANNUAL ONE-ON-ONE EVENT: The One-On-One With Colorado Women's Basketball event is a program favorite. In its fourth year under head coach **Linda Lappe**, this year's event was held Oct. 28 with nearly 250 fans, faculty and staff members in attendance.

The premise of the One-On-One event is to have each student-athlete pair up with a prominent female member of the university's faculty/staff, and get to know them outside of a classroom or office setting. The pairs then introduce each other to fans in attendance for the main program.

A diverse group of campus leaders joined for this event, ranging from professors, to department heads, to CU Regents.

"This event is special for us; it lets our fans know exactly who we are on and off the court," said sophomore guard **Lauren Huggins**, whose presenter was Dr. Susan Hendrickson, a senior instructor of chemistry and one of Huggins' former professors. "We also get to meet and interact with influential women within the CU community and through that we build relationships that will help us in the future."

Student-athletes and their "presenters" first sat down at a team dinner to learn about each other. Following the dinner, the public event began with a reception where players and presenters could greet the fans in attendance. Former head coach Ceal Barry, who held a similar event during her tenure, served as the event's emcee and brought each player and presenter to the stage.

"We always have such a blast hosting this event," Lappe said. "It shows a true commitment from both the faculty and staff on campus and also from all of our fans in the community."

Each student-athlete introduced their presenter, their role within the university and what they learned about them, and vice versa.

After introductions, the presenter was then allowed to ask the player any question, touching on a wide variety of topics, which always prove to be very entertaining, as both student-athlete and presenter let their own personalities shine.

ROBERSON TO MISS SEASON: Junior forward **Arielle Roberson** will miss the 2014-15 women's basketball season after tearing the ACL in her left knee in a routine drill during individual workouts just prior to the start of fall practice.

A two-time honorable mention All-Pac-12 selection, Roberson led Colorado in scoring (12.0 ppg) and rebounding (8.3 rpg) while ranking second in blocked shots (1.0 bpg) and third in field-goal percentage as a sophomore in 2013-14.

Roberson ranked ninth in the Pac-12 in rebounding, and at times, simply dominating in the paint for the Buffaloes. She had seven double-doubles on the season and her 109 offensive rebounds were the fourth-most by a Buffalo since the 1987-88 (when the stat was first charted on a regular basis).

Roberson set a Colorado conference tournament game record with 17 rebounds in the 2014 Pac-12 Tournament quarterfinals against Stanford; tying for the 11th best overall performance by a Buffalo. Her 464 career rebounds are the fourth best for a freshman-sophomore combined in team history.

The 2013 Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, Roberson has scored 771 points through her first two seasons and already ranks 14th in career double-doubles (10) and double-figure rebounding games (14) and is 19th in all-time blocked shots (57).

BOULDER – Colorado overcame a sluggish start and with a strong second half prevailed 68-59 over North Dakota in the first round of Preseason WNIT Saturday at the Coors Events Center.

Senior forward **Jan Reese** scored a game-high 21 points and junior front-court mate **Jamee Swan** pitched in 16 as Colorado remained perfect all-time in season openers at home (28-0).

The win sets up a quarterfinal game with Western Kentucky on Monday, Nov. 17, at 7 p.m. at the Coors Events Center. WKU coasted to a 93-57 home win over Central Arkansas on Friday.

"It's going to be a great win for us when the end of the season comes around because they're going to win a lot of games," head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "You can see why; they don't back down. We're happy to be moving on."

Colorado entered the game knowing the key was to stop 6-5 senior post Emily Evers and as advertised, Evers posted her numbers, finishing with 21 points and 18 rebounds, but the Buffaloes made her work. Evers nine field goals came on 22 attempts.

North Dakota shot out to an 11-4 lead. With the Buffs keying in on Evers, Leah Szabla took advantage by finding open driving lanes to score five of her 15 points in the early minutes.

But UND stalled, making just four of its first 21 shots, allowing Colorado to steadily crawl back into the game.

Haley Smith scored four points during an 11-2 run that gave the Buffaloes their first lead at 15-13. Colorado also had a boost from freshmen **Brecca Thomas** and **Alina Hartmann** playing in their first game. With **Lexy Kresl** and **Jasmine Sborov** in early foul trouble with two each, Hartmann came in and scored five points off the bench and Thomas played a steady 11 minutes, with a rebound, assist and no turnovers.

With the help of the solid bench, the game stayed tight for the rest of the half. Swan scored on a layup with just under a minute left for the eighth tie of the period at 31-31. UND, answered with a conventional 3-point play by Evers to take a 34-31 lead at the break.

Colorado went on an 8-1 run to start the second half which gave the Buffaloes a 39-35 lead. But Colorado went cold missing its next seven shots allowing North Dakota to close to 45-43 with 1:44 left on a Bailey Strand layup.

At that point, needing plays on both ends, Colorado really put it together.

With UND continually pounding the ball at Evers, the Buffaloes started to win the battle. Swan blocked an Evers layup attempt that quickly turned into **Lauren Huggins'** third 3-pointer at the 9:43 mark. That exchange jolted the momentum to Colorado, embarking on a 13-2 run.

Reese accounted for four in a row followed by six straight from Swan who hit a couple free throws to give CU its largest lead at 58-45 with 6:46 remaining.

The defending Big Sky Conference champs weren't going to go away without a fight. Szabla scored five straight as CU's lead was quickly whittled down to six. CU responded with a Swan layup to halt UND's run.

Megan Lauck scored on a jumper but Thomas answered with her first career 3-pointer to push the lead back to nine at 63-54.

Following Thomas' 3-pointer, the Buffs went scoreless for the next four minutes. Evers took advantage with two field goals and a free throw in the first half of that span to trim CU's lead to four.

Despite missing five straight shots in that time frame, Colorado was able to get stops to avoid UND getting any closer. After a Colorado turnover with 30 seconds left, Swan made a great play to get in the UND passing lane to get a steal.

