BROADCAST: All Colorado women's basketball regular and post season games are broadcast live on KKZN 760 AM, Boulder's Progressive Talk station. Mike Rice, in his second year, will handle play-by-play duties and is joined by Carol Callan of USA Basketball with the color commentary. Live internet audio can be accessed through Yahoo! Sports. BuffsTV, a video subscription service of CU's Official Athletic Website CUBuffs.com, will carry both of the Buffaloes Coors Classic games live.

THE BUFFALOES: Colorado began the 2007-08 campaign with a rare road trip, winning its season opener at San Francisco, 66-48 on Nov. 16 and falling at USC, 70-57, on Nov. 18. The games marked just the second time in school history that Colorado opened

the season with two straight road games, the other coming in 1984-85 -- Ceal Barry's second season as head coach -- with losses at Georgia Tech and Florida State. CU's win over San Francisco moved the Buffaloes to 29-5 all-time in season openers and 5-4 when that initial game is on the road. Colorado has history on its side for its home opener on Friday. The Buffaloes are a sparkling 32-1 in their season home debuts. CU's lone loss in a home opener came against Michigan, 77-63, to kickoff the 1999-2000 season.

Freshman **Brittany Spears** had an impressive start to her collegiate career averaging 17 points, 7.0 rebounds and 3.5 steals on the road trip. She had 15 points, seven rebounds and five steals in the opener against San Francisco. Spears' 15 points, all of which came in the first half, tied for the 10th best total in a Buffs' debut. Four of her five steals also came in the first half, a number that's even more impressive when you consider that CU's individual high for a game last year was four, twice done by **Jackie McFarland** and once by **Kara Richards**.

McFarland had a game-high 22 points against San Francisco, with most of her output coming in the second half helping the Buffaloes pull away from the Dons. The All-Big 12 forward was held to seven points and seven rebounds against USC, but she still walked away from the weekend averaging 14.5 points and 7.5 rebounds while shooting 56.5 percent from the field (13-of-23).

Colorado's bench displayed signs of its great potential on the West Coast swing, especially against the Dons. The Buffs' bench outscored the USF 26-6, led by freshman guard **Britney Blythe** who had 11 points in her collegiate debut which was about five miles from where she starred in high school at St. Ignatius Prep. Sophomore forward **Aija Putnina** had six points and a team-high nine rebounds against San Francisco and flipped her numbers against USC, registering nine points and six rebounds. Sophomore guard **Bianca Smith** also had a productive weekend off the bench scoring five points against USF and then recording nine points and a career-high four steals at USC.

Colorado enjoyed a +5.0 rebound margin over the first two games and had four players average four or more during the trip. McFarland and Putnina each averaged 7.5 per game while Spears had an even 7.0 per contest while senior guard Susie Powers corralled six against USC and averaged 4.0 per game. The Buffaloes turned the ball over more than they would have liked at 21 per game, but had a solid weekend of getting the ball back as well. CU forced 38 turnovers in the two games, recording 21 steals. The Buffaloes had 11 steals against San Francisco and 10 against USC, marking the first time since the middle of the 2004-05 season that CU had double-digit steals in back-to-back road contests (10 at Missouri on Jan. 18, 2005 and 10 at Oklahoma State on Jan. 22, 2005).

THE COACH: **Kathy McConnell-Miller** begins her third season as Colorado's head coach. She is 23-39 in her first two seasons with the Buffaloes and has an overall eight-year head coaching record of 114-127.

ABOUT THE SAINTS: Siena is 1-3 overall, coming off a 57-47 win at Long Island on Nov. 19 for its first win of the season. First team All-Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference forward Laura Menty led the Saints with 21 points and nine rebounds. Menty is averaging a team-best 18.5 points and 5.5 rebounds per game. Much of her damage has come at the free-throw line as the 72 percent foul shooter has already made 26 free throws in four games, nearly half the team total (55). Senior guard Melissa Menzer is second on the team in scoring at 13.5 points per game and has 13 of the Saints' 16 3-point field goals this season (13-of-31, .419). Siena is averaging 59.2 points per game and hitting 40.5 percent from the floor (83-of-205).

