FOR STARTERS: Colorado enters the conference tournament as the only school not to play on a neutral court this season ... CU has never been the No. 12 seed ... It's the fourth straight year CU opens the tournament against a Big 12 South school (2-1 record) ... Last time played Texas Tech in the conference tourney was the 2003-04 season and lost 79-69 as the No. 4 seed (CU earned a NIT berth) ... Last time this low of a seed was 2004-05 as No. 11, becoming first low seed to defeat a high seed (No. 6 Texas, 81-69) ... Since January, the Buffaloes have won four times by an average of 8.3 points (Central Florida, Iowa State, Oklahoma State, Nebraska) in 17 games; average loss is 18 points ... CU has not won consecutive games this year; the last time that happened was 1971-72 (35 years) ... The Buffs are 6-10 in the conference tournament under Coach Patton (6-11 counting the 1995-96 season in the Big 8).

POSITIVE BITS: Dominique Coleman ranks first all-time in season rebounding for guards. After grabbing a career-best 15 rebounds against Nebraska, Coleman has totaled 177 boards topping the previous best held by Donnie Boyce, 1993-94 (173) ... Coleman has made 111 field goals this season compared to 48 last year; his assists total has increased from 88-to-57 and steals 42-to-32 ... With 32 blocked shots, Marcus King-Stockton had only 30 combined in his freshman and sophomore seasons ... Xavier Silas has 301 points for eighth place on CU's freshman scoring list ... Roby and Coleman led the team in FGs made with 152

HOOK SHOTS: Richard Roby was named an honorable mention selection on the 2006-07 Phillips 66 All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Awards list; he was named a first-team selection a year ago...Roby scored 23 points against Nebraska to move into seventh place on CU's all-time scorers list with 1,439 points...In his last eight games, **Dominique Coleman** is averaging 13.3 ppg., 9.4 rpg. with 26 assists, 11 steals and shooting 40-for-67 (.597). Coleman has six or more rebounds in 14 of the last 16 games including a pair of 15 rebound games (Nebraska, Oklahoma State)...Roby has led CU in scoring four of last five games (21.3 ppg.)...In his last six games, **Jermyl Jackson-Wilson** is averaging 7.7 rpg, 6.6 ppg....Coleman has led the team in rebounding four of the last five games and in assists, three of five...Coleman leads the team with four double-doubles and CU is 3-1 when that occurs (loss vs. Texas A&M)...**Xavier Silas** has double-digit scoring in 10 of his past 13 games. He has 80 points in the last six contests (13.3 ppg.)...**TEAM:** The last time CU lost 20 games in a season was 1988-89 (21)...The three conference game wins ties the 1995-96 season (interim coach Patton)...The Buffs have allowed eight Big 12 opponents to shoot 50% FG or better...CU has used 13 different starting combos in 26.

and 111, respectively; Silas has 101 ... Roby (449 pts.), Silas (301) and Coleman (290) can equal the 2004-05 season with at least three players with over 300 points (Roby, 480; Chris Copeland, 340; Marcus Hall, 324).

LAST TIME vs. TTU (complete box and story on page 27): Jay Jackson scored 28 points to lead Texas Tech past Colorado 95-74 back on Feb. 17. Richard Roby led the Buffs with a team-high 17 points. Jermyl Jackson-Wilson, Xavier Silas and Dominique Coleman added 15, 14, and 11 points, respectively. Tech was sharp from 3-point range, hitting 11 of 25, and led by double digits for much of the game. The Red Raiders took their largest lead at 64-38 when Martin Zeno hit two free throws with more than 10 minutes left in the game.

CU vs. TTU: Although CU leads the all-time series, 16-9, Texas Tech has won five of the last seven games under head coach Bob Knight. Coach Patton is 2-1 against Coach Knight in Boulder and 0-1 at the Big 12 Tournament (2003-04). For history buffs, Coach Patton topped Coach Knight's Indiana Hoosiers (80-62) back on March 13, 1997 at the NCAA Tournament 1st Round (Winston-Salem, N.C.).

QUICKLY ON THE RED RAIDERS: Senior guard Jarius Jackson is second on the Texas Tech career scoring list with 2,170 points. He needs 87 points to pass all-time scoring leader Andre Emmett (2,256, 2001-04) on the school and Big 12 charts ... Junior guard Martin Zeno has scored in double-figures in 28 games in 2006-07. He has shot 50.0 percent or better 20 times ... Tech has recorded 20 wins for the fifth time in six years under head coach Bob Knight. Prior to his arrival, the Red Raiders won 20 games three times in the previous 24 seasons ... Freshman forward Decensae White has scored in double-digits in three of his past six games. Prior to the string, he had one game with 10 points or more all season.

