THE GAME: The University of Colorado travels to play the University of Missouri on Friday, Dec. 12, at 6 p.m. MST, at Mizzou Arena in Columbia, Mo.

BROADCAST: Friday's game will air live on KKZN 760 AM. Cory Lopez will have the call with Carol Callan of USA Basketball providing the color commentary. The game will be streamed on SEC + allowing fans to watch on the WatchESPN App or WatchESPN.com subject to availability through a service provider.

OPENING TIP: Colorado is playing back-to-back true road contests against out-of-state teams for the first time during the nonconference schedule since opening the 2007-08 campaign at San Francisco and at USC.

ABOUT THE BUFFS: Colorado is 6-2 overall after seeing its five-game winning streak end with a 78-63 setback at No. 22 (AP) / 19 (WBCA) ranked Iowa on Dec. 5.

Despite enduring their lowest point total of the season against the Hawkeyes, the Buffaloes have been solid offensively overall averaging just under 80 points per game while shooting 44 percent from the field and 71 percent from the free throw line. Colorado has hit

80 points four times this season and the 97 points scored against San Jose State are the most in the **Linda Lappe** era and most since scoring 100 against Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 18, 2005.

Defensively, Colorado has allowed 70.4 points per game on 35.5 percent from the field. The Buffaloes are the Pac-12's top rebounding team, pulling down 50.4 per game. Colorado is second in field goal percentage defense (.355), rebounding margin (+10.1) and blocked shots (5.9 bpg).

Senior forward **Jen Reese** is off to a fantastic start. She leads Colorado by averaging 16.0 points and 8.6 rebounds per game while hitting 47 percent from the field and 87 percent from the free throw line. Reese scored a career and team-season high 26 points in the win over Colorado State. She also matched a personal-best with 14 rebounds for her sixth career double-double and third of the season. Her 26-point performance also marked the third time this season she's hit the 20-point mark and sixth of her career. Reese was named to the Omni Hotels Classic All-Tournament team.

On the Pac-12 leaderboard, Reese is fifth in free throw percentage, seventh in overall rebounding, 10th in scoring and defensive rebounds (5.9 drpg) and 11th in offensive rebounds (2.8 orpg).

Senior guard **Lexy Kresl** is averaging just under 10 points per game and leads Colorado in assists (6.1 apg) and steals (1.5 spg) and is second in 3-pointers with 15. She was MVP of the Omni Classic averaging 14.5 points, 9.0 rebounds and 7.5 assists in the two-game classic. During that stretch, not only did she record her first career double-double, she topped that with just the fourth triple-double in program history in the win over Colorado State (12 points-11 rebounds-11 assists).

Kresl is second in the Pac-12, and 15th in the nation, in assists. She ranks 13th in defensive rebounding (5.0 drpg), 14th in free throw percentage (.762) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.4) and 15th in 3-pointers made (1.9 3mpg) on the Pac-12 leaderboard.

Junior forward **Jamee Swan** is averaging 14.4 points and 8.4 re-

bounds while hitting 49 percent from the field; ranking second in the team in all three categories. Over the past three games she's grabbed double-figure rebounds in each, averaging 11.3 per contest. She scored a career best, and matched a team season high with 26 points in the win over San Jose State. Swan also had 11 rebounds to record her third career double-double and first of the season.

Swan tops Colorado and ranks third in the Pac-12 in blocked shots (1.8 bpg) while ranking third in offensive boards (3.8 orpg), eighth in rebounding and 12th in scoring.

Sophomore guard **Haley Smith** leads Colorado in field-goal accuracy at 55.1 percent while averaging 13.0 points and 7.3 rebounds per game. She recorded her first career double-double with 24 points and 12 rebounds against San Jose State; both numbers marking personal bests. During Colorado's recent five-game winning streak she made a whopping 65 percent from the floor (34-of-52). She hit 10-of-14 from the field during her career-best day against the Spartans.

On the Pac-12 leaderboard Smith ranks ninth in field goal percentage, 12th in overall rebounding, 15th in defensive rebounds (4.8 drpg) and 19th in scoring.

Senior guard **Jasmine Sborov** is averaging 7.1 points and 5.6 rebounds and ranks second on the team in assists with 24. Against Iowa, Sborov led Colorado with career-highs in points (17) and rebounds (12) for her second career double-double. Sborov also dished out a career-high nine assists against San Jose State. On the Pac-12 charts she is 15th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.3).

Sophomore wing **Lauren Huggins** is averaging 7.4 points per game and leads the team in 3-point shooting, connecting on 19-of-41 from long range for an impressive 46.3 percent. She has hit nine of her last 17 (.529). Huggins hit three of her four 3-pointers against CSU in the overtime sessions. Two of those came in the final minute of the first overtime, including one with 1.7 seconds remaining to send the game into the second extra period. Huggins ranks eighth in the Pac-12 in 3-pointers made and is ninth in 3-point percentage.

Forward **Zoe Beard-Fails** has provided a nice spark off the bench averaging 3.9 points and 3.9 rebounds. She has shown the knack of getting to the foul line ranking third on the team in attempts, hitting 15-of-23. She had a career-high seven rebounds in the win at Denver.

ABOUT THE TIGERS: Missouri is 6-2 overall coming off a 74-55 win over Saint Louis on Dec. 8. The Tigers are averaging 73.5 points per game on 45 percent shooting. Missouri allows just 58.4 points per game as opponents are making 35 percent from the field. The Tigers have a good edge on the boards, outrebounding their opponents by nine per game.