ABOUT THE TIGERS: Clemson is 2-3 overall and coming off a 74-56 setback against No. 25 Vanderbilt at home on Nov. 20. Senior D'Lessa Lloyd came off the bench to score 17 points to lead the

Tigers. Lloyd is one of six Tigers averaging between 9.0 and 10.5 points per game. True freshman guard Sthefany Thomas has the most total points for Clemson, scoring 51 over the first five games of the season (10.2 ppg) while backcourt mate sophomore Christy Brown is averaging slightly more (10.3 ppg) in one less game. Sophomore forward LeLe Hardy paces Clemson with 7.6 rebounds per game while scoring 9.0 per contest. The Tigers have struggled from the field early on, hitting just 36.5 percent from the floor and

only 23.7 percent from 3-point range. Defensively Clemson is averaging 13.2 steals per game.

ABOUT THE OWLS: Rice is off to the best start among Coors Classic teams sitting at 5-1 after a 49-39 win over Arkansas-Little Rock in its home opener on Nov. 20. The Owls' lone loss this season came at UCLA, 79-71, on Nov. 18. Senior Valeriya Berezhyńska and junior Maudess Fulton account for over half of the Rice offensive attack. The 6-4 Berezhyńska tops the Owls with 20.2 points and 8.6 rebounds per game. Fulton, a 5-10 guard, is averaging 16.2 points per game and has a team-best 10 3-point field goals. The Owls are averaging 66 points per game while holding the opposition to just 57.3 points per game. Rice's defense has held opponents to 37 percent from the floor.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be the second meeting between Colorado and Siena. The only other meeting was a 98-78 Colorado win in the first round of the 2001 NCAA Tournament, played in Nashville. This would be the third meeting between Colorado and Rice, with the Buffaloes winning both games at the Coors Events Center. CU and Rice last met in the 2002-03 opener, a 85-66 Buffs win. The other meeting was a 53-49 CU win in the championship game of the 1997 Coors Classic. Colorado and Clemson would meet for the first time.

Kathy McConnell-Miller has never faced Siena or Clemson as a head coach. McConnell-Miller is 5-8 against Rice, all while she was head coach at Tulsa.

The Buffaloes are 2-0 all-time against Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference teams, once against Siena and a home win over Manhattan during the 2004-05 season. CU is 11-2 against current Conference USA teams and 3-3 against squads from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

CU IN COORS CLASSIC: Colorado is 33-7 all-time in the Coors Classic and has won 12 of the 19 tournament titles contested. No

team champion was crowned at the 2006 Classic as the tournament switched to a true "Classic" format where Colorado and Wyoming played Nevada and Charlotte on consecutive nights. The front range teams went a perfect 4-0 in the Classic. CU defeated Nevada 80-60 the first night and handled Charlotte 78-65 on day two. Wyoming defeated Charlotte 77-55 and Nevada 80-71. The 2007 Coors Classic will return to the traditional format with a consolation and championship game scheduled for Saturday.

FAMILIAR FACES, FAMILIAR PLACES: Colorado's Latvia connection of junior Dina Piterniece and sophomore Aija Putnina welcome an old friend and fellow Latvian native Liga Alpe-Luka, a senior guard for Siena. Piterniece and Alpe-Luka played on the same junior national team that claimed a bronze medal at the 2005 U20 European Championships. Putnina and Alpe-Luka played together at the World University Games. Colorado assistant Tom McConnell was an assistant men's coach at Marquette (1986-99) at the same time current Siena head coach Gina Castelli was an assistant women's coach at Marquette. Castelli is in her 18th season as the Siena head coach. Sophomore guard Bianca Smith is from Missouri City, Texas, located about 20 miles from Rice.

CAPTAINS NAMED: Seniors **Jackie McFarland** and **Susie Powers** and junior **Caley Dow** will serve as team captains for the 2007-08 season. McFarland is a captain for a third straight season, Powers is in her second year as captain and Dow is a captain for the first time. CU team captains are voted on by players prior to the first regular season contest each year.

PITERNIECE OUT 1-2 MORE WEEKS: Junior forward **Dina Piterniece** will have to wait 1-2 more weeks to make her CU debut as she continues to recover from a broken toe suffered during practice on Oct. 19. The injury is to the third metatarsal on her left foot. Piterniece is expected to make a significant contribution to the CU lineup this season after a two-year career at Odessa where her teams went 66-3, winning the 2007 junior college national championship and a second place finish in 2006.