ROBY vs. TTU: In three games against the Red Raiders in his career, Richard Roby is averaging 21.0 ppg. and 8.3 rpg. One of his five career doubles-doubles came against Texas Tech back on Feb. 11, 2005 (at Boulder) with 17 points and 15 rebounds and a 66-64 CU win.

X FACTOR: After missing the game at Iowa State with a left ankle impingement, freshman Xavier Silas remains a force in the CU lineup, perhaps better in the starting lineup. In 17 starts, Silas averages 13.5 ppg. and 4.1 rpg., 72-for-171 from the field (.421) and has led the team in scoring five times. He's come off the bench in pair of home games, Kansas State and Kansas as well as the first six games of the season. In those eight games, Silas is averaging 9.8 ppg., 3.3 rpg. and shooting 26-for-77 from the field (.338) with 11 3-pointers.

LONG DISTANCE IS BETTER: If you look at his overall stats, freshman Kal Bay is second on the team in treys made (43). Bay has a higher percentage from the arc (.361) than the rest of the field (.338). In fact, 43 of his 51 made field goals are treys. In 16 Big 12 games, Bay has 22 3-pointers (second on team), five are from the rest of the field.

SIXTH MAN...no more: With two games coming off the bench for the first time in his career (KU, Feb. 14; at Texas Tech, Feb. 17) Richard Roby returned to the starting up at Iowa State (Feb. 21) with 23 points, seven rebounds and 26 points, six rebounds against Kansas State (Feb. 24). TOP-10 SHOOTER: Richard Roby ranks among the top-10 field goals attempts list. Entering tonight's game, Roby has 1,184 attempts good enough for sixth place. As for field goals made, Roby is a bit behind Scott Wedman's 10th place of 516. Roby has 493 field goals made.

ON THE ROAD IN THE BIG 12: Since the Big 12 formed (1996-97), CU has played 88 regular season games on the road. At the close of the 2006-07 season, the Buffaloes under Coach Patton are 21-67 (.239). That means an average of 2.1 wins a season and 5.9 losses in eight road games. The highest win total was 4-4 in 1996-97; their lowest was one win in each of the 2002-03 (Baylor), 2001-02 (A&M) and 1999-2000 (Kansas State) seasons.

HALL ALMOST ELIGIBLE: Next season is almost here for Marcus Hall, who redshirted this year academically. The 6'1" guard from Houston, Texas will join seniors Richard Roby and Marcus King-Stockton along with a talent returning group. Hall has played 88 career games played (44 starts) and averages 8.3 points and 3.4 assists per game. He ranks ninth on the school's all-time assist list (295), 10th in 3-pointers made (99) and 19th in steals (82). Hall was also one of the captains on the 2005-06 team.

BOULDER (AP) - Richard Roby scored 20 points and Colorado remained unbeaten in 11 season openers under coach Ricardo Patton during the Buffaloes' 78-64 win over Denver.

Colorado's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson grabbed 17 rebounds, including 10 in the first half, and had 14 points, giving him his first career double-double. Jackson-Wilson's 11 offensive boards and his 17 for the game are the most by a Buff in a debut. Dominique Coleman, the lone senior on Colorado's roster, finished with 19 points and seven assists.

DaShawn Walker led Denver with 16 points. Joseph Jackson and Tyler Bullock each added 15 points.

It's the first time the two teams have played since 2000. Colorado leads the all-time series 56-25 and has won the last five in a row. Patton, who announced he'll step down at the end of his 11th season, is 4-0 against the Pioneers.

The Buffaloes led by as many as 21 points in the second half.

Roby had a play late in the first half that probably won't make his highlight reel. Roby attempted a one-handed dunk on a breakaway but was rejected by the rim and fell to the floor. He smiled as he headed back down the court. The Buffs were up 17 points at the time.

Xavier Silas was assessed a technical with 9:23 left in the first half for hanging on the rim.

The Pioneers trimmed a 17-point deficit in the first half to 37-24 at halftime with a 5-1 run to close out the half.