Sophomore guard Jordan Frericks leads Missouri with a season double-double averaging 14.4 points and 11.0 rebounds per game while making an outstanding 61 percent from the floor (43-of-71). Senior guard Morgan Eye averages just under 10 points an outing and leads Missouri in 3-pointers with 23. Sophomore forward Kayla McDowell averages 8.3 points and is Missouri's second-leading rebounder at just below seven per contest.

Robin Pingeton is in her fifth year as Missouri's head coach with a record of 66-67. She is in her 20th season as a collegiate head coach with a record of 401-224.

THE SERIES: This will be the 70th meeting between Colorado and Missouri making it the most played in program history; breaking a tie with series' against Kansas and Nebraska. The Buffaloes own a 42-27 record against the Tigers with the 42 wins the most against any one team.

The two programs met at least twice a year from the formation of Big Eight Conference women's basketball in 1982-83 through Colorado's final year in the Big 12 Conference in 2010-11. Colorado won the last four meetings, seven of the last eight and eight of the last 10. The Buffaloes hold a 16-15 edge in Columbia and have won their last four.

Colorado's **Linda Lappe** is 2-0 against Missouri as a head coach. Robin Pingeton is 0-2 against Colorado as a head coach.

This will be Colorado's first regular season game against a former Big Eight/Big 12 opponent since the Buffaloes joined Pac-12 Conference in 2011-12. Missouri joined the Southeast Conference one year later. The Buffaloes have played two other former Big Eight/Big 12 opponents in the postseason, against Kansas in the first round of the 2013 NCAA Tournament and Oklahoma State in the quarterfinals of the 2012 WNIT. Colorado has also played current Big 12 member TCU, in the first round of the 2014 WNIT, though the Horned Frogs joined the league after the Buffaloes had left for the Pac-12.

BACK TO THE BOARDS: Colorado has outrebounded each of its eight opponents this season by an average of 10.1 per game. Over the last six contests that margin has increased to 12.8 an outing. The Buffaloes lead the Pac-12 in overall rebounds (50.4 rpg) and also in offensive (16.6) and defensive (33.8) boards.

Colorado recorded 60 rebounds in the San Jose State game hitting that mark for the first time since pulling down 60 against Marquette in the first round of the 1994 NCAA Tournament.

The Buffaloes have three players ranking in the top 12 in rebounding in the Pac-12 while no other team has more than one. **Jen Reese** leads the effort in seventh at 8.6 per game. **Jamee Swan** is eighth (8.4 rpg) and **Haley Smith** is 12th (7.3 rpg).

KRESL'S DISH: **Lexy Kresl** recorded the fourth triple-double in team history by scoring 12 points, grabbing 11 rebounds and dishing out 11 assists in the double overtime win over Colorado State on Nov. 29.

Her triple-double was the team's first since Chucky Jeffery recorded the second of her two triple-doubles at Oklahoma State on Mar. 25, 2012 during the Postseason WNIT. Sandy Bean achieved the program's first triple-double against Utah State on Feb. 16, 1979.

For Kresl, both the rebounds and assists figures were career-highs. It was actually her second "double" of the week. Kresl put together her first career double-double in the win over Denver with 10 points and 10 assists.

Nine of her assists in the Denver game came in the first 20 minutes, tying a school record for assists in one half originally set by Whitney Law against Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 18, 2005.

Counting Colorado's prior three triple-doubles, Kresl's points-assists double-double was the 14th in team history and first since Jeffery's triple at OSU (12 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists).

WORKING OVERTIME: Colorado played in overtime in three of its first seven games. The Buffaloes won the last two, defeating San Jose State 97-89 on Dec. 5 and Colorado State 87-81 in double overtime on Nov. 29, after dropping a 79-78 decision to Western Kentucky on Nov. 17.

Colorado played back-to-back overtime games for the first time in team history with the San Jose State and CSU contests. The Buffaloes had two overtimes in a three-game span in February 1988.

The double overtime game with CSU was just the sixth in team history and first since an 84-77 setback to Iowa State on Jan. 13, 2008. **Lexy Kresl** set a school single game record by playing in 49 minutes against Colorado State.

Colorado's win over San Jose State improved its all-time record to 23-23 all-time in overtime. The Buffaloes are 3-3 in double overtime games.

It's the fifth time Colorado has played three overtime games in one season and first since 1995-96; the most in any one campaign. This is the first instance where all three games have happened during the nonconference schedule. Overall it's the 14 time Colorado has played multiple overtime games in one season.

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS: Colorado has a record of 50-24 since the beginning of the 2012-13 season. Of those 24 losses, 13 have been to ranked teams and 12 of those ranked higher than Colorado at the time the game was played. The Buffaloes have won 47 of their last 58 games against unranked opponents.

The Buffaloes have been dominant in regular season nonconference games under **Linda Lappe**. Colorado is 47-7 in that stretch since the beginning of the 2010-11 season. The Buffaloes have won 40 of their last 43 regular season nonconference contests. The Buffaloes put together 33 straight nonconference wins from Dec. 30, 2010 through Dec. 12, 2013.

REESE'S PIECES: Senior forward **Jen Reese** has joined one elite group in Colorado history and is well on her way to join another. Reese became the 21st player to reach 500 career rebounds during the Missouri State game. She is currently 19th on Colorado's all-time list with 533.

The 6-2 shooter is also Colorado's active leading scorer with 915 career points, putting her well within range to become the 26th player in team history to reach 1,000.

Hitting both marks would make her just the 15th player in team his-

tory to reach 1,000 points and 500 rebounds.

KRESL SOLID FROM ARC, LINE: Senior guard **Lexy Kresl** ranks seventh in career 3-pointers attempted (461) and is 10th in 3-pointers made (139)

She has made a 3-pointer in 76 of 103 career games and has 37 contests with two or more buckets from long range.

