NEXT UP: The University of Colorado second-ranked men's and sixth-ranked women's cross country teams will head back to Terre Haute, Ind. for the NCAA Championships on Monday, Nov. 20. Both teams won the NCAA Mountain Region Championship to advance to the 68th annual men's and 26th annual women's championships. The race will take place on the LaVern Gibson Cross Country Course at the Wabash Valley Family Sports Center.

This is the 21th straight appearance at the NCAA Championships for the CU men and the 25th in 26 years. The women are making their 15th consecutive trip to the championship and have qualified 17 of 18 times.

HOW THEY GOT HERE: Colorado earned an automatic bid to the championship by winning both of the NCAA Mountain Region Championship last Saturday in Albuquerque, N.M. This is the 14th time both teams have advanced with automatic bids.

THE SCHEDULE: The women's 6k race is at 12 p.m. (ET) with the men to follow at 1:15. An awards ceremony will follow the competition.

WHAT HAPPENED LAST YEAR: Colorado earned a second-place finish on the women's side and took fifth on the men's. The women beat Duke by four points for second with 181 points. Christine Bolf led the Buffs with a seventh-place finish. Liza Pasciuto also finished in the top-10, earning a ninth-place finish. Jenny Barringer was the third Buff across the line and took 43rd in her first NCAA Championship. The men were led by James Strang and Stephen Pifer who took 35th and 37th, respectively overall. Bret Schoolmeester finished 42nd and Billy Nelson took 76th.

COLORADO'S NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY: Both of Colorado's teams have left their marks on the national scene since the 1990's. The men's team has finished only lower than fifth twice (1997, 2003) since 1993. The women finished 20th in 1992 and jumped up to the podium and a second-place finish in 1995 and then took the team title in 2000. Both teams have two national titles under their belts. The women took top honors in 2000 and again in 2004. The men won the championship in 2001 and 2004. CU has had seven national champions: Mark Scrutton (1982), Mary Decker (1978), Adam Goucher (1998), Kara Grgas-Wheeler (2000), Jorge Torres (2002) and Dathan Ritzenhein (2003).

DOUBLE DUTY: Colorado is one of 14 programs to be sending both its men's and women's teams to the NCAA Championship and have both programs ranked in the top-10. Arkansas, Stanford, Wisconsin and North Carolina State also have both teams in the top-10. The other teams sending both programs include: BYU, Florida, Florida State, Georgetown, Iona, Iowa, Michigan State, Providence and Virginia.

BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR: University of Colorado head cross country coach Mark Wetmore has been named the 2006 Big 12 Conference Men's and Women's Coach of the Year. The award is voted by the league's coaches. Wetmore led CU to its 11th straight men's and 10th overall women's Big 12 titles this past Friday at the Rim Rock Farm Cross Country Course in Lawrence, Kansas.

Wetmore's squads swept the 2006 Big 12 Cross Country team titles for the eighth straight year. The women notched 45 points to defeat runner-up Texas Tech (64) and the men recorded 36 points as they bested Texas (80).

THROWING A 1-2 PUNCH: The Colorado women have a dynamic duo in junior Liza Pasciuto and sophomore Jenny Barringer. Barringer has been CU's no. 1 runner this season and Pasciuto has been second in every race for the Buffs.

FRESHMEN PHENOMS: Claire Maduza and Aislinn Ryan have made an immediate impact on this year's team. Each have placed third and fourth for CU on two occasions.

EXPERIENCE: Colorado's men's team is made up of lots of experience. The Buffs have two seniors and four juniors on the squad. Among Brent Vaughn, Billy Nelson, Stephen Pifer, James Strang, Erik Heinonen and Pete Janson, they have six All-American honors, 10 all-region and 12 All-Big 12 honors to date.

RETURNING ALL-AMERICANS: Colorado is returning five All-Americans to the NCAA Championship on Saturday. Senior Billy Nelson and juniors Stephen Pifer, James Strang and Brent Vaughn will race for the men. Nelson was an All-American in 2002 and 03. Vaughn used a medical redshirt in 2005, but was fourth in 2004 to earn his All-American status. Pifer is a two-time honoree in 2004 and 05 and Strang was named in 2005. On the women's side, Liza Pasciuto is the only returning All-American. She placed ninth for the Buffs last season to earn her second cross country All-American honor in two years.

GIVE THEM SOMETHING TO TALK ABOUT: Colorado has made a habit out of running better than its national ranking at the season finale. This is how the team has done in the Wetmore era.

ACADEMIC ALL-BIG 12: The University of Colorado cross country program placed 12 on the Academic All-Big 12 teams, the conference office announced Tuesday. Members of the first team have a grade point average of 3.20 or better. Those named to the second team have a 3.0-3.19 grade point average.

Anthony Chiulli, Pete Janson and Daniel Kenney all earned their third selection to the Academic All-Big 12 team. Janson and Kenney each earned their third selection to the first team. Janson is a Biology major and Kenney is majoring in business. Chiulli, a management major, is a three-time member of the second team.

Senior Erik Heinonen, a news editorial and anthropology major and Erin Marson, an integrated physiology major, were named to the first team for the second time in their careers at CU.

Jenny Barringer, Rachel Gioscia, Jennifer Hooper, Kenyon Neuman and Caitlin Schultheiss were named to the first team for the first time in their careers. Seth DeMoor and Liza Pasciuto earned second team honors for the first time in their prospective careers.

30th ANNIVERSARY: 2006 marks the 30th anniversary of the CU women's cross country team. Over the past 30 years, CU has won two national championships and two individual national championships. The Buffs also have two runner-up team finishes and one individual runner-up. Colorado has placed in the top-five 11 times in the team championship. In the first year of competition (1976), the team finished 16th at the national championship with Pam Allen leading the team with a 16th-place finish. Last year saw the Buffs stunning Duke by taking second at the NCAA's. Only time can tell what mark this season's squad will leave in the record book.