Denver freshman guard Nate Rohnert rolled his ankle during a shoot-around Friday morning and was held out of the game. The Pioneers were already missing junior guard Mykhael Lattimore (right thumb injury) and junior center Adam Tanner (fractured left arm). They're expected to miss at least three more games.

Colorado guard Kal Bay became just the fifth freshman to start in the opener during Patton's tenure. Roby started for Patton in 2004-05.

Giddens, the former Kansas guard who sat out last season after transferring to New Mexico, shook off a slow start and dissected the Buffaloes' defense with his quickness, slashing moves to the basket and outside jumper that repeatedly found the hoop.

Guard Xavier Silas led the Buffaloes (1-1) with 14 points. Richard Roby and Calvin Bay each scored 12.

New Mexico (3-0) took its first lead at 15-14 on a pair of free throws by Jeffrey Henfield with 11:46 left in the first half. New Mexico's reserves, who scored 25 points in the first half, and some solid free throw shooting, carried the Lobos' offense until Giddens found his stroke.

The Lobos hit their first 13 free throws and reserves Daniel Faris, Chad Toppert and Ryan Kersten provided much of the offense in the first 20 minutes.

Toppert hit a trio of 3-pointers in the first half, Faris scored 8 points and Kersten 6. Toppert's back-to-back 3s gave the Lobos a 36-25 lead with 5:02 left in the first half.

Faris, the sophomore backup center, finished with career highs of 14 points and 8 rebounds.

New Mexico led 47-34 at halftime and broke it open from there as the Lobos shot 67 percent in the second half. Giddens was the catalyst. He scored on a jumper in the lane, then came up with a steal and dunk that pushed the lead to 62-39 with 12:55 left.

Giddens, a junior who New Mexico coach Ritchie McKay has tabbed a likely lottery pick in next summer's NBA draft, flexed his muscles to the crowd of more than 12,000 after the dunk.

Giddens hit 11 of 19 shots and along with Faris and Aaron Johnson led the Lobos to a 51-35 edge in rebounding. Giddens had 9 rebounds and Johnson 11.

BOULDER (AP) - The Colorado Buffaloes men's basketball team were held to 11 points in the first half and fell to the Air Force Falcons at the Coors Events Center.

Sophomore forward Jermyl Jackson-Wilson led Colorado with nine points. Leading scorer, junior guard Richard Roby was held to six points on 3-for-14 shooting.

Nick Welch added 18 points for Air Force (4-0), which last started out with four straight wins in the 1998-99 season, when it began 5-0. The Falcons hit 13-of-25 3-pointers, four by Tim Anderson.

The first half output of 11 was Colorado's lowest scoring half since being held to four points in the first half of a Jan. 23, 1980 game at Missouri.

It was also the first time CU failed to place a player in double figures since Feb. 15, 1992 at Kansas. Poncho Hodges and Joe Stephens each scored nine points in the 82-45 loss.

Colorado took a 4-0 lead early, but trailed 35-11 at halftime thanks to a scoring drought that lasted nearly 12 minutes and a patient Air Force team that shot 52 percent and had 11 points from Welch.

After a basket by junior forward, Marcus King-Stockton, the Buffaloes missed 11 straight shots and turned the ball over five times while the Falcons' Dan Nwaelele buried three, 3-pointers as part of a 22-0 run that ended with Matt McGraw following his own miss to push Air Force ahead 22-4.

Jackson-Wilson ended the scoreless string with a basket at 6:49 that drew a roar from the crowd. Colorado, which shot 23 percent for the half, managed only seven points the rest of the period, two by Roby, who was 1-for-8 shooting.

Things didn't get much better in the second half for Colorado. The Buffaloes improved their shooting to 42 percent, but fell behind 47-17 after a 3-pointer from Welch and a layup and free throw from Keith Henke.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah (AP) - Richard Roby scored 22 points, and teammate Jermyl Jackson-Wilson made a free throw with 2.1 seconds remaining to lift Colorado to a 60-59 victory over Utah Tuesday night.

Kal Bay added 11 points and three 3 pointers for the Buffaloes who won at Utah for the first time in six tries dating back to 1946. It's also the first road win in seven road games for CU since winning at Oklahoma State back on Jan. 21, 2006 in overtime (80-78).

Jackson-Wilson missed his second of two free throws, and the Utes rebounded and called timeout with 1.8 seconds left. But Lawrence Borhas desperation three-pointer missed badly as time expired.

The victory was the first for the Buffaloes (2-2) after back-to-back blowout losses, while the Utes fell to a 0-3 start for the first time since 1970.