Kresl has also been one of Colorado's most reliable free throw shooters over the past three seasons. Her career percentage of 83.0 (142-of-171) would rank fourth on the Buffs' all-time list (minimum of 100 attempts).

Kresl hit 84.1 percent from the line in 2013-14 (69-of-82) ranking third in the Pac-12 Conference. Her mark was also good for 19th on Colorado's single-season list.

Kresl has a shot at reaching 1,000 career points entering Friday's game at 817.

HUGGINS SHOOTS UP LIST: With 12 3-pointers over the last four games, sophomore **Lauren Huggins** has put herself among the Buffaloes' career leaders. She is currently 18th on the all-time list with 59.

SWAN'S SWATS: Junior forward **Jamee Swan** ranks third in the Pac-12 in blocked shots at 1.8 per game. She has 18 blocks over the last 10 games dating back to last season.

Swan has 78 career blocks which puts her in a three-way tie for 10th place on CU's all-time list.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado is 0-1 against ranked teams this season after dropping a 78-63 decision at No. 22/19 Iowa. The Hawkeyes are one of four teams on the Buffaloes' schedule ranked in the Top 25 joining Stanford, California and Oregon State.

The Buffaloes have dropped their last 13 against ranked opponents. Colorado is 62-155 all-time against ranked opponents.

OMNI HOTELS CHAMPS: Colorado won its Omni Hotels Classic championship for the 18th time by defeating Missouri State and Colorado State. The Buffaloes improved to 46-10 all-time in their home holiday classic and won their sixth straight title.

CHALLENGING START: Colorado opened a season with two teams that made the NCAA Tournament the previous year (North Dakota & Western Kentucky) for the first time since 2003-04 when the Buffaloes hosted Old Dominion and Notre Dame in the WBCA Classic. Only twice since then had the Buffaloes even played one team in their first two coming off a trip to the big dance, Loyola-Marymount in 2004-05 (Game 1) and Vanderbilt in 2006-07 (Game 2).

Two of Colorado's three opening opponents, North Dakota and Arkansas State, are their respective conference's top preseason pick and Western Kentucky was selected second. The Buffaloes have also faced two conference preseason players of the year in Western Kentucky's Chastity Gooch and Arkansas State's Aundrea Gamble.

WRAPPING UP THE WNIT: Colorado was 2-1 in the Preseason WNIT advancing to the quarterfinals and picking up a consolation round win. The Buffaloes competed in the season-opening event for the third time and moved to 8-2 all-time in the tournament.

The Buffaloes won the championship in 1995 and also advanced to the semifinals of the 2001 event.

Mississippi State defeated Western Kentucky 88-77 in the championship game. The 2014 Preseason WNIT featured five NCAA Tournament teams from a year ago along with four Postseason WNIT participants, including Colorado.

SBOROV GOOD WORKS: Senior guard **Jasmine Sborov** is one of 93 Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) nominees for the 2015 AllState WBCA Good Works Team.

This prestigious community service award recognizes a distinguished group of student-athletes who have demonstrated a commitment to enriching the lives of others and contributing to the greater good in their communities.

From the 93 WBCA nominees distinguished voting panels will select two 10-member teams comprised of five student-athletes from the

NCAA Division I level and five student-athletes from NCAA Divisions II, III and the NAIA. The final roster of 20 award recipients will be unveiled in February.

2014-15 Opponents in Bold

HARRIS LEAVES TEAM: Sophomore guard **Desiree Harris** has left the Colorado women's basketball program citing personal reasons.

Harris, who did not appear in a game this year, played in 15 contests as a freshman averaging just a little under five minutes per game. She intends on remaining at the university as a student.

FOR OPENERS: Colorado improved to 36-5 (.878) in all-time season openers and has won the last 15. The Buffaloes started the season with a home game for the 28th time in 41 seasons. Colorado is an outstanding 39-2 (.951) all-time in home openers and has never lost its overall season opener when played at home (28-0).

RETURN TO 'D': Defense has been a staple to the Colorado program under **Linda Lappe** and for the Buffaloes to be successful in 2014-15, toughness on that side of the court will once again be paramount.

Three of Colorado's top four single-season field goal percentage defense totals have come under Lappe's direction. The 2012-13 NCAA Tournament team set the bar with a school-record effort at .350. Last year's squad came in with the third-best total at .369. Colorado's 2013-14 total ranked third on the Pac-12 leaderboard and 34th in the nation.

Two of Colorado's top 10 scoring defense totals have come under Lappe's reign including a school-best 54.5 ppg in 2012-13. Three of CU's top 10 rebounding margins have also come in that time frame, including last year's mark of plus-5.0, the eighth best in team history.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 399-136 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.746). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 25 of 36 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

Colorado was 12-6 at Coors in 2013-14 and has won 23 of its last 31 and 34 of its last 45 at home.

BUFFS SIGN QUARTET TO NLI's: **Monica Burich, Makenzie Ellis, Kennedy Leonard** and **Alexis Robinson** have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2015-16 head coach Linda Lappe announced on Wednesday, the first day of the NCAA's early signing period.

Burich, a 6-2 forward, is a strong three-sport athlete for Roseville (Minn.) High School in the Twin Cities area. She averaged 15.5 points, 9 rebounds, 5 assists, 3 steals and 2 blocks as a junior, helping Roseville to a 21-7 record. Burich was first team Class AAAA All-State selection by the Minnesota Girls Basketball Coaches Association. A two-time all-conference selection, Burich has led the Raiders in blocks and steals the last three years, and added rebounds and assists to that resume as a junior.