Reese then iced the game on a 3-point play. She scored in traffic on a put back of a free throw miss, was fouled herself and sank the free throw to put CU up 66-59 with just 15 seconds left.

BOULDER – Free throws brought the Colorado women's basketball team back into its WNIT game Monday night against Western Kentucky but turnovers took the Buffaloes out of it, allowing the Lady Toppers to escape the Coors Events Center with a 79-78 overtime win.

Trailing by nine points midway through the second half, the Buffs roared back by hitting 22 of 27 free throws in the final 12:46 and tied the score at 68-68 on one of two foul shots by **Jan Reese** with 19.3 seconds to play.

But OT belonged to Western Kentucky, which turned CU's 24 turnovers into 21 points and got a game-high 30 points from Chastity Gooch – the Conference USA coaches' preseason player of the year.

Reese scored a career-best 24 points, including 20 in the second half and overtime. Her 11-of-13 performance from the foul line set career highs for both attempts and makes. Meanwhile, teammate **Lexy Kresl** tied her career high with 20 points and hit four of seven 3-point attempts.

The Lady Toppers led 36-35 after a first half that couldn't have been much tighter. The first 20 minutes featured 13 lead changes and seven ties, with neither team leading by more than four points.

That large lead was posted by the Buffs, who got 12 points from Kresl on her perfect 3-point shooting (4-of-4). She opened the night's scoring with a trey, and didn't cool off before intermission.

CU finished the half hitting five of its six 3-point attempts, with **Haley Smith** hitting the other 3-ball and **Jasmine Sborov** responsible for the lone miss. Overall, the Buffs shot 50 percent (11-of-22) from the field before the break.

Western Kentucky opened the second half just as it did the first, getting a trey from the versatile Gooch and taking a 39-35 lead for its largest advantage of the night to that point.

Gooch wasn't done. She scored the Lady Toppers' next five points, pushing them in front 44-37 with a conventional 3-point play with 16:13 remaining.

Less than 2 minutes after Swan's fourth, Smith went to the bench with her fourth foul and Western Kentucky was beginning to pull away. Lappe shifted her team into a 2-3 zone defense, which might have eased the Buffs' foul problem but not their turnovers.

And the Lady Toppers took advantage, surging to a nine-point lead (48-39) and forcing the Buffs into catch-up mode. They took it to well, outscoring the Lady Toppers 12-3 and tying the score at 53-53 on a pair of free throws by Reese with 8:33 to play.

Kresl completed CU's comeback by hitting two free throws with 6:19 left, giving the Buffs their first lead (57-55) of the second half. It didn't last long. After Gooch hit the first of two free throws, Western Kentucky controlled the second miss, allowing Kendall Noble to sink a short jumper and the Toppers to reclaim a one-point advantage with just over 5 minutes remaining.

Having climbed back in, CU wasn't going away. Four free throws by Beard-Fails and Reese pushed the Buffs back in front 62-61 at the 4:08 mark. They managed a four-point lead (67-63) on another pair of foul shots by Beard-Fails, but the Toppers tied the score at 67-67 on a free throw and a put-back by Gooch of the second miss. Tashia Brown broke the tie (68-67) by hitting one of two free throws.

CU controlled the rebound and Lappe called a timeout with 26.8 seconds showing. The plan was to get Reese the ball – and it worked. Fouled with 19.3 seconds left, she hit one of two free throws to tie the score at 68-68.

Kresl gave the Buffs the OT lead, making one of two free throws, and Sborov corralled Kresl's miss and laid it back in. CU was up 71-68, but a Gooch free throw and a Noble put-back drew another tie at 71-71.

Gooch took care of that with two free throws, giving the Toppers a 73-71 lead, then hit a short baseline jumper to increase it to 75-71. Sborov made one of two foul shots with 42.1 seconds left, pulling the Buffs to within 75-72.

Two Jones free throws put Western Kentucky up 77-75, but Reese answered with a trey from the right corner, then a conventional 3-point play as CU closed to within 79-78 with 20.7 seconds left.

The officials' review of an out-of-bounds call gave the Buffs the ball with 19.5 seconds left, but Kresl missed a baseline drive and Noble was fouled with 3 seconds showing. She missed both free throws but they weren't needed; CU was out of time and luck.

DENVER – Lexy Kresl was in a giving mood for the first 20 minutes of Tuesday night's game. But in a crucial moment early in the second half, there was no spreading the wealth, she would take control.

Kresl scored five straight points to stop a Denver run and in turn sent the Buffaloes rolling to a 77-49 win at Magness Arena Tuesday night on the DU campus.

Kresl recorded her first career double-double scoring 10 points and dishing out a career-high 10 assists, nine of which came in the first half, tying a CU single-half record.

Colorado (3-1) used a 12-3 run late in the first half to open up a double-digit lead. Kresl had five assists in a span of six baskets late in the period to build a 38-27 advantage at the break.

Junior forward **Jamee Swan** was one of the main benefactors, scoring 17 of her season-high 23 points in the first 20 minutes.

"It took us a little while to figure out how to play with (Denver's) changing defenses," Kresl said. "We were playing a motion offense against a zone, so once we found those areas there were a lot of gaps and we had a lot of opportunities to score."

Denver (0-3) opened the second half on a 7-0 run. The Buffaloes missed their first three shots and had a turnover, which allowed consecutive layups by Alecia Espinosa and Paige Bradley. Denver's Morgan Van Ripper-Rose then hit a 3-pointer to cut the lead to 38-34.

Scoreless in the first half, Kresl stopped the Pioneers' run with a 3-pointer from the baseline. Then, Kresl stayed in the backcourt, darted in front of Espinosa's inbound pass for a steal and laid the ball back up and in for a 43-34 Colorado lead.