Johnnie Bryant scored 20 points for the Utes, including 11 in a row to start the second half, and Luke Nevill added 14 points and 10 rebounds.

But the Utes committed two crucial turnover in the final minute, with the game tied 59-59.

The first came on a bad pass after Utah's Shaun Green drew a charging foul on Roby, and the second came when the Utes lost the ball on a fast break following a blocked shot by Nevill. Borha fouled Jackson-Wilson in the ensuing scramble to set up the winning free throws.

Jackson-Wilson added 10 for the Buffaloes, who forced 17 turnovers and held the Utes to 43.6 percent shooting.

The teams combined for 17 turnovers in the first half, and the Utes made 6-of-22 shots. Neither team led by more than six points.

WILMINGTON, N.C. - Junior guard Daniel Fountain poured in a career-high 21 points and UNC Wilmington held Colorado to 18 points in the second half for a 67-55 come-from-behind victory over the Buffaloes in the home opener for the Seahawks.

The Seahawks improved to 2-3 on the season and snapped a three-game losing streak as they made new skipper Benny Moss a winner in his first home game. The Buffaloes dropped to 2-4 in the new season.

Fountain paced three players in double digits for the Seahawks, who shot 44.8 percent to just 37.3 percent for the Buffaloes. With guard Richard Roby sidelined most of the second half with cramps, CU managed just 26.1 percent from the floor after the break.

Senior playmaker Temi Soyobo poured in 12 points - all in the first half - on 6-of-8 shooting and added nine rebounds and dished out five assists in an all-around game. He also had eight steals to match the record set by Bob Martin in UNCW's 83-79 loss to Wake Forest when the arena opened on Nov. 26, 1977.

Roby paced the Buffaloes with 16 points, all in the first half. Jeremy Williams was the only other CU player in double figures with 14 markers.

Trailing by five points at halftime, the Seahawks finally caught up with the Buffs with a 7-0 mini-run midway through the second half. A finger roll by CU's Jermyl Jackson-Wilson with 15:48 remaining gave the Buffs a 40-36 lead, but UNCW reeled off seven unanswered points and grabbed a 43-40 edge when Fountain followed up his own shot at 13:09.

After CU sliced the deficit to two points, 49-47, with 6:18 left on a dunk by Jackson-Wilson, the Seahawks went on a 10-2 run. Freshman guard Daryl Felder converted a conventional three-point play on a spin move in the paint to start the rally and a jumper by Dejan Grkovic in the paint at 3:54 pushed the margin to 10 points, 59-49.

The Seahawks, who outrebounded the Buffs by a 37-32 margin, held CU to just six field goals and forced 11 turnovers in the final period.

CU gained the final possession and it would take two missed jumpers before Jackson-Wilson picked up the offensive rebound and hit the game-winning shot to end the game.

Jackson-Wilson also added seven rebounds, six blocked shots, four assists and three steals.

Roby was long a 3-pointer that would have tied it with 10 seconds left and the Rams got the ball out of bounds.

Durant connected on another 3-pointer with 15:38 left to begin a 19-7 run that also included two 3-pointers each by Abrams and Augustin that stretched the Longhorns' lead to 80-62.

A 3-pointer by J.D. Lewis and dunk by Durant extended the Texas lead, 88-66 with 7:56 remaining. Roby went scoreless over the last six minutes of the game and CU never got closer than 17 points in the final 5:50 of the game.

Roby and Durant nearly matched shot for shot in the first half. Durant, who had 21 points and three 3-pointers by halftime, had a scoop shot layup and free throw to put Texas up 50-43 with 2:23 before the break.

CU got four free throws from Roby in the last 1:34 as the Buffaloes closed the gap to 51-48 at intermission. Roby was 3-for-5 on 3-pointers and had 22 points in the first half.

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) - Nate Carter came off the bench to score 15 points and grab eight rebounds as Oklahoma defeated Colorado, 78-54 on Wednesday in the Sooners' Big 12 Conference home opener, giving rookie coach Jeff Capel his first league win.

Oklahoma (9-5, 1-1 Big 12) snapped a two-game losing streak. The Sooners have beaten Colorado (4-8, 0-2) 22 straight times at the Lloyd Noble Center, a streak that dates to February 1980.

Carter has 28 points and 17 rebounds in the Sooners' two league games. Freshman Tony Crocker, who entered the game with a 10.9-point scoring average, had 16 points and eight rebounds, and point guard Austin Johnson added 10 points for Oklahoma.