McFARLAND PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12; BUFFS PICKED 11TH: Senior forward **Jackie McFarland** has been named to the 2007-08 Preseason All-Big 12 Conference Women's Basketball team by a vote of league coaches.



McFarland is CU's second preseason All-Big 12 honoree as former Buffaloes standout Erin Scholz was named to the 1996-97 squad. She joins Nebraska forward Kelsey Griffin, Oklahoma center Courtney Paris and Texas A&M guards A'Quonesia Franklin and Takia Starks on the five-member preseason team. All five players were first team All-Big 12 picks last winter.

A native of Derby, Kan., McFarland topped the Big 12 and ranked third in the nation in field-goal accuracy in 2006-07 at 61 percent. She was second in the Big 12 in scoring (17.8 ppg) and rebounding (10.8 rpg) and led the league in minutes at 36.4 per game.

McFarland, a 2007 *Associated Press* honorable mention All-American, is one of just five players in Colorado history with career numbers totaling 1,300 points and 700 rebounds and just one of three players to record back-to-back 500 point seasons. She is already in Colorado's career Top 10 for rebounding (fourth at 770), free throws made (sixth at 383) and blocked shots (sixth at 100) and is on pace to enter the Top 5 in all three categories as well as scoring and field goals made.

She was one of just two players in the Big 12 with 18 or more double-doubles in 2006-07 and missed five additional double-double opportunities by either a single point or rebound. Her 18 double-doubles were equal to or more than 10 of the 12 conference teams. McFarland's 37 career double-doubles are tied with Scholz (1993-97) for second on CU's all-time list.

Her 325 rebounds were a school-record for a junior and the fifth best single-season total in team history. McFarland's 10.8

Kathy McConnell-Miller
 Head Coach
 Third Season

When **Kathy McConnell-Miller** took over the University of Colorado program just over two years ago, there's no question the Buffaloes were rebuilding and the team was a work in progress.

In two seasons at Colorado, progress is certainly a valid term for McConnell-Miller's Buffaloes.

McConnell-Miller, 40, sports a 22-38 record in her two seasons at Colorado and is 113-126 overall in eight seasons as an NCAA Division I head coach.

She led Colorado to a 13-17 mark in 2006-07, the team's best record since the 2003-04 Buffaloes went 22-8 and advanced to the program's last NCAA Tournament. Colorado also enjoyed its best Big 12 Conference showing in three years, tying Texas and Texas Tech for seventh in the league standings at 6-10. The Buffaloes' six conference wins in 2006-07 were more than the previous two years combined (3-13 in 2005-06 and 2-14 in 2004-05).

McConnell-Miller, who officially became the sixth head coach in the history of CU women's basketball on April 27, 2005, has overseen the development of Jackie McFarland, who has emerged as one of the top players in the Big 12. McFarland has earned All-Big 12 honors in both her seasons under McConnell-Miller including first team acclaim this past season. All-league selections are nothing new to McConnell-Miller as she has had at least one first or second team all-conference performer in each of her eight seasons as a collegiate head coach.

The Buffaloes have also had academic success in the McConnell-Miller era. In her two seasons, McConnell-Miller has coached seven Academic All-Big 12 Women's Basketball team members and has helped guide McFarland two a pair of Academic All-America second team honors.

She has done well with the players inherited from legendary CU head coach Ceal Barry, but she has also excelled in bringing in her own players.

McConnell-Miller, who from day one has established a family type atmosphere in the lockerroom and a fighting spirit in her players, and her staff have landed back-to-back Top 40 recruiting classes, including the No. 29 class in 2006 according to the All-Star Girls Report. What was remarkable about the class of 2006 is McConnell-Miller and her staff didn't even have the chance to start on the recruiting trail until April when they arrived in Boulder. Despite that late start, McConnell-Miller and her staff managed to sign five top 150 players, including Whitney Houston and Aija Putnina who made significant contributions as first-year players.

Before arriving at CU, McConnell-Miller spent six seasons as head coach at the University of Tulsa where she constructed an impressive turnaround of the Golden Hurricane program. Before her arrival in 1999-2000, Tulsa had just one winning season in its 14-year history, an overall record of 81-250 (.324), and was actually dropped as a varsity sport for nine years following the 1986-87 campaign. In her six seasons at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller recorded a program-best 91 wins (15.2 wins per year), winning seasons in three of the last four years and two postseason appearances.