"I knew we needed a spark so I just wanted to pick up the intensity," Kresl said. "After that (play) everyone else caught on with that same aggressiveness."

That was just the beginning. **Jen Reese** scored the next basket for the Buffaloes and **Haley Smith** added her sixth and final field goal of the night to cap off the 9-0 run and the Buffaloes rolled from there, outscoring the Pioneers 30-15 the rest of the way.

"That was a huge five points for our team," coach **Linda Lappe** said. "They started to get some of that momentum and as soon as that happened, they were deflated a little bit and that's when we knew we needed to go on a run, and our players did a really nice job capitalizing on that."

Swan made 8-of-12 from the field and hit all seven free throw attempts. She also grabbed seven rebounds, dished out three assists and had two blocks.

"Jamee was outstanding tonight," Lappe said. "She played hard and was disciplined. She played a lot tougher on both the offensive and defensive end."

Smith finished with 12 points, hitting 6-of-8 from the field, with seven rebounds and two steals. Reese had 10 points, five rebounds and a pair of steals.

Colorado shot 48 percent from the field while holding Denver to just 28 percent. Despite some early troubles on the boards, the Buffaloes out rebounded the Pioneers 47-37.

Bradley led Denver with 15 points.

BOULDER – Haley Smith scored a career-high 18 points as Colorado's offense was firing on all cylinders in an 87-59 win over Missouri State in the first round of the Omni Hotels Classic Friday evening at the Coors Events Center.

Senior **Lexy Kresl** added 17, hitting five 3-pointers as the Buffaloes (4-1) hit 80 points for the second time in three games.

Colorado moves on to face Colorado State in Saturday's championship game at 7:30 p.m. Colorado State (3-1) defeated TCU 76-62 in the tournament opener. Missouri State (0-5) will face TCU (3-2) in Saturday's consolation at 5 p.m.

"I really liked our effort tonight," coach **Linda Lappe** said. "I thought we played a complete game, both offensively and defensively. We had great production from our starters, had great production from our bench."

The Smith-Kresl duo were simply on fire. Smith was 6-of-9 from the field, in continuation of a three-game stretch where she's made a whopping 73 percent of her attempts (19-of-26). Kresl hit five of her first six 3-point attempts, settling in for a solid 6-of-13 night from the field which included seven rebounds, four assists and a pair of steals.

"My teammates are hitting me for open shots," Smith said. "I don't feel like I'm having to create; I'm just hitting the ones that are open."

It helps that Smith's shot selection mirrors that of every practice this season, and her teammates are taking notice, if the opposition has caught on yet.

"Haley deserves everything she's getting," Kresl said. "I see her shooting every day in the gym. That shot that you see her hit 7-of-8 in the game; she hits them in practice and shoots them every day."

Colorado shot 43 percent and hit a season-high nine 3-pointers. The Buffaloes put up 50 points in the second half on 46 percent shooting, thanks to momentum that actually began in the final minutes of the first period.

Smith and Kresl had eight points each as the Buffaloes built a 16-9 lead. But MSU stayed close, and tied the game at 18-18 on a Kenzie Williams free throw.

Kresl's third 3-pointer of the half and a **Zoe Correal** layup pushed CU's lead back to five, but the Lady Bears answered again, tying the score at 27-27 with 3:35 remaining.

For the second straight game Colorado made a strong run at the end of the first half to seize momentum.

The Buffaloes started getting stops and were able to get the ball quickly down the floor in transition. Colorado broke the tie with four straight free throws and then after a MSU turnover, **Jasmine Sborov** drilled a 3-pointer from left baseline to give Colorado a 34-27 advantage.

Free throws gave Colorado a 37-27 lead at halftime and the Buffaloes came out of the locker room fast and furious. Colorado had three offensive rebounds on the first possession, the final one ending in a **Jamee Swan** put back basket.

Then, **Jen Reese** had a great steal on the other end, which ended in a transition layup by Swan off a nice no-look feed from Sborov that capped off a 14-0 run.

"That's really big in any game, just ending the half with momentum," Kresl said. "The other team goes into the locker room kind of doubting themselves."

Liza Fruendt stopped CU's run with a 3-pointer to pull MSU back to 41-30, but Colorado kept on rolling.

Kresl hit back-to-back 3-pointers and **Lauren Huggins** added her first of three second half treys as Colorado led 50-32 with 15:06 remaining.

A 10-2 Missouri State run, aided by five points from Fruendt, closed Colorado's lead to 12 at 56-44 with 8:16 remaining. But Colorado quickly ended that run as Swan converted on a 3-point play, and scored on another fast break bucket, off an alley-oop pass from Smith, that sparked a 20-1 run that gave CU a 76-46 lead to end the Lady Bears' night.

Swan scored 14 points and had eight rebounds. Correal also had personal-best eight rebounds to tie Swan for the team lead. Colorado dominated the glass, outrebounding Missouri State 53-36 and committed a season-low 10 turnovers.

BOULDER – The Colorado Buffaloes starting front court of **Jen Reese, Haley Smith** and **Jamee Swan**, combined for 67 of 97 points, and **Lexy Kresl** scored the game's final six from the free throw line as the Buffs defeated San Jose State in overtime, 97-89, Friday morning at the Coors Events Center.

Swan (26 points, 11 rebounds) and Smith (24 points, 12 rebounds) both had double-doubles and Reese just missed one (17 points, 9 rebounds).

The Buffs (6-1) jumped out to a quick 9-0 lead in the first four minutes of the game, as the Spartans didn't get on the scoreboard until Ta'Rea Cunnigan hit a 3-pointer at the 15:52 mark. Smith hit the game's first shot and had two free throws to end that 9-0 run.

After the Spartans Rachol West hit a jumper, was fouled and hit her free throw, the Buffs lead was down to five at 11-6. **Lauren Huggins**, who hit all four of her 3-pointers in the first half, knocked down her first triple and along with a Reese jumper and two free throws from Swan, the Buffs lead grew to 18-9.