The Sooners controlled the basketball game on the defensive end, holding the Buffaloes to five points in the first 8:18. Colorado's final point total was about 17 below its previous season average.

Oklahoma also harassed the Buffaloes into a season-high 25 turnovers - stepping into passing lanes for 14 steals - and blocked three shots.

The loss was Colorado's fourth in five games. It's the eighth time in Big 12 history that the Buffaloes have started league play 0-2.

After scoring 30 points in CU's last game, against Texas, Richard Roby scored 20 points. Freshman forward Jeremy Williams had eight points to go with a season-best 12 rebounds for the Buffaloes.

The Sooners never trailed, jumping out to a 16-5 lead early behind five early points from Carter.

A layup by Dwight Thorne and a 3-pointer by Roby pulled the Buffaloes to within two points with just over four minutes left in the first half. Carter responded with a short jumper and Crocker took a charge on Colorado's next possession, then hit two free throws to extend the Sooners' lead.

Oklahoma ended the half on a 13-4 run and led 37-26 at halftime.

The Aggies put Colorado away with a 19-3 run as the Buffaloes went more than three minutes without a basket. Richard Roby scored 11 points, his 10th straight game in double figures. He came in averaging 25 points in Big 12 play.

Silas scored 11 straight points, on a trio of 3-pointers and a layup down the baseline, to help the Buffaloes regain their lead at 47-41 in the opening minutes of the second half, and Colorado never trailed again.

Silas' 3-pointer with 6:47 left gave the Buffs a 58-52 lead that they extended to 63-52 on Jermyl Jackson-Wilson's three points and a bucket by Dominique Coleman (nine points, seven rebounds, four assists, four steals).

Xavier Silas led two Buffaloes in doubles figures with 13 points, although he hit only five of his 12 shots from the field. Coleman added 12 points and five assists.

Jeremy Williams had a career-high 15 points and Richard Roby contributed 11 points, moving him into 14th place on Colorado's all-time scoring list.

Lawrence found himself in an unusual situation - open. Lawrence typically draws a crowd around the 3-point arc, but found room against Colorado's defense, finishing 4-of-8 from 3-point range.

After Colorado pulled to within four late in the first half, the Tigers went on a 27-12 run to put the game away and improve to 12-6 for the first time since the 2000-01 season.

The Buffaloes have now allowed three first-year coaches to win their first Big 12 game this season - Missouri's Mike Anderson, Oklahoma's Jeff Capel and Nebraska's Doc Sadler.

Colorado was 1-for-15 from 3-point range for the game and committed 15 turnovers. The Buffaloes have lost five of their last six games.

Johnson's follow shot gave Iowa State its first lead, 53-51, but Roby tied it for the final time with a fadeaway. Colorado started the game by breaking down Iowa State's defense time after time for close-in shots. Of the Buffaloes' first nine baskets, seven were layups and another was a dunk.

The Buffs stretched their lead to 28-13 on Kal Bay's 3-pointer before Iowa State closed the half with a 13-2 run capped by McIntosh's 3 just before the buzzer, drawing the Cyclones to 30-26.

The Wildcats had a big run in the first half, only to see Colorado rally back into the game. After falling behind early, Kansas State went on a 17-3 run to take a 21-15 lead with 7:54 remaining in the first half.

However, the Buffaloes regrouped and went into the locker room leading 30-29 after Dwight Thorne hit a 3-pointer with 49 seconds to go before halftime.

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) - With four Colorado players scoring in double-figures, led by senior Dominique Coleman with 19, the Buffaloes were unable to continue a second-half surge and came up short in the 91-82 loss to Missouri Wednesday night.

Freshmen Jeremy Williams and Xavier Silas scored 15 points each for the Buffs and junior Richard Roby added 13.

Marcus Watkins made his first start of the season on senior night and had career highs with 15 points and a team-leading six rebounds in for Missouri.

Colorado opened the second half on an 11-0 run capped by Silas' 3-pointer that cut the deficit to 52-49 with 16:51 to go, and again shaved Missouri's lead to three at 56-53 with about 14 minutes left.

Missouri led 52-38 at the break, topping 50 points in a half for the second time of the season and first since scoring 59 in a 101-80 opening victory over North Carolina A&T on Nov. 10. Consecutive 3-pointers by Lawrence gave Missouri its largest lead at 47-27 with four minutes to go.