She left as Tulsa's all-time leader for coaching victories with a record of 91-88 and owns the longest tenure in school history by a women's basketball coach. McConnell-Miller, who earned WAC Coach of the Year honors in her rookie season as a collegiate head coach in 1999-00, led Tulsa to 14 or more wins in five of her six campaigns.

Under the direction of McConnell-Miller, Tulsa placed at least one player on either the All-WAC first or second team, each of her six seasons. McConnell-Miller also had the Golden Hurricane excelling in the classroom sporting four *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District first and second team performers. Tulsa players also earned 23 All-WAC Academic Team honors. One of McConnell-Miller's prize players was Allison Curtin who was an

Associated Press honorable mention All-American for the Golden Hurricane and was drafted by the Houston Comets in the first round of the 2003 WNBA Draft.

Prior to her appointment at Tulsa, McConnell-Miller spent four seasons on Theresa Grentz's staff at the University of Illinois (1995-99). She was an assistant coach for her first three years before being promoted to associate head coach for her final season. The Fighting Illini posted an overall record of 76-45 and advanced to three NCAA Tournaments with McConnell-Miller on the bench. Illinois won the Big Ten Conference Championship in 1997 and twice advanced to the Sweet 16. While at Illinois, McConnell-Miller was vital in the signing of a pair of recruiting classes that ranked among the top five in the nation.

McConnell-Miller coached with Grentz for a total of six years as she went with Grentz to Illinois from Rutgers University in 1995. McConnell-Miller was a Rutgers assistant for two seasons (1993-95), helping the Lady Knights post a pair of winning campaigns, the 1994 Atlantic 10 Championship and a spot in the NCAA Tournament. Her recruiting expertise was well documented at Rutgers as her last class was rated as the 14th-best nationally, giving McConnell-Miller back-to-back Top 15 classes.

Her first collegiate assistant coaching job came at her hometown school, the University of Pittsburgh. She joined the Panthers in 1991 and served as the recruiting coordinator. She was also an assistant coach for the 1993 Big East All-Star Team which played in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

She is a member of the Western Pennsylvania Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, and was inducted into the Seton LaSalle High School Hall of Fame in October of 2006.

McConnell-Miller enjoyed a four-year playing career at guard for the University of Virginia (1986-90). She played in four NCAA Tournaments with the Cavaliers including a pair of Sweet 16 appearances and the 1988 Elite Eight. McConnell-Miller earned her bachelor's degree in rhetoric and communications from Virginia in 1989.

One of eight children, she is one of six McConnell siblings who attended college on a basketball scholarship.

Three McConnell's are presently in the coaching ranks, two at the college level and one at the high school level. Her older sister, Suzie McConnell Serio was the head coach of the Minnesota Lynx of the WNBA for three seasons (2003-06).

Born on Sept. 24, 1967, McConnell-Miller and her husband, Brad Miller, have three children: Brice (7), Mackenzie (5) and Macie (3).

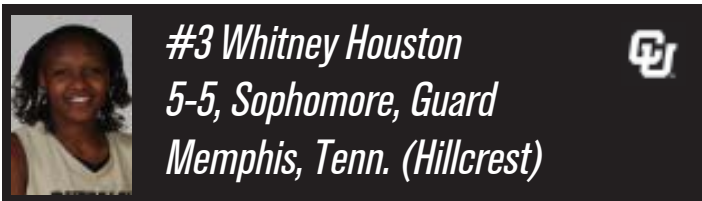

SAN FRANCISCO — Freshman **Brittany Spears** had 15 points — all in the first half — to spark Colorado to a season-opening 66-48 win at San Francisco Friday night at War Memorial Gymnasium.

Spears, who also tallied seven rebounds and five steals, scored 15 of CU's first 23 points as the Buffaloes erased an early 13-6 deficit and closed the first half with a 30-12 run to take control of the game. Spears was 7-of-11 from the floor and had four of her steals by halftime equaling CU's top individual theft performance from any game all of last season. Her scoring output tied for the 10th best Buff debut in team history.