Zoe Beard-Falls had a nice post-to-post dish to Reese under the basket, and then hit a lay-up of her own to push the Buffs lead to double figures at 22-11, after which the game remained pretty even for most of the rest of the first half.

Huggins hit her second, third and fourth 3-pointers in a span of three minutes on the game clock, each alternating with a lay-up from Swan, as the Buffs led 35-25 with 7:25 left in the first half. Huggins final 3-pointer was matched by a 3-pointer from Cunnigan to cut the Buffs lead to seven, but then Smith followed a mid-range jumper with a 3-pointer in the span of 12 seconds to push the Buffs lead back to 12 at 40-28.

After a pair of Swan layups and another jumper from Swan, the Buffs led 46-36 with 3:34 remaining in the half. The Spartans used a 10-4 run to cut the Buffs lead to just four at the break, 50-46, powered by 3-pointers from Rebecca Woodberry and Ali Bettencourt.

Woodberry then became a thorn in the Buffs side, as she scored eight straight points to give the Spartans their first lead of the game at 58-56. That lead was short-lived, as Jasmine Sborov hit a triple to put the Buffs back up 59-58.

The Spartans used a 6-0 run to take a five point lead, 64-59 and led 69-63 after a Bettencourt 3, the Buffs would claw their way back into the game on the strength of Swan and Smith. Those two combined for 13 of the first 14 points in a 14-2 run as the Buffs turned their six point deficit into a six point advantage with five minutes left in regulation. Swan hit three lay-ups and three free throws in the run while Smith had a baseline jumper and nice reverse lay-up. Swan also took a huge charge on the defensive end to keep the game tied 71-71 in the midst of that run.

Woodberry then went back to work, hitting four straight free throws on back-to-back possessions to cut the Buffs lead down to two at 77-75. Riana Byrd made it a one-point game hitting 1-of-2 from the line before Brecca Thomas hit her only shot of the game, a huge 3-pointer to put the Buffs up 80-76 with 3:34 left.

Reese then had a layup on the Buffs next possession and with a 82-76 lead with less than three minutes left, the Buffs looked to be in good shape, but the Spartans had one more run in them, outscoring the Buffs 9-3 down the stretch, capped by a Cunnigan layup with just 3:0 seconds left, that tied the game at 85-85. Woodberry continued to hurt the Buffs, knocking down two free throws and hitting a 3-pointer with 1:54 left that made it a two point game.

San Jose State took the initial overtime lead after Byrd hit a layup to open the period, but the Buffs then took control as Smith hit two jumpers and Swan another to give the Buffs a 91-87 lead three-and-a-half minutes into the extra period.

Smith quickly tied the game at 87-87 less than a minute into overtime, then Swan completed a great post move that started that the high post and included a nifty spin move to put the Buffs up for the final time at 89-87. The Buffs then bucked down on the defensive end and controlled the boards for the next three possessions. After Lappe called a timeout with 1:42 left, the next play to Smith, including a pump fake, she dribbled once, hit her shot to put CU up 91-87 with 1:34 left.

After Cunnigan hit two free throws at the 1:26 mark, Kresl went to work, first drawing a foul and hitting two freebies at the 1:12 mark and then grabbing huge defensive rebounds and being fouled immediately. Her third and fourth free throws came with just 31 seconds left, making it 95-89, and her final two with just 16 seconds left, making the game 97-89.

IOWA CITY, Iowa – Despite a career afternoon from senior **Jasmine Sborov**, Colorado endured its lowest offensive output of the season and struggled to make key stops when they were needed as No. 22/19 Iowa defeated the Buffaloes 78-63 Sunday afternoon at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Sborov led Colorado (6-2) with career-highs in points (17) and rebounds (12) for her second career double-double.

"Defensively, we have to get tougher," head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "We can't give up 78 points on the road and expect to win."

The Buffaloes did some things well and showed they could play toe-to-toe with the Hawkeyes. CU dominated on the boards by a count of 53-36, and 23 offensive rebounds led to some extra possessions and trips to the foul line that kept the Buffaloes close.

However, persistent foul trouble, and key lapses at the beginning of the first half, and start of the second, allowed Iowa (7-2) to build a double-digit lead and maintain that margin to stay unbeaten at home in 2014 (6-0).

Haley Smith, coming off a 24-point performance, looked to get on track early once again hitting two of her first three shots as CU took a 6-4 lead. But she picked up two fouls in six seconds just one minute later forcing the Buffaloes to go to their bench early. She would be limited to eight points hitting just 4-of-12.

Melissa Dixon, who led Iowa with a game-high 23 points, hit her first of five 3-pointers to spark a 6-0 Hawkeyes run and a 10-6 lead.

Sborov, who crashed the boards hard from the beginning, answered with a 6-0 run of her own. First she got a rebound off her own free throw miss and eased in for a layup to end Iowa's run. Then the senior put the Buffaloes up 12-10 as she took a handoff from **Zoe Beard-Falls** at the elbow and scored on traffic, converting on a 3-point layup.

The game pace picked up from there. After Iowa retook the lead, Colorado briefly took it back when freshman **Alina Hartmann** hit a 3-pointer in transition. The Hawkeyes responded with an almost identical shot of their own. Dixon's second 3-pointer was followed by one from Ally Disterhoft which sparked a 10-2 run that gave Iowa a 24-17 edge.

Colorado's ability to get offensive rebounds extended possessions that allowed the Buffaloes to chisel away at the Hawkeyes. Beard-Falls converted a 3-point play to cut the lead to four. Sborov was then fouled on another offensive rebound and hit two free throws to trim Iowa's lead to 25-23.