Leonard, a 5-8 guard from Southlake, Texas, has led Carroll High School to three straight district and regional championships. Leonard averaged 8.4 assists per game in 2013-14, leading Texas and ranking ninth in the country. She was the 2014 District MVP, 2013 District Offensive MVP and the 2012 Newcomer of the Year. Leonard has averaged 12 points, 7 assists, 6 rebounds and 3.5 steals over her first three years.

Ellis, a 6-2 forward from Tulsa, Okla., averaged 12.2 points and 6.6 rebounds as a junior, guiding Booker T. Washington High School to a 22-5 record. She earned honorable mention to the Tulsa World's All-State team – which spans all classifications – as the Hornets fell just one game short of the 2014 state tournament. Ellis was the lone sophomore starter on Booker T. Washington's 2013 Class 6A State Championship team and earned All-State Tournament honors.

Robinson, a 5-10 guard from Ashland, Ky., has led Ashland Blazer High School to the last three Kentucky state tournaments, highlighted by a semifinals appearance in 2014. She is the only player in the state to be named MVP of her district tournament the past three years. Robinson is a two-time Area Player of the Year and a member of the Lexington Herald Leader All-State team. She enters her senior campaign already the Kittens' all-time leader in steals with 242 and on pace to challenge team marks for points, rebounds, assists and blocks.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado women's basketball will be televised to a regional or national audience at least 13 times during the regular season, including 12 games on the Pac-12 Networks during league play. This marks the third consecutive year the Buffaloes will have double-digit regional or national television appearances.

Colorado made its television debut on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain on Nov. 25, defeating Denver 77-49. Colorado's first eight Pac-12 games will be televised on the Pac-12 Networks as will five of the Buffaloes' nine home conference games. All remaining home games, and conference road games, that aren't televised will be scheduled to be streamed live through Colorado's Pac-12.com video portal. In addition, CU's game at Missouri on Friday, Dec. 12, will air on SEC Network +, the SEC's online video streaming option.

Entering this season, Colorado has tipped off on 127 national or

regional telecasts since the fall of 2001, and 28 since the advent of the Pac-12 Networks in 2012.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado improved to a perfect 25-0 in exhibition games with its 90-57 win over CSU-Pueblo on Nov. 8. The Buffaloes have outscored their opponents by 32 points per game (86.3 to 54.3) in those contests. The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU's exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams. CU's closest exhibition contest came in 1997, a 77-72 win over Athletes in Action.

BUFFS PICKED 10TH: In what is expected to be one of the most competitive league races in recent memory, Colorado was tabbed to finish 10th in the 2014-15 Pac-12 Conference standings according to the annual coaches preseason poll, announced at Pac-12 Media Day on Oct. 21.

Stanford was voted the preseason favorite for the 15th straight season, claiming 116 points and seven first place votes. California was second with 111 overall and three first place votes. The other two first place nods went to Oregon State, selected to finish third overall with 105.

UCLA was fourth with 84 points followed by Washington (72), USC (65), Arizona State (64), Washington State (56), Oregon (48), Colorado (31), Utah (28) and Arizona (12).

In the media's preseason poll, Colorado was picked 11th, swapping positions in that poll with Utah.

BUFFS TIP OFF SEASON WITH ANNUAL ONE-ON-ONE EVENT: The One-On-One With Colorado Women's Basketball event is a program favorite. In its fourth year under head coach **Linda Lappe**, this year's event was held Oct. 28 with nearly 250 fans, faculty and staff members in attendance.

The premise of the One-On-One event is to have each student-athlete pair up with a prominent female member of the university's faculty/staff, and get to know them outside of a classroom or office setting. The pairs then introduce each other to fans in attendance for the main program.

A diverse group of campus leaders joined for this event, ranging from professors, to department heads, to CU Regents.

"This event is special for us; it lets our fans know exactly who we are on and off the court," said sophomore guard **Lauren Huggins**, whose presenter was Dr. Susan Hendrickson, a senior instructor of chemistry and one of Huggins' former professors. "We also get to meet and interact with influential women within the CU community and through that we build relationships that will help us in the future."

Student-athletes and their "presenters" first sat down at a team dinner to learn about each other. Following the dinner, the public event began with a reception where players and presenters could greet the fans in attendance. Former head coach Ceal Barry, who held a similar event during her tenure, served as the event's emcee and brought each player and presenter to the stage.

"We always have such a blast hosting this event," Lappe said. "It shows a true commitment from both the faculty and staff on campus and also from all of our fans in the community."

Each student-athlete introduced their presenter, their role within the university and what they learned about them, and vice versa.

After introductions, the presenter was then allowed to ask the player any question, touching on a wide variety of topics, which always prove to be very entertaining, as both student-athlete and presenter let their own personalities shine.

ROBERSON TO MISS SEASON: Junior forward **Arielle Roberson** will miss the 2014-15 women's basketball season after tearing the ACL in her left knee in a routine drill during individual workouts just prior to the start of fall practice.

A two-time honorable mention All-Pac-12 selection, Roberson led Colorado in scoring (12.0 ppg) and rebounding (8.3 rpg) while ranking second in blocked shots (1.0 bpg) and third in field-goal percentage as a sophomore in 2013-14.

Roberson ranked ninth in the Pac-12 in rebounding, and at times, simply dominating in the paint for the Buffaloes. She had seven double-doubles on the season and her 109 offensive rebounds were the fourth-most by a Buffalo since the 1987-88 (when the stat was first charted on a regular basis).

Roberson set a Colorado conference tournament game record with 17 rebounds in the 2014 Pac-12 Tournament quarterfinals against Stanford; tying for the 11th best overall performance by a Buffalo. Her 464 career rebounds are the fourth best for a freshman-sophomore combined in team history.