"I felt comfortable because we were prepared," Spears said. "We worked all week on (San Francisco's) plays, all the screens; flare screens. (The coaching staff) told us what they were going to do. I felt prepared mentally and physically for this game."

With Spears' strong start the game opened up for CU's all-Big 12 forward **Jackie McFarland** who had a game-high 22 points including 15 in the second half.

"The ball movement was great," McFarland said. "Before (opponents) have been able to double-down on me the entire game and tonight after a couple plays in the first half when we were getting good shots (outside), it opened up the post a lot and allowed me to move around."

Freshman guard **Britney Blythe** made her collegiate debut in her own back yard scoring 11 points with two steals and two assists. The San Mateo, Calif., native led a Colorado bench effort that outscored the USF bench 26-6. Sophomore **Aija Putnina** corralled nine rebounds and had six points, including her first career 3-point field goal.

"We have several options for players coming off the bench and tonight we wanted players on the floor that could score and I thought that was the difference," CU head coach **Kathy McConnell-Miller** said. "We had five players that could shoot the ball and USF had a difficult job of figuring out who to guard. In the past we've had just one (who could score) and now we have more offensive weapons."

"We wanted to improve our performance on the road this year and I was very pleased with the mental toughness of this team and the decision making on the floor. This team was prepared for what we were going to do and our staff had a confidence level going into the game tonight the way the players have worked in the off season and preseason."

The Buffaloes, which have won just one road game each of the last two years, enjoyed their widest margin of victory on the road since a 71-50 win over Kansas on Jan. 18, 2003. It's also the fewest points CU's allowed on the road since a 45-42 win over Pacific on Dec. 18, 2004.

Colorado's defense shut down San Francisco as the Dons were held to just 37 percent shooting for the game and just 32 in the second half (9-of-28). The Buffaloes had 11 steals — nine in the first half — and overall forced 18 USF turnovers. Lisa Olden led USF with 14 points and seven rebounds while Necolia Simmons had 11 points and seven rebounds.

LOS ANGELES — Southern California took advantage of hot perimeter shooting, nailing 11 3-point field goals to claim a 70-57 decision over Colorado Sunday afternoon at the Galen Center on the USC campus.

USC (1-1) hit a scorching 50 percent from the 3-point arc (11-of-22) and hit timely shots each time the Buffaloes made a run. Brynn Cameron was 4-of-6 from downtown and led USC with 16 points. Simone Jelks, who had just seven 3-pointers all of last season, was 3-of-3 for the afternoon scoring 10 total.

Freshman **Brittany Spears** led Colorado with 19 points, 14 of which came in the second half. Sophomores **Aija Putnina** and **Bianca Smith** each had nine points off the bench.

Colorado's had a first half to forget netting just 16 points while committing 15 turnovers. The Buffaloes made just 5-of-21 from the field (23.8 percent) and had trouble getting All-Big 12 forward **Jackie McFarland** involved in the game. McFarland was held to just one free throw for the first 20 minutes with two rebounds.

McFarland finished with seven points and seven rebounds. Southern California began the game on a 21-7 run, forcing seven Buffaloes turnovers in the first nine minutes and holding CU to just 17 percent from the field (2-of-12). Camille LeNoir, playing in her first game of the season, had seven of her nine points in the opening minutes of the game.

Colorado closed the gap with a 7-0 run on a Spears free throw, and back-to-back 3-point field goals by Spears and Putnina, but Cameron scored five straight to ignite a 16-2 USC run to end the half. The guard combo of Cameron and LeNoir combined for 17 first half points on 7-of-11 shooting, including three 3-point field goals.

McFarland was able to get back on track early in the second half with six points in the opening moments, but each time USC had an answer on the other end. McFarland and junior center **Kara Richards** combined for six straight to knock the score down to 39-22, but Allison Jaskowiak, and Cameron answered with 3-pointers as the Trojans pushed the lead back to 47-24.

Spears then hit a 3-pointer and followed it up with back-to-back scores as the Buffs went on a 11-2 run to narrow the margin to 49-35 with 12:13 left. However, once again Cameron and Jelks hit back-to-back from downtown to push the USC lead back to 20 (55-35).

Overall Colorado committed 26 turnovers and shot just 38 percent for the game (21-of-55).