After a Disterhoft basket and Iowa with the ball after a foul, Lexy Kresl stole the ball from Claire Till and found **Lauren Huggins** for a transition 3-pointer that cut the Iowa lead to 27-26 with 3:39 left.

Dixon's third 3-pointer sparked an 8-2 run for Iowa to end the half. Iowa point guard Samantha Logic, who had been held scoreless, secured an offensive rebound and banked in a short jumper at the buzzer for a 35-28 Iowa lead.

Iowa kept rolling early in the second half. The Hawkeyes hit 4-of-7 out of the gate and even had the ball bounce their way a few times. Disterhoft missed a free throw but Whitney Jennings was able to get the rare offensive rebound and put it in for a double-digit Iowa lead.

Smith scored her first basket since early in the second half to make it a 47-38 game. The Buffaloes were able to force a Jennings miss, but during a mad scramble for the rebound, Till corralled the ball from her knees and pitched out to Dixon for her fourth 3-pointer as the lead quickly went back to double-digits.

"Give Iowa a lot of credit," Lappe said. "I thought their spurt to end the first half and at the beginning of the second half was the difference in the game."

Jen Reese scored all 14 of her points in the second half. Even when it seemed she was about to get going, scoring on Colorado's first two second half possessions, she was hit with two quick fouls that gave her four total with nearly 18 minutes remaining.

Iowa built its lead to 15 at 59-44 with 8:39 left, but the Buffaloes put up a good fight to end the game. Reese reentered and scored six straight for Colorado to cut the Hawkeye lead to 61-52. But by this time, with nearly everyone in some sort of foul trouble, Iowa attacked. Back-to-back layups by Dixon and Kali Peschel had Iowa running back out to an 18-point advantage with 4:31 left.

To their credit, the Buffaloes never quit. Down 72-54, Colorado began to press. The Buffaloes forced two turnovers helping a 9-0 run led by five straight from Sborov. Iowa figured out the press and hit free throws for the final margin.

BOULDER – If Jen Reese was the starter, Jamee Swan was the closer – and for Swan the role was unconventional. Out of the starting lineup for the first time this season, Swan bounded off the bench to score 16 second-half points and help push Colorado past Wyoming 76-71 on Sunday afternoon.

“Wyoming is always really tough...it’s always a great game,” said CU coach Linda Lappe. “It was a great way to go into the holiday break.”

The Buffs and Swan saved most of their excitement and energy for the game’s final 10 minutes. After Reese scored CU’s first 10 points and kept the home team close at intermission – the Cowgirls led 42-41 – Swan helped reenergize the Buffs when they needed it most.

Trailing by eight points twice in the last 14:30, the Buffs launched a 10-1 run that took them from a 58-50 deficit to a 60-59 lead with 5:52 left. A couple of hustle plays and back-to-back baskets by senior Jasmine Sborov and a short banker by Alina Hartmann gave CU its first lead since 41-40.

Hartmann’s basket came off an acrobatic falling-out-of-bounds assist from Swan, who also had four rebounds, one block and two steals. Up 60-59, the Buffs built a 69-65 lead as Swan scored the next seven points. Then she put a ribbon on the win with three of four free throws in the final 13 seconds.

In addition to Swan’s 16 points and Reese’s 15, CU got double-figure production from Sborov (11) and Haley Smith (10). Guard Marquelle Dent, one of four Coloradans in Wyoming’s starting lineup, led the Cowgirls (5-5) with 24 points. Kayla Woodward added 22, hitting five of her seven 3-point attempts, and Kaitlyn Mileto contributed 11 points.

Both Reese, who finished 7-of-13 from the field, and Swan said the energy created by CU’s bench factored significantly in the comeback. Reese pointed specifically to Swan as being high-voltage: “When (she) comes in and takes that charge and makes that face, screaming, I get excited and almost have a heart attack...our energy on the bench was great that game and that really helped.”

The Buffs trailed 42-41 at halftime after Dent hit a layup and left CU with a 6-second final possession. The Buffs couldn’t convert and had to be satisfied with their one-point deficit.

Neither team led by more than four points in the opening half, with CU managing a 12-8 lead on two of three free throws by Thomas with 13:52 before intermission. Reese finished the first half with a team-best 13 points, hitting six of nine from the field as CU shot a season-high 57.7 percent (15-for-26).

Opening the second half with a 13-6 run, Wyoming extended its lead to a game-high eight points, going ahead 55-47 on a put-back by Jordan Sibrel with just over 13 minutes remaining.

At the half’s mid-way point, CU still trailed by eight and found itself trading baskets – not a good way to catch up – until Reese and Swan hit back-to-back jump shots to cut Wyoming’s lead to 59-54.

The Buffs were reenergized and rolling. Back-to-back jump shots by Sborov and Hartmann’s short banker completed CU’s 10-1 run. A one-point lead was exchanged until Swan scored on a smooth pivot move to send the Buffs up 64-62, then collected a defensive rebound at the other end, then connected on two free throws to put CU ahead 66-62 with 2:55 left.

A Woodward try brought the Cowgirls to within 66-65, but Swan’s conventional three-point play with 1:40 remaining pushed the Buffs up 69-65. After Dent cut it to 69-67, Sborov hit a pair of free throws to restore CU’s four-point advantage (71-67).

Smith and Sborov hit one free throw each in the final minute but Dent answered with field goals each time and brought Wyoming to within 73-71 with 30.5 seconds to play – and the Cowgirls had the ball.

Coming out of a time out, Dent missed a chance to tie and Swan was fouled after snaring the rebound. She made three of four free throws in the final 13 seconds and the Buffs finally could relax.

In spite of themselves and their ill-timed generosity, the Buffaloes (7-4) didn’t go quietly. They cut a 13-point second-half deficit to two before faltering in the final 5 minutes, allowing the 49ers (13-1) to win their 11th consecutive game.