The 2013 Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, Roberson has scored 771 points through her first two seasons and already ranks 14th in career double-doubles (10) and double-figure rebounding games (14) and is 19th in all-time blocked shots (57).

BOULDER – Colorado overcame a sluggish start and with a strong second half prevailed 68-59 over North Dakota in the first round of Preseason WNIT Saturday at the Coors Events Center.

Senior forward **Jan Reese** scored a game-high 21 points and junior front-court mate **Jamee Swan** pitched in 16 as Colorado remained perfect all-time in season openers at home (28-0).

The win sets up a quarterfinal game with Western Kentucky on Monday, Nov. 17, at 7 p.m. at the Coors Events Center. WKU coasted to a 93-57 home win over Central Arkansas on Friday.

"It's going to be a great win for us when the end of the season comes around because they're going to win a lot of games," head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "You can see why; they don't back down. We're happy to be moving on."

Colorado entered the game knowing the key was to stop 6-5 senior post Emily Evers and as advertised, Evers posted her numbers, finishing with 21 points and 18 rebounds, but the Buffaloes made her work. Evers nine field goals came on 22 attempts.

North Dakota shot out to an 11-4 lead. With the Buffs keying in on Evers, Leah Szabla took advantage by finding open driving lanes to score five of her 15 points in the early minutes.

But UND stalled, making just four of its first 21 shots, allowing Colorado to steadily crawl back into the game.

Haley Smith scored four points during an 11-2 run that gave the Buffaloes their first lead at 15-13. Colorado also had a boost from freshmen **Brecca Thomas** and **Alina Hartmann** playing in their first game. With **Lexy Kresl** and **Jasmine Sborov** in early foul trouble with two each, Hartmann came in and scored five points off the bench and Thomas played a steady 11 minutes, with a rebound, assist and no turnovers.

With the help of the solid bench, the game stayed tight for the rest of the half. Swan scored on a layup with just under a minute left for the eighth tie of the period at 31-31. UND, answered with a conventional 3-point play by Evers to take a 34-31 lead at the break.

Colorado went on an 8-1 run to start the second half which gave the Buffaloes a 39-35 lead. But Colorado went cold missing its next seven shots allowing North Dakota to close to 45-43 with 14:44 left on a Bailey Strand layup.

At that point, needing plays on both ends, Colorado really put it together.

With UND continually pounding the ball at Evers, the Buffaloes started to win the battle. Swan blocked an Evers layup attempt that quickly turned into **Lauren Huggins'** third 3-pointer at the 9:43 mark. That exchange jolted the momentum to Colorado, embarking on a 13-2 run.

Reese accounted for four in a row followed by six straight from Swan who hit a couple free throws to give CU its largest lead at 58-45 with 6:46 remaining.

The defending Big Sky Conference champs weren't going to go away without a fight. Szabla scored five straight as CU's lead was quickly whittled down to six. CU responded with a Swan layup to halt UND's run.

Megan Lauck scored on a jumper but Thomas answered with her first career 3-pointer to push the lead back to nine at 63-54.

Following Thomas' 3-pointer, the Buffs went scoreless for the next four minutes. Evers took advantage with two field goals and a free throw in the first half of that span to trim CU's lead to four.

Despite missing five straight shots in that time frame, Colorado was able to get stops to avoid UND getting any closer. After a Colorado turnover with 30 seconds left, Swan made a great play to get in the UND passing lane to get a steal.

Reese then iced the game on a 3-point play. She scored in traffic on a put back of a free throw miss, was fouled herself and sank the free throw to put CU up 66-59 with just 15 seconds left.

BOULDER – Free throws brought the Colorado women's basketball team back into its WNIT game Monday night against Western Kentucky but turnovers took the Buffaloes out of it, allowing the Lady Toppers to escape the Coors Events Center with a 79-78 overtime win.

Trailing by nine points midway through the second half, the Buffs roared back by hitting 22 of 27 free throws in the final 12:46 and tied the score at 68-68 on one of two foul shots by **Jan Reese** with 19.3 seconds to play.

But OT belonged to Western Kentucky, which turned CU's 24 turnovers into 21 points and got a game-high 30 points from Chastity Gooch – the Conference USA coaches' preseason player of the year.

Reese scored a career-best 24 points, including 20 in the second half and overtime. Her 11-of-13 performance from the foul line set career highs for both attempts and makes. Meanwhile, teammate **Lexy Kresl** tied her career high with 20 points and hit four of seven 3-point attempts.

The Lady Toppers led 36-35 after a first half that couldn't have been much tighter. The first 20 minutes featured 13 lead changes and seven ties, with neither team leading by more than four points.

That large lead was posted by the Buffs, who got 12 points from Kresl on her perfect 3-point shooting (4-of-4). She opened the night's scoring with a trey, and didn't cool off before intermission.

CU finished the half hitting five of its six 3-point attempts, with **Haley Smith** hitting the other 3-ball and **Jasmine Sborov** responsible for the lone miss. Overall, the Buffs shot 50 percent (11-of-22) from the field before the break.

Western Kentucky opened the second half just as it did the first, getting a trey from the versatile Gooch and taking a 39-35 lead for its largest advantage of the night to that point.

Gooch wasn't done. She scored the Lady Toppers' next five points, pushing them in front 44-37 with a conventional 3-point play with 16:13 remaining.

Less than 2 minutes after Swan's fourth, Smith went to the bench with her fourth foul and Western Kentucky was beginning to pull away. Lappe shifted her team into a 2-3 zone defense, which might have eased the Buffs' foul problem but not their turnovers.