“Give Long Beach State a lot of credit,” said CU coach Linda Lappe. “They’re 13-1 for a reason...they’re tough and they make plays when they need to. We turned the ball over way too many times; there were too many possessions when we didn’t even get a shot.”

CU got a double-double (15 points, 15 rebounds) from Jamee Swan and a career-high 14 points from Zoe Beard-Fails, who also contributed eight rebounds as the Buffs won the board battle 50-26.

“We knew that we would have an advantage in the post,” Lappe said. “And both Zoe and Jamee have been playing really well. I thought their energy, and toughness were two things that they brought.”

Beard-Fails scored the Buffs’ first 6 points and 8 of their first 15. While she hit four of her six shots during that span, her teammates could hit only 3 of 14 field goal attempts. Swan added six first-half points, doing the majority of her scoring after intermission.

With 12:09 left and trailing 45-32, the Buffs had committed 23 of their final turnover total. Making matters (and the score) worse, they had hit only 2 of 10 from the field.

But CU settled down. A technical foul on Devin Hudson resulted in two free throws from Jen Reese and launched a 14-3 run that pulled the Buffs to within 48-46 on another pair of Reese foul shots with 5:02 left. Reese hit seven of her eight free throw attempts, but she was only 1-of-8 from the field.

During its comeback, CU stymied Long Beach with a 3-2 zone, resulting in the 49ers shooting 2-for-12 from the field. But in the final 5 minutes, the Buffs could creep no closer than two points. The 49ers increased their lead to as many as nine points (61-52) and left Boulder with their 11th consecutive win.

Giving up 13 points off of 14 first-half turnovers, the Buffs sabotaged themselves time and again in trying to cope with the 49ers frequently changing defense. Still, CU trailed only by two points (28-26) at the break after leading for the first 11:30.

The Buffs led by as many as five points (9-4) early, but Long Beach caught up and passed the home team on a pair of 3-pointers by Hallie Meness. Her first try tied the score at 15-15 and her second gave the 49ers their first lead of the night at 18-15 with just over 8 minutes left before intermission.

From there, the Buffs managed only one more first-half lead, going up 19-18 on a put-back by Swan. The 49ers took advantage of six Buffs turnovers and a 3-48 CU drought to go up 24-19. The Buffs eventually fell behind 28-22, but closed the half with a 4-0 run and closed to within a basket at the half. The teams’ 54 combined first-half points was the second-lowest of the season in a CU contest, trailing the 51 in the Colorado State game.

Meanwhile, the 49ers’ leading scorer, Raven Benton (11.7 ppg), went to the bench with two personal fouls at the 10:01 mark and remained seated for the rest of the half. After starting the second half, Benton again went to the bench only 3 minutes in after hurting a knee on a breakaway layup attempt that she missed.

Once again, the 49ers didn’t suffer greatly with Benton temporarily sidelined. They opened the second half with a 15-2 run and took the first of two 13-point lead – 43-30. CU finally got a layup from Swan to stop a 12-0 Long Beach surge, but by then the 49ers were in command and the Buffs were still struggling to protect the ball.

BERKELEY, Calif. – California's inside game was too much to handle as the Golden Bears defeated Colorado 75-59 in a Pac-12 Conference game Monday evening at Haas Pavilion in Berkeley.

California scored 52 points inside the paint, mostly to the benefit of leading scorer Rashanda Gray who had 17 points and 10 rebounds.

Jamee Swan led Colorado with 21 points and five rebounds. **Jen Reese** pitched in 15 points on 6-of-12 shooting with eight rebounds.

The Golden Bears also took advantage of 23 Colorado turnovers, accounting for 21 points.

Cal's Brittany Boyd had 19 points, 14 rebounds, seven steals and six assists. California continually pounded the ball inside to the 6-foot, 3-inch Gray, and despite her low field goal numbers – she made just 4-of-12 from the field – it was effective as she continually made it to the foul line, hitting 9-of-16.

When Colorado could get stops, they struggled to score. The Buffaloes shot just 37 percent and fell victim to California's ability to run off a defensive rebound, resulting in 20 fast break points. Boyd controlled that tempo as she was just three steals and four assists shy of a quadruple double.

"(Especially in the second half) they pounded it inside and we didn't have an answer," CU coach **Linda Lappe** said. "We didn't have an answer down low; we didn't have an answer for their layups in transition. We'll regroup and get back into it."

California never trailed. After Reese hit her first two shots to tie the game at 4-4, Cal scored the next eight. **Jasmine Sborov** got aggressive for the Buffaloes, darting to the rim on consecutive layups to slice the Bears lead in half.

Following a Boyd jumper, Reese connected on her third 3-pointer of the season and Swan scored on a fast break bucket to pull the Buffaloes within one (14-13), with 10:54 remaining.

California responded with three straight buckets in the paint and led 20-13. The Buffaloes fought back to make it a 1-point game again as a 6-0 run ending with a **Haley Smith** field goal made it a 20-19 game at the 7:36 mark.

While Swan and Reese accounted for most of Colorado's points, Boyd was able to get everyone involved. Penina Davidson drilled a 3-pointer, Gabby Green and Justine Hartman added points as a 13-2 run late in the first allowed the Bears a 10-point halftime lead (33-23).

"We did some good things in the first half," Lappe said. "But it went down from there. We have to be ready to play."

Swan and Reese started the second half with layups and **Brecca Thomas** hit a 3-pointer to cut the Cal lead to 37-30, four minutes in. But the Buffs missed their next five shots which allowed Cal a 6-0 run over 2:13 to take a 43-30 advantage.

Gray made four straight free throws and Boyd scored on a runner in the lane to put Cal up 49-35. Swan scored consecutive baskets on nice post moves to bring the deficit to 10 one more time.

Mikayla Cowling scored four straight points and Boyd pitched in the next five as Cal went on an 11-2 run to put the game out of reach.