And the Lady Toppers took advantage, surging to a nine-point lead (48-39) and forcing the Buffs into catch-up mode. They took it to well, outscoring the Lady Toppers 12-3 and tying the score at 53-53 on a pair of free throws by Reese with 8:33 to play.

Kresl completed CU's comeback by hitting two free throws with 6:19 left, giving the Buffs their first lead (57-55) of the second half. It didn't last long. After Gooch hit the first of two free throws, Western Kentucky controlled the second miss, allowing Kendall Noble to sink a short jumper and the Toppers to reclaim a one-point advantage with just over 5 minutes remaining.

Having climbed back in, CU wasn't going away. Four free throws by Beard-Fails and Reese pushed the Buffs back in front 62-61 at the 4:08 mark. They managed a four-point lead (67-63) on another pair of foul shots by Beard-Fails, but the Toppers tied the score at 67-67 on a free throw and a put-back by Gooch of the second miss. Tashia Brown broke the tie (68-67) by hitting one of two free throws.

CU controlled the rebound and Lappe called a timeout with 26.8 seconds showing. The plan was to get Reese the ball – and it worked. Fouled with 19.3 seconds left, she hit one of two free throws to tie the score at 68-68.

Kresl gave the Buffs the OT lead, making one of two free throws, and Sborov corralled Kresl's miss and laid it back in. CU was up 71-68, but a Gooch free throw and a Noble put-back drew another tie at 71-71.

Gooch took care of that with two free throws, giving the Toppers a 73-71 lead, then hit a short baseline jumper to increase it to 75-71. Sborov made one of two foul shots with 42.1 seconds left, pulling the Buffs to within 75-72.

Two Jones free throws put Western Kentucky up 77-75, but Reese answered with a trey from the right corner, then a conventional 3-point play as CU closed to within 79-78 with 20.7 seconds left.

The officials' review of an out-of-bounds call gave the Buffs the ball with 19.5 seconds left, but Kresl missed a baseline drive and Noble was fouled with .3 seconds showing. She missed both free throws but they weren't needed; CU was out of time and luck.

Kresl scored five straight points to stop a Denver run and in turn sent the Buffaloes rolling to a 77-49 win at Magness Arena Tuesday night on the DU campus.

Kresl recorded her first career double-double scoring 10 points and dishing out a career-high 10 assists, nine of which came in the first half, tying a CU single-half record.

Colorado (3-1) used a 12-3 run late in the first half to open up a double-digit lead. Kresl had five assists in a span of six baskets late in the period to build a 38-27 advantage at the break.

Junior forward **Jamee Swan** was one of the main benefactors, scoring 17 of her season-high 23 points in the first 20 minutes.

"It took us a little while to figure out how to play with (Denver's) changing defenses," Kresl said. "We were playing a motion offense against a zone, so once we found those areas there were a lot of gaps and we had a lot of opportunities to score."

Denver (0-3) opened the second half on a 7-0 run. The Buffaloes missed their first three shots and had a turnover, which allowed consecutive layups by Alecia Espinosa and Paige Bradley. Denver's Morgan Van Ripper-Rose then hit a 3-pointer to cut the lead to 38-34.

Scoreless in the first half, Kresl stopped the Pioneers' run with a 3-pointer from the baseline. Then, Kresl stayed in the backcourt, darted in front of Espinosa's inbound pass for a steal and laid the ball back up and in for a 43-34 Colorado lead.

"I knew we needed a spark so I just wanted to pick up the intensity," Kresl said. "After that (play) everyone else caught on with that same aggressiveness."

That was just the beginning. **Jen Reese** scored the next basket for the Buffaloes and **Haley Smith** added her sixth and final field goal of the night to cap off the 9-0 run and the Buffaloes rolled from there, outscoring the Pioneers 30-15 the rest of the way.

"That was a huge five points for our team," coach **Linda Lappe** said. "They started to get some of that momentum and as soon as that happened, they were deflated a little bit and that's when we knew we needed to go on a run, and our players did a really nice job capitalizing on that."

Swan made 8-of-12 from the field and hit all seven free throw attempts. She also grabbed seven rebounds, dished out three assists and had two blocks.

"Jamee was outstanding tonight," Lappe said. "She played hard and was disciplined. She played a lot tougher on both the offensive and defensive end."

Smith finished with 12 points, hitting 6-of-8 from the field, with seven rebounds and two steals. Reese had 10 points, five rebounds and a pair of steals.

Colorado shot 48 percent from the field while holding Denver to just 28 percent. Despite some early troubles on the boards, the Buffaloes out rebounded the Pioneers 47-37.

Bradley led Denver with 15 points.

BOULDER – Haley Smith scored a career-high 18 points as Colorado's offense was firing on all cylinders in an 87-59 win over Missouri State in the first round of the Omni Hotels Classic Friday evening at the Coors Events Center.

Senior **Lexy Kresl** added 17, hitting five 3-pointers as the Buffaloes (4-1) hit 80 points for the second time in three games.

Colorado moves on to face Colorado State in Saturday's championship game at 7:30 p.m. Colorado State (3-1) defeated TCU 76-62 in the tournament opener. Missouri State (0-5) will face TCU (3-2) in Saturday's consolation at 5 p.m.

"I really liked our effort tonight," coach **Linda Lappe** said. "I thought we played a complete game, both offensively and defensively. We had great production from our starters, had great production from our bench."

The Smith-Kresl duo were simply on fire. Smith was 6-of-9 from the field, in continuation of a three-game stretch where she's made a whopping 73 percent of her attempts (19-of-26). Kresl hit five of her first six 3-point attempts, settling in for a solid 6-of-13 night from the field which included seven rebounds, four assists and a pair of steals.