"(Cal) made us turn over the ball more than we wanted to," Reese said. "We didn't play together for a 40 minutes. We had spurts where we did, but spurts where we didn't and we can't do that."

BOULDER – If the Colorado women's basketball team was counting on the rigors of the road rattling Southern California, it didn't happen. Leaving LA for the first time in a month – or in eight games – the Trojans made themselves at home Friday night in the Coors Events Center, but with lots of unwarranted hospitality from the Buffaloes.

Getting 22 points from 21 CU turnovers, USC rolled to an 81-61 Pac-12 Conference win.

The Buffs committed 11 of their turnovers in the first half, digging themselves an early hole with a very narrow escape route. CU (7-7, 0-3) never found it, losing its fourth consecutive game and its sixth of the past seven. The Buffs trailed by as many as 19 points late in the first half and were never able to pull closer than 9 points in the second half.

Entering Friday night, the Trojans (10-5, 2-2) had lost three of their past four games, including a split with the Oregon schools in the Pac-12's opening weekend.

"I thought we did some really good things," CU coach **Linda Lappe** said, "but we didn't start off well (and) it didn't seem like we could ever catch up . . . but give USC credit; they came in here with a lot of confidence and played hard."

Lappe said her team, which faces UCLA on Sunday at the CEC (2 p.m., Pac-12 Network), "just has to regroup and keep getting better, come to work every day . . . I feel like we have gotten better but if you look at one stat, it's the turnovers."

"We have to tighten up defensively, but offensively if we take care of the ball (Friday night) it's a totally different game at halftime."

The Buffs trailed 40-27 at intermission, but it took a 6-0 run to close the half to get them that close. And that run could have been 8-0 had **Jamee Swan** and **Jasmine Sborov** converted free throws for three-point plays.

But the Buffs couldn't complain; less than a minute earlier they trailed 40-21 with that 19-point deficit marking their largest at home this season. It surpassed the 14-point deficit they faced against Colorado State in the Omni Hotels Classic. The Buffs rallied to win that one 87-81 in double overtime, but to duplicate that – OT or not – against the Trojans would be difficult.

For starters, CU's turnovers would have to decrease. Of the Buffs' 11 first-half turnovers, four came in the first 4:03. The Trojans got 14 first-half points off of the home team's errors, then eight more in the second as a result of the Buffs' 10 turnovers. The 11 first-half errors were largely responsible for CU failing to score on consecutive possessions until the 6-0 run to close the half.

Meanwhile, CU got only eight points from USC's eight miscues in 40 minutes. Guard **Lexy Kresl** said the Buffs can combat their turnover epidemic by "having confidence, handling the ball and handling the pressure . . . we just have to attack; when you're not aggressive you make more mistakes."

Added Lappe: "It's not that we're bad ball handlers, it's just making the right reads and the right passes."

CU shot 41.9 percent (13-for-31) from the field in the first 20 minutes and the Trojans weren't astoundingly better, hitting 43.2 percent (16-of-37). It merely underscored CU's need to take better care of the ball in the second half; it happened for a while but not consistently enough for the Buffs to catch up.

USC finished the night shooting 42.9 percent (27-of-63) while CU checked out at 44.3 percent (27-of-61). And that takes the Buffs back to the turnovers that ultimately cost them the game.

Three Buffs scored in double figures, topped by Swan's 14 points. **Jen Reese** added 13 and Sborov 10. The Trojans got 20 points each from Alexyz Vioioletama and McKenzie Calvert, and 17 from Brianna Barrett.

USC's aggressiveness in getting to the basket was obvious. The Trojans attempted 31 free throws, making 23, while the Buffs went 8-for-11 from the foul line. "Yeah," said Lappe, "I think we can be more aggressive in getting to the rim."

Opening the second half with a conventional three-point play from Swan, the Buffs trimmed the Trojans' lead to 10 (40-30). But it took nearly 8 minutes before they finally cut USC's lead to single digits. **Lauren Huggins** hit a 3-pointer from the top of the key to put CU to within nine points (56-47) with 12:17 to play.

But that was as close as the Buffs could get. The Trojans responded with five quick points, rebuilt a 14-point lead (61-47) and led by as many as 20 in the final minute.

BOULDER – The Colorado women's basketball team had never opened conference play – any conference play – with five consecutive losses. It required an extra 5 minutes and stellar free throw shooting, but the resilient Buffs avoided that historical blemish with a 77-72 overtime escape against Utah Wednesday night at the Coors Events Center.

CU (8-8, 1-4) broke a five-game losing streak and earned its first Pac-12 Conference win of 2015.

"It feels good to get that one," added Buffs coach **Linda Lappe**. "I liked how our team came out tonight."

That would be bold and aggressive, but the Utes (6-10, 0-5) didn't rattle or roll over. Rallying from an eight-point second-half deficit to tie the score at 63-63 with 1:23 to play, they forced the Buffs into their fourth overtime this season – the most in program history. CU is 3-1 in those games.

The Utes held a 41-32 rebound advantage and outscored the Buffs 42-16 in the paint. But in OT, CU showed the same determination it discovered in a Sunday loss to UCLA and didn't falter.

Two minutes into the extra period, freshman **Joeseta Fatusi** hit a 3-pointer for Utah's first lead – 68-67 – since 9-7. The teams traded one-point leads until **Jen Reese**, **Lexy Kresl**, **Jasmine Sborov** and **Haley Smith** hit eight of 10 free throws in the final 1:33 to seal CU's win.

"We were comfortable going into overtime – we've been in a lot of them -- although we could have won it in regulation," Lappe said. "But we made enough plays down the stretch (in OT)."

Making those plays led to Utes fouls and to Buffs free throws. CU made 31 of 40 attempts for the night, but went 10-of-13 in the overtime. Smith was perfect in the extra period – 4-for-4 – and for the night – 11-for-11. Kresl canned 11 of her 16 foul shot tries and finished with a career-high 26 points.