"My teammates are hitting me for open shots," Smith said. "I don't feel like I'm having to create; I'm just hitting the ones that are open."

It helps that Smith's shot selection mirrors that of every practice this season, and her teammates are taking notice, if the opposition has caught on yet.

"Haley deserves everything she's getting," Kresl said. "I see her shooting every day in the gym. That shot that you see her hit 7-of-8 in the game; she hits them in practice and shoots them every day."

Colorado shot 43 percent and hit a season-high nine 3-pointers. The Buffaloes put up 50 points in the second half on 46 percent shooting, thanks to momentum that actually began in the final minutes of the first period.

Smith and Kresl had eight points each as the Buffaloes built a 16-9 lead. But MSU stayed close, and tied the game at 18-18 on a Kenzie Williams free throw.

Kresl's third 3-pointer of the half and a **Zoe Correal** layup pushed CU's lead back to five, but the Lady Bears answered again, tying the score at 27-27 with 3:35 remaining.

For the second straight game Colorado made a strong run at the end of the first half to seize momentum.

The Buffaloes started getting stops and were able to get the ball quickly down the floor in transition. Colorado broke the tie with four straight free throws and then after a MSU turnover, **Jasmine Sborov** drilled a 3-pointer from left baseline to give Colorado a 34-27 advantage.

Free throws gave Colorado a 37-27 lead at halftime and the Buffaloes came out of the locker room fast and furious. Colorado had three offensive rebounds on the first possession, the final one ending in a **Jamee Swan** put back basket.

Then, **Jen Reese** had a great steal on the other end, which ended in a transition layup by Swan off a nice no-look feed from Sborov that capped off a 14-0 run.

"That's really big in any game, just ending the half with momentum," Kresl said. "The other team goes into the locker room kind of doubting themselves."

Liza Fruendt stopped CU's run with a 3-pointer to pull MSU back to 41-30, but Colorado kept on rolling.

Kresl hit back-to-back 3-pointers and **Lauren Huggins** added her first of three second half treys as Colorado led 50-32 with 15:06 remaining.

A 10-2 Missouri State run, aided by five points from Fruendt, closed Colorado's lead to 12 at 56-44 with 8:16 remaining. But Colorado quickly ended that run as Swan converted on a 3-point play, and scored on another fast break bucket, off an alley-oop pass from Smith, that sparked a 20-1 run that gave CU a 76-46 lead to end the Lady Bears' night.

Swan scored 14 points and had eight rebounds. Correal also had personal-best eight rebounds to tie Swan for the team lead. Colorado dominated the glass, outrebounding Missouri State 53-36 and committed a season-low 10 turnovers.

BOULDER – The Colorado Buffaloes starting front court of **Jen Reese, Haley Smith** and **Jamee Swan**, combined for 67 of 97 points, and **Lexy Kresl** scored the game's final six from the free throw line as the Buffs defeated San Jose State in overtime, 97-89, Friday morning at the Coors Events Center.

Swan (26 points, 11 rebounds) and Smith (24 points, 12 rebounds) both had double-doubles and Reese just missed one (17 points, 9 rebounds).

The Buffs (6-1) jumped out to a quick 9-0 lead in the first four minutes of the game, as the Spartans didn't get on the scoreboard until Ta'Rea Cunnigan hit a 3-pointer at the 15:52 mark. Smith hit the game's first shot and had two free throws to end that 9-0 run.

After the Spartans Rachol West hit a jumper, was fouled and hit her free throw, the Buffs lead was down to five at 11-6. **Lauren Huggins**, who hit all four of her 3-pointers in the first half, knocked down her first triple and along with a Reese jumper and two free throws from Swan, the Buffs lead grew to 18-9.

Zoe Beard-Falls had a nice post-to-post dish to Reese under the basket, and then hit a lay-up of her own to push the Buffs lead to double figures at 22-11, after which the game remained pretty even for most of the rest of the first half.

Huggins hit her second, third and fourth 3-pointers in a span of three minutes on the game clock, each one alternating with a lay-up from Swan, as the Buffs led 35-25 with 7:25 left in the first half. Huggins final 3-pointer was matched by a 3-pointer from Cunnigan to cut the Buffs lead to seven, but then Smith followed a mid-range jumper with a 3-pointer in the span of 12 seconds to push the Buffs lead back to 12 at 40-28.

After a pair of Swan layups and another jumper from Swan, the Buffs led 46-36 with 3:34 remaining in the half. The Spartans used a 10-4 run to cut the Buffs lead to just four at the break, 50-46, powered by 3-pointers from Rebecca Woodberry and Ali Bettencourt.

Woodberry then became a thorn in the Buffs side, as she scored eight straight points to give the Spartans their first lead of the game at 58-56. That lead was short-lived, as Jasmine Sborov hit a triple to put the Buffs back up 59-58.

The Spartans used a 6-0 run to take a five point lead, 64-59 and led 69-63 after a Bettencourt 3, the Buffs would claw their way back into the game on the strength of Swan and Smith. Those two combined for 13 of the first 14 points in a 14-2 run as the Buffs turned their six point deficit into a six point advantage with five minutes left in regulation. Swan hit three lay-ups and three free throws in the run while Smith had a baseline jumper and nice reverse lay-up. Swan also took a huge charge on the defensive end to keep the game tied 71-71 in the midst of that run.

Woodberry then went back to work, hitting four straight free throws on back-to-back possessions to cut the Buffs lead down to two at 77-75. Riana Byrd made it a one-point game hitting 1-of-2 from the line before Brecca Thomas hit her only shot of the game, a huge 3-pointer to put the Buffs up 80-76 with 3:34 left.