Smith added 15 and freshman **Brecca Thomas** scored a career-high 11 points. Thomas was one of three freshmen – **Zoe Correal** and **Alina Hartmann** were the other pair – who aided in the Buffs' bench productivity. CU's subs outscored Utah's 18-6.

Up by a point with 3:04 left before intermission, the Buffs closed out the half with an 8-2 run and took a 38-31 lead to their locker room. It was their largest advantage of the first half, and they never trailed after the 15-minute mark when the Utes forged a 9-9 tie.

Kresl scored her 10 first-half points in the first 12 minutes, going 3-for-3 from the field and hitting a pair of treys and two of three free throws. But her second personal foul sent her to the bench with 8:12 left in the period and she didn't return.

Also missing court time due to a pair of quick fouls was **Jamee Swan**, who played only 6 minutes and scored three first-half points (seven total). And Reese, coming off a career-high 30 points against UCLA, missed her only three field goal attempts and went to the locker room scoreless. She finished with six points.

Given those circumstances, CU needed bench help – and the subs delivered. Thomas (9), Hartmann (3) and Correal (2) combined for 15 first-half points.

But CU's late first-half momentum didn't spill into the second half. Opening the final 20 minutes with a 6-0 run, Utah crept to 38-37 and forced a Buffs timeout.

Kresl and Sborov hit back-to-back jumpers, putting CU ahead 42-37 with 15:30 remaining. Not quite half a minute later, one of two free throws by Kresl sent the Buffs up 43-37, and when Reese hit a 15-foot jumper for her first points CU finished a 7-0 run and pushed its advantage to eight (45-37).

But Wicijowski and the Utes Utah kept pushing. After her 3-pointer from the top of the key drew them to 52-50, her pair of free throws with 1:23 to play tied the game at 63-63. After a timeout with a minute remaining, the Utes turned the ball over with 38.9 seconds left. CU called timeout, but a traveling call on Kresl ended that possession and left Utah with 26 seconds to win it.

With 15.3 seconds showing, the Utes took a timeout to set their final play. A layup attempt by Danielle Rodriguez missed, the Buffs controlled the rebound and used their last timeout with 1.1 seconds remaining.

A full-court pass by Reese was fielded at the top of the key by Swan, who steered a pass to Smith for a desperation shot from the left corner. It missed and once again the Buffs were headed for OT.

SALT LAKE CITY – The Colorado women's basketball team required overtime to defeat Utah on Wednesday night in Boulder, but on Sunday afternoon no extra time was needed for the Buffaloes to record a memorable road win.

Parlaying torrid 3-point shooting in the second half and skin-tight defense all game on the Utes' Taryn Wicijowski, the Buffaloes took care of business in regulation and left the Huntsman Center with a 73-54 Pac-12 Conference victory.

CU (9-8, 2-4) won for the second time on the road this season and for the first time in Pac-12 play. It was the Buffs' largest conference road win in 12 years -- or since a 71-50 triumph at Kansas in 2003, current CU coach **Linda Lappe's** senior season.

"We started well and had a lot of energy," Lappe said. "Defensively, I liked our presence. They (Utah) missed shots, and a lot of them we caused by having our hands up and our length."

The Buffs hit eight of their 14 3-point field goal attempts, including going 7-for-11 in the second half. Their final shooting numbers: 44.9 percent from the field, 57.1 percent from beyond the arc. But they hit 63.6 in the final 20 minutes from long range and 57.1 percent from the field overall in the second half.

Just as impressive, though, as the Buffs' marksmanship was their inside defense on Wicijowski, who nearly singlehandedly carried the Utes in their 77-72 OT loss on Wednesday in Boulder.

In that game, Wicijowski led all scorers with 29 points and all rebounders with 14. But four days later, the Buffs had her figured out; she finished with six points -- none in the second half -- and three rebounds -- none in the first half.

"Our spots may not have scored a lot for us (today), but they did a nice job defending," Lappe said. "We talked a lot about how we were going to stop Taryn Wicijowski, she obviously hurt us at our place, we wanted to do some different things on her."

Jamee Swan did a nice job. **Zoe Correal** did a nice job as well. Just the way that we doubled team, it was there every time, a defender could really count on that double. I think we just caused her [Wicijowski] to think. And anytime you make players think, good things happen for you defensively."

And after scoring a career-high 26 points on Wednesday night, senior **Lexy Kresl** again found Utah's defense to her liking. She led all scorers Sunday with 18 points, but got help from **Haley Smith** (11) and **Swan** (10).

The Buffs also went 13-for-14 from the free throw line, got 17 points off of 12 Utes turnovers and committed just nine themselves. They outrebounded the Utes 36-28, with Jen Reese grabbing a team-high seven boards.

Danielle Rodriguez led Utah with 14 points and was the only Utes player in double figures. Utah was held to 36.7 percent (18-of-49) from the field. The Utes (6-10, 0-6) dropped their sixth consecutive game and now have lost seven of their last nine games.

The Buffs led 27-24 at halftime, taking the lead on a 3-pointer by Kresl with 5 seconds before the buzzer. They were ahead for most of the half, up by as many as five points before encountering a nearly 6-minute scoring drought and committing three of their four first-half turnovers.

The Utes took advantage, going on an 8-0 run and taking a three-point lead before the Buffs righted themselves, caught up and went into intermission ahead.

At the 12:30 mark of the second half, CU opened an eight-point advantage (40-32) then went ahead by double digits (50-40) for the first time on a Kresl layup. Less than a minute later, **Jasmine Sborov** added a reverse layup for a 52-40 lead -- and with 8:02 to play the Buffs appeared to be reaching a rare comfort zone on the Pac-12 road.

CU increased its advantage to as many as 21 points in the final minute and a half.