Reese then had a layup on the Buffs next possession and with a 82-76 lead with less than three minutes left, the Buffs looked to be in good shape, but the Spartans had one more run in them, outscoring the Buffs 9-3 down the stretch, capped by a Cunnigan layup with just 3.0 seconds left, that tied the game at 85-85. Woodberry continued to hurt the Buffs, knocking down two free throws and hitting a 3-pointer with 1:54 left that made it a two point game.

San Jose State took the initial overtime lead after Byrd hit a layup to open the period, but the Buffs then took control as Smith hit two jumpers and Swan another to give the Buffs a 91-87 lead three-and-a-half minutes into the extra period.

Smith quickly tied the game at 87-87 less than a minute into overtime, then Swan completed a great post move that started that the high post and included a nifty spin move to put the Buffs up for the final time at 89-87. The Buffs then bucked down on the defensive end and controlled the boards for the next three possessions. After Lappe called a timeout with 1:42 left, the next play to Smith, including a pump fake, she dribbled once, hit her shot to put CU up 91-87 with 1:34 left.

After Cunnigan hit two free throws at the 1:26 mark, Kresl went to work, first drawing a foul and hitting two freebies at the 1:12 mark and then grabbing huge defensive rebounds and being fouled immediately. Her third and fourth free throws came with just 31 seconds left, making it 95-89, and her final two with just 16 seconds left, sealing the game 97-89.

IOWA CITY, Iowa – Despite a career afternoon from senior **Jasmine Sborov**, Colorado endured its lowest offensive output of the season and struggled to make key stops when they were needed as No. 22/19 Iowa defeated the Buffaloes 78-63 Sunday afternoon at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Sborov led Colorado (6-2) with career-highs in points (17) and rebounds (12) for her second career double-double.

"Defensively, we have to get tougher," head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "We can't give up 78 points on the road and expect to win."

The Buffaloes did some things well and showed they could play toe-to-toe with the Hawkeyes. CU dominated on the boards by a count of 53-36, and 23 offensive rebounds led to some extra possessions and trips to the foul line that kept the Buffaloes close.

However, persistent foul trouble, and key lapses at the beginning of the first half, and start of the second, allowed Iowa (7-2) to build a double-digit lead and maintain that margin to stay unbeaten at home in 2014 (6-0).

Haley Smith, coming off a 24-point performance, looked to get on track early once again hitting two of her first three shots as CU took a 6-4 lead. But she picked up two fouls in six seconds just one minute later forcing the Buffaloes to go to their bench early. She would be limited to eight points hitting just 4-of-12.

Melissa Dixon, who led Iowa with a game-high 23 points, hit her first of five 3-pointers to spark a 7-0 Hawkeyes run and a 10-6 lead.

Sborov, who crashed the boards hard from the beginning, answered with a 6-0 run of her own. First she got a rebound off her own free throw miss and eased in for a layup to end Iowa's run. Then the senior put the Buffaloes up 12-10 as she took a handoff from **Zoe Beard-Falls** at the elbow and scored in traffic, converting on a 3-point play.

The game pace picked up from there. After Iowa retook the lead, Colorado briefly took it back when freshman **Alina Hartmann** hit a 3-pointer in transition. The Hawkeyes responded with an almost identical shot of their own. Dixon's second 3-pointer was followed by one from Ally Disterhoft which sparked a 10-2 run that gave Iowa a 24-17 edge.

Colorado's ability to get offensive rebounds extended possessions that allowed the Buffaloes to chisel away at the Hawkeyes. Beard-Falls converted a 3-point play to cut the lead to four. Sborov was then fouled on another offensive rebound and hit two free throws to trim Iowa's lead to 25-23.

After a Disterhoft basket and Iowa with the ball after a foul, Lexy Kresl stole the ball from Claire Till and found **Lauren Huggins** for a transition 3-pointer that cut the Iowa lead to 27-26 with 3:39 left.

Dixon's third 3-pointer sparked an 8-2 run for Iowa to end the half. Iowa point guard Samantha Logic, who had been held scoreless, secured an offensive rebound and banked in a short jumper at the buzzer for a 35-28 Iowa lead.

Iowa kept rolling early in the second half. The Hawkeyes hit 4-of-7 out of the gate and even had the ball bounce their way a few times. Disterhoft missed a free throw but Whitney Jennings was able to get the rare offensive rebound and put it in for a double-digit Iowa lead.

Smith scored her first basket since early in the second half to make it a 47-38 game. The Buffaloes were able to force a Jennings miss, but during a mad scramble for the rebound, Till corralled the ball from her knees and pitched out to Dixon for her fourth 3-pointer as the lead quickly went back to double-digits.

"Give Iowa a lot of credit," Lappe said. "I thought their spurt to end the first half and at the beginning of the second half was the difference in the game."

Jen Reese scored all 14 of her points in the second half. Even when it seemed she was about to get going, scoring on Colorado's first two second half possessions, she was hit with two quick fouls that gave her four total with nearly 18 minutes remaining.

Iowa built its lead to 15 at 59-44 with 8:39 left, but the Buffaloes put up a good fight to end the game. Reese reentered and scored six straight for Colorado to cut the Hawkeye lead to 61-52. But by this time, with nearly everyone in some sort of foul trouble, Iowa attacked. Back-to-back layups by Dixon and Kali Peschel had Iowa running back out to an 18-point advantage with 4:31 left.

To their credit, the Buffaloes never quit. Down 72-54, Colorado began to press. The Buffaloes forced two turnovers helping a 9-0 run led by five straight from Sborov. Iowa figured out the press and hit free throws for the final margin.
